Senior Olympics in Sun City

Sun City plays host this year to three categories for the Arizona Senior Olympics, giving us the opportunity to showcase RCSC facilities to seniors from throughout the state and a chance to cheer on the participants in a variety of sporting events.



The Bocce courts at Sundial Center kicked off the start of the games here when more than 120 competitors came to Sun City during the week of February 16-20. Many brought family and friends, with attendance swelling for certain matches to over 200. Bocce Senior Olympics will return to Sundial next year, so plan to catch the action if you missed it this year.

March brings more Olympic events when the Sun City Starrs swim club hosts the Swimming Relays at Bell Cen-

ter on Saturday, March 7. Over 90 swimmers and their supporting families are expected to attend.

The entire pool area at Bell will be closed on this day from 7:30a.m. to 3:00p.m. However, spectators are welcome to come out and see how the competition unfolds.

This same weekend (March 7-8), the Sun City Billiard Club at Lakeview Lanes will host the Billiards single 8-ball competition. Men will play on Saturday and Women on Sunday in two categories – 50-65 years and 65+ years (subject to change depending upon number of participants).

RCSC Cardholders wishing to play billiards this weekend are encouraged to use either Bell Lanes or Fairway Center billiards rooms.

Golf Report

Pro Shops

Rounds for December continued the year long trend, posting the highest number of rounds played in a year since 2007. Rounds played at our executive courses in December, were the highest recorded total since at least 2006. For the year a total of 320,481 rounds were played throughout RCSC golf courses, representing a 5.45% increase over prior year.

On February 12th, Lakes East/Lakes West will be hosting the 7th Annual Teal Ribbon Tournament. The event is open to ladies and men and no handicap is required. It is a 9 hole event with a 9:30 shotgun start and a Texas Roadhouse catered lunch follows play at Sundial. The keynote speaker will be Tracy E. Crane, MS, RD, University of AZ Cancer Center, LIVES Study Coordinator, Research Specialist. She will report on the clinical trial the event has helped fund which now exceeds 475 patients on this study and how support is invaluable as funding is so difficult to secure for lifestyle studies. Entry forms are available at each clubhouse and may be turned in to the starters at any golf course.

Snack Shops

Total revenue for the snack shops exceeded budget by \$4,900, capping off a great year. We thank everyone for their support of the snack shops.

Golf Courses

To date the Riverview project is moving according to schedule, with shaping complete on nine holes. Drainage is complete on five holes and the irrigation mainline is complete on four holes. The renovation to the lake on hole #3 (old #12) is in process, the finished product will be deeper and lined, providing a stable source for irrigation water. Tree work throughout the course is expected to be completed by January 23.

Beginning the last week in January, we will begin the drilling of a new well at Lakes West Golf Course. The first stage will be mobilization which will include sound abatement structures and the drilling of a pilot hole. Once drilling has commenced the rig will run 24 hours a day until completed, which is expected to be approximately one week. The well is expected to be completed in mid-March. Other work related to the project (lake lining, site construction and pump installation) will begin mid-February. This portion of the project will end mid-March, at which time the final pump selection will be determined. Lead time on the pump is several months, leading to an expected start to normal pumping to begin in July.

At this time all regulation courses have received "The Spryte" laser finder system. The Sprytes are placed at the top of the flagstick and are designed for easy access from any angle. We decided to install the Sprytes at the other regulation courses following a trial period at Willowcreek.

This report by Brian Duthu, RCSC Director of Golf & Grounds, was presented to the RCSC Board of Directors at their monthly meeting on January 29, 2015.

Architect's Report

Riverview Renovation Update

Weather has been good to us again this winter. Although a little rain is nice, it does slow construction down. With that, overall construction is on schedule, if not trending a little

Earthwork and shaping is progressing and I am very pleased with what is taking form on the golf course. The challenge I have with Riverview is to create something different, but follow the overall criteria that I have been directed by the RCSC Board of Directors to achieve with the golf course. I am on-site almost every day working alongside the shapers to make any small changes in the field that I feel will enhance the character of the golf course. We are paying special attention to the shaping of the bunkers to make sure the shape of the bunker surrounds will tie-in with the final sand lines that we are trying to achieve. The good thing in working with Wadsworth Golf Construction is the New irrigation pump station and motors being set at Riverview Course. lead shaper will be lead for the



bunker crew so he will be able to see the vision all the way through. In addition, he is one of the best bunker guys I have ever worked with in the industry.

