Survey Provides Some Insight into Sun City AZ Population

An informal survey recently conducted by RCSC in which nearly 2,500 responses were received (approximately 6% of 40,000 whom reside in Sun City) shows that almost two-thirds of them have lived here for less than 10 years, and almost 80% are first-generation residents. Furthermore, the unscientific questionnaire showed that over three-fourths of the respondents are between the ages of 61 and 80, and that over 97% own their homes.

Other data gleaned showed that just over 61% live here full-time, while just under 39% tend to make Sun City a part-time destination, with most spending five to six months here each year. And while Sun City AZ is known as the “City of Volunteers,” less than half of the respondents either currently volunteer or had done so in the past, while 21% plan to volunteer in the future. Nearly one-third of the respondents stated they had no interest in volunteering.

When we drilled down deeper with that question, most of the current and former volunteers have been in Sun City longer than five years. It seems to be that after about five years, people get the urge to help others. And most of the volunteers are also full-time residents. Over half (53%) who said they reside here full-time say they either currently or have previously volunteered.

Interestingly, about 14% of the respondents don’t consider themselves retired, working either full- time or part-time while 86% consider themselves retired.

The most popular state that comes to Sun City AZ is not much of a surprise. Seventeen percent resided elsewhere in Arizona prior to moving here. Almost 7.5% hail from Minnesota, followed by Washington State, California, Illinois, and Wisconsin. Every state in the union was represented in the survey except Mississippi. Nearly 5% of the survey respondents are Canadian, while less than 1% answered that they were from some other country.

The survey will be used to better understand our current residents as well as to develop marketing targeted at specific areas. Respondents answered the 11 question survey either online, in print form through Sun Views, or by filling out the questionnaire at Cardholder Services.

Future surveys are possible as the need arises. Thanks to those in the community that took the time to respond.

- Must be at least fifty-five (55) years of age;
- Must not be related by marriage or birth to any other member of the Board, Senior Management Staff, or Board Candidate;
- Must be a Deeded Real Estate Owner of property in Sun City, Maricopa County, Arizona as well as a resident of Sun City;
- Must be a Member in good standing;
- Must reside in Sun City, Arizona and be available at least ten (10) months of the year;
- Must meet the requirement to hold an Arizona liquor license;
- Must be eligible and available to serve a three (3) year term; and
- Must attend Board Candidate Orientation(s).

We want to continue to have an excellent slate of candidates for the December 2015 election. Thank you for your participation and input!

Golf Report

Pro Shops

Early frost days in the beginning of the month and rain days throughout the month took their toll on total rounds played. There were 5000 fewer rounds played in January 2015 than January 2014. The first half of February trended above 2014, and with only a little rain predicted in the forecast we are hopeful the trend will continue.

As we move into spring we can expect an increase in golf rounds, with increased rounds come increased wear and tear. As temperatures warm throughout the spring, these wear and tear areas will heal fast, however we still need golfer support. We ask everyone to please fill your divots and fix your ball marks. With increased play, slow play instances become more likely. We ask everyone to please practice ready golf by: playing your shot as soon as possible and when it doesn't interfere with your playing partners or the group ahead; move to your ball whenever it is safe to do so; avoid excessive practice swings; read your putt ahead of your turn; and record scores on the following tee box.

Golf Courses

The 2015 aerification/over-seed schedule has been finalized. As we did in 2014, we are skipping May green aerifications in favor of a more aggressive dual aerification in the summer. Though North remains on the aerification schedule, the greens will be aerified using less aggressive methods that should have little to no impact on play. As with North, the greens at Riverview will not be over-seeded this year. For clarification this means they will be hard, fast and pigmented. We choose not to over-seed the greens to remove the stress on newly established turf.

With unseasonably warm temperatures, the turf is requiring more water. Over the next several weeks additional water to fairways, tees and greens can be expected. Additional watering to the rough will also occur, to help bring it out of dormancy.

Staff will hand water hot spots as required. Wet areas will still be monitored and addressed. In addition to water, slow release fertilizer will begin to be applied, to provide nutrients to the bermuda grass as it comes out of dormancy.

The Riverview project remains on schedule with rough shaping complete on the front nine, and rough shaping still in process on the back nine. Irrigation is in various stages of completion on the front 9, with five holes completed and nearing completion on the remaining four holes and practice area. The major highlight of the past month has been the delivery and installation of the pump stations for the front and back nine. Extensive lake work on hole number 3, including a UV protected lake liner, has been completed. We just need electrical work to be completed in this area before the lake can be filled. Snack Shops

Despite a drop in rounds, the snack shops came within \$1500 of their budgeted goal. Positive performance in Cost of Sales and Operating Expenses, led to a positive result in Net operations. We continue to be appreciative of the support the Snack Shops receive from golfers and non-golfers alike.

