BOWLING NEWS & NOTES

Now that the summer bowling season has arrived, maintenance on the bowling pinsetters has begun. The bowling mechanic's have begun a maintenance program which includes cleaning, adjusting and rebuilding key components of the bowling pinsetters. Maintenance is expected to be completed by mid-August.

A new summer league began in May at Lakeview Lanes. The new league allows bowlers to experience several different lane conditions throughout the summer season. The league is also beneficial to the bowling centers because feedback is provided from the bowlers which will help the bowling centers make adjustments to provide a condition that is fair in regards to scoring for the upcoming fall bowling season.

BUILDINGS & INFRASTRUCTURE NEWS & NOTES

SOLAR PROJECTS, which include thermal (Water heating) and PV (Electricity producing), are still going through the plan review process with Maricopa County Planning and Development Department. Solar contractors include Wilson Electric for the photovoltaic solar and Priceless Plumbing for thermal solar.

MT. VIEW CENTER Lighting will be installed late this summer around the Mt. View swimming pool and also in two areas within the mini-golf course. Induction type light fixtures installed on light poles will be used for this project. Contractor is Accel Electric. **(Cost – \$40,000)**

FAIRWAY CENTER / SOUTH MAINTENANCE/ QUAIL RUN/ SUNBOWL: Once special order materials arrive, automatic door openers will be installed on (2) doors at the Fairway Library. The two doors include the main library entrance and the unisex restroom. Contractor is Action Entrance. **(Cost – \$4,768)**

The RCSC continues to work with our architect and engineers to produce detailed drawings for the replacement of the South golf maintenance building (The former building was destroyed by a fire). It has been decided that a metal building will be constructed for the South maintenance facility. At the present time, three bids have been received from metal building companies and Bunker Steel was selected as the steel building provider. This selection is important as Bunker Steel Inc. and CCBG Architectural must work together in the development of the final construction drawings. Once the final building plans are completed they will be submitted for permit and released for contractor bids prior to review and approval by the RCSC bid commission.

RE-CARPETING OF THE QUAIL RUN PROSHOP is planned for late summer 2012. In the meantime, some sample carpets were installed at the proshop entrance for testing purposes. More information will be shared later on this project.

Planning and pre-permit work is underway for the replacement of the irrigation systems and turf at the Sunbowl ball park and park area south of the ballfield. Irrigation design, and all civil engineering work, is nearing completion. The RCSC is hoping to submit this project for permit and also send it out for contractor bids by July 3, 2012. After bids are received the entire project will be submitted to the RCSC bid commission for final approval. Contractors currently assigned to this project include: CCBG Architectural, Marvin Mills Irrigation Consulting and Broderick Engineering.

can Septic. **(Cost – PERMIT & SEPTIC WORK \$5,110)**

Planning is underway to replace (2) Riverview pro shop signs. One sign is by the entrance to the main parking lot and the other is across Del Webb Blvd by the #10 tee box. More information will be shared later regarding this project.

MARINETTE CENTER / WB-WC PRO SHOP: Spot repairs to the pool decking at Marinette Center are now completed. Contractor was Desert Rose. **(Cost – \$11,370)**

The WB/WC pro/snack shop parking lot will receive a rubberized overlay soon. The parking lot will also be cleaned and re-stripped following the newly overlaid surface. Contractor is Pinnacle Paving. **(Cost – \$161,803)**

SKILLED TRADES DEPARTMENT: The Skilled Trades department completed 192 work orders during the month of March 2012.

LAKEVIEW CENTER: Both Lakeview Spas remain closed as they are being repaired and upgraded to meet current Maricopa County Environmental Services requirements. The project is currently 85% completed with interior spa work and painting remaining. Contractors are Aquatic Builders and the RCSC Skilled Trades Department. **(Cost – \$164,000)**

The Lakeview lawn bowl greens will receive replacement metal halide light fixtures on top of the existing light poles. The new fixtures will reduce energy costs and supply better light for evening lawn bowling activities. Contractor is Wilson Electric. **(Cost – \$47,686)**

Once materials arrive, new vinyl flooring will be installed in the Lakeview social halls. The new floor will correct the current delaminating problem and greatly reduce maintenance costs. Contractor is Puckett's Flooring. **(Cost – \$38,086)**

BELL CENTER: Architectural drawings for the Bell Wood and Metal shop expansion project are still being developed. Once completed, the drawings will be submitted to Maricopa Planning and Development for permit and also sent to construction companies for competitive bids. Once all bids are received the project will be forwarded to the RCSC bid commission for final approval.

