Online Voting Continues Through Election Day

Voting is underway in the RCSC Board of Directors elections for the three upcoming vacancies, with seven candidates running for these 3-year positions.

Election Day is Tuesday, December 8, 2015 when in-person voting will occur from 8a.m. to 4p.m. in Lakeview Social Hall #2 for RCSC Members wishing to cast paper ballots. Online voting continues until 4p.m. on Election Day as well. RCSC Members are encouraged to sign up and use the RCSC Web Portal at www. sunaz.com to cast their ballots.

Online voting offers RCSC Members the convenience of being able to vote anywhere,

anytime (home, office, library) – whether you're here in Sun City or out of town.

Only Members in good standing are eligible to cast votes and you can rest assured that safeguards are fully in place which restrict each qualified member to only one vote and that confidentiality will be maintained throughout the voting process. An online informational guide is available to assist Members through portal process.

The last day to request an absentee ballot is November 30 for those unable to vote online or to cast their ballot in person on Election Day by contacting the RCSC Board Office at Lakeview Center or calling 623-561-4600. All absentee ballots must be received no later than December 8.

Two candidate forums held in November at Fairway and Marinette Recreation Centers were well attended. Videos of these sessions are currently available for viewing via the RCSC YouTube channel, also accessible via www.sunaz.com, through Election Day.

Those elected will take office effective January 1, 2016. Outgoing Board Members James Brasher, David Wieland and Ron Jesse will complete their terms of service on December 31, 2015.

Golf Report

Pro Shops

We will be hosting a Beat-the-Pros on December 10 at Riverview Golf Course, which will celebrate the renovation. Hosting the event in December provides the opportunity for our Winter guests to participate and ties into our fundraising efforts for our chosen Winter Celebration Charity. This year the chosen charity is the Sun City Fire Department. The format will be a two person scramble. Prior to play, Golf Magazine's "2013 Golf Entertainer of the Year" Brad Denton, will be putting on a Trick Shot Show. After the show Brad will head out to a par 3. For a donation, Brad will hit a drive for your team, aiding in your attempt to Beat-the-Pros. Applications for the event are available at each golf shop.

Through August total revenue has exceeded budget, despite a decline in public green fees. Total merchandise through August was \$7,500 ahead of budget; we thank everyone for their support. Please remember, though we do not carry a regular inventory of golf clubs, we can special order equipment from any supplier. In most cases we can match the price offered at big box retailers. When Riverview reopens, new apparel and accessories will be available for purchase. A sneak peak of the new items will be possible beginning November 9th, when we begin taking tee times for Riverview. The pro shop will be open from 6:00 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. for the draw, after 8:30 a.m. tee times for Riverview can be made at any of the shops or via the web portal.

We have received the Men's and Ladies USGA course ratings for Riverview. The men's rating from the white tees increased very slightly from 68.0 to 68.2. The ladies rating from the red tees also increased slightly from 70.4 to 70.7. The slope ratings from both tees also increased from 113 to 115 for the men from the white tees and from 115 to 118 for the ladies from the red tees. The new set of yellow tees (for those wishing to Play it Forward) have a course rating of 62.2 for men and 65.9 for ladies.

Please join us in welcoming Michael Schneider as our newest Head Starter. Michael assumed the position of Head Starter at Quail Run Golf Course on October 26. Mike had served as a starter at Lakes East/Lakes West for nearly four years, prior to accepting the Head Starter position.

Golf Courses

Overseeding on Riverview began on October 12, the timing of the overseed will allow the course to open on November 14 with no cart path restrictions. As a reminder the greens will not be overseeded this year and can be expected to play firm and fast. Any area of disturbance, such as green banks and tee banks, can also be expected to play firm. Firmer than normal conditions can be expected for a period of 18 to 24 months.

Overseeding for the remaining courses began October 5, at North, Lakes West, Willowbrook and Quail Run. The final overseeding began October 26 at Willowcreek, South and Lakes East. The later start should provide better growing temperatures for the rye grass. The courses that overseeded on October 5 are scheduled to have cart path restrictions until November 6.





The golfers/residents of Sun City were instrumental in creating this program to help preserve and protect the beauty of RCSC golf courses.

If you're passionate about the game of golf and the conditions on the courses in Sun City, why not consider becoming a volunteer ranger?

