Updates

We ended August 2012 well within our operating and capital budget year-to-date. All divisions have met their net operating budget prior to depreciation year-to-date except food service, which is solely due to the costs incurred in the required replacement of equipment and the remodeling of the café at the Lakeview Lanes. The coffee counter has been re-installed as was highly requested by Sun City residents. We are very please that we got the restaurant open and operating on October 1, 2012.

Repairs and maintenance are considerably under budget which is strictly a timing issue as R&M projects will be completed throughout the remainder of 2012, and most likely into 2013, which will eliminate the current \$600k positive variance year-to-date.

Payments made by property owners in outside collections totaled \$11,209 in August with payments from 18 property owners. Larger payments from several past due property owners were collected this month. During the month our internal collector processed payments from past due property owners totaling \$28,310 and property related transfer fees totaling \$84,882. Both of these were lower this month as anticipated due to scheduled time off of our internal collector although staff in the Cardholder Services Office assisted during this time.

Property trustee sale notices on Sun City properties ticked up slightly to 97 at the end of August as did the number of bank owned properties to 76 owned by lenders.

Woods & Dwyer, auditors for the RCSC Employee 401(k) Plan, recently completed an audit of the Plan for the 2011 calendar year. Financial statements and supplemental schedules were audited. The audit found RCSC to be in compliance.

Although both health and dental benefits are renewing on October 1, 2012, RCSC's health carrier, Aetna, has returned a very unfavorable renewal rate of a 20% increase. RCSC has been seeking an opportunity to change the renewal date to January 1, a date consistent with the fiscal year and the deductible year. Additionally, RCSC was notified that the highly desired Aetna plan where co-pays have counted towards annual deductibles will no longer be available after this renewal. Therefore, RCSC is in the negotiating process for new health and dental benefits as of January 2013.

A Moment with President Coleman: Perception

Thirty years ago, when I was selected to command a brigade, I met with my new boss, a Major General, who gave me my charge as the Division Artillery Commander. "An organization mirrors its leadership" he stated, which had a significant impact on me and something I will never forget. That was true then and is true now. The perception of what and who you are is just as important as the facts. The perception of what the conditions are, what the environment is, what the relationships are between individuals and leadership is very important.

In 2001 I purchased a condo in Sun City after having visited twice in 2000. My first visit was in the spring of the year, the temperatures were ideal. I had quarters at Luke Air Force Base and visited Sun City West, Westbrook, Mesa, Chandler and Sun City. After visiting those developments, I decided to live in Sun City. My perception of Sun City was that it was a safe, clean and friendly community where residents cared for each other.

In July I met two golfers at the Lakes West snack shop who invited me to play golf the following afternoon at 1pm. I thought they were crazy to play golf in the heat of the day in over a hundred degrees. Then I saw a group of senior cyclist riding by so I decided that if they could ride a bike in this heat, I could certainly play golf. And when I showed up with a rental cart the next

day, one of the golfers suggested I return it and ride with him. In one of the other communities, the seller accused me of damaging her screen door. In another, I spoke to people as I was viewing properties without any response and it was like I wasn't even there. At one community, golf membership was thousands of dollars to join with an annual fee, plus thirty dollars per round. No perception here; this is factual; and definitely not my kind of place.

I wanted to move to a warmer climate where I could have a cup of coffee in the mornings and read the paper in short sleeve shirts (I hadn't thought of short pants) and listen to the birds sing. Sun City was that place! Was Sun City the place I perceived it to be?

My perception of Sun City was that it was a clean, safe, quiet city where the rat race was over. People were no longer fighting to get ahead, putting the job ahead of friendship, and, in some cases, family. I perceived that most of the people were physically active.

After moving to Sun City, I found most of the amenities, attitudes and values that I perceived to be present. Sun City was my reality; quiet, clean, safe and occupied by wonderful happy and friendly people. After ten years, I realize that it is the people that live, play and work here that make Sun City great!

Why do we need to market Sun City?

Great question and one l've asked many times; let's face it, Sun City sells itself.

That said, there's a dozen answers and all of them make perfect sense to anyone interested in Sun City's future.

We know in our first 18 years (1960-1978) the community was marketed as heavily as any, since the day it opened. What most people don't know is the first 5 years "marketing" was more about advertising while the next 13 years the ads became less significant and John Meeker's goal was more about branding and positioning the community in a sustainable way.

That's a significant difference in both style and approach and one that is important as the RCSC moves forward with a marketing plan. We're not talking about spending a fortune on ads. We're looking at taking a page from Sun City's most explosive growth period and following in its footsteps.

John Meeker saved Sun City, a story we will tell in coming issues. For now, suffice it to say, his genius focused on 3 or 4 dynamic changes within the makeup of the community. Upon his arrival in 1965, he spent countless hours talking to residents. He used the clubs as a backdrop for the changes and those living here told him what they would like to see.

What he found was encouraging; people loved Sun City and he understood he could turn that love affair into one of the strongest marketing efforts available. By building brand loyalty, helping to grow the clubs, and providing internal promotional materials to residents, he understood his reach across the United States was unlimited.

