Sundial Ticket Sales Begin November 1

Board of Directors Election

Candidates to be Announced This Month


2016 is turning into a big election year, not only across the nation but right here in Sun City AZ as well.

With candidate packets for the upcoming RCSC Board of Directors Elections due to the Corporate/Board Office no later than Friday, September 30, 2016 by noon, the race for your vote starts counting down. Once application packets are deemed complete and signatures have been verified, candidates will be announced to the local media and directly to Cardholders who receive RCSC News Email Alerts. The full slate of candidates along with their qualifications will also appear in the November edition of SunViews and on the RCSC Web Portal once online voting begins.

This year, RCSC Members will be voting for four director positions in total. The three full 3-year term positions are for those seats being vacated by RCSC President Dan Schroeder, Treasurer Michael Kennedy and Director Peter Lee. Those elected will serve through 2019. In addition, the candidate with the fourth number of votes (providing it is at least 100) will complete the term of the recently vacated board position (through 2018).

Candidates will be formally introduced at the Board/Member Exchange on Monday, October 10 at 9:00am in Social Hall #3 at the Lakeview Center and at subsequent Board Meetings and Board/ Member Exchanges, where tables will be provided for candidates to share informational literature about their qualifications.

Two candidate forums will also be held this year, allowing members to question candidates about their goals and expectations if elected prior to ballots being cast.



RCSC Board of Directors Election Tuesday, December 13, 2016

Candidate forums are scheduled for Thursday, November 3 at 2:00pm at Fairway and on Tuesday, November 15 at 7:00pm at Marinette. Both sessions will have a meet-and-greet social one-half hour prior to the start of the forum. These forums provide candidates an opportunity to debate the issues and answer member questions.

Electronic voting for this year's election begins online one month prior to Election Day (starting Monday, November 7 at 8:00am). Safeguards that restrict each qualified member to only one vote will be in place and strict confidentiality will be maintained throughout the voting process.

By casting ballots online, RCSC Members will have the convenience of voting from any computer, anywhere at any time – from home, at work, or from a public library – whether they are out of town or right here in Sun City AZ. For any members without access to a computer, in-person voting will be held at Lakeview Center on Election Day (Tuesday, December 13, 2016) from 8:00am to 4:00pm. In addition, RCSC Members may cast their vote using an absentee ballot, which can be requested from the Corporate Office beginning on November 7 and must be returned by Election Day.

Stay involved and do your part. Participate in the RCSC Board of Directors election process. Meet the candidates and attend the forums. And most importantly, vote!

Remember - those elected will be leading RCSC into the future. Your future and the future of Sun City AZ.

Golf Report

Pro Shops

Total rounds for July fell behind prior year, both for the Month and year-to-date; however, total revenue remains well ahead of prior year and budget. For the month of August, 95% of rounds played were played by residents and their guests, which is only slightly under the year-to-date average. We do understand that due to the conditions at North and transition issues on the other courses our residents took some of their business outside of Sun City. We do appreciate the support and patience of those that continued to play our courses.

We currently have 70 participants signed up to participate in our "Patriot Day" golf event on September 2. This slightly behind our 84 participants from last year, and we are hopeful to pick up a few last minute entries prior to the date of play. "Patriot Golf Day" was organized with the help of PGA of America to raise funds for the Folds of Honor Foundation. The money raised is used to fund scholarships for spouses and children of military service men and women killed or disabled while serving our country.

Snack Shops

Snack Shop revenue missed budget slightly, but continues to exceed budget year-to-date. Snack Shops continue to have a regularly scheduled closing time of 1:00 p.m., however this closing time can be extended based on demand.

Courses

Palm tree trimming began at South and is continuing throughout all the courses, with the exception of Lakes East. Palm trees at Lakes East will be trimmed closer to the reopening. Due to the grow-in at Lakes East, many areas remain too wet for the large trucks performing the trimming.

The revised over-seed schedule was recently released, our email explanation left some golfers wondering as to the reasons behind this decision. First, there was an incorrect date for the overlap period, it should have read October 17-21. Second, the overlap period is a result of moving the first wave of courses starting date from September 26 to October 3. Moving the date back into October increases our chances of having favorable temperatures for over-seeding, thereby increasing our chances of a successful over-seed.

As a reminder, as we move into September rough heights will be raised. The higher height of cut helps protect the rough from cart traffic as it moves into dormancy and throughout the winter. The height of cut is not raised to increase difficulty, though increased difficulty is a by-product of this procedure. We thank you for your patience and understanding.

