Maintaining "Healthy Swimming" Standards

Safe and healthy swimming is one of the hallmarks at RCSC's seven recreation centers and Cardholders and their guests are a key component to healthy pool and spa sanitation.

While all recreational pool facilities must comply with Maricopa County Department of Environmental Health rules and regulations, RCSC goes above and beyond those requirements to ensure the wellbeing of swimmers, bathers and walkers alike that use the pools and spas.

Although public health code requires only one reading each day to test for chlorine, alkaline and PH levels, RCSC goes even further by testing four times per day at each of the RCSC Center's pools and spas. Chemicals may need to be added and adjustments are made as necessary to maintain correct water balance.



In addition, all RCSC pools and spas are equipped with Ultra Violet (UV) Light Systems which not only reduce the amount of chlorine needed but quickly sterilize or eliminate any bacteria in the water. During this process, pool water is channeled through a full pipe UV System and is sanitized before returning to the pool or spa.

But all the chemicals, treatment and testing can't keep all of the pools healthy and sanitary all of the time. Swimmers must be active participants in helping with these efforts.

With the continued help and support from Cardholders and their guests, RCSC will be able to maintain healthy swimming pools and spas for everyone's enjoyment by following these simple guidelines:

- Don't swim if you have diarrhea. Doing so can spread germs and make other people sick!
- Stay out of the water for at least two weeks after symptoms disappear.
- Avoid getting pool water in your mouth; and if you do, don't swallow.
- Always practice good hygiene. Onsite showers are required before entering any swimming pool or spa.
- Take frequent bathroom breaks and thoroughly wash your hands after using the restroom.
- If you see fecal matter, immediately report it to the on-duty Facility Attendant so that proper measures can be taken.

RCSC staff are responsible for all pool maintenance and sanitation management. Certified Pool Operators are on-staff at all RCSC Centers whose responsibilities include water testing and equipment maintenance. In addition, there are now five members on RCSC staff who have successfully completed the required testing and have received their Aquatics **Facility Operator Certification** ensuring our that facilities continue to be operated for

your utmost enjoyment and protection by providing clean and sanitized aquatic facilities for all Cardholders and their guests.

Several RCSC Members have already stepped up and are committed to giving back to the community by picking up candidate packets for the upcoming Board of Directors elections. Don't miss your opportunity to make a real and lasting difference in Sun City AZ.

Meanwhile, many who have already picked up candidate packets are busy visiting various clubs and events, collecting the required signatures from fellow Members. There will be three vacancies to fill in this year's December election, with each being a three year term.

Candidate packets are still available and those interested in obtaining a packet must make this request in person at the Lakeview Corporate/Board Office (lower level) and present their RCSC Member card. The deadline for packet submissions is noon on Friday, September 30, 2016.

Requirements to become a RCSC Board candidate:

- Must be at least fifty-five (55) years of age;
- Must not be related by marriage or birth to any other member of the Board, Sr. Management Staff, or Board Candidate;
- Must be a Deeded Real Estate Owner of property in Sun City, Maricopa County, Arizona;
- · Must be a Member in good standing;
- Must reside in Sun City, Arizona and be available at least ten (10) months of the year;

- Must meet the requirements to hold an Arizona liquor license (RCSC holds liquor licenses which require Board officers to be included on the licensing).
- Must be eligible and available to serve a three (3) year term; and
- Must be available to attend Board Candidate Orientation(s).

Candidates must also submit a fully completed RCSC petition, signed by 100 or more Members in good standing, along with all other forms provided in the RCSC Candidate Packet.

A successful candidate will:

- Have a strong desire to serve Sun City;
- · Be fair and courteous;

- Use good common sense;
- Have good communication skills;
- Be willing to work as part of a team;
- Ability to prioritize both policy and projects - which will have the greatest benefit for the most members;
- Be willing and able to dedicate the necessary hours to be an effective Director.

Candidates will be introduced at both the October and November Board meetings and candidate forums that will be held in the fall. Forum locations and dates will be announced at a later time.



Renovations May Cause Some Restrictions

Due to closure of the Sundial pool and fitness areas (renovations continue through mid-September), RCSC Cardholders are advised that access may be limited at other facilities in order to accommodate all scheduled club and class activities. Oakmont and Fairway will be most impacted and Cardholders are advised to contact these Centers in advance to confirm open swim availability. We appreciate your cooperation and understanding as we strive to meet the needs of all during this period.

