



### **Golf Report**

### **Pro Shops**

We will be hosting a Beat-the-Pros Tournament on Thursday, December 8 at Willowcreek Golf Course. This event is held in conjunction with other RCSC events throughout the year that raise funds for our annual chosen charity. This year the chosen charity is the Sun City Foundation. The Sun City Foundation supports RCSC members who have outlived their resources through assistance with RCSC annual property assessments and transportation. Through the Foundation RCSC members are able to continue using the facilities and remain active and social. The format will be a two person scramble.

Our first Get Golf Ready sessions for this season begin in November. We are now taking reservations for those sessions on a first-come, first-served basis. The five day session is \$99 per person, which includes four 1-1/2 hour lessons and a round of golf with the pro on the 5th day. Each session is completed in two weeks. Please call Sue Presta or Chris Linam at 623-876-8419 to register for the classes.

As we enter the fall/winter season, the Rangers will be asking more players to see their handicap cards and receipts. They will be asking for handicap cards to ensure the allowances given to players that genuinely need access around the greens and tees are not being abused by those that do not. Receipts are requested to ensure all players on the course have properly checked in with the pro shop prior to play. We thank those that have volunteered to become a ranger and hope you do as well.

### **Snack Shops**

Year-to-date Snack Shop revenue remains ahead of prior year and year-to-date budget. Beginning in October the closing time for snack shops will change to 3:00pm. Snack Shops are given the discretion of remaining open longer based on demand.

### **Golf Courses**

An active monsoon season, along with our normal summer cultural practices, has helped to rectify the issues experienced this summer with transition. In an effort to encourage transition next year, we will be moving fairway dethatching into May. Dethatching will help to thin and weaken the rye grass allowing the summer bermuda to begin filling in. This does not eliminate transition, however it should help smooth out the transition process. Weather will still play a major factor in the harshness of transition. Each course will be closed for two days in May while this process takes place, the schedule will be presented to the Golf Advisory Committee in January for review and finalized in February. The closing will be staggered similar to greens aerification.

Over-seeding begins October 3rd at Riverview, Lakes East, Willowcreek and South. As has been previously announced the first wave of overseed will overlap with the second wave of overseed for a period of 5 days. The intentional overlap is an effort to create the best window for a successful overseed. Ideally the starting date for all courses would be mid-October, however this would result in the closure of all courses and is not a viable option.

In preparation for overseed, mowing heights for fairways and greens will be raised. Heights are lowered during overseed to scalp the bermuda, to open the grass canopies and allow the rye better soil contact when it is spread. Mowing heights of the rough have already been increased. The higher height of cut aids the bermuda grass to hold up to cart traffic through the winter as it becomes dormant. In the past we have encouraged carts to enter the fairway at a 90 degree angle to their ball. This season we will also encourage carts to remain on the cart path and enter the rough and fairway at a 90 degree angle to their ball. If we can reduce the amount of cart traffic in the rough, it will hold up longer through the winter and able to recover more quickly in the spring and summer.

Not only will you be able to cast your vote online in the RCSC Board of Directors election (beginning Monday, November 7). the RCSC Web Portal is safe, secure and allows you to do many other tasks as well.

### **Management Updates**

### **Financial Report:**

We have completed August 2016 well within our operating and capital budget year-to-date. Matter of fact, every division has a net operating positive variance from budget as of August 31, 2016.

### **Bowling:**

Fall leagues have begun for the 2016/2017 season, the bowler count is better than projected due to the forming of new leagues.

We recently confirmed the Metro Phoenix Women's Senior Tournament the weekend of October 29th. This unbudgeted tournament will bring additional income to the bowling division.

Year to date bowling net operating is \$41k better than budget and \$4k better than 2015. Half of this increase is due to new leagues starting at Lakeview Lanes and Bell Lanes.

### Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments in August rebounded some from last month and were 2.5% above the monthly average for the year. Overall accounts receivables increased by under 0.5% in August. All past due categories saw an increase in August which has happened each August for the past 5 years. July assessments went 30 days past due at a 5.4% rate while June assessments went 60 days past due at a 4% rate. The result is a shift in receivables from current into the past due category this summer. Payments from our third party collections firm were down by 50% in August with year to date payments totaling \$158,114.

Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal in August totaled \$80,315. Year to date web portal payments total \$673,659. As a reminder the RCSC Web Portal payment function is available around the clock online and immediately updates cardholder accounts. As we go into the holiday season this is an easy way to quickly make your payment without writing a check or coming into our offices.