Architect's Report

Riverview Renovation Update

Green is good. Yes, with the warmer weather we have had this spring the grass on the Riverview Golf Course is already greening up. The irrigation system on the west side of Del Webb is complete and wired into the controllers so the maintenance crew is able to get a jump start on the re-establishment of the turf.

Although on the surface the west side holes might look near completion but there is still a lot of coordination to take place between the contractor and golf maintenance crews as materials still need to be hauled into the greens and tees, and the bunker crew still needs to get back in and finish building the bunkers. Each day the Superintendent from Wadsworth Golf meets with the Irrigation Foreman for the RCSC to go over that days and the coming days schedule so water can be scheduled accordingly.

Earthwork and shaping will be complete in early April with the driving range and practice green being one of the last areas to be completed. Crews have already started placing sand on the tees and sand should soon be placed in the green cores.

Irrigation is still progressing east towards the east pump station so that when that connection is made, Wadsworth and the Owner will have water completely available to them through the new irrigation mainline and the existing mainline can be completely abandoned. Currently there are a couple of locations where we have temporarily made connections to the existing mainline to allow us to have water available to flush mainline, laterals and irrigation heads. Once we are solely on the new system these temporary valves will be closed and abandoned.

Overall we are right on schedule to complete grassing by mid-July.

Learning to Golf

Golfing - It's all about having fun!

Here is the final installment of Sarah Bakefelt's series on "Learning to Golf."

Let me share a cute story. I was on the 6th hole of Willowbrook with my students. I look down the fairway at the sand trap. I have my student in the sand trap scooping sand into a seed and sand container. I ask her, "What are you doing?" She said that her boyfriend had told her to get sand for this container. "I said put the sand back (pointing over to the next tee) and go over to the container by the tee and that is where you will put seed and sand into the container." We all laughed and it was a great lesson for my students that day.

A few more tips to remember to have more fun on the golf course:

- Play late in the afternoon, keeping score using double par for beginners.
- If your ball is not on the green on a par 3 in six strokes, pick the ball up and put it on the green.
- Make your practice useful and take a drill your teacher gave you and turn it into your practice swing, swing continually back and forth. A practice swing is just to loosen up your muscles.
- Lastly no matter how old you are, if you start now, you can grow old with friends and family playing this wonderful game. That's why they call golf "The Game of a Lifetime."

With row boats available to Cardholders at no charge for those not wanting to fish from the shore, you won't want to let the big one get away. And even better, no fishing license is required. The first fishing derby in recent memory last month, sponsored by the Sportsmen & Conservation Club, was a great success!

But if fishing isn't your thing, there's still plenty of fun to be had. Paddle boats can be checked out for your own private cruise or maybe a leisurely stroll past the waterfall and up to the top of the hill to catch a stunning sunset moment is more to your liking.

If you're looking for something indoors (read "when it's too dang hot out!") there's plenty to keep you busy. Both RCSC Bowling Centers have billiards rooms, but few know that there are also pool tables at Fairway Center. Another "pub game" that was missing from the Sun City AZ scene was darts, but we've hit another "bullseye" by adding an area at Bell Lanes with five dart machines to meet the demand and a new chartered club has been formed if you're interested in joining the fun.

Other hidden treasures at Bell Center include table tennis, racquetball, and indoor shuffleboard courts for those seeking more activities that provide both exercise and a little friendly competition. And remember, all of these amenities are available to Cardholders at no additional charge!

While you've got family and friends visiting, a trip to a museum is always a great educational experience and Sun City AZ offers

those as well. The Mineral Museum is located at Sundial and operated by volunteer members from the Rockhound Club. This little gem is a "must-see" for residents and visitors alike. With specimens from around the world and right in our own backyard, everyone will find something of interest. Don't forget to take a few extra minutes and tour the Fluorescent Room; you won't believe your eyes!

Head over to Fairway Center where you can find an entire room full of the best model train display around. Resident conductors from the Model Railroad Club of Sun City will be happy to answer any questions and are always ready with a good story guaranteed to delight both the young and the young hearted.

If history is more to your liking, there's no better place to learn about Sun City AZ from the very beginning than at the Del Webb Sun Cities Museum. Housed in an original model home, volunteer docents will lead you through displays that capture the Del Webb persona and vision – the man who changed the way we look at retirement communities for all time.

