RCSC Pools Maintain “Healthy Swimming” Standards

Safe and healthy swimming is one of the hallmarks at RCSC’s seven recreation centers and Cardholders and their guests are a key component to healthy pool sanitation.

While all recreational pool facilities must comply with Maricopa County Department of Environmental Health rules and regulations, RCSC goes above and beyond those requirements to ensure the wellbeing of swimmers, bathers and walkers alike that use the pools and spas.

Although public health code only requires one reading each day to test for chlorine, alkaline and PH levels, RCSC goes even further for your benefit by testing four times per day at each of the RCSC Center’s pools and spas. Chemicals may need to be added and adjustments are made as necessary to maintain correct water balance.

In addition, all RCSC pools and spas are now equipped with Ultra Violet (UV) Light Systems which not only

reduce the amount of chlorine needed but further eliminate any bacteria in the water. During this process, all of the water is channeled through a full pipe UV System and completely sanitized before returning to the pool or spa.

But all the chemicals, treatment and testing can’t keep all of the pools healthy and sanitary all of the time. Swimmers must be active participants in helping with these efforts.

With all the steps the RCSC is taking and with the continued help and support from Cardholders and their guests, RCSC will

be able to maintain healthy swimming pools and spas for everyone’s enjoyment by following these simple guidelines:

- Don’t swim if you have diarrhea. Doing so can spread germs and make other people sick.
- Stay out of the water for at least two weeks after symptoms disappear.
- Avoid getting pool water in your mouth and if you do, don’t swallow.
- Always practice good hygiene. Showers are required before swimming.
- Take frequent bathroom breaks and thoroughly wash your hands after using the restroom
- If you see fecal matter, immediately report it to the on-duty Facility Attendant so that proper measures can be taken.

RCSC staff fully is responsible for all pool maintenance and sanitation management. Certified Pool Operators are on-staff at all RCSC Recreation Centers whose responsibilities include water testing and pool equipment maintenance. In addition, two RCSC managers very recently completed the required testing and have received their Aquatics Facility Operator Certification ensuring our that facilities continue to be operated for your utmost enjoyment and protection by providing clean and sanitized pools and spas for all Cardholders and their guests.

“With everyone’s continue commitment to keeping RCSC pools clean, Healthy Swimming in Sun City AZ is here to stay!” remarked Jim Wellman, RCSC Assistant General Manager.

Board Candidate Packets Available

RCSC Cardholders are reminded that Members seeking to become candidates in this year's Board of Director elections may be soliciting signatures on RCSC properties over the next several months. There will be three vacancies to fill in the December election, with each vacancy being a 3-year term.

Those interested in becoming a candidate must request a packet in person and present their RCSC Member card at the Corporate/Board Office at Lakeview Center. The deadline for packet submissions is no later than noon on Friday, October 2.

Requirements to become a RCSC Board candidate are:

- Must be at least fifty-five (55) years of age;
- Must not be related by marriage or birth to any other member of the Board, Senior Management Staff, or Board Candidate;
- Must be a Deeded Real Estate Owner of property in Sun City, Maricopa County, Arizona;
- Must be a Member in good standing;
- Must reside in Sun City, Arizona and be available at least ten (10) months of the year;
- Must meet the requirements to hold an Arizona liquor license (RCSC holds liquor licenses which require Board officers to be included on the licensing);

- Must be eligible and available to serve a three (3) year term; and
- Must be available to attend Board Candidate Orientation(s).

Candidates must also submit a fully completed RCSC petition, signed by 100 or more Members in good standing, along with all other forms provided in the RCSC Candidate Packet.

A successful candidate will:

- Have a strong desire to serve Sun City;
- Be fair and courteous;
- Use good common sense;
- Have good communication skills;

- Be willing to work as part of a team;
- Ability to prioritize - policy and projects; which will have the greatest benefit for the most members; and
- Be willing and able to dedicate the necessary hours to be an effective Director.

Candidates will be introduced at both the October and November Board meetings and at two candidate forums that will be held in the fall. Forum locations and dates will be announced at a later time.

Golf Report

Pro Shops

Total revenue for April exceeded both budget and prior year, despite a sharp decline in public play. For the year we are \$28,000 behind budget and \$69,000 behind prior year.

