Sun City Property Holdings Company Rationale for Formation

The Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. (RCSC) Board of Directors will be voting on a motion at the June 30, 2016 Board meeting to establish a new corporation, Sun City Property Holdings, Inc. (SCPH), which will be wholly owned by the RCSC.

This corporation is being formulated in case RCSC should foreclose on a suitable property without a superior lien for non-payment of RCSC fees and associated legal costs so that it can place a bid on the property to protect RCSC's interest and avoid unnecessary liability should it be awarded the property.

The RCSC Board of Directors is not interested in being in the real estate business or acquiring any Sun City AZ property. They are simply interested in upholding their fiduciary duty through due process of collecting all fees due the RCSC whenever possible. Therefore SCPH will simply place a bid to cover all RCSC fees and associated legal costs on a property being foreclosed on by the RCSC. If another bidder bids higher, which is what is expected, then all RCSC fees and associated legal costs will be paid for by the highest bidder and there will be no further action taken by SCPH. If in the unlikely event that no one out bids the SCPH, then SCPH would become the owner of the property. SCPH would then seek to sell the property to cover its costs, to include RCSC fees and associated legal costs.

The cost to the RCSC is about \$2,000 for establishing and filing the legal documents to form the corporation and \$1,000 to open a checking account, plus about \$200 a year for operating costs. This is a very inexpensive insurance policy for the RCSC, as it protects RCSC from any liability associated with such real estate.

While historically, RCSC has rarely, if ever, foreclosed on a property in Sun City AZ, it is very important for Sun City AZ homeowners to understand that could be a result of repeatedly not paying RCSC fees. If you assume because there was no such holding company created in the past it was not needed, that would be an incorrect

assumption. The number of properties that are delinquent with annual property assessments or other fees is a dynamic number that changes daily. The reasons for the delinquencies are as numerous as the number of property owners. Why a property owner is delinquent correlates, to some degree, whether a delinquent account is resolved before being referred to outside collections or before suit is filed with the courts. We have resolved delinquent accounts at each step in the collections process. When this occurs is dependent on the property owner.

As per Board Policy Resolution No. 28, RCSC files a lien on any property 60 days past due. Filing the lien is vital to protecting the RCSC and comes into play whenever someone tries to sell the property, as the lien must be paid in full to receive clear title. However, it does not provide the same benefit if the homeowner remains the owner. In these cases the only option is to pursue all legal avenues of collecting the debt, up to and including foreclosure.

Want a Bigger Voice in Sun City AZ? Run for the Board; RCSC Candidate Packets Now Available

While the RCSC Elections may be months away, it is not too early to consider giving back to the community by becoming a candidate for upcoming Board vacancies. There will be three vacancies to fill in this year's December election, with each being a three year term.

Candidate packets are now available. Those interested in obtaining a packet must make this request in person at the Lakeview Corporate/Board Office (lower level) and present their RCSC Member card. The deadline for packet submissions is noon on Friday, September 30, 2016.

Requirements to become a RCSC Board candidate:

- Must be at least fifty-five (55) years of age:
- Must not be related by marriage or birth to any other member of the Board, Sr. Management Staff, or

Board Candidate;

- Must be a Deeded Real Estate Owner of property in Sun City, Maricopa County, Arizona;
- Must be a Member in good standing; Must reside in Sun City, Arizona and be available at least ten (10) months
- of the year; Must meet the requirements to hold an Arizona liquor license (RCSC holds
- liquor licenses which require Board officers to be included on the licensing);
- Must be eligible and available to serve a three (3) year term; and
- Must be available to attend Board Candidate Orientation(s).

Candidates must also submit a fully completed RCSC petition, signed by 100 or more Members in good standing, along with all other forms provided in the RCSC Candidate Packet.

A successful candidate will:

- Have a strong desire to serve Sun City;
- Be fair and courteous:
- Use good common sense;
- Have good communication skills;
- Be willing to work as part of a team; Ability to prioritize - policy and
- projects; which will have the greatest benefit for the most members; and
- Be willing and able to dedicate the necessary hours to be an effective Director.

Candidates will be introduced at both the October and November Board meetings and candidate forums that will be held in the fall. Forum locations and dates will be announced at a later time.





Golf Report

Pro Shops

For the first time this year we failed to meet our budgeted goals, with total revenue missing budget by \$12,409. While all categories failed to meet budgeted goals Daily Surcharge play and Public Play exceeded budgeted goals. Revenue heads into the summer months \$153,681 ahead of budget and \$260,366 ahead of prior year. Prior year revenue has been aided by having an additional course available for play.