Throughout August, Cardholders should also note that the Movies will continue to be shown on Wednesdays in the Sundial East Hall while the Marinette Auditorium, kitchen and restrooms are under renovation. This work should be completed in early September. All club

activities normally held in this Auditorium have been rescheduled or relocated during this period.

Several other renovation projects are continuing and RCSC Management and staff are working diligently to inform Cardholders of any impacts that may occur. It is strongly advised that Cardholders sign-up to receive RCSC News Email Alerts at suncityaz.org under the Recreation Centers tab, in order to get the most accurate and up-to-date information regarding these and other projects as they occur over the next several months.

Labor Day Holiday Changes CHS Saturday Hours

RCSC Cardholders are reminded that Cardholder Services will be closed the first Saturday in September in observance of Labor Day; however, the office will be open on Saturday, September 10 from 9:00a.m. to noon for your convenience.

Cardholder Services is located on the lower level of the Lakeview Center. Normal office hours are Monday through Friday from 8:30a.m. to 4:00p.m.

In addition, all RCSC Offices and the Sun City Visitors Center will be closed on Monday, September 5, 2016 in observance of this holiday as well.

All recreation centers will be open normal operating hours on Labor Day, with summer hours ending at close of business, September 5.

Golf Report

Pro Shops

Total rounds for May were flat compared to prior year; however, revenue did increase. The percentage of public play year-to-date has increased slightly from prior year; year-to-date public play represents 5.7% of total rounds played. For the year 173,353 rounds have been played on our courses.

With longer daylight hours, this is the time of year we like to remind our residents that "After 5:00pm" cards are available for purchase in the pro shops. The cards allow residents to play after pro shops are closed for the day. Cards are sold for \$44 to RCSC Cardholders and for \$12 to RCSC Cardholders that purchase the surcharge pass on an annual basis. Please remember to carry your "After 5:00pm" card during your round as they serve as your receipt should a Ranger be on duty. Irrigation start times vary by the efficiency of each course's irrigation system, this time of year they are set for as late a start as possible.

In addition to the "After 5:00pm" cards, range balls are also available after hours for those holding a range card. Range cards are sold in various increments and allow the holder to utilize the range ball machines and bypass the pro shop counter. Range balls will not be available after hours on days the range is closed early for clean pick.

Golf Courses

The Lakes East renovation project is well underway, with the irrigation portion running ahead of schedule. The main line has been laid around the entire course and lateral lines have been placed around the entire back nine. The week of June 27 lateral line work began on holes #1, #2 and #3. Landscaping work has begun near the restrooms on hole #14 and progress from there towards the front 9. Plans for the project are on display in the Lakes East/Lakes West pro shop for those interested in the project.

The lake renovation on Willowbrook is progressing according schedule. The lake liner began installation on June 23 and is scheduled to be finished June 30. The next steps of the project are to install the new pump station, tie into the irrigation system, concrete the shoreline, install the lake aerators/fountains and tie all components into the electrical panel. The new pump is scheduled to be online mid-July. The Willowbrook lake renovation is an integral piece of the Willowcreek/Willowbrook irrigation project scheduled for 2017. Unfortunately, this project has had significant impact on the course conditions for both Willowcreek and Willowbrook. The sudden change from mild May temperatures to temperatures in excess of 115 degrees brought a sudden and harsh transition. With only one pump station online our ability to combat this sudden

transition is greatly diminished. You are probably asking yourself, "Didn't they know it was going to be hot in June?" We did and we knew we would have challenges with watering, but also knew that completing this part of the project early was the safest route to take long term. The irrigation project for Willowcreek/Willowbrook will include 18 new greens that also need to be planted during the warmest part of the year and need to be fully planted by mid-July to ensure they have enough to time to become established prior to dormancy in the fall. No one on the golf staff is happy with the conditions on Willowcreek/Willowbrook, but we would be much less happy if a delay in the project next year would have impacted the total renovation.

Though the Willowcreek/Willowbrook water issues were anticipated, the other courses have had their share of unplanned water issues. South has had two separate issues with a well pump, that greatly diminished our ability to water, the issue is resolved though watering of the extreme perimeters of the course is still reduced to allow our lake levels to normalize. North had an issue with a 400 amp breaker to a well pump. North is particularly vulnerable due to only having one source of water. Water to the course needed to be reduced to allow the lake level to normalize. As with South, the areas that suffer the most are the extreme perimeters, greens will always be given the highest priority. Quail experienced an issue with a 60hp pump station motor, also resulting in diminished watering. Our water issues, coupled with a harsh transition, have resulted in extremely dry conditions.

