Giving Back to the Community

Each year, RCSC Management selects a community organization to be the benefactor of its fundraising efforts throughout the year in lieu of a holiday gift exchange. Considerable staff time is volunteered towards this effort and the true spirit of giving and support of the community has increased substantially over the years.

Recently, General Manager Jan Ek, on behalf of the RCSC Management Team, presented the Sun City Community Assistance Network (SCCAN) with a check in the amount of \$8,231.52, reflecting last year's charity fundraising activities, including the proceeds from Sun City logo apparel and personal donations which culminated with the annual Sun City Holiday Celebration.

At the presentation, Hugh Duncan, SCCAN Board President, announced that not "one nickel" of this money will be used for operating or administrative expenses. Duncan instead turned the tables with the surprise announcement that all of the monies will be used to fund a new SCCAN program that will provide free Dial-A-Ride tickets to low income Sun City residents.

In an email to staff after the presentation, Ek reported: "I was surprised and extremely happy to find out that all of our \$8,200+ donation will be used to provide transportation to those who need it in Sun City. It really touched my heart to see how much our efforts are going to benefit Sun City residents." She further stated, "We will help provide Sun City residents in need with over 2,050 taxi rides. How exciting! As always, you guys have done a great thing for Sun City!"

Bill Pearson, Sun City Foundation President and RCSC Board Director, also announced at this meeting that an additional \$10,000 from the Foundation will also go towards this new program.

"We know that we can do more for Sun City if we work together," Pearson said. "This is another great example combining our efforts for the good of the community."

Continued funding for this project will be contingent on donations and SCCAN intends to pursue grant funding if possible. Contributions to the Sun City Foundation can also be earmarked solely to this program.

This is a remarkable opportunity to "help fill the transportation void" created by the demise of Sun City Area Transport (SCAT) nearly five years ago, Pearson said. Working in partnership with Valley Metro, many Sun City residents who have struggled with transportation will find this new program a godsend.

In order to qualify, applicants must be a full-time Sun City resident over 65 years of age, with an income less than \$1,437 for singles (\$1,940 for couples) and not own a car. Those who believe they are eligible for this benefit will need to call SCCAN at 623-933-7530 and request an application. Those who qualify will have \$50 in free Dial-A-Ride tickets mailed to them four times a year.

Even if you are not low income, everyone in Sun City over 65 years old can now use Dial-A-Ride's green Discount Cabs for \$4 one-way transportation. Trips must be scheduled the day before and exact fare is required. You can travel anywhere in Sun City, Sun City West, Surprise, Youngtown and El Mirage. Updates

Financial Report:

As of November 30, 2013, RCSC has operated within its operating and capital budgets year-to-date. It is essential to remember that monies budgeted for both capital and repair & maintenance projects not completed yet is carried into the future to fund those projects. This money is reflected in our unrestricted fund balance, which creates what may appear to be a surplus but will be used as we proceed through our project completion. It is also important to realize that as we build our Capital Reserve Fund annually to the desired \$5M balance, it is important to reserve some money in case of an emergency. Additionally, it is very important to remember that the Preservation and Improvement Fund (PIF) projects are completed separate from the operating and capital budgets and are not funded by annual property assessments whatsoever. Therefore, there is no increase in assessments to fund these projects. In order to qualify for a PIF project, the project must exceed \$300,000 and have a useful life of 15 years or greater.

Bowling Centers:

The Arizona State Senior tournament was held at Lakeview Lanes and Bell Lanes during Thanksgiving weekend and the first weekend of December. The tournament was budgeted to produce \$6,800 in revenue, but this year's tournament was larger than expected and produced \$8,600 in revenue, which is a positive variance of \$1,800 compared to budget.