"Get Golf Ready" class attendance totaled 110 students for the season. The attendance was relatively unchanged from the 109 students the previous year. The "Get Golf Ready" classes are a national PGA initiative to increase golf participation. Nationally in 2015, the "Get Golf Ready" program introduced 107,000 students to the game of golf. "Get Golf Ready" classes will begin again in November and are available to Sun City residents and guests.

Golf Courses

On Tuesday, May 17 we conducted our annual USGA visit with Brian Whitlark. Mr. Whitlark is an Agronomist for the USGA, representing the Southwest Region. During the visit we managed to visit all of our golf courses, with the exception of Quail Run. We began our day at Willowbrook, reviewing/ discussing the upcoming renovation to both Willowbrook and Willowcreek. Due to the abnormal amount of turf (by today's standard in Arizona), turf reduction has always been a topic of conversation. Mr. Whitlark was pleased with the Board's decision to be pro-active removing turf from our golf courses as well as the decision to rebuild the greens at Willowcreek. Mr. Whitlark recommended a deep tine green aerification for most of our courses that would be in addition to our normal aerification process. The timing of overseeding was a major point of discussion, as we try to find the best window and keep golf available during this process. He was very pleased with the progress North has made since his visit last year and that his recommendations for tree removal were followed. His full report will be available online when it is received.

The irrigation project on Lakes East began as scheduled on May 2. To date, the main line has been laid from the pump station on hole number 5 green backwards towards hole number 1 and back again to the 6th tee. The pump station has been delivered and is awaiting in field modifications prior to final connections. Preparations are underway for the boring of the mainline under the parking lot and across Talisman Road. Landscape work will begin once more significant progress has been made to the irrigation system.

The lake/pump station project for Willowbrook is well underway. This work is part of the 2017 irrigation renovation and aids that project by completing a significant amount of work ahead of time. Fish were removed the week of May 2 and transferred to other lakes on Willowcreek. This project is scheduled to be completed mid-July.

Fairway aerification began May 23 at South and continues through June 21 at Riverview. The only exception to this schedule is Lakes East. The full aerification schedule can be found on the sunaz.com website. Green aerification will begin July 5th at South. As a reminder courses will be closed longer for Green aerification, to give crews time to also verticut fairways.

Snack Shops

Snack Shop performance mirrored Pro Shop performance, missing budget by \$3,889. Despite the miss, Snack Shops enter the summer months with a healthy positive variance to revenue budget. Snack Shops are now closing at 3:00 p.m. on a consistent basis.

Lawn Bowl and Grounds

We are closely monitoring requests from the committee to plane the greens at the Bell Center. Unusually mild temperatures in May have been the determining factor in not starting. We have also met with a contractor to laser level and top dress the greens following planing. Both these practices are best accomplished during periods of vigorous growth, from the end of June through July.

The Lawn Bowl committee report 5,502 bowlers during the first quarter of 2016. The committee also reported a total of 14,397 bowlers in 2015. Reporting is voluntary and could result in an under reporting of attendance.

Uncertain about Pool Drainage? Seek Assistance from Maricopa County

Property owners with swimming pools in Sun City are advised that there are very strict Maricopa County regulations regarding stormwater and the draining of pools, backwashing, and filter cleaning. Many residents are under the misconception that they can drain onto golf courses after business hours. Be advised that this practice is not permissible. If you are uncertain how to proceed with the care and upkeep of your pool, please contact a pool maintenace professional if necessary. Otherwise, please refer to the information below and seek further assistance from the Environmental Services Department at 602-506-5557 or online at www.maricopa.gov/stormwater.

Stormwater Managment Best Practices

Swimming pools must be maintained properly to ensure that chemicals do not enter the street or storm drain system where they can be discharged directly into our rivers and lakes. Products such as chlorine and bromine that control pH, bacteria, and algae can also pollute water and harm wildlife.

HOA prior to draining your pool.

What Can I Do?

Drain pool using one of these methods:

- 1. Drain into sanitary sewer cleanout.
- 2. Drain onto your property making sure no water leaves the property.
- Drain freshwater swimming pool water into street or gutter making sure the water has been de-chlorinated/debrominated.