In August property transfer related balances increased by 4.4% and lender owned related balances increased for the first time since January. Outstanding balances related to property transfers now represent approximately 57% of all receivables due and 55% of past due balances.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City AZ properties remained steady at 41 properties at the end of August. The number of properties owned by lending institutions increased this month to 18 properties. An increased turnover of the lender owned properties resulted in higher balances while the count increased just slightly.

Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in August were \$626,500, which is \$241,500, or 63%, over the amount budgeted. Year to date PIF fees are \$5,622,100

which is \$1,845,600, or 49%, over budget for the year. Year to date 34 properties have closed in the new Sun City Manor development that have added \$119,000 to the year to date PIF fees collected, which were not projected in the budget due to the uncertainties of this new development in Sun City AZ.

The RCSC Web Portal was upgraded in August with improved functions for booking tee times including the ability to edit tee time bookings. Previously golfers were required to contact the pro shop to update bookings made through the web portal. We continue to review the web portal and look for additional updates to improve functions and enhance capabilities.

### **Human Resources:**

Recently we met with representatives from Willis, our brokers for employee benefit plans, to plan strategy for annual renewal. We do not have renewal rates for the plans as of this date and expect to receive them in early October. We did make the decision to take the medical and dental out for bid in the marketplace for comparison and have provided a complete census to Willis for this purpose.

Hiring continues to be a focus for H.R. We have hired 35 individuals in the third quarter of the year with a total of 70 year to date. Sixty three individuals have left the company this year.

The new final overtime rules issued by the Department of Labor will be effective December 1, 2016 and we are in the process of bringing RCSC into compliance. The overtime rule raises the salary threshold from \$455 per week (\$23,660 per year) to \$913 per week (\$47,476 per year). Some RCSC employees' status will be changed from "exempt" to "nonexempt" making them eligible for compensation at one and half times their hourly rate for time worked in excess of 40 hours per week. Changes will be made beginning late November and will be completed by December 1.

### **Member Services:**

Our third annual Casino Night was a huge success! This year playing times were 30 minutes which gave everyone a chance to take a break and get a bite to eat or enjoy a cocktail while they watched the Vegas acts being projected on the big screens.

The fall Sun Bowl concert series began Sunday, September 25. The band voted best in Phoenix, Faded Jeans, took the stage and the evening was on! People danced non-stop and sang along to all their favorite hits. It was a night to remember and a great way to kick off the season.

On Sunday, October 2, we'll have a Sun City AZ favorite, The Real Tones. It's James Garner as Johnny Cash on October 9 and CC Ryder Express on October 16. A Beach Boys tribute with The Southwest Surfers will move the

### Project Updates

### **General Information**

 Toilets and lavatories continue to be replaced at all on-course golf restrooms. To date, the RCSC plumber has completed installations at Riverview, Lakes West and Willowcreek. One restroom building has been completed at North Course, South Course and Lakes East. It has been determined that only eight hollow metal doors need replacement at the on-course restrooms. These doors are on order and will be installed soon after their arrival. Toilets and lavatories are being installed by the RCSC plumber. The door installations will be completed by D.H. Pace. (Approximate Cost – \$23,000)

### **Oakmont Center**

 The Oakmont auditorium renovation project is wrapping up and will be reopened on October 3, 2016. The project includes removal of the auditorium stage, construction of a short section of wall, installation of a new ceiling with dimmable LED light fixtures and wall painting. Contractors for this project included Ace Acoustics, Kowalski Electric and the RCSC painter. (Cost – \$34,505)

### **Grand Avevue Property**

• The interior areas of the building have been demolished in order to rid the building of restaurant related items and unnecessary walls. This work will also allow for a better understanding of the buildings construction for the RCSC ADHOC Long Range Planning Committee. It will also make future architectural design and engineering easier. The building is in great overall condition and is very well constructed. Contractor was DFG Construction. Demolition Cost – \$28,575)

### Lakeview Center/Duffeeland Dog Park

- A new floating dock has been ordered for Viewpoint Lake. The new dock will accommodate RCSC's existing boats with a couple of additional spaces for other lake boats and future growth. The new dock is expected to be installed in November 2016. Contractor is Floatation Systems. (Cost – \$62,996)
- While recently attempting to clear the clay club drain line, the plumber used a drain line camera to locate an old plumber's snake which was left stuck in the line from years gone by. The snake must be removed and will require opening up a small section of concrete in the woodshop, digging down to the line and attempting to remove the snake. If this attempt is unsuccessful, additional work will be required to remove this drain line obstacle. Contractor is Sunland Plumbing. (1st attempt cost is \$3,800)