Depending upon the time of year and volunteer scheduling, hours at each Sun City AZ museum vary. It is highly recommended that you call before making a special trip. Phone numbers can be found on the website at www.sunaz.com, either on the Clubs page or under Sun City Links.

Updates

Financial Report:

Wow it seems as if 2014 just ended, and we are already almost to the end of February! Time does fly when you are having fun! We have ended January well within our operating and capital budget. The rainy and cold weather always wreaks havoc with our golf revenue, and therefore our food service revenue as well. We ended January \$44k under budget in revenue in our golf division, carrying to the bottom line a \$49k negative variance from budget. All other divisions, including food service, have completed January 2015 with a positive variance from budget in net operating excess.

Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments bounced back in January and were greater than the monthly average for the first time in 5 months. As a result, past due assessments decreased in January by 3% and offset the increase last month. December billings went past due at a rate of 6.0% and November balances went 60 days past due at a rate of 2.7%.

Total accounts receivable decreased in January with the largest decrease coming in annual property assessments. In January we saw a slight decrease in property transfer related balances and a 12% decrease in lender owned related invoices. Outstanding balances related to property transfers continue to represent 53% of all receivables due and past due balances.

Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal totaled \$51,108 in January. This is the highest monthly total for online payments. The online process is fully integrated with payments made through the web portal being posted to Cardholder accounts immediately. This is a great convenience option for Cardholders and allows for payments to be made outside of our regular office hours.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties increased again to 52 properties at the end of January. The number of properties owned by lending institutions decreased in January, however, and is now at 41 properties.

Preservation and Improvement Fees started the year strong as \$485,000 was collected in January, which is \$233,000 over the amount budgeted. Again a reminder that we intentionally budget PIF income very conservatively to assure that we have the cash on hand for any planned project as we remain debt free.

Bowling:

In 2014 considering the increase in minimum wage and operating expenses the Bowling Division had a very successful year and they have started out 2015 very strong.

League bowling was up \$17k in 2014 compared to 2013. We have been contacted by two different leagues that bowl in other valley bowling

centers that are interested in moving their leagues to our centers. We are currently in the process of negotiations, if the leagues move to our centers, we could see an increase of approximately \$20k in unbudgeted income in 2015.

Human Resources:

As most of us know, the cost of medical care and health insurance continues to rise. Studies show that 50% of the costs are due to lifestyle choices. RCSC has set out this year to affect the rising costs by implementing a program that measures where each employee is health wise now, where they want to go and lifestyle changes they need to make to get there. In November 2014, employees on a voluntary basis participated in health screenings where they were provided numbers on their total cholesterol, HDL cholesterol, BMI, blood pressure and blood sugar. Each employee then participated in an online health assessment by entering the information and now have a measurement tool to assist

in health improvement. As an incentive for change, participants receive a reduction in their medical premium each month. We are happy to announce that we achieved an 82% participation rate by all full-time employees which is excellent since most non-participants have medical coverage elsewhere making them ineligible for participation in RCSC’s plan.

RCSC is required annually to submit a report to the Bureau of Labor Statistics regarding work related injuries. We are told this is a voluntary program; however, participation is mandatory for selected employers chosen from designated industries. We have completed and submitted the 2014 report that contains statistics regarding annual number of employees (373), total hours worked by all employees (499,381) and total number of reportable work related injuries (14). The report requires extensive information regarding each injury and is used to make workplaces safer and healthier.

The Occupational Safety and Health Act’s (OSHA) required form 300A is now posted on all employee bulletin boards throughout RCSC and will remain there through April 30.

Project Updates

General Centers Projects and Information

• The electronic sign project continues to progress with all signs now installed. The electrical boring work under RCSC parking lots is still underway but expected to be completed by March 2, 2015. On February 10, 2015 while boring work was underway at Bell Center, the contractor hit the main water line feeding Bell Center which shut down the center for that afternoon and evening. All the proper precautions were taken, including blue stake and private utility line locates, but the main water line into Bell Center is a 3" concrete pipe which was not detectable with line locating equipment. Unfortunately, the RCSC does not have architectural drawings or other reference materials for utility lines installed under the parking lots. The problem was further complicated that day by the fact that 3" concrete water line pipe is no longer available. After a call was made to Epcor water, a used section of suitable concrete pipe was found and the water line was restored to service about 9PM that night. Electronic sign project contractors include: Bootz and Duke Signs and Accel Electric. (PIF Cost – \$850,775)

Viewpoint Lake / Duffeeland

• Eric Swanson, RCSC Viewpoint Lake consultant, is currently working with volunteers in hanging the "Fingerling Fortress" habitat from homeowner docks. In addition, volunteers are being contacted to help at the March 3-5 and March 10-12 workday events to install pea gravel for the spawning beds around the lake. A spring fish delivery is set up for April and May 2015. Fish deliveries will include channel catfish, largemouth bass, copper-nose bluegill, red-ear sunfish, white amur and threadfin shad. If you would

like to volunteer for the Viewpoint Lake habitat project please call the RCSC at 623-561-4600 and add your name and phone number to our volunteer list.

