Updates

Financial Report:

We ended the year, December 31, 2013, well within our operating and capital budget. We have \$560k in repairs and maintenance projects that were not completed as of year-end and will be carried forward into 2014. We have been able to create a restructuring that solves most of the financial challenges that led us to contract the golf and grounds maintenance services, therefore, as of January 1, 2014, RCSC has brought golf and grounds maintenance back inhouse.

Bowling Centers:

The RCSC Bowling Division recently purchased new bowling ball racks for spare balls. With the constantly changing technology in bowling equipment, more bowlers are using different bowling balls to convert spares. The new spare ball racks will accommodate twelve bowling balls and the rack also includes a table top for bowlers to place their towels and accessories. The racks are expected to arrive in early February and will be installed soon after. The racks were purchased from Brunswick Corporation at a cost of \$13,500 for twenty racks.

The New Year's Eve party held at Lakeview Lanes was a huge success! The Sun City Bowling Association did an excellent job of organizing and planning the event. Approximately 150 bowlers participated in the event which ended with a champagne toast at midnight.

Cardholder Services:

The payments on past due assessments were steady in December but below the monthly averages for the past year by 12%. November billings went past due at a rate of 7.1% which is right at the average for the past 12 months. October balances followed the annual trend identified last month and went over 60 days past due at a monthly rate of 6.3%. This is 40% over the monthly average for the past year. Outstanding balances related to property transfers increased by 10.6% in December and now represent 57% of all receivables due and 56% of past due balances.

Overall account receivables due at the end of 2013 increased by 23.8% compared to the end of 2012 balances with 80% of this increase being attributable to balances related to property transfers. Compared to the end of 2012, the outstanding balances related to property transfers increased by almost 36%. Past due balances increased by 18% over the end of 2012 with the over 90 day

A Moment with President Brasher - Quorum: Is it important?

The online Merriam-Webster Dictionary defines a quorum as "the smallest number of people who must be present in order for decisions to be made." The term's first known use is stated to be the year 1602.

During my time as a member of the RCSC Board of Directors I know of no other single word that has been such a flashpoint subject among members. It could be that the significance of a "quorum" is greatly exaggerated. RCSC Bylaws state that a Membership Meeting will be held with the presence of a quorum of Members. The last Membership Meeting with a quorum was held in November 2009, when 168 Members were present; there was a 100 Member quorum requirement at that time.

A quorum has never been present since then at any of the Membership Meetings. Generally, the RCSC Board of Directors has held at least ten Monthly Board Meetings per year. At these meetings, as well as at monthly Board/Members Exchanges, attendance by Members is sparse to say the least, and attendance by more than 50 Members would be striking.

Let's look at a brief history of the quorum question with RCSC, although I have

found it difficult to find out much about the quorum numbers in our Sun City history.

In 2009, there were two guarterly Membership Meetings with a quorum present in September and November. That apparently occurred because there was a very controversial subject on Members' minds - the guorum requirement. Prior to that time, a Membership Meeting guorum had not been met since January 26, 2006. In 2009, RCSC's legal counsel advised the Board of Directors at that time that less than one-half one percent (0.3%) of the total Membership were able to create a quorum which left RCSC and its Members at risk of being controlled by small minority, possibly to the detriment of the community as a whole.

After some bumps in reaching a suitable quorum number, the Board of Directors formed an ad-hoc committee of Members to study the quorum question. After considerable discussion, on May 27, 2010, the quorum number was set at 1,250 (this number currently represents 3.8% of RCSC's Members). It should also be noted that if the Board of Directors does not set a quorum requirement, Arizona law under ARS Title 10 states a quorum will be ten percent of the Members. Some time ago the RCSC Board of Directors recognized the quorum question is important to a number of our Members. Two years ago the Board instituted an attempt to hold an Annual Membership Meeting Event with entertainment and free food in hopes that enough interested Members would attend and we would gain a quorum. The first of these Annual Meetings was in January 2013 and the second this past January. In 2013 the number of registered Members was under 500; in January 2014 there were just under 600 registered Members.

In light of the above, we ask the question: Is the quorum important? Is it possible that RCSC Members are comfortable with their delegation of responsibilities for governing Sun City to their elected Directors and do not feel it is necessary to attend RCSC meetings? Let's not forget that your Board of Directors and Management are eager to hear Members' concerns and recommendations at our two open meetings each month and that our doors, telephones, and email contacts are always open to you.

The RCSC Management Team is pleased to announce the selection of the Sheriff's Posse of Sun City as the beneficiary of its 2014 charitable giving efforts.

Each year, a Sun City organization is selected and funds are raised through donations and various functions throughout the year, culminating with the annual Sun City Holiday Celebration in December.

