RCSC Cardholder Login Updates Announced

The future is now for many Sun City AZ residents as they continue to enroll to receive RCSC News Email Alerts and/or use the RCSC Cardholder Login (Web Portal) to pay their assessment in real time online or book golf tee times.

To date, there are over 7,300 RCSC Cardholders signed up to receive News Alert Emails. This is a great way to get communications from RCSC including general news (such as management reports and press releases), notices regarding centers and information about upcoming events and entertainment.

RCSC has also updated the RCSC Cardholder Login with a simplified payment process that allows any property owner to make payment for the balance due on the property. This recent update also includes other features requested from Cardholders such as the ability to change contact information (such as a change of email address), improved details display, reporting for center visits and golf rounds, and transaction detail visibility/reporting for account balances. Cardholder feedback has been important to this update process and we look forward to these enhancements providing better service to you.

Using the RCSC Cardholder Login allows Cardholders to:

- View your property/cardholder assessment balances
- Make payments towards outstanding assessment balances with VISA, MasterCard, or Discover
- · Run reports for assessment and payment history
- Book golf tee times and view current round bookings
- View golf play history
- View pro shop purchases, including items purchased in golf course pro shops and Cardholder Services
- View and report on facility check-ins at RCSC Centers
- View on account balances and related transaction details
- Manage participation in e-mail communications from RCSC
- Vote in annual Board of Director elections.

Board Candidate Packets Available June 3

While the RCSC Board of Director elections may be months away, now is the time to make a commitment to give back to the community by becoming a candidate for upcoming Board vacancies. There will be three vacancies to fill in this year's December election, with each vacancy being a 3-year term.

Candidate packets will be available for pick-up on Wednesday, June 3, 2015. Those interested in obtaining a packet must make this request in person at the Corporate/Board Office at Lakeview Center (lower level) and present their RCSC Member card. The deadline for packet submissions is no later than noon on Friday, October 2, 2015.

Requirements to become a RCSC Board candidate are:

- Must be at least fifty-five (55) years of age;
- Must not be related by marriage or birth to any other member of the Board, Senior Management Staff, or Board Candidate;
- Must be a Deeded Real Estate Owner of property in Sun City, Maricopa County, Arizona;
- · Must be a Member in good standing;
- Must reside in Sun City, Arizona and be available at least ten (10) months of the year;
- Must meet the requirements to hold an Arizona liquor license (RCSC holds liquor

licenses which require Board officers to be included on the licensing);

- Must be eligible and available to serve a three (3) year term; and
- Must be available to attend Board Candidate Orientation(s).

Candidates must also submit a fully completed RCSC petition, signed by 100 or more Members in good standing, along with all other forms provided in the RCSC Candidate Packet.

A successful candidate will:

- Have a strong desire to serve Sun City;
- Be fair and courteous;
- · Use good common sense;

- · Have good communication skills;
- Be willing to work as part of a team;
- Ability to prioritize policy and projects; which will have the greatest benefit for the most members; and
- Be willing and able to dedicate the necessary hours to be an effective Director.

Candidates will be introduced at both the October and November Board meetings and at two candidate forums that will be held in the fall. Forum locations and dates will be announced at a later time

Golf Report

Pro Shops

Total rounds played were down 2,389 rounds to prior year, mostly as a result of an additional rain day compared to prior year. Rounds at the executive courses remain brisk, posting their second highest number of rounds played in March since 2006. Despite weather challenges rounds are remaining steady with recent performance, we have had 117,511 rounds recorded this year, which is the 3rd highest total of the previous six years.

Though there was no "Moonlight" to be found, our first night event of the year certainly was filled with "Madness," 58 players braved chilly temperatures and strong winds, on Saturday, April 25. Prior to play, participants enjoyed pulled pork sandwiches prepared by the Lakes snack shop, followed by dessert. Participants competed in four flights, utilizing a two person scramble format; in addition skill prizes for long drive, closest to the pin and longest putt were also available. Winners were Steven Sorini and Sue Carnahan (First Flight), Martin and Mary Rey (Second Flight), Mike and Carol Lunz (Third Flight) and David and Beverly Pedersen (Fourth Flight). Full results are available on the RCSC website.

The first tee time for courses using a straight sheet will be adjusted as daylight permits, though they will be no earlier than 6:00 a.m. The earlier starts also allow early risers the opportunity for finish their round sooner in the day.

Snack Shops

Despite the additional rain days, snack shops managed to come within \$700 of budget. We continue to thank everyone for their support. Snack shop closing times will be adjusted, based on demand; 3:00 p.m. is the traditional closing time in May. Pro shops will have beverages and some snacks available when snack shops are closed.

Golf Courses

Despite our efforts to prepare golfers on the expected conditions of North (following the renovation), we continue to receive questions and concerns regarding the current condition. In an effort to help get the proper information out, we would like to cover a few key points.