Get Golf Ready classes proved to be popular this year. From November through May 108 students attended the classes. Demand for classes increased from prior year. Get Golf Ready is a national initiative of the PGA of America to introduce people to the game of golf, in a setting that is not intimidating.

On Tuesday, May 19, we conducted our annual USGA visit with Brian Whitlark who is an Agronomist for the USGA, representing the Southwest Region. A key component of these visits is putting green condition, particularly as it relates to our summer agronomic practices. In an effort to reduce the disruption caused by aerification, we began our first full year of performing dual aerifications on each course on back to back days. This process enables us to eliminate May aerifications, thus providing additional play days for summer golfers, free of disruption. During our course visits with Whitlark, the greens did not display any adverse effects from this process.

In addition to his annual visit, Whitlark also made a visit to North on April 23 to give his assessment on the condition of the greens as they were coming out of dormancy. Though the greens have performed as we expected, we felt it important to have a third party review. To quote from his report, “Not overseeding the greens was definitely the correct decision and as a result, the bermuda grass is healthy and emerging from winter dormancy. During the first year after such renovation, regardless of the grass, the greens will be firm. It is part of the maturation process and will take at least two years for the greens to be more receptive to incoming golf shots.” Also included in his assessment were recommendations for continuing fertilization and some tree removal recommendations to provide better sunlight. Whitlark was impressed with the progress the North greens made in between his visits.

Courses

The Riverview project remains on schedule. Final preparation in advance of seeding began on the 5th hole. Grassing is scheduled to begin June 2 and will begin with the placement of sod around green complexes. Once the sod collars are in place, sprigging of the greens will begin. Grassing of the course is expected to be finished in early July. It is important to remember that we will follow the same process of not overseeding the greens the first season following renovation. This decision is made to protect the greens for the long term. Pigment will be applied to give the greens color during

RIGHT!

- 1) Close the gap/hole with putter by patting down the ball mark.
- 2) Insert *Green-Save* tool on the high side behind ball mark and push the back toward the center.
- 3) Do not pull up, twist or lift with the tool.
- 4) Push both sides of the ball mark into the center.
- 5) Gently tap the surface down with putter.
- 6) Never use loosened turf for repair.

WRONG!

Pulling up or lifting on the center or the sides will tear the roots and result in brown spots taking weeks for the surface to heal.

Do not pull up or twist with tool. This will only bring sand to the surface and tear the root system

RIGHT!

Insert tool and push back and sides forward to center. No damage to root system. Healing starts immediately.



Architect's Report

Riverview Renovation Update

One of the challenges of growing-in a golf course is the unpredictability of Mother Nature. We had one of the coolest months of May in a long time. We also received rain and a little humidity in early June which almost never happens. The good thing is the first week of June, although a little cooler than normal in the daytime, the night time temperatures started to creep up and we actually got to a point that newly planted Bermuda grass will actively grow.

Grassing of the golf course started on June 2 and has been going at a steady pace since. We still are on schedule to complete grassing by mid-July, if not sooner. The golf course maintenance staff is working extremely long hours monitoring the watering and working hard to grow-in the golf course. We should really start to see some good growth at about 30 days after planting and then as we enter mid-July and August when the humidity kicks in the grass will really start to take root and grow.

As with any living, breathing organism it is very important during it's infancy to properly nourish it so that as it matures it can be healthy. There will come a time later this summer when the golf course will "look" like it is ready to play but in reality too much traffic could be detrimental to the long-term viability of the turf.

Once everything gets closer to being established myself, the irrigation consultant and superintendent will go through the golf course and create a punch-list of final items that we will have the golf contractor perform before finalizing the construction process.

It seems like just yesterday we started construction and now we are getting closer to the completion of another successful golf course renovation for the Sun City AZ golfers and residents.

the winter season. The greens and disturbed areas will require the same amount of maturing as North and should be expected to play firm in the first two years.

The Board will vote today on a motion to revise the long range plan, including the decision to switch irrigation projects at Lakes East and Willowcreek/Willowbrook. With the recent renovations to North and Riverview, the Board and Management felt it was important to place a pause in between projects that include green renovations. This pause will provide another year of maturity for the North greens and allow for an additional year of maturity for the Riverview greens, before beginning another green renovation.

