Golf Course Properties; Respect Goes Both Ways

Sun City AZ is proud to offer residents eight golf courses. We are fortunate to have so many homes adjacent to these properties which help to maintain home values throughout our community. And most residents understand the costs associated with maintenance, renovation and our continued efforts to conserve water, despite that some believe the monies could be spent better elsewhere.

But when a golf course is your backyard, there are a number of restrictions and irritations that may come with such property ownership. We ask all to be mindful of these constraints and show respect for others.

Properties adjacent to RCSC golf courses may not have any structures closer than 25 feet to the property line abutting the golf course. In addition, these lots may not have a fence, wall, rail or hedge built or maintained greater than six feet high within 25 feet of property line adjacent to the course and any fencing in excess of three feet is limited to wrought iron construction. Landscaping on these lots must also be planted in such a manner as to avoid undue obstruction of the view of the golf course.

In short, golf course property owners are required by the community conditions, covenants and restrictions (also known as CC&Rs and enforced by the Sun City Home Owners Association) to maintain these properties to a certain standard due to the fact that they are adjacent to Sun City golf courses.

Golfers, too, are required in turn to show respect to these property owners and their homes. Golfers are not entitled to trespass on someone's property simply because the property is on a golf course. Would you appreciate such treatment if you lived in a house on a golf course?

Golfers are responsible for any damage they may cause to properties along the golf course. While a few homes may be more vulnerable, great care is taken when laying out a course to minimize damages. It is not the homeowner's responsibility (nor their insurance) to absorb the cost associated with any destruction caused by a golfer.

Many feel that Sun City AZ has some of the best run and maintained golf courses in the Valley for their relative low cost. Groundskeepers, starters, and RCSC management

spend time and money to maintain our golf courses to the highest standards at as low a cost as possible, and yet, many golfers do not support these efforts.

Too often people drive golf carts on the shoulders of the green, compress the soil, and then complain about the condition that they created. Golfers are proud when they hit a good iron shot, but oftentimes neglect to repair the huge divot they created.

Many golfers in our community are well-versed in the rules and these responsibilities, respectful of homeowners on the courses and supportive of the course maintenance efforts. There are also many golf course property owners who remain positive toward golfers and are even eager to help retrieve their wayward balls. Staff, too, take pride in helping maintain our courses and are pained when Mother Nature spoils their plans.

We are all responsible for the condition of our golf courses. Let us respect the property of our neighbors, the work and effort of RCSC golf course workers, and those who own property adjacent to the courses. Let us respect what we have here and continue to respect each other.



Golf Report

Pro Shops

Though we exceeded our revenue budget by a substantial amount, total rounds for the year decreased slightly from prior year. In-season rounds out performed prior year, summer rounds were down slightly and the bulk of the decrease occurred in October as a result of the five day overlap of course closures. Though the overlap resulted in fewer rounds, it did provide a much better window for overseed.

On February 9, Lakes East/Lakes West will be hosting the 9th annual Teal Ribbon Tournament, benefitting the University of Arizona Cancer Center for Ovarian Cancer research. This is a 9:30am shotgun start, 9 hole event open to both ladies and men with no handicap requirement. The entry fee is \$30 per person to include lunch at the Sundial Recreation Center following play. Entry forms may be picked up and turned in to any pro shop.

Snack Shops

Total revenue for the snack shops exceeded budget in December, capping off a great year. Snack Shops also met their budgeted net goals for the year. We hope our rainy days are nearing an end and we do remind everyone that the snack shops may close early during periods of inclement weather.

Golf Courses

The preliminary aerification/overseed schedule was presented to the Golf Advisory Committee during the January meeting. We will continue our practice of a single, more aggressive greens aerification. This year we have moved fairway dethatching into the month of May, during which each course will be closed for two days, with Quail being the exception. Moving the dethatching into May will allow for early thinning of the rye grass providing the bermuda with less competition as it emerges from dormancy. Nothing we do will eliminate the problems associated with summer transition, however this process will help us ease into that transition.

