The RCSC Board of Directors election results are in. The total number of ballots cast in this year's election totaled 1,100 (75 absentee ballots, 139 paper ballots at the poll and 886 electronic ballots cast

The successful candidates elected to serve on the Board are:

- Stella VanNess who received 883 votes,
- · Jerry DeLano who received 820 votes,
- · David Wieland who received 746 votes, and
- Bruce Alleman who received 677 votes.

RCSC Directors are elected to serve three-year terms. The candidate with the fourth number of total votes (Alleman) will serve a twoyear term, filling a vacancy on the board due to a resignation earlier in the year. The newly elected Board Members were installed at the Board Meeting on Thursday, December 22, 2016.

Congratulations to the winners and thanks to all the candidates for their willingness to serve the community. Outgoing Directors Dan Schroeder, Michael Kennedy and Peter Lee complete their terms of service on the Board on December 31, 2016.

RCSC Board Approves Fee Increases for 2017

With the passage of Proposition 206 by the voters in November which raises the minimum wage in Arizona to \$10 per hour effective January 1, 2017, the RCSC Board of Directors approved the following increases for annual assessments, privilege cards, guest fees and host punch cards, golf and bowling fees, and rental rates for RCSC facilities.

Annual Property Assessments: Effective February 1, 2017

\$496 per year on property assessment basis (from \$474) \$248 per year on per person assessment basis (from \$237)

Privilege Cards: Effective January 1, 2017

Short-Term Privilege Cards (30, 60 and 90 day)

\$75 per month (from \$60)

Annual Privilege Card - \$248 per year (from \$237)

<u>Guest Fees</u>: Effective January 1, 2017 \$2.50 per person per day (from \$2)

Host Punch Cards: Effective January 1, 2017

\$20 for 8 punches per card

Golf & Green Fees: Effective January 1, 2017 Both Executive and Regulation, for both Cardholders and Guests; 9-Hole, 18-Hole and Twilight increase \$1 per round in the winter months (November 1 to April 30); No increases in summer golf fees.

Annual No Fee Golf Pass-All Courses - \$1,550 (from \$1,525)

Annual Surcharge Golf Pass-All Courses - \$800 (from \$775)

Annual No Fee Golf Pass-Executive - \$1,375 (from \$1,350) Annual Surcharge Golf Pass Executive - \$625 (from \$610)

Daily Surcharge Fees:

Per 18-hole round (November 1 to June 30) - \$6 (from \$5) Per 18-hole round (July 1 to October 31) - \$4 (from \$3) Per 9-hole round (November 1 to June 30) - \$4 (from \$3) Per 9-hole round (July 1 to October 31) - \$2 (no change)

Bowling Fees: Effective January 1, 2017

League & Open Bowling-Cardholder - \$2.65 per game year-round (from \$1.90 summer, \$2.40 winter) League & Open Bowling-Guest - \$2.90 per game year-round (from \$2.15 summer, \$2.65 winter) **Bowling Fees: (continued)**

Shoe Rental - \$2.50 per pair (from \$2) Locker Rental - \$18 per year (from \$16)

* Leagues currently under contract are not affected by

this change until next season

Facility Rentals: Effective January 1, 2017

Rates for Cardholders, non-Cardholders and Competitive Play facility rentals have also increased. More information regarding these fees can be found on the website at www.suncityaz.org or by visiting the Clubs & Activities Office on the lower level of the Lakeview Center.

RCSC Cardholders are also advised that the Board voted in December to revise Board Policy 10 (Code of Conduct & Rules & Regulations), requiring proof of age (birth certificates) for children under the age of six in order to enter RCSC aquatic facilities. Photo copies and/or electronic images of such documentation will be sufficient for presentation to Facility Attendants.

Board Approves Video Taping of Meetings in 2017

The RCSC Board of Directors has made the decision that as of January 2017, both the monthly Board meetings and the Board/Member Exchanges will be video recorded and posted on the Sun City AZ You Tube site.

Many in the community had raised concerns that members were unable to attend these meetings for various reasons and that use of this method of communication would enable those interested to stay informed. Anyone attending these meetings will be informed that by attending they are agreeing that they could be recorded.

The minutes will remain as the permanent corporate record of the monthly Board meeting. Video recordings of the Board meetings will maintain on the You Tube site for 120 days.

The Board/Member Exchanges are not a matter of corporate record, and only the last Board/Member Exchange will be available on You Tube, taking the old previous one off when the new one is posted.

Golf Report

Pro Shops

We will be hosting a "Beat-the-Pros" tournament on Thursday, December 8th at Willowcreek Golf Course. This event is held in conjunction with other RCSC Management Team sponsored events that are held throughout the year and raises funds for our annual chosen charity. This year's chosen charity is the Sun City Foundation. The Sun City Foundation supports RCSC members who have outlived their resources through assistance with RCSC annual property assessments and transportation. Through the foundation RCSC members are able to continue using the facilities and remain active and social. The format will be a two person scramble and lunch will be provided by Famous Dave's.

