Reserved Seating at Sundial Ticketed Shows for 2016

In an effort to improve customer service and better accommodate Cardholder expectations, RSCS is pleased to announce that all ticketed shows in 2016 will have reserved seating in the Sundial Auditorium.

With a great line-up of entertainment scheduled for next year that includes tributes to some of the biggest names in the music industry – from Bob Seger and the Carpenters to Roy Orbison, Garth Brooks, Rod Stewart and Cher - reserved seating means no more arriving hours early and waiting in line until the doors open.

Season tickets, which will be available from November 2 through November 30, are being sold only to RCSC Cardholders (limit one per card) for the unbelievable price of \$154 – that's only \$14 per person for each show (11 shows total) - for a savings of \$33.

Season ticket holders will have the same seat guaranteed for every show in the Sundial Auditorium (does not include free shows nor Sun Bowl concerts relocated to Sundial due to inclement weather).

RCSC Cardholders may purchase season tickets beginning on Monday, November 2 at the Lakeview Clubs Office, Monday through Friday from 8:30am to 4:00pm or calling 623-561-4660 and speaking with a Clubs & Activities Agent (no voice mail or email orders will be processed). RCSC accepts Visa, MasterCard or Discover in addition to cash and personal checks.

While it is understood that all Cardholders may not be available to attend every show, season tickets are transferable to others for your convenience. All ticket sales are final; no refunds will be issued.

Beginning on December 1, tickets for all individual shows will go on sale. Tickets are priced \$17 per person for RCSC Cardholders, \$20 per person for non-Cardholders. Again, with reserved seating, you'll be able to arrive at your leisure with less hassle than ever before.

All 2016 Sundial shows begin at 7pm and doors will still open at 6pm. Gourmet food vendors will arrive 1-1/2 hours prior to show time for those wishing to grab a bite before each concert.

Won't you help us get the word out to Sun City AZ concert lovers who may not arrive until later in the winter?

Board of Directors Election Update

Be Part of the Process - Candidate Packets Due October 2

RCSC Members have just about one month remaining to request a candidate packet and obtain the required signatures before the submission deadline of noon on October 2.

There will be three vacancies to fill in this year's Board of Directors election, with each vacancy being a 3-year term.

Those interested in becoming a candidate must request a packet in person and present their RCSC Member card at the Corporate/Board Office at Lakeview Center.

Cardholders are reminded that candidates are allowed to and may be collecting signatures on RCSC properties during this time.

Requirements to become a RCSC Board candidate are:

- Must be at least fifty-five (55) years of age:
- Must not be related by marriage or birth to any other member of the Board, Senior Management Staff, or Board Candidate;
- Must be a Deeded Real Estate Owner of property in Sun City, Maricopa County, Arizona;
- Must be a Member in good standing;
- Must reside in Sun City, Arizona and be available at least ten (10) months of the year;
- Must meet the requirements to hold an Arizona liquor license (RCSC holds liquor licenses which require Board officers to

be included on the licensing);

- Must be eligible and available to serve a three (3) year term; and
- Must be available to attend Board Candidate Orientation(s).

Candidates must also submit a fully completed RCSC petition, signed by 100 or more Members in good standing, along with all other forms provided in the RCSC Candidate Packet.

A successful candidate will:

- Have a strong desire to serve Sun City;
- Be fair and courteous;
- · Use good common sense;
- · Have good communication skills;

- Be willing to work as part of a team;
- Ability to prioritize policy and projects; which will have the greatest benefit for the most members; and
- Be willing and able to dedicate the necessary hours to be an effective Director.

Candidates will be introduced at both the October and November Board meetings and at two candidate forums that will be held in the fall. Forum locations and dates will be announced at a later

Golf Report

Pro Shops

Once again this year we will be participating in Patriot Golf Day. Patriot Golf Day was organized, with the help of PGA of America, to raise funds for the Folds of Honor Foundation. The money raised is used to fund scholarships for spouses and children of military service men and women killed or disabled while serving our country. Starters will be collecting donations through the pro shops from September 4 through September 7. In addition to our normal fundraising efforts, we will be hosting a Skins game on September 4, open to all golfers; proceeds from the event will be added to our fundraising efforts. The event will begin at 7:00 a.m. with a shotgun start.

