North American Challenge Returns to Sun City

Evidence of lawn bowling (or “bowling on the green”) dating back some 7,000 years shows it to be one of the oldest sports known to man. It quickly became a favorite in Sun City’s early days with many complete strangers to the sport enthusiastically taking up the game. With lighted greens at five locations throughout the community (and the conducive Arizona climate), you’ll find people today rolling bowls from early morning until late evening.

Competition between U.S. and Canadian bowlers has always been fierce but friendly. Several years of discussion brought about what we now know today as the North American Challenge, a biannual international competition that alternates between these two countries and was originally held in Sun City back in 1995.

This year, Team USA will host Team Canada when the North American Challenge returns here once again at the Lakeview Recreation Center over three days of spirited rivalry, October 16-18, 2014.

Opening ceremonies will begin at 8:00a.m. on Thursday followed by squad play rounds. Spectators are encouraged to attend these festivities and to watch all the action as it unfolds.

A very unique twist to this year’s Challenge is that two members on Team USA, Myra Wood and Lorraine Hitchcock, are also residents of Sun City.

In order to participate in the Challenge, bowlers had to apply to be selected for the team. Each country fields teams consisting of 10 men and 10 women, appointed to either the Folkins or Jarvis squads (named in honor of two great bowlers – Dick Folkins from the U.S. and Graham Jarvis from Canada). Overall, there will be 48 matches and trophies awarded to Folkins and Jarvis men and women, combined genders and the overall North American Challenge trophy winner.

The Challenge is on! Come out and cheer on the home team – whichever team that might be!

Myra, who comes from Tacoma, WA has lived in Sun City since 2001 and boasts five generations of lawn bowlers in her family. Her mother learned to bowl from her grandmother back in Scotland. Myra has since passed her wisdom and love of the game to her son and three grandchildren.

Lorraine, who relocated here from Pennsylvania and has lived in Sun City since 1998 “married” into lawn bowling, learning the sport from her father-in-law who was also an avid bowler here in Sun City. Her husband, Len, is very involved in the Sun City lawn bowls community as well.

Wood and Hitchcock met at a lawn bowling tournament back east in 2001 and were pleasantly surprised to figure out their paths

would be crossing again when they quickly determined that Sun City, Arizona was where they would both eventually call “home.”

“We’re both excited that the North American Challenge is coming back to Sun City (it was last here in 2007) and to be playing on Team USA,” Wood and Hitchcock stated. In addition, they have both worked on the organizing committee for this event.

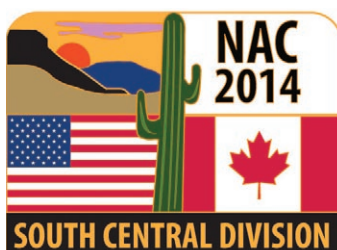

An Urgent Message from RCSC General Manager Jan Ek

Voice Your Opposition to Consolidation, SIB & Adjuster Mechanisms In Epcor Water & Wastewater Rate Cases

EPCOR Water is seeking not only rate increases in water and wastewater as is easily visible and reported in these cases, but they are also seeking significant Adjuster Mechanisms and a System Improvement Benefits ("SIB") mechanism that will more than double the rate increases proposed over the next 5 years in the water case. Should we be upset with EPCOR Water? No, not necessarily, they are simply another corporation asking for everything they can get. Who deserves our focus, frustration and angst should this water rate increase be granted or this wastewater consolidated are our elected Commissioners on the Arizona Corporate Commission ("ACC"). And given the Commission's recent decisions, including EPCOR's recent Fountain Hills case which weighed heavily in favor of EPCOR on most of these same issues, Sun City people have reason to be concerned!

Sun City's fight over not being consolidated with other water districts is not new; we have been very vocal over our opposition to consolidation for years and we cannot let up now as it will cost Sun City residents an 89% increase in their wastewater, plus the increase costs for RCSC operations as well. While claims may be made that consolidation of our water districts are similar to APS consolidation, this is not true; our water and waste water systems are separate from one another and in most cases cannot even be linked to provide backup support. In addition, consolidation would give EPCOR a blank check to buy up junk water companies and get their entire customer base to pay for it. EPCOR reportedly plans to spend \$9.3 million in improvements to Sun City's wastewater operations in the next 5 years; however, if we are consolidated, Sun City residents will pay \$31.8 million for those improvements over the next 5 years.

