# **Election Nears, Online Voting Starts November 9**

The race begins as elections for the upcoming vacancies on RCSC Board of Directors gets underway this month, with seven candidates vying for three 3-year positions.

"We're excited to have so many candidates who are willing to step forward and run in this year's election," said Michael Kennedy, RCSC Elections Committee Chair. "It should be a great race and Members are encouraged to attend one of the Candidate Forums that will be held to meet the candidates, find out more information and ask the tough questions."

Online voting for this election begins Monday, November 9 at 8a.m. and will continue through Election Day. RCSC Members are encouraged to sign up and use the RCSC Web Portal to cast their ballot. Access to the portal can be found at www.sunaz.com and then selecting "RCSC Cardholder Login" from the top menu bar.

Only Members in good standing are eligible to cast votes and you can rest assured that safeguards are fully in place which restrict each qualified member to only one vote and that confidentiality will be maintained throughout the voting process. An online informational guide is available to assist Members through portal process.

By casting ballots online, RCSC Members will have the convenience of voting from any computer, anywhere – home, work, library – whether they are out of town or right here in Sun City

AZ. You will also find using the portal to be convenient for other applications as well, such as paying annual property assessments and booking golf tee times.

In-person ballots can be cast on Election Day (Tuesday, December 8) from 8a.m. to 4p.m. in Lakeview Social Hall #2 for Members who would prefer to cast their vote via paper ballot.

In addition, absentee ballots can be obtained by contacting the RCSC Board Office at 623-561-4600 beginning November 9; the last day absentee ballots will be mailed is November 30 and all absentee ballots must be received no later than December 8.

Stay involved and do your part – participate in the RCSC Board of Directors election process.

Remember - those elected will be leading RCSC into the future. Your future and the future of Sun City AZ.

### **Golf Report**

### **Pro Shops**

We will be hosting a Beat-the-Pros event on December 10 at Riverview Golf Course, which will celebrate the renovation. Hosting the event in December provides the opportunity for our winter members and guests to participate and ties into our fundraising efforts for our chosen Winter Celebration Charity. This year the chosen charity is the Sun City Fire Department. The format will be a two person scramble. Prior to play, Golf Magazine's "2013 Golf Entertainer of the Year" Brad Denton, will be putting on a Trick Shot Show. After the show Brad will head out to a par 3 and for a donation, Brad will hit a drive for your team, aiding in your attempt to Beat-the-Pros.

During our Patriot Day Golf Event, \$1,273 was raised through 84 participants. Patriot Day Golf was organized with the help of PGA of America, to raise funds for the Folds of Honor Foundation. The money raised is used to fund scholarships for spouses and children of military service men and women killed or disabled while serving our country.

### **Snack Shops**

Year-to-date Snack Shop revenue remains well above budget. The decision was made to keep 1:00 p.m. as the closing time for Snack Shops into September based on expected demand. Shops are given the flexibility to remain open should demand be sufficient.

### Courses

The normal monsoon weather is encouraging growth. This is the time of year maintenance crews struggle to keep up, often leading to clumping in the roughs. We appreciate your patience and understanding.

The Riverview renovation remains on schedule for the November 14 reopening. Greens are responding well to the fertilization and cultural practices. Areas around greens and tees that were not responding well have been sodded.

Over-seeding begins October 5, at North, Lakes West, Willowbrook and Quail Run. The remaining courses begin October 26. The later start should provide better growing temperatures for the rye grass. In addition to the later start we will be over-seeding with a blend of annual and perennial rye grass this year, which has a better heat tolerance. The changes should provide better overall playing conditions than last year.

### **Grounds/Lawn Bowl**

The renovation to the Lakeview lawn bowl greens are in the final stages. The greens continue to be fertilized top dressed on a regular basis. Barring any unforeseen circumstances the greens will be made available for use on October 12. The height of cut is gradually being lowered and is currently at .140" - the height will be kept slightly higher than normal going into dormancy, to protect the newly planted surface.

