Season Tickets and Reserved Table Seating at Sundial for 2016

In an effort to improve customer service and better accommodate Cardholder expectations, RCSC is pleased to announce that all ticketed shows in 2016 will have reserved cabaret-style table seating in the Sundial Auditorium.

With a great line-up of entertainment scheduled for next year that includes tributes to some of the biggest names in the music industry – from Bob Seger and the Carpenters to Roy Orbison, Reba McEntire, Garth Brooks, Rod Stewart and Cher – reserved seating means no more arriving hours early and waiting in line until the doors open.

Season tickets, which will be available from November 2 through November 30, are being sold to RCSC Cardholders only for the unbelievable price of \$154 – that's only \$14 per person for each show (11 shows total) – for a savings of \$33.

Season ticket holders will have the same seat guaranteed for every show and as an added incentive, you'll also have that same reserved seat for five free shows that take place in the Sundial Auditorium, including the very popular Dancing with the Sun City Stars in February and the amazing Christmas Extravaganza in December.

RCSC Cardholders may purchase season tickets beginning Monday, November 2 at the Lakeview Clubs Office, Monday through Friday from 8:30am to 4:00pm or by phone at 623-561-4660. RCSC accepts Visa, MasterCard or Discover in addition to cash and personal checks.

While it is understood that all Cardholders may not be available to attend every show, season tickets (including the free shows) are transferrable to others for your convenience.

Beginning on December 1, tickets for individual shows will go on sale. Tickets are priced \$17 per person for RCSC Cardholders, \$20 per person for non-Cardholders. Again, with reserved seating, you'll be able to arrive at your leisure with less hassle than ever before.

All 2016 Sundial shows begin at 7pm and doors will still open at 6pm. Gourmet food vendors will arrive 1-1/2 hours prior to show time for those wishing to grab a bite before each concert.

Board of Directors Election Update**Signature Gathering by Candidates Continues**

RCSC Cardholders are reminded that Members seeking to become candidates in this year's Board of Director elections may be soliciting signatures on RCSC properties over the next several months. There will be three vacancies to fill in the December election, with each vacancy being a 3-year term.

Those interested in becoming a candidate must request a packet in person and present their RCSC Member card at the Corporate/Board Office at Lakeview Center. The deadline for packet submissions is no later than noon on Friday, October 2.

Requirements to become a RCSC Board candidate are:

- Must be at least fifty-five (55) years of age;
- Must not be related by marriage or birth to any other member of the Board, Senior Management Staff, or Board Candidate;
- Must be a Deeded Real Estate Owner of property in Sun City, Maricopa County, Arizona;
- Must be a Member in good standing;
- Must reside in Sun City, Arizona and be available at least ten (10) months of the year;
- Must meet the requirements to hold an Arizona liquor license (RCSC holds liquor licenses which require Board officers to be included on the licensing);

- Must be eligible and available to serve a three (3) year term; and
- Must be available to attend Board Candidate Orientation(s).

Candidates must also submit a fully completed RCSC petition, signed by 100 or more Members in good standing, along with all other forms provided in the RCSC Candidate Packet.

A successful candidate will:

- Have a strong desire to serve Sun City;
- Be fair and courteous;
- Use good common sense;
- Have good communication skills;

- Be willing to work as part of a team;
- Ability to prioritize - policy and projects; which will have the greatest benefit for the most members; and
- Be willing and able to dedicate the necessary hours to be an effective Director.

Candidates will be introduced at both the October and November Board meetings and at two candidate forums that will be held in the fall. Forum locations and dates will be announced at a later time.

Golf Report

Pro Shops

Total rounds for May were down slightly from prior year, however revenue did increase. The percentage of public play year-to-date is consistent with recent trends, with less than 5% of total rounds played by public players. For the year 172,057 rounds have been played on our courses.

With longer daylight hours, this is the time of year we like to remind our residents that After 5:00 cards are available for purchase in the pro shops. The cards allow residents to play after pro shops are closed for the day. Cards are sold for \$44 to RCSC Cardholders and sold for \$12 to RCSC Cardholders that purchase the surcharge pass on an annual basis. Please remember to carry your After 5:00 card during your round, they serve as your receipt should a Ranger be on duty. Irrigation start times vary by the efficiency of each course's irrigation system, this time of year they are set for as late a start as possible.

Snack Shops

Snack shop hours have now changed to summer operating hours and now have 1:00 p.m. for a closing time. After the snack shops are closed, the pro shops have a limited selection of beverages and snacks available for sale.

