And the winners are...

Despite a full slate of candidates, many voters opted to remain silent again in the 2013 RCSC Board of Directors Elections this year. The total of 1,270 votes were cast (859 electronic, 375 paper and 35 absentee) while last year less than 400 members voted. The top three vote getters elected to serve three-year terms on the Board are Dan Schroeder, Peter Lee and Michael Kennedy.

Dan Schroeder (with 697 votes) comes to the Board with a background in construction (electrician, foreman, project manager) and has served on the RCSC Clubs Organization Committee. He is currently president of the Oakmont Lapidary Club and was the Chairman for this year's Sun City Arts & Crafts Festival.

Peter Lee (with 565 votes) worked 34 years for the U.S. Department of Defense, serves as a volunteer tax preparer for the Sun City Community Assistance Network and is a member of the Computer Club.

Michael Kennedy (with 483 votes) had a 40+ year career in management and finance, is an adjunct instructor of business courses at Rio Salado Community College and has had prior board experience. He serves on the Board of Directors and is auditor for

the Camera Guild and plays softball in the Sun City Senior Softball Association.

Due to the number of candidates from which to choose, as well as an online voting option, far more votes were cast than in the past two elections. The debut of the RCSC Web Portal made voting easier for some members as they were able to cast ballots in advance, from anywhere.



"While Sun City is known for high voter turnout in national and state elections, for some reason the attitude towards local elections seems to wane," said Linda Lindquist, RCSC Elections Committee Co-chair, "and these elections are very important to the way Sun City moves forward."

"In the past when there has been high voter turnout, there has always been an issue that pushed the voting. We would interpret this as people in general being happy with the way things are run," stated Lindquist. "It is fortunate that we had eight able-bodied citizens step up and want to be part of the process. Having said that, I think Sun City came out as a winner," she concluded.

Updates

Financial Report:

We have ended October well within our operating and capital budgets year-to-date. All divisions have met their budget goals year-to-date, excluding the golf division. The golf division experienced a significant negative variance from budget in the first quarter of 2013 due to cold and wet weather. They have managed to get that negative variance from \$136,703 at the end of March to only \$38,988 at the end of October. Considering that much of this gain was captured in what is considered as primarily golf’s off-season, kudos to Director of Golf Brian Duthu and his team for making a difference!

Bowling Centers:

The Arizona State Senior Open Championship tournament will be held for two weekends beginning Thanksgiving weekend. The Arizona State Senior Tournament has participants from almost every city in Arizona. The bowling staff always enjoys hosting the Tournament; they feel it gives them a chance to show off the RCSC bowling facilities.

Lakeview Lanes will be hosting the annual New Year’s Eve party again this year. The party is sponsored and organized by the Sun City Bowling Association.

Bell Lanes has 802 bowlers for the current season compared to 799 bowlers last season. Lakeview Lanes has 1,055 bowlers for the current season compared to 951 bowlers last season. Overall, that’s an increase of 107 bowlers which is a \$23,000 increase in bowling revenue for the current season.

Cardholder Services:

The payments on past due assessments were down in October with the recent trend of payments at or above the monthly averages for the past year being broken. September billings went past due at a rate of 7.1%, which is at the monthly average rate. August balances went over 60 days past due at a monthly rate of 4.3%, which is just under the average. Outstanding balances related to property transfers increased by almost 9% in October and represent 55% of all receivables due and 53% of past due balances. Without this increase in transfer related invoices, total accounts receivable would have been about a 1% decrease.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties reduced again to 39 for the end of October. The number of properties owned by lending institutions reduced down by 10% to 72 this month.

The Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in October were \$435,000. Year-to-date PIF fees are \$5,776,040, which is \$2,446,050 over budget and \$43,965 more than last year. Remember that the PIF budget is done extremely conservatively to assure that money is available when PIF projects are budgeted.

As we end the 2013 holiday season and look forward to 2014 it is time to reflect on the many positive happenings in Sun City that have worked to benefit and enhance the lifestyle of our residents.

The most obvious visible changes in our community are the many photovoltaic solar panels atop parking structures in multiple parking lots. These solar improvements contribute to RCSC's attempts to minimize the impact of utility expenses on our members. Didn't we enjoy having the shaded areas in which to park our vehicles near our recreation centers during the past summer? Rest assured, they will be here for many years to come.

