RCSC Board of Directors Election

And the Winners Are!

Despite a full slate of candidates, many Sun City voters opted to remain silent once again in this year's RCSC Board of Directors Elections. A total of 998 ballots were cast (783 electronic, 140 paper and 75 absentee).

The RCSC Board of Directors is pleased to announce the top three vote getters elected to serve three-year terms beginning in 2015 (and the number of votes received): Carol Lawry (658), Rich Hoffer (614) and Ida Eisert (587).

Carol Lawry comes to the Board with a background as the owner/operator of a small business for 25 years and has served on the RCSC Clubs Organization Committee in addition to her involvement with the Euchere Club, Artistic Stained Glass and Bell Metal Club.

Rich Hoffer has 36 years of marketing and advertising experience and was an on-air radio personality. He has been active in the NextGen Club, Sun City Men's Golf Association and serves on several RCSC Committees.

Ida Eisert's background includes 20 years of sales experience in Fine Paper and Industrial Paper Distribution. In addition, she was a realtor for four years and is a Certified Reflexologist. Ida's club involvement includes Lakeview Woodworking and the Bocce Club.

Mike Kennedy, RCSC Elections Committee Co-chair remarked on the election, "I was very happy how well the electronic voting process, the absentee ballot process, and the in person balloting came together. The outside accounting firm and the company controlling the electronic voting process did a great job."

"While Sun City is known for high voter turnout in national and state elections, for some reason the attitude towards local

elections seems to wane," said Linda Lindquist, RCSC Elections Committee Co-chair, "and these elections are very important to the way Sun City moves forward."

"In the past when there has been high voter turnout, there has always been an issue that pushed the voting. We would interpret this as people in general being happy with the way things are run," stated Lindquist. "It is fortunate that we had five able-bodied citizens step up and want to be part of the process. Having said that, I think Sun City came out as a winner." Lindquist concluded.

The newly elected Board Directors will be installed on Thursday, December 18, 2014 at 9:00a.m. at the regular RCSC Board of Directors meeting at the Sundial Auditorium but do not take office until January 1, 2015. Directors Linda Lindquist, Bill Pearson and Carole Martinez complete their elected terms of service on December 31, 2014.



Golf Report

Pro Shops

Rounds played in October were at the second highest level since 2008, with 23,079 rounds played. Rounds played year-to-date are at the third highest level since 2008, with 260,878 rounds played. Year to date only 5% of the rounds played on RCSC courses were public players.

On November 30, Riverview will be hosting a "Texas Cup" tournament, utilizing an 8-inch cup. The event is open to everyone and entry forms are available at each of the golf shops.

The November 27 entry deadline for the North Pro Am is quickly approaching; we encourage anyone wishing to play to sign up soon. We currently have 12 team spots remaining. As a reminder this event supports the Sun City Posse, as well as celebrating the North Renovation. Our fund raising goal for this event is \$2,500. Every non-professional will have a chance to win a Pebble Beach vacation for a hole in one on the 17th hole. Prizes will also be available on most other par 3s, for a hole in one. Lunch will be served at the Mountain View Center following play.

Beginning December 1 and continuing through January 31, the first tee time will be 8:00 a.m. This change does not apply to Wednesday Men's Day; the time on Wednesdays will remain 7:30 a.m. This change was made three years ago to reduce the number of tee times lost to frost delays and to open more times for those wishing to play.

Snack Shops

Snack shop revenue exceeded budget by nearly \$12,000 in October. We thank everyone for their continued support.

Golf Courses

Overseeding is completed and all courses are open for play. The courses that overseeded first are showing signs of stress and additional seed is being added to the weakest areas. The courses most affected are Willowcreek, Quail Run and North. The stress is related to the above normal and near 90 degree temperatures we experienced throughout October. We switched to an annual rye grass two years ago, due to its low heat tolerance. The low heat tolerance allows the rye to "checkout" earlier in the spring, thus allowing for a smoother transition to bermuda and eliminating the need for chemical spraying.





Architect's Report

Riverview Renovation is Underway

Happy New Year! It has been great to hear all the comments about the recent renovation of the North Golf Course. The golf course will take some time to mature but the foundation is there for the course to only get better with age. It is hard to believe that it is been a year since we started the North renovation and that puts us already today at the Riverview Golf Course.