Courses

With the extended cooler weather, the normal transition from winter rye to summer bermuda was later than normal. The fairway aerification and suddenly hot temperatures has pushed out any remaining rye grass. Conditions will vary depending on the efficiency of the golf course's irrigation system and the strength of the rye overseed. Watering a "hot spot" to recover turf coverage, often leads to overwatering otherwise healthy areas. The overwatering will lead to saturated wet spots. We appreciate everyone's patience as we move through transition.

Green aerification will begin July 6 at South and continue through July 28 at Willowbrook. Though originally scheduled, the greens at North will not be core aerified. Therefore North will remain open for play on July 13 and July 14. The full aerification schedule can be found at www.sunaz.com, under golf.

The Riverview renovation project is progressing as scheduled, with grassing complete on the front nine and in process on the back nine. The newly planted sprigs have responded well and are actively growing. Much of the process of growing in greens, is patience, though there is also rolling and fertilizing. After the greens have been established and watering scaled back, mowing will begin, along with continued fertilization. For a successful grow-in, the newly planted sprigs need to be saturated and remain moist day and night. We have had many incidents of curious residents driving through the course, into heavily saturated, newly

Architect's Report

Riverview Renovation Update

Grassing of the Riverview Golf Course finished about two weeks ahead of schedule. We are already seeing the benefits of the increased heat and humidity as the grass is really taking root. The maintenance staff is doing a great job with the grow-in and several third party turf consultants have come by to review and they have all completed the grow-in taking place. Again, please help us and stay off the golf course as every time the maintenance staff has to take time to repair damage that is time they are taking away from other projects they are working on to get the golf course in shape for a fall opening.

planted areas. The results of this curiosity result in hundreds of dollars of repairs, we implore everyone to remain off the course for the duration of the renovation.

As a reminder, the greens at Riverview will not be over-seeded for the upcoming winter season. Therefore, the greens will perform similarly to the North greens this past season. The greens will have pigment applied, to give them color through their dormancy. The greens will be firm and will become firmer throughout the season. The greens will look the worst in April and May, before they begin actively growing. It will be a full 18 to 24 months for the greens to begin playing as expected.

Lawn Bowling

New to the report this month is a lawn bowl report. The renovation to the Lakeview Lawn Bowl greens is nearing completion, with the west green expected to be sprigged the week of June 29. In order to give the best chance for a successful grow-in, we have put in place a temporary, diesel powered pump to assist with watering. This augmented irrigation system will ensure that the newly planted sprigs receive enough water to keep them moist day and night. Improper drainage and undesired grasses were two reasons for this renovation to take place. Both greens now have the proper profile for drainage, a herringbone system to gather the water and a 20 foot hurricane hole collect the water. The greens will be sprigged with tiff-dwarf Bermuda grass, the same surface as the Bell Lawn Bowl Greens. The project is proceeding as scheduled with final grassing to be in place by mid-July and the greens ready for use for the upcoming fall/winter season.

The remaining lawn bowl greens have been aerated, top dressed and fertilized. Another round of aeration, top dressing and fertilizing will take place in July. Once humidity has increased the Bell Lawn Bowl greens will be planed, to remove uneven surfaces.

Grounds

Tree trimming is underway and continued cleanup from rains earlier in the month. Tree and shrubs have been planted at Lakeview. The soft ball field has been aerated and additional 1/4 minus ground gravel has been added to the walking track at the Sun Bowl.

AZ Gals Bring Home Diamond Division Title

This past June, an unlikely mix of ladies (including two league bowlers from Sun City AZ's very own Lakeview Lanes) joined forces in Reno, NV while participating in the 96th Annual Women's USBC National Tournament.

The team, bowling in the Diamond Division (725 and above averages, 4 person team), was brought together with the help of social media and some unplanned injuries. In April, team captain Brenda Burns (who has bowled two 300 games at Bell Lanes) was contacted by two team mates informing her they would be unable to compete due to injury. As time was short, Brenda reached out to the bowling community via Facebook. She received a few single responses; however, she was ultimately looking for a pair of bowlers. As luck would have it, Shannon Pluhowsky (age 32), a two-time collegiate All American for the University of Nebraska, three-time Professional Women's

Bowling Association (PWBA) title holder, including the USBC Queens, 15-time Team USA member and high average in the nation for women at 245 was looking to bowl along with her very talented partner Megan Kelly. With 45-300 games and 45-800 series to her credit, Shannon comes from a long line of bowlers the includes her grandfather, William (Bill) Hawk, who is in the AZ Hall Of Fame, as well as her father and mother who have several local and state titles between them. As Shannon is from the Phoenix area she knew Brenda through local bowling events and leagues.

