Golf Report

Pro Shops

Complimentary golf clinics at Lakes West began on October 31, with approximately 100 students participating the first session followed by 110 students on November 7 and 14. The final free clinic will be held on November 21, with a 9:30am. start. Clinics are open to all skill levels and do not require registration. This is a great opportunity to introduce a family member, friend or neighbor to the wonderful game of golf. Free clinics will be offered again in March 2016.

Continuing through January 31, the first tee time will be 8:00am. This change does not apply to Wednesday Men's Day, the time on Wednesdays will remain 7:30am. This change was made several years ago to reduce the number of tee times lost to frost delays and to open more times for those wishing to play.

Plenty of new merchandise is on display and for sale at Riverview Golf Course. If you are in the market for a bargain, Willowcreek has plenty of items on sale. If you are in the market for a new pair of shoes or a golf bag, we invite you to shop with us.

Golf Courses

Riverview opened on November 14, on schedule and without cart path restrictions. The response to the course renovation was mostly positive, though several golfers expressed dismay with the firmness and speed of the greens. We remind everyone that the greens were not overseeded this year to protect the putting surfaces long term. The dormant greens will putt well; however, since the putting surface is dormant and not growing, our ability to control the speed is limited.

All courses have opened for play following overseeding. The courses that recently reopened are expected to have cart path restrictions in place until Thanksgiving. The seed variety chosen for fairways and tees has performed as expected and is growing well, the more normal October temperatures also helped. Mowing heights are coming down and will continue to do so on a course specific basis. The two greens at North that have been closed due to Pythium blight are expected to reopen on November 21.

The new well on Lakes West golf course is nearing completion. The well and required infrastructure is in place and we are on the list with APS for installation of a transformer and meter. Once these items are in place the well will be energized.

Snack Shops

Total revenue has exceeded budget by \$27,207 through September. We thank everyone for their continued support. Beginning November 1st, closing time for the Snack Shops has moved to 5:00pm.

Lawn Bowling and Grounds

Lawn Bowl greens have entered dormancy and speeds can be expected to increase. Lakeview Lawn Bowlers will benefit from the dormancy. Greens have been kept longer than normal to provide protection in the winter months. The grounds crew will be kept busy this winter around Lakeview mowing and trimming trees and bushes.

But with each good-bye comes another round of hellos and congratulations as we welcome three new Directors to the board.


Gary Cotten brings to the board many years of real estate brokerage and residential construction RCSC 2015 Board President experience. His insights into

Management Updates

Financial Report:

We have completed October 2015 well within our operating and capital budget year-to-date. As a matter of fact, every division has a net operating positive variance from budget.

Bowling


Bell Lanes and Lakeview Lanes recently hosted the Metro Phoenix USBC Valley of the Sun Senior Tournament. There were 28 team entries. The tournament produced approximately \$2,200 of unbudgeted income. Shirley Braverman of Phoenix, who is also a member of our Columbia 300 scratch league, bowled the only 300 game of the tournament at Lakeview Lanes. This was the second 300 game that Shirley has bowled at Lakeview Lanes.

The remodel of the bowling centers is almost complete. The railings have been installed and we are currently in the process of securing the tables to the floor. Once the tables are secured, additional railings and garbage cans will be added to the space between tables.


Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments dipped slightly in October and were under the monthly average for the prior 12 months by 5%. Overall past due assessments decreased in October by just under 2% with the Over 30 Days past due balances changing the most. The 30 Day past due rate assessments decreased in October and is the lowest rate for September for the last four years. Year to date payments from our third party collections firm are \$79,849.

The charts below show the 30 Day Past Due Amounts and the Total Past Due Assessments for the past four years on a monthly basis for comparison.



The chart below shows the total accounts receivable balance for each month this year. The total is categorized by Assessments, Fees (Late/Interest/Lien) and PIF/Transfer with the relative percentage for each category each month.



In October property transfer related balances remained relatively unchanged and lender owned related balances decreased by over 21%. The balance flow for these two categories continues to be dynamic over time as does the number of properties. Outstanding balances related to property transfers continues to represent 52% of all receivables due and past due balances.

Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal in October totaled \$51,688. Year to date payments through the web portal are \$592,023 and continue to represent 3.6% of total accounts receivable payments.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties increased to 49 properties at the end of October. The number of properties owned by lending institutions was unchanged again in October at 39 properties.

Preservation and Improvement Fees (PIF) collected in October were \$496,733, which is \$220,733 over the amount budgeted. Year to date PIF fees are \$5,631,253 which is \$2,301,253, or 69%, over budget for the year. Again a reminder that we intentionally budget PIF income very conservatively to assure that we have the cash on hand for any planned project as we remain debt free.

The Cardholder Services and Member Services offices have moved back into their updated offices on the first floor at Lakeview Center. While both areas continue to get settled in and get everything in place, we anticipate that the space will be more comfortable for Cardholders and allow us to better serve you.

Human Resources:

In early November, open enrollment meetings were held to explain the Benefits Plan provided by RCSC and made available to full time employees. The meetings were facilitated by representatives of BlueCross/BlueShield of AZ and Mutual of Omaha.

Plans available include medical, dental, life, short and long term disability, employee assistance program and an unreimbursed medical plan. The Unreimbursed medical plan is available through Section 125 of the Internal Revenue Code and RCSC's Director of Human Resources presented that information at the benefits meetings.

The RCSC Benefits Plan is designed to acknowledge that our workforce is diverse and recognizes its diversity as it encourages each employee to design his/her own benefits plan based on individual needs. The individual plans are paid for in a diverse manner: some are 100% RCSC paid; some are cost shared; others are 100% employee paid.

The Benefits Plan runs on a January 1 through December 31 Plan Year. Annually, employees are given the opportunity to make changes in their coverages to accommodate their individual and family needs for the coming year. Open enrollment establishes the time period for allowing changes.

Member Services:

There are still many great seats available for indiviual show tickets for the 2016 Winter-Spring Sundial Concert Series. Tickets can be purchased at the Lakeview Clubs Office.

Project Updates

Lakeview Center / Lakeview Lanes / Viewpoint Lake

- Two Viewpoint Lake wall repairs will be made once the necessary repair products arrive. One is small and will only take about an hour to complete but the other is very large and is being reviewed by a structural engineer before repairs are made. (Estimated Cost for these repairs \$4,000)
- The Cardholder Services and Clubs offices renovation project is now complete. Both offices have moved back into their new space and are serving cardholders. I would like to thank RCSC cardholders for their patience and the Lakeview staff for all their hard work during this project. Contractors were Ken McIntyre Construction, Accel Electric, CCBG Architectural, D.H. Pace and Resource Flooring. (Cost – \$209,196)
- Remodel work at Lakeview Lanes is nearing completion with the new bowlers'
 area flooring installed, carpet trim-outs completed and new ball racks and counters set up. The new handrails are now installed on the stairs and the divider railings between the counters are being fabricated. Contractors include DFG Builders,
 Resource Flooring and the RCSC Skilled Trades Team. (Cost \$55,248)
- The re-carpeting of the Lakeview mini golf course is now completed. Contractor is Floors at the Arizona Design Center. (Cost – \$20,781)
- Construction and deployment of pipe palaces fish habitat into Viewpoint Lake occurred the week of October 26, 2015. Construction and deployment of fingerling fortress fish habitat and hanging fish habitat occurred the week of November 2, 2015. Construc-



tion and deployment of catfish condos habitat occurred the week of November 19, 2015. This completes the total fish habitat project for Viewpoint Lake. Additionally, approximately 500-600 lbs. of 10"–13" rainbow trout will be stocked in Viewpoint Lake once the lake temperature decreases. This will most likely happen in December 2015.

Sundial Center

- The small pole lights around Sundial Center have now been replaced with new LED fixtures. Many positive comments have been received about these fixtures and the improved lighting. Contractor was Accel Electric. (Cost – \$14,109)
- The broken florescent light fixtures in the clubs display cases at Sundial will be replaced soon with new LED lighting. Contractor is Accel Electric. (Cost \$11,312)
- A \$10,502 APS rebate was received by the RCSC for the Sundial pool/spa LED lighting project. The rebate brought the total cost for this project from \$55,425 to \$44,923 since there were no contingency costs associated with this project.