Filter Maintenance:

- Do NOT discharge filter backwash water into street or storm drain; use the sanitary sewer cleanout or maintain discharge on your property.
- Do NOT clean or rinse filter or cartridges into street or storm drain.

Jesus tees it up and hits a lofted iron shot that finishes 25 yards short of the green and in the water.


Jesus turns to Moses and says, "How about parting the water so I can play my ball where it lies?"


The Sun City Mineral Museum at Sundial Center, operated by

If you're willing to venture a little further from Sun City AZ, the Phoenix area offers a number of great cultural spots that might be to your liking.

If you're going toward the airport, take time to stop at the Hall of Flame Fire Museum (6101 E. Van Buren St.) where you'll see nearly an acre of fire history exhibits with over 90 fully restored pieces of fire apparatus dating from 1725 to 1969. There's also a gallery dedicated to the history of wildland firefighting. First responders definitely know HOT!

An easy drive over on the 101, take the Tatum Blvd. exit and head south to Mayo Blvd. where the Musical Instrument Museum col-



lection of more than 15,000 instruments and artifacts from around the world provides an opportunity to explore and enjoy the wonders of the global language of music.

Venture into historic downtown Scottsdale where you'll find Western Spirit – Museum of the West (3830 N. Marshall Way). Within these mod-

ern and austere walls, you'll find art and artifacts from the Old West and exhibits that include works by Russell, Remington and O'Keefe.

There's also the soon-to-open OdySea Aquarium and the Butterfly Wonderland (both located at 9500 E. Via de Ventura) where you can get up close and personal with nature.

My last suggestion is to take US 60 "Out Wickenburg Way," where you'll find the Desert Caballeros Western Museum for more art and history of the American West or go for a walking tour about town.

Management Updates

Financial Report:

We have completed April 2016 well within our operating and capital budget. Every division has operated better than budget year-to-date. Today the Board will be voting on a motion to purchase a tract of land and building located at 10415 West Grand Avenue, Sun City, Arizona. The purchase price of this property is \$750,000 and will be funded by operating capital. Despite the fact that this is an unbudgeted purchase, we have accumulated the necessary funds to make this purchase by continuing to operate better than budget. Therefore, the funds are coming from prior years' carryforward excess to make this purchase.

Bowling:

The 28th Annual Sun City Open Senior Bowling Tournament was held on the last weekend of April producing \$5k in income. Bowlers from all over Arizona participated in the event

Bell Lanes will begin the monthly summer No-Tap bowling tournaments which are held the last Sunday of each month, the first tournament will be held on May 29th. All bowlers are welcome whether USBC certified or not.

Bowling scores were outstanding for the 2015/2016 season, Lakeview Lanes had fifty-five 300 games and Bell Lanes had twenty-one 300 games. Both RCSC Bowling Centers remain the top scoring centers in the state.

Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments in April maintained the increased level from last month. Overall accounts receivables decreased in April with all past due categories seeing a decrease while the current category increased due to April being our highest annual property assessment billing month of the year. Payments from our third party collections firm were very strong in April and year to date payments total \$75,226 which impacts the overall accounts receivables positively.

Historically we have focused on the accounts receivables balance in tracking receivables over time. Looking at this a little differently, we have seen the count of property owners who are past due decrease over the past several years. At the end of April the number of past due owners has decreased 15% from 2015 and 46% from 2012.

In April, property transfer related balances decreased by 3.4% and lender owned related balances decreased by 30%. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent approximately 53% of all receivables due and 52% of past due balances.

Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal in April totaled \$93,615. This is below last month's high but continues to represent a growing adoption of the online web portal by property owners to make payments. Year to date web portal payments total \$351,200.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties decreased to 41 properties at the end of April. The number of properties owned by lending institutions decreased slightly this month to 29 properties.

Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in April were \$879,800, which is \$298,800 over the amount budgeted. Year to date PIF fees are \$2,763,400, which is \$834,900, or 43%, over budget for the year. The year to date total is up 17% from 2015. Again a reminder that we intentionally budget PIF income very conservatively to assure that we have the cash on hand for any planned project as we remain debt free.

In April we saw 5 additional closings within the new Four Seasons at the Manor development. A total of 11 closings have completed year to date with another 7 pending. Due to the uncertainties of a new development outside the control of RCSC the closings for this development were not included in the 2016 PIF budget.

Human Resources:

The voluntary CPR/AED/First Aid training classes that RCSC is providing to its employees have begun. So far, four sessions have been held with 39 employees in attendance and all have received a two year certification verifying satisfactory completion. Additional classes are being scheduled over the next few months.

