Golf Report

Pro Shops

Despite fewer total rounds played vs. prior year, total revenue for December exceeded budget and exceeded prior year. All of the major categories (Green Fee/Cart Fee, Merchandise and Driving Range) exceeded budget.

On February 11, Lakes East/Lakes West will be hosting the 8th annual Teal Ribbon Tournament. The event is open to ladies and men and no handicap is required. It is a 9 hole event with a 9:30 shotgun start and lunch follows play at Sundial. Proceeds benefit the University of Arizona Cancer Center for Ovarian Cancer research. Entry forms are available at each clubhouse and may be turned in to the starters at any golf course.

On March 10, the 2nd Annual Can/Am tournament will be held at Lakes West. The format will be a two person best ball, with one American team and one Canadian couple. The cup will be awarded to the team with the most winning couples. Last year the American team narrowly edged the Canadians. In addition to the cup, prizes will be awarded equally between the American and Canadian teams, as well as prizes for longest drive and closest to the pin. A Pebble Beach vacation will be awarded for a hole in one on hole number seven.

Snack Shops

Total revenue for the snack shops exceeded budget by \$2,800, capping off a great year. We thank everyone for their support of the snack shops.

Golf Courses

The preliminary aerification/over-seed schedule has been distributed to each course's Green Committee and will be finalized in February. Once finalized, the schedule will be posted to the RCSC website. We will continue our practice of a single, more aggressive aerification. This year will be extending the number of days closed to allow time for fairway verticutting. There will be periods of two courses being closed at the same time. Fairway verticutting is a slow process that is difficult to accomplish during play. Taking the time to verticut will remove excessive thatch and increase the chances of a good over-seed. All courses will over-seed greens, tees and fairways this year.

Quail Run is currently in the process of removing invasive weeds in the sanctuary area around hole five. The branch interfering with play from the gold tee on hole #7 was trimmed by B&C Tree Service. Sprinklers are being edged and leveled as needed.

Riverview continues to play hard and fast, particularly around greens and tees. Green speeds remain extremely fast, as a reminder the greens at Riverview were not over-seeded, to protect them long term. Prepping a green for over-seed places tremendous stress on the Bermuda grass. As temperatures rise and the grass emerges from dormancy, green speed will slow down and playability will be increased. There are areas of settling around the course near irrigation lines. This is normal and expected and will be corrected by the

contractor at no additional cost when the Bermuda grass is actively growing again.

### Lawn Bowl/Grounds

All centers are having turf mowed and trees trimmed on a regular basis. The Bell center has received some new plantings, in the form of an Elm tree, some Roebelenii palms, some shrubs and some daisies. The new plantings take the place of the Carob tree that was removed.

Lawn Bowl greens are still in the period of minimal maintenance and will remain so until the Bermuda emerges from dormancy. We have been working with Southwest Turf support to review our agronomic program. The goal of the review is to ensure we provide a surface that can hold up to winter play.

During the Bell Recreation Center Fun Fair and Open House, the Bell lawn bowling greens will be open to cardholders looking to try lawn bowling. Members of Bell lawn bowling will be available to assist you. The Fair will be held from 9:00am to 3:00pm, on February 27. Please join us to roll some bowls and enjoy some popcorn.

A Moment with President Schroeder -  
RCSC Water Conservation Efforts Continue on Course(s)

Water is a very precious commodity here in the desert. Residents in Sun City AZ are reminded of the need to conserve water every month when the SunViews brings you information, tips and quizzes about how to limit waste when it comes to turning on (and off) the faucet, sprinkler and shower.

Saving water is about more than just you and me doing our part. It is about our community working together to find ways help save every drop we possibly can.

Recent renovations at RCSC Sun City AZ golf courses have included major improvements to the irrigation systems at Lakes West, North and Riverview.

And along with these course renovations and improvements we're looking at ways to further reduce RCSC water consumption on the golf courses through turf reduction.

Working with golf course architect Gary Brawley and landscape architects In2It Studios, RCSC remains committed to doing our part and planning is crucial to successful turf reduction. Currently, plans to convert 10 additional acres from turf to landscaping on the Lakes East course are being finalized.

This project calls for colorful replacement vegetation such as low-growing, desert plantings that will beautify and enhance views from neighboring properties and will be much more appealing from high visibility areas. This work will not only save water but also help to reduce related landscape maintenance costs in the long run.

Renovations are also being planned for the Willow courses in 2017 proposing the phased removal of over 75 total acres of turf which will also include enhanced landscaping, using the same color palette as Lakes East.

How much water will we save with turf reduction? Literally millions and millions of gallons annually. Truly more than 100 million gallons each year! The proposed plans for Willow

alone would sustain the annual water needs of over 2,300 individuals.

But that's not all the RCSC is doing to help with this cause.