"Staff works hard and much personal time is spent conducting fundraising events to benefit an organization each year that directly helps the community," said RCSC General Manager Jan Ek.

"I am pleased to announce the selection of the Posse, who provide so much not only at RCSC events, but whose volunteers patrol the streets of Sun City on a routine basis, assist with traffic control when necessary and offer the vacation watch program to our residents," Ek concluded.

In an email response, Posse Commander Roberta Lambin exclaimed, "I cannot tell you how excited we are at the Posse to receive this news. As you know, funding for the Posse is totally through our annual fund drive and with economy we have not done as well in the last few years as in the past. We provide great services to our citizens and would like to continue on our mission."

Last year's recipient, Sun City Community Assistance Network, recently received a check from the RCSC in the amount of \$8,231.52 which will be used to fund tickets for a free Dial-A-Ride program for low income Sun Citians in need of transportation.

Project Updates

General Centers Projects/Information

• Robert Ortiz was hired in January 2014 to assume the position of Grounds Supervisor. Robert will oversee the landscaping maintenance at all RCSC centers and the maintenance of all Lawn Bowling greens. Robert's extensive training and experience in turf management will certainly help the RCSC meet its grounds maintenance goals and objectives. Welcome aboard Robert!

• The RCSC has completed a thorough review of various card access security systems for its ongoing building security needs. Recently the RCSC hired the Multi Card Company to bring this technology to our facilities. The current plan is to set up the card access software and meet with club officers at Fairway Center prior to installing door hardware on each club room door, and on the East entrance doors. Once these installations are successfully completed the RCSC will determine other locations to upgrade with this new technology. Benefits of Card Access include: key and locksmith cost reductions, tracking and reporting of door openings, and immediate deletion

of lost access devices, to name a few. Obviously there will be many cardholder questions about this new technology, and how it works, so I will keep cardholders and club officers updated as best I can as we work through the installation process. Contractor is Multi Card. (Phase 1 Cost – \$ 52,000)

Mt. View Center

 Demolition is completed for the seven (7) new pickleball courts at Mt View. The next steps for this project include trenching, light pole footings and forming of the court surfaces. All seven courts will be constructed using post tension concrete. Please note that after the post tensioned concrete is poured, there is a 28 day waiting period for the concrete to cure before the final colored top coatings can be applied. The two tennis courts at Mt. View will remain open for tennis play, and pickleball players are asked to use the Marinette Center courts during construction. Contractor is Sunland Sports and CCBG Architectural. (Cost - \$243,681)

South Golf Maintenance

• The replacement 6,000 s.f. South Golf Maintenance building is completed. Contractors for this project included Bunger Steel, Inc, Jokake Construction, Northstar Construction, CCBG Architectural and Accel Electric. (Approximate Cost – \$475,000, After insurance)

Oakmont Center

• The Oakmont pool, spa and equipment room project began January 27, 2014 with closure and drainage of the pool and spa. Contractors to date include CCBG Architectural, K.L. McIntyre Construction and Aquatic Builders. (Cost – \$529,416)

Lakeview Center

• The upper and lower ramps on the east (red) entrance at Lakeview Center are now demolished and re-grading is underway. The new ramps will have a much more gradual slope, making it easier for cardholders and guests to access the facility. Contractor is Ken McIntyre Construction. (Cost – \$120,975)

balances increasing most significantly. Changes to the outside collections process negatively affected these past due balances due to the transition between collection agencies. Now that all changes have been completed we are starting to see successful collection efforts.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties increased again for the second month and is now at 46 for the end of December. This decreased by 50% from the end of 2012. The number of properties owned by lending institutions decreased to 69 this month and is down by 10% from the end of 2012.

The Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in December were \$437,500 which is 58.5% more than budget. Year-to-date PIF fees are \$6,627,540, which is \$2,691,540 over budget for the year. We intentionally budget PIF fees conservatively to assure that sufficient cash is on hand when PIF projects are scheduled as we remain debt free.

Human Resources:

With team work and much cooperation amongst numerous departments including, but not limited to golf maintenance, accounting, pro shops and human resources, we were able to successfully bring golf and ground maintenance back in house while continuing to maintain golf course maintenance and timely payment of wages to golf and grounds maintenance staff, as well as other new hires. We processed in excess of sixty employees in a week's time, which included orientation, verification of right to work documents, social security trace, background checks and timely input of new hire information into the human resource/payroll system. As a result of the changes, RCSC employs 340 full- and part-time personnel with 65% being Sun City residents. Early in January we held informational/enrollment meetings for RCSC's 401(k) Plan and the 125 Flexible Benefits Plan. We distributed Summary Plan Description to the 125 plan participants in compliance with IRS requirements.