Irrigation installation is also on schedule but there is a lot of work still ahead of the crews. They are working on getting the new mainline distribution installed so that we can fully charge the new irrigation system using the new mainline. This is important as temperatures are warming up and we can start growing grass once we have water. Wadsworth Golf will be sending a crew back through the golf holes that are complete with irrigation and work on cleaning those holes up.

Both new pump stations have been installed with the east station completely up and running and the west station waiting for an upgrade to the power supply before we can charge that system.

We have tested all the sand for the greens and Wadsworth will soon start to install the drainage, gravel layer in the green complexes. They also will soon be installing sand on the tee surfaces, working towards grassing in June.

Learning to Golf

Golfing - It's all about having fun!

So you're on the first tee, and you tee your ball up. Your first swing misses the ball. But you say, "That's okay," and pick your ball up and throw it down the middle of the fairway. You go to your ball and tee it up again. You take your 5 iron since the woods are longer, and you feel better with an iron right now. You take one practice swing and get up and hit the ball.

It gets in the air to the right and goes behind a tree. Okay, now you go and throw your ball out in the fairway. You tee it up again, take your fir iron and one practice swing, then swing and hit the ball.

Boy, this is fun! I can learn and not get frustrated. I can throw it out from a tree. If I miss the ball totally, I get to throw it down the fairway. I get to tee the ball up anywhere I want while playing. Our group moves right along and everyone has more fun. Others may tell me I'm not playing real golf and I just smile and say "that's ok, I'm having fun."

When I can hit the ball consistently, I can stop teeing up anywhere and stop throwing the ball, but I'll be a better player because I have learned etiquette, how to move on the golf course and how to take care of the course. Anyway, what is a score or a handicap? I'm not going to be graded on it!

A quote from Harvey Penick's Little Red Book is very good advice, "No pretty woman can miss a single shot without a man giving her some poor advice. A husband should never try to teach his wife to play golf or drive a car. A wife would never try and teach her husband to play bridge."

The beginner golfer has a lot of fears about not being good enough to play the game of golf. Pick a reason you want to play – for family, exercise, sunshine, and friends. It gets you away from the rat race and outside enjoying the fresh air.

Golf is a family sport. Sometimes members of a family may be going in all different directions. Why not do something together? Get your grandchildren involved; it teaches them so much. If you are a young family all of you can get involved.

I grew up in a golfing family and appreciate what my parents did by including the whole family. Enjoy the company and the time you're together and forget about your bad shots and all of life's worries. Don't live in the past. Just look at the next shot and forget about the bad shots. Life is short - enjoy it.

Do just that when you are playing golf. Don't let everyone you are playing with give you advice. If you're having trouble, ask a golf professional to get the help you need. I've always told my students that if they need help just ask so they won't be totally confused after being told ten different things they're doing wrong by ten very helpful players on the course.

Start with putting two clubs down for your swing path and start with the shortest club you have then work your way up to the longer clubs. On each shot, pretend you are playing. Stand behind the ball, pick a target and take your practice swing while focusing on that target. Take your time in set up and grip correctly then clear your mind and just hit the ball.

Most mistakes happen before you ever hit the ball in your set up and routine. If you are careful in your set up, chances are greater that the ball will get in the way of your swing.

Remember - whatever your hobby or occupation might be, you didn't learn it without first learning the basics. With patience and time and doing it over and over again. So if you want to learn the game of golf, take lessons, practice at the range and play without trying to fix your swing. Advice is great but not while you're playing.

Remember this is a game, have fun be that 12-year-old kid again. Just hit the ball, go find it and hit it again.