Recently, RCSC Assistant General Manager Jim Wellman referred to 2016 as the "year of the restroom renovation." Work is being scheduled that will include restroom and/or shower renovations at golf courses, Sundial Center, Marinette Auditorium building, Bell Center near the clubs and inside the bowling center, and also in the Sun City Library at Bell.

And with all of these restroom renovations will come water savings. We will be installing metered lavatory and shower faucets in these facilities which will help to curb waste by shutting off automatically. In addition, low water volume toilets and urinals will be used in these renovations. Studies vary depending upon the maximum flow rate (measured in gallons per minute) but estimates of water savings have been as high as 45 percent. There are over 30 golf course faucets alone being replaced which equate to a lot of water savings.

To compare this on a personal level, replacing your own home bathroom sink with a low flow faucet would amount to approximately 570 gallons per year of water savings.

Cardholders are also encouraged to complete Comment Cards should they notice water waste on RCSC properties. Notice a leaky faucet or a toilet with troubles, let us know so that we can get it repaired as soon as possible.

And saving water not only means saving money, it means saving a precious resource for future generations.

Management Updates

Financial Report:

We have completed year-end well within our operating and capital budget for 2015. We have six financial divisions within our operation: Building & Infrastructure, Member Services, Bowling, Golf, Food Service and General & Administrative. The Building & Infrastructure division includes all of RCSC’s buildings and infrastructure regardless of what they support; such as, repairs and maintenance of the recreation centers and facilities, grounds maintenance and repairs, golf pro shop & maintenance buildings, bowling center buildings, parking lots, and the dog park. The Member Services division includes the administration of the clubs, all of RCSC’s events and entertainment, communication including the newsletter and websites, the Sun City Visitor’s Center operation and marketing of Sun City AZ. The Bowling division includes the bowling operations at both Lakeview and Bell. The Golf division includes all the golf operations including golf course maintenance for RCSC’s eight golf courses. The Food Service division includes the snack shops at the regulation golf courses and the two leased restaurants at the bowling centers. The General & Administrative Division, commonly referred to as G&A, includes the corporate and board offices, cardholder services, accounting, human resources, purchasing & warehouse and information technology. Every one of these divisions operated better than budget and ended 2015 with an overall positive variance from budget of \$1,304,971. So what happens to this positive variance from budget? Part of it is carried forward to complete the repairs and maintenance projects budgeted but not completed as of year end. Part of it, \$748,098, has been used to balance the 2016 budget, therefore reducing the amount assessed to Sun City property owners. The amount remaining after that will be used to balance future year’s budgets or complete an unbudgeted project that needs immediate attention.

For the second year in a row, the golf division has operated with a net profit before depreciation. That means our golf division has operated in the black! Interestingly, both years we have had one of our regulation golf courses closed for renovation. As most of you know, the golf courses were deeded to the Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. with the restriction that they must remain golf courses.

Bowling:

The annual New Year’s Eve party was held at Lakeview Lanes and over 160 bowlers attended. Prizes, drawings and champagne were provided to all of the party goers to ring in the New Year. As always John Kaus and the Sun City Bowling Association did an outstanding job organizing and sponsoring the event.

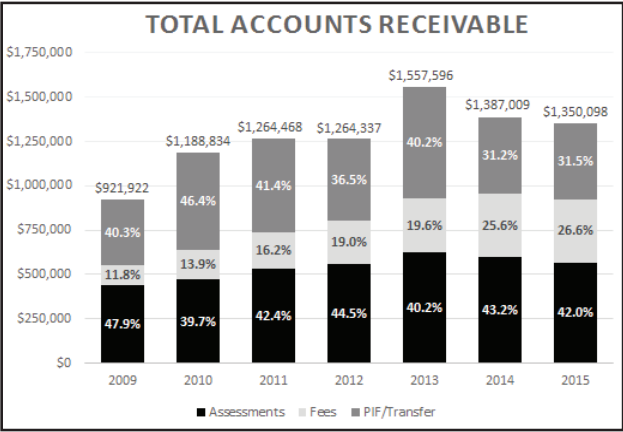
The Bowling Department had an exceptional year in 2015, open play & tournament income was \$21,000 better than the previous year and league play income was \$26,000 better than the previous year.

The Metro Phoenix USBC Senior Tournament was held at Bell Lanes and Lakeview Lanes. Forty-seven teams participated (188 bowlers) in the tournament on the weekend of January 16, 2016. The tournament produced approximately \$4,000 in unbudgeted income.

Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments jumped in December to their highest level in 2015 and as a result overall past due assessments decreased in December by almost 5%. Over 90 Days past due balances changed the most and are at their lowest level in 2½ years. The Over 30 Day past due rate for November balances lessened to under the average for 2015 while the Over 60 Day rate was up showing a continuing from last month. Payments from our third party collections firm for 2015 totaled \$93,528.

