RCSC Promotes Healthy Swimming

Safe and healthy swimming is one of the hallmarks at RCSC's seven recreation centers and Cardholders and their guests are a key component to pool sanitation.

While all recreational pool facilities must comply with Maricopa County Department of Environmental Health rules and regulations, RCSC goes beyond those requirements to ensure the wellbeing of swimmers, bathers and walkers alike that use the pools and spas.

Although public health code only requires one reading each day to test for chlorine, alkaline and PH levels, RCSC goes above and beyond for your benefit by testing four times per day at each of the RCSC Center's pools and spas. Chemical may need to be added and adjustments are made as necessary to maintain correct water balance.

In addition, the pools and spas at Lakeview, Sundial, Fairway, Bell and Mountain View all currently have or are in the process of being equipped with Ultra Violet (UV) Light Systems this year that will not only reduce the amount of chlorine needed but will further eliminate any bacteria in the water. During this process. all of the water is channeled through a full pipe UV System and completely sanitized before returning to the pool or spa.

The pools and spas at both Marinette and Oakmont will be equipped with UV systems in 2014 when these facilities are scheduled to undergo renovations.

But all the chemicals, treatment and testing can't keep all of the pools healthy and sanitary all of the time. Swimmers must be active participants in helping with these efforts.

Many fear recreational water illnesses (RWIs) which are caused by germs spread by swallowing, breathing in or having contact with contaminated water in swimming pools and spas, not to mention hot tubs, water parks, lakes and rivers – even the ocean. Such concerns may be understandable, but that should not keep those wishing to enjoy the water from doing so.

With all the steps the RCSC is taking and with the continued help and support from Cardholders and their guests, RCSC will be able to maintain healthy pools and spas for everyone's use and enjoyment by following these simple guidelines:

- Don't swim if you have diarrhea. Doing so can spread germs and make other people sick.
- Stay out of the water for at least two weeks after symptoms disappear.
- Avoid getting pool water in your mouth and if you do, don't
- Practice good hygiene. Shower before swimming.
- Take bathroom breaks and wash hands after using the
- If you see fecal matter, immediately report it to the Facility Attendant so that proper measures can be taken.

"With everyone's help, Healthy Swimming is here to stay!" remarked Jim Wellman, RCSC Assistant General Manager, Wellman and his staff are responsible for pool maintenance and sanitation management.

RCSC Debuts Web Portal

RCSC's new web portal will debut later this month which will combine services that were previously processed by separate providers and streamline a number of administrative functions into a single web platform.

Through the new online web portal, RCSC Cardholders will be able to manage routine interactions with RCSC in a variety of ways:

- View property/cardholder assessment balances.
- Make payments on outstanding balances with VISA or Master-Card only. Payments from bank accounts through the E-Check option will no longer be available.
- Run reports for assessment and payment history on a prop-
- Book golf tee times. This function will be available at noon, five days prior to the booking date.
- View golf play history.
- View pro shop purchases, including items purchased in the golf course pro shops and Cardholder Services as well as check-ins at RCSC Centers.
- Manage participation in e-mail alerts and communications from RCSC.
- Online voting for annual Board of Directors Elections.

In order to use the web portal, Cardholders must have an e-mail address on file with Cardholders Services. Those sharing e-mail addresses must the same e-mail address on each Cardholder record for access to be granted. E-mail addresses must also be on file for ownership entities such as Trusts and Corporations to allow web portal access to pay annual property assessments.

As part of the web portal rollout, cardholders who have signed up for email communications will have their email list selections brought into the new web portal. An email communication will be sent to each of these cardholders with information on managing email preferences in the new web portal.

"RCSC is excited about adding another avenue for Cardholders to take care of business through this new portal," said Chris Herring, Director of Support Services. "Those who prefer to mail in payments or don't have computer access will be able to continue using the methods that they prefer." Updates

Financial Report:

Since there is no monthly Board meeting in the month of July, I will include the Treasurer's report information in my monthly report. The balance of unrestricted funds as of June 30 was \$11,830,569 which includes a \$2.5M cash reserve. Restricted funds include the Preservation and Improvement Fund (PIF) and the Capital Reserve Fund. As of June 30, PIF had a balance of \$12,247,984 plus \$599,500 collected in June that was transferred into the PIF account the first part of July. The Capital Reserve Fund had a balance of \$1,000,044 as of June month end. The corporation has operated within its budget for the 2013 fiscal year.

