Golf Report

Pro Shops

November temperatures proved to be a double edge sword, the warmer temperatures increased rounds played, however the temperatures kept the Bermuda grass from fully going dormant. Total rounds played in November were the highest level since 2007, rounds played at the executive courses were the highest level since at least 2005. During the month of November 96% of rounds played were by residents, their guests or RCSC staff. For the year 292,235 rounds have been played throughout our 8 courses.

The North Pro Am was successful, with 99 residents joining 32 golf professionals from around the Valley and even Colorado. Residents played a 3 person scramble and had the option of using their professionals drive twice per nine holes. The amateur teams also had the option of using their professional's score on a hole twice per nine holes. Many thanks to Chris Linam, Sue Presta and Janine Millette for their assistance organizing, securing donations and scoring the event. Proceeds from the event exceeded \$2,000 and benefitted the Sun City Posse.

Snack Shops

Snack shops benefitted from increased play, exceeding budget by \$8,100. Due to increasing costs beer prices will be increasing January 1, the new prices will be posted in each snack shop and bowling center.

Golf Courses

As stated above, warmer than normal temperatures posed problems for this year's overseed, throughout the valley. The problems are most noticeable on the courses that seeded first, they include Willowcreek, Quail Run and North. These courses have re-seeded the weakest areas and some improvement has been made. Watering levels have returned to normal on these courses. To help prevent future issues we will be moving overseed to a beginning date in October. We ask any groups planning events in October or November, to pay close attention to the overseeding schedule when it is announced in January.

The Riverview Renovation project has started on time, with work beginning on hole #4 (previously #13). We continue to remind residents that the old back 9 is closed to all pedestrian and cart traffic. This is an active work site, for your safety we ask that you refrain from walking or driving through this area. For non-golfers the area we are referring to is West of Del Webb Boulevard. We are allowing fishing on the old front nine (the area east of Del Webb). We are hoping that the open fishing reduces the bass population on these lakes. The bass are natural competitors to the fish we stock for mosquito and algae control.

This report by Brian Duthu, RCSC Director of Golf, was presented to the RCSC Board of Directors at their monthly meeting on December 18, 2014.

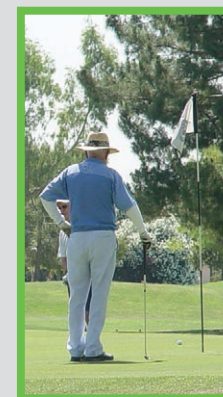

Architect's Report

Riverview Renovation

Construction at the Riverview Golf Course started back in full force the first Monday after the New Year. We went from a construction crew of eight guys in December to a crew of almost 25 on the 5th of January. This was not a surprise to us as it is important for the earthwork and shaping crew to get out ahead of the drainage and irrigation crews so once they are on-site they can work with no delays.

One of the changes on the course that golfers will first notice is a change in the golf hole numbering. What originally was Hole 10 will now be Hole 1 and the original Hole 9 will be the new Hole 18. With the existing routing of the golf course, golfers either were going to play into the sun as they started their rounds early in the morning or when they were finishing their rounds late in the day. With the heavier play at Riverview in the morning, the desire was to switch the nines so instead of the first four holes playing east in the morning towards the rising sun, they would now play west allowing golfers until their approach shot on the new sixth hole before playing a shot to the east into the sun. To accommodate this change, a new putting green is being built on the west side of Del Webb Boulevard so as golfers are waiting for their turn to tee off they will be able to continue their warm up on the green. So as I talk about individual golf holes in the future, I will be speaking of the new numbering sequence and not the old.

Coming up, construction is continuing to work from west to east on the golf course. The new irrigation pump stations are scheduled to be delivered in early February and the new irrigation system will be tied into these structures. Also, sand for the putting greens is being screened and manufactured to the project specifications and testing has already begun to monitor the consistency of the material.

Teal Ribbon Tournament - February 12

The 7th annual Teal Ribbon Golf Tournament will hopefully surpass the West Valley Ovarian Cancer Alliance's donation of \$12,000 raised last year. This event was started by two-time cancer survivor and Sun City resident Laurel Pracht. Each year the tournament and proceeds have grown. Ovarian Cancer research is the specific area earmarked at the University of Arizona Cancer Center since Laurel credits her doctor and staff there for her recovery.

Nine holes of golf on both the Lakes West and East courses are followed by a Texas Roadhouse lunch at Sundial. A short program and the awarding of exciting raffle prizes will follow the luncheon.

Registration begins at 8:30a.m. with a shotgun start at 9:30a.m. Entry forms are available at all RCSC golf courses, or on the website at <http://www.westvalleyoca.org>. Entry fee is \$30 with course green fees paid during registration. Think about finding some "teal" clothing in your closet and joining in this year's festivities.



Learning to Golf

Remember - It's all about having fun!