### **Bell Center**

- Renovation of the clubs restrooms will be completed as of September 29, 2016 and reopened the same day. A couple of interior doors will be replaced the following week, but will only close the restrooms for a few hours. Contractor was DFG Builders. (Cost – \$94,892)
- Renovation of the two main Bell Library restrooms is well underway with demolition, plumbing rough-in and framing completed. Wallboard is currently being installed in preparation for wall tile and paint. Contractor is Ken McIntyre Construction. (Cost \$100,000)

### **Sundial Center**

- The Men's shower room is now completed and re-opened Friday, September 23, 2016. This concludes the 2016 remodel of the lower level at Sundial. Contractors for this project included: Hardscape Resurfacing, Inc., DFG Builders, Aquatic Builders, Accel Electric, J&J's Carpet Cleaning, Lee's Counter Tops, RCSC Information Technology Department and the RCSC Skilled Trades Electrician, Cabinetmakers, Painter, Plumber, Fitness Mechanic and Pool Mechanic. And finally, a huge thank you to the Sundial Utility team for all of the clean-up work they performed over the duration of this project. (Cost \$99,800)
- New ceiling and LED lighting is being installed in the Palo Verde Art Club. Contractors include Kowalski Electric, Ace Acoustics, SES Electronics, Olympic Fire and Custom Cooling. (Cost – \$24,584)

Three new power drop cords will be installed soon in the Silver Stones clubroom.
 Contractor is Kowalski Electric. (Cost – \$2,325)

### **Marinette Center**

 The remodel of the auditorium, social hall ceiling, main restrooms, kitchen and installation of two new swimming pool restrooms is progressing well. To date, demolition, framing, mechanical, wall skim coating, floor grinding and rough in plumbing and electrical is completed. Contractors are DVP Professional Builders, Accel Electric and Custom Cooling. (Cost – \$259,015)

### Lakes East/West

 Plans are being finalized to seal coat and restripe the entire parking lot at Lakes Pro Shop and Talisman Hall. This work will occur during October 2016 and areas of the parking lot will only close for a few days each. Contractor is Regional Paving. (Cost \$25,000)

### Willowcreek/Willowbrook Maintenance

 Plans are underway to demolish the current WB/WC maintenance building and construct a steel maintenance building which will serve the golf maintenance staff and the RCSC Skilled Trades department. Construction of the new maintenance building will commence sometime in October 2016. Contractor will be DVP Professional Builders and Bunger Steel. (Cost – PIF \$1,881,825)

### **Skilled Trades Department**

• The RCSC Skilled Trades Department completed 277 work orders during the last two weeks of August 2016 and the first two weeks of September 2016.

### **Centers Operations**

- Congratulations to Dorothy Waggoner at Sundial, Joe Barnett at Bell, Earl Heinselman at Sundial, and Bob Bean at Mountain View on their recent 5-year anniversaries with the RCSC. All make positive contributions to their respective workplaces.
- Over the past few months it was necessary to reschedule various clubs and events due to cleaning and building improvements at the centers. Centers staff made this process virtually painless with their flexibility and positive attitudes. The extra efforts at Sundial were particularly appreciated with the preparation and clean up after the project was complete. Staff did an exemplary job of minimizing inconvenience to cardholders and provided excellent service. Thank you to all involved.



### Watershed versus Plumbing?

Think you can figure out what is just bad for our rivers and lakes vs. your plumbing system? Try taking this quick little quiz:

- Dental Floss, Cotton Swabs and Bandages: Believe it or not, dental floss and cotton swabs are only bad for your pipes, not for watershed, but still should be disposed of in your garbage, unless you don't mind plugging up your pipes, because you will sooner or later. Most bandages however are plastic and do not biodegrade.
- Solvents, Paints, Glues: Yes, of course these types of items are hard on your plumbing system, but they are horrible for watershed as well. They should be disposed of at an "Eco Station" or other appropriate disposal facility. At the very least, please don't wash them down the drain.
- Motor Oil, Lubricants and Antifreeze: So, maybe these are dumped on the ground instead of down the drain, right? Better for our water, right? Well, not really. If they happen to get washed into the street (by say, oh, I don't know, a monsoon or something) they will wind up rushing through the storm water system. Keep in mind that storm water receives no treatment but flows directly into our lakes and rivers.
- Old prescriptions, perfume, lotions and potions: Studies on different types of fish have shown everything from "Zoloft" relaxed males (much less cautious of predators) to estrogen-laced male fish (still able to reproduce but shunned by females). So, it's fairly obvious that unneeded/ old prescriptions should be taken to a medicine "take-back" program, usually hosted by local police. There,



authorities burn old RXs with confiscated items in a controlled manner. Find out more online or ask your pharmacist the next time you pick up a new prescription. Old perfumes and lotions (prescription or not) should be tossed out in the garbage. Just don't have a "brain-drain" and flush harmful things away. If it's uncertain whether something is harmful, pour it into a bag of coffee grounds or kitty litter then toss it out. This can also be done with medications, but keep in mind there is always a chance the compounds could eventually leach into ground water.