This year over-seeding will be expanded to include greater areas around green complexes. This will provide a better surface to those shots that stray from the green surface. The expanded over-seed will also keep stray shots from the excessive bounces and the excessive roll, seen in the past.

All courses have largely recovered from this year's transition and related problems. We certainly understand the concern over course conditions this summer and appreciate the patience that was largely shown during this period. The greens at North as still recovering and will continue to do so all the way up to over-seed. The front nine greens have largely recovered, however there are still several on the back nine that continue to recover. The North maintenance staff, led by Neil Hladik, has put much time and effort into the recovery process, we thank them for their efforts and hope you will also.

The Lakes East renovation is in the final stages of clean up and still on target to open October 22 following over-seeding. We advise Lakes East golfers and homeowners that the new plantings will take time to establish and will appear sparse in the meantime. As the plant-

ings mature, the final design will materialize. The plantings have been designed to allow maintenance from motorized equipment, reducing the amount of time spent on maintaining these areas. This is important if we are to realize any savings from this and future turf reductions. This renovation will have minimal impact on play but will still take time to mature, we again appreciate your patience.

Lawn Bowling/Grounds

Earlier this summer, the greens at Bell were top-dressed and laser leveled. Though this will help in areas that were experiencing untrue draws, there are several areas that have failed to recover. These areas will be sodded the week of August 29th in order to be ready for Fall and Winter play.

The softball field has developed lip in certain areas, between the infield and the outfield. These areas have been marked and scheduled to be corrected the week of August 29.

But I must say that I am truly amazed by many in Sun City AZ who routinely claim that they know nothing about what goes on. All I can say is that information is available.


While the monthly SunViews newsletter provides a wealth of information about RCSC events and club activities, it also includes management reports and corporate financial information. Management reports are presented to the Board at their monthly meetings (typically the fourth Thursday at 9am in the Sundial Auditorium), after which they are posted on the website and sent to those who have signed up to receive RCSC News Email Alerts.

While Members can address the Board at these monthly meetings, comments are limited to three minutes. It is best that concerns and issues be brought to the Directors at the monthly Board/ Member Exchange (typically the second Monday at 9am in Lakeview Social Hall #3). What you have to say is important, but the Board of Directors must determine if your viewpoint is worthy of further consideration.

Property owners, RCSC Members, Privilege Cardholders and Sun City AZ residents need to take some responsibility and educate themselves. If you don't know, please ask. There are numerous resources available and many, many people who are willing to share their knowledge with you.

Once again I will remind you that the RCSC is not a government entity. We are not charged with overseeing the streets, sidewalks nor traffic issues (contact Maricopa County Department of Transportation and the Sheriff's Office). We are not responsible for trash collecting and recycling (Parks & Sons). The only election that RCSC oversees is the one each December for our Board of Directors. While customer service and satisfaction is what we strive for, we don't have all of the answers all of the time.

RCSC staff is more than happy to help when they can but there are limitations. Board Policies dictate the distribution of literature and RCSC properties are facilities to be enjoyed by Cardholders and their guests only. We are not public parks open to all, nor should we have to tolerate trespassers who might vandalize or create an atmosphere that is unacceptable. RCSC has always and will

The wealth of activities and services available throughout our community are numerous. Getting information about all of it from one source is virtually impossible. Hard as we might try.

Management Updates

Financial Report:

Since there is no monthly Board meeting in the month of August, I will include the Treasurer's report information in my monthly report. The balance of unrestricted funds as of July 31, 2016 was \$10,841,131 which includes a \$2.5M cash reserve. Restricted funds include the Preservation and Improvement Fund ("PIF") and the Capital Reserve Fund. As of July 31, 2016, PIF had a balance of \$7,479,237 plus \$638,500 collected in July that was transferred into the PIF account the first part of August 2016. The Capital Reserve Fund had a balance of \$5,000,044 as of July month end.

We have completed August 2016 well within our operating and capital budget year-to-date. Matter of fact, every division has a net operating positive variance from budget.

Bowling:

Bell Lanes recently replaced the underlayment for the bowling lanes. The previous underlayment had too much flex which caused some lane panels to crack. The cost of the project was \$25,000.

Both bowling centers will be installing lane bumpers. Two lanes will be installed at each center. The lane bumpers will make the bowling experience more enjoyable for young children because the bumper will not allow the bowling ball to fall into the gutter. The project was expected to be completed by the end of August, but due to delivery delay the project has been postponed and hopefully will be completed by late September. The cost of the project is \$6,000.

Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments in July decreased by 32% from the June high. In spite of this decrease, overall accounts receivables decreased by just under 2% in July. The Over 90 day balances increased in July by 31% and reflects the continued aging of April past due balances. June assessments went 30 days past due at a 5.5% rate while May assessments went 60 days past due at a 2.9% rate. Payments from our third party collections firm were down slightly in July with year to date payments totaling \$147,245.

Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal in July totaled \$78,230. Year to date web portal payments total \$593,343. Web portal payments are up 40% YTD compared with 2015 and 97% YTD compared to 2014.

In July property transfer related balances decreased by 3.6% and lender owned related balances decreased by 3%. This was the sixth month in a row lender owned balances have decreased and continue to be significantly below prior year's balances. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent approximately 54% of all receivables due and 53% of past due balances.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties increased to 42 properties at the end of July. The number of properties owned by lending institutions decreased again this month to 17 properties.

Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in July were \$638,000, which is \$239,000, or 60%, over the amount budgeted. Year to date PIF fees are \$4,995,600 which is \$1,604,100, or 47%, over budget for the year. The year to date total is up 20% from 2015. Again a reminder that we intentionally budget PIF income very conservatively to assure that we have the cash on hand for any planned project as we remain debt free.

Human Resources:

Employee voluntary CPR/AED/and First Aid training classes are now completed for this series. Seventy seven employees have completed the training and have received their two year certification. Future training classes will be held on a semi-annual schedule to offer new hires the training opportunity.

Federal, state and local laws require employers to comply with certain labor laws and to post those laws in all work locations to inform employees of their rights. Posting is also required in the Human Resources office where applicants complete job applications. Since the laws change periodically, Human Resources has begun an audit of RCSC's work locations to assure compliance.

Member Services:

On Saturday, August 13 we had our 3rd annual Ice Cream Social Dive-In Movie at the Mountain View Recreation Center. Not only did we show a movie on the big screen by the pool, we also presented a movie inside the auditorium for those who didn't care to get wet. The night was beautiful, the kids had fun watching the family movie in the pool and ice cream was enjoyed by all.

We kick off the fall Sun Bowl concert series at 7pm on Sunday, September 25 with the band voted best in Phoenix, "Faded Jeans." But before we hit the dance floor, we will be attending Casino Night at the Sundial Auditorium on Saturday, September 17. This is a free event from 4-8pm. Doors open promptly at 4pm. Be sure to bring your RCSC photo ID card, as you must present it to attend this event. Key fobs will not be accepted. Donations will be accepted to benefit this year's RCSC Management Team's 2016 non-profit charity of choice, The Sun City Foundation.

In October we will be back in full swing with the fall Sun Bowl concert series. All shows in October will begin at 6:30pm. Watch for information on our 2nd annual Fall Festival at Sundial on Friday, October 21 from 4-7pm. There will be carnival games, prizes, food and dancing to the sounds of one of Sun City's all-time favorites, "Yesterday Once More." This is a free event for RCSC Cardholders and their escorted guests. Come feel like a kid again! Play games, eat carnival food and do some good old time dancing!

Project Updates

General Information

Toilets and lavatories continue to be replaced at all on-course golf restrooms. To
date the RCSC plumber has completed installations at both buildings at Riverview,
Lakes West and Willowcreek, one restroom building at North course and one restroom building at Lakes East. It has been determined that only eight hollow metal
doors need replacement at the on-course restrooms. These doors are on order and
will be installed soon after their arrival. The door installations will be completed by
D.H. Pace. (Approximate Cost – \$23,000)

Oakmont Center

The Oakmont auditorium renovation project is now underway. This project
includes removal of the auditorium stage, construction of a short section of wall
and the installation of a new ceiling with dimmable LED light fixtures. Contractors
for this project included Ace Acoustics and Kowalski Electric. (Cost – \$34,505)

Grand Avenue Property

The newly acquired Grand Avenue property recently received a landscaping clean
up, trash removal, two backflow preventer rebuilds and a replacement of a third
backflow preventer. In addition, a large leak in a pressurized two-inch irrigation
pipe was located and repaired. Contractors completing this work included Property Preservation Services and Sunland Plumbing. (Cost – \$7,890)

Lakeview Center / Duffeeland Dog Park

- Two new shade canopies at Duffeeland Dog Park are now installed. Contractor was USA Shade. (Cost – \$15,097)
- The remodeling of the east Lakeview Lanes and the upstairs restrooms at Lakeview Center will be postponed until 2017 since restroom proposals are coming in at a much higher cost than budgeted.
- A new floating dock has been ordered for Viewpoint Lake. The new dock will
 accommodate RCSC's existing boats with a couple of additional spaces for other
 lake boats and future growth. The new dock is now expected to be installed in
 October-November 2016. Contractor is Floatation Systems. (Cost \$62,996)