Snack Shops

Snack shop hours have now changed to summer operating hours and now close at 1:00pm. The pro shops have a limited selection of beverages and snacks available for sale after the snack shops close.

We remind everyone that alcohol consumed on the courses is required by law to be purchased through the snack shop or the pro shop. In addition, we are required by law to remove a patron should the patron drink to the point of obvious intoxication. If asked to leave, the patron must do so within 30 minutes. We want everyone to have a good time, but ask that you do so in a responsible manner for your safety as well as others.

Lawn Bowl and Grounds

Our summer agronomic practices began the week of June 20 with green aerification. An important part of this summer's program is reestablishing the turf in the wear areas of the Bell greens and laser leveling the green to remove the uneven draw in several of the rinks. The leveling will be completed by Barkshire Laser Leveling.





Management Updates

Financial Report:

We have completed May 2016 well within our operating and capital budget. Every division has operated better than budget year-to-date.

Bowling:

In August, Bell Lanes is scheduled to replace the underlayment for the bowling lanes. The current underlayment has too much flex which is causing some lane panels to crack. The cost of the project is \$25,000.

Summer maintenance is being performed at both bowling centers by the RCSC bowling mechanics. Maintenance includes rebuilding major components and lubrication. The maintenance will ensure proper operation for the upcoming fall season.

Recently the United States Bowling Congress (USBC) performed inspections on all RCSC bowling lanes, approaches, foul lights and pinspotting. There were a few minor issues at each center which will be resolved before the beginning of the fall season.

Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments decreased in May compared to the last 2 months. Overall accounts receivables increased by 2% in May and was most affected by the increase in Over 30 day balances. April assessments went 30 days past due at a 5.3% rate while March assessments went 60 days past due at a 1.9% rate. The latter is the lowest 60 day past due rate for assessments in the last 4 years and is particularly impactful due to March being the highest billing month of the year. Payments from our third party collections firm continued to be strong in May and year to date payments total \$107,834 which impacts the overall accounts receivables positively.

In May, property transfer related balances decreased by 2.3% and lender owned related balances decreased by 11%. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent approximately 53% of all receivables due and 52% of past due balances.

Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal in May totaled \$83,372. This dropped again for the second month but continues to be up significantly from 2015 monthly payments. Year to date web portal payments total \$433,572.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties increased to 50 properties at the end of May. The number of properties owned by lending institutions decreased slightly this month to 25 properties.

Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in May were \$829,700, which is \$269,700 over the amount budgeted. Year to date PIF fees are \$3,593,100, which is \$1,104,600, or 44%, over budget for the year. The year to date total is up 24% from 2015. Again a reminder that

we intentionally budget PIF income very conservatively to assure that we have the cash on hand for any planned project as we remain debt free.

Human Resources:

The voluntary CPR/AED/First Aid training classes that RCSC provides to employees are well underway. In the 6 classes held so far, 57 individuals have been trained and have received certification cards. The next two classes will be held July 22 and several classes are scheduled for August.

Audit of the RCSC Employees 401(k) Plan for the calendar year 2015 is in process. This is the first audit conducted since transferring the Plan from Nationwide to Fidelity in May 2015. This audit requires incorporating information from both investment companies.

Employee hiring is an ongoing process and year to date 46 individuals have been newly hired with 30 of those being residents of Sun City AZ. RCSC recruits from surrounding areas as well. The part time positions offered are attractive to individuals living in retirement communities.

Member Services:

The Neil Diamond Tribute show originally scheduled for Wednesday, June 15, was moved to June 29 due to construction delays at Sundial Auditorium. I have to say it was worth the wait. The show was fantastic, especially displayed on our four new video screens. The new screens brings the total to six large screens in the auditorium. There truly is not a bad seat in the house.

The 38th annual "Ring That Bell" ceremony will take place at Bell Recreation Center social halls at 9:00am on July 4. Lunch will be served at 11am for \$3, which includes a hot dog, chips and bottled water. Afterward, you can spend the afternoon dancing, playing games, winning prizes and enjoying free cake. Free bowling, billiards, shuffleboard and darts will be available at the Bell Center from 11am-2pm. Come out and help support the Sun City Foundation, the RCSC Management Team's 2016 designated charity.

The full 2017 line-up will be released in July 2016. Season tickets will be available to RCSC Cardholders only and only during the month of November 2016. Individual tickets will be available in December 2016 to RCSC Cardholders only. Remaining tickets will be available to both cardholders and non-cardholders beginning in January 2017.