Updates

Financial Report:

We have ended 2014 well within our operating and capital budget. Here are some of the highlights of budget variances in 2014: large positive variances in income were sale of water credits (\$184k), transfer fees (\$334k) and golf division (\$220k); we also had significant positive variances in wages, taxes and benefits in the golf and grounds division (\$777k) primarily created by budgeting full benefits for each staff member in maintenance as we had no history to draw from with no previous employees in golf or grounds maintenance; and we actually had a negative variance in repairs and maintenance (\$349k) which was to be expected as we caught up with previous years repair and maintenance projects. If you have attended the annual membership meetings in the past, you have heard me talk about how it works with repairs and maintenance projects in that we keep the money budgeted and therefore dedicated for these projects until the projects are completed or canceled, as we do with operating capital projects as well. This ensures that these needed projects are completed. With all of this being said, I think the most exciting financial news of all is that the Golf Division for the first time since 2000, ended the year in the black! And the success in the golf division led to a big positive variance (\$44k) in gross income in the food service division which also came down to their bottom line. AND all of this was accomplished with the North golf course and snack shop closed! I have to tell you that I am really excited about where we are financially and physically, I don't think there is another 55+ community out there that could compete with us in either category! And we are not done yet, we still have more to do and we will continue to keep our eye on keeping Sun City AZ unique in almost every sense - culturally, environmentally, socially and in value with exceptional recreational and social facilities.

Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments were down again in December and well below the monthly average by 30%. As a result, past due assessments increased in December by 3%. November billings went past due at a rate of 5.5% and October balances went 60 days past due at a rate of 5.7%. The latter 60 day increase was the highest since October last year. For the past three years the 60 day rate for October has spiked well above other months of the year.

Total accounts receivables were relatively unchanged in December despite the lower past due balance payments. In December we saw a 2% decrease in property transfer related balances and a 6% increase in lender owned related invoices. Outstanding balances related to property transfers continue to represent 53% of all receivables due and past due balances.

Overall accounts receivables due at the end of 2014 increased by 1.7% compared to the end of 2013 balances. Past due balances increased by 9.7% over the end of 2013 with the over 90 day balances increasing the most. A significant area of increase has continued to be in the fees related to past due accounts. The increases in these areas over shadow the reduction in other areas. Compared to the end of 2013, the outstanding balances related to property transfers decreased by 19% although the fees related to past due balances increased in 2014.

In 2014 cardholders increased online payments over 2013 by 25% and over 2012 by 7%. Approximately 5% of payments were made online through the web portal in 2014. We hope to see this increase dramatically in 2015. If you do not have a Cardholder login, please make sure to get one as it not only gives you the opportunity to pay your assessments online, it allows you to vote in Board elections if you are eligible, book tee times and get email news alerts specifically chosen to fit your interests.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties increased slightly to 49 properties at the end of December. The number of properties owned by lending institutions decreased in December and is also now at 43 properties.

Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in December totaled \$551,500 which is \$275,500 over the amount budgeted. PIF fees collected in 2014 were \$6,914,376 which is \$2,978,376 over budget for the year. Again a reminder that we intentionally budget PIF income very conservatively to assure that we have the cash on hand for any planned project as we remain debt free.

Bowling:

Courtesy of Columbia 300 (bowling equipment manufacturer) and the Bowling Division offered all RCSC league bowlers a chance to win a new bowling ball. The drawing was held on January 12, 2015 and the winner was Bill Diethart.

Human Resources:

Along with many other changes, the Occupational Safety and Health Act (OSHA) has brought changes to the standard annual requirement to post Form 300A injury and illness summary logs. It has also brought certain changes to the OSHA reporting requirements for major injuries and illnesses going forward. RCSC has been logging and posting the summary of the previous year's injuries in employee work areas from February 1, through April 30 each year.

The revised OSHA rule modifies the types of injuries and illnesses that require reporting to the Agency. The newly revised rule retains the requirement to report workplace related fatalities within eight hours, it also adds the requirement to report individual work-related inpatient hospitalizations, amputations or losses of an eye within 24 hours. Under the new rule, RCSC reported a hospitalization

early in January to the Agency. Previously reporting was only required for three or more employees injured in the same accident.

On another note, H.R. is in the process of working with the 401(k) plan administrator to complete the valuation for the 2014 calendar year in preparation for the annual audit that is required for filing the I.R.S. form 5500.