Shannon and Megan Kelly now reside in Dayton, OH, run a local bowling establishment and when they aren't on the bowling lanes, they are busy with their 2-year old daughter, Autumn (who will likely be bowling before too long). Megan (age 30), comes from a long line of bowlers as well. Most notably is her mother Linda Kelly who spent many years on the PWBA tour and is a four-time national title holder. Megan currently averages an impressive 219 and will be competing on the newly revamped PWBA tour. She has 3-300 games and 2-800 series, along with several city and state titles.

The youngest member of the team, Megan Withey (age 29), also bowls here at Lakeview, along with Brenda, on Thursdays in the Sun City Scratch Classic league. Megan has been bowling since the ripe old age of 4. She joined the competitive ranks a few years ago. In that short time, Megan has earned two city team titles and earlier this year won the All Events title in Arizona State with an impressive 2052 for nine games. She currently averages 215 and has 3-300 games and a high series of 748.

Rounding out the group is team captain and senior bowler, Brenda Burns (50). Brenda currently averages 219, and has multiple city and state titles to her name. Brenda began bowling in Milwaukee at the age of 8, competed for Arizona State University and was inducted into the Phoenix City Hall of Fame (2002) and the State of Arizona Hall of Fame (2004). Brenda has 6-300 games to her credit along with a high series of 797.

This team of unusual suspects found instant team chemistry and took it to the lanes like they were on a mission.

The Women's National Tournament runs from April through June in Reno, NV and as the tournament was winding down, the previous lead of 2634 seemed a daunting task, but with a first game of 916, the team was on track to pursue the title. The second game they only got better with an impressive tournament high team game of 960 (4th highest game in tournament history). By the third game, the lanes began to transition and the challenge was on for the team. They held it together and not only took the lead, but eclipsed the previous 2634 by 83 pins. The 2717 posted by AZ Gals is the 3rd highest team set posted since the USBC changed the format to four-person teams.

Congratulations ladies! Way to mix youth and experience to prevail in the nation's most prestigious women's amateur event and show them that AZ Gals know how to roll.

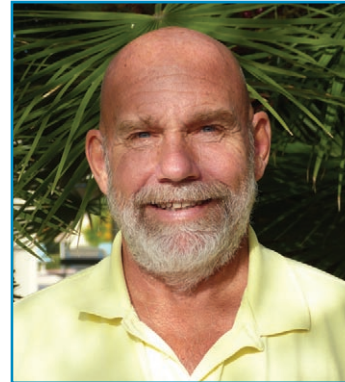
A new twist to this patriotic celebration was added just a few years ago when we invited Ring That Bell attendees to stay afterwards for an "Indoor Picnic" that includes music and dancing, games and prizes, providing an opportunity to enjoy the company of friends, family and neighbors. A record crowd of more than 550 this year shows that this is likely a tradition that will continue for a long while.



Concerts have always been a great entertainment value in Sun City AZ and the last few years have seen attendance at shows dramatically increase with great tribute acts and musical artists bringing record crowds to the Sun Bowl. Concerns from Cardholders that many attending these events were from outside of Sun City AZ prompted the Board to address this issue and Member or Privilege Cards will now be required to gain entry to all non-ticketed (free) RCSC shows and events.

The free concerts at Sundial over the summer provided two spectacular nights of entertainment. In June, Heartbeat from Tucson, AZ had the crowd on their feet with classic rock greats while The Main Event Band in July delighted the audience with the

big band sound which proved to be a swinging good time. These shows provided not only a couple of occasions to escape the heat, but also afforded RCSC staff an opportunity to begin instituting the "card must be presented for entry" requirement. Very few people attending came with only their key fobs and were gently reminded that for access to all future free events their Member or Privilege Card with photo would be required. The overwhelming sentiment is that many Cardholders are thrilled with this change as some were no longer attending concerts since even finding a place to sit had become too difficult.

Updates

Financial Report:

We have ended May 2015 within our operating and capital budget. Again all divisions, excluding golf, have met their operating and expense goals. The golf division ended May 2015 just shy of a \$70k negative variance from budget year to date.

Cardholder Services:

While payments on past due assessments increased in May from the prior month the overall past due assessments increased slightly in May by under 0.5%. April billings went past due at a rate of 5% and March balances went 60 days past due at a rate of just 2.1%. As of last month, we have seen the lowest April past due amount and rate for the past four years. Year to date payments from our third party collections firm are \$52,489.

Total accounts receivable increased in May by 4.5% with the most significant increase in the current category rather than past due balances. In May property transfer related balances increased by 8% and lender owned related balances increased by over 27%. Outstanding balances related to property transfers continue to represent 50% of all receivables due and past due balances.

Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal decreased in May for the first time in 2015 and totaled \$56,560. While the overall payment amount decreased it was still more than any month in 2014. The RCSC Web Portal upgrade has been completed and we anticipate that the increased payment flexibility by all property owners will make it easier for more cardholders to pay their assessments online.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties remained steady again at 46 properties at the end of May. The number of properties owned by lending institutions increased slightly in May and is now at 37 properties.

Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in May were \$527,748, which is \$107,748 over the amount budgeted. May PIF collected is down from the highs the prior two months. Year to date PIF fees are \$2,890,848 which is \$1,027,848 over budget for the year. Again a reminder that we intentionally budget PIF income very conservatively to assure that we have the cash on hand for any planned project as we remain debt free.

Bowling:

New bowling pins have been delivered to both bowling centers. The bowling pins that were in use at both centers had reached the end of their life. The new bowling pins were stored for four weeks in order to acclimate to our environment before installation. Installation was completed the week of June 15. The cost of the bowling pins was approximately \$13k and the vendor was Brunswick Corporation.

Summer maintenance is being performed on all pinsetters at both bowling centers. Maintenance includes lubrication and rebuilding of all major components to ensure proper operation and minimal downtime during the busy fall season.

Recently the United States Bowling Congress (USBC) performed inspections on all RCSC bowling lanes, approaches, foul lights and pinspotting. There were a few minor issues at each center which will be resolved before the beginning of the fall season.

Human Resources:

With the successful completion of transferring 401(k) funds to Fidelity and ending the required blackout period, we are up and running on the new system. All individual accounts have been verified and Plan participants now have complete access to their accounts.

RCSC is dedicated to providing a safe work environment for all RCSC employees. While accidents may still happen, we believe that safety efforts and timely follow up help control the severity of the injuries and resulting expenses. Year to date there have been six reportable on-the-job injuries. Reportable means those accidents that result in medical treatment and/or lost time away from work. Those injuries include: broken left thigh bone; bruised forearm; strained lumbar spine; strained hip; strain to shoulder; strained cervical spine. There were nine injuries that required first aid treatment only. Several were caused by bee or wasp stings.

Member Services:

The Clubs Office held the club officers' summer refresher course on Thursday, May 2 at Fairway. Thirty-five officers attended, representing 26 clubs, along with 12 Club Organization Committee members. This refresher course was informative and help-

ful to officers working to comply with requirements needed to keep their clubs current and up to date.

All 2016 concerts and events have been selected and scheduled. We will release the exciting line-up in the upcoming Sun Views.

The Clubs Office has completed entering all of the 2016 club reservations, with the exception of seven clubs who have yet to submit their schedule requests.

On Wednesday, June 17, approximately 850 attended the Heartbeat concert and were thoroughly entertained. This was the first concert at which RCSC Cardholders used their photo cards for entry to this free event. Most of the residents were ready with their photo card in hand, and many expressed their appreciation to us for doing so.

Project Updates

Lakeview Center / Viewpoint Lake / Duffeeland

- Eric Swanson, RCSC Viewpoint Lake consultant, and all the wonderful RCSC volunteers have now completed the scheduled habitat for 2015. Eric is hoping to secure several hundred trees after the holidays to construct habitat called “Christmas Tree Clusters” in early 2016. Cardholders may still volunteer for construction of future lake habitat by calling the RCSC corporate office at 623-561-4600.

- Duffeeland Dog Park closed for construction on June 17, 2015. To date, designated trees have been removed and surveying work is completed. Grading and dirt removal will begin on the South side of the dog park as soon as the dust control permit is obtained. Split faced block and steel for the new walls has been ordered. Since more dirt must be hauled away than previously estimated and a new irrigation system is needed for the many trees in the park, the cost of this project increased from the amount previously estimated. Contractors are Wadsworth Construction, Double R Masonry, B&C Tree and Sav-on-Fence. (Cost – \$136,213)

- The deteriorated vinyl siding on the second level at Lakeview Center will be replaced with new vinyl siding beginning Monday, June 29, 2015. Contractor is AAA Siding. (Cost – \$16,700)

Sundial Center/Lakes East/West

- Installation of the new Verizon cell tower and equipment building at Sundial Center continues to move forward. The monopalm-type tower will be erected on the NW corner of Sundial Center. The associated equipment building will be hidden from view by masonry walls, which will appear as an extension of the Sundial Center. The project is expected to be completed in about six weeks.

