Board Approves Video Taping of Meetings in 2017

The RCSC Board of Directors has made the decision that as of January 2017, both the monthly Board meetings and the Board/Member Exchanges will be video recorded and posted on the Sun City AZ YouTube site.

Many in the community had raised concerns that members were unable to attend these meetings for various reasons and that use of this method of communication would enable those interested to stay informed. Anyone attending these meetings will be informed that by attending they are agreeing that they could be recorded.

The minutes will remain as the permanent corporate record of the monthly Board meeting. Video recordings of the Board meetings will maintain on the YouTube site for 120 days.

The Board/Member Exchanges are not a matter of corporate record, and only the last Board/Member Exchange will be available on YouTube, taking the old previous one off when the new one is posted.

Attention: RCSC Cardholders

As more and more winter visitors return to Sun City AZ, RCSC would like to remind Cardholders of a few items which require your attention when using the facilities:

- All RCSC Cardholders are required to check in with their Member or Privilege Cards (key fobs accepted for entry to fitness, pools and spas; not concerts or free events)
- Host punch cards are purchased by and belong to the Cardholder, not the guest.
- Guests may be requested to show government-issued photo ID when checking in to use RCSC facilities.
- Neither Sun City AZ residents nor spouses of RCSC Cardholder are eligible to be guests.
- Proof of age for 4 and 5 year olds is now required for access to swimming pools. Photo copies or electronic images are acceptable.

Golf Report

Pro Shops

The Beat the Pro event held on December 8 was successful in reaching our established goal of \$2000 with \$2,223 raised for the Sun City Foundation. The pros reverted to their generous ways, allowing 65% of the field to "Beat the Pros." As with any event of this type the volunteers are key to the success. We would like to thank John Dockham for assisting with raffle sales and for monitoring the hole-in-one dressed as jolly old St. Nick. Thanks also go to Rich and Lynn Lybolt for assisting with registration and for aiding our fund raising efforts by selling the tee markers that were replaced at the South Golf Course. We also thank Janine Millette for securing the large number of donations given away in our raffle. Finally a big thank you to all that participated and made this a successful event.

For those that may not know, Sue Presta has recently retired after 12 years of service to the Recreation Centers of Sun City. She will be missed by those she tirelessly assisted with golf event scheduling and rescheduling and by the management staff she kept in line. We wish her well with her retirement. With her departure, Chris Linam, our Pro Shop Manager will take on an elevated role and will be the go to person for event scheduling and merchandise selection and ordering. We wish Chris the best of luck in his new role.

The replacement for the South Clubhouse remains on track for next year. The concept and plans will be presented to the South Green Committee during their January meeting. This presentation is only open to committee members and invited guests. On Monday, January 16 the plans will be presented to all interested RCSC members as part of two town hall meetings. Sales for November were \$948 behind our budgeted goals. Snack Shop revenue for the year is \$4,811 ahead of budget.

Golf Courses

The above normal fall temperatures have broken and pushed the bermuda into dormancy. The weakest overseeded areas have had additional seed applied and will fill in as we move through the winter months. All courses are currently mowing fairways at ¾", this height will remain through the coldest part of winter.

One of the most common course condition remarks we receive involve ball marks and the fact that they are often not repaired. Unrepaired ball marks are frustrating to those that play through them, however not all scars on the putting green are a result of an unrepaired ball mark, they are often a result of ball mark repaired incorrectly. Studies have shown an improperly repaired ball mark can take up to twice as long to heal as a properly repaired ball mark and can cause more damage than not repairing at all. There are new versions of the traditional two pronged ball repair tool, however there is little scientific evidence that they do a better job, any tool can perform the task.

The first step in repairing a ball mark is to insert the tool on the turf edge of the depression, not into the depression itself. Once inserted you want to push the tool towards the center of the depression, do not try to push up the bottom of the depression, this tears the root structure, killing the grass. You want to continue inserting the tool around the turf edge of the crater and pushing into the middle. After you have completely worked the tool around the crater, the final step is to gently tap the turf down with your putter.



A Moment with President Hoffer -

Improving Communication

I can't recall many people who have run for the Board of Directors recently that haven't included improving communications between the Board and cardholders as one of their goals. I know I did. I spent 35 years in the communications game, and thought we could really do a lot to improve the way the Board of Directors communicated to the cardholders.

I was wrong.