In order to provide a greater chance of a successful overseed, we will begin overseeding later this year, with a start date of October 5. The later start will provide greater chance of achieving optimal temperatures during the overseed process. In addition to scheduling, we will also be changing seed providers and are evaluating the possibility of expanding overseed around the green complexes.

Snack Shops

Snack Shops exceeded budgeted revenue goals in April. We continue to adjust snack shop closing time based on demand. The scheduled closing time for May is 3:00pm and moves to 1:00pm beginning June 1.

Properly Entering and Exiting Bunkers

It can be frustrating to enter a bunker, only to find your ball sitting in a footprint or divot from a previously played shot. Below are tips that will help ensure everyone has a fair lie in our bunkers and keep the sand in our bunkers distributed properly.

The rules of golf do not permit a golfer to rake a bunker to improve conditions of the lie, stance or area of intended swing. It is for this reason that is important that golfers take the time to rake the bunker following their shot. Taking the time to care for the bunker ensures that other golfers will be provided a chance to play a fair shot free of foot prints.

To help pace of play, a rake should be picked up and brought into bunker prior to hitting your shot. Following your shot the disturbed area should be raked over evenly including foot prints. In general, sand should be raked towards the middle of the bunker. As you exit the bunker it is important that your foot prints are raked behind you. Bunkers should always be entered and exited at the lowest point around the bunker; this area may not be near your ball. It is important to enter and exit the bunker at the lowest point for your safety. Choosing to exit at high points increases the risk of falling and increases the amount time the maintenance crew spends repairing bunkers.

Bunker shots can provide challenging shots under the best of conditions. By following some simple etiquette we can all ensure that these shots will not be more challenging than they should be.

Lakeview Lawn Bowling Renovation

The renovation of the Lakeview Lawn Bowl Greens is nearing completion. After each phase of construction, sub-grade prep, drainage, and gravel layer the contractor has provided survey on a 10' grid to ensure a level playing surface from the bottom up. The final sand layer has been water settled and laser leveled prior to planting the Bermuda grass. Once construction work is complete and both greens have been planted, the grow-in period begins and the new greens should be ready sometime later this year.

Next time you're south of the tracks on a Wednesday, stop by the Model Railroad display at the Fairway Center where you'll


go back in time with an entire room full of boys and their toys (and women, too!).

During the summer months, hours at these venues are limited and it is suggested that you call ahead to make certain they're open. (Phone numbers and more information is listed at the end of this column for your convenience).

If you're willing to venture a little further from Sun City AZ, the Phoenix area offers a number of great cultural spots that might be to your liking.

If you're going toward the airport, take time to stop at the Hall of Flame Fire Museum (6101 East Van Buren Street) where you'll see nearly an acre of fire history exhibits with over 90 fully restored pieces of fire apparatus dating from 1725 to 1969. There's also a gallery dedicated to the history of wildland firefighting. First responders definitely know HOT!

An easy drive up and over on the 101, take the Tatum Boulevard exit and head south to Mayo where the Musical Instrument Museum collection of more than 15,000 instruments and artifacts from around the world provides an opportunity for all to explore and enjoy the wonders of the global language of music.

Updates

Financial Report:

We have ended April 2015 within our operating and capital budget. All divisions, excluding golf, have met their operating and expense goals. The golf division will, however, be receiving a credit for the an insurance claim settlement which will recapture some of the unexpected expenses that have occurred. Due to the weather early in the year, we are \$28k under budget in golf revenue year to date. The management team has been working on a succession plan as it is vital that the organization have a plan for their key personnel when it comes to training and replacement to provide protection in the event of a sudden change. This succession planning has made us aware of some significant holes and has created some beginning changes in our structure to provide additional security for the corporation.

Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments were down in April with overall past due assessments increasing in April by almost 3.5%. March billings went past due at a rate of 4.4% and February balances went 60 days past due at a rate of 3.1%. With March being the largest billing month, even with this being the lowest rate for March balances, it results in a greater overall increase this past month. Historically the March through May three month period is the highest growth period for past due balances. We have seen the lowest March increase for the past four years. Year to date payments from our third party collections firm are \$40,933.