In the past ten years or so, the Arizona State Senior tournament alternated annually between RCSC bowling centers in Sun City and centers in Tucson. Director of Bowling Operations Randy Johnson was notified that the tournament will most likely hold their tournament two years at the RCSC centers in Sun City and one year in Tucson then back to RCSC centers for two years. This change in scheduling would mean that RCSC Centers would host the state tournament again in 2014, 2016, and 2017.

RCSC bowling centers were also offered the opportunity to host the Arizona State Senior Women's tournament in December 2014. Randy Johnson was told by the Arizona State Bowling Association Manager that the bowlers enjoy bowling at RCSC's bowling centers because they are clean and the staff is always courteous and helpful. Confirmation should occur after the end of the year.

A Moment with President Brasher - Building for the Future

The Fairway Recreation Center is currently the premier example of how one of our two original Centers (built in 1961) can be upgraded and is a beautiful demonstration of how we can use funds from our Preservation and Improvement Fund to provide the best for our residents. The Board of Directors has no plans to make our other Recreation Centers into "Fairways," but we do hope to provide significant improvements we can be proud of in other Centers.

The current RCSC plans are to propose alterations and improvements to Centers, enlist the membership in discussions, and formulate plans of action for the future. Such a process has been accomplished with the plans for the Marinette Recreation Center, Bell tennis complex, and Oakmont pool modifications. RCSC is now in the process of obtaining the necessary construction bids, county permits, and such to put these plans into action.

During the process for Marinette it has been made clear that some things will change and members who wish to use certain amenities will have the need to travel to other recreation centers (for mini-golf, tennis), while seeing expansion of the existing fitness centers, locker/shower rooms, pickleball courts, and improvements to the walking track. Improvements at Marinette are being done for the most utilized amenities while moving the least attended to other Centers.

The RCSC Board of Directors has worked closely with its Long Range Planning Committee to identify facilities in Sun City that would benefit from modernization, expansion, or contraction in an attempt to ensure Sun City's future is as positive as its past. During this process some difficult decisions are being made in attempts to see that Sun City in the future will continue to provide the best value and experience for all who choose to live in our premier active senior adult community.

Similarly, adjustments have to be made in usage of space by several clubs. Some

clubs have declined in member usage while demand has grown significantly for others. It is imperative that RCSC address the need for club space, whether clubs agree to consolidate of simply share rooms, to enhance the experience for the many members who are embracing current trends in leisure activities and hobbies. To this end we must attempt to accommodate by providing more to all while consolidating the lesser used clubs and amenities.

Residents need to remember that there have been many changes in the community in the past, and more will be coming in the future. The goal is to constantly improve our life experience in our wonderful community. Change doesn't come easy and difficult decisions will have to be made. We in Sun City value the history of success in our community and must continue it by building for the future.

Project Updates

General Centers Projects/Information

•Vern White has filled the Building and Infrastructure Coordinator vacancy created when Josephine Karacsony resigned her position. Mr. White comes with some impressive skills and experience which also include working the last two years at Bell Center as Utility Worker and Lead Utility Worker. Congratulations Vern!

Mountain View Center

•The new swimming pool deck lighting is now completed. With the installation of the lighted solar canopy over the mini golf course, the mini golf lighting pole is no longer necessary. Contractor was Accel Electric. (Estimated Cost – \$40,000)
•The RCSC will be replacing the existing (4) pickleball courts and adding another (3) pickleball courts in 2013. All seven court surfaces will be constructed using post tension concrete. Submittal for

building permit and construction proposals are in process. Once all bids have been received, the project will be sent to the RCSC Bid Commission for final project approval. The two tennis courts at Mt. View will remain open for use during this project.