And that's just part of the story, Here's The Rest Of The Story...

While EPCOR Water is requesting a rate increase for Sun City water (in addition to the wastewater increase) of approximately \$3.82 per month, they are also asking for another \$3.80 per month or so for SIB, commonly referred to as infrastructure. As the General Manager of the Recreation Centers of Sun City who owns and operates 10 wells, I completely understand the need for replacement of infrastructure; however, the problem with SIB is three fold: 1) SIB rewards utility companies for not doing proper maintenance or making necessary improvements; 2) SIB is too broad as it applies to 55% of EPCOR Water's total investment; and, 3) it does not meaningfully consider reductions in operating costs, synergies as a result of the new infrastructure and other safeguards meant to protect the Sun City customers. Moreover, our consumer advocate, RUCO has sued the Commis-

sion claiming the SIB is unconstitutional. Although some scare tactics have been used in the past that without all these additional fees the infrastructure that makes up our systems could fail or be inadequate; the fact is that EPCOR Water is required by law to provide safe and sufficient water to Sun City residents. Sun City residents should disregard the scare tactics and insist that the Commission act in a just and balanced manner!

And that's still just part of the story, Here's Even More Of The Story...

Sun City residents need to address consolidation, the SIB/ System Improvement Benefits and Adjuster Mechanisms with the Arizona Corporate Commission (ACC) because they are the ones who will determine if this occurs. Basically, adjuster mechanisms allow rates to go up between rate cases as utility companies want to be protected for declining usage and other unfavorable factors. While that may be appropriate to assure that EPCOR has the ability to provide safe and sufficient water and wastewater services to Sun City, the issue is that the rate does not go down if there is an increase in usage, which is totally not fair. In addition, some of the adjuster mechanisms are not appropriate such as tank maintenance expenses or employee health care costs, operating costs controllable by the corporation.

Golf Report

Pro Shops

As they did in June, total rounds for July increased slightly over prior year. For the month 13,698 hearty souls played a round of golf. Year-to-date rounds remain well ahead of prior year and ahead of recent averages.

We currently have 109 participants signed up to participate in our Patriot Day golf event on August 29. Patriot Golf Day was organized, with the help of PGA of America, to raise funds for the Folds of Honor Foundation. The money raised is used to fund scholarships for spouses and children of military service men and women killed or disabled while serving our country. Starters will also be collecting donations through the pro shops from August 29 through September 1.

Snack Shops

Snack Shop revenue benefitted from increased play, exceeding budgeted revenue by \$1,500. Normal Snack Shop closing time remains at 1:00 p.m., however hours can be extended should the demand arise. Work on the North patio expansion continues and is expected to be ready for the course reopening.

Courses

Palm tree trimming began at the South course and is continuing throughout all the courses, with the exception of Riverview. Due to the upcoming renovation at Riverview the palm trees will not be trimmed this year. All courses are spraying for weeds, including Nutsedge. As the Nutsedge dies it will turn a noticeable yellow. In addition all courses will begin spraying a pre-emergent to control winter weeds.

Though it is a slow process to watch, the North project remains on schedule for an October reopening. The greens are continuing their fertilization program and are responding as expected. Greens are currently being walk mowed three times per week. In addition to mowing the greens are top dressed with USGA greens mix each Friday. Some areas that are not responding to sprigging will be sodded the week of August 25th. Fairway lines were painted out in August and are now mown to their new layouts. On August 28th the AGA will be on site to give the North course its new rating. In addition to North they will also be rating Quail Run.

As a reminder, Riverview will not be overseeded this year. We are currently considering the feasibility of leaving 9 holes open in December, while the front 9 is in the first part of construction. Since the course will not be overseeded, the feasibility greatly relies on our ability to control the green speed. We will post more definitive information in the near future.