Project Updates

General Centers Projects and Information

• The electronic sign project continues to progress with all signs now installed. Both Mt. View signs and the Sun Bowl sign are now on-line. Boring work for electrical to signs at Oakmont, Lakeview, Bell and Marinette is underway. The entire project is expected to be completed by late February 2015. Contractors are Bootz and Duke Signs and Accel Electric. (PIF Cost – \$850,775)

Viewpoint Lake / Duffeeland

- Approximately 500 pounds of Rainbow Trout were released into Viewpoint Lake on December 22, 2014. Many happy anglers have stopped me just to share their wonderful trout fishing experience. Eric Swanson, RCSC Viewpoint Lake consultant, is currently rounding up volunteers to hang the "Fingerling Fortress" habitat from homeowner docks. In the meantime, Eric is looking into how the pea gravel spawning beds will be installed since the RCSC row boats will not handle the weight of the gravel. (Dates for this work will be set up once equipment is obtained.) The Thread Fin shad (forage fish) are still delayed but Eric thinks we will get an order of Shad in a couple of months.
- A meeting was held on January 20, 2015 to discuss Duffeeland dog park improvements with officers of the recently chartered Dog Park Club. This meeting was very constructive and resulted in an agreement of RCSC proposed improvements with some minor additions and variations. An early May 2015 construction shutdown of the dog park was agreeable to all club officers.

Bell Center

• Concrete on nine of the ten tennis courts is now poured and under the 30 day cure clock prior to the epoxy coating application. The 10th court to the South will be the last concrete court poured as the contractor continues to work his way out of the construction area. The first 20' colored walkway, between the North courts, is poured and the South 20' colored concrete walk is being formed for concrete. Mini golf hole #4 will be re-carpeted as soon as the carpet material arrives from the mill. The tennis project includes demolition of the current (8) tennis courts and the installation of (10) new tennis courts. The new updated complex will also include a



shaded gathering area, courtside canopies, water and electric to each court, tables and benches for spectators and planters in the common areas. Contractors include Lloyd Sports Engineering as architect and project manager and Sunland Sports as the building contractor. (PIF Cost – \$1,778,074)

• A new Darts area will be constructed soon just outside the billiards room at Bell lanes. The new designated area will host five new Arachnid Galaxy III dart machines. The machines use plastic tipped darts which will be available to cardholders at the bowling desk. Cardholders may also use their own plastic tipped darts but no metal tipped darts will be allowed in this game area. (Cost – \$35,000)



Marinette Center

• Concrete is completely poured for the track, single ply roofing is being applied on the pavilion, pavilion fencing is being installed, the spa steel fence is installed, concrete walks are being formed and poured, fitness carpet is being installed, ladder to the roof of pavilion is installed, lobby furniture is ordered, mansard roofs on existing buildings will be re-tiled the week of February 9 and cardio / strength equipment to be set in fitness center January 27, 2015. One problem we are having is getting APS to set the new electrical transformer. Another concern is getting the concrete slabs, which are shaded by the pavilion, above 55 degrees on a day to day basis so the colored concrete coating can be applied. The Marinette Center expansion and renovation project includes a 4,000 s.f. fitness center, rubberized outdoor walking track, a total of 20 Pickleball courts, an outdoor spa, a thermal solar system for pool water pre-heating, tankless water heaters for the showers, new doors and windows and exterior stucco of all remaining buildings. Contractors include: CCBG Architectural, Robert Porter Construction and Aquatic Builders. (PIF Cost – \$4,709,422)

Fairway Center

• Since I have had several cardholders request a small ramp in the fire lane just west of the bike racks I have cleared this with the Sun City Fire marshal and approved this installation. Construction of the new ramp will commence soon. Contractor is Ken McIntyre Construction. (Cost -\$3,048)

Mountain View Center

• Due to safety concerns, the concrete entry and a portion of the sidewalks leading into the breezeway and Facility Attendants station has been demolished and is currently being replaced with new walkways. Contractor is Ken McIntyre Construction. (Cost – \$13,505)

Riverview Pro Shop Building

• While the Riverview golf course is shutdown for renovations, the pro shop / snack shop building will also see renovations of its own. Improvements include new covered patios off the East and South sides of the existing building, a fire sprinkler system, parapet wall, roofing work and some interior renovations. Contractors include Ken McIntyre Construction, Accel Electric and CCBG Architectural. (Cost – \$524,236)

Willowcreek / Willowbrook Pro Shop Building

• The four outside entrance areas leading into the pro shop and snack shop are in need of some new flooring material. After looking for a suitable exterior product, I believe the RCSC has finally located one. The installation of this material will commence as soon as we receive the product from the manufacturer. Contractor is Baker Brother Carpeting. (Cost – \$3,207)

Skilled Trades Department

• The RCSC Skilled Trades department completed 177 work orders during the last two weeks of December 2014 and the first two weeks of January 2015. In 2014 the RCSC skilled Trades department completed a total of 1595 work orders plus routine maintenance and repair work by the fitness technician and pool mechanic, which was not a part of the work order system. Congratulations Skilled Trades for a very productive 2014!