The goal of the volunteer ranger program is:

- Provide excellent customer service
- Enforce the rules and regulations and enhance safety
- Maintain the flow of play
- Verify greens fees and handicap permits
- Handle player concerns

Volunteer rangers receive:

- Ranger hours/\$5.00 Credits towards Annual/Surcharge Pass based upon hours
- Rangers will receive a Gas Stipend if they use their own cart or they can use the Pro Shop cart if they don't have a cart of their own
- Rangers will receive range ball pass based upon hours

Following overseeding, a disease known as Pythium Blight was discovered on several greens at the North course. Though the proper treatment was applied when noticed, significant damage had been done to holes 5 and 6. The most affected greens have been reseeded, top-dressed and will recover. In order to aid their recovery, we will be mowing out temporary greens on holes 5 and 6 and closing the greens to play. The greens are expected to be closed for a period of 10 to 14 days. Removing play will allow the greens to recover faster than they would otherwise. The other greens that were affected have only localized damage and will recover without closing.

We also have a new addition to our Superintendent ranks. Neil Hladik has recently assumed the role of Superintendent at the North Course. Prior to moving back to Arizona, Neil had served as Superintendent at the Napa Golf Course in Napa, California. Neil has also worked as Superintendent at several Arizona courses, such as Los Caballeros, Gold Canyon, Sun Lakes and Antelope Hills. Neil was also on site at these courses during their construction.

Snack Shops

Year-to-date Snack Shop revenue remains well above budget.

Lawn Bowling/Grounds

The newly renovated greens at Lakeview opened for practice on October 12 and held their first club function on October 13. The west green was unavailable for use due to a vehicle driving across the green and leaving tire marks. Repairs to the green have since been completed and both greens are available for use.

Mowing has slowed on all greens as the weather cools. As the greens go dormant maintenance practices will be limited to rolling, keeping the ditches clean and minimal edging. The softball field has been reseeded and practices began on October 24.

A Moment with President Schroeder -

What kind of RCSC Cardholder are you?

Residents of Sun City AZ are many things – volunteers, club members, golfers, swimmers, gym and church and concertgoers. We stay active and engaged. Many of us are creative and love our hobbies. Some consider themselves baby boomers while others who call Sun City home may be the parents OF those baby boomers.

The key to all of this fun in the sun is what is still referred to by many as your "rec card" - which must be shown to gain access to RCSC fitness centers and swimming pools, upon joining a chartered club, and for entry to many RCSC concerts and events.

While you'll often hear the phrase "for RCSC Cardholders and their escorted guests" when we publicize activities, did you realize that not everyone who lives in Sun City is a Cardholder?

There are essentially two types of RCSC Cardholders. Membership Cards are issued to deeded, qualified property owners who meet the age and residency requirements as found in the Corporate Bylaws. Privilege Cards may be purchased by non-owners, renters, tenants, lessees, and/or occupants of a residence in Sun City AZ provided that they also meet certain requirements. One major difference between the two is that Privilege Cardholders may not vote in RCSC Elections and that the annual property assessment must be current for the residence for either of these types of cards to be active.

Those eligible for Privilege Cards can purchase either shortterm (30, 60 or 90 days) or for the entire year. If an annual Privilege Card is purchased and you relocate to another qualifying residence within Sun City AZ, you must bring documentation back to the Cardholder Services Offices where staff is able to "move" your remaining time on the card over to the new location. Should you decide to purchase a home (or condo, duplex, etc.) after "test driving" in a Sun City AZ rental for a period of time, you may request that the remaining balance of the annual Privilege Card be refunded to you.

Transfers and refunds do not apply to short-term Privilege Card purchases.

Privilege Cardholders can join clubs (the same as Member Cardholders) and are also eligible to bring family and friends to the recreation centers with the purchase of a Host Punch Card. Upon a Cardholder checking in their guests using a Host Punch Card, a Guest Pass may be requested and issued so that multiple centers (or activities)

can be visited that same day with only one punch per guest being used. You can even get Guest Passes for up to seven consecutive days which allows your guests to visit facilities without you having to escort them. How convenient is that?

However, please be aware that neither spouses of Cardholders nor Sun City AZ residents, whether seasonal (30 days or more) or permanent, may be considered guests. If eligible, they would need to purchase their own Privilege Card in order to use RCSC facilities.

In order for all Cardholders to be able to access and enjoy everything that Sun City AZ has to offer, it is suggested that Cardholders with guests who reside within 75 miles of Sun City AZ limit their visits to 30 times per year.