Less visible to many but very positive changes include the completion of thermal solar constructions at Oakmont Recreation Center; improvements to the parking lots at several centers; the striking new paint on the exterior of several structures such as Bell Recreation Center and Riverview Golf Course; improvements in the Willowbrook Golf Course sand bunkers; and the South Golf Course

maintenance building that is nearing completion. Improvements were done at the Sun Bowl, including providing space for the ever-popular food trucks that is more easily accessible. Nearby one can see the fantastic improvements to the softball field and its facilities. We were glad to see the Garden Club realize its dream of a new community garden facility with the help of EPCOR providing space at its Greenway facility.

A highly significant event in 2013 was the news that our efforts in getting approval from the Arizona Department of Water Resources for our water conservation plan, confirming that we can look to at least the next several years without investing huge sums in Viewpoint Lake modifications.

Race in December as part of the Sun City Holiday Celebration. Annual Assessment Increase Effective February 1, 2014

In December, the RCSC Board of Directors approved an increase in the annual property assessments of \$6.00 per property effective February 1, 2014 from \$450.00 to \$456.00 (or \$228.00 per year for properties purchased prior to 2003 that are assessed on a per person basis) – an increase of less than 1.5 percent.

Yearly Privilege Cards for non-owner occupants of residences in Sun City will also increase to \$228.00 per person per year on this date. Short-term privilege cards (30, 60 and 90 days) remain at \$60.00 per month.

Based on the recommendations from the Finance, Budget and Audit Committee, the annual RCSC budget must address

increased costs of utilities, maintenance and employees salaries and insurance. General Manager Jan Ek will do a presentation on the budget at the Annual Member Meeting on January 25, 2014. This meeting will be held at the Sundial Auditorium from 9:00a.m. to 2:00p.m.

The Board continues to feel that more frequent smaller increases to the assessment amount are more palatable to the majority of Sun City residents versus less frequent larger increases.

The Sun City Foundation is available for qualified members who need assistance with payment of their RCSC assessment.

RCSC continues to operate well within its operating and capital budgets each month and remains fiscally sound and debt-free.

RCSC Management Reports

RCSC Management reports to the Board of Directors at each monthly meeting, typically held on the last Thursday at 9:00a.m. in the Sundial Auditorium. These reports contain a vast amount of information about RCSC operations and activities.

If you are unable to attend these meetings these reports are posted on the website at www.sunaz.com under the Corporate tab and are also printed in SunViews for further reference.

You can also receive these reports directly by signing up for RCSC Email Alerts via the Web Portal. Select the News category to receive the General Manager's Report along with information such as press releases; Centers to receive the Assistant General Manager's Report which includes information about building and infrastructure projects and information regarding the Centers; and Golf to receive the Director of Golf's Report. Other selections include Bowling, Lawn Bowling and Movies & Entertainment to help you "stay in the loop."

Project Updates

General Centers Projects & Information

•The Quail Run Maintenance asphalt project will not be completed in 2013 due to operational and planning issues. Regional Paving has already been awarded the contract and will complete it once the RCSC determines the commencement date.

Mt. View Center

•The new light poles have been painted and will be installed and energized at the Mt View swimming pool and mini golf course by November 30, 2013. Contractor is Accel Electric. (Cost - \$40,000)

•The installation of the Mt. View pool and spa Ultra Violet Light system is completed and will be put online next week. The new systems reduce chlorine usage and further eliminate any bacteria in the pool/spa water. These systems are part of the RCSC's Healthy Swimming program and have proved to be very effective at the Fairway and Sundial pools. Contractor: Aquatic Environmental Services (AES) (Cost – \$70,000)

•The RCSC will be replacing the existing 4 pickleball courts and adding another 3 pickleball courts in 2013. All 7 court surfaces will be constructed using post tension concrete. The architectural work for this project has now been completed and plans have been sent to Maricopa County Planning and Development Department for building permit. The project will be

sent out for contractor bids the week of November 25, 2013. Once all bids have been received, the project will be sent to the RCSC Bid Commission for final project approval. The two tennis courts at Mt. View will remain open for use during this project.