As expected, the three payrolls in May which pushed both the Food Service and Bowling Divisions into a negative variance from budget year-to-date at the end of May have experienced a correction in June, leaving both in a positive variance from budget y-t-d as of June 30. While the Golf Division could not make up for its loss of revenue in the first quarter, the division has held its own in the second quarter.

Bowling Centers:

The bowling staff is now in the process of recruiting league members for the fall season beginning in September. Most leagues seem to be coming back as strong as last year, however; some leagues have weakened. Di Tormanen the Bowling League Coordinator is working diligently to strengthen these leagues.

In August, bowling management will meet with all league Secretaries and Presidents. Director of Bowling Randy Johnson will make a presentation to the league officers and update them on any policy or procedural changes. Representatives from the Metro Phoenix USBC will also attend the meeting and provide updates of playing rules and USBC procedures.

There will be an increase in prices beginning September. Costs will increase from \$2.25 per game for Cardholders to \$2.40 per game and costs for Guests will increase from \$2.50 per game to \$2.65 per game. Contracted leagues for the upcoming season will not be affected. Bowling fees have not increased since 2008. During that period bowling lanes, overhead monitors and lower monitors were replaced; and, new carpet and new lane machines were installed at both centers. The cost of these upgrades was approximately \$500,000, yet there was no price increase until now. Even with this price increase, RCSC still offers the best value in the metropolitan Phoenix area.

Cardholder Services:

The payments on past due assessments increased again in June and were 31% over monthly averages and were the highest in the past year. May billings went past due at a rate of 7.1%, down slightly from last month. April balances went over 60 days past due at the average rate of 3.9%, the lowest rate in the past year. Outstanding balances related to property transfers decreased just slightly in June and continue to represent half of all receivables due.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties reduced down to 58 for the end of June. The number of properties owned by lendsee UPDATES on Page 4

A Moment with President Brasher - A Year Round Community

At monthly Board Meetings, Member Exchanges and in committee meetings, RCSC Members will occasionally bring up the question: "Why do our Corporate Bylaws specify that to be eligible to run as a candidate for the Board of Directors a Member must be present in Sun City 10 months of the year?"

Actually, at this time the Bylaws state a potential Board candidate "must reside in Sun City, Arizona and be available at least ten (10) months of the year." Such a requirement may be interpreted to mean that the Director away from Sun City could be in touch via electronic means, i.e. email, telephone, texting, etc.

Let's take a look at the total picture. The RCSC schedule reflects that there are no Board or Member Exchange meetings in July and August and many of the committees recess during this time period as well. On the surface, one could surmise that we are functioning for only 10 months of the year. However, we are a corporation with a twenty million dollar annual budget and employees to manage; seven recreation centers to operate; eight golf courses to run; RCSC corporate offices, cardholder services and various other sections with full-time operating hours requiring management supervision and personnel decisions.

For the conduct of these myriad operations, Sun City needs corporate oversight and management leadership. The Board of Directors is charged with establishing objectives, approving budgets for the Corporation, and assuring implementation by Management so that the functions of our operations continue in an efficient manner for the good of all our residents. It is important that we continue to elect conscientious Directors who have the above thoughts in mind. We on the Board of Directors schedule our absences as much as possible during this two-month summer window (July-August) and at other times of the year so that sufficient Directors and Officers are present to advise management and ensure our employees are paid in a timely manner.

Were we to have several Directors who are only present in Sun City for six to nine months a year, our actions and efficiency could be severely compromised. Timely decisions by the majority of Directors could be unnecessarily delayed leading to problems with services and inconveniences for employees and members alike.

Seasonal residents who miss summertime in Sun City may not realize that our active lifestyle continues in great fashion.

Outdoor sports begin early and may continue well into the later morning. Golf scheduling begins daily at 6:30am (6:00am on courses with straight-sheet scheduling), and resident golf fees are lower during the summer months. Pickleball and tennis players may be joined at courts very early most mornings. This summer has seen the addition of two paddle boats for members at

Viewpoint Lake (available at no fee at the monitor station by mini-golf). Fitness facilities are available in recreation centers beginning at 5:00am most days. Many club members say that summer is the best time to use club facilities because fewer members are here.