Recently, HR completed a review of employee work related injuries from January 1, 2015 to date, a period of approximately 17 months. There were 26 on-the-job injuries reported as follows: 16 in Golf and Grounds Maintenance; 1 in the Pro Shop; 1 in the Snack Shop; 2 in Bowling; 6 in Centers. All accidents are responded to immediately including filing the proper paperwork and follow up for accident prevention purposes.

Safety is a primary concern and we are dedicated to providing a safe environment for employees, as well as those who use the facilities.

Member Services:

Johnny K & Kompany were back by popular demand and many are requesting that they come again, so we are bringing them back in 2017 for our next Senior Prom. Watch the Sun Views for this event coming in April 2017, as it will book up quickly and is limited to 500 people.

Our closing show of the Sun Bowl spring series was Yesterday Once More. The band entered the stage in their impressive, all black and white attire. When the first note was played, the dance floor filled up and stayed full until the second encore was finished. This band was so full of energy, and they kept the place hopping. What a great way to end the spring series.

Our next free show will be Wednesday, June 29, as we welcome to the Sundial Auditorium stage Eddie Diamond with his tribute to Neil Diamond. Please note this (continued on page 11)

Project Updates

General Information

- The Building and Infrastructure Department is in the process of launching a web based work order and preventative maintenance tracking software called "Facility Dude." This new software will help resolve communication issues, provide an improved way to track preventative maintenance and reduce administrative time currently required by the Building and Infrastructure Coordinator. The software will also be used to report landscaping issues to the Grounds Department.
- Re-roofing and fascia repairs of all RCSC on-course restrooms is now completed with toilet and lavatory replacements underway. Bids are being requested for the twelve new hollow metal doors needed at various course restrooms. Contractor for roof repairs was DFG Builders. (Cost – \$24,104)

Oakmont Center

• The Oakmont renovation project is beginning to wind down with mainly the stucco, card access and restrooms work left to complete. This project should be completed sometime in June 2016. The increased cost below is due to electrical, plumbing, insulation, carpentry and termite repairs discovered when the outside siding was removed from the buildings. Contractors are Ken McIntyre Construction and Accel Electric. (Cost – \$387,323)

Mt. View Center

- The grinding and resurfacing of the two existing tennis courts was completed May 18, 2016. Contractor was U.S. Tennis Court Construction Southwest. (Cost – \$10,500)
- The Mt. View Auditorium interior will be re-painted June 13-24. Contractor is Exquisite Painting. (Cost \$9,678)
- The metal shade canopy by the pool will be prepared and repainted June 13-24. Contractor is Exquisite Painting. (Cost \$1,585)

Fairway Center

- Crack repairs, seal coating and re-striping on the Fairway parking lot is now completed. Contractor was Regional Paving. (Cost – \$8,050)
- The hardwood flooring of all four Arizona Rooms were prepared and recoated with polyurethane on May 15-20, 2016. Contractor was Enmar Hardwood. (Cost – \$3,847)
- The three dry wells connected to the Fairway Storm water system require some minor repairs and a thorough inside cleaning. Contractor is Torrent Industries. (Cost – \$3,900)

Lakeview Center / Duffeeland Dog Park

- The drinking fountain has been installed at Duffeeland but the two new shade canopies are awaiting permit approval. Once the permit is approved the canopies will be fabricated and installed. Contractors are USA Shade and the RCSC Skilled Trades Department. (Cost – \$18,496)
- The installation of the new light fixtures on the Lakeview Mini Golf Course is underway. Contractor is the RCSC Skilled Trades Electrician. (Approximate Cost – \$2,400 after APS rebate)
- Contractor proposals continue to be delayed for remodeling the east Lakeview Lanes restrooms and the upstairs restrooms, by the red entrance, at Lakeview Center.
- New flooring will be installed June 6-11 in the Lakeview Sew N Sew club room. The new flooring will replace the existing deteriorated vinyl tile and reduce RCSC labor costs associated with waxing the old floor. Contractor is Resource Flooring. (Cost – \$19,136)
- The Lakeview Sew N Sew clubroom will receive a fresh coat of paint, including the built-in wall cabinets, May 23- June 6. Contractor is Exquisite Painting. (Cost – \$8,785)
- Re-paving of the roadway to the upper gazebo at the Hillside Park is underway. Contractor is Regional Paving. (Cost \$9,975)
- Replacement of bollard lighting circuits, conduit and wiring for the roadway to the upper gazebo will be completed soon. Contractor is Accel Electric. (Cost \$18,812)