A new instructor, John Martin, Class A PGA Professional, has joined our other independent teaching professionals, Sarah Bakefelt, Bob Day, and Bob Jennings. John replaces Billy Edmundson who recently stepped down from his position. The four professionals conduct our "Get Golf Ready" classes, our free golf clinics held in November and March and are also available for private lessons throughout the year. Contact information for the professionals can be found on the www. suncitygolfing.com website or at one of our golf pro shops. The free golf clinics have been well attended during the fall sessions (October and November). In the past, well over 300 golfers or prospective golfers have attended these sessions. The final clinic will be held on November 19 with a 9:30 a.m. start at Lakes West. Registration for Get Golf Ready classes is also underway, the cost of the classes is \$99 which includes 4 days of instruction as part of group of 8 students or less, as well as a 5th day of on-course instruction. The program covers swing fundamentals as well as golf etiquette and an introduction to golf rules. The program is part of a national initiative of the PGA of America to grow the game of golf.

Snack Shops

Through October, snack shops have exceeded budgeted revenue by \$5,759, we continue to thank everyone for their support. Snack shops are now operating under winter hours and remain open until 5:00 p.m. except in the rare cases of significant inclement weather. We respectfully remind everyone that all food and beverage consumed in the snack shops or adjacent patios must have been purchased through the snack shops.

Golf Courses

All courses are now open from over-seeding. We have been receiving mostly positive comments on course condition, post over-seed and they are appreciated. With the extended period of warm weather, the bermuda grass has not entered full dormancy. Once we have a frost, course conditions will take on a different appearance.

As play increases, so does the stress on our courses. We remind all golfers that we all have a responsibility to keep our courses in good condition. Golfers can assist by filling their divots, raking sand traps, replacing rakes in bunkers parallel to play and repairing ball marks. During times of cart path restrictions, please remember to take your sand bottle to the fairway.

The key dates of the 2017 Willowcreek renovation are as follows:

- February 27, 2017 Work on Willowcreek pump station begins (both courses remain open)
- March 6, 2017 Mainline installation at Willowcreek begins (both courses remain open)
- March 20, 2017 Willowcreek back nine will be closed. (Willowcreek Front 9 Open, Willowbrook Open)
- April 10, 2017 Both Willowbrook and Willowcreek will be closed due to the heavy construction presence around the clubhouse
- November 2017 (Date TBD) both courses open

Lawn Bowling

Dennis Dulaney, South Golf Course Superintendent, has been placed in charge of the lawn bowling greens. The lawn bowl team will continue with the normal day to day maintenance of the greens. Dennis will be responsible for developing the overall agronomic plans for the greens throughout the year.

With the growing season being extended, due to higher than normal temperatures, the amount of irrigation water applied has been increased. As temperatures normalize, we will closely monitor the moisture content of the greens, in an attempt to reach the drier conditions requested by the committee.

Management Updates

Financial Report:

There should be no concern about 2016, all is in order and we are operating well within our budget with all divisions in a positive variance position at the end of October.

Now 2017 that's a different story! No I am not talking about the recent election for the President, I am talking about Arizona passing Proposition 206 which increases minimum wage from \$8.05/hour to \$10.00/hour effective January 1, 2017. That folks is a 24% increase in pay and it doesn't only affect those that are being paid minimum wage, it affects numerous pay scales. This minimum wage increase will have a tremendous effect on RCSC's operating costs in 2017 as 55% of RCSC's current staff are paid under the \$10.00/hour minimum at this time.

In addition this new law requires us to accrue and pay sick time for part-time employees. Approximately 50% of our 375 employees are part-time and this additional cost to RCSC will also increase RCSC's operating costs in 2017.

Finally, it is very important to recognize that these changes will affect many of our service providers and supply vendors as well, therefore, the overall effect of the passing of Proposition 206 is impossible to fully calculate.

With this sort of significant potential impact, RCSC may have to consider fee and assessment increases, as well as, reduced services and benefits. It is important to recognize this doesn't just end with the minimum wage increase for 2017, there is another 20% increase to \$12.00/hour before the effects of Proposition 206 are over.

While some folks may be taking home a bigger pay check starting January 1, 2017, I venture to say that most will not have more when it is all said and done as businesses adjust their prices to accommodate their significant increased costs for operating their businesses.

Bowling:

Signups for the annual New Year's Eve Party at Lakeview Lanes has begun. Doors open at 7:15pm and the party starts at 8pm with a potluck, bowling and prize drawings. The night will end with a champagne toast to the New Year. Everyone is welcome to attend even if you are not a bowler. Stop by Lakeview Lanes or Bell Lanes to reserve your spot as availability is limited.

