Solar Fuels Sun City AZ with Savings

In response to numerous requests from RCSC Members for an update on the photovoltaic solar project, RCSC General Manager Jan Ek is pleased to present the following report on the current status of this project, which is proving to be a very good partnership.

For those that are not familiar, here's a quick summary of how the Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. came to lease photovoltaic ("PV") solar systems.

As a non-profit organization, RCSC was not eligible for federal or state tax credits, a needed incentive for the purchase of PV solar. An eligible leasing company purchased and installed the PV solar systems at RCSC, and RCSC leases the PV solar at ten locations with the initial lease cost of \$578,283 per year (15-year lease with increasing lease payments every five years). In addition, RCSC placed bids for 17 PV solar projects, receiving approval for 14 of them at 10 locations with the APS Renewable Energy Incentive Program. This needed incentive was projected to provide a rebate direct to RCSC of approximately \$185,000 per year for 20 years. The estimated production of electricity was estimated to save RCSC an average of \$480,000 per year. The estimate APS rebate plus the electricity production savings less the solar lease cost nets RCSC a savings of \$86,717 per year before insurance (current cost of \$12,386 per year) and any repairs and maintenance.

So that was the plan. What has happened so far?

Well to start, repairs and maintenance have been almost non-existent; the only issue we have had was covered under warranty. The systems were installed and activated in 2013. All systems have been online, functioning and producing electricity, as of September 2013. It was expected that there would be some costs

not covered by electricity production and rebates initially, and that proved to be the case. In 2013, the PV solar produced electricity with a value of \$202,873.59 and APS rebates of \$78,216.61. With a total solar rent and lease expense of \$332,711.51, there was a net cost to RCSC of \$51,621.31 in 2013.

The weather obviously makes a considerable difference in the amount of energy used and produced, which is evident in the comparisons between 2014 and 2015. Nonetheless, these first full two

years of PV solar production provides good information as to whether our projections were sound.

In 2014 the PV solar produced 3,951,496 kWh of electricity at value of \$479,356.95 for the year. RCSC received \$189,211.01 in APS rebates for a total savings of \$668,567.96. The solar lease cost RCSC \$578,283.00, for a net savings to RCSC of \$90,284.96.

In 2015 the PV solar produced 3,783,354 kWh of electricity at a value of \$483,182.61 for the year. RCSC received \$181,404.78 in APS rebates for a total savings of \$664,587.39. The solar lease cost remained the same at \$578,283.00, for a net savings to RCSC of \$86,304.39.

As electricity costs rise, the savings extended to RCSC with the production of electricity by the PV solar systems will also increase. But that is not the only place where RCSC can increase its rewards from PV solar.

Golf Report

Pro Shops

Despite a slow start to the month due to weather, total rounds for January slightly exceeded the prior year. Total revenue for the Golf Division exceeded budget for the month.

On February 11, Lakes East/Lakes West hosted the 8th annual Teal Ribbon Tournament. The event proved popular once again, raising over \$18,000 for the University of Arizona Cancer Center for Ovarian Cancer research. A total of 210 golfers participated in the event, which is significantly higher than the 50 participants in the inaugural event.

On Monday, March 7 we will be hosting a demo day at Riverview Golf Course from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Expected vendors include Wilson, Cleveland, Mizuno, Orlimar, King Par and Biion.

On March 10, the 2nd Annual Can/Am tournament will be held at Lakes West. The format will be a two person best ball, with one American team and one Canadian team. The cup will be awarded to the country with the most winning teams. Last year the American team narrowly edged the Canadians. In addition to the cup, team prizes will be awarded equally between the Americans and the Canadians. Prizes will also be awarded for longest drive and closest to the pin. A Pebble Beach vacation will be awarded for a hole in one on hole seven.

Free golf clinics will be offered March 5, 12, 19 & 26 at Lakes East/West; classes begin at 9:30 a.m. Topics covered in this order: putting, chipping, golf swing fundamentals and ball flight. Please note that this is a change from the flyer originally distributed. There is no need to preregister and the clinics are open to golfers of all skill levels. The clinics are a great introduction to the game of golf or great way to brush up on your game. Clinics are conducted by LPGA and PGA professionals.

