Marinette Expansion - Past, Present and Future

When homes in Phase 3 of Sun City were originally purchased, salesmen from the Del Webb Development Corporation (DEVCO) were quick to show on the map where the "future" recreation center would be at 99th and Union Hills. Residents at the time were content to use the Bell Center until "theirs" was constructed.

Due to construction cost overruns at Bell, plans for what would be Sun City's northern most recreation center were quietly cancelled. Upon hearing this news, homeowners in the area let it be known they were unhappy and being short-changed. DEVCO acquiesced by building a very small center on the planned site which opened in 1980. Two meetings rooms, four tennis courts and a swimming pool so small it was heated by bottled gas rendering it all but unusable except in the warmer months.

Within a few years, additional amenities were added to Marinette and the facilities were upgraded. This included the fitness room, bocce and horseshoe courts, jogging track and mini-golf – all lighted for night use. Natural gas was brought in to adequately heat the pool. The crafts building was completed in 1984.

Fast Forward to 2014

Thirty years later, work has begun on the Marinette Center once again. An extensive expansion and renovation project has started that will once again showcase the amenities, facilities and activities Sun Citians have grown to expect and appreciate. Highlights of this project include expanded lobby and seating area, expansion of the fitness center (to 4,000 s.f.), a rubberized walking track, 20 pickleball courts (eight which will be under a permanent shade pavilion), an outdoor spa with shade sail, expanded horseshoe courts, half court basketball area, new restrooms for fitness and

pickleball, thermal solar systems for pool and shower water preheating, security walls and fencing, pool shower room improvements, new doors and windows, and exterior stucco on all of the buildings.


It is anticipated that this project will take approximately seven months to complete. During this construction period, the auditorium, social hall and clubs building at Marinette remain unaffected except for a 4-6 week closure while the windows, doors and stucco work are being done. Cardholders will be kept informed as the project progresses.

To The Future

While neighborhood centers were the original concept in Sun City, most Cardholders these days understand the benefit of utilizing all of the RCSC facilities available for their fitness and recreational needs. Having every activity offered at every Center is no longer realistic or feasible.

RCSC looks forward to continuing to provide the broadest range of recreational and social facilities possible to enhance the active lifestyle and well-being of our residents. Marinette will be there for future residents when this project is complete – and not just for those living north of Bell.



Golf Report

Pro Shops - Golf rounds for May were flat compared to prior year; however Green Fee revenues increased slightly. Resident and Guest play account for 95% of the rounds played year-to-date. For the year 248,789 rounds have been played on our courses.

For those that may not be aware After 5:00 Cards are available for purchase by RCSC card holders. The cards allow residents to play after pro shops are closed for the day. Cards are sold for \$44.00 to RCSC cardholders and sold for \$12 to RCSC Cardholders that purchase the surcharge pass on an annual basis. Please remember to carry your After 5:00 Card during your round, they serve as your receipt should a Ranger be on duty. Irrigation start times vary by the efficiency of each course's irrigation system, this time of year they are set for as late a start as possible.

We have recently begun including upcoming events, tee sheet start types, etc., as part of a weekly email - Your Sun City AZ Week. The email includes information for the upcoming week in which it is sent, as well as the following week. We are hopeful this will prove to be a useful tool for planning of tee times.

Snack Shops - Due to increased costs, menu pricing in the snack shops has recently been adjusted. New menu pricing can be found online at www.sunaz.com or in the snack shops. We have recently added a new menu item as a trial, Mike's Hard Lemonade. We continue to thank everyone for their support of the snack

Courses - Aerification of fairways and tees using a 3/4 inch tines is complete and the annual rye grass used for overseeding has checked out. During this period of transition, we remind everyone that playing conditions will not be ideal. Conditions will vary depending on the efficiency of the golf course's irrigation system. Watering a "hot spot" to recover turf coverage, often leads to overwatering otherwise healthy areas. The overwatering will lead to saturated wet spots. We appreciate everyone's patience as we move through transition.

In conjunction with watering; practice tees, fairways and roughs have been fertilized with ammonium sulfate to promote bermuda growth.

Green aerification began July 7 at Willowbrook and continue through August 1 at Lakes West, the full schedule can be found at www.sunaz.com, under golf.