• The building permit has been approved by Maricopa County Building and Planning Department for the Duffeeland Dog Park renovation project. Bid packets will be assembled soon and sent to various construction companies. Once all bids are received the project will be submitted to the RCSC bid commission for final approval. Currently the target date for commencement of this project is May 2015.



Bell Center

• Bell Tennis is progressing nicely with all concrete poured, fencing fabric installed and court surface coating underway. Mini golf hole #4 is now carpeted and expected to reopen very soon. The tennis project includes demolition of the current (8) tennis courts and the installation of (10) new tennis courts. The new updated complex will also include a shaded gathering area, courtside canopies, water and electric to each court, tables and benches for spectators and planters in the common areas. Contractors include Lloyd Sports Engineering as architect and project manager and Sunland Sports as building contractor. (PIF Cost – \$1,778,074)

• The Darts activity area at Bell Lanes is now being constructed. Currently the glass and solid panel wall which divides this area from the billiards area is completed. Installation of electrical outlets, relocation of a door and setup of the five dart machines is underway. Appropriate tables and chairs are currently being located with hopes to open this amenity by March 16, 2015. Contractors include: Jocran Glass, Accel Electric, Ken McIntyre Construction and the RCSC Skilled Trades Department. (Cost – \$35,000)



Marinette Center

• The Marinette project is nearing completion. At this time the fitness room and lobby areas are being setup. The pool and spa will receive final interior pebble sheen finish and be filled with water the week of February 23, 2015, and the solar pool heating equipment will be started and put online once the pool is filled. Court surface finish on all pickleball courts is underway and WOW is it looking good! The existing four

pickleball courts are receiving new net posts, a bottom rail around the perimeter fence and the fence fabric re-tensioned. The parking lot to the South of the new facility and West driveway will be pulverized and paved the week of March 1, 2015. Completion of the landscape work is needed in order to pass the grading and drainage inspection for the final Certificate of Occupancy (COO), however the track, horseshoes and basketball areas will remain closed a little longer, as additional track concrete cure time is needed before application of the rubberized surface is made. Contractors include: CCBG Architectural, Robert Porter Construction, Regional Paving and Aquatic Builders. (PIF Cost – \$4,709,422)

Fairway Center

• The new ramp was installed in the fire lane/drop off area just west of the bike racks. Construction of the new concrete ramp was completed by Ken McIntyre Construction. (Cost - \$3,048)

Mt View Center

• Due to tripping hazards, the concrete entry and some of the sidewalks leading into the breezeway and Facility Attendants station have been replaced. Contractor was Ken McIntyre Construction. (Cost – \$13,505)

Riverview Pro Shop Building

• While the Riverview golf course is shutdown for renovations, the pro shop / snack shop building will also see some renovations of its own. The building permit for this project has been approved by the Maricopa County Planning and Development Department. So far the old patio roof and columns have been removed, the parking lot saw cut and asphalt removed and some demolition performed in the snack shop. Improvements include new covered patios off the East and South sides of the existing building, a fire sprinkler system, parapet wall and roofing work, ceiling replacements, new lighting, new flooring and other interior renovations. Contractors include Ken McIntyre Construction, Accel Electric and CCBG Architectural. (Cost – \$524,236)

Willowcreek / Willowbrook Pro Shop Building

• The four outside entrance areas leading into the pro shop and snack shop received temporary repairs to prevent tripping. New flooring material for these entrances is on order and will be installed sometime in March 2015. Contractor is Baker Brothers Carpeting. (Cost – \$3,207)

Skilled Trades Department

• The RCSC Skilled Trades department completed 147 work orders during the last two weeks of January 2015 and the first two weeks of February 2015. The RCSC skilled Trades fitness technician and pool mechanic completed routine maintenance work which is not a part of the work order system.



Centers Operations

• New pool furniture has been delivered to Marinette in anticipation of the center opening. Included in this order are 8 "high-bed" loungers which are being tested since they are not as low to the ground as a standard lounger. Bell Center is also receiving more pool loungers to meet the demand of that facility.