Greens were groomed regularly throughout the summer, rather than verticut. The regular grooming is a less aggressive method of removing thatch. The greens were also rolled frequently and kept to a slightly higher cut. The speed of greens this summer was satisfactory, based on comments from this season's first Lawn Bowl meeting.

The softball field and Sun Bowl will be over-seeded following the completion of summer league play and completed in time for fall play. Areas around centers were sprayed with a pre-emergent to help control weeds throughout the winter.





There were a couple of years when RCSC elections barely garnered enough candidates for the open positions. That's changed in recent years - thanks in large part to the dedication of the Elections Committee and also to those who have made the commitment to step forward and run for office.

And now it's your turn. Take the time to learn about the candidates running for the Board. What is their background and experience? What are their goals and aspirations for the future of Sun City AZ?

Come out and meet the candidates. There will be several opportunities to get acquainted with those seeking to be elected.

### And then vote!

Voter turn-out for many elections has been dismal to say the least. There are currently over 33,000 residents in Sun City eligible to cast a ballot. Last year, fewer than 1,000 votes were cast

There's really no longer any excuse. You cannot blame the weather or that the hours at the polls on Election Day conflict with other appointments or commitments.

With the RCSC Web Portal, you can cast your vote online from wherever you are – whether you're in Minnesota or Manitoba, California or Colorado – or right here in Sun City AZ!

Signing up for the RCSC Web Portal is easy! If you're receiving RCSC News Email Alerts, we've got your email address on file. If not, contact Cardholder Services at 623-561-4603 so that we can update your records and get you signed up to start receiving email alerts as well, if you would like. You can rest assured that RCSC will never release your email address to any outside source.

Once we have your email address, simply go to www. sunaz.com and click on RCSC Cardholder Login on the top menu bar. First time users will click on "New User Password

Retrieval" and then enter your RCSC Member or Privilege Card Number. In no time at all, you'll be sent a password to access the system.

Not only will you be able to cast your vote online in the RCSC Board of Directors election (beginning on Monday, November 9), the RCSC Web Portal allows you to do so much more!

I personally use the RCSC Web Portal to book my golf tee times

and to pay my annual property assessment. Through the portal, you can also review reports on your facility usage, see how much money you've got in golf certificates and tournament prizes or to check the free movie schedule for the current month.

Of course, we'll still have in-person voting on Election Day (Tuesday, December 9) at the Lakeview Recreation Center from 8am to 4pm. Should you need, we can also send you an absentee ballot which may be requested through the RCSC Corporate Office beginning on November 10 and must be received back no later than Friday, December 4.

So no more excuses. Meet the candidates. Let them know what you think. Hear what concerns them and the issues they believe should be addressed in the future to keep Sun City AZ the best retirement value in the country.

I've heard it said that if you don't vote, you get what you deserve, and if you do, you never get the results you expected. I prefer to think of it more simply: "If you don't vote, you can't complain."

### **Updates**

### **Financial Report:**

We have completed August 2015 well within our operating and capital budget year-to-date. As a matter of fact, every division has a net operating positive variance from budget even though we are coming out of our slower summer months.

### **Bowling:**

The Bowling Department is now entering their busy season. All fall leagues are in progress and several tournaments are scheduled October through December, including the Arizona State Senior Women's, the Arizona State Senior Open and the Metro Phoenix Valley of the Sun Tournaments.

Several improvements were completed at both RCSC Bowling Centers. The flooring in the bowler's area was replaced with a wood grain type material similar to what was used in the Lakeview Center Social Halls. The maskings, which are the shields that cover the pinsetters, were replaced with a southwestern theme and the countertops were removed and are due to be replaced with eight-foot tables purchased from Murrey International Bowling. The tables replacing the countertops will serve as tables for spectators or bowlers on the concourse side and will serve as countertops from the bowler's area side. The tables also have storage for house balls. As we promised, the bowler's area seating was expanded to provide more room between the spare bowling ball racks allowing bowlers more room to pass in the bowler's

The project started in late August due to the contractor's other obligations and RCSC's commitment to scheduling upgrades without closing the centers whenever possible and during times when it would cause the least amount of disruption for league and open play bowlers.