Several significant events also take place between May and September. The Memorial Day Service at the end of May at Sunland Memorial Park begins with moving tributes to our honored veterans. The annual Ring That Bell ceremony on the 4th of July, hosted by Uncle Sam at the Bell Center, was coupled this year with a day of fun and games at that facility that included free bowling. In early September, the Daughters of the American Revolution present a program honoring veterans and POW/MIAs again at the Bell Center. These patriotic and moving events are greatly appreciated. In addition, entertainment in the air conditioned comfort at little or no cost to Carholders happens in June, July and August at the Sundial Auditorium.

While all the above programs are going on, RCSC Assistant General Manager Jim Wellman and his staff do their best to complete as many projects as possible during the summer months, thereby causing the least disruption to residents.

In summary, summertime in Sun City can be what residents make of it, and we at RCSC strive to provide the best for all of us - as we do the rest of the year.

Electronic Voting for 2013 Elections Becomes Reality

With the debut this month of the RCSC Web Portal (see related story on front page), online voting for this year's elections will become a reality. Eligible RCSC Cardholders will have access to the election portion of the portal beginning one month prior to Election Day starting on November 11. Safeguards that restrict each qualified member to only one vote will be in place and confidentiality will be maintained throughout the process. For any members without access to a computer, in-person voting will be held at Lakeview on Election Day (December 10) from 8am to 4pm.

Electronic voting will allow members to vote from any computer, anywhere - home, work, library - whether they are out of town or right here in Sun City.

Candidate packets are still available to anyone interested in running for one of three open positions. Packets must be requested in person at the Corporate/Board Office at Lakeview Center and present their RCSC Member card. The deadline for submission is October 1, 2013 by noon.

Requirements to become a candidate are:

- Must be at least fifty-five (55) years of age;
- Must be a Deeded Real Estate Owner of property in Sun City, Maricopa County, Arizona;
- Must be a Member in good standing;

- Must reside in Sun City, Arizona and be available at least ten (10) months of the year;
- Must meet the requirements to hold an Arizona liquor license;
- Must not be related by blood or marriage to anyone else on the Board of Directors or member of RCSC Management staff; and
- Must be eligible and available to serve a three (3) year term.

Candidates will be required to submit a fully completed RCSC petition, signed by 100 or more Members in good standing, and the other forms provided in the RCSC Candidate Packet.

A successful candidate will have a strong desire to serve Sun City; be fair and courteous; use good common sense; have good communication skills; be willing to work as part of a team; ability to prioritize policy and projects which will have the greatest benefit for the most members; and be willing and able to dedicate the necessary hours to be an effective Director.

Candidates will be introduced at both the October 31 and November 21 Board meetings and a candidate forum will be held in the fall. Date and location will be announced at a later time.

Project Updates

General Centers Projects / Information

• Installation of the Photo Voltaic (PV-Electricity producing) systems is winding down with the last solar equipment connections made at Lakeview the weekend of July 18. The following systems are online and producing power at the time of this report: Marinette, Oakmont, Quail Run Maintenance, Lakes Pro and WB/WC Maintenance. Solar systems at Bell, Sundial and Fairway will be online late July or early August. Lakeview Center will be the last to come online due to APS transformer and entrance equipment (SES) replacements and relocations which occurred the weekend of July 20.

Mt. View/Sun Bowl Ballpark & Amphitheater

- The permit for the Mt. View pool lighting system and mini golf pole light has been approved by Maricopa County Planning and Development Department. The installation of the pool lighting is expected to commence in early August. Contractor is Accel Electric. (Cost \$40,000)
- The Mt. View Center pickleball court expansion project has been approved. The RCSC will be replacing the existing 4 courts and adding another 3 courts in 2013. All seven court surfaces will be constructed using post tension concrete. Architectural drawings are being finalized so they can be submitted to Maricopa County for building permit and contractor bids. Once all bids have been received, the project will be sent to the RCSC Bid Commission for final project approval.
- The Sun Bowl Ballfield project is essentially complete with grass now planted, the 20' outfield fence installed and the dugouts expanded. Contractors are Wadsworth Golf Construction Company and Western Fence. (Approximate Cost \$200,848)
- The Sun Bowl Amphitheater project is well underway with all grass areas sprayed out for weeds, re-leveled and overseeded with bermuda. Bollard type walkway lighting and new handrails have been installed on the outer walkways, the gravel drain in the bottom of the bowl has been replaced and a new driveway behind the Amphitheater building for food trucks has

