It's Election Time! Meet the Candidates!

Elections begin this month for the three upcoming vacancies on RCSC Board of Directors, with five candidates running for the 3-year positions.

Election Day is Tuesday, December 9. Voting will occur from 8a.m. to 4p.m. in Lakeview Social Hall #2 for Members wishing to cast paper ballots.

Online voting begins Monday, November 10 at 9a.m. and RCSC Members are encouraged to sign up and use the RCSC Web Portal at https://sunaz.totalegolf.com/ to cast their ballots. (See related article on page 3).

Online voting offers the convenience of being able to vote anywhere, anytime – whether you're here in Sun City or out of town.

In addition, absentee ballots can be obtained by contacting the RCSC Board Office at 623-561-4600 beginning November 10; the last day to request an absentee ballot is December 1 and all absentee ballots must be received no later than December 9.

Two candidate forums have been scheduled and Members are encouraged to attend. Light refreshments will be served.

You must have an email address on file with RCSC to get started on the RCSC Web Portal. If you are receiving RCSC News Email Alerts or you believe your email address is already on file, you may begin the process at step 1 (below).

If your email address is not on file, follow the online instructions or go to: https://sunaz.totalegolf.com/AddEmail to securely send RCSC the information to update your file. A password will be assigned and emailed to you.

Step 1. Go to sunaz.totalegolf.com. Click on New User Password Retrieval (highlighted in yellow).



Step 2. Enter your Member ID and click on Send Password.

A password will be generated and sent to vour email address.

If your email address is not on file, follow the on-screen instructions to securely send RCSC the information to update your records.

Step 3. Once your password has been received, return to the login screen and enter your Member ID and password. Click on Login.

Step 4. You are now logged into the RCSC Web Portal!



Once logged on, you may manage your email subscriptions, book tee times, pay your annual assessment and vote in the RCSC Board of Directors elections.

A recently added feature to the portal is the ability to view the current list of movies that are shown at Mountain View and Marinette Centers.

There is also a full Web Portal Instruction manual online to help you discover all of its features.



Golf Report

Pro Shops

Year to date rounds remain ahead of prior year and are at the second highest level since 2010. Six out of eight months this year have exceeded prior year rounds played.

We will be hosting a Pro-Am on December 11th at the North Course, which will celebrate it's renovation. This date was chosen for two reasons. It will enable our seasonal visitors to partake in the celebration and it will also serve as a fundraiser for the RCSC Management Team's 2014 charity - the Sun City Posse. Teams will be made up of 3 residents and a Golf Professional from the Southwest Section PGA. Following play lunch will be served at the Mountain View recreation center.

During our Patriot Golf Day Event, \$1,650 was raised through the 109 participants. Special thanks to the "Bunker Babes" for their \$100 donation. Patriot Golf Day was organized, with the help of PGA of America, to raise funds for the Folds of Honor Foundation. The money raised is used to fund scholarships for spouses and children of military service men and women killed or disabled while serving our country.

Snack Shops

Snack shop revenue exceeded budget by \$5600, continuing their yearlong trend. Work on the North patio expansion continues and the effort is being made to have it open following overseeding.

Courses

Heavy rainfall, including record September rains, has been a boon for grass. The boon for grass has placed a heavy burden on maintenance staffs to keep up with growth. We are striving to make golf operations self sufficient, maintain turf acreage that is 3 – 4 times that of most other courses and ensure North opens on schedule. Maintaining that balance is not always possible and occasionally falls out of balance. We apologize if our efforts have fallen short of expectations.

Though it is a slow process to watch, the North project remains on schedule for an October reopening. The greens are continuing their fertilization program and are responding as expected. Greens are currently being mowed five times per week. In addition to mowing the greens are top dressed with USGA greens mix each Friday. Some areas that are not responding to sprigging were sodded last week. Fairway lines were painted out in August and are now mown to their new layouts. On August 28 the AGA was on site to give the course its new rating. The AWGA was on site September 23 to provide a ladies rating. Initial scorecards may be temporary, as we do not want to have a supply of scorecards without a ladies rating for an entire year. Due to the renovation, local rules have been changed and will be reflected on the new scorecard. Local rules for North were developed with the assistance of Missy Jones, our local USGA rules official.

Riverview renovation planning is in the final stages, initial plans have been submitted to Maricopa County. Our prebid meeting with contractors that met qualifications, is set for September 30. Bids are due by October 17. Construction is slated to begin December 1 and will run through overseeding of 2015.



Riverview to Close December 1 for Course Renovation

Sun City's Riverview Golf Course will close December 1 for renovations of the irrigation system, including pump stations, as part of the mandatory work required by the RCSC agreement with the Arizona Department of Water Resources.

This work will also include the renovation of all greens, with the intent to have them remain the dominate characteristic of the course. This will provide more pin placements that fall within USGA guidelines. Tee boxes will also be renovated and a new forward tee added. It is anticipated that the bunker renovations will again use the Better Billy Bunker construction method (http://billybunker.com/thebetter-method/) as was used at North.

The only major course layout change will be the green complex on hole #12, which will be moved to the west, bringing the lake more into play.