Fairway/South Golf Maintenance

•The replacement 6,000 s.f. South Golf Maintenance building is about completed. On December 11 APS installed the primary cables through previously installed conduits for the new electrical service. APS will set the new transformer soon. In addition, Jokake Construction must replace the panel or meter base to conform to new code, which requires an 8 pin socket. Contractors to date include Bunger Steel, Inc, Jokake Construction, Northstar Construction, CCBG Architectural and Accel Electric. (Budgeted Cost – \$600,000, After insurance)

Oakmont Center

•The new Oakmont pool and equipment room project has been submitted to Maricopa County Building and Planning and Maricopa County Environmental Services Departments for necessary permits. In addition, the project has been sent to construction companies for construction proposals. Once all proposals are received the project will be submitted to the RCSC bid commission for final project approval. Contractors to date include CCBG Architectural and Aquatic Builders.

Lakeview Center

•The East Ramps (red entrance) at Lakeview Center will be replaced soon with ramps that meet ADA code requirements. The slope of the new ramps will be significantly reduced making entry to the lower and upper levels much easier to navigate for cardholders and guests. The project is awaiting Maricopa County permit approval and the return of construction proposals. Once the construction proposals are received, the project will go to the RCSC bid commission for final approval. Contractor to date is CCBG Architectural.

Bell Center

•Two high efficiency commercial water heaters for the outside shower rooms and swimming pool showers were found to be beyond repair. The water heaters will be replaced soon with (5) Rinnai tankless commercial water heaters. The new tankless water heaters will save energy while providing all the hot water needed for this facility. Contractor is Sunland Plumbing and Construction. (Cost – \$25,381)

•Four mechanical units (HVAC) will be replaced soon as they have served their useful life. Contractor is Sunland Plumbing and Construction. (Cost – \$29,990)

Sundial/Riverview Pro/Snack Shop

•The two electronic display signs for Sundial Center are scheduled to be installed January 7 and 8, 2014. One sign will be located on the Boswell side of Sundial Center and the other on the 103rd Ave side of Sundial Center. Contractors for this project are Bootz and Duke Sign Company, Supercharged Electric and Ken McIntyre Construction. Cost – \$102,107)

•Three mechanical units (HVAC) will be replaced soon as they have served their useful life. Contractor is Sunland Plumbing and Construction. (Cost – \$38,360)

Marinette Center

•The building plans for the Marinette building expansion are in the final stage of development by various engineers and the architect. As soon as the plans are completed they will be reviewed and forwarded to Maricopa County Planning and Development Department for permit and to construction companies for bid proposals. Once the proposals are obtained, the project will be submitted to the RCSC bid commission for final approval. Site and floor plan drawings are on display for cardholders at various centers, including Marinette, Bell, Sundial, Lakeview and Fairway.

Skilled Trades Department

•The RCSC Skilled Trades department completed 84 work orders during the last half of November and the 1st half of December 2013. This total does not include other routine and specialized work completed outside of the work order system.

Cardholder Services:

The payments on past due assessments were up in November but still below the monthly averages for the past year. October billings went past due at a rate of 9.0%. This is significantly higher than the monthly average rate but is consistent with trend for the prior two years where October invoices are past due at a higher rate than all other months. September balances went over 60 days past due at monthly rate of 3.9%, which is just under the average. Outstanding balances related to property transfers increased by just under 5% in November and represent 56% of all receivables due and 54% of past due balances.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties increased for the first time in several months with the count up almost 20% to 46 for the end of November. The number of properties owned by lending institutions increased slightly to 74 this month.

The Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in November were \$414,000 which is 25% more than budget. Year to date PIF fees are \$6,190,040, which is 69% over budget for the year.

Human Resources:

Beginning January 1, 2014, RCSC is rolling out a new service awards program to replace the current one that recognizes employees with an awards pin with gem stones for increments of 5 years of service up to 25 years. To assure the program was meaningful to employees, the Management Team conducted an informal opinion poll earlier this year to see what employees would like to receive in recognition of continued service. The overwhelming response was monetary recognition. An increasing scale starting at \$50 for 5 years of service is being implemented.

In making this change, we have not forgotten those employees who receive their 15 year pin on or before December 31, 2013 and would like to complete it upon reaching 20 and 25 years of service. We have provided for that option in the new program.