Total accounts receivable increased in April by nominal percentage. Property transfer related balances decreased by 3% in April and lender owned related balances increased by just 1%. Outstanding balances related to property transfers now represent 50% of all receivables due and past due balances.

Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal increased in April for the fourth month in a row and totaled \$77,012. The online payment process is fully integrated with payments made through the web portal being posted to Cardholder accounts immediately.

The anticipated update to the RCSC Web Portal was rolled out very recently, but had to be unrolled due to some complications. We expect to roll it out again soon and then we will have an opportunity to see the impact on online payments. As noted, the payment process has been simplified by allowing any property owner the ability to pay the balance due on the property. The enhancements to the web portal platform will improve the overall cardholder online experience. In conjunction with these changes RCSC will now be accepting Discover cards for payment at all RCSC locations, as well as online on the web portal.

Trustee sale notices on Sun CityAZ properties remained steady again at 46 properties at the end of April. The number of properties owned by lend-

ing institutions decreased slightly in April and is now at 35 properties.

Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in April were \$717,000, which is \$282,000 over the amount budgeted. Year to date PIF fees are \$2,363,100 which is \$920,100 over budget for the year. Again a reminder that we intentionally budget PIF income very conservatively to assure that we have the cash on hand for any planned project as we remain debt free.

Bowling:

The 27th annual Sun City Open Bowling Tournament was completed on the weekend of May 2nd. This year the tournament had 63 team entries and 256 singles entries. The tournament produced over \$5,000 in income over the two weekends. Tournament participants came from all over Arizona and praised the center’s cleanliness and the RCSC staff at the Bowling Centers.

Lane Analytics completed the bowling lane project at both centers. The project included the mapping of all lanes. Lane mapping is a procedure in which the bowling lanes are measured for depressions, crowns and levelness for the entire length and width of the bowling lane. Bowling scores have definitely improved since the project was completed.

Bowling scores were outstanding for the 2014/2015 season, Lakeview Lanes had forty-eight 300 games and Bell Lanes had twenty-seven 300 games. Both RCSC Bowling Centers are among the top scoring centers in the state.

Human Resources:

Hiring has been a priority for Human Resources since the beginning of the year. Usual turnover numbers and the re-opening of Marinette Center had an impact on staffing needs and we have hired fifty one individuals year to date. The majority of

the new hires were in the Building and Infrastructure division, with twenty utility workers and eleven facilities attendants; the golf division followed with seven greens workers; and the remainder were dispersed amongst other various departments.

In early May we held 401(k) informational meetings that all RCSC employees were required to attend. As new hires come onboard, they are presented with printed material to bring them up to date and into the process.

Member Services:

Beginning this summer, RCSC Cardholders will be required to present either their Member or Privilege Card (with photo) prior to entry at any free, non-ticketed events and all guests must be with the Cardholder at the time of entry.

Project Updates

Lakeview Center / Viewpoint Lake / Duffeeland

• Eric Swanson, RCSC Viewpoint Lake consultant, and all the wonderful RCSC volunteers completed the deployment of the previously constructed Bass Bungalows into VP Lake on May 14, 2015. Materials are currently being gathered so construction work on the Snow Fence Pens (Fish Condos) can commence in early June 2015. The Viewpoint Lake habitat project continues to look for volunteers who want to make a lasting difference in Sun City by constructing the much needed fish habitat. If you are one of these people, please call the RCSC corporate office at 623-561-4600 and add your name and phone number to our volunteer list.

• Requests for proposals are out for commercial sub-contractor bids for specific work at Duffeeland Dog Park, i.e. irrigation, grading, concrete, masonry, fencing, etc. As soon as we receive the necessary proposals, the bid packet will be assembled and forwarded to the RCSC bid commission for signatures. Once the bid packet is approved, dog park closure notifications will be emailed out to cardholders and flyers will be placed at Duffeeland.