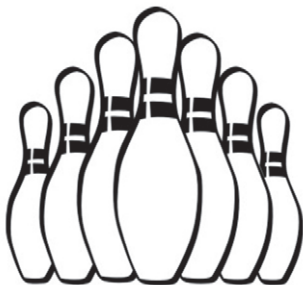

North Golf Course Renovation Project Architect's Report

In less than one year the North Golf Course has gone through a major transformation, and we are excited for the golfers to finally get out on the golf course and experience the new renovation. The golf course maintenance staff has worked many long days in the heat of the summer to manage the grow-in of the golf course, and due to this we have had a very successful grow-in. Now we are just fine tuning the course to get it ready for play.

One of the biggest things we are challenged with in every renovation and new course we are involved in is managing the golfer's expectations. It is important to remember that the grass is a living organism, and like that bottle of fine wine, will mature with age. The surfaces you will play on will be very good, but keep in mind that the conditions will not be perfect right out of the gate. . For instance, a comment we usually hear the most is "these greens are firm," and that is correct. The greens will be firm for the next couple of seasons. The reason behind this is what makes a putting green soft and receptive to the approach shot is the gradual build-up of a thatch layer. This thatch layer is an organic layer that builds up over time just below the surface of the putting green. The build-up of this organic layer, which is also managed, is why greens become softer and more receptive to golf shots over time.

This winter the new putting greens at North will not be over seeded. With new greens the longevity and condition of the greens will be much better by not having to scalp the surfaces and over seed them this year. What does that mean? It really has to do with weather. If we have a warm winter like we did last year the green speeds will be more manageable, but if we get a really cold winter with days of hard frost the grass will go into dormancy. This is something your maintenance staff is prepared to manage and they are already starting to take steps today for what is going to happen later this winter. It is worth noting that there is the potential for the green speeds to pick-up a little during dormancy but they will be rolling very true.

As for the other features of the golf course, they too are evolving and your maintenance staff is learning every day the little intricacies to manage those features to the expectations you want with your golf course. Believe it or not how one bunker is maintained may end up being different than another because of the timing the sun hits the sand based on which direction the bunker is facing.

We are extremely honored to have been a part of the North Golf Course Renovation. We are proud of the work that was done, and now look forward to seeing you enjoy and play the golf course.

A Moment with President Brasher - Inheriting Sun City

Many property transfers in Sun City, unfortunately, result from the passing of one or more parents and their descendant(s) inheriting the property. Whether the Sun City property is owned by individuals or is part of a trust, the heirs need to understand the unique nature of our community. We encourage all property owners to share with their future heirs their knowledge of our wonderful active senior adult community, and the responsibilities of ownership. In this Commentary we will touch on important items that we would do well to share with our heirs and will ease the way for them during a very difficult phase upon the loss of loved ones.

We are well aware that Sun City is not actually a city, rather it is an unincorporated community in Maricopa County. It is a planned community and all Sun City property owners must comply with the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (CC&Rs), available online at www.suncityhoa.org. These deed restrictions are recorded against each Sun City property (lot) and are enforced by the Sun City Homeowners Association (SCHOA). When acquiring a new property, whether by purchase or inheritance, the execution of a Facilities Agreement in favor of the Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. (RCSC) and payment of the annual homeowner fee is required.

Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. (RCSC) is a private, non-profit corporation that owns and operates all the recreation facilities in Sun City. RCSC assesses all Sun City property owners an annual property assessment on the anniversary of the date of change in the recorded deed regardless of whether they occupy the Sun City residence or use the recreational facilities. One may access RCSC Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws and Board Policies at www.sunaz.com under the Corporate Tab.

As provided in the RCSC Corporate Bylaws, a Preservation and Improvement Fee and a Transfer Fee shall be imposed on the purchase, acquisition, transfer, inheritance, gift or any change in ownership. Again, details of the above may be found on the [sunaz.com](http://www.sunaz.com) website. It is important to explain that the Preservation and Improvement Fee goes into a restricted account and can only be used for projects that exceed \$300,000 with a useful life expectancy of 15 years. Such funds are important as Sun City finds the need to improve facilities, buildings, etc. to maintain the

excellent quality of life we enjoy as residents without increasing our annual property assessment.