Bell Center

- Renovation of the clubs restrooms is progressing nicely with porcelain tile installation about to commence. Cardholders and guests are encouraged to use the restrooms inside Bell Lanes, the Social Halls or the portable toilet located directly across from the Visitor Center entrance. Contractor is DFG Builders. (Cost – \$94,892)
- The canvas covers were replaced on the two awnings over the entrances to the Bell outdoor shower rooms. Contractor was Phoenix Tent and Awning – (Cost – \$1,982)
- Renovation of the two main Bell Library restrooms will commence August 29, 2016. Contractor is Ken McIntyre Construction. (Cost – \$100,000)
- The remodeling of the west Bell Lanes restrooms will be postponed until 2017 since restroom proposals are coming in at a much higher cost than budgeted.

Sundial Center

• The Sundial pool, fitness, spas and men's shower room project is winding down. This project included resurfacing of the epoxy pool deck, installation of two new horizontal sand filters and 15hp pump on the large swimming pool, stucco repairs and re-painting in the pool area, toilet repairs, carpet cleaning of the fitness room and facility attendant station, installation of quartz counter tops at the welcome desk, light fixture repairs, installation of a wood focal wall with lettering, revisions to the welcome desk check-in computers, repairs of some fitness equipment, installation of electrical circuits and fans over the second row of cardio equipment and a huge clean-up of the entire facility.

The pools, fitness center and spas will re-open on September 5, 2016 but the
men's showers, located in the men's locker room, will remain closed for a few
more weeks. Contractors for this project included: Hardscape Resurfacing, Inc.,
DFG Builders, Aquatic Builders, Accel Electric, J&J's Carpet Cleaning, Lee's Counter
Tops, RCSC Information Technology Department and the Skilled Trades Electrician, Cabinetmakers, Painter, Plumber, Fitness Mechanic and Pool Mechanic. And
finally, a huge thank you to the Sundial Utility team for all the clean-up work they
performed over the duration of this project. (Cost – \$99,800)

Marinette Center

 The remodel of the auditorium, social hall ceiling, main restrooms, kitchen and installation of two new swimming pool restrooms is underway. To date, demolition is completed and the electrical and plumbing rough-in work underway. Contractors are DVP Professional Builders, Accel Electric and Custom Cooling. (Cost – \$259,015)

Skilled Trades Department

 The RCSC Skilled Trades Department completed 319 work orders during the last two weeks of July 2016 and the first two weeks of August 2016.

Centers Operations

- Two water brooms have recently been purchased for Bell Tennis to be used for cleaning the courts. These are more efficient than the two older ones we are replacing and are better ergonomically built for this type of work.
- The RCSC has purchased five additional Harmsco Better-filter Portable Pool Vacuum units so all seven recreation centers will have one for their pool(s) and spas. The portable filters were purchased because the Virginia Graeme Baker Pool and Spa Safety Act, which went into effect December 2008, no longer allows the use of vacuum ports in the side of swimming pools or spas. These portable filters also clear up challenging water problems without wasting water, heat and chemicals. The units can be moved around quickly and easily, which increases efficiency during normal maintenance. We had two of these units available when the last big Haboob hit Sun City a couple of years ago, shutting down a number of our pools. Without these two units our pools would have been out of service much longer. Now, all seven recreation centers will be using these vacuums on a regular basis.
- With recent news of cryptosporidium outbreaks at various pools in the Phoenix valley, it is reassuring that the RCSC continues to enjoy nine healthy swimming pools and ten clean spas. The RCSC believes this is due to our healthy swimming program which requires more frequent pool water chemistry checks, cardholders observing Maricopa County Environmental Services and RCSC rules and carefully maintained Ultra Violet light equipment on RCSC's nineteen bodies of water.

Admission and parking are free.

This year there will be over 40 Sun City artisan and artist groups offering their original and award winning hand crafted and hand painted works for sale. Shoppers will find sterling silver and polished stone jewelry, stained glass, fine art paintings, photographs, ceramics, pottery, needle crafts including quilts and hand-weaving, leather, wood and metal crafts, calligraphy and much more! All made right here in the good ol' USA!

In addition to the outstanding shopping, there will be entertainment, raffles and food vendors. For your convenience, there will also be an ATM on site. This is an event not to be missed. It only happens once a year. Mark your calendar and plan to be amazed at the quality and selection of gifts suitable for the whole family, from newborns to grandma.