• The kitchen in the Lakeview Women's Social Club was recently remodeled. The remodel included a new counter top, sink and faucet, a new lower cabinet and storage cabinet, wall painting and new vinyl flooring. All work was done by the RCSC Skilled Trades Department except for connecting the sink faucet and drain, which was done by Sunland Plumbing. (Approximate Cost – \$1,012)

• Two small sidewalks were added by the main entrance into Lakeview Center. These walks were added so cardholders parking in the gold entrance parking spaces can avoid walking through the landscaping rock. Contractor was Ken McIntyre Construction. (Cost – \$1,364)

• Extensive cleaning and filter replacements were completed to the Lakeview woodshop dust collection system. In addition, the air compressor (not including the tank) which blows down the filters, also had to be replaced. Duct cleaning was done by The Top Hatter Inc. with all other work completed by the RCSC Skilled Trades Department and utility staff at Lakeview. (Cost – \$5,200)

Sundial Center / Lakes East/West

• Power and data cabling is currently underway for the new Verizon cell tower at Sundial Center. The monopalm type tower will be installed on the NW corner of Sundial Center and be supported by an equipment building that looks like an extension of the existing center. The project is expected to be completed in about eight weeks.

• In mid-March 2015, evidence was discovered which led the RCSC to believe water from the women's showers had been leaking into the walls and rusting away the metal framing structure. After preliminary inspections, this project was sent out for contractor bids based upon what the RCSC believed was the extent of the damage at that time. Unfortunately, after demolition commenced it was discovered that all the wall framing and wall-board had to be removed. Instead of reframing this area with metal studs again, it was decided that CMU block walls would be a long lasting solution for repairing this facility even though there was an increase in the initial cost. (Cost below reflects replacement of all walls with masonry construction). At the current time, demolition of all shower room walls and the installation of masonry walls throughout is completed. Floor drains are being jack-hammered out as they are rusted at the top and are not able to be water proofed. Installation of the rough-in plumbing for the shower fixtures and push button "metered" shower valves is underway. New LED can lights are also being installed into the ceiling and the air evacuation system tested, repaired and modified to move even more moisture to the outdoors from this shower facility. The biggest task remaining is the installation and grouting of the new wall and floor tile. Contractor is Robert Porter Construction. (Cost – \$171,175)

• Asphalt pulverizing, paving and restriping of the Lakes E/W golf parking lot will commence on June 7, 2015. This work will be done in three phases in order to keep both golf courses and the snack shop open. The first phase will be the lot to the East (Talisman Hall area), the second phase will be areas around the pro shop and the third phase will be the West lot. Contractor for this project is Regional Paving. (Cost – \$185,700)

Bell Center

• The installation of six new freestanding site directories is now completed. The new directories are located near the sidewalk at all major entrances to Bell Center. The new directories will assist cardholders and visitors to more easily locate specific areas they are interested in visiting. Contractor was Tag Team Signs. (Cost – \$10,683)

• A new vent hood was added in Bell Silvercraft club room. Contractor was Custom Cooling. (Cost – \$6,705)

• To eliminate a potential safety issue with the existing T-8 florescent light fixtures in the Bell Craft room, the fixtures were replaced with thirty-nine new surface mounted LED light fixtures with wrap type diffusers. Contractor was Accel Electric. (Cost – \$12,972)

Mt. View Center

• The Mt. View swimming pool closed Tuesday May 26, 2015 for renovation work. This project includes replacement of the interior plaster with pebble sheen, new ladders and handrails, new rope anchors, installation of a bench in the pool, new waterline and swim lane marker tile and some decking repairs. Contractor is CDC Pools. (Cost – \$102,090)

Riverview Pro Shop Building

• Construction of the underground fire line which services the pro shop building is underway. Unfortunately, the fire main line on the West side of Del Web Blvd was larger than indicated on the plans so we are waiting for some tapping sleeves. The fire line is expected to be completed by May 29. The fire system installation within the building will commence once the riser is installed. Structural steel installation for the patio roof is to begin in early June. A new window and door were installed and installation of the interior mechanical ductwork has begun. Pro shop interior soffits have been raised to nine feet, framing for perimeter display areas installed and drywall hung. Roof crickets and upper block stucco work is almost completed. Underground electrical conduits were installed in preparation for pouring of the concrete patio in early June. Contractors include Ken McIntyre Construction, Accel Electric and CCBG Architectural. (Cost – \$524,236)

Skilled Trades Department

• The RCSC Skilled Trades department completed 141 work orders during the last two weeks of April 2015 and the first two weeks of May 2015.