To avoid “sticker shock” potential inheritors can be advised of the amount of the current fees, subject to future change:

Preservation & Improvement Fee	\$3,000.00
Transfer Fee	300.00
Annual Property Assessment	456.00
Recording Fee	10.00

If an inherited property is sold by the heir within one year of acquisition, the Preservation & Improvement and Transfer Fee may be refunded upon request. Similarly, there are provisions for refund of some of the Annual Property Assessment. A full explanation of refunds is explained in RCSC Board Policy No. 22.

Of course, this Commentary has focused only on the Sun City-specific information for us to convey to our potential heirs. There is an excellent source of online advice we can use to learn other things it would be important to share: <http://care-giver.org>; click on End-of-Life Decision-Making.

As a final note, consider organizing all important papers in an easily accessible place and advise heirs of the location. The RCSC Cardholder’s Guide could be included. In our home we have maintained a loose-leaf notebook for years. We update it often and have advised our heirs where it is located.

Updates

Financial Report:

Since there is no monthly Board meeting in the month of August, I will include the Treasurer's report information in my monthly report. The balance of unrestricted funds as of July 31, 2014 was \$10,945,750 which includes a \$2.5M cash reserve. Restricted funds include the Preservation and Improvement Fund ("PIF") and the Capital Reserve Fund. As of July 31, 2014, PIF had a balance of \$10,941,404 plus \$441,000 collected in July that was transferred into the PIF account the first part of August 2014. The Capital Reserve Fund had a balance of \$1,500,044 as of June month end.

As is customary, we have completed July 2014 well within our operating and capital budget year-to-date. Matter of fact, every division has a net operating positive variance from budget, with the golf division potentially completing the year in a net operating excess position for the first time in my tenure and likely in decades. The negative variance from budget in the annual property assessments income is a budget timing issue which will be resolved by September month end. All divisions, excluding bowling, have positive budget variances in wages, taxes and benefits year-to-date. Overall, we continue to operate effectively and efficiently, while providing a great product for the residents of Sun City.

Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments in July were reversed from June and were above the monthly average for the past year. June billings went past due at a rate of 6.2% and continue the trend of being below the rate for the same month the prior two years. May balances went 60 days past due at a rate of 3.2%. This is below the monthly average for the prior year, which reached the lowest level for the 60 days past due rate in the past three years.

Total accounts receivables increased by 3.8% in July. This increase is most attributable to the increase in accounts receivables related to property transfers which increased by over 12% in July. Current receivables, those not past due, for property transfer related balances increased by 90% in July due to a significant increase in property transfers this past month. Outstanding balances related to property transfers now represent 55% of all receivables due and 51% of past due balances.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties stayed steady at 49 properties at the end of July. The number of properties owned by lending institutions increased slightly in July and is now at 59 proper-

ties. Preservation and Improvement Fees (PIF) collected in July totaled \$441,000, which is 47% more than budget. Year-to-date PIF income is \$4,185,238, which is 65% over budget for the year. Remember that we intentionally budget PIF income very conservatively to assure that we have money available prior to the onset of any capital projects budgeted for PIF.

Human Resources:

H.R. has been notified that it is time again to restate the RCSC Employees 401(k) plan document. Every six years, the IRS requires that all defined contribution plans be updated and resubmitted to the IRS for review and approval.

The current required restatement is referred to as the "PPA Restatement" after the largest piece of legislation contained in the new document and will incorporate previous amendments for:

- Final 415 regulations
- Pension Protection Act (PPA)
- Heroes Earnings Assistance and Tax Relief Act (HEART)
- Worker, Retiree and Employer Recovery Act (WRERA)
- Katrina Emergency Tax Relief Act (Ketra)
- Gulf Opportunity Zone Act (GOZone)

H.R. will be working with Pension Funds of Arizona beginning now and during 2015 to incorporate the amendments. Our goal is to have our documents restated before the end of 2015 even though the IRS deadline is April 2016.