Courses

The dual aerification process tested two years ago at Lakes West and implemented on all courses last year was completed on July 28. Aerifying the greens twice, over two days, eliminates the aerification that normally took place in May/June. The dual aerification decreases the total number of days disrupted by aerification, effectively increasing the number of days available to play for year round residents.

The Riverview project is progressing as planned and remains on track for opening following over-seeding. The playable areas of the course finished grassing two weeks ahead of schedule. The final stage of grassing was completed on July 23, which included disturbed areas of the driving range floor. As the driving range floor is a less critical area (though large), the decision was made to delay grassing. By delaying, we ensured water was available throughout the rest of the course for irrigation, without taxing the system. We have had several third parties review the grow-in; all have been impressed with the quality of growth.

Much of the course has returned to near normal watering levels. The greens have been mown several times and are in a rotation of applying fertilizer and top-dressing.

Despite our pleas, interested parties continue to travel onto the course and off of the cart path, causing damage. We beg of everyone to please stay off the course, until it is reopened.

Snack Shops

Snack shop revenue continues to exceed expectations. We continue to thank everyone that supports our snack shops. The snack shops provide a comfortable setting for breakfast or lunch and are open for golfers and nongolfers alike. We invite you to give us a try.

Lawn Bowl

The Lakeview Lawn bowl greens are in the process of growing in, after a successful sprigging. The greens were mowed for the first time on July 24, to remove early growth and the sprigs that did not take. The greens are going through their fertilization program and will be receiving their first top dressing soon. The plinth boards will be GPS'd to ensure they remained level throughout the renovation.

Architect's Report

Riverview Renovation Update

On August 11, residents with close ties to the Riverview renovation along with Board President Dan Schroeder and Board Member Jim Brasher, were treated to a tour of the recently renovated Riverview Golf Course.

The entire course was toured and included a lengthy discussion regarding green design. The most significant change to the course was hole #12 (pictured bottom right). The green was redesigned to provide more "pin-able" locations and to bring the lake more into play. Tour goers were informed that the green can be reached by playing to the left and allowing the ground to funnel the shot to the green. The lake was also significantly deepened and lined to provide more capacity. A short tour of the renovated golf shop and snack shop was also given. As with the North renovation, seating capacity on the patio was significantly increased.

A Moment with President Schroeder -

Bullying - It's Not Just a Kid Thing!

There should be no doubt in anyone's mind how I feel about living in Sun City AZ. I've heard some people say that they feel like a kid again living here or that they're on vacation every day with all there is to do and to keep active.

But sometimes I see and hear things that just don't seem quite right. Maybe you have, too.

"You can't sit there. That's my spot." "Move out of the way. I'll show you how to do it right." Or perhaps club members who might be less than welcoming to newcomers.

I was alarmed after doing a little research to discover that bullying is not just for young people. Peer-to-peer bullying within senior social circles it turns out is quite prevalent, with some estimating that this type of behavior plagues nearly 20% of the seniors who participate in regular group activities or live in senior communities or assisted living facilities.

Bullying often takes the form of negative gossip, public snubbing, exclusion from social gatherings, or cruel treatment by others, causing the victims emotional distress that becomes so severe that that they tend to retreat and isolate themselves. Victims in these settings often keep the fact that they are being bullied to themselves, either because they are embarrassed, or because they have no close friends or family to tell.

Fear, and more likely in adults, shame prevents them from reporting this type of behavior.


Many senior living communities and facilities have enacted rules and procedures to address residents concerns about this matter, and I am proud that the RCSC has such protocols in place.

It is clearly stated in the RCSC Code of Conduct and RCSC Rules & Regulations (Board Policy 10) that Cardholders and their guests must not "jeopardize or interfere with the rights and privileges of others" and that such unbecoming behavior may result in disciplinary action. This includes indecent or

abusive language. Furthermore, Cardholders should not harass or abuse, verbally or physically, any other person.

