Golf Report

Pro Shops

Slightly cooler temperatures and a later start to over-seed resulted in a revenue deficit to budget. On a bright note, merchandise sales did exceed budgeted goals, and we thank you. We have several items at Riverview that would make great Christmas gifts, including a Golf Buddy Laser Range Finder or an Orange Whip swing training aid, stop in and do some last minute shopping.

The free clinics conducted in October and November proved to be popular once again. For the month of November, a total of 423 students attended the clinics over four consecutive Saturdays. The highest single day count was 110 students on both November 7 and 14.

The Beat the Pro event held on December 10 was successful in reaching our fundraising goal of \$2000 with \$2,478 raised for the Sun City Fire Department. This year, only 3 teams managed to beat the Pro's score of 63; they were, Wayne Van Horn & Nicky Vornholt, 62.8, Noel Johnson & Arthur Jenkins, 62.5 and Keith Smith & Royal Halvorsen, 62.6. The winning teams will be awarded \$260 (\$130 per player) for their winning efforts. The trick shot show by Brad Denton was informative, fun and entertaining, with a nice mix of golf tips, impersonations and skillful trick shots. Brad also aided our fundraising efforts hitting tee shots on the 12th hole.

The group from Pure Grip will be on site installing grips December 18 at Willowcreek. This will be your last opportunity with Pure Grip this year. They offer a wide selection of grips and are installed using air. Since no solvent is used, there is no drying time and the clubs can be used immediately after install. Pure Grip may add dates in 2016 and we will announce that schedule if it becomes available.

Snack Shops

Total revenue for the snack shops, also was affected by over-seed schedule and weather, missing budget by \$1,600.

Golf Courses

The two greens affected by Pythium Blight at North have been reopened. Though not fully recovered, we felt additional downtime would have been of little benefit. The greens on the front 9 at South were affected by rain during over-seeding. The rain slightly washed the greens, leaving behind a rippling effect. The greens most affected were the 5th and 6th holes.

SCMGA President Comments on Course Renovation

I thought I would send you my impressions of the new Riverview Golf Course. On arriving my first time I was very impressed with all the changes made. The driving range and practice putting areas, the new practice ball dispenser, the club house and snack bar areas make your golfing experience more enjoyable and bring Riverview to a new era for golf in Sun City. Equal too many of the better courses in the surrounding communities.

Upon playing the course for the first time I noticed subtle changes that make course management more of a challenge. The tee areas are flat, the fairways are wide, the greens are large and the sand traps are challenging and as hazards should be. I understand that as with the North course renovation there will be a period of firm fairways and fast greens, these add to the attraction of playing a course that challenges you to play your best. Anyone who expects the game of golf to be easy needs to understand that a round ball may take an unusual bounce at any time. It is how well you recover from those unexpected bounces that make the game a challenge. For me I enjoy a challenge and welcome the chance to play courses such as North and Riverview, these will only get better with time and provide future Sun City residents golf courses that they can enjoy.

So I say well done to the RCSC, yourself, the Green Committee's at each course, the architect and maintenance crews. Thank You for providing improved facilities for us here in Sun City!

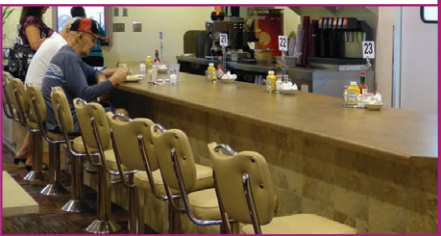

Management Updates

Financial Report:
We have completed November 2015 well within our operating and capital budget year-to-date. And as I said last month, every division has a net operating positive variance from budget.