Fairway Center/South Golf Maintenance

•Construction is now complete on the pipe rail fence around the Fairway lawn bowling green. A change had to be made to the height of the gates and the lock tabs so the adjusted cost is reflected in the total below. The fence will help to protect the artificial green from bicycles, skateboards and persons using the green for things other than lawn bowling. Contractor: Sav-on-Fence. (Cost – \$14,894)

•The replacement 6,000 s.f. South Golf Maintenance building is nearing completion with only the electrical service work yet to be completed. Accel Electric completed the installation of the conduit for installation of the “primary” electric cables to the site. APS plans to install the transformer and pull the primary cables through the previously installed conduits in about 2-3 weeks. Once these APS cables are installed and energized, the secondary cabling will be completed by Accel Electric so final inspections can take place. Contractors to date: Bunger Steel, Inc, Jokake Construction, Northstar Construction,

CCBG Architectural and Accel Electric. (Budgeted Cost – \$600,000) (After insurance)

Oakmont Center

•A town hall meeting was held on Friday, November 1, 2013 at 3:30pm in the Oakmont Auditorium. An estimated 65 cardholders attended to offer their suggestions and comments regarding the proposed Oakmont swimming pool. RCSC is now working with our pool builder to incorporate as many of the suggestions as possible. Once the pool plans have been revised they will go on display at the Oakmont Auditorium for cardholder viewing. I would like to thank everyone who attended this important Town Hall meeting.

Lakeview Center

•The East Ramps (red entrance) will be replaced soon with new ramps that meet ADA code requirements. The slope of the new ramps will be significantly reduced making entry to the lower and upper levels of Lakeview much easier for cardholders and guests. The building plans for this project have already been submitted to Maricopa County for permit and will be submitted to contractors for bids next week. Once contractor bids are received, the project will go to the RCSC bid com-

mission for final approval. Contractor to date: CCBG Architectural.

Bell Center

•The renovation of the Lawn Bowl Greens at Bell is completed including the canopy. Contractors include: Ken McIntyre Construction, National Turf, Accel Electric and Wood Bay Turf Technologies. (Cost – \$484,308)

•The large swimming pool heater on the Bell Lap pool was replaced with 4 smaller heaters. The new heaters will reduce maintenance and heater replacement costs while allowing some heating of the pool water when a heater is pulled off-line for repair or replacement. Contractors: Aquatic Builders, Sunland Plumbing and Supercharged Electric. (Approximate Cost – \$24,500)

•A town hall meeting was held on Tuesday, October 22, 2013 at 2:00pm and 6:30pm in the Bell social halls. An estimated 75 cardholders attended to offer their suggestions and comments regarding the proposed plans for replacing the Bell tennis courts in 2014. RCSC is now working with our architect and a tennis consultant to update the plans and incorporate as many cardholder suggestions as possible. Once the tennis plans have been revised they will go on display at the facility attendant station near the Bell tennis courts. I would like to thank everyone who attended.

Sundial / Riverview Pro/Snack Shop

•Two electronic display signs have been approved and designed for Sundial. One sign will be located on Boswell and the other on 103rd Ave. Permits have been obtained and installation should occur in about three weeks. Contractors: Bootz and Duke Sign Company, Supercharged Electric and Ken McIntyre Construction. (Cost – \$102,107)

•The patio at Riverview pro/snack shop received an epoxy coated surface similar to the one applied at Lakes East/West. This completes this patio project. Contractor: Desert Rose. (Cost – \$11,055)

Marinette Center

•The building plans for the Marinette building expansion continue to be developed by various engineers and the architect. As soon as the plans are completed they will be reviewed and forwarded to Maricopa County for permit and to construction companies for bid proposals. Once the proposals are obtained, the project will be submitted to RCSC Bid Commission for final approval. Site and floor plan drawings are on display for cardholders at various centers, including Marinette, Bell, Sundial, Lakeview and Fairway.

Skilled Trades Department

•The RCSC skilled Trades department completed 96 work orders during the last half of October and the first half of November 2013. This total does not include other routine work completed outside of the work order system.