- The greens were not over-seeded for this past season to protect them long term.
- Since they were not over-seeded, a pigment was applied to give them color otherwise they would have been brown.
- The greens are less than a year old and have no organic matter built up. As they mature they will develop a thatch layer allowing them to soften and grow into the surfaces we expect them to.

Architect's Report

Riverview Renovation Update

We are getting closer! With the Bermuda grass growing season ahead of us now the only thing left to do is finish prep all of the disturbed areas and plant with new Bermuda grass.

The new west irrigation pump station is now completely operable giving the golf course much more water than they had previously with the old system. Although we have the ability to water the entire golf course from either side of the property on a temporary basis, right now the golf holes on the west side of Del Webb Blvd. is independent from the golf holes on the east side, allowing better management of irrigation flows and grow-in.

Front-nine bunkers are complete and the three man bunker crew is working their way through the back-nine holes. Once we get the sand in the bunkers most of the heavy construction traffic onto the golf course will be complete and the golf course maintenance staff can really start to push the grow-in.

During the grow-in of the golf course it will be wet and it will not be uncommon to have standing water in some areas. The optimal growing condition for Bermuda grass, is hot and humid and especially during these early months of the growing season we have to "create" our own humidity. As the Bermuda grass establishes itself we will be able to back off on the water.

We want to remind everyone at this time to please help everyone involved with this project and stay off the golf course. Damage to a newly planted area can be costly to



repair as it typically involves turf removal, re-grading, and sodding later in the season.

I look forward to working with the crews to bring the Riverview Golf Course to completion.

How Rare is a Hole-in-One?

A hole-in-one (commonly referred to as an ace) is a rare feat that the average amateur golfer rarely achieves. It is estimated one out of every 12,750 shots on a par-3 goes directly into the hole. According to Golf Digest, on a course that has four par-3s, the likelihood of a player making two aces in a round is one out of 162,562,500 times.

- The heat during over-seeding worked against us. We stuck to our time table
 in order to not interfere with planned events. Over-seeding schedule for all
 courses has been moved to October for this year, with Riverview scheduled in
 the second wave of courses.
- Summer heat will allow us to move into our normal agronomic practices, allowing us to aerify, top-dress, verticut and fertilize all areas of the course. This will begin the process of "softening" up the golf course.
- The North greens will be over-seeded this year, though they will still be firm.
- We have always stated that conditions would take eighteen months to two
 years to normalize and provide the playing surfaces expected.
- The conditions at Riverview will be similar to North.

We understand the frustration many are experiencing, we only ask for your patience, as we move through the expected processes and conditions, following the renovations. The North renovation is in infancy, we expect her to grow into a beautiful adult.

All courses are currently preparing for summer and the transition from winter rye to bermuda. Fairway cuts have been lowered, to allow better infiltration of sunlight to the bermuda base. Watering has been increased, with temperature fluctuations; wet spots will not be uncommon. The courses with recent irrigation renovations will have better control over wet spots. Wall to wall slow release fertilizer has been applied to all courses. Fairway aerification will begin May 18 at South.



Updates

Financial Report:

We have ended the first quarter of 2015 within our operating and capital budget. All divisions, excluding golf, have met their operating and expense goals. The golf division has suffered a double whammy, as the golf revenues are \$50k short of budget, and an issue that occurred with one of RCSC's wells has created a \$96k negative variance from budget in repairs and maintenance in the golf division. There is potential that some of this additional expense may be covered by insurance, however, since some of the damage may be the fault of another company it may take some time to settle this claim. Despite these two big hits to the golf division of almost \$150k negative variance from budget, overall the division was able to recover a great deal with only a \$79k negative variance in net operating excess.

Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments increased in March compared with February. Overall past due assessments still increased slightly in March. February billings went past due at an increased rate of 4.8% and January balances went 60 days past due at a rate of 2.0%. Both of these rates continue to be well below the annual averages for these balances. Year to date payments from our third party collections firm are \$30,883.

Total accounts receivable decreased in March by just under 2%. In March property transfer related balances decreased by 7% and lender owned related balances decreased by 24%. Outstanding balances related to property transfers now represent 52% of all receivables due and past due balances.

Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Cardholder Login (Web Portal) continued strong in March and totaled \$75,927. This is the third month in a row that the total of online payments has increased to a new high. The online payment process is fully integrated with payments made through the web portal being posted to Cardholder accounts immediately.

We are anticipating an update to the RCSC Web Portal platform in May that will simplify the payment process and allow any property owner to make the payment for the balance due on the property. This update will also include other features requested from cardholders and includes, to name a few: the ability to change contact information, improved details display, reporting for center visits and golf rounds, and transaction detail visibility/reporting for account balances. Cardholder feedback has been important to the update process and we are looking forward to the enhancements to this service.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties remained steady at 46 properties at the end of March. The number of properties owned by lending institutions decreased in March and is now at 36 properties.

Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in March were \$699,100, which is \$291,100 over the amount budgeted. Year-to-date PIF fees are \$1,646,100 which is \$638,100 over budget for the year. Again a reminder that we intentionally budget PIF income very conservatively to assure that we have the cash on hand for any planned project as we remain debt free.

Bowling:

On April 20, 2015 Lane Analytics began the task of mapping the lanes at both RCSC bowling centers. Lane mapping is a procedure in which the bowling lanes are measured for depressions, crowns and levelness for the entire length and width of the bowling lane. Seven hundred fortyfour measurements are taken on each lane (this is almost seventy times the number of measurements taken during the annual inspection performed by the United States plan review and after several months of Bowling Congress). It has been proven that research of other plans, other providers the flatter the playing surface, the more consistent lanes will play from lane to lane and day to day. Once the lanes have been mapped, Lane Analytics will begin the

process of leveling the lanes ensuring that they are flat and secure. We expect this procedure will not only prolong the life of the lane, we expect it will produce higher scores from all bowlers. The cost of the procedure is \$27,600 (\$690 per lane).

An article has been posted on the RCSC web site under Bowling News which details the procedure.

Human Resources:

As fiduciary of the RCSC's Employees 401(k) Plan, we have a responsibility to provide due diligence which includes reviewing the Plan and investment performance periodically to assure that investors in the Plan receive the best possible return on their investments. In 2014 we began a and obtaining bids were able to enhance our plan. In March 2015, we announced to the employees changes to the Plan that offer increased flexibility and greater con-

venience in managing their retirement plan accounts including a better return on investments. We are in the process of transitioning the plan investments, trustee, and recordkeeping services to Fidelity Investments.

In an effort to address concerns expressed by RCSC Cardholders about the increasing attendance by nonresidents at free RCSC events, the Board of Directors has requested that we begin implementing changes to further enforce the RCSC Cardholders and their escorted guests only policy. Therefore, it is imperative to start carrying your photo RCSC Member or Privilege Card, as we reserve the right to ask to see your card at any free RCSC event. If vour card cannot be produced in order to prove you are a RCSC Cardholder, you may be asked to move or leave the event. We will not allow non-residents

Project Updates

Viewpoint Lake / Duffeeland

- Eric Swanson, RCSC Viewpoint Lake consultant and all the wonderful RCSC volunteers completed the installation of pea gravel beds in the shallow water around the perimeter of Viewpoint Lake. Eric Swanson had this to say about this particular habitat project, "With the help of RCSC volunteers we accomplished an amazing feat of moving 50 tons (1 million pounds!) of pea gravel into Viewpoint Lake over 9 days of work in March and early April. We exceeded our goal of 250 gravel beds, and ended up with 282. Altogether, we had 30 different volunteers assist with the gravel project accounting for approximately 950 hours of hard work! This completes this important project and meets all 5 year goals for spawning gravel enhancements. Special acknowledgement goes to Larry Klein for working 8 of 9 days and volunteering the full use of his pontoon boat each day. Also special kudos to the following volunteers who helped 3 or more days: Wally Brambilla, Ken Kehoe, Bob Howicz, Dick Holt, Jay McMichael and Terry Keliher."
- On April 10, 2015 Viewpoint Lake was stocked with 1,500 Large Mouth Bass (4-6 in.), 1,400 Bluegill (4-5 in.), 1,600 Redear Sunfish (4-5 in.), 120 White Amur (12-14 in.) and 1,000 lbs of Channel Catfish 1-2 lbs each. Habitat projects commencing in May 2015 include 20 Bass Bungalows and 35 fish condos. The Viewpoint Lake habitat project continues to look for volunteers who want to make a lasting difference in Sun City by constructing the much



needed fish habitat. If you are one of these people, please call the RCSC corporate office at 623-561-4600 and add your name and phone number to our volunteer list.

 Sub-contractor bids for the Duffeeland Dog Park renovation are expected to be received soon for RCSC review. After review they will be sent to the RCSC bid commission for final approval. The current target date for commencement of this project is May 2015.