So whether you're here year-round or just escape to Sun City AZ for a few months each winter, whether you own your home or prefer to rent - keep yourself active and experience all the advantages of being an RCSC Cardholder.

We have completed our third quarter of 2015 and are well within our operating and capital budget year-to-date. We are quite conservative in our budgeting process to assure that we can meet all the financial demands that come our way. For example, as of September 30, 2015 we had a positive variance from our budgeted income of \$603,053, however our actual income through the third quarter was only \$42,812 greater than last year despite the \$6.00 per property annual assessment increase. You can see that if we budgeted income aggressively, we could quickly find ourselves struggling to make ends meet. We budget our expenses and operating capital requirements to be equal to or less than our income; we cannot have a deficit.

We budget our expenses expecting and knowing there will be increases. However, we seldom spend all that we have budgeted and during my tenure we have never had an overall negative variance from budget. There is one area of our financial statement that can be a bit confusing however, and that is the repairs and maintenance section. We budget millions of dollars of repairs and maintenance projects each year, but we seldom complete all of them in that same year. All repairs and maintenance projects, as well as operating capital projects, are carried forward and the money is retained for them until they are completed or cancelled. For example, as of September 30, 2015 we have \$982,141 unfinished 2015 repairs and maintenance projects and \$513,010 unfinished 2015 operating capital projects. We maintain the money in our bank accounts to complete these projects.

Do not confuse the Preservation & Improvement Fund (PIF) projects with repairs and maintenance and operating capital projects, they are entirely separate and you can see on the third quarter Balance Sheet that PIF is \$7.7M less than last year at this time because of the PIF projects in process and completed. It is important to understand while our financial statement may reflect considerable cash and investments, these funds are already budgeted for expenditure at some time in the future.

The third quarter financial review is very important as it pretty much sets the stage for the 2015 year end and I am really happy to say that once again, we are in good financial condition. All divisions have operated better than budgeted, and therefore we feel very confident that we will be able to produce favorable year end results. I am also very excited to report that the golf division is in the black, despite its early struggles this year. After the last two years of operating in the black in the golf division with one regulation golf course closed for renovations, it may seem that possibly Sun City AZ could do with one less golf course, however, let me remind you that these golf courses were deeded to RCSC with restrictions that they remain golf courses and for many, that is good news.

Let me also remind you that we complete all these projects you hear Mr. Wellman talking about each month, millions of dollars of projects each year, and we still remain debt free!

Bowling

November will be a busy month for the Bowling Department with the Arizona State Senior Women's and Arizona State Senior Open Tournaments. These tournaments provide exposure to our community and will produce between \$10k and \$12k in unbudgeted income. The tournaments will use both centers so lane availability will be limited during squad times. All upcoming tournaments and events are listed on the RCSC website at www.sunaz.com by clicking on the bowling tab and selecting upcoming tournaments.

Signups for the annual New Year's Eve Party at Lakeview Lanes will begin at 9:00am on November 2, 2015. Everyone is welcome to the event even if you are not a bowler. Stop by Lakeview Lanes or Bell Lanes to reserve your spot as availability is limited.

Almost all the fall bowling leagues are in full swing with the


exception of a few spots waiting to be filled when the winter visitors return.

Cardholder Services:


Payments on past due assessments reduced again in September and were at the monthly average for the prior 12 months. Overall past due assessments increased in September by just under 1% with the Over 90 Days past due balances increasing the most. The 30 Day past due rate assessments increased in September and is at the same level for this month the last four years. Year to date payments from our third party collections firm are \$76.028.

The following charts show the 30 Day Past Due Amounts and the Total Past Due Assessments for the past 4 years on a monthly basis for comparison.





The chart below shows the total accounts receivable balance for each month this year. The total is categorized by Assessments, Fees and PIF/Transfer with the relative percentage for each category each month.



In September property transfer related balances increased by 3% and lender owned related balances decreased by 15%. The balance flow for these two categories continues to be dynamic over time. Outstanding balances related to property transfers now represents 52% of all receivables due and is up to 52% of past due balances.

Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal in August totaled \$56,747. Year to date payments through the web portal are \$540,335 and represent 3.6% of total accounts receivable payments.