• Once again our appreciation goes out to RCSC staff as they have been very busy supporting events like the Art Show at Bell Center, the Mt View Players Club performance "Playing The Palace" and the Clay Club juried show at Lakeview Center. The staff at Sundial pulled double-duty the weekend of February 21 and 22. There was a dance Friday night. Saturday morning by 7:00am, 1500 chairs were set up for the Annual Membership Meeting and then the chairs were torn down for a dance that same night. Sunday morning the RCSC team set up for the Tip Top Dancers show and then were called upon to set up for the "The Blue Yonders" show which moved from the Sun Bowl to Sundial due to inclement weather on Monday afternoon. What a weekend!

• In addition to all the other activities in Sun City, cardholders are enjoying themselves by participating in activities such as the Arizona Senior Games held at the Sundial Bocce courts the week of February 16-20, checking out a paddle boat and cruising Viewpoint Lake and playing water volleyball in the new Oakmont pool.

Friends of the Library

Water Conservation

Gray Water & Your Landscape

Did you know you can have the "gray water" from your home routed to irrigate your landscape? First, you must be aware that there is a big difference between gray vs. black water. Black water - wastewater collected from toilets, kitchen sinks, and dishwashers is full of contaminants, bacteria and pathogens, and should never be used around the house or in the yard, while gray water - collected from washing machines, bathroom sinks or tubs - is great for irrigating your landscape. However, it is important to know what is in your gray water i.e. sulfates, chlorides, sodium or high pH levels, which can damage some plants.

If you are thinking about using gray water, here are a few of the guidelines that the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality to which you must adhere:

- Avoid human contact with gray water, or soil irrigated with gray water.
- Use gray water for household gardening, composting, lawn and landscaping as long as it stays on your property (no runoff).
- Do not surface irrigate any plant that produces fruits or vegetables, except citrus and nuts trees.
- Spraying gray water is prohibited; flood and drip irrigation are both permitted.
- Label pipes carrying gray water under pressure to eliminate confusion between gray water and drinking water pipes.
- Cover, seal and secure storage tanks to restrict access by rodents and to control disease-carrying insects such as mosquitoes.

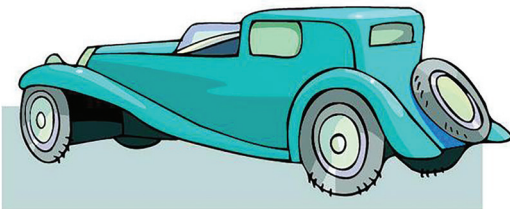
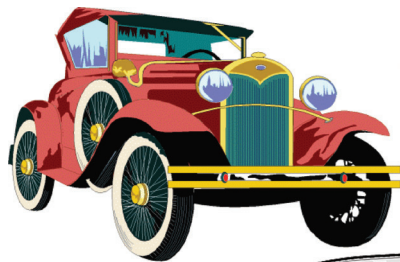

Have a Ball Building Core Strength

Balancing on a Stability Ball is a great way to engage core muscles. Lil Mastergeorge uses the "ball walkout" technique to position herself for a free weight Chest Press. Ball training is only one of the many exercise formats Lil learned from fitness professional, Jane Fortier. Core strength is critical to functional fitness – that is, fitness essential to both daily living and recreational activities. Strong core muscles help maintain appropriate posture and reduce strain on the spine. The "core" actually consists of many different muscles that stabilize the spine and pelvis and run the entire length of the torso. The goal of core stability is to maintain a solid foundation, and transfer energy from the center of the body out to the limbs.

"Exercises performed on a Stability Ball challenge core musculature", Fortier states. "Core muscles have two different roles – one to move the body (Mobilizers) and one to resist or control movement (Stabilizers). Biomechanically speaking, Core

Mobilizing muscles move the body in several different directions – bending forwards, backwards, sideways and twisting; Core Stabilizing muscles keep the individual bones of the spine correctly aligned when the mobilizers are at work. Exercises on the Stability Ball use both mobilizers and stabilizers, thus improving core strength & stability. These exercises lead to stronger trunk musculature and better functional fitness."

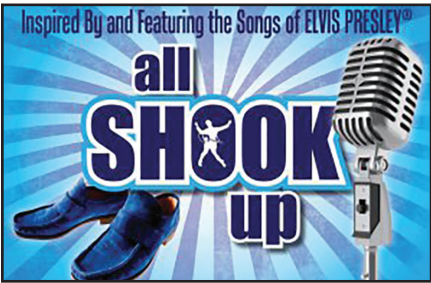

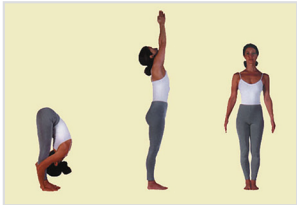