The Bell Library interior lighting retrofit/replacement project is now completed. Contractor for this project was Wilson Electric. **(Cost – \$64,646)**

SUNDIAL CENTER / RIVERVIEW PRO & MAINTENANCE: Planning work for the new back-stage and main-stage curtains for the Sundial auditorium is completed. The new draperies will be ordered as soon as the RCSC bid commission approves this project. Contractors will include S&K Theatrical for the draperies and Sonora Theatre for the removal/installation work. **(APPROXIMATE COST – \$18,000)**

Two 15 Ton mechanical units (HVAC) over the Sundial auditorium will be replaced when new equipment arrives. Contractor is Custom Cooling. **(Cost – \$33,142)**

The defective septic system leach field at the Riverview maintenance facility was recently replaced. This required opening a small area of asphalt in the maintenance parking area, replacement of the leach lines and installing new gravel/fill dirt. Since the parking lot is due for resurfacing this year no asphalt patch was done at this time. Contractor was Ameri-

FINANCIAL NEWS & NOTES

MAY 2012: RCSC HAS ENDED MAY 2012 WELL WITHIN ITS OPERATING AND CAPITAL BUDGET. YEAR-TO-DATE ALL DIVISIONS HAVE EXCEEDED THEIR INCOME BUDGETS. WAGES, PAYROLL TAXES AND BENEFITS ARE BELOW BUDGET YEAR-TO-DATE. AS USUAL, WHILE REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE IS CONSIDERABLY UNDER BUDGET YEAR-TO-DATE, THAT IS STRICTLY A TIMING ISSUE, WHEREBY THOSE PROJECTS WILL BE COMPLETED THROUGHOUT THE REMAINDER OF 2012 AND MOST LIKELY INTO 2013 AS WELL. BOTH UTILITIES AND GENERAL OPERATING EXPENSES HAVE ALSO MANAGED TO COME IN UNDER BUDGET YEAR-TO-DATE. OVERALL OPERATIONS HAVE OPERATED EFFICIENTLY YEAR-TO-DATE.

PAYMENTS MADE BY PROPERTY OWNERS IN OUTSIDE COLLECTIONS CONTINUED TO BE LOW IN MAY AT \$3,885 WITH PAYMENTS FROM 18 PROPERTY OWNERS. DURING MAY OUR INTERNAL COLLECTOR PROCESSED PAYMENTS FROM PAST DUE PROPERTY OWNERS TOTALING \$58,977 AND PROPERTY RELATED TRANSFER FEES TOTALING \$152,297. BOTH OF THESE WERE DOWN FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH

PAYMENTS ON PAST DUE BALANCES IN MAY CONTINUED THE HIGHER TREND AND PAST DUE ASSESSMENT BALANCES DECREASED BY 5.85% DURING THE MONTH. THE CATEGORY WITH THE HIGHEST COLLECTED AMOUNT WAS THE OVER 30 DAY CATEGORY AND RELATES TO THE MARCH BALANCES THAT FIRST WENT PAST DUE LAST MONTH. THE LARGE APRIL ASSESSMENT BILLING TOTAL SAW A LOWER PERCENTAGE GO PAST DUE AT 6.5% OF THE INVOICED AMOUNT. AT THE END OF MAY, OUTSTANDING BALANCES RELATED TO PROPERTY TRANSFERS INCREASED BY 6.5% AND NOW REPRESENT 51% OF RECEIVABLES DUE AND 47% OF PAST DUE BALANCES. BETWEEN THESE TWO FACTORS THE NET ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE TOTAL DID NOT CHANGE FROM APRIL TO MAY.

PROPERTY TRUSTEE SALE NOTICES ON SUN CITY PROPERTIES WAS INCREASED BY 16% IN MAY AND ENDED THE MONTH AT 102 AND MAY INDICATE A TREND FOR INCREASED FORECLOSURES. THE NUMBER OF BANK OWNED PROPERTIES DECREASED AGAIN DOWN TO 74 PROPERTIES OWNED BY LENDERS. BASED UPON THE INCREASED TRUSTEE SALE NOTICES THIS IS EXPECTED TO INCREASE IN THE COMING MONTHS.

Golf News and Notes

COURSES
Golf course fairway aerification is complete and transition to Bermuda is well under way. Please remember that while playing conditions during this time are not ideal. The courses that eliminated the winter rye grass chemically (Riverview, South, Willowbrook and Lakes East) will have very noticeable bare spots. The courses that did not spray will begin experiencing similar conditions as the summer progresses and the rye dies due to heat.

The tee boxes at Riverview are particularly bad; we will be thinning out the dead rye grass with brushes, to give the Bermuda even less competition. This is the second of five applications for Riverview and the other three courses. While the turf conditions are certainly poor, the turf coverage is estimated to be 40% – 50% better than the first application two years ago.