North is coming along well with grassing being completed on holes 1-13 and the practice green. A key factor in watching sprigs grow in is patience as the first 30 days is very slow, and then there is a lot of rolling, fertilizing, mowing and filling over the next 60 to 90 days. They are on target to be ready for opening day, so please keep this mind. As reminded in a recent email, we implore everyone to refrain from touring the course during this critical time, thank you.

Renovation to the Quail Bunkers began June 23. This small project is designed to make the bunkers more accessible and more playable. Though the design concept is different, the bunkers will be built with the method of the North bunkers.



Summer Care for Bowling Equipment

Now that summer is here, it is time to protect your bowling equipment. Sometimes we learn the lesson the hard way. Bowling balls should not be stored in your garage or the trunk of your car. Extreme temperatures (hot and cold) and rapid temperature changes can cause the bowling ball to crack, rendering it useless. Extreme heat can

also cause the bowling ball to "sweat;" bowling balls absorb lane conditioner and heat will cause the ball to "sweat" and become slippery.

Don't take the chance, store your equipment properly. As you know, bowling equipment can be quite expensive. We recommend storing your equipment in a controlled environment such as a locker at the bowling center or inside your home.

Bowling Fun Facts - Did you know...

- 1. Bowling equipment was found in an Egyptian pharaoh's tomb (estimated 5200BC).
- 2. Recorded history shows in 200AD, German sport included rolling stones at wooden clubs called kegels; German bowlers are still called "Keglers" on occasion.
- 3. The British were bowling as early as 1100AD. In fact, King Edward the III (r. 1327–1377) banned his troops from lawn bowling as they were becoming too distracted from their archery practice. King Henry the Eighth (r. 1509-1547) was said to be a fan of the game and reportedly used a cannonball as a bowling ball.



- 4. The traditional German version of the game was an outdoor sport known as "skittles." This game was the forerunner of more modern forms of bowling.
- 5. In the 1600s, Americans were introduced to bowling by Dutch settlers. Called "Dutch Pins," bowling became so popular that it (supposedly) gave Bowling Green in New York its name.
- 6. The first indoor bowling lanes were built in New York City in 1840.
- 7. Ninepin bowling was banned in the entire state of Connecticut in 1841 as the sport began to be associated with truancy, gambling, and crime. This reportedly led to the invention of tenpin bowling by those circumventing the law. "Certainly we are not breaking the law, officer! Look, we are not bowling at nine pins!"
- 8. The standardized rules for tenpin bowling were established on September 9, 1895 in New York City.
- 9. Outside of soccer, bowling is now the most popular sport and there is an active movement to make the game an Olympic sport. And why not, when bowling has been the sport of Egyptian pharaohs, soldiers and English kings?

Candidate Packets Available at Corporate

There is still plenty of time to pick up a Candidate Packet for the upcoming 2015 RCSC Board of Directors vacancies. You may obtain your packet at the Corporate/Board Office located on the lower level of Lakeview Center (Red Entrance). In order to collect a packet, you must inquire in person and present a valid RCSC Member card.

While there is still ample time to submit a packet, this is a reminder that a completed RCSC petition with 100 or more valid signatures (signatures from RCSC Members that are in good standing) is a requirement. The completed petition, along with other forms provided in the Candidate Packet, must be submitted to the Corporate Office no later than noon on Wednesday, October 1, 2014.

Requirements to become a candidate are:

- Must be at least fifty-five (55) years of age;
- Must not be related by marriage or birth to any other member of the Board, Senior Management Staff, or Board Candidate;
- Must be a Deeded Real Estate Owner of property in Sun City, Maricopa County, Arizona as well as a resident of Sun City;
- Must be a Member in good standing;
- Must reside in Sun City, Arizona and be available at least ten (10) months of the year;
- Must meet the requirement to hold an Arizona liquor license;
- Must be eligible and available to serve a three (3) year term; and
- Must attend Board Candidate Orientation(s).

A Board Candidate that withdraws from his/her candidacy for any or no reason may not elect to re-establish candidacy in the same election year.

A successful candidate will:

- Have a strong desire to serve Sun City;
- Be fair and courteous;
- Use good common sense;
- · Have good communication skills;
- Be willing to work as part of a team;
- Ability to prioritize policy and projects; which will have the greatest benefit for the most members; and
- Be willing and able to dedicate the necessary hours to be an effective Director.