Once I became a Director, I saw that the RCSC does a pretty good job of communicating with Cardholders. When I looked around, I realized that there were many avenues and different ways the Board tries to communicate to Cardholders - whether it's the SunViews, electronic signs, the website, email blasts, kiosks, or the two local newspapers. The RCSC does a darn good job of getting information out to you. But that doesn't mean there isn't room for improvement. And I'm happy to announce that there are several things that we on the Board are doing to facilitate that.

The first thing that was actually accomplished by last year's Board, and was implemented in January is the videotaping of the Member Exchanges and monthly Board Meetings. These recordings will ensure that if, for whatever reason, you can't make it to a meeting you can still watch the video of the entire meeting and find out what went on.

One other way that we will be opening up the lines of communications will be at the monthly Board Meetings. When you come to the Board Meeting with a question, the Board will be able to answer your question...keeping in mind we need to stay within the three-minute time limit. It's not meant for a drawn out discussion, but if you have a question and come to the Board Meeting, you should be able to get an answer!

In the same vein, we are going to be expanding the email blasts in the coming year. Whenever the Board decides to put motions on the agenda for the monthly Board Meeting, we will be emailing those who are signed up to receive RCSC News Email Alerts. That way you'll know what's coming up. There

won't be any more excuse for not knowing what the Board will be voting on! We're going to make sure everyone in Sun City AZ that wants to know what is happening, WILL know what is happening!

One other improvement that started taking place in January is the "One on One with The Board." This is your chance to come and meet with the Board President and another Board member with concerns or questions you may have. We have two separate ways to do that. The meetings will take place on Friday and will be listed in the weekly emails, and online as to their date and time. If we have a need to do it more often than once a month, we certainly will. And if you have a question or a comment that you want answered, feel free to schedule a time and come talk with us.

It is this Board's desire to improve communications, both between the Board to the Cardholders, as well as the Cardholders to the Board. We want to give Cardholders every opportunity to have their comments and suggestions heard.

Management Updates

Financial Report:
We have completed November 2016 well within our operating and capital budget.

Bowling:
Lakeview Lanes recently started a new bowling league. The league bowls Wednesday mornings and has twelve teams of four persons per team. The new league will produce approximately \$11,000 of unbudgeted income.

Lakeview Lanes will host the annual New Year’s Eve party on December 31 starting at 8pm. There are still a few openings for bowling, but there are plenty of openings for anyone just wanting to enjoy the party. The cost is only \$20. Please call Lakeview Lanes for more information.

Cardholder Services:
Payments on past due assessments decreased noticeably in November with the rate being 9.2% of the past due balance. While overall accounts receivables increased by 3% in November this increase is exclusive to current assessments with all past due categories staying flat or reducing. October assessments went 30 days past due at just a 3.7% rate while September assessments went 60 days past due at a reduced 2.4% rate. Payments from our third party collections firm also increased significantly in November with year to date payments totaling \$202,979.

Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal in November totaled \$75,637. Year to date web portal payments total \$898,777. During this time over 3,400 property owners have used the web portal to make payments.

In October, property transfer related balances increased by 6% and lender owned related balances markedly increased by 43% in November. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent approximately 56% of all receivables due and 55% of past due balances.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City AZ properties increased marginally to 46 properties at the end of November. The number of properties owned by lending institutions remained unchanged this month at 17 properties.

Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in November were \$658,500, which is \$217,500 over the amount budgeted. Year to date PIF fees are \$7,422,700 which is \$2,533,200, or 52% over budget for the year. Again, a reminder that we intentionally budget PIF income very conservatively to assure that we have the cash on hand for any planned project as we remain debt free.

Human Resources:
This month, RCSC completed three open enrollment meetings to explain 2017 employee benefit plans and to allow employees to make changes in coverage for themselves and their family members. Most of the plans

remained the same, however, we switched to a new dental plan and now offer coverage through Delta Dental.

The IRS increased the amount that an individual can contribute to a Healthcare Spending Account for the 2017 plan year from \$2,550 to \$2,600. RCSC’s plan defaults to the allowable amount enhancing tax savings benefits for employees.

The U.S. Citizenship & Immigration Services published a revised version of Form I-9, (Employment Eligibility Verification for right to work in the U.S.). By January 22, 2017, all employers must use only the new version. H.R. staff completed an online training session and implemented the use of the new form this week.

Member Services:
There are still plenty of tickets available for the individual shows. Beginning January 3, any remaining tickets will become available to non-RCSC Cardholders. Be sure to get your tickets now if you want to see the shows.