Snack Shops

With steady play, snack shops also exceeded total revenue budgeted for January. While the normal closing time for our snack shops is 5:00 p.m., with longer daylight hours we may extend these hours to meet demand.

Golf Courses

As we move into spring we can expect an increase in golf rounds and with increased rounds come increased wear and tear. As temperatures warm throughout the spring, these wear and tear areas will heal faster, however we still need golfer support. We ask everyone to please fill your divots and fix your ball marks. With increased play, slow play instances become more likely. We ask everyone to please practice ready-golf by playing your shot as soon as possible and when it doesn't interfere with your playing partners or the group ahead, move to your ball whenever it is safe to do so, avoid excessive practice swings, read your putt ahead of your turn and recording scores on the following tee box.

Riverview continues to play hard and fast, particularly around greens and tees. Green speeds remain extremely

fast, as a reminder the greens at Riverview were not over-seeded, to protect them long term. With the recent warm weather we have had significant growth that has brought

the green speed down slightly. Prepping a green for over-seed places tremendous stress on the Bermuda grass. As temperatures rise and the grass emerges from dormancy, green speed will slow down and playability will be increased. There are areas of settling around the course near irrigation lines. This is normal, expected and will be corrected by the contractor at no additional cost when the Bermuda grass is actively growing again.

On February 1, 2019, RCSC will have the option to buy out the lease for the PV solar systems for a projected amount of \$5,545,215.68. So why would RCSC consider this option? Simple, it provides a significant savings. If RCSC continued to pay off its 15-year lease and following five-year Solar Services Agreement to the owner of the PV solar systems, it would pay a total of \$2,497,720 more than if it takes the one time 66-month option to buy out of the lease and eliminate the Solar Services Agreement.

The Solar Lease Buy-Out is currently projected to be paid out of the Preservation & Improvement Fund in 2019. The roughly \$600,000 that is currently included in utility expenses for the solar lease annually will end. Hence why the \$748,098 prior years carry forward excess used to balance the 2016 budget was prudent, as it allowed the RCSC Board not to increase the annual property assessments any more than they had to with the anticipation of this \$600,000 decrease in operating expenses forthcoming in 2019.

And there is no doubt that Sun City AZ resident volunteers are the absolute BEST advocates of our community. Management Updates

Financial Report:

We have completed January 2016 well within our operating and capital budget. The only division that fell short of budget was Member Services by about \$9,000, with primary variance falling under gross income and wages.

Bowling:

Bowling leagues are winding down, most leagues will finish their season by mid-April and shortly thereafter summer leagues will begin.

The 28th Annual Sun City Open Senior Bowling Tournament will begin April 30 and will run for two weekends. The tournament has always been successful, producing income of \$5,000 to \$6,000. The tournament is open to all senior bowlers in Arizona. It is always a joy to receive the compliments from the bowlers about the cleanliness and upkeep of our two RCSC bowling centers.

Bowling scores have been outstanding for the 2015/2016 season. Both RCSC Bowling Centers are among the top scoring centers in the state.

Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments in January were the lowest in the past year. While the Over 90 Day balances increased dramatically this month the Over 60 Day balances decreased substantially as well. Overall the total of these two categories decreased in January from the end of the year. The Over 30 Day past due rate for December balances increased which resulted in the higher Over 30 Day balances. Payments from our third party collections firm started strong in 2016 and totaled \$9,415. This did not impact total accounts receivable balances as several of the payments were from former property owners.

In January, property transfer related balances increased almost 6%. Lender owned related balances also increased again and were up almost 15%. The cyclical nature of these balances continue to show that they are dynamic over time. Outstanding balances related to property transfers continues to represent approximately 53% of all receivables due and past due balances.

Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal in January totaled \$67,896. This is up 33% from January 2015 payment totals.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties increased to 44 properties at the end of December. The number of properties owned by lending institutions decreased slightly again this month to 37 properties.

Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in January were \$535,500, which is \$196,000 over the amount budgeted. This is up just over 10% from the same period in 2015. Again a reminder that we intentionally budget PIF income very conservatively to assure that we have the cash on hand for any planned project as we remain debt free.

Human Resources:

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) requires better information about Medicare beneficiaries’ health coverage. The purpose is to help Medicare identify situations where another health care plan should be, or should have been, the primary payer for health services. As a result, CMS requires employers to submit responses to an extensive Data Match Questionnaire in order to determine recovery. This year CMS has requested medical information going back to 2011 on 83 current and former RCSC employees.

The Occupational Safety and Health Act (OSHA) Form 300A requires information on work-related injuries and illnesses for the previous year, as well as, average number of employees and total hours worked by all employees be posted on all employee bulletin boards throughout the corporation and remain there from February 1 through April 30 each year. The form is now posted in RCSC workplaces and has been submitted electronically to OSHA.

Member Services:

Our first show in February, the Motown Review, was the first sell-out show of the season. This was followed a week later by the magician/illusionist Eric Giliam. This talented young man and his assistant kept us mesmerized and wondering “how did he do that?” Then the “Bob Hope, Bing Crosby, Red Skelton, Jack Benny & Jimmy Durant” tribute show brought us back to the days of black and white TV and soda in a glass bottle. The audience shared a relaxing, fun evening with neighbors and friends. Our last show of February was a Carpenters Tribute, “Close to You.” This band was flawless; they didn’t miss a beat! Their look and sound was just like watching the legendary Karen Carpenter herself.

RCSC Management Reports are presented at RCSC Board of Directors meeting each month, posted on the website at www.suncityaz.org (under the Recreation Centers), and sent via email to RCSC Cardholders who have signed up to receive RCSC News Alert Emails. These reports were presented to the Board on February 25, 2016.

Project Updates

General Information

- Forty-four cardholders attended a “What’s Working, What’s Not” meeting held at Fairway Center on February 16, 2016. The Assistant General Manager introduced RCSC staff from buildings and infrastructure, operations, clubs and activities and cardholder services. Information was provided regarding 2016 RCSC projects. The floor was then opened to all attendees to share their concerns and questions with RCSC management. The meeting was very constructive and several very good suggestions were shared with RCSC management.
- Twenty-four (24) Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) have now been installed at all Recreation Centers, all golf pro shops, both bowling centers and the Sunbowl Amphitheatre and ballpark. Additionally, Mary Dickenson with Sun City Fire and Medical delivered AED and Chest Compression training to approximately 240 cardholders who volunteered to attend on February 8 and 9, 2016. Plans are now underway to hold more volunteer training sessions with Sun City Fire and Medical. Oakmont Center

- The Oakmont renovation project is scheduled to commence on March 7, 2016 after the Clubs’ Fun Fair has concluded. The project includes exterior stucco of all remaining buildings, rework of soffits and fascia boards, new gutters and downspouts, some new windows and doors, a few sidewalk replacements, installation of an ADA ramp into the Lapidary/Silver club, remodel of the two restrooms by the auditorium and patio repairs. Contractor for this project is Ken McIntyre Construction. (Cost – \$288,000)

Mountain View Center

- The Mini Golf course at Mountain View will be completely re-carpeted in March 2016. Contractor is Floors at the Arizona Design Center (Cost – \$31,330)

Fairway Center

- The tile flooring in front of the Fairway pool showers has been replaced. Contractor was Resource Flooring. (Cost – \$3,456)

Viewpoint Lake

- The large crack in the Viewpoint Lake wall has now been repaired. Contractors for this specific crack repair included Starling-Madison-Loftquist Engineering and Ken McIntyre Construction. (Cost – \$3,619)

- Two additional pedal boats have been purchased for cardholder use on Viewpoint Lake. The new boats allow the RCSC the opportunity to pull the two older pedal boats out of the lake for some much needed repair and maintenance work. Once dock space is increased, the two older boats will be re-launched, joining the two new ones, making four pedal boats available to cardholders and their invited guests.