Project Updates

General Information

- As I begin this report, I would like to recognize and congratulate Barry Masloff, Centers Operations Manager, for completing 5 years of dedicated service at the Recreation Centers of Sun City.
- Preparations are underway to complete the following work at Sundial: Remodel the men's shower room, replace the pool/spa epoxy deck coating, deep clean the pools and spas, install new fans in the fitness center, replace the Facility Attendant station counter top and rebuild the large pool filtration system. In order to complete this work, the lower level of Sundial Center will be closed from July 11, 2016 through September 16, 2016. Occasional progress reports will be emailed to cardholders who are registered to receive RCSC Centers email updates. Additionally, updates will be included in upcoming Building and Infrastructure Board reports for July 2016 and August 2016. These reports will be posted on the RCSC website at www.suncityaz.org.
- The Building and Infrastructure Department is in the process of launching a new web based work order and preventative maintenance tracking software called "Facility Dude." The new software will help resolve communication issues, provide a way to track preventative maintenance and significantly reduce administrative time by the Building and Infrastructure Coordinator. The software will also be used to report landscaping issues to the Grounds Department. The software is expected to go on-line the week of July 4, 2016.
- Re-roofing and fascia repairs of all RCSC on-course restrooms is now completed. Replacement toilets and lavatories were received from our vendor the week of June 20, 2016. The RCSC plumber is now beginning to replace these bathroom fixtures at all RCSC on-course restrooms. Lastly, bids are being requested for the twelve new hollow metal doors needed at various course restrooms. Contractor for roof repairs was DFG Builders. (Cost to Date-\$24,104)

Oakmont Center

The Oakmont renovation project is essentially completed with only rain gutters and the two patio restrooms, which still need to be outfitted with plumbing fixtures and toilet partitions. Contractors for this project include Ken McIntyre Construction and Accel Electric. (Cost – \$387,323)

Mt. View Center

- The interior painting of the Mt. View auditorium and vestibule was completed the week of June 20, 2016. Contractor was Exquisite Painting. (Cost – \$10,500)
- The metal shade canopy by the swimming pool was also repainted the week of June 20, 2016. Contractor was Exquisite Painting. (Cost – \$1,585)

Fairway Center

 The three dry wells connected to the Fairway Storm water system require some minor repairs and a thorough inside cleaning. This work is scheduled for July 7 and 8. Contractor is Torrent Industries. (Cost – \$3,900)

Lakeview Center / Duffeeland Dog Park

- The building permit for the two shade canopies at Duffeeland Dog Park has now been issued and the contractor is currently fabricating the shade structures. Installation will commence in July 2016. Contractor is USA Shade. (Cost – \$18,496)
- The installation of the new light fixtures on the Lakeview Mini Golf Course is now completed. The new LED fixtures offer much better light and will save energy for the RCSC. Completed by the RCSC Skilled Trades Electrician. (Approximate Cost – \$2,400, after APS rebate)
- Contractor proposals continue to be delayed for remodeling the east Lakeview Lanes restrooms and the upstairs restrooms by the red entrance at Lakeview Center.
- New flooring has now been installed in the Lakeview Sew N Sew club room. The new flooring replaces deteriorated vinyl tile and will reduce RCSC labor costs

- associated with waxing the old floor. Contractor was Resource Flooring. (Cost \$19,136)
- The Lakeview Sew N Sew clubroom has received a fresh coat of paint, including the built-in wall cabinets. Contractor is Exquisite Painting. (Cost – \$8,785)
- The asphalt roadway, leading up to the upper gazebo, at Hillside Park is completed. Contractor was Regional Paving. (Cost \$9,975)
- Replacement of bollard lighting circuits, conduit and wiring for the roadway to the upper gazebo has been completed. Contractor was Accel Electric. (Cost \$18,812)
- A 7.5 ton HVAC unit which serves Lakeview Billiards was replaced and a 2.5 ton HVAC unit which serves the women's shower room was also replaced. Contractor was Custom Cooling. (Cost – \$10,700 and \$5,500 respectively)

Quail Run Golf Course

 The block wall, which runs around the inside perimeter of the Quail Run golf course, has now been re-painted and a couple of locations on the Grand Avenue side of this wall have also been re-painted. Contractor was Ken McIntyre Construction. (Cost – \$15,744)