Bell Center / Bell Lanes

 Remodel work at Bell Lanes is nearing completion with the new bowlers' area flooring installed, carpet trim-outs completed and new ball racks and counters set up. The new handrails are now installed on the stairs and the divider railings between the counters are being fabricated. Contractors include DFG Builders, Resource Flooring and the RCSC Skilled Trades Team. (Cost – \$47,812)

Fairway Center

 The Best Friends Dog Club shade canopy and artificial turf project is now completed. Contractors included Arizona Bag and Shade, Sun Burst Landscaping, and CCBG Architectural. (Cost – \$80,909)

Mt. View Center / Sun Bowl

A new T-Mobile Monopalm Cell Tower is currently being installed at the Sun Bowl
property just west of the existing cell tower. The new site will not cause the RCSC
to lose any parking spaces as these are desperately needed for RCSC Sun Bowl
shows.

Skilled Trades Department

 The RCSC Skilled Trades department completed 127 work orders during the firstthree weeks of November 2015.

Centers Operations

 Marinette successfully hosted a Pickleball tournament from Tuesday, November 3, 2015 through Friday, November 6, 2015. The Marinette staff did a stellar job meeting the needs of the 330 participants during this event.



- Bell Metal and Wood Shops held a Halloween party which included watching movies and playing mini golf at the Bell mini golf course. The Bell staff really enjoyed serving this wonderful group of cardholders.
- Although the days are getting shorter don't forget you can still play mini golf under the lights at any one of our four courses. The locations are Mountain View, Lakeview, Sundial and Bell.

Water Conservation

Water Ouotes & Considerations

Let's take a couple of famous quotes about water and talk a little about the impact it really has in our lives.

Water, water, every where, Nor any drop to drink.

This part of the "The Rime of the Ancient Mariner" is truer than one might think. Recalling that 70% of our home planet is water, one must also recall that nearly 97% of that is saltwater; and 90% of that remaining fresh water is locked up in the ice caps and glaciers. This leaves a minuscule 1% for consumption. Keeping as much water as possible out of our treatment plants means conserving by way of military showers, washing only full loads of laundry, rinsing dishes or cleaning vegetable and fruits in a bowl or sink full of water, turning off the tap while brushing teeth, et cetera. Think about all the things we've learned and implement as many of them as you can as often as you can.

There's a hole in the bucket, Dear Liza...Well fix it Dear Henry...

One faucet dripping one drip per second wastes 27,000 gallons of water annually according to one IBM infographic series. If focusing on your budget helps, the average cost of water in the West Valley is \$51.30 per 9,000 gallons. So one faucet dripping one drip per second, per one year could cost you approximately \$154 (or more) for nothing, let alone the wasted resources.

How in the heck can I wash my neck if it ain't gonna rain no more?

I bet you're wondering how this is going to tie in; so here it is: Another way to conserve water is to keep a bucket handy and when warming up that shower, catch the cold water. This can be used to water your animals, plants (interior and exterior) or to flush your toilet. I suppose you could even use it to wash your neck if you so wish. Learning to bathe at the sink with cold, or at least cooler, water (instead of waiting for the hot water to reach the basin) is another great way to conserve.




The shop is a non-profit club. The proceeds from all club sales purchase future equipment/supplies giving us the best-supplied shop in Sun City.



Thank you, Sun City AZ, for your support and generosity!







Tips for Seniors from Daily Fitness Preparing the Body for Pickleball

Strength Exercise can improve the performance of these two muscle groups, and Flexibility Exercises can cut down on injury to these muscles. The Illiotibial Band needs to be strong and pliable to protect knees with the lateral movement involved in pickleball."

"Because the sport requires lots of bending, trunk rotation, side-to-side shifts and arm swings, the muscles involved in those movements need to be in good condition, as well", continues Fortier. "Preparing appropriate muscles for the game should involve a balanced strength workout, as well as static and dynamic stretches for flexibility."