Web Portal:

To date just over 1,600 Cardholders have signed up for web portal access. We have held three web portal training sessions for Cardholders. These were well attended and Cardholders gave positive feedback on the topics covered.

Each Member must initiate their RCSC Web Portal account. Your first step is to confirm with Cardholder Services at Lakeview Center via email at webportal@sunaz.com that you have the correct email address for each individual Member. Your RCSC Cardholder record will be updated and you will be emailed an initial password to access your account. Then go to our website www.sunaz.com at the top of the page and click on “Web Portal – New!” This page contains information and a link to the web portal, as well as a complete and detailed user’s guide for using the web portal. To help you with the process please pick up the “Getting Started on the RCSC Web Portal” flyers available for you at any of the RCSC facilities.

Human Resources:

Recently, a disgruntled former employee filed a complaint with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) against RCSC. Upon receipt of the complaint, we conducted a thorough investigation of the charges. Finding no evidence of discrimination, we responded to the complaint. In early November, we received a determination notice from the EEOC that the file was being closed because they were unable to conclude that there were any violations of statutes by RCSC.

The U.S. Citizenship & Immigration Services (USCIS) enhanced the E-Verify program to combat identity fraud by identifying and determining fraudulent use of social security numbers for employment eligibility verification. The new safeguard enables USCIS to lock a SSN that appears to have been misused, protecting it from further potential misuse in E-Verify. If an employee attempts to use a locked SSN, E-Verify generates a “Tentative Non-confirmation” document notifying the employee and the employer allowing time for the employee to resolve the issue.

If it is resolved, a notice of “Employment Authorized” status will appear in E-Verify.

RCSC participated in an E-Verify system survey regarding the ease of use of the system and the value of the enhancements. The HR department uses the system to verify every employee’s authorization and right to work in the U.S. The system is efficient saving much time. HR personnel are responsible for completing tutorials and testing on an ongoing basis in order to continue to use the program.

Member Services:

The Clubs Office will be meeting with representatives of a group of residents interested in starting a Kayak Club at Viewpoint Lake.

The Farmer’s Market will take a break following the December 19 market and will resume on Thursday, January 9, 2014.

The Tribute to the Veterans show was well received by the nearly 1,000 in attendance. However, the sun came out from behind the clouds and the afternoon became uncomfortably warm. Next year we will look at doing the Tribute in the evening.

The Sun City Idol finale’ was a big success! NBC’s Today Show was in the house filming the Sun City Poms for a segment to air in early December. A German filmmaker recorded footage of the Tip Top Dancers, among others, for a documentary that will be submitted to the Sundance Film Festival next year. Adrienne Christie was the first place winner. When Adrienne came to audition, she stated that singing for an audience was on her “Bucket List” and that she had never sung in public before. With her son and granddaughter in the audience, Adrienne sang in the finals and they had never heard her sing before. She mesmerized the audience with her beautiful rendition of “I Dreamed a Dream.” After she won the competition, the audience stood up and sang “Happy Birthday” to her. That night, November 13, was her 72nd birthday. I understand that since her performance she has been asked to sing for the Piano Club’s holiday party.

Golf Report

Pro Shops

October proved to be another successful month, with total revenue exceeding Budget by \$20,232. Despite negative variances to Prepaid Green Fees and Public Green Fees, Green Fee/Cart Fee revenue exceeded budget by \$13,070. Increases in Green Fee/Cart Fee revenue continue to be driven by Sun City Resident play and their guests. Merchandise sales exceeded budget by \$584 and Driving Range revenue exceeded budget by \$2,403. For the month 23,523 golfers played in October, this was 2,881 more than the previous year.

October revenue performance and expense savings brought our Net Operating Deficit to a loss of \$240,408, which is \$38,990 behind budget. Since February we have reduced our variance to Net Operating Deficit by \$102,309.

On November 30 North will be hosting a "Texas Cup" tournament, utilizing an 8" cup. The event is open to everyone and entry forms are available at each of the golf shops.