On October 29 and 30 Bell Lanes hosted the Metro Phoenix Senior Ladies Championship tournament. Entries weren't as high as expected, but this was a new tournament for the Metro Phoenix USBC. The tournament produced \$800 of unbudgeted income.

The RCSC bowling centers will not be hosting the Arizona State USBC Senior Tournament this year or next year. RCSC has hosted the tournament for the past six years. The tournament was always very successful, but

the Arizona State USBC has decided to rotate the tournament between centers in different cities in Arizona.

Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments in October increased slightly from last month but continued to be over 10% of the past due balance. Overall accounts receivables decreased by 3.25% in October. September assessments went 30 days past due at a decreased 5.2% rate compared to the past 3 months while August assessments went 60 days past due at a reduced 2.9% rate. Past due assessments are at their lowest level since September 2011. The shift in receivables from current into the past due category subsided in October with both categories declining this month. Payments from our third party collections firm also increased slightly in October with year to date payments totaling \$179,471.

Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal in September totaled \$79,078. Year to date web portal payments total \$823,140. During this time over 3,100 property owners have used the web portal to make payments.

In October property transfer related balances decreased by 7% and lender owned related balances offset last month's decrease with a 41% increase in October. Outstanding balances related to property transfers are the lowest to date this year and now represent approximately 54% of all receivables due and 55% of past due balances.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City AZ properties increased marginally to 45 properties at the end of October. The number of properties owned by lending institutions also slightly increased this month to 17 properties.

Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in October were \$565,100, which is \$194,100 over the amount budgeted. Year to date PIF fees are \$6,764,200 which is \$2,121,600, or 52%, over budget for the year. Again a reminder that we intentionally budget PIF income very conservatively to assure that we have the cash on hand for any planned project as we remain debt free.

Human Resources:

RCSC has renewed employee medical insurance coverage with BlueCross/BlueShield of AZ for the 2017 calendar year. The provider for dental insurance coverage will change from Mutual of Omaha to Delta Dental. Life and Short & Long Term Disability insurances will remain with Mutual of Omaha.

Employee benefit meetings will be held on December 1 and 2 to provide information regarding the plans and to allow an opportunity for employees to enroll and make changes in current coverages. Also information will be provided regarding the Healthy Rewards Program and the 125 Flexible Spending Account.

The 125 Plan allows employees to set aside pre-tax dollars to provide reimbursement for out-of-pocket medical (continued on next page)

Project Updates

General Information

Toilets and lavatories continue to be replaced at all on-course golf restrooms.
Remaining locations for toilets and lavatories are as follows: four at Lakes East and
four at Willowbrook. The RCSC plumber is committed to completing these locations
in November 2016. Roofing Contractor was DFG Builders (Cost \$24,104). Painting
was done by Exquisite Painting and Lavatories and toilets completed by the RCSC
Skilled Trades plumber (Cost – \$24,857). The four doors (two at Lakes West and two
at Quail Run) are still on order with D.H. Pace and will be installed as soon as they
arrive from the manufacturer (Cost – \$3,961).

Lakeview Center

- A new floating dock on Viewpoint Lake will be installed the week of November 14, 2016 and is expected to reopen the following week. The new dock will now accommodate RCSC's existing boats and has additional spaces for other lake boats and future growth. Contractor is Floatation Systems and the RCSC Skilled Trades team (Cost – \$62,996).
- The security fencing at Lakeview Hillside Park is now put in place. Final painting and hardware installation will complete the project on or before November 30, 2016.
 Contractor is Save-On Fence (Cost – \$21,800).

Bell Center

- Renovation of the two main Bell Library restrooms is now completed. The restrooms were re-opened Monday November 14, 2016. Contractor was Ken McIntyre Construction (Cost – \$100,000).
- The Bell Visitor Center will be relocated into a temporary location, directly east
 of their current location, provided the temporary building permit receives final
 approval. Remodeling of the current visitors center will commence immediately
 afterwards and will include an automatic entrance door, interior wall reconfiguration, LED lighting, ceilings, windows, doors, flooring, furniture, literature displays
 and a new fire alarm panel and sprinkler heads. Contractor is Ken McIntyre Construction (Cost \$132,152).
- The RCSC Skilled Trades department corrected a safety issue at the Bell Ceramics
 Club by re-anchoring with screws, all the shelf standards previously stapled in place.
 In addition, the RCSC cabinetmakers replaced 109 shelves in these cabinets which
 deteriorated tremendously since their installation many years ago.