The chart following shows the total accounts receivable balance for end of the year for the past five years. The total is categorized by Assessments, Fees (Late/Interest/Lien) and PIF/Transfer with the relative percentage for each category at each year end.



In December property transfer related balances decreased by 3%, offsetting last month’s increase, and are just 1% below the 2014 end of year balances. Lender owned related balances decreased again by almost 5% and are 25% below the 2014 end of year balances

The balance flow for these two categories continues to be dynamic over time as does the number of properties. Outstanding balances related to property transfers continues to represent approximately 53% of all receivables due and past due balances.

Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal in December totaled \$53,907. Payments through the web portal in 2015 were \$712,071 and continue to represent 3.6% of total accounts receivable payments.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties decreased to 43 properties at the end of December. The number of properties owned by lending institutions decreased slightly this month to 39 properties.

Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in December were \$649,313, which is \$373,013 over the amount budgeted. Year to date PIF fees are \$6,817,766 which is \$2,878,766, or 73%, over budget for the year. Again a reminder that we intentionally budget PIF income very conservatively to assure that we have the cash on hand for any planned project as we remain debt free.

Human Resources:

In December of last year, the Internal Revenue Service

Project Updates

General Information

- Twenty-two (22) Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) have been purchased and are being prepared for installation at all Recreation Centers, the Sun Bowl Amphitheater/Ballpark and at all Golf Pro Shops. Installation of the AEDs will commence the week of February 1, 2016. In addition, voluntary training is being offered by Sun City Fire and Medical on Monday, February 8, 2016 from 9-10am at Sundial East Hall and Tuesday, February 9, 2016 from 2-3pm at Mt. View Auditorium. Each session is identical and will cover chest compressions and use of the AED equipment. While these classes are filling up fast there is still space available by contacting Linda Menna at lmenna@suncityaz.org or for those who do not have a computer 623-561-4614.
- On site evaluations of fifteen men & women’s golf (on-course) restroom locations were completed on January 15, 2016. While most of the buildings were in good repair the RCSC will need to replace some doors & jambs, fascia boards, toilets, skylights and perform other maintenance such as painting. In addition, all lavatory faucets will be replaced with push button, metered type units to conserve water and all roofs will be repaired and recoated. The complete project is being prepared for contractor bids at this time.
- The RCSC is also preparing to remodel several men & women’s restrooms at the following locations: Bell Club Area, Bell Library (East), Bell Lanes (East), Lakeview (upstairs), Lakeview Lanes (East) and Marinette by the Social Hall. The remodels will include ADA accommodations and each must be scheduled during the year when usage is down. Additional information about these restroom remodels will be included in future reports.

Oakmont Center

- Contractor bids for the Oakmont exterior remodel project have been received and will be submitted to the RCSC bid commission for final approval very soon. The project includes exterior stucco of all remaining buildings, rework of soffits and fascia boards, some new windows and doors, some sidewalk replacements, remodel of the two restrooms by the auditorium and patio repairs. Commencement of work is planned for March 7, 2016 after the Clubs’ Fun Fair is completed.

Fairway Center

- Materials have been ordered and a contractor hired to repair the tile in front of the pool showers. The mats currently being used to prevent slippage will be removed once the tile work is completed. Contractor is Resource Flooring. (Approximate Cost – \$2,800)

Viewpoint Lake

- The large crack in the Viewpoint Lake wall has now been evaluated by a Structural Engineer. His final conclusions and repair requirements have been received and a repair contractor is being hired to repair the crack which has closed somewhat now that the lake is at normal operating level. (Estimated Cost for Engineer and repairs – \$4,000)
- Due to shortages of Rainbow Trout this year, and the high cost of bringing trout in from Colorado, the RCSC will not be stocking rainbow trout in 2016. The RCSC will again look into stocking trout in Viewpoint Lake for the December 2016/Spring 2017 season.

Lakes West

- Replacement of a 15” septic leach field pipe, which serves the on-course restrooms by the 13th green at Lakes West will commence once we coordinate with Brian Duthu. Due to existing underground utilities and irrigation systems, the work must be completed by hand instead of a backhoe. Contractor is Sunland Plumbing. (Cost – \$5,500)

Bell Center

- The wood support structure from which the Liberty Bell hangs is deteriorating, therefore plans are underway to support the bell while the support structure is removed. Once the new support structure is fabricated the 2,080 pound bell will be reinstalled. Contractors are Starling-Madison-Loftquist structural engineer,

Ken McIntyre Construction and the Skilled Trades Department. (Estimated Cost – \$4,700)

Skilled Trades Department

- The RCSC Skilled Trades department completed 177 work orders during the last two weeks of December 2015 and the first two weeks of January 2016. The Skilled Trades team completed a whopping 2,003 work orders in 2015 compared to 1,595 work orders the previous year. This is in addition to all the work done without a work order such as fitness equipment and swimming pool/spa maintenance work. Way to go Skilled Trades!