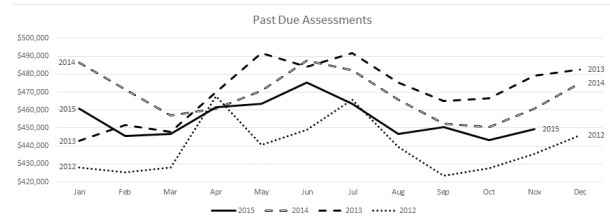
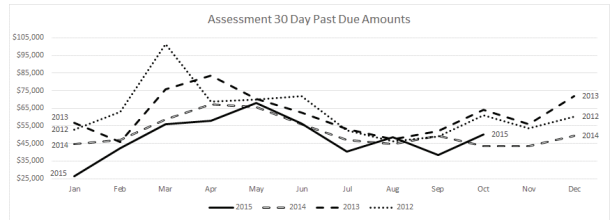
Bowling:
The bowling center modernization is almost complete. We are waiting for railings to be assembled and installed in between the new tables on the concourse. We recently held tournaments which included bowlers from all over the state and we were complimented on the cleanliness and roominess of the bowling centers. One Lakeview Lanes visitor commented “these are the cleanest public restrooms I have ever seen.”

The Arizona State Senior Women’s and Senior Open Tournaments were held at both RCSC Bowling Centers in November. The tournaments produced \$13,000 in unbudgeted income.

New LCD televisions were installed to replace the older models. The new televisions are “smart TVs” which have a much higher resolution which allows us to use them for advertising. The televisions will also be used for televised sporting events that bowlers can view during their league play.

Cardholder Services:
Payments on past due assessments dipped again in November and were under the monthly average for the prior 12 months by 10%. Overall past due assessments increased in November by just under 2% with the Over 30 Days past due balances changing the most and directly offsetting the reduction in October. The Over 30 Day past due rate for October balances was the highest rate in almost 2 years while the Over 60 Day rate was right on average. Year to date payments from our third party collections firm are \$86,452.

The charts below show the 30 Day Past Due Amounts and the Total Past Due Assessments for the past 4 years on a monthly basis for comparison.



In November property transfer related balances increased by 3% and lender owned related balances decreased again by almost 18%. The balance flow for these two categories continues to be dynamic over time as does the number of properties. Outstanding balances related to

property transfers continues to represent approximately 53% of all receivables due and past due balances.

Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal in November totaled \$66,140. YTD payments through the web portal are \$658,164 and continue to represent 3.6% of total accounts receivable payments.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties remained at 49 properties at the end of November. The number of properties owned by lending institutions increased slightly this month to 41 properties.

Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in November were \$534,500, which is \$204,500 over the amount budgeted. Year to date PIF fees are \$6,165,753 which is \$2,505,753, or 68%, over budget for the year. Again a reminder that we intentionally budget PIF income very conservatively to assure that we have the cash on hand for any planned project as we remain debt free.

Human Resources:
The IRS increased the amount of pre-tax dollars that employees can set aside for medical expenses from \$2,500 to \$2,550 for the 2016 calendar year. RCSC has amended the 125 Flexible Benefits Plan to accommodate the change and avoid future amendment costs by amending to read, “The maximum amount permitted under Code Section 125.”

We are in the final process of enrolling employee changes in the benefit plans which includes the Biometric Screenings taking place on December 16 and 17.

Member Services:
Our 2016 individual show seat tickets for the 2016 Sundial Concert Series are now on sale. Show tickets will be on sale daily up through the day of the show unless we sell out prior. Individual show tickets can be purchased in the Clubs Office on the lower level of the Lakeview Recreation Center near the gold entrance. Club Office hours are 8:30am to 4:00pm Monday through Friday. For your convenience, we will sell tickets at the Sundial box office, if still available, and will accept cash, check, Visa, MasterCard and Discover at the window.

Our final event of 2015, the annual Holiday Celebration was a fabulous fun-filled event. The ever thrilling duck races had some lucky winners receiving great cash prizes along with the money tree. And if you left without a pie from the infamous pie walk, hopefully it wasn’t without giving it a try. The hole-in-one contest was more exciting than ever as the competition was fierce. We enjoyed musical entertainment, a light show, great refreshments, and the lighted boat parade which was projected on the big screen. All proceeds from this event went to benefit the RCSC management team’s Sun City charity of the year... our Sun City Fire and Medical Department!