What can you do? Prevent this type of behavior through intervention. If you see it, speak up. If it's happening to someone else, report it.

If such behavior takes place in an RCSC club, the incident should be reported to a club officer who may contact their COC for further assistance to help mediate the situation. If it hap-



complete an Incident Report which are available from any Facility Attendant.

Incident reports reviewed by both the RCSC General Manager and Assistant General Manager and are always kept confidential.

Be as detailed as possible, including the names of anyone who


may have witnessed the event. You should only include the facts

of the situation without any opinions, speculation or commentary.

Updates

Financial Report:

Since there is no monthly Board meeting in the month of July, I will include the Treasurer's report information in my monthly report. The balance of unrestricted funds as of June 30, 2015 was \$10,296,509 which includes a \$2.5M cash reserve. Restricted funds include the Preservation and Improvement Fund ("PIF") and the Capital Reserve Fund. As of June 30, 2015, PIF had a balance of \$3,277,686 plus \$702,200 collected in June that was transferred into the PIF account the first part of July 2015. The Capital Reserve Fund had a balance of \$5,000,044 as of June month end.

We have completed our second quarter well within our operating and capital budget year-to-date. Matter of fact, every division has a net operating positive variance from budget.

Bowling:

Monthly summer No-Tap bowling tournaments are held the last Sunday of each month and end the last Sunday of September with a Scotch Doubles tournament. The tournament is being held at Bell Lanes and all bowlers are welcome whether USBC certified or not.

Bowling league secretaries and presidents are essential to league operations; communication with the bowling centers is also very important. On August 20, 2015 the Director of Bowling Operations, the bowling center supervisors and the representatives of USBC will meet with all RCSC league presidents and secretaries to discuss any RCSC policy changes and USBC rule changes.

Starting September 20, 2015 RCSC Bowling Centers will host a monthly Century Doubles Tournament. The tournament is unique in that the doubles partners ages must add up to 100 years old or older in order participate. The tournament is scheduled to bowl every month until August 2016.

Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments increased in June and were 20% higher than the average for the prior 12 months. Overall past due assessments increased in June by 2.5%. This is most attributable to May billings that went past due at a higher rate of 6.6% and April balances that went 60 days past due at a higher rate of 3.2%. In June the largest increase was seen in the Over 30 Day balances while the Over 90 Day balances were the lowest since November 2013. Year to date payments from our third party collections firm are \$57,499.

Total accounts receivable decreased in June by 3.5% with the most significant change being the flow of balances from Current to Over 30 Days past due. In June property transfer related balances decreased by 8% and lender owned related balances decreased by over 27%. This offset the increases in May. Outstanding balances related to property transfers continue to represent 50% of all receivables due and past due balances.

Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal in June totaled \$58,507. Year to date payments made through the web portal are \$372,868 and represent 3.4% of total payments. This is \$111,916 higher in web portal payments than the same period in 2014, as well as a marginal increase of 1% in the percentage of all payments. We anticipate the use of the web portal to make annual property assessment payments to continue to increase as more cardholders become familiar with this online resource.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties reduced slightly down to 43 properties at the end of June. The number of properties owned by lending institutions decreased as well in June and is now at 33 properties.

Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in June were \$702,200, which is \$324,200 over the amount budgeted.

Year to date PIF fees are \$3,593,048 which is \$1,352,048, or 60%, over budget for the year. Again a reminder that we intentionally budget PIF income very conservatively to assure that we have the cash on hand for any planned project as we remain debt free.

Human Resources:

Human Resources (HR) stays informed on proposed legislative changes to labor laws in order for RCSC to plan for and comply with any changes that do occur. The Department of Labor (DOL) has announced proposed changes to the white-collar overtime exemptions under the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA). If enacted, these changes will significantly impact employers.