Candidates will be introduced at both the October and November Board meetings (held on the 4th Thursday) and two candidate forums which will be held in the fall. Dates will be announced at a later time.



In an earlier commentary I wrote about the importance of volunteers in the history and maintenance of Sun City as the premier senior active adult community. There are so many organizations I could not give credit to in that article, so let's look at some of the others and their contributions.

The most visible of these organizations is the Sun City Posse. These volunteers provide an invaluable service to the safety and

security of our community. The Posse is a link to the Maricopa County Sheriff's office in times of emergency, provide traffic control in medical and accident emergencies, and assist in traffic flow at major events such as the Sun Bowl, Sundial concerts, etc. Their Vacation Watch Program helps our winter residents during summer absences.

The Sun City Homeowners Association is a voluntary membership organization open to all Sun City residents. For only \$20 annual membership dues we know the SCHOA will be protecting our property values by enforcing our CC&Rs, providing a link to the Maricopa County Department of Transportation, and

maintains a vendor referral list that includes contractor services for home improvements, etc. We all need to support SCHOA with our minimal annual dues.

The SC CAN (Community Assistance Network) is another great volunteer organization. No one is disappointed with their IRS tax assistance and other tax related assistance. These volunteers go the extra mile to assist all who need advice in this field. The SC CAN also helps qualified residents in learning about and obtaining benefits assistance from a number of entities. In addition, they work




with a County Tax Assessor representative who can help residents in the CAN office with property tax matters as well as free legal consultations.

My impression is that the many members of the golfing community in Sun City are so proud of their facilities that they do not hesitate to volunteer in many ways. Every golf course has its

Selected representatives of these individual committees meet monthly with their counterparts from other courses in the RCSC Golf Advisory Committee, one of the largest committees of the RCSC. In the meeting they discuss course conditions, the Director of Golf's report, and recommendations for the future of each course. In addition, the representatives of the Sun City's Women's and Men's Golf Associations present their reports, requests, etc. Thanks to each of these individuals for giving up some of the time they could be golfing to be present in these important meetings.

Another large and very important committee of volunteers is the RCSC Properties Committee, who meet several times a year with reports of their tour and review of our facilities and suggestions for improvement. Perhaps the next largest committee is the Club Organizations Committee (COC) made up of volunteer members who give of their time to help their assigned clubs to deal with questions, etc., and provide help with individual problems. These committee members often encounter unique challenges, and we owe them a special vote of appreciation. Since there are over 120 clubs in Sun City, the COC representative provides an important link for between the clubs to and the Board of Directors.

An individual who epitomizes the volunteer spirit is Mike Lindquist, a long-time Sun City resident who for several years has taken on the persona of Uncle Sam. No patriotic event here would be complete without him. In addition, he donates his time to take Uncle Sam to schools and civic events in nearby communities. Updates

Financial Report:

We completed May within our operating and capital budget year-to-date. Again a reminder that our assessment income shows it is under budget year-to-date. However, it is a budget timing error that will level out over the summer. Each division has operated within its operating budget through May 31, 2014.

Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments in May were at the monthly average for the past year. April billings went past due at a rate of 6.0%, which is increased from last month, but similar to March, is below the rate for last two years. March balances went 60 days past due at a rate of just 2.3%, following the direction from last month.

Total accounts receivables decreased by 4.9% in May. Since the beginning of the year total account receivables have decreased by 10% and over 60 day balances have decreased by 5.8%. Outstanding balances related to property transfers decreased by 9.5% in May and continue to represent 54% of all receivables due and past due balances. Offsetting to last month, the decrease in accounts receivables in May is most attributable to this decrease in property transfer balances.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties increased to 49 properties at the end of May. The number of properties owned by lending institutions decreased slightly to 70 this month, although there was turnover on specific properties.

Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in May totaled \$587,500, which is \$167,500 more than budget. Year-to-date PIF fees are \$3,168,978, which is \$1,305,978 over budget for the year.

Bowling Centers:

Bell Lanes has begun monthly summer No-Tap bowling tournaments which are held the last Sunday of each month and end the last Sunday of September with a Scotch Doubles tournament. All bowlers are welcome whether USBC certified or not.