been constructed. Contractor is Wadsworth Golf Construction, Accel Electric and Ironwood Gates and Welding. (Cost – \$245,883)

•Four new pool heaters were installed on the Mt. View pool replacing the large Raypak pool heater that continually required repairs and maintenance. Contractor was Aquatic Builders. (Cost – \$21,450)

South Golf Maintenance

• The replacement 6,000 s.f. South Golf Maintenance building is near completion with essentially the fire system and new electrical service yet to be completed. The new metal building will be more fire retardant, offer improved mechanic and maintenance areas and increase security for overnight storage of valuable golf equipment. Contractors to date include Bunger Steel, Inc, Jokake Construction and CCBG Architectural. (Budgeted Cost – \$600,000) (After insurance)

Oakmont Center

- Work is currently underway to remodel the Oakmont shower rooms. The work includes new flooring, wall tile, toilet partitions, vanities, lockers, light fixture change outs and water extractors for the swim suits. Contractor is Ken McIntyre Construction. (Cost \$194,808)
- •The Oakmont pool was recently drained and the fiberglass shell repaired. Contractor was the Jixsco Company.(Cost – \$2,500)

Fairway Center/Quail Run

- Two new florescent light fixtures were installed at the Fairway dog arena. The contractor was Supercharged Electric. (Cost – \$1,500)
- A slump block wall repair was made following damages caused by a motorist who veered off the roadway on Grand Avenue and took out a section of the Quail Run golf course wall. (We are currently seeking reimbursement from the motorist's insurance company. Contractor was Ken McIntyre Construction. (Cost \$4,800)

Lakeview Center

• The Lakeview waterfall pump and motor were replaced in early July. Cardholders and their

guests are once again enjoying this wonderful amenity. (Est. Cost – \$24,700)

- The Lakeview mini golf restroom remodel is complete and remodeling of the Lake- view lawn bowl restrooms are in final stages of completion. Contractors include the RCSC Skilled Trades Department and Interior Logic Flooring.(Cost \$33.774)
- Permits are currently being obtained to install Ultra Violet Light Systems on the Lakeview pool and both spas. The new systems will reduce chlorine usage and further eliminate any bacteria in the pool/spa water. These systems are part of the RCSC's Healthy Swimming program and have proved to be very effective at the Fairway and Sundial pools. Contractor is Aquatic Environmental Services. (Cost \$100,000)

Bell Center

- The Bell Wood & Metal shop expansion project is complete and the Certificate of Occupancy has been obtained. General Contractor was K.L.McIntyre Construction. (Cost – \$540,288)
- The complete renovation of the two Lawn Bowl Greens at Bell Center is nearing completion. At the time of this report, the footings, backboards, plinths, walkways, irrigation system, drainage system and drainage rock have been installed. The root Zone mix is being installed in the greens and sprigging of the Tiff Dwarf Bermuda grass will occur in early August. Contractors include Ken McIntyre Construction, National Turf and Wood Bay Turf Technologies. (Cost \$484.308)
- Replacement of the last four (4) clay tile mansard roofs, with standing seam metal roofing material, commenced July 22. The contractor is Starkweather Roofing. (Cost – \$28,185)
- Permits are being obtained to install Ultra Violet Light Systems on all Bell pools and spas. The new systems will reduce chlorine usage and further eliminate any bacteria in the pool/spa water. These systems are part of the RCSC's Healthy Swimming program and have proved very effective at Fairway and Sundial. Contractor is Aquatic Environmental Services. (Cost – \$102, 178)
- A new pool shower was installed at the Bell

walking pool. The project included re-sloping the cool decking so water from the shower drains properly. Contractor was Aquatic Builders. (Approximate Cost – \$7,000)