All of this brought forth something that was even more important: He built a sense of community that culminated in 2000 homes being sold a year (1968-1978). To this day, numbers most developers would love to achieve. More importantly, that is still the game plan new developments try and create... a sense of community, of belonging.

The beauty of what we are talking about is that Sun City still has many of those same qualities. After 52 years, much of what Meeker created is lingering just below the surface; just waiting to be nurtured. In the past year, we have talked about how we tap into them and use them yet again.

Within a matter of months, a marketing/branding/positioning of Sun City will come to light. We are carefully putting pieces in place that will be exciting, revealing, and encourag-

Project Updates

General Centers Projects Information

Solar projects, which include thermal (Water heating) and PV (Electricity producing) are still going through the plan review (Permitting) process with Maricopa County Planning and Development Department. A leadership meeting was held with Maricopa County Planning and Development Department on September 12, 2012 to come up with a plan on how to get these Solar permits approved. Contractors include Wilson Electric for the photovoltaic solar and Priceless Plumbing for thermal solar.

Security fencing and gates are being installed around one pump station at the following golf course locations; Riverview, Willowbrook and Lakes West. Contractor is Sav-on-Fence. (Cost - \$14,300)

Mt. View Center

The Mt. View pool lighting project is in the planning stage. The contractor is currently preparing project plans for submittal to Maricopa County for the construction permit. (Sorry, last month's report stated that submittal for permit had been made but that was incorrect.) The project includes induction type lighting around the swimming pool and two pole lights in the mini golf area. Contractor is Accel Electric. (Cost - \$40,000)

South Maint. / Quail Run / Sunbowl

The building drawings for the new South Golf Maintenance building should be finished this week and submitted for permit the week of October 1, 2012. The drawings will also be sent out for contractor bids prior to review and approval by the RCSC bid commission. Contractors to date include Bunger Steel, Inc and CCBG Architectural.

Re-carpeting of the Quail Run pro shop will occur while the course is closed for 2012 over-seeding in late October. Contractor is Puckett's Flooring. (Cost – \$4,432)

The permit from Maricopa County Planning and Development has been

received for the replacement of the irrigation systems and turf at the Sunbowl ballpark and park (water retention) area south of the ballfield. The project was sent out to four contractors for bid but two backed out stating that they were too busy and the other two continue to delay their response. Since it is too late to plant (spring) Bermuda grass this project will resume in April/May of 2013. In the meantime, we will continue to seek the necessary project bids and forward the entire project to the RCSC bid commission for final approval. Current contractors assigned to this project include CCBG Architectural, Marvin Mills Irrigation Consulting and Broderick Engineer-

North Golf Course

The defective septic system leach field at the North golf maintenance facility has been replaced. The work included removal of a small amount of asphalt and gravel from the parking area, replacement of the leach lines, replacement and compaction of gravel and fill dirt and a final asphalt patch. Contractors were American Septic and Pinnacle Paving. (Cost – Permit & Septic Work \$5,110)

Lakeview Center, Lakeview Lanes & JiMichael's Café

The Lakeview lawn bowl greens will receive replacement metal halide light fixtures on top of the existing light poles as soon as the permit is received from Maricopa County Planning and Development Department. In addition, two electrical panels must be replaced and some new electrical cabling done in order to complete this project. The new light fixtures will supply additional light while keeping energy costs down. Contractor is Wilson Electric. (Cost – \$55,880)

Inside areas of Lakeview lanes are being repainted by the RCSC Skill Trades department. (Cost-paint and supplies \$600)

The Lakeview café is being cleaned and repaired in preparation for JiMichael's to assume operations. During this process

the commercial restaurant equipment is also being cleaned, serviced and replaced as necessary. Cleaning work is being done by ServPro of Arizona, the upholstery work by Desert Flower Upholstery and all painting, carpentry and minor electrical repairs by the RCSC skilled trades department. The café reopened on October 1, 2012.

Bell Center

Architectural drawings for the Bell Wood and Metal shop expansion project are completed. Project plans were submitted to Maricopa County Planning and Development for permit on September 20, 2012. The building plans will also be sent out to construction companies for competitive bids. After all bids are received the project will be forwarded to the RCSC bid commission for final approval. Planning and pre-permit work is completed for repairs to the Bell Lawn

Bowling irrigation system and lawn bowl green backboards. The RCSC submitted drawings to Maricopa County Planning and Development Department, for an irrigation pump electrical permit, on July 24, 2012 but the permit was not issued until September 12, 2012. Due to permit delays, etc the project will now commence in April/May of 2013 since the Lawn Bowling season is rapidly approaching. In the meantime, the project will be sent out for construction bids. Once all bids are received, the entire project will be submitted to the RCSC bid commission for approval.