Centers Operations

• Due to frequent relocations of chairs for large Sundial events the RCSC has purchased an additional 206 chairs for Sundial auditorium.


If you are a traveler, it is fun to explore the places you have been from a different perspective, and if you haven't traveled, it is a way to see places you have only heard about.

Artistic Stained Glass

Top Ten Stained Glass Facts:

- 10. The earliest known glass artifacts are Egyptian and date back to 1350 BC, but the Romans were the first to produce transparent glass, it enabled them to admire the color of their wine.
- 9. For almost 500 years, from the end of the 14th century until the 19th, no glass was made in China. Now it is the world's largest producer, controlling 34 per cent of the global market.
- 8. The Venetian island of Murano is still the center of Venice's glass making industry. The glass furnaces of Venice were moved to the island in 1291, to reduce the risk of setting fire to the city. Here, inspired by migrant Islamic craftsmen, Venetians learnt to make the finest glass in the world, giving them a monopoly that has lasted for centuries.
- 7. In America, the stained glass movement began with William Jay Bolton, who made his first window for a church in New York in 1843. No other American practiced the art professionally until Louis Comfort Tiffany and John La Farge began working with stained glass near the end of the 19th century.
- 6. The technology for making glass dates back at least 5,000 years, and some form of stained glass was used in European Christian churches by the third or fourth century A.D.
- 5. In 1887, Kokomo Opalescent Glass Company began production in Kokomo Indiana. In 1889 they won a gold medal at the Paris World Exposition for their multi-colored window glass.
- 4. The largest stained-glass window in the world is at Kennedy International Airport in New York. It can be seen on the American Airlines terminal building and measures 300 feet long by 23 feet high.
- 3. The recipe for producing colored glass involves the addition of a metal to the glass. This is accomplished by adding powdered oxide, sulfide or other compound to the glass while it is molten.
- 2. Perhaps the best example of 'colored glass' is "cobalt blue" which is produced by adding cobalt oxide to the glass melt. "Ruby" and "cranberry glass" are produced by the addition of gold and "Egyptian blue" is produced by the addition of copper.





Swedish massage is based on concepts of anatomy and physiology, as opposed to energy work on "meridians" as in Asian massage systems. Most people get a 30-60 minute Swedish massage, but 90-120 minutes gives the therapist more time to work the muscle tissue and achieve optimum results.

Before the massage, the therapist will ask you about any injuries or conditions that he or she should know about. Things you want to tell a therapist include areas of pain, discomfort, allergies, joint replacements, surgeries, and medications you are currently taking. If you are ill, wait until you feel better before getting a massage.


A Swedish massage can be slow and gentle, or more vigorous, depending on the therapist's personal style and your preference. You can also tell them up front if you prefer light or firm pressure. During a Swedish massage you undress to your comfort level and you lie on a massage table. There is a drape or sheet covering your entire body. The therapist uncovers only the part of the body he/she is working on. This is called Draping and Arizona is very strict with Draping Rules. The therapist will incorporate various massage techniques that include effleurage, kneading, friction, stretching and tapping. Therapists will check in with you periodically concerning your comfort level and it is important to let the Therapist know if you feel uncomfortable at any time. Everyone wants you to have a beneficial and rewarding session.

The Mayo Clinic notes that massage therapy can be used to help manage pain. Swedish massage sessions can target specific areas of pain especially the knee, neck and shoulder. It can be used to manage the chronic pain that accompanies conditions like arthritis and fibromyalgia and can help make many painful conditions more bearable. It also helps to improve circulation; it facilitates the flow of essential nutrients and oxygen to your body. Massage has been shown to reduce depression by activating the relaxation response and by improving sleep patterns.
