RCSC Board of Directors Election Day Draws Near

Voting is underway in the RCSC Board of Directors elections for the three upcoming vacancies, with five candidates running for these 3-year positions.

Election Day is Tuesday, December 9, 2014. In person voting will occur from 8a.m. to 4p.m. in Lakeview Social Hall #2 for Members wishing to cast paper ballots. Online voting

continues until 4p.m. on Election Day as well. RCSC Members are encouraged to sign up and use the RCSC Web Portal at https:// sunaz.totalegolf.com/ to cast their ballots. (See related article on page 3 which details the process for getting started on the portal).



Online voting offers RCSC Members the convenience of being able to vote anywhere, anytime (home, office, library) – whether you're here in Sun City or out of town. Online balloting during last year's inaugural launch was met with some resistance but RCSC anticipates that the number of voters online will increase dramatically as registration of portal users continues to climb.

For those unable to vote online or to cast their ballot in person on Election Day, absentee ballots can be obtained by contacting the RCSC Board Office at 623-561-4600 no later than December 1. All absentee ballots must be received no later than December 9.

Member attendance at the two candidate forums held in November at Fairway and Marinette Recreation Centers showed much interest in this

year's election compared to previous years when the slate of candidates rarely exceeded the number of vacancies.

Step 2. Enter your Member ID and click on Send Password.

A password will be generated and sent to your email address.

If your email address is not on file, follow the on-screen instructions to securely send RCSC the information to update your records.

Step 3. Once your password has been received, return to the login screen and enter your Member ID and password. Click on Login.

Golf Report

Pro Shops

The North Course reopened on October 18 following the renovation. In the first 5 days of being reopened, 1,270 rounds were played, an average of 254 rounds per day. Response from golfers has been overwhelmingly positive, from the first tee to the 19th hole. We thank everyone in RCSC for their efforts, in particular the North maintenance staff and the Buildings and Infrastructure staff, that made this project a success. In particular we thank Rick Stoffel (course superintendent), Vern White (Building and Infrastructure Coordinator) and Janice Boyer (snack shop manger). Their efforts ensured a successful project and a successful opening.

Applications for the North Pro Am are now available, which will celebrate the North renovation. The Pro Am will be held on December 11th, with a 9:00 a.m. shotgun, with an awards luncheon following play at Mountain View. Teams will consist of three amateur residents/guests and one local professional. In addition to celebrating North we will also be raising funds for the RCSC Management Team's chosen charity, which this year is the Sun City Posse.

Willowcreek has reopened from overseeding with the new clothing line for the 2014/2015 season. We encourage anyone in the market for new golf apparel to stop by Willowcreek/Willowbrook and check out the new and reasonably priced items. In addition we encourage anyone in the market for new golf equipment to allow us to provide a price, before buying outside of RCSC. We can order from any vendor and can generally match the "big box" stores prices on new equipment. Sales of golf equipment and merchandise directly benefit the RCSC golf division.

Following the bidding process, Wadsworth Golf Construction has been chosen as the contractor for the Riverview renovation. The Riverview renovation will be as complete as the North renovation. Tees will be leveled and expanded, bunkers renovated, a new irrigation system installed and the green complexes renovated. We are looking forward to another successful project. The course will close December 1, 2014 with the reopening planned for late October 2015.

Snack Shops

Through August total F&B revenues have exceeded budget by nearly \$18,000, we continue to thank everyone for their Snack Shop support. Snack shops will extend their hours of operation to 5:00 p.m. beginning November 1.

Golf Courses

Golf courses have completed overseeding and are in various stages of growth. Willowcreek, Riverview, Quail Run and North are open without cart path restrictions. South and Lakes East are open with cart path restrictions in place, Lakes West and Willowbrook will open November 8th with cart path restrictions in place. We have been successful so far this year in removing cart path restrictions earlier than normal, we will notify by email if restrictions are to be lifted ahead of schedule for the remaining courses.

Riverview Closes for Renovation on December 1st

Sun City's Riverview Golf Course closes December 1 for renovations of the irrigation system, including pump stations, as part of the mandatory work required by the agreement with the Arizona Department of Water Resources.