After a competitive bid process the same contractor for the North renovation, Wadsworth Golf Construction, was awarded the work for Riverview. What excites me is we get the same key guys back for Riverview as we had at North. I already expressed to them that we set the bar high with the renovation work at North so now we have to do something even better at Riverview. I have been working closely with the shaper on the core of the first two greens to make sure we follow our promise to keep with the tradition of the Riverview Golf Course and have great greens.

Looking ahead, irrigation work will begin in January with the earthwork and shaping operation continuing on the holes west of Del Webb Blvd and then crossing over continuing to the east.

The RCSC Board of Directors is made up of nine volunteers who accept the challenge of donating a significant part of their life for three years to maintaining and improving the community of Sun City. Updates

Financial Report:

We have ended October 2014 well within our operating and capital budget year-to-date. As we come into our fourth quarter, I want to give you just a few reminders about variances from budget that have occurred year-to-date. As is consistent with our Preservation & Improvement Fund budgeting, Transfer Fees are budgeted very conservatively and historically have a positive variance from budget. We were able to sell (\$183k) the 1080AF of water credits we purchased in 2010 and 2011 due to Viewpoint Lake's seepage, which is reflected in Miscellaneous Income and produced a net profit on the credits. In the process of considering succession planning, both contract and temporary labor has been used in excess of budget while wages have been under budget in G&A. We have done very well in legal expenses y-t-d, with a \$90k positive variance from budget. The Bowling Division's willingness to provide liquor service to numerous events has produced an \$8,500 positive variance in their liquor sales y-t-d. Despite the North Course being closed, both the golf division and food service division have operated with a better bottom line than last year and considerably better than budget. I know I made Brian nervous when I predicted a few months ago that we could end the year in the black in the golf division, but my prediction remains solid, I believe that we will at the very least break even in the golf division this year!

Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments in October were below the monthly average for the year by 10%. Although past due assessments decreased by just under 1% in October, they are at the lowest level since April 2013. September billings went past due at a rate of 6.5% and August balances went 60 days past due at a rate of 3.8%. Both of these rates are right at the monthly averages for the past 12 months.

Total accounts receivables decreased by 2% in October and are at the lowest level since April 2013. In October we saw a 3% decrease in property transfer related balances and a 38% drop in lender owned related invoices. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent 54% of all receivables due and past due balances.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties increased slightly to 47 properties at the end of October. The number of properties owned by lending institutions decreased in October by 20% and is now at 42 properties.

Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in October totaled \$556,600, which is twice the amount budgeted. Year-to-date PIF fees are \$5,868,938 which is \$2,538,938 over budget for the year. Again a reminder that we intentionally budget PIF income very conservatively to assure that we have the cash on hand for any planned project as we remain debt free.

Bowling

Beginning Thanksgiving weekend, both RCSC bowling centers will again host the Arizona State USBC Senior tournament. The tournament has always been successful for the RCSC. The tourna-

ment also provides exposure to our community and additional income.

On the weekend of December 13, Lakeview Lanes will host the Arizona State Senior Women's tournament for the first time ever. The event will include women from all over the state. Signups for the annual New Year's Eve Party at Lakeview Lanes has begun. Everyone is welcome even if you are not a bowler. Stop by Lakeview Lanes to reserve your spot as availability is limited.

Human Resources:

Open enrollment meetings for employee benefit plans were held on November 5 and 6. A Benefits Guide for 2015 was distributed to all employees explaining details of the medical, life, and long and short term disability plans including associated costs. During the next few weeks employees have the opportunity to make changes in coverage based on individual needs.

RCSC always looks for ways to affect and contain rising medical costs within the organization. Since 50% of medical costs

in the U.S. are due to lifestyle choices, management is working with BlueCross/Blue Shield of Arizona to include a wellness program beginning with the 2015 renewal. The goal is for participants to lower cholesterol, stop smoking, wear seat belts, exercise regularly, lose weight, etc. To assist employees in living healthier lifestyles, the first step is for each participant to find out where they are now and where they want to go.