The annual Holiday Celebration was Friday, December 9. There were lots of winners! Duck race 1st place winners of the two races won \$404; 2nd place won \$243 and 3rd place won \$162. The Hole-in-One winner won the all-time high amount of \$205. Fifty pies were given away at the Pie Walk. One lucky winner went home with a Christmas tree decorated with \$580 cash. Santa welcomed everyone for a photo opportunity. And as always, the evening concluded with the lighted boat parade on Viewpoint Lake. Thank you, Sun City AZ residents, for sharing this special event with us and for supporting the Sun City Foundation.

Be sure to join us on Wednesday, January 11 at Sundial Auditorium at 7pm as we kick off our concert series with Journey Unauthorized, a tribute to the band Journey. The following Wednesday, January 18, also at Sundial is “Discover Sun City AZ.” Come out and see all that Sun City AZ has to offer its residents. Two sessions are offered: 9am-11am and 6pm-8pm.

We will end the month of January with a tribute to the Righteous Brothers on Wednesday, January 25. Tickets are still available at the Clubs and Activities Office at Lakeview Recreation Center.

RCSC Management Reports are presented at RCSC Board of Directors meetings each month (except July and August), posted on the website at www.suncityaz.org (under the RCSC tab), and are sent via email to RCSC Cardholders who have signed up to receive RCSC News Email Alerts. These reports were presented to the Board at the meeting on December 22, 2016.

Project Updates

General Information

- Toilets and lavatories at all on-course golf restrooms are now replaced. Roofing contractor was DFG Builders (cost \$24,104); painting by Exquisite Painting; lavatories and toilets completed by the RCSC Skilled Trades plumber (cost – \$24,857). The four doors (two at Lakes West and two at Quail Run) are still on order with D.H. Pace and will be installed as soon as they arrive from the manufacturer (cost – \$3,961).

Lakeview Center

- A new floating dock on Viewpoint Lake has been installed. Since the new dock rides higher on the lake than the old dock, new boat loading platforms and gates will be installed as soon as they are received. The new dock is expected to reopen by the end of December 2016 (weather permitting). Contractor was Floatation Systems and the RCSC Skilled Trades team (cost – \$69,095).
- The security fencing at Lakeview Hillside Park is now completed except for the tie-in of the new fence to the boat ramp fencing. Contractor is Save-On Fence. (Cost – \$21,800)

Bell Center

- The Bell Visitor Center moved to their temporary building on Tuesday, December 6, 2016 while the RCSC remodels the permanent visitor center location. The demolition is completed and plans are underway to rebuild the HVAC duct system and west facing windows. The remodeled visitor center will include an automatic entrance door, reconfiguring of interior walls, LED lighting, new ceilings, windows, doors, flooring, furniture, literature displays and new fire alarm panel and sprinkler heads. Contractor is Ken McIntyre Construction (cost – \$132,152).

Marinette Center

- The replacement of the west parking lot at Marinette Center is now completed. The project required the rebuilding of the subgrade in the south section which increased the cost of the project. The parking lot was reopened to cardholders on Saturday, December 10, 2016 (cost – \$192,475).
- Plans are underway to seal coat and restripe the south parking lot at Marinette. This will require a two phase process to complete the work and keep the center open to cardholders. The seal coating will be completed in late December 2016 (weather permitting). The contractor is Regional Paving (cost – \$5,125).

Willowcreek/Willowbrook Maintenance

- The Willowcreek/Willowbrook maintenance building is progressing very well. The concrete slab floor is poured and the steel building structure is currently being erected. Contractors are Doege Construction, CCBG Architectural and Bunker Steel (PIF Cost – \$1,881,825).


Skilled Trades Department







Increasing muscle mass and decreasing body fat are individual processes. These processes can occur simultaneously, if an individual is focusing on changing body composition. A good strength training program will result in more "lean weight" and less "fat weight", over a period of time. Simply put - Building muscle anywhere burns fat everywhere. Specific areas like the belly will see a reduction in fat, as an individual builds muscle throughout the entire body."

"For maximum results, it's extremely important strength exercises be done correctly," states Fortier. "As senior fitness specialists, we introduce clients to the most effective exercise format for strength training over the age of 50. Because of physiological changes to an aging body, strength exercise needs to be approached differently than when we were younger. Muscle isolation, breathing, form, and repetition cadence are critical to effective results."

Perhaps the most difficult part of reducing the belly, is the lifestyle changes required with food. What's accomplished in the gym can be totally sabotaged, by unhealthy eating habits. Following the Glycemic Index, when making food choices, can result in better glucose management and reduced fat storage."