This work also includes the renovation of all greens, with the intent to have them remain the dominate characteristic of the course. This will provide more pin placements that fall within USGA guidelines.

Tee boxes will also be renovated and a new forward tee added. It is anticipated that the bunker renovations will again use the Better Billy Bunker construction method (http://billybunker.com/the-better-method/) as was used at North.

The only major course layout change will be the green complex on hole #12, which will be moved to the west, bringing the lake more into play.

The renovation work at Riverview is expected to be completed by Fall 2015.



"I wanted to let you know that the Board, the Architect, and the workers hit a real home run with the new design at North. From the golf course, to the practice area, to the clubhouse improvements, North Golf Course is the new "jewel" of Sun City. Now we'll all have great expectations for the Riverview renovation. Awesome Job!" "I just wanted to thank the board and particularly the two of you for all the wonderful capital improvements to our properties, but particularly the most recent, the North Golf Course.

Incredible - by far and away the best course in Sun City. I know the board took a lot of heat from residents resistant to change or residents that think they know more about improving a golf course than a professional golf course architect. Thanks for doing the right thing for Sun City's future.

The green complexes are incredible, many potential pen positions. If you have ever played a hole where you hit a great shot into the green only to be on a side slope, then, with a well struck putt, the ball rolls past the hole, down the slope 10-15 ft, you begin to understand how elated I am with the greens at North. The selection of grass for the greens was well thought out and perfect, tif-dwarf is the perfect speed for a senior community, not too fast for the high handicapper, yet not too slow for the low handicapper.

The design of the bunkers add real class to the course, visually they are stunning. They penalize an errant shot, but are designed to let the ball come to the bottom of the bunker, thus giving the player a chance to get out. And the design to allow seniors to walk out (not climb out) the back of the traps was a stroke of genius.

A Moment with President Brasher - 2014: A Good Year for Sun City

The year 2014 has been a good one for Sun City and its residents. A number of significant projects upgrading our facilities and amenities have been completed and more have been initiated with completion anticipated early next year.

Perhaps the biggest project to be completed is the renovation of North Golf Course in which the irrigation system installed in 1960 was completely replaced, coupled with improvements to all aspects of the course. Since its reopening in October there have been many positive comments from golfers and all seem to be enjoying play there. Improvements to the North Course patio and pro shop building were also completed. Another golf project completed was the much needed new South Golf Course maintenance building built to replace a smaller one destroyed by fire last year.

It wasn't all golf, however, as construction was ongoing in other areas. The Oakmont Recreation Center's pool and some of the surrounding buildings were reconstructed and opened in early July to great acclaim from RCSC Cardholders. The new pool provides an improved environment for the aqua fitness and water volleyball clubs, plus a better area for the lap swimmers.

In anticipation of the construction projects to update and enlarge much of the Marinette Recreation Center, the pickleball court complex at the Mountain View Center was enlarged and completed.

Significant projects begun this past summer include a new and larger tennis complex at Bell Recreation Center, as well as the major renovation at Marinette.

The Marinette improvements will provide an expanded fitness center, improved pickleball courts (some with a canopy for shade), and an improved walking track among other modifications. Both the Bell and Marinette improvements are expected to be completed in early 2015.

The electronic signs installed at Sundial Recreation Center early in 2014 garnered so many positive comments from residents that the Board of Directors decided to provide

similar signage at the other centers and the Sun Bowl. By making the decision to do so enabled RCSC to contract for all the other electronic signs, enabling funding to be done from our Property Improvement Fund (PIF).

2014 has been a great

year for those of us who

enjoy quality entertainment. The Sun Bowl and Sundial free performances have been outstanding thanks to the efforts of our Member Services Director and her staff. The ticketed shows at Sundial continue to be well attended. Monthly special events such as the Del Webb Day, Casino Sun City, and the upcoming Holiday Celebration featuring the famous duck race are outstanding.

It should be noted that all of the above major improvements are funded by the PIF, thereby avoiding the use of regular operating funds which we contribute to via our annual property assessments.

A five-year plan to upgrade fish habitat and make Viewpoint Lake a sustainable fishing lake has been developed and is underway. In addition, the introduction of paddle boats has been extremely well received and are quite is very popular. There may be more in the future.