To implement the program, employees participated in Biometric Screenings on November 12 and 13. Employees were tested for blood pressure, glucose, total and HDL cholesterol, and measurement of waist circumference and were provided the confidential results to complete online health assessments. When an assessment is completed, the individual is provided a score and can take advantage of available Healthy Living Programs to become healthier.

General:

It is with great pleasure that I present to Assistant General Manager Jim Wellman recognition and a small token of our appreciation for his 10 years of service to the RCSC. I have worked directly with Jim for 8 of the past 10 years and I am thrilled and proud to call him a member of my Senior Management team! Jim and I always look for ways to "divide and conquer" as we call it and he is an excellent team player and an extremely vital part of RCSC and the success we enjoy today! Thank you Jim for the past 10 years and here's hoping for another ten!

Project Updates

General Centers Projects and Information

Electronic sign construction continues to progress on schedule. All support poles for the new electronic signs have been placed at Marinette, Bell, Lakeview, Oakmont, Mountain View and the Sun Bowl. The two electronic signs at Fairway are completely installed and currently in use. The sign company will continue to erect the electronic signs with electrical and data completed as electrical permits are approved. The entire project is expected to be completed in early 2015. Contractors are Bootz and Duke Signs and Accel Electric. (PIF Cost – \$850,775)

Lakeview Center/Viewpoint Lake

A second fish habitat construction event was held November 12–14 at Mountain View and Lakeview Centers. All pipe palaces and fingerling fortresses have been constructed and have been deployed into Viewpoint Lake. The next fish habitat project will occur early in December so if you have not signed up to help out with this very important project, please call the RCSC Administration office at (623) 561-4600 and

add your name and contact information to our list of volunteers.



The threadfin shad (forage fish for bass, bluegill and catfish) are still delayed due to supplier inventory shortages. Once quantities are available, the shad will be delivered and introduced into Viewpoint Lake. Now that the lake water has cooled down we are also preparing to stock 10" to 12" Rainbow Trout. So be sure and watch for this announcement soon!

The Duffeeland dog park improvement project is currently on hold while a dog club is organized. Once this club is formed and approved by the RCSC Board of Directors, the RCSC will move forward with improvements to the dog park.

Bell Center

Final grading, rough—in of all utilities and laser leveling are now completed in preparation for forming of the post tension tennis courts. Forming work commenced this week in preparation for concrete pours scheduled for the first week in December. Court and windscreen colors have been reviewed with the tennis club and selections were made. The #4 hole of the mini golf course remains closed. However a path was created for cardholders between hole #3 and hole #5 so the mini golf course can

still be used. Cardholders playing the course are asked to take par for hole #4. The tennis project includes demolition of the current eight (8) tennis courts and the installation of ten (10) new tennis courts. The new updated complex will also include a shaded gathering area, courtside canopies with benches, water and electric to each court, tables and benches for spectators and planters in the common areas. Contractors include Lloyd Sports Engineering as architect and project manager and Sunland Sports as building contractor. (PIF Cost – \$1,778,074)



As part of the RCSC healthy swimming program, the RCSC pool mechanic has changed out the sand inside the Bell pool and spa filters and the Lakeview pool filters. Sand in the Mountain View sand filters was recently changed and the filters on the Marinette pool and spa will be done prior to re-opening. The filters on the Sundial and Fairway pools and spas will also be replaced soon. All remaining locations utilize cartridge filters which are cleaned on a regular basis by RCSC Certified Pool Operators.

Sundial Center

All shower doors in the men's and women's locker rooms are now replaced. The new shower doors replace worn out doors installed many years ago. Many positive com-

ments have been received from cardholders, and of course from the Sundial staff, who had to daily clean the old shower doors.

Marinette Center

The Marinette project is really taking shape with only seven (7) lifts of blocks left to complete the overall height of the pickleball pavilion. After inspection by a structural engineer, it was determined that the East block wall between Marinette Center and the homes on Conestoga Drive needed to be replaced. (Project cost adjustment below reflects this work & new fire line) Following demolition of the old block wall, the footing for the new block wall was poured Friday November 14. Block work on the new wall will commenced Monday, November 17 and is expected to be completed in about a week. The walking track was delayed due to this wall and will probably end up being the last work completed on the project. Lots of other work has been completed including all rough-in utility work in the fitness center (mechanical, plumbing and electrical), lobby and fitness walls insulated and sheet rock in process, window glass being installed, new pool decking poured with new drains (not cool deck topping yet), spa block wall constructed, North "open" Pickleball courts formed and graded and shade canopy posts installed. The Marinette Center expansion and renovation project includes a 4,000 s.f. fitness center, rubberized outdoor walking track, a total of 20 Pickleball courts, an outdoor spa, a thermal solar system for pool water pre-heating, tankless water heaters for the showers, new doors and windows and exterior stucco of all remaining buildings. Contractors to date include: CCBG Architectural, Robert Porter Construction and Aquatic Builders. (PIF Cost -\$4,709,422)