During periods of inclement weather, please note that it is never our desire to impose cart path only restrictions, we only do so when the opportunity is high for course damage to occur. Even after restrictions are lifted, there will remain areas that are susceptible to cart damage. We ask for your diligence in avoiding areas that have become saturated, though we realize these areas are not always evident.

Lawn Bowling

All irrigation to all lawns was turned off in November 2016 but they continue to be wet due to excessive rain over the last month. Stimp readings for Bell North were 13.4, Bell South 13.7, Lakeview East 15.3, Lakeview West 15.0, Oakmont 13.8, Mountain View 13.2.

Moisture readings for Bell North were 17.83, Bell South 18.68, Lakeview East 15.42, Lakeview West 16.47, Oakmont 29.99, and Mountain View 16.11.

Mowing is continuing on all lawns once per week to clean the surface. Rolling is being done four times per week when not raining.

The Lawn Bowl Crew replaced two broken backboards at Lake View East and two backboards at Lakeview West. We also replaced a section of backboard at Oakmont.

Bowls USA held the AZ Rinks and Salisbury Singles Lawn Bowling tournaments January 14-18 on the Bell, Lakeview and Oakmont Greens. Some of the best bowlers in the USA and Canada competed. Although there was plenty of rain, the bowlers enjoyed playing on what they consider the finest greens in North America.

Grounds

The recent damp weather has provided ideal growing conditions for weeds. The Grounds crew have given these unwanted plants high

priority. Leaves from our deciduous trees have nearly ended their migration to the ground and have kept our crew extremely busy over the last 30+ days.

The grounds crew is currently in the process of freshening a planter at Oakmont, replacing the current planting of Lantana with a Pygmy Date Palm and Japanese Boxwood. At the Bell Center, the crew is sprucing up mini golf, including removing loose and broken railroad ties and adding river rock. The crews are also awaiting quotes for trimming trees in front of the Bell Center and looking for replacement options for pine trees at the softball field. The pine trees that were removed were considered a safety hazard.





The next Sun City Foundation meeting will be held on Thursday, March 9, 2017 at 1pm in the Lakeview Center Board Room.

Management Updates

Financial Report:

Litigation is pending against the Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. ("RCSC") concerning the organization's authority to assess the Preservation and Improvement Fee ("PIF") used to fund major structural improvements and restorations to the recreational facilities in the community. While RCSC believes the challenge is without merit, RCSC has a responsibility to proceed with caution until the issue is resolved. In view of this, by unanimous vote of the Board of Directors, RCSC has suspended new PIF contracting until further notice. This means the Willowcreek/Willowbrook golf course project and the South pro shop/golf cart storage project scheduled for 2017 will be postponed.

RCSC completed 2016 well within its operating and capital budget for the year. We ended 2016 with an \$821k positive variance from budget in gross income; \$109k of such coming from the golf division alone. In 2016 we operated \$461k better than budget for wages, payroll taxes and employee benefits and we also spent \$551k less on general operating expenses than budgeted. However, we spent \$543k more on repairs and maintenance than budgeted and \$226k more on utilities than budgeted. Additionally, our cost of insurance for the operation of the corporation was \$58k more than budgeted.

Each division operated better than budget as follows: Building & Infrastructure ended 2016 with \$668k positive variance from budget; Member Services accumulated a \$116k positive variance from budget, the General & Administration Division operated \$303k better than budget, Food Service Division had a \$27k positive variance from budget, Bowling operated \$27k better than budget and Golf beat their budget by \$138k. Overall our net excess before depreciation was \$1,279,277 better than budget for 2016.

Please remember that the net excess before depreciation is used for capital expenditures, which always includes any capital project under \$300,000 or one with a useful life of less than 15 years.

Bowling:

The annual New Year's Eve party was held at Lakeview Lanes and 147 bowlers attended. Champagne was provided to all of the party goers to ring in the New Year! Add prizes and drawings and a good time was had by all. As always Roger Beebe and the Sun City Bowling Association did an outstanding job organizing and sponsoring the event.