RCSC has renewed employee insurance benefits with our current carriers BlueCross/BlueShield of AZ and Mutual of Omaha. BC/BS offers medical coverage and Mutual of Omaha offers dental, life, voluntary life, short term disability and long term disability coverage. There will be an increase in premium for medical and dental,

however, not as significant as expected in today's market and as affected by the Affordable Care Act. We are currently holding Open Enrollment for employees who wish to make changes in their coverage.

In renewing RCSC's IRS Section 125 Unreimbursed Medical Plan for calendar year 2014, we are offering a change to employees enrolling in the program. Enrollees will be issued debit cards to pay medical expenses not covered by medical insurance. Currently the plan requires employees to complete reimbursement forms and submit with medical receipts either by U.S. mail, fax, or online. With a swipe of the card, an employee will be able to pay for medical services received immediately. Money to pay these expenses is deducted from participating employees' pay on a pre-tax basis and employees never pay taxes on the money set aside for reimbursement.

Member Services:

The Arizona Christmas Spectacular concert at Sundial on Tuesday, December 10th was another fantastic performance. With a full house of 1200 Guests they came and enjoyed hot cocoa and hot apple cider while they were entertained for 2 solid hours. The show received three standing ovations. We look forward to next year's holiday concert.

The Holiday Celebration was huge! People filled Lakeview and enjoyed every aspect of the afternoon. The synchronized swimmers kicked off the event and captivated the audience; there was a continual line for the pie walk, hole in one and the money tree. The Ducks had two full races; the food was good and plentiful. All the proceeds went to benefit SCCAN. The event ended with the fantastic boat parade, a perfect ending to a perfect day. I must say a good time was had by all. What a wonderful way to end the season!

New Club Presidents are getting ready to take over in January and the Club Office Staff is preparing for the New Club President Orientation on Wednesday, January 22.

Golf Report

Pro Shops

Total revenue for November finished \$31,376 behind budget. Green Fee/Cart Fees (including golf pass revenue) were \$35,411 behind budget, merchandise finished \$3,838 ahead of budget and driving range revenue was \$740 ahead of budget. Two days of rain, followed by a day of cart path only, resulted in lost revenues of \$25,000 to \$30,000.

Year-to-date total golf revenue is \$142,962 behind budget. Through savings in Cost of Sales and Total Operating Expenses we have recovered \$37,240 of our revenue deficit, bringing our Net Operating Excess/ Deficit to within \$105,722 for the year.

Our Beat the Pro event, supporting Sun City CAN once again lived up to its name, with 83% of the teams beating the "pros". We surpassed our fund raising goal of \$2500, reaching \$3,088 in total donations. Many raffle prizes were lined up thanks to the efforts of Janine Millette from Willowcreek and Sue Presta, our Golf Administrative Coordinator. Next year's event is tentatively scheduled to coincide with the North Golf Course Grand Re-Opening, following the renovation. Tripp Davis and Gary Brawley, the Golf Course Architects responsible for our golf course master plans, have tentatively agreed to participate as well. We are hoping to make the event Beat the Pros and the Architects.

Snack Shops

Sales in the snack shops finished \$1,103 behind budget. The wet weekend also affected their performance to budget. For the year Snack Shop revenue is \$2,749 ahead of budget and \$20,960 ahead of their Net Operating Excess/Deficit budget.

Golf Courses

With the first frosts of the year, the weak overseeding spots have been exposed, particularly at Willowcreek. Courses have begun an aggressive fertilization program and have re-seeded the weakest spots. Improvement will be most noticeable once warmer day time temperatures are reached.

The North Renovation project has started on time, with work beginning on hole #8. If you choose to observe any part of the process, we ask that you avoid any areas that are active work sites. This is both for your safety and the safety of the work crews. Gary Brawley, the golf course architect, will be providing monthly updates in the Sun Views. Pine logs will occasionally be split and placed in the parking lot for resident use. The work crews are expected to be off property from December 21 through January 2.