Currently, for a position to be Exempt from the Overtime provisions of the FLSA it must meet 3 tests:

a. The fixed salary test – same salary payroll period after payroll period

regardless of hours worked; b. The salary level test – at least \$455/ week (\$23,660/year); and, c. The job duties test – duties within the Executive, Administrative, Professional, Outside Sales, or Computer-related exemptions.

The only announced change is to the salary level test – increasing the level from \$455/week to \$970/week (\$50,440/year) in 2016. However, the DOL is asking for comments about possible changes to the job duties test – changes that could further restrict which jobs are exempt.

There is no exemption for non-profit organizations under the FLSA or in the proposed rule. Thus, the proposed rule may impact non-profit organizations having an annual dollar volume of sales or business done of at least \$500,000. In determining coverage, only activities

Project Updates

Lakeview Center / Viewpoint Lake / Duffeeland

- Duffeeland Dog Park renovations are progressing very well with the block walls, irrigation system and slabs and walkways completed. In addition, ten trees have been planted and decomposed granite spread over all inside areas of the park. Remaining work includes finishing the steel fencing atop the walls, construction and installation of the gates, cleaning up the parking lot and repairing the potholes at both park entrances. Contractors are Wadsworth Construction, Double R Masonry, B&C Tree and Sav-on-Fence. (Cost \$136,213)
- Replacement of the deteriorated vinyl siding on the second level at Lakeview Center is about 70% completed and is expected to be fully completed by the first week of August. Contractor is AAA Siding. (Cost \$16,700)
- The lake wall repairs around Viewpoint Lake are nearing completion. After a boat trip around the perimeter of the lake on July 21 all the recent repairs to the lake wall look good except one by the 103rd Ave overflow. This repair will be cleaned up when the contractor returns to do the remaining five repairs. Contractor is Waterworks by George. (Estimated Cost \$10,000)

Sundial Center / Lakes E/W

- Installation of the new Verizon cell tower and equipment building at Sundial Center is completed, except for the masonry walls around the equipment building. These walls have been delayed as the block to be used must match the center and the block had to be special ordered. As soon as this block arrives, the construction of the wall will commence.
- The 10 remodeled women's shower rooms were completed and reopened for cardholder use on July 8, 2015. Contractor was Robert Porter Construction. (Cost \$171,175)
- The two assisted shower rooms at Sundial also required remodeling due to water damage and are expected to re-open in early August 2015. Contractor is Robert Porter Construction. (Cost \$49,074)
- Preparations are underway to install two unisex ADA restrooms in the lobby area of Sundial Auditorium. The two new restrooms will be located in former storage areas on the West and East side of the lobby. Contractor is DFG Builders. (Cost \$49,848)
- The Lakes E/W golf parking lot has now been totally re-paved and re-striped. Thank You, golfers, for your patience during this project. Contractor was Regional Paving. (Cost \$185,700)

Bell Center

• Renovations of the indoor and outdoor spas and walking pool at Bell Center were completed in early July and reopened for cardholder use. I would like to thank the cardholders for their support and patience while these renovations took place.

North Pro Shop

 New underlayment has been installed and the clay roof tile reinstalled on the North Pro/Snack shop. The deteriorated roof felt underlayment was discovered when the new patio roof was installed in 2014. Contractor was Reliable Roofing. (Cost – \$38,000)

Fairway Center

• Contractor bid proposals have been received and bid commission approval obtained for the installation of artificial grass and construction of a shade structure at the Best Friends Dog Club training facility. As soon as the engineering is completed for the shade structure, the architect will submit this project to Maricopa County Planning and Development Department for the building permit. Contractors include Arizona Bag and Shade, Sun Burst Landscaping, and CCBG Architectural. (Cost – \$80,909)

Mt. View Center

• Mt. View swimming pool renovation work was completed and the pool reopened for cardholder use on Friday July 17, 2015. Contractor was CDC Pools. (Cost – \$102,090)