Project Updates

Lakeview Center / Lakeview Lanes / Viewpoint Lake

- Two Viewpoint Lake Wall repairs will be made once the necessary repair products arrive. One is small and will only take about an hour to complete but the other is very large and will take 1-2 days to fix. (Estimated Cost – \$4,000)
- Cardholder Services and Clubs office renovation project is nearing completion with final permits obtained from Sun City Fire and Maricopa County Planning and Development. While these are being obtained, the new furniture is being installed. Unfortunately, the cost of this project increased due to furniture and additional wiring costs. Contractors are Ken McIntyre Construction, Accel Electric, CCBG Architectural, D.H. Pace and Resource Flooring. (Cost \$209,196)
- Remodel work at Lakeview Lanes is progressing well with the new bowlers' area flooring installed, carpet trim-outs completed and new ball racks and counters set up. The new handrails had to be measured before fabrication and will be installed mid November 2015.
 Contractors include DFG Builders, Resource Flooring and the RCSC Skilled Trades Team. (Cost \$55.248)
- LED wall pack lights were installed along the West side of the Lakeview Lanes Building. Contractor was Accel Electric. (Cost \$3.141)
- Mini golf carpeting at Lakeview Center is currently being replaced. Work commenced October 26, 2015 and should be completed by October 30, 2015 weather permitting. Contractor is Floors at the Arizona Design Center. (Cost – \$20,780)
- Construction and deployment of pipe palaces fish habitat into Viewpoint Lake will occur the
 week of October 26, 2015. Construction and deployment of fingerling fortress fish habitat and
 hanging fish habitat will occur the week of November 2, 2015. Construction and deployment
 of catfish condos habitat will occur the week of November 16, 2015. This will complete the
 total fish habitat project for Viewpoint Lake. In addition, approximately 500-600 lbs. of 10" to
 13" rainbow trout will be stocked in Viewpoint Lake once the lake temperature decreases. This
 will most likely happen in December 2015.

Sundial Center

- The small pole lights around Sundial Center are being replaced with new LED fixtures. The
 new lights will address a safety issue by improving the lighting along the perimeter walkways.
 Contractor is Accel Electric. (Cost \$14,109)
- The broken florescent light fixtures in the clubs display cases at Sundial will be replaced soon with new LED lighting. Contractor is Accel Electric. (Cost – \$11,312)
- The walls in the Aerobics room received a fresh coat of paint on Saturday, October 17, 2015.
 Contractor was Exquisite Painting. (Cost \$1,700)

Bell Center / Bell Lanes

- Remodel work at Bell Lanes is progressing well with the new bowlers' area flooring installed, carpet trim-outs completed and new ball racks and counters set up. The new handrails had to be measured before fabrication and will be installed mid November 2015. Contractors include DFG Builders, Resource Flooring and the RCSC Skilled Trades Team. (Cost – \$47,812)
- One of the four women's restroom toilets in the Bell Crafts area was removed so an ADA toilet area could be established. Contractors were Sunland Plumbing and DFG Builders. (Approximate Cost \$2.000)

Fairway Center / Quail Run Pro

- The Best Friends Dog Club shade canopy and artificial turf project is completed except for the
 overhead canvas awning which is still being fabricated. Since the posts and turf are completed
 the Best Friends Dog Club was informed they can start using the dog arena on Thursday,
 October 29, 2015. Once the shade awning is fabricated it will be installed on a day when the
 club does not plan to use the dog arena. Contractors include Arizona Bag and Shade, Sun Burst
 Landscaping, and CCBG Architectural. (Cost \$80,909)
- Parking lot crack repairs and seal coating was recently completed at Quail Run Pro Shop and Quail Run Maintenance. Contractor was Pinnacle Paving. (Cost – \$6,800)

Mt.View Center / Sun Bowl

- Ninety-six thermal solar panels at Mt. View Center have now been replaced. In addition, some deteriorated 4" piping was replaced and upgrades were made to the electronic controller.
 Contractor was General Solar. (Cost – \$37,614)
- A new T-Mobile Monopalm Cell Tower is currently being installed at the Sun Bowl property just
 west of the existing cell tower. The new site will not cause the RCSC to lose any parking spaces
 as these are desperately needed for RCSC Sun Bowl shows.
- A new secured block dumpster enclosure was constructed on the West side of the Sun Bowl parking lot. Contractor was Double R Masonry and Sav-On-Fence. (Cost – \$6,506)

Oakmont Center

 Crack repair and seal coating was completed on the West and East parking lots. Contractor was Pinnacle Paving. (Cost – \$6,250)

Riverview Pro/Snack Shop Building

The Riverview pro shop, patio and building renovation project is now completed. At the present time the facility is being cleaned and set up for the upcoming November 14, 2015 reopen-

ing. Contractors include Ken McIntyre Construction, Accel Electric, Regional Paving and CCBG Architectural. (Cost – \$524,236)

Skilled Trades Department

 The RCSC Skilled Trades Department completed 203 work orders during the last two weeks of September 2015 and the first two weeks of October 2015.