Bell Center

- Three new steel base cabinets with stainless steel counter tops and sinks have been installed in the Bell Silvercraft Club. RCSC Skilled Trades Department completed the demolition of the existing base cabinets. The contractor was Wasserstrom & Sons for construction and installation of the new cabinets and counter tops. (Cost – \$10,876)
- Two new sets of very long, wood base cabinets and new stainless steel counter tops and sinks were installed in the Bell Crafts Club. RCSC Skilled Trades Department completed the demolition, construction and installation of the new base cabinets. The contractor was Wasserstrom & Sons for construction and installation of the new stainless counter tops and sinks. (Estimated Cost – \$7,750)
- Contractor proposals continue to be delayed for the complete remodeling of the Bell Library restrooms, west Bell Lanes restrooms and Clubs restrooms.
- The Bell Craft Club has now been re-painted. Completed by the RCSC Skilled Trades painter. (Estimated Cost – \$400)
- New flooring has now been installed in the Bell Craft room. The new flooring replaces existing deteriorated vinyl tile and will reduce RCSC labor costs associated with waxing the old floor. Contractor was Resource Flooring. (Cost – \$15,493)

Sundial Center

- The auditorium and east/west halls are now equipped with new LED lighting which includes web-based electronic dimming controls. The auditorium stage front has also received a facelift including new projection screens mounted at strategic points in the auditorium. Completed by the RCSC Audio/Video Team and contractors Accel Electric and Ken McIntyre Construction. (Cost \$155,250)
- The maple hardwood flooring in the auditorium and east/west halls was screened and recoated with polyurethane. Contractor was Enmar Flooring. (Cost – \$16,192)
- A 12.5 ton HVAC unit which serves the SilverStones club was replaced. Contractor was Custom Cooling. (Cost – \$20,682)

Riverview Pro / Lakes E/W Snack Shop

 A new stainless steel counter with stainless top and a new condiment counter with stainless steel top were fabricated and installed at the Lakes East/West Snack Shop. Completed by the RCSC Skilled Trades Department and contractor Wasserstrom & Sons. (Cost – \$7,204)


Water Conservation

Reverse Osmosis Can Have You Going in Circles

So you're looking to get the best drinking water available but you are concerned about what bottled water waste is doing to the environment. And you should be. Each day in the US more that 60 million plastic water bottles are simply thrown away. Though many recycle (which is a good thing), most of these end up in landfills or littering the streets, parks and waterways of America.

Single-serving disposal water bottles cost a lot of money, as much as 10,000 times more that tap water. But the prices to the environment is even more staggering when you consider that the manufacturing, transport and disposal of these bottle in the United States along requires more that 15 million barrels of oil annually, enough to fuel 100,000 cars for a year.

With all good intentions, someone suggests that you looking into a "Reverse Osmosis" system for your home. Hmmm....This might be interesting since reverse osmosis is used in a variety of situations, from desalination of brackish water, to washing windows, even to make maple syrup, believe it or not. The process is proven to work. However, sorry to say, there is a "however."



Compared to usage in commercial processes, reverse osmosis in the home is not as efficient due to a deficiency of back pressure and the inability to create it. A unit used in the home only recovers between 5% and 15% of the water entering the system. For example, a unit that delivers five gallons of treated water daily can discharge back into the system anywhere from 20 to 90 gallons of wastewater (containing toxins, heavy metals, and

bacteria among other things) per day. Because they have the capacity to generate the necessary high pressure, large scale industrial or municipal systems typically recover around 80% of the water entering a system. That's a big difference; however (again), one must consider the amount of wastewater and the concentration of the waste created by the discharge; where it can be reused or whether it can be reused; and/or the amount of "turn-around" time for processing the discharge back into potable water.

Before running out and purchasing an "RO system" for your home, be sure to do a little research. Consider what wastes are being returned to the environment and how much you could be adding to your water bill by getting those five gallons of treated water if the system you select washes another 20-90 gallons down the drain. In addition, the reverse osmosis process can also remove many healthy, naturally occurring minerals in water which provide a good taste to water and but also serve vital functions in our body. Removal of some of these trace minerals and elements can actually be unhealthy. Some people actually refer to water treated by reverse osmosis as "dead water" since all minerals - both good and bad - are removed in this process.

Others believe that you can add these trace minerals back into reverse osmosis water but these drops or supplements may be more harmful than what is currently in your tap water. It may actually be that drinking filtered tap water is the best way to go since city water is highly regulated and tested for safety. It may be most cost effective to consider filtering systems such as those in many refrigerators nowadays and/or water pitchers and sink attachments.