This is also a perfect time for us to review the plan documents and the operation of the plan to determine if any changes should be made at the time the document is restated.

Member Services:

We had another record-breaking event at Mountain View pool and patio on Saturday, August 16, when approximately 275 residents shared with us our Hand-Scooped Ice Cream Social and Dive-In Movie. The monsoon avoided us that night, and we had a great time socializing, swimming, eating ice cream with all the fixin's and watching a baseball movie. It was a great way to spend a summer evening!

Project Updates

General Centers Projects and Information

As part of the permit process for electronic signs, the RCSC is currently seeking to obtain set back variances so the signs can be set closer to the property line. The total project is expected to be completed in early 2015. Contractor is Bootz and Duke Signs. (PIF Cost – \$782,103)

Mt. View Center

The stage flooring in the Mt. View auditorium will receive termite and water damage repairs and will be sanded and refinished the week of August 18, 2014. Contractor is Enmar Flooring. (Cost – \$10,000)

Oakmont Center/North Pro Shop

The Oakmont pool/spa, equipment building and Facility Attendant Station project has been completed and reopened to cardholders on July 11, 2014. Contractors included: CCBG Architectural, K.L. McIntyre Construction and Aquatic Builders. (PIF Cost – \$777,069)

Permits have been approved by Maricopa County Planning and Development for the North Golf patio cover project. Demolition of the old patio cover is now completed and the block work is about 80% complete. The new larger patio cover will provide shade for more golfers to enjoy time together. Contractors are CCBG Architectural and Ken McIntyre Construction. (Cost – \$167,505)

Quail Run Maintenance

The repaving of the Quail Run maintenance yard is now completed along with the cement pads for bulk sand and materials storage. Contractor was Regional Paving. (Cost – \$34,135)

Lakeview Center/Viewpoint Lake

Planning and scheduling is underway for construction of the fish habitat for Viewpoint Lake this fall. If you have not signed up to help out with this very important project, please call the RCSC Administration office at (623) 561-4600 and put your name and contact information on the list. In addition, there have been delays in getting the threadfin shad (forage fish for bass, bluegill and catfish) due to a supplier inventory shortage. Once quantities are available, the shad will be delivered and introduced into Viewpoint Lake.



This picture represents a sample of a fish habitat but does not necessarily represent what RCSC will build.

Sundial Center/Riverview Pro Shop/Lakes Maintenance

The (2) layers of roofing over the Sundial auditorium and vestibule were removed and a new coated built-up roof was installed. Contractor was Progressive Roofing. (Cost – \$234,775)

Floors in the auditorium and East/West Halls were repaired, sanded and coated with polyurethane. Contractors were Enmar Flooring and Coit Cleaning Services. (Cost – \$35,862)

During the month of August 2014, new partitions will be installed between the auditorium and East/West Halls. Contractor is Hufcor Az, Inc. (Cost – \$98,430)



Bell Center

The RCSC has acquired the permit for the Bell tennis project and demolition is scheduled to begin August 4, 2014. The project includes demolition of the current (8) tennis courts and the installation of (10) new tennis courts. The new updated complex will also include a shaded gathering area, court-side canopies with benches,

water and electric to each court, tables and benches for spectators and planters in the common areas. Contractors include Lloyd Sports Engineering as architect and project manager and Sunland Sports as building contractor. (PIF Cost – \$1,778,074)

The two 100 gallon domestic hot water heaters, providing hot water for the showers inside the fitness building, have been replaced with (5) new Rinnai tankless water heaters. This tankless technology is working out very well on the outside pool shower rooms at Bell so the same equipment was used again to replace the two inside shower room water heaters. Contractor was Sunland Plumbing. (Cost – \$22,280)

Lighting control cabinets and switches were installed at the Bell social halls to eliminate the use of circuit breakers to control the lighting and allow staff to lock the equipment rooms. Contractor was Supercharge Electric, Inc. (Cost – \$22,590)

Marinette Center

The Marinette Center expansion is progressing nicely with demolition, sewer main, fitness building footings and stem wall all completed. The Marinette Center expansion and renovation project includes a 4,000 s.f. fitness center, rubberized outdoor walking track, a total of 20 Pickleball courts, an outdoor spa, thermal solar systems for pool water and shower water pre-heating, new doors, new windows and exterior stucco of all remaining buildings. Contractors to date include: CCBG Architectural, Robert Porter Construction and Aquatic Builders. (PIF Cost – \$4,387,373)



Bids are being received and preparations underway to remodel the Marinette Clay club including new sinks with clay traps, enlargement and re-organization of kiln room, electrical work, expansion into the former china paint room and some new shelving and cabinets.