On August 2, 2014, Bell Lanes will be hosting our first ever Baker format tournament; Baker format is an entirely different format than what bowlers are used to. The teams will consist of three people and all three people will bowl alternating frames in the same game. This should be a fun tournament and is open to all USBC certified

Join us for Fun Day Fridays at Lakeview Lanes at 12 noon! Cost is \$10 per person. Bowlers shoot at colored pins for cash and prizes. Around forty bowlers per week have been enjoying this great event!

Human Resources:

HR is holding the 2nd quarter 401(k) enrollment meeting this week. Since enrolling

the returning golf maintenance staff and other newly eligible staff into the plan on January 1 and the recent fund performance, total plan assets have increased from \$972,000 to \$1,030,250.

We continue to add new staff to our team. With preparation for re-opening North Golf Course, we are recruiting for additional greens workers. As budgeted for 2014, we have added a plumber to our Skilled Trades staff and are currently recruiting for a Facilities Attendant Supervisor. Current RCSC employees receive first consideration for all open positions.

Project Updates

General Centers Projects and Information

Plans are underway to design and install (12) electronic signs at RCSC Centers and the Sun Bowl Amphitheatre with the exception of Sundial which already has electronic signs. (Some locations will have two signs installed while others like Oakmont and the Sun Bowl will receive only one.) Most of the signs will be constructed using a high profile style to improve visibility. In addition, there will be one non-electronic sign placed at Bell Center, along the North end of 99th Ave, to advertise the library, restaurant, visitor's center and Bell Lanes. Sign construction and installation for each location will commence as the set back variances and permits are



approved by Maricopa County Planning and Development Department. The total project is expected to be completed in early 2015. Contractor is Bootz and Duke Signs. (PIF Cost - \$782,103)

Mt. View Center

The foam roof over the Mt View auditorium was repaired, sealed and re-coated. Contractor was Starkweather Roofing. (Cost – \$54,553)

Oakmont Center / North Pro Shop

The Oakmont pool/spa, equipment building and Facility Attendant Station project is in its final stages of construction. If all goes well the new pool and spa are expected to open in early July 2014 rather than late June, as previously reported, due to delays



in applying the acrylic deck surface. Remaining work includes the interior Pebble Sheen finish inside the pool and spa, installation of all stainless steel railings and stabilizing the water chemistry prior to final inspections by the health department. Contractors to date include: CCBG Architectural, K.L. McIntyre Construction and Aquatic Builders. (PIF Cost – \$777,069)

Permits have been secured and a construction contractor will be hired soon to demolish the North Golf patio cover and construct a larger patio cover. The new patio cover will provide shade for more golfers to enjoy time together. Contractor selection and PIF cost for this project will be included in my next report.

Quail Run Maintenance

The Quail Run maintenance yard is currently being re-paved and cement pads installed for bulk sand and materials storage. Contractor is Regional Paving. (Cost – \$34,135)

Lakeview Center

Installation of new LED low voltage lighting on the Lakeview Waterfall is now completed. Contractor was Accel Electric. (Cost - \$11,256)

The foam roof over Georges Café and the South bowling entrance was repaired, sealed and re-coated. Contractor was Starkweather Roofing. (Cost - \$47,555)

Sundial Center/Riverview Pro Shop/Lakes Maintenance

The (2) layers of roofing over the Sundial auditorium and vestibule were removed and a new built up and coated roof was installed. Contractor was Progressive Roofing. (Cost – \$234,775)

The Riverview pro shop was re-carpeted with 100% nylon carpet squares. Contractor was Resource Carpet of Arizona and RCSC staff. (Cost – \$7,690)

Asphalt at the Lakes Maintenance facility was seal coated. Contractor was Pinnacle Paving. (Cost – \$5,868)

Bell Center

A pre-application meeting was required by Maricopa County zoning department to discuss options regarding light pole heights and set back requirements along Boswell Blvd. The meeting was not very productive from an RCSC perspective however Lloyd