Imagine the planning, organization, interaction with the county for permits, etc., that go into developing and arranging contractors for the major RCSC projects – all while keeping Cardholders informed of the progress and scheduling changes often required. Your volunteer Board of Directors is thankful for the great Management Team and their staff that follow through with projects we deem to be in the best interest of current and future Sun City residents.

Updates

Financial Report:

We have ended our third quarter of 2014 well within our operating and capital budget yearto-date. Every division has completed the third quarter with a positive variance from budget overall. The trend of more golf rounds and income coming from RCSC Cardholders has remained true through 2014, and we have been able to operate both golf courses and snack shops without loss of income due to the North Course being closed for renovations. Thank you RCSC Cardholders! The management team has completed their proposed 2015 Operating and Capital Budget and I presented that budget to the Finance & Budget Committee and RCSC Board this week. I am very proud of how we are able to operate these facilities for annual property assessments that are unheard of in the industry for the amount of amenities we offer and without debt. I was given the opportunity to meet with a group of realtors last week and when discussing the Preservation & Improvement Fund fee I explained the enormous value this "capital fee" has brought Sun City and each of its homeowners. If we did not have this fund, we would have to raise our annual property assessment considerably or we would have to let our facilities deteriorate - neither is a good option for Sun City and the latter would greatly affect home values in Sun City. As someone who has paid this fee, I am grateful for it and can see every day in Sun City where my money has gone. The financial stability of this community is excellent and I am excited about our future!

Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments in September were down from the high in August and were at the monthly average for the year. Past due assessments decreased by just under 3% in September. August billings went past due at a rate of 6.3% and July balances went 60 days past due at a rate of 4%. The 60 days past due rate for July balances was the first time this was over 4% in 2014 and broke the trend of lower rates over the past two years for this age of balances.

Total accounts receivable decreased by just over 4% in September and is at the lowest level since September 2013. In September we saw an almost 5% decrease in property transfer related balances. Outstanding balances related to property transfers continue to represent 55% of all receivables due and 54% of past due balances.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties remained at 45 properties at the end of September. The number of properties owned by lending institutions also decreased in September and is now 52 properties. While these numbers have remained relatively constant we do see a turnover in affected properties which impacts overall receivables and collected Preservation and Improvement Fees.

Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in September totaled \$626,100, which is \$401,100 more than budget. Year-to-date PIF

fees are \$5,312,338 which is \$2,258,338 over budget for the year. Again a reminder that we intentionally budget PIF income very conservatively to assure that we have the cash on hand for any planned project as we remain debt free.

Bowling:

RCSC Director of Bowling Randy Johnson was recently appointed to the Arizona State USBC Board of Directors. USBC (United States Bowling Congress) is a non-profit organization that establishes playing rules and standards for league and tournament bowling in addition to establishing specifications for lanes and lane conditions. Randy was selected due to his extensive background in the industry. Randy has 36 years of experience in the bowling industry and is looking forward to providing input as to current bowling industry trends and bowler concerns while maintaining the integrity of the sport.

Beginning Thanksgiving weekend, both RCSC bowling centers will again host

the Arizona State USBC Senior tournament. The tournament has always been successful for the RCSC and also provides exposure to our community and additional income.

Sign-ups for the annual New Year's Eve Party at Lakeview Lanes begin at 9:00am on November 3, 2014. Space only allows 140 people, so sign up early to reserve your spot.

Human Resources:

The second audit conducted in 2014 on the RCSC Employee 401(k) Plan has been completed by an independent auditor for 2013. Copies of the report and a positive determination letter have been received by RCSC. A copy of the independent auditor's report is required to be filed along with the I.R.S. Form 5500 for the plan each year. The audit and the documents were filed on October 15, 2014.

RCSC received renewal quotes from the carriers for the employee benefit plans which include medical, dental, life, short-term and long-term disability. Employee meetings have been scheduled for early November to communicate details of the plans and to provide employees the opportunity to make changes in coverage to fit their needs.