### **Cardholder Services:**

Payments on past due assessments backed off slightly in August but continued to be 15% higher than the average for the prior 12 months. Overall past due assessments decreased in August by 3.7%. The 30 Day past due rate assessments decreased and is at the 12 month average for the past year. Year to date payments from our third party collections firm are \$71,658.

Total accounts receivable decreased just slightly in August the most significant change being the flow of balances from Over 60 Days past due to Over 90 Days past due. This follows the balance flow seen last month into the Over 60 Day category. In August, property transfer related balances increased by 1% and lender owned related balances increased by 11%. The balance flow for these two categories continues to be dynamic over time. Outstanding balances related to property transfers now represents 52% of all receivables due and is back up to 50% of past due balances.

Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal in August totaled \$57,968. YTD

payments through the web portal are \$483,589 and represent 3.5% of total payments.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties decreased to 43 properties at the end of August. The number of properties owned by lending institutions was relatively unchanged in August and is now at 40 properties.

Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in August were \$470,000, which is \$182,000 over the amount budgeted. Year to date PIF fees are \$4,636,520 which is \$1,807,520, or 64%, over budget for the year. Again a reminder that we intentionally budget PIF income very conservatively to assure that we have the cash on hand for any planned project as we remain debt free.

A reminder that the Cardholder Services and Member Services offices have been relocated to Social Halls 2 and 3 on the second floor at Lakeview Center while the office space for these areas is being renovated. All current contact information such as email addresses and phone numbers remain the same.

During office renovation club copies may take a few days turnaround time, clubs have been asked to plan accordingly.

### **Human Resources:**

RCSC offers a comprehensive benefits program to promote health and financial security for full time employees and their families. RCSC pays the full cost of many of the benefits; employees share the cost of others; and employees pay the full cost for any voluntary benefits elected. The advantage of employer sponsored plans regardless of who pays the premium is

cost effectiveness and affordability.

Two benefits added to the program approximately two and a half years ago are Short Term (STD) and Long Term Disability (LTD). These plans provide financial income protection at approximately 60% during an unplanned event that is the result of a non-work related injury or illness for both total and partial disabilities certified by a physician.

Year to date five employees have received benefits from STD and one employee is now in the LTD plan. While RCSC salaries may be lower than for-profit organizations, we believe our benefit program attracts many qualified applicants.

### **Project Updates**

### Lakeview Center / Lakeview Lanes / Viewpoint Lake

- The lake wall repairs around Viewpoint Lake are nearing completion, however, another large crack was found. We have limited response to our requests from our previous contractor so I am working with another contractor and a lake wall repair materials manufacturer to move this project to completion at least for now, as I expect more cracks in the future. (Estimated Cost to Date \$10,000)
- The cardholder services and clubs offices renovation is progressing nicely with all demolition completed; walls framed and rough-in electrical, mechanical and data currently underway. Renovation work includes complete interior demolition, new framed interior walls, ceilings, LED lighting, flooring, automatic entry doors and furniture. Contractor is Ken McIntyre Construction, Accel Electric, CCBG Architectural, D.H. Pace and Resource Flooring. (Cost – \$171,206)
- Remodel work at Lakeview Lanes is progressing well with the new bowlers' area flooring installed and carpet trim-outs underway. The new ball racks and counters are ordered and expected sometime late this month. New handrails for the steps and ramps to the bowlers' area are ordered and being fabricated. Contractors include DFG Builders, Resource Flooring and the RCSC Skilled Trades Team. (Cost – \$55,248)

### **Sundial Center**

- The new Verizon cell tower and equipment building project is now completed except for some landscaping clean-up work.
- The two new unisex ADA restrooms in the lobby area of Sundial auditorium are completed and were opened to cardholder use on September 3. I personally have had several positive comments regarding these new restrooms. Contractor was DFG Builders. (Cost – \$49,848)
- The Sundial pools and spas were closed on September 7 so new LED overhead lighting could be installed. During this time the skilled trades and Sundial utility team thoroughly cleaned the pool



area from top to bottom, replaced one spa heater and scrubbed the pool decking. A pool finish contractor acid washed and repaired the interiors of both spas. The shutdown was expected to last approximately 14-18 days but the facility was re-opened to cardholders in 12 days (Friday, September 18). Contractors were Harmon Electric, Prado Pool and the RCSC Skilled Trades / Utility Worker teams. (Cost – \$52,500)