Skilled Trades Department

The RCSC Skilled Trades department completed 172 work orders during the last half of June 2014 and the 1st half of July 2014.

Grounds Department

The RCSC Grounds Department, which includes the Lawn Bowling greens, has been reassigned to the RCSC golf division under the leadership of Golf Director, Brian Duthu. While I really enjoyed working with this team I know that Brian and his head superintendent David Dube will utilize their turf-specific training and expertise to further enhance the RCSC properties.

More Things Water... Use it Wisely!

Instead of waiting for the water to get warm or hot, learn to wash your face in cool or cold water.

When washing hands, turn the water on to dampen, then turn it off while you lather, and back on to rinse briefly. In fact, if you use "foam" soap, you don't even need to moisten your hands before washing, just for rinsing.



Think twice before ordering that glass of water at a restaurant. Are you really going to drink it? Maybe have them only fill the glass halfway. You can always get more.

The following tip is probably more user friendly for those who travel north or east for the summer, but it is a good thought to keep in mind: Reuse the water from your dehumidifiers for watering plants, indoors and outdoors.

Save water from boiled vegetables for making soup stock. It is full of vitamins and other good stuff. Also, save water from pasta and boiled eggs for watering your plants. Adding leftover coffee to this will also gives your plants a boost of nutrients. Keeping a jug under your sink is a good way to gather it.

If you have ants in your yard, you can also pour the water left over from boiling eggs or pasta (while it's still hot) on the ant hills. This often takes care of the problem without using chemical pesticides.

If your toilet was installed before 1992, add a toilet dam to reduce the amount of water flowing out of it by 35 percent and still leave it functioning properly. Toilet dams displace water in the tank so that the toilet uses less water each time it's flushed.

Home centers and plumbing supply stores sell plastic shields that act as dams by restricting how much water fills the tank. You can also create your dam by filling plastic quart-sized bottles with sand or pebbles so that they remain at the bottom of the tank. These homemade units displace water that would have otherwise filled the tank. Avoid using bricks as toilet dams since they release chemicals that could harm the internal components of a toilet tank, and pose the risk of cracking the tank during placement.



As well as they seem to work, the water from a mister evaporates almost immediately. A cool drink or a wet cloth around your neck is much more efficient.

Ever lived in a home dependent on well water, only to have the electricity go out and the water pump not run? If you have, you're probably familiar with using grey water to flush toilets. It can be done anytime; not just when the power goes out. You can fill a bucket while waiting for the shower to warm up, save water from dripping faucets... you get the picture...

Celebrities known to play backgammon include: Jackie Kennedy-Onassis, Cary Grant, Madonna, Barbra Streisand, Bob Dylan, Mick Jagger, Hugh Hefner, Lucille Ball, Fred Astair, J. Edgar Hoover and Leonardo Dicaprio.

Since early Egypt and China, this has been a game of both luck and skill. Napoleon required his generals to learn and master the game, yet any child can learn the basics of play in just one day.

Many people know that Mark Anthony risked an empire to remain in Egypt, but few know that he played backgammon with Cleopatra.

Nero was said to play for as much as \$15,000 a point. In the United States it has been played since the earliest days of our history. On June 10, 1776 Thomas Jefferson "the distinguished gentleman from Virginia" was appointed to draft the Declaration of Independence. Among his surviving records are two entries indicating that Jefferson played backgammon for relaxation during that time.

Backgammon - the king of games, and the game of kings - is being discovered by everybody. When did you play your last game of backgammon?