Project Updates

General Centers Projects and Information

Electronic sign construction continues to progress on schedule. All support poles for the new electronic signs have been placed at Marinette, Bell, Lakeview, Oakmont, Fairway, Mt View and the Sun Bowl. The two electronic signs at Fairway are completely installed with electrical and data wiring underway. We expect the Fairway signs to come on-line very soon. Although electrical permits have not been obtained for the other locations, Bootz and Duke Sign Company will continue to erect the electronic signs with electrical and data work being completed soon afterwards. The electrical and data installation costs increased due to underground boring work needed and is reflected in the new total below. The entire project is expected to be completed in early 2015. Contractors are Bootz and Duke Signs and Accel Electric. (PIF Cost – \$850,775)



North Pro Shop

The North patio and building remodel work is now completed. The golf course, pro shop and snack shop, including a new covered patio, opened to Cardholders on October 18, 2014. Contractors for the patio and building remodel include: CCBG Architectural, Ken McIntyre Construction, Resource Flooring and Ghaster Painting. (Cost – \$167,505 plus \$11,774 for new flooring)

Lakeview Center / Viewpoint Lake

Approximately eighteen volunteers joined Eric Swanson (Lake Consultant) to construct fish habitat for Viewpoint Lake. The first habitat construction event occurred October 7 – 9 at Mt View recreation center. The volunteers amazingly completed (60) pipe palaces and deployed them into VP lake and then went on to prepare the materials to complete (80) fingerling fortresses for the next fish habitat event to be held November 10–14 at Mt. View Center. (No work on the 11th due to the holiday). If you have not signed up to help out with this very important project, please call the RCSC Administration office at (623) 561-4600 and add your name and contact information to our list of volunteers.

The threadfin shad (forage fish for bass, bluegill and catfish) are still delayed due to supplier inventory shortages. Once quantities are available, the shad will be delivered and introduced into Viewpoint Lake.

The Duffeeland dog park project is currently on hold while the RCSC Board of Directors discuss Cardholder suggestions, ideas and concerns brought forth at the Duffeeland Town Hall meeting held October 10 at Bell Center.

Bell Center

The dehumidifier over the indoor spa at Bell Center has now been replaced with a Pool Pack dehumidifier. The indoor spa room at Bell is scheduled to re-open the week of October 27, 2014. Contractor is W.D. Manor Company. (Cost – \$70,258)

The block wall work and drainage pipe behind the new walls at the tennis facility are expected to be completed this week. Electrical conduit to the courts and common areas is being run and the sub-grading of the post tensioned (PT) courts is commencing soon. Some 140+ holes are being bored for fence posts within the PT courts. The

#4 hole of the mini golf course remains closed. However a path was created for Cardholders between hole #3 and hole #5 so the mini golf course can still be used. Cardholders playing the course are asked to take par for hole #4. The tennis project includes demolition of the current (8) tennis courts and the installation of (10) new tennis courts. The new updated complex will also include a shaded gathering area, courtside canopies with benches, water and electric to each court, tables and benches for spectators and planters in the common



areas. Contractors include Lloyd Sports Engineering as architect and project manager and Sunland Sports as building contractor. (PIF Cost – \$1,778,074)

The RCSC pool mechanic is in the process of changing out the sand inside all RCSC sand filters. The pool mechanic will try to schedule this work when a pool or spa is

already shut down for other maintenance work. Currently the sand filters on the Bell walking pool and both spas are completed.

Marinette Center

The Marinette expansion and remodel project is still in full swing with the following work completed: Stucco on existing buildings, roofing over lobby/facility attendant station, outdoor spa is plumbed and shotcreted, solar plumbing has been run to the swimming pool, the pickleball pavilion post tensioned slab is poured, fire system piping has been installed and passed inspection, and new doors/windows have been installed in the existing buildings. The Marinette Center expansion and renovation project includes a 4,000 s.f. fitness center, rubber-



ized outdoor walking track, a total of 20 Pickleball courts, an outdoor spa, a thermal solar system for pool water pre-heating, tankless water heaters for the showers, new doors and windows and exterior stucco of all remaining buildings. Contractors to date include: CCBG Architectural, Robert Porter Construction and Aquatic Builders. (PIF Cost – \$4,387,373) (Please note that the Marinette Auditorium and Social hall will be closed through October 30 for construction work.)