RCSC matches each 401(k) plan participant's contributions up to \$500 annually with a six year vesting schedule. At the end of the 2013 calendar year, RCSC's employee 401(k) Plan had \$10,978 in a forfeiture account. The forfeitures result from match money not fully vested when participants terminate employment. Forfeitures are then used to offset the employer match money at the beginning of each plan year until the account is exhausted.

Member Services:

RCSC's Clubs & Activities Office has been extremely busy with new club officers, year-end reports, events and tours. We have 20 concerts, 8 RCSC sponsored events, 16 Farmers Markets, 27 day tours and 18 overnight tours all scheduled between January and June of this year!

The Farmers Market resumed on January 9 and more and more vendors are joining this fast growing, successful market! Held every Thursday from 8am to 12noon in the parking lot at the Bell Center, mark your calendars.

General:

Bell Center

• Two high efficiency commercial water heaters for the outside shower rooms and swimming pool showers were found to be beyond repair. The water heaters were replaced with (5) Rinnai tankless commercial water heaters. The new tankless water heaters are operating well and helping the RCSC save energy. Contractor was Sunland Plumbing and Construction. (Cost – \$25,381)

• Four mechanical units (HVAC) were recently replaced at Bell Center, as they had served their useful life. Contractor was Sunland Plumbing and Construction. (Cost – \$29,990)

Sundial Center

• The two electronic display signs for Sundial Center are now installed and in use. Many positive comments have been received about the new signs. Contractors for this project included Bootz and Duke Sign Company, Supercharged Electric, Ken McIntyre Construction and the RCSC Grounds department. (Cost – \$102,107)

• Three mechanical units (HVAC) are currently being replaced at Sundial Center as they have served their useful life. Contractor is Sunland Plumbing and Construction. (Cost – \$38,360)

Marinette Center

• The building plans for the Marinette building expansion have been submitted to Maricopa County Planning and Development for first review. While the County reviews the plans the RCSC will also review the plans so all corrections can take place before second submittal to Maricopa County and to various builders for construction proposals. Once construction proposals are obtained, the project will be submitted to the RCSC bid commission for final approval. Site and floor plan drawings are on display for cardholders at various centers, including Marinette, Bell, Sundial and Fairway.

Skilled Trades Department

• The RCSC Skilled Trades department completed 131 work orders during the last half of December 2013 and the 1st half of January 2014. This total does not include other routine and specialized work completed outside of the work order system.

Golf Report

Pro Shops

Total revenue for December exceeded budget by \$21,350 and prior year by \$10,330. Total Green Fee revenue exceeded budget by \$11,621, despite Tournament Income and Public Green Fees missing budget by a combined total of \$13,106. Green Fee revenue was driven by Cardholder play and Cardholder Guests, which exceeded budget by a combined total of \$30,582. Driving Range revenue exceeded budget by \$3,771 and Merchandise Sales exceeded budget by \$5,189.

Despite our December performance we still fell short of our budgeted 2013 revenue goals by \$121,614. After February we were \$156,502 behind our revenue budget, which means from March 1 through December 31 we exceeded budgeted revenue by \$34,888. Our Net Operating Budget saw improvement as well, ending \$70,794 behind budget, an improvement of \$70,213 since February.

On February 13, Lakes East/Lakes West will be hosting the 6th Annual Teal Ribbon Tournament. The event is open to ladies and men and no handicap is required. It is a 9-hole event with a 9:30 shotgun start and a Texas Roadhouse catered lunch follows play at Sundial. In addition to golf there will be a 50/50 and a raffle. Net proceeds will benefit the AZ Cancer Center, Ovarian Cancer Research. Entry forms are available at each clubhouse and may be turned in to the starters at any golf course.

Golf Courses

The preliminary 2014 aerification/overseed dates have been submitted to Golf Advisory. Based on the success of our trial at Lakes West last year, each course will only be closing once for green aerification. We will still be removing the same amount of organic material. This will be accomplished by using larger tines in a tighter pattern. We will be less aggressive in our sand removal from the putting surface this year, with the intent of allowing the greens to heal more completely and quicker following aerification. It is important to note that the greens at North will not be overseeded this year and will be dormant. Not overseeding the North greens will place less stress on them following the renovation. The proposed schedule may be changed if unforeseen circumstances delay the North renovation project. Once approved by Golf Advisory the dates will be posted on the sunaz.com website.

Snack Shops

Total revenue for the snack shops exceeded budget by \$968 for December and finished the year \$26,428 ahead of their Net Operating Budget.