- The women’s shower room at Sundial Center is progressing nicely with most of the tile work now completed. Installation of new LED lights and final installation of shower doors, soap niches and changing room benches remain. Contractor is Robert Porter Construction. (Cost – \$171,175)

- Asphalt pulverizing, paving and restriping at Lakes E/W golf parking lot is underway with all the old asphalt removed. This project was to be completed in three phases; however, due to wet sub grade issues encountered during first phase construction, the RCSC elected to remove the remaining areas of asphalt and postpone paving for a couple of weeks while the soil dries out. At this time, it appears that the subgrade in the West lot is drying out the fastest and paving of that area should commence in 7-10 days. Contractor for this project is Regional Paving. (Cost – \$185,700)

Bell Center

- On June 10, 2015 the Bell lap pool was closed for some warranty deck repairs. The lap pool was reopened on Sunday June 13, 2015. The pool was again closed on June 22, 2015 for more warranty deck work as the contractor failed to complete his previous work properly.

- The Bell walking pool was closed on Monday June 15, 2015 for re-piping work, new filters and routine maintenance inside and around the pool. Contractor is Aquatic Builders and RCSC staff. (Cost – \$24,375)

- Since the timing was right with the closure of the Bell walking pool, the Bell outdoor spa was also shut down for a new filtration system, re-piping, plumbing repairs and a thorough cleaning. Closure of the pool and spa also allowed the decking contractor to come in and do warranty repairs to the cool deck. Contractors are Aquatic Builders and RCSC staff. (Cost – \$20,250)

- A door was installed in the concrete precast wall which divides the two racquetball courts. The new doorway will allow players to go from court to court without walking up and down the ramps in the breezeway. Contractor was Ken McIntyre Construction and Starling-Madison-Lofquist Engineering. (Cost – \$3,373)

North Pro Shop

- The tile roof at North Pro/Snack Shops is being removed so the deteriorated underlayment can be replaced with a heavy gauge peel-n-stick product. The deteriorated roof felt underlayment was discovered when the new patio roof was installed in 2014. Contractor is Reliable Roofing. (Cost – \$38,000)

Fairway Center

- Contractor bid proposals are being requested and an application for a building permit has been submitted to Maricopa County Planning and Development for installation of artificial grass and construction of a shade structure at the Best Friends Dog Club training facility. Once contractor bids are received, a bid packet will be submitted to the RCSC bid commission for approval.

Mt. View Center

- The Mt. View swimming pool closed Tuesday May 26, 2015 for renovation work. Currently all the interior plaster has been removed and new rope anchors, water line tile, step edge tile and lap lane tile have been installed. Repairs to the cool decking and installation of new handrails and ladders is underway. The final part of this project will be repainting the decking and application of the pebble sheen finish inside the pool. Contractor is CDC Pools. (Cost – \$102,090)

Riverview Pro Shop Building

- The Riverview pro shop patio and building renovation project is progressing well. The fire line to the building is now completed and the interior fire sprinkler system piping is nearing completion. The concrete patio slabs have both been poured and the structural steel and decking over the patio roofs is completed. Curbing for planters on the East side of the patio has been installed and planters on the South side relocated and poured so the South driveway can be widened. Electrical work is underway and acoustical ceiling work will commence soon. Contractors include Ken McIntyre Construction, Accel Electric, Regional Paving and CCBG Architectural. (Cost – \$524,236)

Skilled Trades Department

- The RCSC Skilled Trades Department completed 122 work orders during the last two weeks of May 2015 and the first two weeks of June 2015.

Centers Operations Report

- It is a known fact that the population of Sun City decreases during the summer months. March is generally the busiest month for the centers and the slowest months are June, July, August and September. Here are some interesting facts about center usage:

- Cardholder and guest check-in for monitored activities at all the centers in 2014 totaled almost one million. This does not include Sundial shows, Sunbowl shows, club activities or special events. If you take these activities into account, we total well over one million visits at our centers each year. This is quite a number for a community our size.

- Marinette Center partially opened on March 23, 2015 and didn’t fully open until April 15, 2015. There was more usage from opening through May 31 than the last 6 months of 2013. Pickleball usage from opening until the end of May 2015 was up 256% from 2013. Fitness usage was up 280% in May 2015 versus May 2013 and outdoor track usage was up 545% in May 2015 versus May 2013.

From these generous donations of fresh fruits and vegetables, along with and other contributions from local businesses, Chef Doru has welcomed the fresh produce for his kitchen and enabling him to create up to 700 meals each day (depending upon the season) which are offered to qualifying seniors at a very reasonable cost – whether one chooses to have breakfast or lunch at the Center or home-delivered meals.