Project Updates

General Information

- On Monday December 7, 2015 I was invited to attend the American Sports Builders Association (ASBA) national awards dinner at the Scottsdale Princess, which followed their annual technical meeting. I was told that the RCSC qualified to be awarded a distinguished facility award for the new Bell Tennis facility completed in April 2015. At this awards dinner not only did the RCSC receive the “Distinguished Facility” award, but was also awarded the 2015 Outstanding Outdoor Tennis Facility of the Year award for the most outstanding tennis facility constructed in America during 2015.
- Twenty-two (22) Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) have purchased and installation will occur in January 2016 at all RCSC recreation centers and golf pro shops along with the Sun Bowl and softball fields.



Lakeview Center / Lakeview Lanes / Viewpoint Lake

- A new office was constructed within the Human Resources department at Lake-view Center. Contractors were Ken McIntyre Construction and Accel Electric. (Cost – \$6,690)
- The large crack in the Viewpoint Lake wall has now been evaluated by a Structural Engineer. His final conclusions and repair requirements will be received soon at which time a repair contractor will be hired to complete the work. The good news is that the repair can be made using an expanding foam injection process rather than replacing a section of the lake wall. (Estimated Cost for Engineer and Repairs – \$4,000)
- Remodel work at Lakeview Lanes is nearing completion with only the divider railings between the counters to be bolted in place. Contractors include DFG Builders, Resource Flooring and the RCSC Skilled Trades Team. (Cost – \$55,248)

Sundial Center/Lakes East-West Maintenance

- The broken florescent light fixtures in the clubs display cases at Sundial Center have been replaced with new LED lighting. Contractor was Accel Electric. (Cost – \$11,312)
- Carpeting in the Sundial Massage Room is being replaced. Contractor is Resource Flooring. (Cost – \$1,224)
- New steel spear and composite wood replacement gates are being fabricated for the East/West maintenance facility. The gates will be installed in late December 2015. Contractor is Sav-on-Fence Company. (Cost – \$2,150)

Bell Center / Bell Lanes

- Remodel work at Bell Lanes is nearing completion with only the divider railings between the counters to be bolted in place. Contractors include DFG Builders, Resource Flooring and the RCSC Skilled Trades Team. (Cost – \$47,812)
- The interior set of bi-parting automatic doors at the main Bell Library entrance have been replaced. Contractor was D.H. Pace. (Cost – \$6,785)

Sun Bowl

- Installation of the new T-Mobile Monopalm Cell Tower at the Sun Bowl property is now completed. This new site will not cause any loss of parking spaces as these are desperately needed for RCSC Sun Bowl shows.



Willowcreek/Willowbrook Bridges

- Repairs were made to three Willowbrook and twelve Willowcreek golf course bridges. Contractor was DFG Builders. (Cost – \$2,137)

Skilled Trades Department

- The RCSC Skilled Trades Department completed 170 work orders during the last two weeks of November and first two weeks of December 2015.

Centers Operations

- Thanks to all the community who showed up for the RCSC Fire Sale on Friday, December 4, 2015. The sale was a great success with 100% of the proceeds going to the Sun City Fire Department.
- Additional umbrellas, loungers, tables, and chairs were recently added to the pool area at Mountain View Center.
- Additional loungers were recently added to the pool area at Oakmont Center.
- Congratulations to Katie Kavanagh who recently celebrated her 10 year anniversary with RCSC. Katie currently works at Sundial.
- On Monday, December 1, Bill Hankins, a utility worker at Sundial Rec Center, bowled a 300 game at Bell Lanes. This was his seventh 300 game. Not only is Bill an exceptional bowler he is also a valuable RCSC employee. He started working with the RCSC in 2011 at Lakeview Lanes.

Sun City resident Wayne Ecker has been playing pool a long time – over eighty years. He finds plenty of opportunity to follow this sport within the community.

Originally from Verona, Pennsylvania (near Pittsburgh), Wayne, 90, and his wife Evelyn, 86 have lived in Sun City for seven years. Wayne once owned a pool hall in Verona called "Kosse's." His association with billiards began at the age of eight when he racked pool balls and did odd jobs at a neighborhood billiards establishment.