 Awning fabric was replaced on the canopy structures at the South bowling entrance and on the East and West entrances to the multiuse building. Contractor was Arizona Bag and Shade. (Cost – \$6,156)

Sundial Center/Riverview Pro/Lakes Pro

- The sign at hole #10 at Riverview Golf Course has been installed by the new sign company. Contractor was Bootz and Duke Sign Company. (Cost – \$7,495)
- Exterior prep and painting of the Riverview pro shop and cart barn commenced July 15. Contractor is Silverado Painting. (Cost \$5,345)
- New LED lighting was installed under the canopies at the Sundial bocce courts. The new lighting will light up the ends of courts 1-8 and also provide some lighting on the concrete sidewalks. Contractor was Accel Electric. (Cost \$7,601)
- Preliminary work is underway for a 4-week August/September shut down of the Sundial elevator. The elevator was installed in 1990 and requires some upgrades including electrical control panel changes, new hydraulic pump, fire system upgrades, installation of a sump pump and ladder in the bottom of the shaft, and dedicated mechanical equipment to maintain the elevator equipment room temperature. Contractors are Otis Elevator and Custom Cooling. (Estimated Cost \$95,781)
- Permits to install Ultra Violet Light Systems on both Sundial spas. (Both pools already have UV systems) The new systems will reduce chlorine usage and further eliminate any bacteria in the pool/spa water. Contractor is Aquatic Environmental Services. (Cost – \$40,596)
- Two electronic display signs have been approved and designed for Sundial. One will be located on Boswell and the other on 103rd Avenue. Permits are currently being obtained from Maricopa County. In addition, a variance is being sought to change the required sign set back from the property line. Contractor for this project is Bootz and Duke Sign Company. (Cost \$102.107)

ing institutions went down to 87 this month. The Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in June were \$599,500. Year to date PIF fees are \$3,708,440.

Human Resources:

RCSC and other employers in Arizona are concerned about the rising cost of Workers' Compensation insurance and carriers providing coverage work closely with employers to control claim costs. Effective loss management and loss control practices rely on the immediate notification of claims. As a result, RCSC employees are trained to report any work related injuries/illnesses immediately to their supervisors and the HR department's management of claims begins immediately. Year to date we have had a total of seven reported claims with three being closed and four remaining open. Medical costs of \$32,560 and lost time wages of \$5,743 have been paid to date. Lost time wages have been kept to a minimum due to RCSC's return to work/light duty program which is an important source in controlling costs.

On July 2, 2013, the Treasury Department and the White House announced in separate blog posts that the Pay or Play Rule (also called Employer Shared Responsibility) is delayed for one year. The surprise announcement was extremely welcome news for employers which had been working quickly to come into compliance. With the delay, the Rule will now be effective in 2015.

In summary the Rule requires employers with 50 or more full-timeequivalent employees to provide acceptable health plan coverage or face a tax penalty. The blog posts state that the delay was needed to

Golf Report

Pro Shops

June revenue fell \$8,387 behind budget, with Prepaid Green Fees constituting the bulk of the revenue deficit. Daily Green Fees/Cart Fees fell \$1,446 behind budget and Merchandise fell an additional \$1,338 behind budget. Driving Range revenue exceeded budgeted expectations by \$247.

June expenses corrected themselves, including payroll. For the month total payroll was \$10,852 under budget, brining YTD payroll to \$8,509 in savings. The large payroll savings was due to having three payroll periods budgeted in June, as opposed to the correct month, which was May. Total operating expenses for the month were \$43,650 under budget, resulting in YTD savings of \$21,422.

In July the pro shops began collecting donations for the families affected by the Yarnell Fire and the 19 firemen that lost their lives fighting the fire. The RCSC courses joined up to 100 other courses across the state in the "Fill the Boot" effort. Fire boots were placed in each shop to accept donations from members and guests that wished to do so. In addition to the "Fill the Boot" fundraiser, a Skins Game has been set for August 2nd at the North Golf Course. The entry fee for this event is \$20, with half the money going towards a donation and the other half going towards prize money, applicable green fees will be paid the day of play.