Beginning February 1, the RCSC Bowling Division will be raffling two bowling balls for RCSC Cardholders that are rostered members of an RCSC bowling league. The bowling balls were donated by Sun City AZ resident Bruce Lamb of Your Strike Shop. There will be two winners (one man, one woman) and the drawing will be held on March 6, 2017.

Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments decreased again in December with the rate being 8% of the past due balance. In contrast to November, overall accounts receivable decreased by 1.3% in December. This decrease was exclusive to current assessments with all past due categories staying flat or increasing. November assessments went 30 days past due at a 6.9% rate, which is the highest monthly rate in three years. October assessments went 60 days past due at an increased rate as well of 4.2%. Payments from our third party collections firm ended the year with payments in 2016 totaling \$211,937.

Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal in December totaled \$57,012. Year to date web portal payments totaled \$955,789, short of the \$1M mark. In 2016 over 3,600 property owners used the web portal to make payments.

Overall Total Accounts Receivable was unchanged in December from the start of the year. A chart of the ending Total Accounts Receivable for the past eight years is below.



In December, property transfer related balances decreased by almost 8% and lender owned related balances decreased by 10% in December. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent approximately 52% of all receivables due and 55% of past due balances.

Trustee sale notices on Sun City AZ properties increased again to 54 properties at the end of December. The number of properties owned by lending institutions remained relatively unchanged this month at 16 properties.

Human Resources:

RCSC offers a workplace wellness program to employees designed to support healthy behavior in the workplace and improve health outcomes. The stated goal is

RCSC Management Reports are presented at RCSC Board of Directors meetings each month (except July and August), posted on the website at www.suncityaz.org (under the RCSC tab), and are sent via email to RCSC Cardholders who have signed up to receive RCSC News Email Alerts. These reports were presented to the Board at the meeting on January 26, 2017.

Project Updates

General Information

- The four hollow metal doors for on-course restrooms (two at Lakes West and two at Quail Run) have been installed. Contractor was D.H. Pace (cost – \$3,961).

Sundial Center

- All Parking lot light poles and fixtures are currently being replaced. The new LED fixtures will produce more light and greatly improve parking lot conditions. Contractor is Accel Electric (cost – \$34,134).

Bell Center

- A new Facility Attendant Welcome Desk is being installed in the fitness lobby. Contractors are Lee's Countertops and the RCSC Skilled Trades cabinet maker (estimated cost – \$4,500).
- New parking lot handicap signs and posts are being installed in the east lot. Contractor is the RCSC Skilled Trades Facility Maintenance Technician (estimated cost – \$1,800).
- A trench drain is being installed at the north end of the metal shop to divert water away from the building. Contractor is Ken McIntyre Construction (cost – \$3,847).
- The Visitor's Center moved to a temporary building on Tuesday, December 6, 2016 so the RCSC could remodel the permanent Visitor's Center. The remodeling work is moving along nicely with drywall and painting completed. Drop-in ceilings and lighting is currently underway. Project completion is expected in early February. General Contractor is Ken McIntyre Construction (cost – \$132,152).

Marinette Center

- Seal coating and restriping of the south parking lot at Marinette is now completed. Contractor was Regional Paving (cost – \$5,125).
- Vertical blinds were installed over three auditorium windows, over two facility attendant windows and over two west facing windows in the fitness center. Contractor was Budget Blinds (cost – \$4,788).

Skilled Trades Department

- The RCSC Skilled Trades Department completed 338 work orders during the last two weeks of December 2016 and the first two weeks of January 2017.

to improve employee health while helping to alleviate the impact of enormous increases in medical insurance premiums.

As an incentive, participants are offered a reduction in their cost of the shared insurance premium. Annually, those individuals participate in a Health Risk Assessment which includes biometric screenings followed by completion of an online health assessment. Screenings, scheduled for next week, include: total cholesterol, HDL cholesterol, blood pressure check, glucose and waist circumference measurement. Those completing the process will receive a reduction in their medical insurance premium for 2017.