Skilled Trades Department

The RCSC Skilled Trades department completed 91 work orders during the last week of October and the first two weeks of November 2014. The RCSC Skilled Trades carpenters and painter continue to construct cabinets for the Marinette clay club remodel while the RCSC fitness technician and pool mechanic continue their routine preventative maintenance duties.



Centers Operations

Ed DeBruyne recently accepted the position of North Area Supervisor (A.M.). He will supervise Marinette, Bell and Sundial Recreation Centers in addition to the utility staff at Willowbrook / Willowcreek, Riverview, and Lakes East / West pro and snack shops. Ed currently works at Lakes East / West golf course as a starter. He will start in his new position on November 24.

It's so hard to believe that Thanksgiving is just a week away! In the spirit of the holidays we hope that cardholders are enjoying the holiday decorations going up at all the centers and golf courses. Not only will there be lights on the outside of RCSC buildings, there will also be indoor decorating done at many locations.

Water: Do What We Can to Conserve

It's a no-brainer. All living things need water to live. Dogs need approximately one-half to one ounce per pound of body weight of water per day. A tomato is 95% water; an apple, an ear of corn and a pineapple are all 80% water; and while people can live sev-

eral weeks without food, they can live only a few days without water. Water makes up 83% of our blood, 70% of our brain, and 90% of our lungs. Overall, our bodies are 70% water and as you know, humans should drink six to eight glasses of water each day. So, if without water the earth would look like the moon, how do our brain, skin and lungs look if we don't get the recommended amount of pure water? Key word: Pure. Pure water is tasteless, odorless and colorless; a rare commodity without treatment.





The first recorded methods of water treatment date back to 400 A.D. when the Egyptians recognized the need for clean water. Their common treatments included boiling water over a fire, heating it in the sun, or dipping into it a piece of heated iron. They also were known for filtering boiling water through sand or gravel and allowing it to cool before consumption. Today, almost every city in the world treats their drinking water by disinfecting with chlorine or other chemicals.

Would you believe that a dinosaur could have once used the same water as you, perhaps even taken the same drink as your last drink? The water on our earth today is

the same water that was on our planet millions of years ago, filtered and cared for by Mother Nature. And if a gallon jug represented the entire world's water, can you guess what amount would be available for human consumption? One tablespoon (or so). That doesn't leave much when it takes nearly 53 million gallons per second – yes, per second – to grow the planet's food supply. That's 3,180,000,000 gallons per minute... and 76,320,000,000 gallons per day.



While keeping that in mind, keep these things in mind as well:

If everyone in the United States flushed the toilet just one time less per day, we could save a lake full of water about one mile long, a mile wide and four feet deep every day. That equals approximately 828 million gallons of water – for one less toilet flush per person, per day – in the United States alone.

Do you know that by taking a shower that is only a few seconds shorter than your "normal," or by keeping the shower pressure just a little lower, one person can save one gallon of water per shower every day. If everyone in the U.S. did this, it would conserve some 85 billion gallons of water per year. Now we're getting somewhere...



An average-sized swimming pool without a cover can lose up to one thousand gallons of water per month from wind and sun exposure alone. That's enough water to keep a family of four supplied with drinking water for a year and a half; two people hydrated for three years; or, one person for six... yes six... years.

The problem is not the amount of water on the earth. Keeping it clean and fresh and ready for consumption combined with the time that it takes to treat the water we used yesterday are the true concerns. If everyone were more careful by only using what is really needed and not a drop more, the true meaning of conservation is observed.

Remember: "We never know the worth of water till the well is dry." Save Water. Everyday becuase every drop counts!