Centers Operations

- New tables and chairs have been added around the pool at Lakeview Center.
- There have been many successful events held at each center during January. A pickleball tournament at Marinette, numerous social events in the Bell social halls, concerts and the Discover Sun City AZ event at Sundial, a quilt show at Lakeview, several club activities at Oakmont, the SCHOA Annual Meeting at Fairway and the Player’s Club production at Mountain View.
- Congratulations to John Collins who recently celebrated his 10 year anniversary with the RCSC. He currently works at the Bell Recreation Center. John performs his job with much enthusiasm and attention to detail.
- We would like to recognize Penny Kovac at the Oakmont Recreation center for her outstanding service to our cardholders. Whenever you see Penny she is always busy doing something to keep the center clean and make visitors welcome. She has worked at Oakmont and the North Golf Course Snack shop for over 8 years. The next time you see her say Hi...if you can catch her!

issued the 2016 optional standard mileage rates used to calculate the deductible costs of operating an automobile for business purposes. The standard mileage rate for business is based on an annual study of the fixed and variable costs of operating an automobile. The recent change is attributed to falling gasoline prices. Beginning on January 1, 2016, the standard mileage rates for the use of a car (also vans, pickups or panel trucks) is 54 cents per mile for business miles driven, down from 57.5 cents in 2015. Accordingly, RCSC has lowered its reimbursement rate to the IRS allowable 54 cents per mile.

Most RCSC’s employee benefit plans renew on a calendar year basis. Therefore, January is a month for closures, changes and renewals in the H.R. department. We have been processing enrollment changes, balancing employee benefit accounts, providing census reports for plan testing and providing other reports for the new plan year.

Member Services:

The opportunity to purchase assigned seats for both season tickets and individual shows for the Sundial concert series has been a huge success. Assigned seating has been very well received and it has eliminated the long two hour or more wait lines for doors to open.

We will be hosting the 4th annual Dancing with the Sun City Stars on Friday, February 26 at Sundial Auditorium at 7pm. This is a free event, so remember to bring your photo RCSC membership card to gain access. Key fobs will not be accepted.

In January the Clubs Office held its first New Club Officer Training at Fairway. It was extremely well-attended and we appreciate the Club Officers participation!

### Water Conservation

## More Water Facts: Did you know...

It takes approximately 70 gallons of water to fill a bathtub?

You can save 15 gallons of water during a 10-minute shower by using low-flow shower-head?

That it was 1994 when low-flow showerheads, faucets and toilets made a "splash" on the water-conservation scene in homes and businesses due to a federal mandate?

Nearly 22% of indoor home water use is from doing laundry? (Be sure to adjust settings appropriately for load sizes!)

Older, less efficient top-loading washing machines uses nearly 40 gallons per load?

That a front-loading uses just over 20 gallons per load and is more energy- and water-efficient?

That dishwashing is a relatively small part of your water footprint; usually less than 2% of indoor water use? Standard dishwashers use only about 6 gallons of water to run a full cycle and Energy Star dishwashers use only about 4 gallons of water per completed wash.

That using a dishwasher is more efficient than washing your dishes by hand - especially if you run full loads?

That hand-washing your dishes can use upwards of 20 gallons of water? (Sink of soapy water, wash, rinse, repeat. If you must hand wash be sure to fill one sink with soap and one with clear rinsing water!)

Most importantly, do you know how important you are in the grand scheme of water conservation? Our children, grandchildren and those on down the line are depending on us to conserve our natural resources, especially our water. Remember, every drop counts!

## FREE RCA Golf Cart Seat Belt Installation Event

Tips for Seniors from Daily Fitness -  
Optimize Aerobic Capacity

Karen Hyde uses an “interval approach” with her Recumbent Bike workout, at the Bell Fitness Center. She learned this technique from Daily Fitness trainer, Jane Fortier.

“Aerobic exercise is just one part of a good exercise program for an active aging adult, but a very important part”, states Fortier. “It’s the key to improving one’s Aerobic Capacity. “Exercising aerobically, in the Cardio Heartrate Zone, improves cardio/pulmonary fitness,” Fortier explains. “The body’s elevated need for oxygen triggers higher breathing rates and an increased heart rate. The body is forced to develop a greater ability to utilize the increased oxygen output. Utilizing oxygen is the job of aerobic enzymes. As the demand for more oxygen increases, the demand for more aerobic enzymes increases. Consistently sending the message for more oxygen, ultimately strengthens the heart and lungs. Aerobic exercise increases cardiovascular efficiency, which in turn increases total metabolism and calorie burn.”