Centers Operations

- Mike Dorn was recently promoted from Utility Worker to evening Lead Utility Worker at Marinette Center. Mike started his employment with the RCSC at Sundial two years ago and then transferred to Marinette when the center reopened in March of this year. Since usage at Marinette Center has increased since the remodel was completed Mike will be integral part of keeping work on track and everything looking clean.
- The heaters at all RCSC pools have been turned on now that fall is here. On sunny days the
 thermal heating at Marinette, Bell, Oakmont, and Mountain View will automatically turn on
 contributing to continued savings on RCSC natural gas costs. In addition, solar blankets are
 now being put on pools nightly at Marinette, Bell, Lakeview, and Mountain View which also
 reduces natural gas usage by the pool heaters.
- Duck Race flyers have now been posted at all RCSC recreation centers. The duck races will take
 place at the upcoming Holiday Celebration held Friday, December 11, 2015. Please stop by
 any Facility Attendant station or Golf pro shop to purchase your ducks for only \$1 each. This
 year half the proceeds will go to the Sun City Fire Department and the rest as prizes for the top
 three finishers of the two duck races.

Management Updates

Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties decreased to 40 properties at the end of September. The number of properties owned by lending institutions was unchanged again in September at 40 properties.

Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in August were \$498,000, which is \$273,000 over the amount budgeted. Year to date PIF fees are \$5,134,520 which is \$2,080,520, or 68%, over budget for the year. Again a reminder that we intentionally budget PIF income very conservatively to assure that we have the cash on hand for any planned project as we remain debt free.

An additional reminder that the Cardholder Services and Member Services offices have been relocated to Social Halls 2 and 3 on the second floor at Lakeview Center while the office space for these areas is being renovated. Work is progressing and we anticipate the changes being made will allow us to better serve our Cardholders.

Human Resources:

An independent audit of the RCSC's Employees 401(k) Plan for calendar year 2014 was conducted this month by PKF Certified Public Accountants and we filed the IRS required Form 5500 on time. The value of employees' 401(k) investments at year end 2013 was \$997,591 and by year end 2014 increased to \$1,118,162.

In 2005 RCSC exercised the right to participate in a settlement agreement established by a former brokerage firm that provided insurance services to us as a client of employee insurance benefits. Eligible clients such as RCSC were entitled to receive a portion of the Fund without having to prove fault, harm or wrongdoing. The firm had been charged with "bid rigging," improperly steering insurance placements to insurers who paid them contingent commissions. In February 2013, RCSC received its first portion of the Insurance Brokerage Settlement in the amount of \$44,681. In September 2015, a second portion was received in the amount of \$812.95.

We are in the process of renewing employee benefits for calendar year 2016 and have scheduled open enrollment meetings on November 4 and 5 to be followed by Biometric Screenings in December.

Member Services:

Season tickets for the 2016 Sundial shows with reserved seating go on sale on November 2 at 8:30am in the Clubs Office. Our main entrance, the gold entrance gate, will open at 5:15am. You will receive a number, and tickets will be sold in that number sequence. If you leave and come back later, and your number has already been called, you will have to start the process over again. We will only sell season ticket packets to RCSC Cardholders only and are limited to one packet per cardholder. Beginning Tuesday, December 1, individual show tickets will go on sale.

Water Conservation

More Water Saving Fun Facts

See if you can match up the questions and answers below. Some of these facts you might find surprising!

- How many states in the US reported "water-stress" conditions in 1990?
 How many states in the US reported "water-stress" conditions in 2000?
 b. 30
- 3. How many states in the US reported "water-stress" conditions in 2009? c. 45

Answers: 1=b; 2=a; and 3=c. The trend for water supply nationwide is worsening. Consider the fact that monitoring your own water use will not only benefit the greater community, but will also save you money.