The final green aerification will begin at the courses beginning with Willowbrook on July 26. Please refer to the calendar on the sunaz.com website for the full schedule.

The irrigation project at Lakes West is well under way. The project did experience unexpected delays at the begin-

ning. As with other projects around Sun City, the permitting process with county was more extensive than other similar irrigation projects performed by the contractor. The shallow depth of utilities along the perimeter of the course has resulted in much of the work having to be completed by hand. We were unable to isolate the current irrigation system in the ways we had planned, altering our plans of placing the new main line first. We had planned to tie the current irrigation system into the new main line as worked progressed, enabling us to maintain proper moisture levels. After a full loop of main line had been placed the new lateral lines and sprinkler heads would have been installed and work would have progressed to the next loop. The main line will now be installed in much smaller sections, followed by the lateral lines and sprinkler heads. The size of the work force will also increase in July. We are confident that the new plan along with additional labor will allow the project to be completed on schedule in early September.

PRO SHOPS
Revenue for May was disappointing and slowed some of the momentum of winter and early spring. Total revenue

was 5% behind budget or \$15,892. Merchandise was the only category to exceed budget. While many factors control our revenue potential, weather will always remain at the top of the list. The lack of rainfall year-to-date has allowed us to grow our revenue and a considerably warmer May than previous year, decreased revenues.

Year to date revenue is \$50,598 ahead of budget and nearly \$79,000 ahead of prior year. Public play continues to not meet budgeted expectations. We are in the process of streamlining our interface with Golf Now. Through streamlining, the times unused by our residents will be released in a more efficient manner. It is hoped that this efficiency will result in more sold tee times.

SNACK SHOPS
Snack shop revenue, at the courses for May, finished \$1,438 ahead of budget. Snack Shops year-to-date, are just over \$19,000 ahead of budget and just over \$21,000 ahead of prior year. Snack Shops are on their summer schedule and are closing at 1:00 p.m., the Snack Shop at Lakes East/West is closing at 11:00 a.m. due to the ongoing irrigation project.

NORTH GOLF COURSE MASTER PLAN UNDERWAY

North is the most historic golf course in the Sun City community, and much is being considered in the master plan development that is now underway. Senior Golf Architect, Gary Brawley, of Tripp Davis and Associates will begin the tedious and arduous process of developing a master plan for RCSC's North golf course. As has been the history of other master plan procedures, Mr. Brawley will meet with and discuss the options with the North course's green committee. However, there is much to be done prior to that meeting as a team of consultants have been hired by the RCSC.

Tripp Davis and Associates will serve as the lead consultant for the RCSC and will coordinate the work to be provided. Survey Innovation Group will utilize aerial topography to develop a contour map of the course. The data they will be providing will be vital in dealing with the surface drainage patterns of the golf course. Erickson & Meeks Engineering will employ a civil engineer on the project to consult on grading and drainage as well as assist in our permitting process with Mari-

copa County. Marvin Mills Design, irrigation consultant, will be involved during the master planning process to find creative means in which the new irrigation design can be incorporated with the golf course improvements to save money. Native Resources, tree specialists, will be used to tag and inventory trees, along with reviewing the health of the trees and providing RCSC with specific recommendations for each individual tree. The goal is to reduce the considerable damage the North course suffers during any significant wind storm and add new trees, as necessary, to maintain course strategy.

"We are really excited to start on the North course," stated Gary Brawley, "although it will require considerably more consultants, the RCSC has retained consultants with relative golf experience that will be extremely valuable and we are confident the end result will be great for all concerned!"

As the donation is presented to Commander Richie Miller, Craig Brown explains, The Sheriff's Posse of Sun City does an invaluable service for the whole community, "they are such a strong deterrent of crime." The Sun City Posse has the primary function of crime prevention in Sun City and to act as the eyes and ears of the Maricopa County Sheriff's Office. Although the Posse is a separate non-profit organization, they operate under the direct authorization of the office of the Sheriff of Maricopa County and are subject to call when needed to assist the Sheriff's Office in or out of Sun City. They not receive any County, State, or Federal funds to carry out the programs of the Posse. On October 1 of each year a letter is sent to each homeowner in Sun City asking

them to support the Posse. The Posse is extremely grateful for the generous support that allows them to carry on their programs and to help maintain one of the lowest crime rates in the nation. The Posse is constantly seeking ways to improve and upgrade their services to the community and with your continued support these programs will be accomplished in the years to come. Since all Posse members are unpaid volunteers, the savings to the taxpayers is a very significant sum.