The tournament, to be held on February 13 at Lakes East/West Golf Courses will benefit research and support for those currently being treated. North Golf Course Renovation Project

Architect's Report

by Gary Brawley Senior Golf Architect, Tripp Davis and Associates

Tee Construction

In this article we are going to be focused on the purpose and method of construction for the new tees at the North Golf Course. During the initial evaluation of the existing tees it was determined that the tees were too small based on the number of rounds played on the course.

Another factor that was taken into consideration is the fact that the RCSC allows for five golfers per grouping, instead of the typical foursome, which increases the physical wear of the tee surface. This does not have to do with the overall number of rounds, but the congregating of golfers on the tee and that the additional golfer inherently impacts a larger area on the tee surface. In addition to the size of the tees we also found many tees that were not properly aligned with the intended direction of play, and there was a lack of variation in distance on some of the golf holes.

When looking at the design of tees, we not only look at the proposed size and location of the tees we also pay careful attention to not just the specifics of each golf hole, but the overall experience for the golfer across all 18 holes. In studying this there was really no room to move greens to change the overall distance of the individual golf holes. So,

any modification to the length of the hole needed to be accomplished with the locations of the tees. The end result will ultimately be an overall yardage that will be very similar to the original with there being some variation from hole to hole. In addition to the three existing tees a fourth set of tees is being added in front of the existing red tees to further give the entire golfing community an opportunity to enjoy the North Golf Course and add variety.

The method of construction is similar to the previous renovations in that the surface will be initially established in the sub-grade, and then a 4" layer of sand will be installed and then laser leveled and/or string leveled to establish the final grade of the tee. All tees have a 1% pitch across them which allows for surface drainage and are a typical method of tee construction in the industry.

Prior to planting an organic amendment will be added to help with establishment of the grass and long term maintenance. One difference at the North Golf Course compared to the other golf courses in Sun City is that the tees will maintain a geometric (squared corners) shape which is much more associated with the classic/historical golf courses. When the golfers return to the North Golf Course they will be treated to all newly expanded and level tees.







Do Laundry and Save Water

Did you know that washing laundry accounts for nearly 25% of a home's indoor water use and that conventional top loading washing machines use between 39 to 43 gallons of water per load? "Water Sense" and "Energy Star" labels were developed by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to help identify and promote water and energy efficient products. Combining a new, high-efficiency washer and utilizing conservation practices while laundering can cut water use by half.

Front-loading washers are the most efficient, using less than half the water of older, top-loading models. Front-loaders fill partially and tumble clothes through a small amount of water. This uses less water and less energy for heating water. Faster spin speeds extract more water from clothing reducing drying time, thereby reducing energy use (by as much as 60%). And no agitator means the machine is gentler on your clothes as well besides using less detergent. But don't worry; they clean clothes better since the rinse water doesn't drain through your clothes.

New top-loading "WaterSense" and Energy Star model washing machines may look like a conventional machine, but upon lifting the lid you will see there is no central agitator. Using a sophisticated wash system to flip or spin laundry through a reduced stream of water, these machines do not fill the tub with water. The rinse cycle uses a system of repeated high-pressure sprays in lieu of soaking in a full tub.

If you are considering the purchase of a new washing machine, keep some these tips in mind:

- Look for the U.S. EPA WaterSense and Energy Star labels. Whether you choose a front loading or redesigned top-loading machine, both models include innovations that help conserve substantial amounts of water (and energy).
- Select a washing machine with a tub volume under 4.0 cubic feet that uses less than 6.5 gallons of water per cubic foot. This can reduce water usage by (up to) 50%.

Try to wash only "full loads" but if you must wash a small load, be sure to select the correct water level on your machine. And to avoid costly energy charges, use cold water whenever possible and limit loads to "off-peak" hours.