Scoring: "Often" scores 3 points, "Sometimes" scores 2 points and "Never" scores 0.

If you scored:

18 to 36: You're doing a great job and are on your way to saving hundreds of gallons of water each month; however, it never hurts to employ a few more ways to save water if you can.

12 to 17: You're off to a good start. Keep trying; and employ more of the tricks we've talk about.

0 to 11: Well, let's just say there's always room for improvement.

Here are a few things to think about to help you take some baby steps and get on the right track:

If you leave the tap running while brushing your teeth, you can waste upwards of 3,650 gallons of water annually if you brush twice daily. That's enough drinking water for a horse for one year (10 gallons per day). Double that for having two people in the household. So, if you are really into saving water, use this nifty trick: for brushing your

teeth try filling a glass with water. Use the water in the glass to wet your mouth and your toothbrush, rinse your mouth after, and then the remainder to rinse your toothbrush. You can do all of this using only eight ounces of water, or less, per brushing!

Washing vegetables in a basin instead of under running water does work. Use that "gently used" water for your indoor plants or your outdoor pots. Don't forget - instead of dumping those ice cubes from your finished iced drink into the sink to melt,



place them on a plant; especially one that would benefit from the "slow watering" as they melt.

We need to keep conservation in mind and start making little changes. Begin with something simple and make it a habit, and maybe you'll find yourself blossoming into a real water conservationist. You never know how easy it is until you really give it a try. Do your part to help conserve - because Every Drop Counts!



They'll accept worn US flags, used cell phones and unwanted pistols,

rifles and ammunition. These are just a few of the tasks performed by the Sheriff's Posse of Sun City. All expenses for items such as vehicles, gasoline, uniforms, radios, computers and other costs associated with operations are funded soley by donations to the Posse. Total savings to taxpayers = \$1.5 million annually.

Sun City PRIDES

We seeing them out in full force, especially on Saturday mornings, with their bright orange shirts and vests shining as beacons of volunteerism, keeping Sun City AZ beautiful by not only picking up litter but also maintaining the landscaping along our boulevards and streets. Maricopa County estimates that the work performed by the Sun City PRIDES (Proud Residents Independently Donating Essential Services) saves taxpayers over \$400,000 each year.

Sun City AZ is also very fortunate to have not one, but two, branches of the Maricopa County Library. Volunteers with the Friends of the Sun Cities Libraries assist those in need with their Book Buddy service, help library staff with shelving books and organizing along with funding for supplies, equipment, speakers and programs. Books Around the Corner Bookstore at Bell is operated by FOTL volunteers and is a great source for gently used books, DVDs, CDs, and more. In 2015, FOTL volunteers donated over 10,000 hours and expended nearly \$30,000 toward library programs, author visits and the like. Again, another superb example of saving taxpayer's dollars.





Tips from Get Fit for Life -

Exercise Mistakes That Lead to Joint Injury

Seasoned exercisers and weekend-war-riors will occasionally suffer joint injury. That injury could be avoided with careful attention to some common pitfalls of exercising:

Doing too much, too soon

Whether coming back from an injury or starting a new exercise program, there is a tendency to push too hard. Joint injury is common when you don't allow the body to adapt slowly to exercise. Every system in your body needs time to



the body to adapt slowly to exercise.

adapt: your muscles, circulatory system, ligaments, cartilage, bones, and joints. Ease into exercise, regardless of how motivated you are to get that workout going. If all goes well, progress with intensity, duration and frequency.

Performing the same exercises all the time

Too much of a good thing, when exercising, can become a bad thing. Your body likes change. Different cardio machines with varied workout approaches, different strength exercises using the same muscle groups, and different stretch routines will bring better results with fewer injuries. Taxing the same muscles and joints in the same way, week after week, can easily lead to overuse injury and wearing down of cartilage. Moving muscles and joints in different directions, with varied intensities, can help prevent injury.

Exercising with improper technique and form – If the seat or resistance level on a cardio machine is set improperly, knee or hip injury can occur; if pivot-point and range-of-motion settings on weight machines are overlooked, shoulder, elbow, knee or hip joint problems can develop; if gait patterns, alignment, and form are poorly executed with body-weight exercises (squats, lunges), the body is at risk with every movement. Diligence and attention to detail is necessary, if joints are going to perform correctly through the required range of motion.

Non-supportive footwear

Records show that as the population of Sun City grew, so did use of our medical equipment. Savings for Sun City residents have been calculated periodically; in 2015, it was estimated that residents saved over two million dollars in cost of equipment for that year alone.