I'm a beginner golfer and I have just accomplished my first feat in golf by taking a series of golf lessons. Now I'm wondering why I did this. I wanted to learn so I could play with family and friends. They say it is fun and I should learn.

Okay, I took the lessons. I couldn't get the ball in the air. I had so many things to think of such as left arm straight, head down, bend my knees, turn my left toe out, shift my weight, bend my wrist and on and on.

Now, we're off to the golf course, for my first time, for nine holes. Our group has just been called to tee off. It's my turn. I tee the ball up and swing and miss the ball.

My friends try to help me by telling me what I did wrong. Everyone is watching me and I think, "What if I can't hit the ball? What are all those people behind me going to think? I swing again and miss. "This is supposed to be fun? How can anyone think this is fun?"

Finally, I hit the ball along the ground a few feet off the tee. Now I'm in a real panic. My friends tell me to keep my head down and straighten my left arm. I swing again and the ball rolls along the ground.

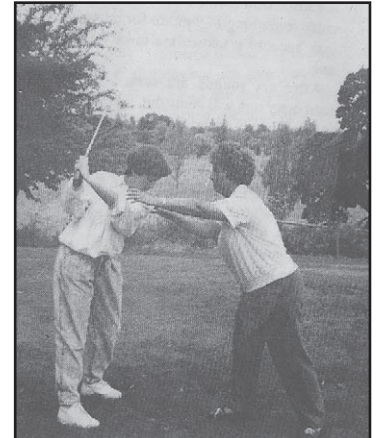
Thirty minutes later, we're finally on the green. We putt and it takes me five shots to get into the hole. Meanwhile, the people behind us are waiting, and the group ahead is nowhere in sight.

The marshal comes up and tells us we have to move faster because we're holding up all the groups behind us. Again, I think, "Fun. Okay, yea. Get real! This is the most miserable thing I have ever done in my life."

After three and a half hours, we finally finish. I tell my friends, "I will never play this game again. It is not fun, I feel rushed with people behind, trying to hit the ball and missing it, and the marshal pushing us all around the course."

Let's not let this scenario happen to you. As a beginner, don't put any expectations on yourself. Ask your friends NOT to help you and to keep quiet. Tell them you have given yourself permission to have fun and play golf your way. So you are going to have fun and not worry about the mechanics while you're playing. Tell them you will do that at the driving range once a week.

Updates

Financial Report:

We have ended November 2014 well within our operating and capital budget year-to-date. While I realize I make that statement every month, the fact is there is no better statement that I could make because financially we are sound and in good shape. All divisions have a positive net operating variance from budget, excluding the Bowling Division, which has a small \$3,485 negative variance year-to-date. With the bowling tournament income forthcoming in the December financial, it is possible that this small negative variance will be eliminated by year end. Nonetheless, we will, without a doubt, end 2014 with a positive variance from budget. As you will see in the motion for the 2015 budget today, these positive variances are used to reduce the increases in annual property assessment income needed to meet the upcoming operating and capital budget for 2015. While there will be a minimal increase (\$6.00/per year/per property) in annual property assessments beginning February 1, 2015, the amount produced by this increase will only cover the lack of rent paid by Maricopa County for the Bell library. Therefore, any increased costs for utilities, repairs and maintenance, payroll and capital expenditures in 2015 will be covered by positive variances in prior year operations.

Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments in November were below the monthly average for the year by 40%. As a result, past due assessments increased by over 2% in November. The timing of the Thanksgiving holiday caused our month end to be earlier this year and resulted in fewer days for payments. This had an impact on the total payments received in November. October billings went past due at a rate of 6.0% and September balances went 60 days past due at a rate of 3.1%. Both of these rates are below the monthly averages for the past 12 months.

Total accounts receivables increased by 3.6% in November. Even with the increase from last month, the balances for November are 4% lower than 2013. In November we saw a 1% increase in property transfer related balances and a 48% increase in lender owned related invoices, which offset last month's drop. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent 53% of all receivables due and past due balances.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties held steady at 46 properties at the end of November. The number of properties owned by lending institutions increased slightly in November and is also now at 46 properties.

Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in November totaled \$491,938, which is \$161,938 over the amount budgeted. Year-to-date PIF fees are \$6,360,876 which is \$2,700,876 over budget for the year. Again a reminder that we intentionally budget PIF income very conservatively to assure that we have the cash on hand for any planned project as we remain debt free.

Bowling:

The Arizona State Senior Tournament was completed on December 7, 2014; the tournament produced approximately \$8,000 in income.

The Arizona State Women's Senior Tournament was completed on December 14, 2014 and produced approximately \$2,500 in unbudgeted income. This year was the first year that a RCSC Bowling Center has hosted the Arizona State Senior Women's Tournament.