Water is vital to human survival and it is especially important to stay hydrated in the summer heat here. Many also find that the benefits of electrolytes, found in sports drinks, improves blood chemistry and muscle function but since these drinks contain sugars and calories, you may want to elect for merely water with electrolytes that is readily available in most supermarkets.

Be water-wise and make every drop count. Simply put - we literally cannot survive without it!

- Twelve new outdoor ceiling fans were installed at the snack shop patio and at the outdoor area east of the pro shop. Some of these fans were replacements while others required electrical to be run to them. Contractor was Accel Electric. (Approximate Cost – \$4,200)
- The parking lot and golf cart area at WC/WB has been crack sealed and seal coated.
 Contractor was Ace Asphalt. (Cost \$16,250)

Skilled Trades Department

 The RCSC Skilled Trades Department completed 211 work orders during the last two weeks of May 2016 and the first two weeks of June 2016.

Centers Operations

- Now that summer has arrived, the annual upkeep of the floors in RCSC club rooms has started. This mainly pertains to the small number of vinyl composition (VCT) floors located throughout the centers. Some floors will be stripped and waxed, while others will be cleaned and polished.
- A new floor machine has recently been purchased and is currently being used at Bell Center. Instead of using a round pad that spins, this machine has a square pad that works like a hand-held sander. It is being used to clean in hard-to-reach places, shower floors, restroom floors, and lobby areas. It cleans, strips, scrubs, and even does the baseboards. There has been a noticeable difference in the appearance of the areas where this machine has been utilized.
- All 50 state flags hanging in the auditorium at Mountain View have been hand washed by staff. This was a great time to accomplish this task as the room was closed for painting.

Sew N Sew, Creative Quilters Show Pride, Give Thanks

Every once in a while a club room needs to be renovated. And just like at home, it's a big job requiring lots of coordination and much effort by many.

The scope of work needs to be determined and the money needs to be in the budget. Bids need to be secured and contractors selected. Coordinating with club members on scheduling the project must occur.

But before any work can really start, the room must be readied which involves the removal of everything that's not nailed, down so to speak. Club supplies, tools and machines, coffee pots and coffee cups, tables and chairs. With limited storage space and many items belonging to club members, everyone pitches in to pack up, painstakingly moving boxes and bins into homes and garages for safekeeping.

Members of the Sew N Sew Club and Creative Quilters at Lakeview worked diligently to get their space ready for the big day. With many away for the summer, it's the ideal time for such a project but it also means fewer people here to help. However, that did not deter this determined group.



Tips from Get Fit for Life -

Strength Exercises for Runners

"Runners are a breed all their own", states fitness professional Jane Fortier. "Their dedication to a sport that appears quite boring (putting one foot in front of another) is amazing. It takes an individual who is mentally tough and physically fit. A runner focuses on running farther, faster and more efficiently, while staying injury free. Any adult who uses running for their exercise routine, should incorporate other exercises into a workout plan, besides just running."

Strength training is an important form of exercise for serious runners and recreational exercisers. Not only does it help to build lean muscles that power the body through the run, it fires-up the metabolism to help with weight control and it activates osteoblasts, which strengthen bones against agerelated deterioration. A solid strength training program can help a runner develop balanced musculature, which leads to greater power and fewer injuries.

The following four strength exercises are a must for any adult who runs:

- Squats: These are the single most effective exercise to strengthen the lower body. Squats target the quadriceps, hamstrings, hips, hip flexors, glutes and core. When done properly, they can prevent knee pain and injury. There are a variety of squat exercises to choose from, depending on equipment available and fitness level.
- Lateral Movements: Since runners move primarily in one direction, it is important to train their bodies through other planes of movement. Lateral moves help improve often neglected muscles, like hip adductors and abductors.
 Strengthening these areas will improve joint stability, balance, and injury prevention. There are many exercises to choose from, depending on the exercise environment and equipment available.
- Pushups: The upper body is often neglected by adults who prefer to run, for exercise. A strong upper body is essential for overall fitness and powerful movement. Pushups are an efficient strength exercise to build chest, shoulders and core, in one move. Chest/bench presses will achieve the same results, if appropriate equipment is on hand.
- Planks: A runner is only as strong as their core abs, obliques, lower back and hips. These muscles, which wrap around the torso like a corset, help balance and support every step. Strong abdominals and lower back will improve running posture and breathing. Planks train every muscle in the core. There are many Plank variations, depending on fitness level and space available.