We welcome all levels of players. We have classes to help you from basic play to using the doubling cube and more advanced strategies. We will help you improve regardless of how little or much you already know.

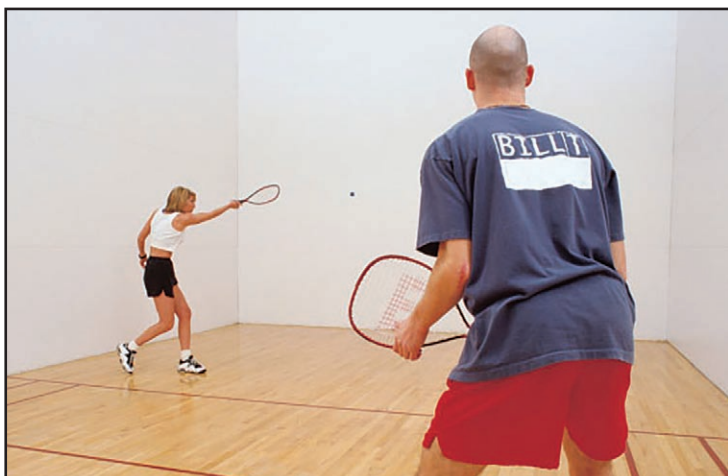

Handbell Ringers of Sun City



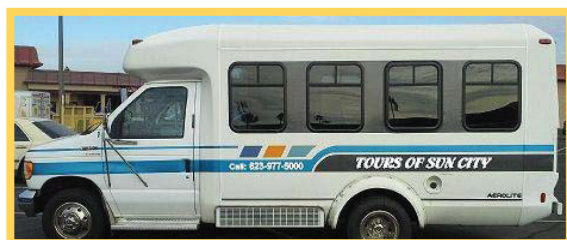

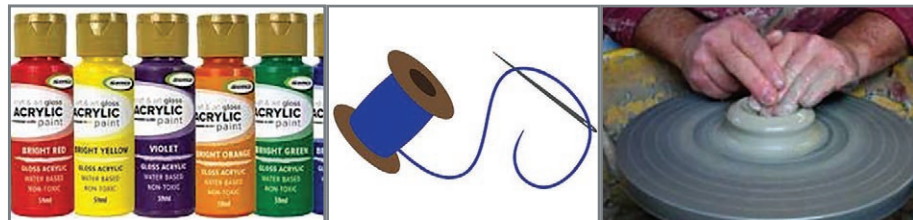



Tips for Seniors from Daily Fitness -
Why is Correct Posture So Important?

"Good posture is necessary to keep the body aligned correctly. As we age, shoulders slump and the head moves forward. This phenomenon takes a serious toll on the spine, shoulders, hips, and knees", states Jane Fortier, fitness professional for Daily Fitness.

"Poor posture can lead to a cascade of structural flaws, resulting in back and joint pain, reduced flexibility, and compromised muscles. When the body is poorly aligned, joints function incorrectly, causing some muscles to work harder than others. Overworked muscles become tense, while others weaken. These muscular imbalances slowly devolve into poorer posture."

The cycle of poor posture can be broken, with consistent attention to the following fitness objectives:

- Strengthen Core – which includes abdominals, lower back, obliques, and hips. If any core muscles are weak, other muscles have to compensate, resulting in loss of motion, balance and stability.
- Fix Rounded Shoulders – which results from sitting at a desk or computer, driving a car, watching TV, reading, cooking, working at the sink, etc. In these forward positions the muscles in the chest, shoulders and hips shorten, as the muscles in the upper and middle back weaken.
- Neutralize Tilted Hips –a condition that develops from sitting too much or spending hours in activities where the legs are bent. An anterior pelvic tilt in the hip area indicates weak hamstrings, gluts and abs, and tight hip flexors and thighs.
- Retract a Forward Head – this head alignment develops after hours, days and years of driving a car, watching TV, and sitting at a computer. These activities tighten the front and side neck muscles, while weakening the deep, rear muscles of the neck. Muscles in the front of the neck must be strong enough to hold the head so that the ears are directly over the shoulders.