Quail Run Golf Course

• The block wall, which runs around the perimeter of the Quail Run golf course, has now been pressure washed in preparation for re-painting. Re-painting includes the wall on the golf course side and a couple of locations on the Grand Avenue side. Contractor is Ken McIntyre Construction. (Cost – \$15,744)

 Remodeling work on the Quail Run Ramada structure is now completed. Work included replacement of all fascia boards, installation of a new ceiling, re-work of the two gable ends, replacement of the ceiling fans and replacement of the rusted out florescent light fixtures with LED lighting. This work was necessary to keep the structure in good repair, improve lighting and stop the pigeons from roosting in the pocket areas where the roof trusses and the walls come together. Contractors were DFG Builders and Supercharged Electric. (Cost – Carpentry/Drywall, \$11,390; Electrical, \$6,850)

Bell Center

- Three new steel base cabinets with stainless steel counter tops and sinks will be installed in the Bell Silvercraft Club on June 2-3. Contractors are RCSC Skilled Trades Department for demolition of the existing base cabinets and Wasserstrom & Sons for construction and installation of the new cabinets and counter tops. (Cost – \$10,876)
- Two new sets of very long, wood base cabinets and new stainless steel counter tops and sinks will be installed in the Bell Crafts Club on June 2-3. Contractors are RCSC Skilled Trades Department for demolition, construction and installation of the new base cabinets, and Wasserstrom & Sons for construction and installation of the new stainless counter tops and sinks. (Estimated Cost \$7,750)
- Contractor proposals continue to be delayed for the complete remodeling of the Bell Library restrooms, west Bell Lanes restrooms and Clubs restrooms.
- The Bell Craft Club is receiving a fresh coat of paint. Contractor is the RCSC Skilled Trades painter. (Estimated Cost \$400)
- New flooring will be installed May 26-31 in the Bell Craft room. The new flooring will replace the existing deteriorated vinyl tile and reduce RCSC labor costs associated with waxing the old floor. Contractor is Resource Flooring. (Cost – \$15,493)

Sundial Center

- The auditorium and East/West halls are receiving (May 23-June 22) new LED lighting with electronic dimming controls. The auditorium stage front is getting a facelift and new projection screens are being mounted at strategic points in the auditorium. Contractors are the RCSC Audio/Video Team, Accel Electric and Ken McIntyre Construction. (Cost – \$155,250)
- The maple hardwood flooring in the auditorium and East/West halls will be prepared and recoated with polyurethane June 23-26. Contractor is Enmar Flooring. (Cost – \$16,192)

Riverview Pro / Lakes E-W Snack Shop

 A new Stainless Steel counter with stainless top and a new condiment counter with stainless steel top are being fabricated for the East/West Snack Shop. Contractor is Wasserstrom & Sons. (Cost – \$7,204)

Skilled Trades Department

• The RCSC Skilled Trades Department completed 213 work orders during the last two weeks of April 2016 and the first two weeks of May 2016.

Water Conservation

More Water Saving Thoughts & Suggestions

Do you have gutters and downspouts on your home? If so, direct the downspouts toward a tree, shrub or plant. You can direct the bleed-off water from an evaporative cooler to trees and shrubs as well.



Turn water treatment and softener units off while on vacation.

If you have a water-softening system, run only the minimum number of regenerations necessary to maintain softness. Softening systems consume 15-120 gallons of water per 1,000 gallons processed. Doesn't sound like a lot, but think back to the average daily consumption per person mentioned in earlier articles.

Did you know that "reverse osmosis" (RO) water purifications wastes 2-9 gallons of drinking water for every gallon processed?



Hopefully you are already plugging your tub right from the start when running the water for a bath. If you collect the cool/cold water and adjust it with the hot water it will save.

Avoid over fertilizing as it not only increases plant growth and the need for water, but it is also a source of water pollution. And keep in mind - more plants die from over-watering than under-watering.

Drink responsibly. If you're not going to drink the entire glass of water you just had to order at your favorite restaurant, then only order a small glass or a half-glass. Better yet, don't order it all. Now they have to wash the glass you only had four sips out of.