The passing of Proposition 206, The Fair Wages & Healthy Family Act, raised Arizona's minimum wage to \$10 per hour effective January 1, 2017. As a result, RCSC's pay ranges required revision and employees pay had to be adjusted to at least the minimum of their range by January 1. In addition, the new law requires employers to post the labor law poster, communicating the new minimum wage, on employee bulletin boards in each work location. RCSC is in compliance with the requirements.

Member Services:

On Wednesday, January 11, we kicked off our Sundial concert series with Journey Unauthorized, a tribute to the band Journey. What a way to start the series! It was fantastic to see all those who came to the front of the stage to dance and sing along with the band.

Discover Sun City AZ, a program designed to let new residents in Sun City AZ become familiar with RCSC, Chartered Clubs and other valuable organizations in our beautiful active adult community was held Wednesday, January 18.

We ended January with a tribute to the Righteous Brothers on the 25th. They wooed our sold out crowd with all the hits that put the Righteous Brothers on the charts!

We have four more shows in February at Sundial that you won't want to miss. Remember, reserved seating tickets are still on sale at the Clubs & Activities Office in the Lakeview Center.

On Wednesday, February 1 we present Strait Country, the most true-to-life George Strait tribute performance in the Valley today. 
March is the month when daylight savings time begins (oops, not in Arizona). *No savings in books--only givings, daylight or no.*

Water Conservation

The "Dirt" on New Washing Machines

Understanding that home laundry accounts for approximately 25% of a home's indoor water use is necessary to understanding the difference between top-loading, front-loading, conventional and high-efficiency washing machines and why you should carefully choose your next purchase.



An important factor to look for when making a washer selection is either a "WaterSense" label or an "Energy Star" label. Front-loaders are more efficient than top-loaders, but both models have major improvements over "conventional" (models with an agitator) and older models.

Traditional Vertical-Axis with Agitators, Better Known as Top-Loaders with Agitators: Still the biggest seller, mostly because of their price, this style includes both new machines and older models, both requiring enough water (normally a considerable amount) in the drum to suspend the fabric in the soapy water. The central agitator then churns the clothes to clean them, but the required amount of water actually limits cleaning efficiency. Newer models of this style have reduced needed water from around 45 gallons to less than 30 gallons per load, but most scored only fair to poorly for water efficiency.

Top-Loaders (WaterSense and/or Energy Star; no agitator): May look like conventional machines from the outside, but have no central agitator and many have sensors to monitor incoming water temperature. Using a sophisticated wash system to flip and spin laundry through a reduced stream of water for the wash cycle and rinsing with a high-pressure spray instead of soaking in a full tub of water cuts way back on water usage.



Front-Loaders (WaterSense and/or Energy Star): Use a "horizontal or tumble axis basket" that lifts and drops laundry into the water. Again, there is no central agitator which makes them easier on your clothes. They use upwards of 30-50% less water than conventional machines and have faster spin cycles. This extracts more water from clothing and shortens drying time. Between washing and drying, these front loaders use approximately 60% less energy in total.

Both top-loaders with no agitator and front-loader models may require special low-suds detergent, so check with a sales rep for recommendations. The wrong soap can cause new machines with their sensors to add time to the rinse cycle. And always remember to select the correct load size or wash only full loads. Newer frontloading machines as well as some models of top-loaders have "auto-load sensing," taking that burden off you. One more sensor to be aware of on new models is the "soil setting." Using the "heavy-duty soil setting" can use more water and extend wash time. The normal setting works for most loads. And one more tip: You can reduce your water use by 30-50% by selecting a washing machine that has a volume under 4.0 cubic feet and that uses less than 6.5 gallons of water per cubic foot.

The arrival of horizontal-axis washers (front loaders) and the recent innovations in ultra, high-efficiency vertical-axis (top load) washers has offered consumers new choices in clothes washers that use less water (and energy) while improving cleaning performance and preserving the quality of the fabric.

There are a lot of great websites out there, including Consumer Reports, that help determine which washer is the best for you - and for conserving water and energy. Now, do something good for you and good for the environment! Go buy that new washer you've been dreaming of and save more money and water, because...






Our membership dues are \$3 a year and you must be an RCSC Cardholder to join.