The Marinette clay club renovation is nearing completion with only a few cabinets yet to build. The Marinette utility workers cleaned, waxed and buffed the clay club floors. Kudos to the Marinette team for their exceptional work!

Skilled Trades Department

The RCSC Skilled Trades department completed 127 work orders during the last half of September and the 1st half of October 2014. In addition, the RCSC Skilled Trades carpenters and painter continue to construct cabinets for the Marinette clay club remodel.

Centers Operations

Julie Tracey, the new RCSC Facility Attendant Supervisor, has started the implementation of a formal training program for all newly hired Facility Attendants. Julie is also putting the finishing touches on additional training for current Facility Attendants. This training program is expected to further improve the Facility Attendants ability to provide exceptional customer service to RCSC Cardholders.

On October 22 and 23, ten RCSC employees attended a "Certified Pool Operators" course to either obtain or renew their Certified Pool Operators certificate. This course is the most widely recognized program by local and state authorities. By completing this course, RCSC employees obtain knowledge in topics necessary for pool management, operation, pool care & maintenance and risk reduction. This training is part of the RCSC "Healthy Swimming Program."



Bell Center recently hosted the North American Challenge at the newly renovated lawn bowl greens. The event had participants from all over Canada and the United States. We would like to thank the organizers for all their hard work which made this event a resounding success. We also appreciate the nice comments received by the Bell Utility staff from the event organizers. The utility workers felt much appreciated and were happy to be a part of this event.

Water: Do What We Can to Conserve

Can you choose the contaminants found in dangerous proportions in our water?

Arsenic Lead Prescription Drugs Dirt
Radioactivity Nitrogen Phosphorus Bacteria



Unfortunately, all of the above are found in our water. Arsenic, a known carcinogen, and radioactivity are the biggest culprits in bottled water (and also in other drinking water sources), stemming from mishandled industrial wastes. But remember, bottled water is no safer from these contaminants than tap water, as 25% of all bottled water is from municipal sources (tap water). And if you remember how much water it takes to manufacture just one bottle for bottled water (1.85 gallons),

maybe it would be more conservative to buy a filter for your home and a refillable container.

Drugs in our water are becoming a big issue. Outdated or unneeded medications found in the medicine cabinet should not be flushed down the sink or toilet. Call your local hospital to find out if/when their next drive is for disposal of old medications. If you can't wait that long, search the internet; there are plenty of places that accept old medications for disposal. This goes for over the counter drugs as well, not just prescription; and includes creams, lotions and potions!

Dirt? Yes, dirt. Dirt and sediment from storm water runoff, wind/water erosion from construction sites and agricultural land. The problems with dirt and sediment are multiple, from choking out ponds and harming wildlife, to spreading pollutants. Chemicals and other pollutants are able to attach themselves to dirt particles.





Nitrogen and phosphorus

not only cause explosive plant growth in water sources, but when consumed in high levels (for infants), reduce the blood's ability to carry oxygen. Most of these chemicals come from fertilizer runoff from farm fields, septic systems, residential lawns and recreational areas such as parks and golf courses.

Improperly handled sewage from humans, livestock and pets can literally cause a host of problems from parasitic infections, dysentery, food poisoning and hepatitis.

You ask what the average person can do to help manage these immense issues? Perhaps we can begin to consider using products made by companies that boast green products and eco-friendly manufacturing practices. If we also keep in mind all the hints and tips given in past water articles and help to conserve our fresh water supply, it will help ensure futher generations have adequate supplies of clean water as well.

While one person cannot control industrial, agricultural or runoff wastes, one can control how long the shower is on; one can repair leaking faucets and use clean "refuse" water to care for both indoor and outdoor plants. It's pretty simple to remember that using an automatic car wash or simply using a nozzle on the hose conserves water, as does watering land-scape before the sun comes up or after it sets. Never



dispose of old drugs down the toilet or drains, let alone chemicals, paints, solvents and oils! When you wash your hands, remember to wet them and then turn off the water to wash, and then rinse.

Conserving clean water helps to keep our water cleaner. And remember, every drop really does count!



Our club hours during the winter are Monday through Friday 8:00a.m. to 4:00p.m. and Saturdays from 8:00a.m. to noon.




Bunco Broncos