Riverview Pro Shop Building

• The Riverview pro shop patio and building renovation project continues to progress with the framing of the patio ceiling completed, insulation installed and weather resistant gypsum board installed. The interior portions of the building have been painted, the ceiling grid completed, light fixtures set into the grid, HVAC ducting and diffusers installed, fire sprinklers set in place and all building inspections passed to date. Upcoming work will include finishing of the patio ceilings, installation of exterior lights, flooring work, placement of ceiling tiles in the new grid, installation of a new

service counter in the pro shop, epoxy coating of the patio slabs, reinstallation of offices, installation of interior and exterior furniture, display cases, parking lot seal coating and re-striping, deep cleaning of the entire facility and other miscellaneous items. Contractors include Ken McIntyre Construction, Accel Electric, Regional Paving and CCBG Architectural. (Cost – \$524,236)

Skilled Trades Department

• The RCSC Skilled Trades Department completed 189 work orders during the last two weeks of June and the first two weeks of July. In addition, the Skilled Trades Department cleaned up their shop area and managed to recycle scrap pool and plumbing equipment. The money raised for this scrap metal will be donated to the Sun City Fire Department as they are the RCSC Management Team's 2015 Holiday Celebration recipient. Kudos to the Skilled Trades Department for this endeavor!

Centers Operations Report

- Summer floor maintenance in club rooms, social halls and auditoriums is in full swing. This maintenance consists of stripping and waxing vinyl composition tile as needed. Since this work takes days to complete and is very labor intensive, summer proves to be the best time for this work as many clubs are closed or have reduced hours.
- Pools and spas are now open at all centers. With the re-opening of Mt. View pool, the Children's Pool Hours will return to the regularly scheduled hours as follows: Mt. View: 10am to 1pm, Marinette: 1pm to 4pm, and Lakeview: 4pm to Closing. Don't forget to ask the Attendant on duty for some pool toys to enhance the children's swimming experience!

Water Conservation

Water: Fact or Fiction?

Fact or Fiction? "The choices I make have little or no effect on the grand scheme of water conservation; after all, I'm just one person."

Fiction! The fact is that little things DO mean a lot, and turning off the faucet while you brush your teeth, installing new low-flow showerheads or taking military-style showers, partially filling a sink to wash salad vegetables all at once instead of rinsing them separately under running water (and then dip a pitcher to water plants – interior and exterior) - add up to a lot; and, if everyone implemented these exercises in water conservation it would add up to a lot more. Don't wonder if your neighbors are doing their part in water conservation; just assume they are and join them by doing your part.

Fact or Fiction? "I'm very careful about conserving inside my home, so if I have an occasional leak in my irrigation, I don't need to fix it right away."

Fiction! One slow drip coming from an exterior tap can waste up to 20 gallons daily, which adds up to over 7,000 gallons per year. If you check your irrigation system regularly, kudos to you, because that's a step in the right direction. Broken and misaligned heads can water streets, sidewalks and driveways. Pointless, don't you think?

Fact or Fiction? "If it rains, there's no reason to be so conservative."

Fiction. Arizona receives water from many sources, ground and river, all currently overburdened. We live in the Sonoron desert where droughts are common. Many reservoirs that collect water for Phoenix and the outlying areas are far to the north and east of the Valley, making water conservation right here important to our ground water sources.

Fact or Fiction? "I put a brick in my toilet, so I'm conserving water every time I flush."

Fact... and Fiction. A water dam is a great idea that can save at least a half-gallon of water with every flush; however, using a brick is not a good idea, unless you use one that is designed specifically for this purpose. Bricks can and will disintegrate over time, creating less water displacement and possibly damaging your toilet and plumbing. If you have no other option, be sure to tightly wrap the brick in plastic, but there are a multitude of choices on the market today, all the way from plastics to low-flush toilets. There's always the "plastic-jug-filled-with-water" option, and while we're at it, try the "if it's yellow, let it mellow" method of flushing and flush only every other time.

Seriously, we all need to do our part. Using these simple techniques will soon become such a regular part of your routine that you won't remember doing things the "old" way.


Sundial Men's Club - More Than Just Fun & Games