Lakes West

- Replacement of a 15’ septic leach field pipe, which serves the on-course restrooms by the 13th green at Lakes West has been completed. Due to existing underground utilities and irrigation systems, the work was completed by hand instead of a backhoe. Contractor is Sunland Plumbing. (Cost – \$5,500)

Bell Center

- The wood support structure from which the Liberty Bell hangs has been removed and is currently being refabricated by Bell Woodworking for the cost of materials only. The shop will rebuild the piece from white oak in accordance with structural engineering requirements. Once the new wood support structure is fabricated, the 2,080 pound bell will be reinstalled. Contractors are Starling-Madison-Loftquist structural engineer, Ken McIntyre Construction and Bell Woodworking. (Estimated Cost – \$4,700)

Marinette Center

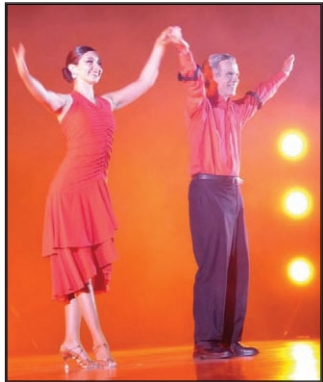
- Two, one at Marinette and one at Mountain View, new 4’ x 8’ Pickleball practice hitting boards were constructed and installed by the Skilled Trades Department. (Cost – \$100)

Skilled Trades Department

- The RCSC Skilled Trades Department completed 203 work orders during the last two weeks of January 2016 and the first two weeks of February 2016.

Centers Operations

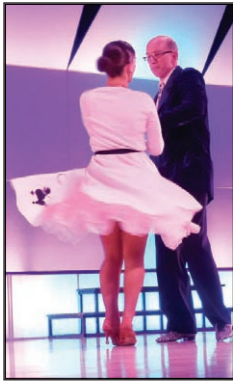

Water Conservation

Saving Water with Aerators

Standard kitchen and/or bathroom faucets use between five and seven gallons of water per minute (gpm). To measure your faucet flow rate, place an empty one gallon milk jug under the faucet and time how many seconds it takes to fill the jug. If it takes 20 seconds or less, you really should use a faucet aerator. For bathrooms, a faucet aerator that slows the flow to 1.0 to 1.5 gpm is more than sufficient for hygiene needs; and in the kitchen, one that uses 2.2 to 2.5 gpm is all that is truly needed for washing dishes. Using these two suggested low-flow faucet aerators can save upwards of 1,100 to 1,500 gallons of water each month, depending upon the size of your household. These aerators usually cost between \$5 and \$10 and can be easily installed by most homeowners.

Meanwhile, standard shower heads delivers around five to eight gpm. That means a five-minute shower can use upwards of 40 gallons of water. Again, that can be determined by using the above-mentioned method, but instead use a bucket marked in one-gallon increments. If you fill a single gallon in 20 seconds or less, you should consider exchanging shower heads. Replacing a standard shower head with a low-flow model cuts your five-minute shower from 40 gallons to 12.5 gallons. An *ultra-low* flow showerhead utilizes 0.8 to 1.5 gpm, reducing average water consumption to 7.5 gallons without sacrificing water pressure. Low-flow showerheads cost anywhere from \$8 to \$50 and can pay for themselves very quickly in water savings.

Thousands of gallons of water can be saved if we all implemented these small changes - saving not only water for future generations but money, too!

Fitness Tips for Seniors -

Fitness Over 50

Carol Knoch works-out on a regular basis at the Bell Fitness Center. She was introduced to the facility through a comprehensive exercise program with personal trainer, Jane Fortier. Jane taught Carol correct form and technique for strength training, so she can achieve maximum results from her efforts. Since muscle dictates metabolism, the more muscle tissue Carol has on her body, the less fat her body will store. In addition, Jane focused on heart-rate and exertion levels with aerobic activity, to improve cardio-pulmonary output. Carol was also introduced to appropriate stretch techniques, to improve flexibility and range-of-motion in a joint. Carol’s total program was tailored to meet personal needs and existing medical issues.