Marinette Center

- The remodel of the auditorium, social hall ceiling, main restrooms, kitchen and installation of two new swimming pool restrooms at Marinette Center is now completed except for a few small contractor follow-up items. The auditorium and main restrooms were re-opened on November 7, 2016 and the two new pool restrooms opened on November 15, 2016. Please note that the project cost increased \$16,572 due to required floor grinding and leveling in the auditorium, mirrors and track, as well as additional wall tile for the restrooms. Contractors were DVP Professional Builders, Accel Electric and Custom Cooling (Cost \$275,532).
- Plans are underway to pulverize, repave and restripe the West parking lot at Marinette Center. This work will commence November 16, 2016 and is expected to be completed November 23, 2016. Contractor is Regional Paving (Cost \$148,600).
- Plans are also underway to Seal Coat and restripe the South parking lot at Marinette. This work will occur immediately following the repaving of the West parking lot. Contractor is Regional Paving (Cost \$4,575).

Lakes East/West

• The concrete entrance from the street to the parking lot at the East end of Talisman Hall was replaced and re-opened November 7, 2016. Contractor was Ken McIntyre Construction (Cost – \$7,739).

Willowcreek/Willowbrook Maintenance

The WB/WC maintenance building has now been demolished and the site excavated in preparation for the new steel Golf and Skilled Trades maintenance building. Work is currently underway to install footings for the new building and block

security walls. In addition, preparations will commence soon for the building's slab floor, including all utility rough-in components and vapor barrier. Contractors are Doege Construction (Formally DVP Professional Builders), CCBG Architectural and Bunger Steel (PIF Cost – \$1,881,825).

Skilled Trades Department

 The RCSC Skilled Trades Department completed 210 work orders during the last two weeks of October and the first two weeks of November 2016. The new electronic work order software is now being used by all Skilled Trades, Grounds and Audio/Video personnel. The software has significantly reduced work order administration time.

Centers Operations

- Congratulations to the following Facility Attendants: Gina Mullings at Bell Center, Ethel Smeaton at Sundial Center, Karla McKay at Mountain View Center and Sue Finley at Marinette Center for their recent 5-year anniversaries with the RCSC. All make positive contributions to the successful operation of their respective centers.
- Recognition is in order for the utility staff at Oakmont, Marinette, and Bell where remodeling work has recently been completed. The employees at these respective centers were instrumental in cleaning and preparing these areas for cardholder use.
- New American and Arizona flags were recently purchased for the flag poles on 107th and Grand Avenues, between Fry's and Starbucks. The RCSC flag is currently being fabricated and will be installed soon. The RCSC will assume the responsibility of adjusting, monitoring and replacing these flags.

expenses. On October 27, the IRS issued notice detailing the cost-of-living adjustments affecting dollar limitations. The maximum amount an individual can contribute pre-tax in 2017 increased from \$2,550 to \$2,600. Participants are never taxed on the amount set aside for reimbursement.

Recently the HR Director attended a webinar facilitated by Fidelity Investments who holds RCSC Employees 401(k) Plan investments. Fidelity will provide investment advice to employers and employees under a recent Department of Labor Fiduciary Rule. This will be done through advice and education. Education will be available online. As long as our plan is less than \$50 million Fidelity will remain fiduciary. Over that amount the Plan Sponsor must take fiduciary responsibility. No rush, our Plan is currently at \$1.153.000.

Member Services:

On November 1, Season Tickets for 2017 went on sale and 360 Season Tickets to RCSC Cardholders sold on the very first day! On Thursday, December 1, Season Tickets will no longer be available. Individual show tickets will become available at \$17 per ticket per show. These tickets will be available to RCSC Cardholders only. Beginning January 3, tickets will become available to non-RCSC Cardholders if they are available. Be sure to get your tickets now if you want to see the shows.

Tuesday, December 13 at 7pm is our Holiday Extravaganza concert at Sundial Auditorium! We'll have complimentary hot cocoa and hot apple cider. Taking the stage will be the Original Four Preps. This show is free to RCSC Cardholders and their escorted guests. Rec cards will be checked at the door; no key fobs will be accepted. Be sure to get in line early as seating is limited.

People, meeting needs of people is what Sunshine Service is all about. Sunshine Service lends medical and children's equipment to residents of Sun City and we have been doing so for over 54 years. We are a charitable non-profit Arizona corporation and are funded by voluntary contributions and memorial gifts.

While the equipment is available for the use of all residents or visitors staying with residents, the equipment must not be taken out of Sun City on a permanent basis. As a matter of control, equipment is loaned only to Sun City residents.

Records show that as the population of Sun City grew, so did use of our medical equipment. Savings for Sun City residents have been calculated periodically; in 2015, it was estimated that residents saved over two million dollars in cost of equipment for that year alone.



Sunshine Service, Inc has received local, state and national recognition. Awards received include the George Washington Honor Medal for services to the sick and handicapped from the Freedoms Foundation of Valley Forge in Pennsylvania.