- 1. The percentage of household water used in an average bathroom is: a. 35%
- 2. The percentage of average bathroom water use for a toilet is: b. 75%
- The average amount of total household water possible to conserve by using water-saving features:

Answers: 1=b; 2=c; and 3=a. So, to summarize: 75% of water used in the home is used in the bathroom and 25% of that is for the toilet. This leads us back to the "if it's yellow let it mellow" theory for flushing; and, when it comes time to replace that old commode, consider putting in an ultra low-flush (ULF) that uses 2 gallons per flush (gpf) as compared to 4 gpf for the average toilet. A less expensive way to conserve toilet water is to use a dam (or a new term: tank bank). Never forget the military style shower, or if you don't want to turn off the water just shorten your shower by a minute or two.

- 1. The top spectrum of a low-flow aerator for in-home water use is: a. 2.5 gpm
- 2. Recommended gallons per minute (gpm) for a kitchen sink aerator: b. 2.5 gpm
- 3. Aerators for a bathroom or other faucets in your home work fine at: c. 1.5 gpm

Answers: 1= a; 2=b; and 3=c. When purchasing low-flow aerators, do your due diligence and read the label. Anything that goes over 2.5 gallons per minute is not low flow. Many retailers promote "low-flow" at the top of the spectrum, which work great in a kitchen; but for bathrooms and other water outlets, 1.5 gpm deliver a comfortable, soft stream.

If you think about it, water conservation at home is low-cost, unless you run out and buy new water-saving appliances, on-demand water heaters for your kitchen or low-flow irrigators for your yard. These items are wonderful if you have the resources to purchase them and have them installed. However, there are other ways to conserve water at home and low-flow aerators, showerheads, and toilet dams (tank banks) are pretty simple to install and don't necessarily need a handyman. Some of these simple tips can be implemented virtually cost free. As a matter of fact, turning off your faucet while brushing your teeth or running a sink one-quarter full of water to rinse a razor can actually save money. Yes, these are little steps, but if everyone practices even just a few of these tips, an average household can save thousands of gallons of water per year, benefit the greater community and put a little extra cash in your pocket.


You must be a resident of Sun City in order to borrow equipment from Sunshine Service and present one of the following forms of identification:




Looking for something fun and challenging to do? We invite you to join us at the Mah Jongg club.


Monday Night Pinochle







Tips for Seniors from Daily Fitness -

Have Strength Gains Stalled in Your Workout?

"If you have incorporated strength training into your exercise regimen, congratulations!", states Dick Fortier, personal trainer for Daily Fitness. "But, just like other aspects of a healthy lifestyle, strength-training progress can be unpredictable. Strength exercise involves a lot of complex elements that have to work in sync to deliver significant results. Here are a few common culprits that could be sapping your strength gains."

Not Resting Enough – In order for muscles to repair themselves, value recovery just as much as the workout. Always rest a muscle group for 24-48 hours after strength exercise, to give it ample time to rebuild and recover.

Using Improper Form – Proper form is crucial for maximum safety and effectiveness in the weight room. Sloppy form produces poor results, because muscles are not engaged correctly through each movement. It can also increase the risk of injury. If form suffers during a set, you are either overloaded or not knowledgeable on the correct way to exercise.

Not Pushing Yourself Enough – It's easy to get trapped in your comfort zone in the fitness center. Increasing weights can be scary, but you will never see improvements in your strength and tissue quality if you fail to challenge the muscle. If you perform more than fifteen repetitions in a set and don't experience fatigue after the set, it's time to make some changes.

Stuck in a Rut – If you continue to do the same exercises, day-in and day-out, your body is going to adapt to the movements – which means you will stall-out on getting results. It's important to work muscle groups in as many different ways as possible. This could involve using different exercises for each muscle group, or varying your sets, reps and cadence schemes

Wrong Approach to Sets & Reps – Most people see significant strength gains by doing 2-3 sets of 8-10 repetitions, at a weight that completely fatigues the muscles by the last rep of the last set. Lifting lighter weights at higher rep schemes will build muscle endurance, but it's not the strategy to use if you want to focus on muscular strength.

Exercising Inconsistently – You won't see results if you strength train one time a week. To reap significant gains, you need to be working all your major muscle groups 2-3 times in a 7-day cycle.

Not Training All Muscle Groups Evenly – It's important to give the same amount of attention to all major muscle groups. Doing just the exercises you like is dangerous. Muscle imbalances lead to injury, and disproportionate body strength.