North Golf Course Renovation Project Architect's Report

by Gary Brawley

Senior Golf Architect, Tripp Davis and Associates

This month we thought it would be appropriate to provide a summary of where we stand today as it has been one of the most asked questions around Sun City. The major milestone we are all working towards is being able to commence planting of the North Golf Course as soon as sod and sprigs are available to be harvested, which is typically in late May early June. The more work we have completed before that time will allow the focus to be put on the finish preparation and planting of the golf course.

Today we have approved laboratory test for the bunker sand, tee sand, and greens mix. This does not mean we are done as it is a requirement of the contract to require Wadsworth Golf Construction to continually test these materials to make sure they are following the project specifications. The RCSC has had Owner representation at the sampling of the sand and will continue to actively participate in this process for the duration of the project.

Following is a summary of construction activity as of mid-February. Wadsworth Golf Construction has completed earthwork and shaping on golf holes 1-9, driving range, and practice green. B & C Tree Service have completed tree pruning and tree removal on holes 1-13 and 18 and will be working to complete their work on holes 14-17. It is worth noting that the tree company will be returning to the project later this summer/ early fall to prune all of the palm trees as we did not want to do this twice. Golf course drainage has been stubbed into all features (tees, greens and bunkers) on holes 1-9, driving range, and practice green. Irrigation installation is complete on golf holes 2-8 with work continuing on holes 1, 9, driving range, and putting green. Along with the installation of the irrigation pipe and wire, Wadsworth Golf has successfully bored the mainline crossings from holes 3 to 4, 5 to 6, and 7 to 8, and have also have installed a temporary tap into the existing irrigation mainline that has allowed them to "charge" the new irrigation system to flush and set heads.

As the schedule moves into March, Wadsworth Golf will continue earthwork and shaping, starting on golf hole 12 and working their way towards golf hole 18 and finishing with holes 10 and 11. A crew specializing in feature construction will also be going back through the front nine and begin to finish building the tees, greens, and bunkers which will include the tie-in of all feature drainage, edging the bunker and preparation of the bunker sub-grade, placement of sand on the tees, and the installation of the gravel and sand on the greens.

Golf Course Architect, Tripp Davis and Associates have had representation on site almost every day since the project started with Gary Brawley, Senior Golf Architect, being very hands-on during construction. Tripp Davis has also made several visits already and is being updated weekly through his communication with Gary. RCSC Board Chairmen to Golf Advisory, and General Manager Jan Ek, have toured the golf course and are also consistently being updated on construction activities. Brian Duthu, RCSC Director of Golf, has been very active in the construction activity, often visiting the project multiple times each week.

A lot is going on but the overall consensus is that the project is moving along very smoothly and on schedule. The key right now is to keep pushing along and making sure the quality is being delivered from start to finish.





Water Savings are just a flush away!


Just think how civilized people felt when the outhouse was no more; to when "walking the privies" no longer meant heading out of doors. Certainly these changes seemed less sanitary in the beginning, but look how customary an indoor facility is today. Bodily waste is a delicate topic and normally unacceptable in a polite conversation. However, when an average person over a lifetime flushes 140,000 times (conservatively), the topic of toilets is a conversation that should be considered; especially when 30% of a home's water usage is guzzled down the drain by simple flushing.

Prior to 1982, toilets used a whopping five to seven gallons per flush. Water usage was improved in 1983 to approximately 3.5 gallons. In 1994, toilets were redesigned to use less water, some up to half as much per flush, cutting that 3.5 to a mere 1.6 gallons. In fact, in 1995 a law passed requiring any newly manufactured toilet must use no more than 1.6 gallons per flush. To currently meet the EPA's WaterSense requirements, a toilet may only use 1.28 gallons (or less) per flush. WaterSense toilets are required in California in all home remodels, or even to simply receive a permit for some home improvements!

There are many choices in purchasing an eco-friendly toilet, and it is suggested you research to find the right fit. Dual-Flush toilets, which handle solid and liquid waste separately, only use approximately one gallon for liquid flushing; however, these toilets don't necessarily save much over a capable single-flush toilet and if a second flush is required to completely clear the bowl, may use far more water.

Toilet models labeled with "WaterSense" can reduce water usage by 20 to 60 percent saving the average family more than \$110 per year in water costs. If every inefficient toilet in the United States were replaced with an ecofriendly model, as a country we could save 520 billion gallons of water per year. That's about the same amount of water that flows over Niagara Falls in about 12 days.

So when you get ready to do that remodel of the master, consider replacing that old commode with a high-efficiency model. And while you're at it, don't forget the guest bath. The price of a new eco-friendly toilet could be recovered with a year's worth of water savings.