Engineering and myself determined a way of moving the courts about 9' to the North thereby eliminating the zoning departments code concerns. The RCSC Board of Directors approved our idea and on June 23, 2014 the revised plans were re-submitted to Maricopa County Planning and Development. We are hopeful that the permit for this project will be awarded without more required plan corrections from other sections of the building department. The project includes demolition of the current (8) tennis courts and the installation of (10) new tennis courts. The new updated complex will also include a shaded gathering area, courtside canopies with benches, water and electric to each court, tables and benches for spectators and planters in the common areas. Contractors to date include Lloyd Sports Engineering as architect and project manager and Sunland Sports as building contractor. (PIF Cost – \$1,778,074)

The Bell Pools, Spa and outdoor shower rooms that were closed on May 5, 2014 to resurface the cool decking, make repairs to the pools and spas and repair the shower areas in the outside locker/shower rooms re-opened on Friday, June 20, 2014. Contractors included Spartan Concrete, Aquatic Builders, Ken McIntyre Construction, Utility staff at Bell Center and the RCSC Grounds Crew. (Estimated Cost – \$85,000 plus shower room repair costs of approximately \$45,000)

The foam roof over the Bell Library was repaired, sealed and re-coated. Contractor was Starkweather Roofing. (Cost – \$50,749)

The Bell aerobics room received a new cushioned engineered floating hardwood floor which makes this floor much more Sun City friendly for those who use this room for aerobic exercise. Contractor was Puckett's Flooring. (Cost – \$17,727)

The two 100 gallon domestic hot water heaters providing hot water for the showers inside the fitness building are being replaced with (5) new Ranai tank less water heaters. This tank less technology is working out very well on the outside pool shower rooms at Bell so the same equipment is being used again to replace these two worn out water heaters. Contractor is Sunland Plumbing. (Cost – \$22,280)

Carpet was replaced in the space occupied by the Sun City Visitors center. Contractor was Resource Carpet of Arizona and the Bell Utility Worker staff. (Cost – \$4,808)

Marinette Center

The Marinette Center expansion and renovation project is underway with the June 23rd closures of mini golf, horseshoes and Pickleball. Demolition of these areas will commence immediately after the closures occur. After the closure of the pool, fitness center and spa building on June 30, 2014 these areas will also be demolished. The Marinette Center expansion and renovation project includes a 4,000 s.f. fitness center,

rubberized walking track, a total of 20 Pickleball courts, an outdoor spa, thermal solar systems for pool water and shower water pre-heating, new doors, new windows and exterior stucco of all remaining buildings. Contractors to date include: CCBG Architectural and Robert Porter Construction. (PIF Cost – \$4,387,373)

The roof on the Marinette clubs building was repaired sealed and re-coated. Contractor was Starkweather roofing. (Cost – \$28,277)



Skilled Trades Department

The RCSC Skilled Trades department completed 127 work orders during the last half of May 2014 and the 1st half of June 2014.

Grounds Department

The RCSC Grounds team continued with their routine maintenance work at all Centers, the Sun Bowl/Ballfield and the (7) lawn bowling greens. They also were instrumental in repairing the irrigation systems and planting shrubs in the Bell pool area prior to its reopening.

The Libraries apologize for any inconvenience that this may cause any of their faithful patrons but it will be a big improvement for both Libraries. Please be patient.





"Fishing" for Volunteers to Help Build Habit

Turning the lake adjacent to Lakeview Center into a jewel in the desert and sport fishing oasis is the goal of the Viewpoint Lake Management Plan, and Members are being encouraged to "jump on board" as we start to construct fish habitat this fall.

Those volunteering will work with Eric Swanson of Swanson Solutions, whose 5-year plan for the lake was approved by the RCSC Board of Directors at their June 26 meeting.

While the 33-acre man-made lake is healthy and with good water quality, the report confirmed what many have known for some time - sport fishing ranks poorly due to lack of habitat. The report recommendations calling upon residents to help construct fish habitat with "catchy" names such as fingerling fortresses, catfish condos, pipe palaces and bass bungalows in addition to gravel spawning beds and hanging habitat from piers and docks

Fish habitat building projects will start later this year and Members wishing to participate will be called upon to work in teams. All of the materials (such as PVC piping and plastic mesh) will be environmentally safe and long-lasting. Once in place, they will not interfere with the other lake activities including boating.


Why Did We Move To Sun City?