Do one thing every day to save water, even if it's as simple as reporting an errant sprinkler to the property owner or water provider. Every person can make a difference and remember, every drop counts.



Sun City Gives Back Fairway Ceramics Hops into Spring at Luke Elementary; Promises to Return

For a second year, the Fairway Ceramics & Porcelain Club coordinated a project this past spring with the third grade classes at Luke Elementary School, helping 78 children create a pair of unique marbled ceramic eggs in time for their Spring 2016 break.

In March, over 20 members of the club helped the young students and their teachers (Mr. Guadalupe Alejos, Ms. Lisa H. Felix, and Ms. Sarah E. Coelho), decorate ceramic eggs in clouds of shaving cream with swirled colors. The children's involvement in this hands-on project led to shaving cream "up to the shoulders" for one enthusiastic boy, and several incidents of shaving cream in some of the girls' hair.



After the eggs were glazed and fired back in Sun City, club members made a return visit to the students and teachers later that same month. In one class, there was a boy who had been absent the day of the decorating



project, and another boy happily gave him one of his eggs. In each class, a ceramic floppyeared bunny was presented to the winning student of a drawing. All three teachers

were also presented with two completed ceramics pieces - a larger egg with "Thank You" and an apple, which one teacher described as looking "good enough to eat!"

Luke Elementary School serves Luke Air Force Base and the surrounding community, located only 11 miles from Sun City. The majority of the students are children of military families, which was one of the reasons the Club reached out to this school. Many of these children experience the frequent absence of the military parent, often over holidays, and it was the hope of Club members that this project would bring some delight and joy to the students. Students are also often living far from their grandparents, and many Club members are, in fact, grandpas and grandmas. The students' warm response

and frequent spontaneous hugs and expressions of thanks made this experience very worthwhile and memorable to the Club members, as well.

An official thank you letter was later delivered to Ms. Molly Garcia, the school Principal. Both she and her administrative staff expressed



appreciation for the investment of time and energy with their third graders, and asked that the Club return. Fairway Ceramics treasures this ongoing relationship with our neighbor, Luke Elementary School, and will honor their request to "please come back" in 2017."



Fitness Tips for Seniors -Toning-Up vs. Bulking Up

"When I talk with people about strength training, I often hear the statement: I don't want to bulk-up, I just want to tone-up," states Get Fit for Life trainer Dick Fortier. "In reality, what those people really want is to become leaner (which requires losing fat) and improve muscle definition and strength. That is exactly what strength training does. To better understand this, let's clarify some myths about Toning-Up and Bulking-Up."

Myth #1: Lifting light weights will tone the body; lifting heavy weights will bulk you up.

While there is some truth to the idea that lifting lighter weights for more reps does a better job of increasing muscle endurance, lighter weights will not help you "tone" better than heavy weights. Lifting heavier weights builds muscle strength and tissue, thereby helping to increase metabolism and fat burn. To gain good muscle tone, fat burn is necessary. Lifting heavier weights with fewer reps (8-12 on average) and working to muscle-fatique is more effective at reaching toning goals than lifting heavier weights is more time efficient too.

Myth #2 - Building Muscle and Bulking-Up are the same thing.

If you have avoided lifting weights because you thought building muscle would bulk you up, you were wrong. When you lift weights that are challenging, you create microtears in the fibers. These tears are then repaired by the body in the next "day's rest." It's this phenomenon that makes muscles stronger and builds tissue. Muscle tissue is dense and tight to the bone, adding little volume to the body. Muscle tissue is what burns fat. That fat burn creates a leaner body. Bulking-Up involves specific lifting techniques with extremely heavy weights and many hours in the gym, not to mention a restricted diet and possible supplements.

Myth #3 - Lifting light weights won't help you get stronger.

The secret to getting stronger isn't about the amount of weight you lift. It's about working your muscles to fatigue – that point at which you can't do another repetition. The time it takes to reach this state of muscle fatigue is much longer with lighter weights. Most people's time is valuable, so it makes more sense to go heavy and go home. If bone density is an issue, lifting heavier weights activates the cells that build bone density much more effectively than lifting light.

Myth #4 - Women and Men should lift weights differently.

Despite gender, to lose weight, tone-up and get lean, a person must have a strength training plan in place that works every major muscle group in the body at least 8-12 times, using a weight that is heavy enough that the last two repetitions are extremely hard to lift. Only then is the body challenged enough to change, grow and adapt, making one stronger, leaner, and lighter in weight.