Human Resources:

In human resources we have been preparing for the many changes that will take place effective the first of January. In addition to working within a new budget, we will be implementing a newly revised pay plan that along with other changes incorporates an increase in the State of Arizona's minimum wage to \$8.05 per hour. Many more states will implement a state minimum wage in 2015 leaving very few operating at the federal level of \$7.25 per hour.

RCSC's employee benefit plans renew January 1, therefore we are holding open enrollment meetings and processing enrollment changes in the medical, dental, and life insurance plans, as well as the 401(k) and the unreimbursed medical plans.

Hiring continues with employee turnover remaining about the same as employees make life changes.

General:

Thank you Marion for the past 25 years and here's hoping for many more years to come!

Project Updates

General Centers Projects and Information

The electronic sign project is progressing nicely with all signs, except Oakmont and Lakeview, now set in place. Electrical work is nearing completion on the northeast Mt. View sign and Sun Bowl sign so these two signs should come online very soon. Electrical work will continue on all the other signs until all are up and running. The entire project is expected to be completed in early 2015. Contractors are Bootz and Duke Signs and Accel Electric. (PIF Cost – \$850,775)

North Golf Maintenance

The North golf maintenance facility recently had a concrete apron poured in front of the maintenance building, areas around the maintenance building re-paved and three bulk material storage areas constructed. Contractors were Ken McIntyre Construction and Sunland Asphalt. (Cost \$89,853)

Viewpoint Lake/Duffeeland

A third fish habitat construction event was held December 11, 2014 at Lakeview Center. During this event, 17 volunteers constructed approximately 60 hanging fortresses to be located on docks around the lake and at the Lakeview pier. Deployment of these hanging fortresses will occur in January 2015. If you have not signed up to help out with this



very important project, please call the RCSC Administration office at (623) 561-4600 and add your name and contact information to our list of volunteers.

Here's the Fishy News! Threadfin shad (forage fish for bass, bluegill and catfish) are still delayed due to supplier inventory shortages. Once quantities are available, the shad will be delivered and introduced into Viewpoint Lake. The RCSC is planning to stock 10" to 12" Rainbow Trout in Viewpoint Lake on December 22, 2014.

The Duffeeland dog park improvement project is currently on hold while a dog club is organized. Once this club is formed and approved by the RCSC Board of Directors, I will share improvement plans with the new club officers and schedule the dog park improvements.

Bell Center

Four of the 10 courts are now poured and concrete will be poured on two more courts December 16, 2014. The pouring of the courts must follow a sequential order from west to east and from north to south as we move towards the only construction entry point for this facility. Hopefully we will not experience more rain as construction work was delayed two days due to the rain storm on December 4, 2014. Hole #4 at the mini golf course is now under construction and remains closed. Cardholders playing the course are asked to take par for hole #4. The tennis project includes demolition of the current (8) tennis courts and the installation of (10) new tennis courts. The new updated complex will also include a shaded gathering area, courtside canopies with benches, water and electric to each court, tables and benches for spectators and planters in the common areas. Contractors include Lloyd Sports Engineering as architect and project manager and Sunland Sports as building contractor. (PIF Cost – \$1,778,074)

The RCSC Grounds Department installed 20 tons of decorative rock in the landscaped areas around the Liberty Bell and Del Webb monument at Bell Center. (Cost – \$1,138)

A new 5.5 HP commercial circulating pump was installed at the Bell walking pool. In addition, some re-piping was done and some special flow meters were installed. Contractor was Aquatic Concepts. (Cost – \$6,975)

Sundial Center

The refrigerant coil on one of the Sundial pool dehumidifiers recently failed and had to be replaced. Contractor was W.D. Manor Company. (Cost – \$32,564)

Marinette Center

The Marinette project continues to move forward even with delays due to the recent rainstorm of December 4, 2014. As of this report, the pavilion has reached its maximum height and steel is being set for the roof structure. Stucco work around all the new buildings continues and the block wall along the east property line is completed. Uncovered pickleball courts to the North are poured and fenced in, and the same is true of the half-court basketball area. Uncovered pickleball courts to the south of the pavilion are formed and ready for installation of the post tension cables. Interior painting of the fitness center and lobby area is completed and ceiling grid and lighting are installed in these areas. Wall tile work is underway in the restrooms and lobby / hallway floor tile is expected to begin in the next few weeks. The Marinette Center expansion and renovation project includes a 4,000 s.f. fitness center, rubberized outdoor walking track, a total of 20 Pickleball courts, an outdoor spa, a thermal solar system for pool water pre-heating, tankless water heaters for the showers, new doors and windows and exterior stucco of all remaining buildings. Contractors include: CCBG Architectural, Robert Porter Construction and Aquatic Builders. (PIF Cost – \$4,709,422)

Mt. View Center

A new 7.5 HP commercial circulating pump was installed at the Mt. View pool. In addition, some re-piping was done and some special flow meters were installed. Contractor was Aquatic Concepts. (Cost – \$8,600)

Skilled Trades Department

The RCSC Skilled Trades department completed 114 work orders during the last two weeks of November and the first two weeks of December 2014. The RCSC Skilled Trades carpenters and painter continue to construct cabinets for the Marinette clay club remodel while the RCSC fitness technician and pool mechanic continue their routine preventative maintenance and repair duties.