The Plumbing lines at La Petite Café' required line jetting due to the plumbing system's age and build-up of debris. Contractor was Sunland Plumbing. (Approximate Cost - \$900)

Sundial Center / Riverview Pro

The new back-stage and main-stage curtains for the Sundial auditorium are now installed. The automatic opener unit is still being outfitted with a remote switch and safety guard. In the meantime the new curtains can be operated manu-



ally. S&K Theatrical manufactured and installed the draperies. (Cost - \$21,92)

Two replacement signs have been ordered for the Riverview golf course. One will be placed on the pro shop building and the other by the #10 tee box. The signs are being constructed at the present time and the permit has been obtained from Maricopa County Planning and Development. Contractor is Apollo Signs. (Cost - \$13,898)

Restroom repairs at Riverview Pro Shop were completed, and the restrooms reopened, on Wednesday, September 19, 2012. The repairs included the replacement of existing lighting, toilet partitions, toilet fixtures, porcelain tile and a complete repainting of the facilities. Contractor was Sunland Plumbing. (Cost-\$46,800)

Roof coating work began the week of September 24th at Sundial. The work includes the two lower auditorium roofs and a section of roof on the West side of the clubs building. Contractor is Reliable Roofing. (Cost - \$ 41,000)

Skilled Trades Department

The Skilled Trades department completed 75 work orders during the month of August/September 2012. While total work orders completed this reporting period seem low, the Skilled Trades Department has also played a significant role in interior repainting of Lakeview Lanes and the renovation of JiMichael's Café at Lakeview.

Three Members are running for seats on the RCSC Board of Directors, James Brasher, Ron Jesse and David Wieland. There are three vacancies on the Board. Even though there are only three candidates, RCSC Members are highly encouraged to cast a ballot because, according to the RCSC Corporate Bylaws (Article IV, Section 5), each candidate must receive a minimum of 100 votes to be eligible to

fill a vacancy. So long as these candidates receive at least 100 votes each, they will each serve a three-year term.

The election will be held on December 11, 2012 from 8:00 am until 7:00 pm. Voting locations will be available at Fairway Center - Arizona Room #3, Lakeview Center - Social Hall #2, and Bell Center - Multi-Purpose Building.

Golf Report

Golf Courses

Overseeding of the courses began October 1; three applications of a pre-emergent for Poa Annua control have been applied as well as a growth regulator to slow bermuda. About a week prior to overseeding water will be turned off and mowing of overseeded areas will stop. Both of these steps are necessary to assist in the scalping of the areas to be overseed. Overseeded areas will receive an application of a starter fertilizer to assist in germination.

The grass being used this year was chosen from an experiment performed on hole #17 of Lakes West last year. The grass proved to be resistant to golf cart wear and tear. The seed germinated and grew very quickly and also died very quickly during transition. It is hoped that the faster germination will reduce the length of cart path restrictions following overseeding.

The steps necessary to develop a master plan for North are well underway. To date Survey Innovation Group has completed an aerial survey, Erickson Meeks Engineering has assisted in identifying areas that will need permitting with Maricopa County and Native Resources has cataloged (by GPS) 797 trees and fauna throughout the golf course. Our architect, Gary Brawley, will meet with the North Green Committee at their next regularly scheduled meeting on October 5. Feedback gathered at this meeting will be used in the development of the master plan.

Pro Shops

Daily green fee and cart revenue exceeded prior year by \$703; merchandise sales were \$1,014 behind prior year, and driving range revenue exceed prior year by \$341. The positive total revenue figures for the month, compared to prior, was a welcome change to the performance in June and July.

On December 7, we will be hosting a fundraising tournament to raise money for our chosen Winter Celebration Charity, the Sun City Prides. The format will be Beat the Pro(s), which will be Brian Duthu (PGA) and Chris Linam (PGA Apprentice) and will be made up of two person teams. Teams that beat the Best Ball score of the Pros will equally share the prize pool. The entry fee will be \$40 and the event will be held at South with Lunch at Fairway following play. In addition to bragging rights for beating the pro, there will also be a chance at a Pebble Beach Vacation.

Snack Shops

Snack shop revenue for August exceeded prior year by \$2,656 and missed budget by \$1,727. Through August, the snack shops have operated with a Net Excess of \$20,520, which is \$4,601 ahead of prior year.



RCSC Redesigning Card Layouts

RCSC has changed the card layout of its cards for members and privilege cardholders. The layout will no longer have the expiration date printed on the card. By no longer printing the cardholder's expiration date on the cards RCSC will create a more streamlined process. Prior to this change, cardholders were required to come into the Cardholder Services Office to receive an annual sticker, or one was mailed at a growing expense.

This change was made possible by the system changes earlier this year where the Cardholder Services Office, Golf Course Pro Shops and Facilities Attendants at RCSC Centers are now all using the same system. RCSC no longer completes nightly updates of cardholder information between three different systems and the single view of cardholders opens the doors for more streamlined operations and cost savings.

For chartered clubs, there is a new process forthcoming as well. The process will be thoroughly defined in the new board policy for chartered clubs slated to be approved at the November board meeting. In the future, clubs will



A strong lower body provides stamina for waiting in lines, energy for walking up stairs, agility for stepping off curbs, strength for getting off the floor, and a firm foundation for a powerful golf swing."