We recently spoke with Wayne as he prepared to enter a billiard tournament held weekly at the Lakeview Recreation Center here in Sun City. He remains competitive, challenging players Tuesday and Thursday mornings in doubles tournaments.

Wayne holds the title of "Senior Stick" at these competitions, and often coaches players while shooting eight-ball. He revealed that new players can become frustrated because they have not spent time developing fundamental skills like keeping a level cue; using a smooth stroke and follow-through; not gripping the cue stick too tightly; or failure to keep their heads down through the entire shot.

Advice from an experienced player is always available at Sun City's billiard facilities, and Wayne encourages anyone who wants to learn more about pool to check out the Sun City Billiards Club at Lakeview Recreation Center or call Bob Elston 602-319-0783. Building Musle Burns Fat

Lynn Altherr of Sun City, works-out, on a regular basis, at the Fairway Fitness Center. Like most individuals over the age of 60, Lynn is concerned about muscle strength, energy & stamina and weight loss. Daily Fitness trainer, Jane Fortier, has introduced Lynn to a comprehensive exercise program that gets results. “So often people want to learn specific exercises that will get rid of flabby arms, eliminate a big belly, or reduce an oversized rear-end”, states Jane. “My answer is never what they want to hear – There is no way to spot reduce any specific area of the body!”

Research shows that it’s impossible to pick and choose the areas where fat will be burned. Doing abdominal crunches will firm up abdominal muscles, but will not eliminate belly fat. Doing a buns-

of-steel workout will firm up the gluteus muscles, but will not reduce the size of the butt. Doing dips will firm up the triceps muscles, but will not get rid of bat wings! Muscle and fat are two separate and distinct tissues, composed of entirely different cells. Increasing muscle mass and decreasing body fat are individual processes. These processes, however, can occur simultaneously, especially if an individual is focusing on changing body composition. A good strength training program will result in more “lean weight” and less “fat weight” over a period of time. Building muscle ANYWHERE burns fat EVERYWHERE. Specific areas like the belly, rear, and arms will

see a reduction in fat as an individual builds muscle throughout the entire body. This can be accomplished with a comprehensive exercise program that includes strength training, cardiovascular work and flexibility exercises.

Aromatherapy - A Treat for the Senses

Aroma means scent and therapy means treatment. So aromatherapy is the practice of using fragrant parts of plants to create essential oils to improve your health and well-being. This can be done through the sense of smell by inhaling the essential oils through the nose, essential oils can be added to massage oils for therapeutic benefits and in some cases certain essential oils may be taken orally. Our sense of smell is the only sense directly tied to the limbic area of the brain, which is considered the emotional control center. This means that when essential oils are inhaled, they are absorbed directly into the brain. Inhaling the appropriate fragrance can reduce stress, relieve depression, and hasten a good night sleep.

The inhaled aroma from these “essential” oils is widely believed to stimulate brain function. Each of the essential oils has therapeutic stimulating, calming, sedative, balancing properties.

Essential oils are aromatic liquids or oils that are derived from the processing of shrubs, flowers, trees, roots, bushes, resins and seeds. These oils also known as nature’s living energy contain unique constituents that provide therapeutic benefits that can enhance our psychological and physical well-being. Aromatherapy has been used for centuries in countries such as Egypt, Italy, India and China.

There are a wide number of essential oils available that are sold separately or they are combined to create blends of oils to address specific healing properties. Some of the most common oils are Lemon which is known for its immune enhancing properties. Lavender is known for its ability to promote relaxation. Peppermint oil has a stimulating effect.

Caution must be taken when using essential oils only the small amounts recommended should be used. Keep essential oils away from children and away from your eyes.

There are several ways essential oils can be utilized. For Inhalation, Dry Evaporation, placing several drops of oil on a cotton ball or a tissue, simple kept it in your vicinity perhaps sniffing occasionally. Spray bottle, a few drops of oils in a spray bottle and perhaps one or two pumps on your pillow case or sheets. A couple drops of essential oils can be absorbed during a massage or a bath as well. It is important to use just one type of oil or oil blend with caution; they can have a very powerful effect.