The December 2nd entry deadline for the Beat the Pro at Lakes West is quickly approaching; we encourage anyone wishing to play to sign up soon. As a reminder this event supports the Sun City Community Assistance Network. Our fund raising goal for this event is \$2,500 and we currently have 37 players entered to play. Every non-professional will have a chance to win a Pebble Beach vacation for a hole in one on the 11th hole. Prizes will also be available on other par 3's, for a hole in one. Lunch will be served at the Sundial Center following play.

Beginning December 1 and continuing through January 31 the first tee time will be 8:00 a.m. This change does not apply to Wednesday Men's Day, the time on Wednesday will remain 7:30 a.m. This change will also not apply to the course the North Men's Club is scheduled to play on Thursdays. This change was made two years ago to reduce the number of tee times lost to frost delays and to open more times for those wishing to play.

Snack Shops

Snack Shops exceeded budgeted goals by 34% or \$11,227. Year-to-date the snack shops have a Net Operating Excess of \$8,647, which is \$25,506 ahead of budget. We continue to thank everyone for their support of the snack shops.

Golf Courses

Overseeding of the courses is complete and good weather has produced a healthy stand of turf. Courses are in various stages of mowing height. Fairway and Green height will be lowered incrementally as the turf matures. We appreciate everyone's patience throughout the overseed process.

One of the most repeated comments at our Green Committee meetings, are the number of unrepaired ball marks and unfilled divots throughout the golf course. Unrepaired ball marks take up to three weeks to heal, a repaired ball mark will heal in half of that time. Unrepaired ball marks are a nuisance to everyone that has to putt through them. We ask all golfers to become a steward of the game by fixing your ball marks and filling your divots.

SCWGA Officers for 2014 Announced

The Sun City Women's 9-Hole Golf Association has announced its officers for 2014. The association is made up of Sun City golf leagues from Lakes East, Lakes West, North, Quail Run, Riverview, Willowbrook and Willowcreek golf courses. North Golf Course Renovation Project

Architect's Report

by Gary Brawley
Senior Golf Architect, Tripp Davis and Associates

Putting Green Construction
Charles Blair Macdonald , the “father” of American Golf Course Architecture wrote in his book titled Scotlands Gift – Golf that “Putting greens are to golf courses what faces are to portraits.” More time will be spent on the construction of the putting greens by both Tripp Davis and Associates and golf contractor Wadsworth Golf Construction at the North Course than any other feature to be built as part of the renovation.

When we approach the design of each putting green we start with looking at the strategic playing options of the golf hole and then best determine how to design the putting green to compliment that strategic character. As the golfer will find while playing the new greens at North, they will not always have to play their approach shot directly at the pin to get close, but the contouring and movement of the green surface will also factor into playing their approach shot. Also, in the design of the putting greens we try to create 3 to 5 pinnable areas on the green. This is not 3 to 5 hole locations, but each pinnable area will be large enough to have multiple hole locations. Having the different pinnable areas will help greatly with the long-term condition of the greens, as the maintenance staff will be able to move the daily hole locations around the green which will help distribute wear.

The profile of the putting green will follow the United States Golf Association (USGA) recommendation for putting green construction consisting of a 4 inch layer of gravel and 12 inch layer of sand. Construction of the putting green will begin by the shaping of the green core and subgrade. The green sub-grade is 16 inches below the finish grade of the green, after the shaping and approval of the core sub-grade, the golf course contractor will install a drainage system below the sub-grade to make sure the green drains properly. The next step will be the installation of

the 4 inch gravel layer. The gravel used for this layer has been tested by a certified laboratory and determined to be compatible with the proposed sand for construction of a putting green. The contractor will install the gravel layer with very tight control in the form of staking and probing as they will now be required to match the approved subgrade with each layer of construction.

Following the installation of the gravel layer will be the installation of the sand layer. The sand used in the putting green has a very strict set of guidelines that have been established by the USGA. This sand is not just taken out of a mine and used on a green, instead it goes through a screening and washing process to make sure the particles size distribution and other physical characteristics of the sand fall within the USGA guidelines. We will also blend the sand with a little bit of peat moss to give the sand some organic content and nutrient value to help with the establishment of the grass on the green. The sand supplier will monitor the sand within their own quality control on a daily basis while we will require testing of the sand throughout the duration of the project. Any sand that does not meet the specification will be rejected and the sand supplier will have to make another batch.