Centers Operations

Sundial was especially busy Thanksgiving week this year. On the Tuesday before the holiday, the Sundial staff set up 2,000 chairs for a public Arizona Corporation Commission meeting. Immediately after that ended, the staff had to set up for the Arts and Crafts show which used almost 300 tables. Our appreciation and congratulations go out to the team at Sundial for the good job they did in flawlessly making both events happen.

What’s Your H²O IQ?

The answer is landscaping. Up to 50% of household water consumption goes toward outdoor use and 50% of that is lost to evaporation or runoff caused by overwatering.

2. A traditional clothes washer, the kind you find in most homes, averages how many gallons per load?
- 10
36
41
60

The answer is 41 gallons. Switching to a “green machine” could reduce water use to as little as 23 gallons and requires half the energy, not only saving resources but on costs as well.

3. In most cases, which conserves more resources?
- Washing dishes by hand
Washing dishes in the dish washer

The answer is using the dishwasher. Don’t pre-rinse your dishes, make sure you have a full load, and don’t feel guilty about pushing that button.

4. When you scrub, which uses less water?
- A Shower
A bath in a tub

The answer is a bath, unless you take what is called a “military shower” and rinse, turn off the water, soap up and rinse again; but if you’re someone who likes to “soak in the shower,” break out the bubble bath instead and settle into the tub.

5. How much water is used during a typical shower?
- 5 gallons
17 gallons
17 gallons
37 gallons

The answer is 17 gallons. An eight minute shower (the average) uses 17. Again, think about taking a “military shower” if you’re going over 8 minutes!

The answer is between five and seven gallons. Fill a plastic soda bottle with water and place it inside your tank to displace water and save gallons. Don’t use bricks or other materials that can damage your tank or disintegrate and damage your pipes!

7. In the United States, what is the biggest use of greywater (untreated freshwater)?
- Personal and residential use
Industrial use
Irrigation
Power generation

The answer is irrigation. Irrigation and power generation make up for about 40 percent each, but water used to make electricity – to cool thermoelectric equipment – goes back into the environment.

8. Which of these averages the most water per person per day?
- Bathing
Flushing the toilet
Running the washing machine
Running the dishwasher

The answer is flushing the toilet. Toilets use 24 gallons, bathing uses approximately 20, the laundry takes just over 8, and the dishwasher uses 4. If you can, think about flushing only every other time (when your bodily function allows). This will cut your water use for toileting in half!

9. On average, \$2 would buy how much water from a public water service?
- 20 gallons
100 gallons
500 gallons
1000 gallons

The answer is 1,000 gallons. Water is a relatively inexpensive resource.

If you scored:
7-9 correct: You’re very water wise.
4-6 correct: Your glass is only half full.
0-3 correct: You’re all wet! And water – logged at that! Save some water for the rest of us!

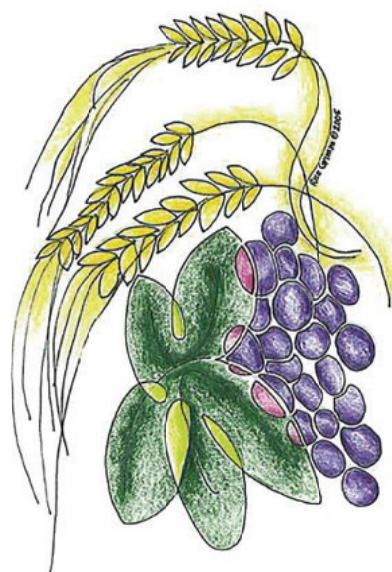

Osteoblasts are the cells that replace lost bone. Stimulating the production of osteoblasts is imperative for someone with osteopenia or osteoporosis. Whether you face bone-density problems, or simply want to avoid getting them, regular weight-bearing exercise is a MUST."

"Not just any old workout gets results," notes Fortier, who personally deals with osteoporosis. "Resistance exercise, that requires muscles to work against gravity, has the most bone-building benefit. Bone responds to intensity, not duration. It reacts to a force greater than what it is used to, not a repetition of the same force. Strength exercise has the ability to progressively and continually challenge muscles that are connected to bones, thus activating osteoblasts. Strength exercise that involves as many different muscles groups, in as many different functional movement patterns as possible, is the best."

Fortier has created a workout for Peggy Spoon that addresses load, intensity and variety – key elements for activating osteoblasts. Daily Fitness trainers custom design programs to fit individual needs and issues.