### **Bell Center / Bell Lanes**

Remodel work at Bell Lanes is progressing well with the new bowlers' area flooring installed and carpet trim out underway. The new ball racks and counters are ordered and expected sometime late this month. New handrails for the steps and ramps to the bowlers' area are ordered and being fabricated. Contractors include DFG Builders, Resource Flooring and the RCSC Skilled Trades Team. (Cost – \$47.812)

### **Fairway Center**

 The Best Friends Dog Club shade canopy and artificial turf project is beginning to pickup speed with the shade canopy now being fabricated and the artificial turf on order. Contractors include Arizona Bag and Shade, Sun Burst Landscaping, and CCBG Architectural. (Cost – \$80,909)

### **Mt. View Center**

Ninety-six thermal solar panels at Mt. View Center are scheduled for replacement.
 The project also includes the replacement of some 4" piping and upgrades to the electronic controller. The project is expected to commence in early October and be completed in approximately 2 weeks. Contractor is General Solar. (Cost – \$37,614)

### **Riverview Pro Shop Building**

The Riverview pro shop, patio and building renovation project has been submitted for final building inspection by Maricopa County Planning and Development Department. Once the project is officially completed there will be some cleaning and re-organizing to do prior to the facility opening when the Riverview course re-opens. Contractors include Ken McIntyre Construction, Accel Electric, Regional Paving and CCBG Architectural. (Cost – \$524,236)



### **Skilled Trades Department**

 The RCSC Skilled Trades department completed 154 work orders during the last two weeks of August 2015 and the first two weeks of September 2015.

### **Centers Operations Report**

• Barry Masloff had an opportunity to attend the NRPA (National Recreation and Parks Association) conference in Las Vegas last week. He thoroughly enjoyed the great training sessions which included topics such as customer service and Americans with Disability Act (ADA) just to name a few. Between conferences, Barry was able to meet with the Director of Hotel Operations (James Healey) at the famous New York, New York hotel to tour their facilities and discuss janitorial and staffing procedures. The RCSC Building and Infrastructure department is hoping this will help us improve staff utilization and further enhance the cleaning/sanitizing of our wonderful recreational facilities.



# LaTouch Wellness Massage Therapy Shares... Massage & The Cancer Survivor


As a cancer survivor, should you receive massage therapy treatment? For many years, massage and bodywork has been looked upon as a contraindication for cancer patients or cancer survivors. It was feared that bodywork could spread cancer. Organizations such as the American Cancer Society now agree that massage therapy can be implemented as an integrative part of cancer survivor's wellness program. Massage therapy can and is an important complementary component that can help them improve their quality of life.

There are now classes being taught that inform the massage therapist how to cautiously work with the cancer survivor. Cheryl Chapman of Springfield, N.J. is one of the leading educators and a pioneer in the protocol of massage therapies for cancer patients and survivors. A fourth generation nurse, she burned out a decade ago on her job as a RN working with oncology patients, which she had done since the mid-1960s. At that point she decided on a career change and became trained as massage therapist. That was over 15 years ago. For the past 6 years, Chapman developed a protocol that supports working with cancer survivors and has been teaching bodyworkers nationally on the best protocol to support cancer patients and survivors toward living a healthier lifestyle. Not all massage therapists are trained in this particular modality so it is very important to ask if your massage therapist has been formally trained specifically to work with cancer patients/survivors. There are still precautions that must be considered and it is very important to always get written permission from your physician, stating that their approval for you to utilize an integrative therapy such as massage.

A typical Swedish massage is usually not recommended for patients in active treatment and again having a doctor's permission is the first step before offering massage as an integrated therapy. As a massage therapist who wants to explore the options of working with cancer survivors should receive the appropriate certification. Some of the more gentle therapies that offer comfort, reduce stress and aid in the relaxation response are more acceptable.