Sundial Center

 In mid-March 2015, evidence was discovered which led the RCSC to believe water from the women's showers had been leaking into the walls and rusting away at the metal framing structure. After preliminary inspections, this project was sent out for contractor bids based upon what the RCSC believed was the extent of the damage at that time. Bid commission approvals were completed on April 20, 2015 and demolition commenced on Wednesday, April 22, 2015. Contractor selected is Robert Porter Construction. (Cost – \$86,885)

Bell Center

• The new Bell tennis facility is completed however, final inspections for the electrical work is requiring additional stamped engineered drawings. As soon as this information is accepted and approved by Maricopa County Building and Planning Department, occupancy will be granted and the courts will be opened for cardholder use. In the meantime, tennis benches, landscaping, court signage and other small details are being completed. Contractors include Lloyd Sports Engineering as architect and project manager and Sunland Sports as building contractor. (PIF Cost - \$1,778,074)



 The new dart machines area at Bell Lanes opened to cardholder use on Tuesday April 8, 2015. Chairs for this area have been placed and appropriately sized Bistro tables will be ordered once the chair groupings are established. Contractors include: Jocoran Glass, Accel Electric, Ken McIntyre Construction and the RCSC Skilled Trades Department. (Cost – \$35,000) An old 7-1/2 Ton heating and air conditioning unit (HVAC) was replaced on April 17, 2015 when it failed to operate due to compressor and motor problems. Contractor was Custom Cooling. (Cost – \$10,258)

Marinette Center

- Marinette Center re-opened on Monday, March 23, 2015 but did not include the
 opening of the track, half court basketball or horseshoes areas due to application
 of the rubberized track coating. On Wednesday April 15, 2015 the remaining areas
 opened for cardholder use. Contractors for this project include: CCBG Architectural,
 Robert Porter Construction, Regional Paving and Aquatic Builders. (PIF Cost –
 \$4,709,422)
- An old 5 Ton heating and air conditioning unit (HVAC) was replaced due to the high cost to replace the internal compressor. Contractor was Custom Cooling. (Cost – \$5.947)

Riverview Pro Shop Building

The Riverview Patio construction project is progressing a little slower than anticipated since during demolition, several former construction issues emerged, requiring additional changes to the approved construction drawings. These construction changes had to be submitted to Maricopa County Planning and Development for

re-approval before work could commence. In addition, while Epcor did approve the fire line and connection to their water system, Maricopa County safety has had our submittal tied up for several weeks preventing fire system work from commencing. To keep this project moving along, the focus has now turned to the planned interior renovations while we wait on steel fabrication and plan



approvals. As soon as these issues are resolved, the project will begin to progress at a good pace once again. Project improvements include new covered patios off the East and South sides of the existing building, a fire sprinkler system, parapet wall and roofing work, ceiling replacements, new lighting, new flooring and other interior renovations. Contractors include Ken McIntyre Construction, Accel Electric and CCBG Architectural. (Cost – \$524,236)

Skilled Trades Department

 The RCSC Skilled Trades department completed 122 work orders during the last two weeks of March 2015 and the first two weeks of April 2015. Because the Skilled Trades Department devoted time to building cabinets for Marinette Clay Club and preparing Marinette for re-opening, they are now focused on catching up the backlog of work orders.

Water Conservation

Landscaping Tips Help to Conserve

With the menace of mid-summer heat just around the corner, now is not the time to revitalize your landscaping; however, it may help you handle the high temperatures if you visualize getting back outside for our beautiful fall weather. SRP at http://www.srpnet.com/water/desertwise/ has some great information for not only conserving water, but on what plants, trees and flowers thrive in the dessert.

Trees

Live Oak - This clean evergreen handles both extreme cold and heat, and holds up well in strong winds. It grows well in gravel and/or grass, making it a great shade tree and is also used for a privacy screen when planted in rows. SRP also recommends willow acacia, blue palo verde, desert willow, and Indian rosewood (Sissoo tree) trees for landscaping.

Shrubs, Ground Cover and Vines:

There are many plants suited to desert life that are quite color-

ful and popular. Shrubbery includes such items as red bird of paradise, Baja red fairy duster, Texas sage, Baja ruellia and Arizona yellow bell.

Vibrant and hardy ground cover plants you may recognize include bougainvillea, bush morning glory, trailing lantana, Lady Banks roses and trailing rosemary.

Of course there are always the obvious: agaves, purple prickly pear, red yucca and other native cactus.



Another tip on desert gardening and water conservation is to prune plants only when it's necessary to control over-growth. Pruning can accelerate growth, which will lead to more frequent watering.

Sun City PRIDES Add More "Beauty" Thanks to RCSC Clubs





Research has shown that mental activity, such as bridge, can play a role in reducing the effects of Alzheimer's.



Tips for Seniors from Daily Fitness -

Stretch for Success

Kathy Krogh finishes up her workout at the Bell Fitness with a series of stretches that address all major muscle groups. One of Kathy's fitness goals is to maintain good flexibility. She met on a regular basis with Daily Fitness trainer Jane Fortier, who developed a comprehensive workout for Kathy that includes not only stretching, but strength and cardio exercises as well.

"As we age, muscles tighten and shorten," states Fortier. "Stretching is critical to maintain flexibility, or range-of-motion (ROM) within a joint. What is a Chair Massage?