Centers Operations

• In the movie "Field of Dreams", a voice was heard saying "if you build it, they will come." While many voices in Sun City were heard regarding the new covered Pickleball facility at Marinette Center, the final outcome was the same. "OH DID THEY COME"

• One of the challenges the Utility Staff faced at Marinette was how to clean the new covered Pickleball courts, as no one had any experience and to ensure that the cleaning schedule didn't impact the pickleball players. The initial estimate of the time it would take using a water broom was 6 hours. We have determined this task take about 12 hours to complete. In order to clean the Pickleball pavilion properly, it will be closed the entire day on the first Sunday of every month.

• We are facing a similar challenge with the new Bell tennis courts. Due to the layout of the courts, we anticipate about four hours to water clean each of the 3 groups of courts. Fortunately, the layout of the courts allows cleaning to be done while other courts are left available for play.

• Two new ball machines were put into use at the new tennis facility at Bell. Cardholders are able to check them out whenever the tennis center is open.

• Two RCSC managers attended class and after passing the required test, received their Aquatics Facility Operator Certification (AFO). This will further assist the RCSC in our continued efforts to provide clean and sanitized swimming pools and spas for all cardholders and guests.

Water Conservation

How Much Water Can be Saved?

It's time to test your knowledge about water conservation once again! Good luck!

1. What's a great way to conserve water while mopping your floors?

- Collect gray water from your washing machine to use as mop water.
- Collect water while heating up your shower to use as mop water.
- Collect gray water from your dishwasher to use as mop water.




Answer: (a) and (b) are both acceptable, but "black water," or gray water that contains food or waste particles is not safe to use for anything until it has been treated by a water plant. In the meantime, feel free to mop your floors with water from your washing machine or from the "cold water catch" while waiting for the shower to heat up. You could even use your soapy shower or bath water for that matter, if that thought doesn't creep you out. You can also use any of these gray water saves (not from the dishwasher though!) to flush your toilet.

2. How much water is lost to household leaks annually in Arizona?

- 16 million gallons
- 20 billion gallons
- 27 billion gallons

Answer: c. Can you believe that in Arizona just from leaks alone, we lose 27 billion gallons of water per year? Can you imagine what it would be if you combined all leaks in all of the U.S.? One trillion gallons are lost annually. Maybe fixing that little drip on the kitchen faucet really could make a difference.

3. If you could save the water lost in leaks in just one U.S. household, how many loads of laundry could be washed?



- 27 loads
- 270 loads
- 102 loads

Answer: b. Fixing small leaks can save money on your water bill and save water for up to 270 loads of laundry a year. According to

www.epa.gov/WaterSense, fixing even a small leak can save up to 10% or more. Common leaks, such as toilet flappers, faucets and showerheads don't require major investment to repair, and usually are easily correctable. The solution may be something as simple as a washer or pipe tape and a wrench.

4. One drip per second from a leaky faucet wastes:

- 200 gallons per year, or enough to take about 12 showers
- 600 gallons per year, or enough to take about 36 showers
- 3000 gallons per year, or enough to take 180 showers

Answer: Though it sounds like a lot, one drip per second wastes (c) 3000 gallons of clean water per year. That's around sixteen and a half gallons for a shower, which really is a high estimate for showering for some people – especially if a military style shower is taken (wet, lather, rinse, turning the water off in between each step).



5. A showerhead that leaks 10 drips per minute wastes:

- 500 gallons per year; enough water to run your dishwasher 60 times
- 200 gallons per year; enough water to run your dishwasher 24 times (with a full load, of course!)
- 375 gallons per year; enough water to run your dishwasher 45 times

Answer: a. 500 gallons per year. Just make sure it's a full load!

6. What percentage of tap water is used for drinking in the city of Phoenix?

- 2%
- 6%
- 1%

Answer: c. 1%. Aren't you getting thirsty just thinking about it?



Well there you have it! Do all that you can to save this precious resources for generations to come!