Snack Shops

Snack shop revenue followed golf course revenue and missed budgeted revenue by \$1,941, bringing the YTD deficit to \$11,035. Snack Shops experienced the same payroll correction as the pro shops, resulting in gain to Net Operating Excess of \$5,237. For the year snack shops are \$5,803 ahead of their budgeted Net Operating Excess.

Courses

The bunker renovation at Willowbrook has been completed and turf grow in is well underway. On August 12th the back nine of Willowbrook will be open for play; we do not expect the front nine to be open for play prior to overseeding.

The dual aerification at Lakes West has been completed and the results are promising. We encourage anyone that has played Lakes West following the aerification to give feedback on the conditions. July growing conditions have allowed the greens to recover at a quicker pace than the greens that were aerified in May. The dual aerification at Lakes West allowed the course to forgo an aerification in May, while still maintaining proper agronomic practices. With the early success of this process, we are strongly considering incorporating this process at all courses on a yearly basis. This would allow members to continue to enjoy normal playing conditions through most of June.



Sun City Raises Funds for Yarnell Fire Victims

Recreation Centers of Sun City (RCSC) joined in a statewide effort recently sponsored by the Southwest Section PGA in a fundraising campaign to help the community of Yarnell and the victims of the June 30 Granite Mountain Hot Shot tragedy.







Mark Baker Takes to the Road - Again!

Some folks have their bucket list. Others make it up as they go along. Sun City resident Mark Baker is in the latter group.

Baker is one of those people who thrives on change. He finds the thrill in life of doing things he's never done before and works effortlessly at fulfilling his dreams. The kind of guy you talk to for a few minutes and you feel like you've known him for a very long time.

Baker's career as a guitarist meant a life on the road, but he made a living doing what he loved. And Mark continues to make music.

You may have attended his concert last month at Sundial. After spending this past summer on the road camping and visiting family and friends with his wife, Peggy, Baker arrived back in Sun City with barely two weeks to finalize his playlist for the performance. "Some of us just work better under pressure," he joked. Accompanied on a number of songs that evening by his daughter, Caitlin Ramlall, his pride and appreciation of her talents was evident. "She's never really performed in front of an audience" although she did once audition for American Idol; he is glad her first time on stage was with him.

But Baker's enthusiasm for making music with others doesn't stop at family. Several years ago while on vacation in San Francisco, he found himself intrigued by someone playing the ukulele. He went out and bought one the very next day. Later on the thought occurred to him: "I should really start a club," and before too long he had a half dozen people willing to take up the instrument. Today, the Sun City Ukulele Club has over 50 members. Mark likes the instrument so well that he is currently in his third year of study to become an accredited instructor.

However, music is not all that makes the man. Another of Baker's passions is bicycling.

He currently rides anywhere between 4,000 to 5,000 miles each year. "I like to set attainable goals for myself," Baker said, "and cycling is such a great sport." Mark has ridden in the Seattle-to-Portland Bicycle Classic held each summer not once or twice, but nine times. "I don't have anything I 'need' to do, it's more about what I 'might' like to try," he said. Before having knee surgery, he and a group of friends decided to bike from Zion National Park back to Sun City. Using a support and gear vehicle (known as a SAG where one person drives while the others ride), they made the nearly 500 mile trek in 14 days. Mark and his wife have also cycled along the Oregon coast - 560 miles in two weeks.

But Baker was looking for something more and began forming plans for his next big adventure. So with 85 pounds of gear loaded onto his bike, Baker leaves from the Sundial Center on September 3 to embark on "the hardest thing I've ever done in my life," he stated. Or is it simply something he's never done before?

Baker will take to the road once again on a solo bicycle trip from Sun City to St. Augustine, Florida. The ride will be along routes suggested in the maps he's gotten from the Adventure Cycling Association. There will be stretches where he won't see a car for 100 miles or more as he travels the backroads through Arizona, New Mexico, Texas, Louisiana, Mississippi and Alabama. And no hotels. He'll have a tent, but few campgrounds. Through the Warm Showers Community, a world-wide hospitality exchange for touring cyclists, he'll stay with strangers, take a shower and sleep in a bed for the night.

Knowing Mark, he'll make new friends along the way. And by mid-November with 2,700 miles behind him, Baker will ship his bicycle home and fly back to reality.