 Fats, Oils & Grease (FOG) will ultimately clog pipes and cause major issues in watershed. It's not just household pipes that clog, but grease, oils and fats get into our sewer systems, causing many issues including the back-up of storm drains. Don't think that FOG is a real problem? Think about the grease collection services that restaurants have and why they have them. For the small amounts we have at home, wipe a pan (cooled, of course) with a paper towel into the garbage; large amounts can go into a lidded can. We must remember that drain cleaners are filled with chemicals and harmful not only to pipes but water as well.

Everything flushed down our toilets, kitchen and laundry sinks goes to wastewater treatment facilities. Unfortunately, these facilities are ineffectual at removing solvents, paints, glues, oils, fats and drugs as well as many other similar types of pollutants. Anything dumped on the ground or down our storm sewers goes (or can go) directly into our water. Either way, these contaminants find their way to lakes and rivers, remaining untreated and polluting our fresh water sources. It might only be a "little bit of paint," but it never goes away, so give a second thought before dumping something down the drain. It's just one more way to conserve water. Thanks to the generous donation of materials from Laguna Clay, Marjon Ceramics and the AZ Clay Association, SCCC each year donates 250 to 300 bowls, all made by the caring hands of the club members who embrace this event; an event very near and dear to their hearts. Members also donate many items to be sold during the event, with pieces selling anywhere from \$15 up to \$300.

Last year, \$25,000 was raised during this event of which 100% of the proceeds went to "Waste Not AZ." While Waste Not's primary purpose is to feed the

### Tips from Get Fit for Life -Machines vs. Free Weights: Which is Better?

"This is a question I hear quite often," states Dick Fortier, personal trainer and co-owner of Get Fit for Life. "Both forms of exercise have advantages and disadvantages. Which is most appropriate, would be a better way to state the question."

Strength Machines work on a fixed path, which makes it easier to execute the movement with correct form, even when muscle-fatigue sets in. While this is an advantage, it also becomes a weakness. The fixed movement path makes it difficult to work important stabilizing muscles or utilize different planes of motion. Machines are more efficient at isolating muscle groups, which is important for rehabbing from an injury or focusing on a particular part of the body. They are user friendly, but invite serious injury if appropriate weight and proper form are not maintained.

Free Weights and Bodyweight exercises have greater carry over to what the body does in daily living - they are functional in nature. Movements can be completed in different planes of motion. Since the body is responsible for creating and supporting the range of motion, free weights involve stabilizing muscles, as well as moving muscles. Learning how to perform each exercise takes time and skill. Precise technique is required to target the muscle and avoid injury. Free weights are versatile, convenient and portable.

"As aging adults, issues like arthritis, osteoporosis, joint replacements, back surgeries and rotator cuff tears will dictate whether machines or free weight exercises should be used," states Fortier. "Sometimes combining both is the best solution. Using a personal trainer to determine the safest and most effective exercises for a workout is definitely worth the investment."

We are a charitable non-profit Arizona corporation and are funded by voluntary contributions and memorial gifts.

While the equipment is available for the use of all residents or visitors staying with residents, the equipment must not be taken out of Sun City on a permanent basis. As a matter of control, equipment is loaned only to Sun City residents.

Records show that as the population of Sun City grew, so did use of our medical equipment. Savings for Sun City residents have been calculated periodically; in 2015, it was estimated that residents saved over two million dollars in cost of equipment for that year alone.



**TAX CREDIT!** Thanks to Arizona House Bill 2074 enacted in 1998, taxpayers may receive up to a \$400 tax credit on their state Income tax by contributing to Arizona schools if they are married and filing jointly. It will remain \$200 if they are single. The program gives a dollar-for-dollar reduction of state income taxes. The money must be designated for school-based extracurricular activities.

• Checks must be made payable to the Nadaburg Unified School District.

• The credit is against taxes. If an individual has no tax liability, a credit will not be available for this year, however, it can be carried forward to later years.

• When the check is received, the taxpayer will receive a receipt from a school district official. The district will also notify the Arizona Department of Revenue. When the District receives the tax forms necessary for your tax filing, upon request you will be sent the appropriate forms.