The renovation work at Riverview is expected to be completed by Fall 2015.

A Moment with President Brasher - Sun City Satisfaction

Strange as it may seem to most of us who live in Sun City, occasionally we encounter situations we consider inappropriate for our senior adult community.


How best to deal with such encounters? Ever felt frustrated? Actually, there are many avenues of approach to seek resolution that will lead to continued member satisfaction. During my time as a Board Director I have learned a great deal about this process and those of us on the Board and in Management think our Corporate Documents and practices provide excellent answers and paths to help residents in need of answers.

The Board of Directors hosts two meetings each month (except July and August) in which members may bring concerns, questions, requests, etc., to the Board. The Director/Member Exchange is held on the second Monday of each month and provides for an interchange between Members and the Board with no time limit. Our monthly Board Meeting is generally the last Thursday of the month where Members may address the Board; these comments are limited to three minutes. At each of these sessions, residents may engage with Directors or members of our senior management staff, and it is not unusual for us to follow up with additional information following the meetings.

During the year there are tens of thousands of resident and guest visits to our recreation centers, golf courses and bowling centers. We would be naïve if we thought every one of these visits were conducted without occasional misunderstandings or conflicts. In spite of their best efforts, sometimes our well-trained facility attendants and other staff will deal with a request or problem that is not resolved to the resident's satisfaction. RCSC employees have recourse to view the resident's status in our computers, refer the individual to the Cardholder Services Office or to the center's lead utility worker/supervisor for help or further explanation. Failing satisfaction with these efforts the cardholder needs to submit an RCSC Comment Card available in all facilities.

If there is a serious issue with an individual cardholder or employee, an Incident Report may be submitted. Comment Cards and Incident Reports are reviewed by RCSC staff and forwarded to the Board Office at Lakeview Center. The Incident Reports are taken very seriously and may sometimes lead to hearings before the Board of Directors.

Occasionally, there are conflicts within a resident's RCSC club. These conflicts need to be brought to the attention of the club's officers in the form of a Conduct Report. If the conflict is not resolved within the club, the report will be

referred to the Clubs Office, who will contact the Club Organization Committee and the liaison for the club in question. Thereafter, a dispute resolution process will be put in place.

Updates

Financial Report:

We have completed August 2014 well within our operating and capital budget year-todate. Budgeting utilities has proven to be somewhat of an extra challenge in 2014, as we will have had all solar systems operating one year as of September. The solar systems have produced 18% more electricity than projected, providing additional rebates from APS as our rebate is paid based on our production. With that being said, we have also used more electricity (\$71k) primarily in the recreation centers than budgeted year-to-date. It is extremely difficult right now to develop any useful comparisons and of course, weather is a big factor. Speaking of weather, thanks to all the rain, we have used \$66k less electricity than budgeted for our well pumps year-todate. While we currently have none of our water rights leased, we were able to sell the water credits that we purchased in 2010 for a profit prior to resolving the water allotment for Viewpoint Lake with the Arizona Department of Water Resources. The majority of our positive variance from budget has come from savings we have been able to acquire through management of payroll costs year-to-date. All divisions have operated well within their net operating budget year-to-date.

Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments in August were the highest since January with past due assessments decreasing by 3.4%. July billings went past due at a rate of 6.4% and June balances went 60 days past due at a rate of 3.5%. The trend is continuing in 2014 with the 30 and 60 days past due rates being lower in each month in 2014 than the corresponding months in each of the previous two years.

Total accounts receivables decreased by 1.4% in August. Most notably this is attributable to the almost 18% decrease in accounts receivables related to lenders in August. We did not see an increase in property transfer related balances that could be expected as ownership changes from lending institutions. Outstanding balances related to property transfers now represent 55% of all receivables due and 56% of past due balances. The latter of these are being impacted by the decrease in total accounts receivable rather than an increase in property transfer balances.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties decreased to 45 properties at the end of August. The number of properties owned by lending institutions also decreased in August and is now at 54 properties.

Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in August totaled \$501,000. Year-to-date PIF fees are \$4,686,238 which is \$1,857,238 over budget for the year. Again, a reminder that we intentionally budget this very conservatively to assure we have sufficient funds prior to starting a PIF capital project.

Bowling:

The months ahead will be busy with tournaments at RCSC Bowling Centers. In October, RCSC centers will host the Sun City Bowling Association Tournament and the Sun City Hall of Fame tournament. Over the weekend of November 29 to 30, both Lakeview Lanes and Bell Lanes will once again host the Arizona State Senior Bowling Tournament: this tournament is expected to produce between \$8k and \$10k. In addition to the state tournament, Bell Lanes will be hostingthe Arizona State Senior Masters tournament and Lakeview Lanes – for the first time in RCSC history – will host the Arizona State Senior Women's tournament, both in December.

RCSC Director of Bowling Randy Johnson has submitted applications for Arizona State Liquor Licenses for the upcoming Mystery Theater event at Bell Center and the Polynesian Night at the Sun Bowl. The event license allows RCSC to serve alcohol on the premises; as a reminder, as long as a liquor license is in effect, outside alcohol is not permitted to be brought on to the premises. Almost all fall bowling leagues are in full swing with the exception of a few spots waiting to be filled when the winter visitors return.