Once the sand is placed above the gravel layer, it is time to finish the green surface before planting. The golf course contractor will get the finish close and then Tripp Davis and I will come out and put the final finish on the green. We believe the difference is in the execution of the small details, and when finishing a green the difference between one-tenth of an inch of sand here or there can make a difference in the playability of the putting green.

Many man hours go into building a green as you can see, and part of the excitement awaiting golfers will be figuring out all the new nuances in the new green surfaces once play resumes at the North Golf Course.

Strong Quads Needed for Mobility

As a member of the Sun City Poms performing and marching squad, Greta Paulsen relies on leg strength. She enlisted the help of personal trainer, Jane Fortier, to prepare her for the Poms' winter performance schedule. Quadriceps are a key muscle group in Greta's total body workout.

"The quadriceps, located in the front of the thigh, are a group of four muscles that run from the hips to the knees," explains

fitness professional Fortier. "They are essential for walking, since they are responsible for swinging the leg forward with each step. The quads play a primary role in actions like rising off a chair, getting out of the tub, and climbing stairs. In Greta's case, they are vital for marching in a 2-mile parade or sustaining the base position in a Sun City Pom's pyramid. Strong quads are necessary for balance and stability. Quadriceps stabilize the knee joint, and help support and reduce stress to arthritic knees. Sudden changes in momentum or unexpected movements engage the quadriceps. Strong quads make it easier to maintain equilibrium and avoid a fall. Quadriceps protect the back, when bending and lifting. Weak quads put a strain on the spine and overwork muscles in the back."

"There are dozens of exercises for strengthening quadriceps," explains Fortier. "More important than the exercise itself, is doing the exercise correctly, with proper form. As personal trainers, we select exercises that are appropriate for individual needs and issues. We work on total body strength and muscle balance." 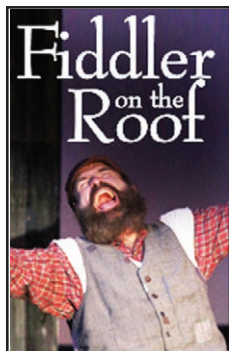

New Ways to Save Water in the New Year

Consider making your new year's resolution to help conserve water – and save yourself some money, too.

One easy way is to install low-flow shower heads and/or faucet aerators in your home. They are inexpensive, simple to install and can reduce your home water consumption by as much as 50%.

You'll save gallons of water each time you use the tap once you have installed low-flow faucet aerators in your sinks. Conventional faucets flow at around 5 gallons per minute, whereas low-flow faucets flow at about 1.5 gallons per minute.

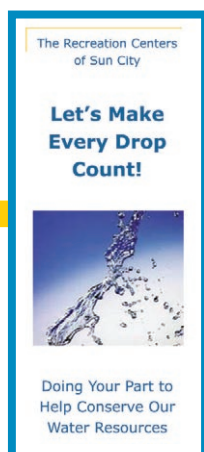
A low-flow shower head may cost you some money up front, but your water conservation efforts will save you money down the road. Conventional shower heads flow at 5 gallons per minute or more, whereas low-flow showerheads typically flow at 2.5 gallons per minute (or less!).

If your water heater tank starts to leak, you might want to consider installing a loop or instant hot water system which

are designed to help you significantly cut your energy usage — and the costs associated with it. Not having to wait for hot water has huge benefits: According to statistics from the U.S. Department of Energy and the U.S. Census Bureau, between 400 billion and 1.3 trillion gallons of water (or close to 2 million Olympic-sized swimming pools) are wasted nationally by households per year while waiting for water to heat up.

Remodeling your bathroom? Consider installing a low-flow or dual-flush toilet. Older, conventional toilets can use 5 gallons per flush or more, whereas low-flow models use as little as 1.6 gallons per flush. Dual-flush toilets use varying amounts of water depending upon whether the waste is solid or liquid. Considering that the average person flushes 5 times per day, these gallons can really add up.

Not ready to remodel? Consider putting a plastic bottle filled with water in your toilet tank to reduce the amount of water used per flush – a truly no-cost commitment you can resolve to do today.