Human Resources:

The H.R. Department has dedicated a great deal of time during the summer months with recruiting, hiring and bringing newly hired individuals onboard. Also, there has been a great deal of internal movement as a result of filling positions with qualified individuals already employed by RCSC.

Thirty-nine newly hired individuals have been added to RCSC staff since May 1. Hiring includes staffing for locations that closed for renovation and have re-opened or are in the process. Turnover also plays a large part in the numbers.

Currently we have 353 individuals on staff with 148 being full time and 205 part time. In addition to recruiting in Sun City, we recruit from the surrounding valley communities in compliance with Equal Employment Opportunity requirements. Many Sun City residents prefer working part time due to the flexibility of time commitment, however, some still chose to work full time. Sixty-five percent of RCSC's staff resides in Sun City.

Since January 1, 2014, 112 individuals have been added to RCSC's staff.

On Monday, September 22, 2014, RCSC received a letter from the U.S. Department of Labor addressing the recent investigation (audit) involving the RCSC Employees 401(K) Plan pursuant to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) and has advised that their investigation is now concluded, and no further action by the Department is contemplated at this time. This is a very positive determination letter and the results are what we expected to receive. We believe RCSC carries out its responsibilities with due diligence.

Project Updates

General Centers Projects and Information

The variances required to reduce the set back (from property line) of ten electronic signs has been approved by Maricopa County Board of Adjustment. As soon as permits are approved the signs will be constructed and installed with Fairway being the 2nc RCSC location to receive electronic signs. The entire project is expected to be completed in early 2015. Contractor is Bootz and Duke Signs. (PIF Cost – \$782,103)

Mt. View Center

The damaged stage flooring in the Mt View auditorium was replaced and the remaining floor sanded. All stage flooring was primed and coated. Contractor was Enmar Flooring. (Cost – \$10,000)

The auditorium backstage and main curtains have been replaced. Contractor was S&K Theatrical. (Cost – \$24,194)

North Pro Shop

Block work has been completed for the North Pro Shop/Snack Shop patio, steel trusses are erected and the concrete patio slab is poured. Tie-in of the two roof lines (old to new building) will occur this week, rain permitting. The project is progressing very well at this time. Contractors are CCBG Architectural and Ken McIntyre Construction. (Cost – \$167,505)



Lakeview Center / Viewpoint Lake

Planning and scheduling is underway for construction of the fish habitat for Viewpoint Lake this fall. If you have not signed up to help out with this very important project, please call the RCSC Administration office at (623) 561-4600 to add your name and contact information on the list. In addition, there have been delays in getting the threadfin shad (forage fish for bass, bluegill and catfish) due to a supplier inventory shortage. Once quantities are available, the shad will be delivered and introduced into Viewpoint Lake.



A variance was approved by the Maricopa County Board of Adjustment to increase the wall height for the Duffeeland Dog Park to improve the separation of the park from adjacent homeowners. Once the permit for this project is approved, contractor proposals will be received and final approval will be requested from the RCSC Bid commission. Construction dates have not been determined at this time.

Sundial Center

New partitions have been installed between the auditorium and East/West Halls. Contractor was Hufcor Az, Inc. (Cost – \$98,430)

Bell Center

Demolition is nearing completion on the Bell Tennis renovation with surveying and grading now underway. The #4 hole of the mini golf course is closed off and a path has been created for cardholders between hole #3 and hole #5 so the course can still be used by cardholders. Cardholders playing the course are asked to take par for the #4 hole. The tennis project includes demolition of the current (8) tennis courts and the installation of (10) new tennis courts. The new updated complex will also include a shaded gathering area, courtside canopies with benches, water and electric to each court, tables and benches for spectators and planters in the common areas. Contractors include Lloyd Sports Engineering as architect and project manager and Sunland Sports as building contractor. (PIF Cost – \$1,778,074)

Marinette Center

The Marinette expansion and remodel project continues to progress nicely even with the short delay from recent storms. The floor for the fitness center, lobby and restroom hallway have been poured and the block wall to the North is nearing completion. The mason is now beginning to go vertical with the fitness center walls. Sun City Fire Department has now determined that the RCSC must install a fire hydrant, in the parking lot planters, west of the existing PB courts. The



Marinette Center expansion and renovation project includes a 4,000 s.f. fitness center, rubberized outdoor walking track, a total of 20 Pickleball courts, an outdoor spa, thermal solar systems for pool water and shower water pre-heating, new doors, new windows and exterior stucco of all remaining buildings. Contractors to date include: CCBG Architectural, Robert Porter Construction and Aquatic Builders. (PIF Cost – \$4,387,373)



Marinette Clay Corner will be closed effective September 3, 2014 for renovations. The renovations include new sinks with clay traps, enlargement and re-organization of kiln room, new ceiling fans, clean up of some electrical, expansion into the former china paint room and some new shelving and cabinets.


