Golf & Grounds Report

Pro Shops

Public play on our golf courses is often a topic of discussion in committee meetings. We did see an increase in public play in 2016, mostly due to having all courses available for play during the peak season. In 2016, public play accounted for 6.9% of our total rounds played, guest play accounted for 11.5% of our total rounds. Annual Surcharge Fee pass holders accounted for 51.9% of our total rounds.

On Monday, March 6, we will be hosting a demo day at Riverview Golf Course from 9:00am to 2:00pm. This year we will be adding Callaway Golf as a vendor; other vendors include Ping, Wilson, Taylor-Made and Cleveland/Srixon.

On February 9, Lakes East/Lakes West hosted the 9th Annual Teal Ribbon Tournament. The event was successful once again due to the efforts of Laurel Pracht and many volunteers. This year, the event raised in excess of \$19,000 for the Arizona Cancer Center for Ovarian Cancer Research. Sincere thanks to those that participated in this fun event. If you did not play this year, we hope to see you next year.

On Thursday, March 9, the 3rd Annual Can/Am tournament will be held at the South Course. The format will be a two person best ball with an 8:00am shotgun start. The cup will be awarded to the team with the most winning pairs. In addition to the cup, prizes will be awarded equally between the American and Canadian teams, as well as prizes for longest drive and closest to the pin. A Pebble Beach vacation will be awarded for a hole in one on hole eleven.

Golf Courses

We are entering our busiest time of the year as more people come to enjoy our beautiful spring temperatures. The warmer temperatures also provide for better growing conditions, allowing turf to grow with more vigor and damage to heal more quickly. Though damage does heal faster, we still need golfer assistance in repairing ball marks and filling divots. With increased play, slow play instances become more likely. We ask everyone to please practice ready golf by: playing your shot as soon as possible, when it doesn't interfere with your playing partners or the group ahead, move to your ball whenever it is safe to do so, avoid excessive practice swings, read your putt ahead of your turn and recording scores on the following tee box.

The warmer temperatures will also begin to bring bermuda out of dormancy. We will begin to increase watering, particularly in the roughs. Mowing heights will also be adjusted lower to open up the grass canopy and allow the bermuda to receive more sunlight. We do understand that a good percentage of our golfers prefer a higher (than industry standard) cut, however lowering the cut is necessary as we enter the transition phase between winter rye and summer bermuda.

Grounds and Lawn Bowling

Prior to this past weekend's rains, greens were beginning to need light watering. Watering this time of year is strictly dictated by mois-

ture level readings of the greens. Data is gathered through the use of an electronic moisture meter. Though the bermuda is dormant light water is needed to keep the roots from becoming desiccated. Overall moisture readings were slightly lower than January and with the exception of Oakmont, green speeds were slightly slower.

Weed control is always a topic this time of year, the mild winter and heavy rain have made them exceptionally problematic this year. The grounds crew has weed control as a top priority and with the assistance of the golf course superintendents, have been spraying weeds both for immediate relief and for long-term control. Weeds in high visibility areas are removed mechanically.



A Moment with President Hoffer -

What is the RCSC?

It seems like an easy enough guestion. The Recreation Centers of Sun City, Incorporated is the place you go to enjoy your retirement. It's one of the things that makes Sun City AZ great. But beyond that, there's a lot of misconception as to what RCSC is and what it is RCSC does.

First off, we are a private 501(c)(4) not-for-profit corporation. We are like every other 501(c) corporation out there in that we have no owner, just as your church, or Easter Seals doesn't have an "owner" per se. And because of that, we follow some different rules than you might think. We aren't a governmental unit of any kind, which means we aren't a city council, and we really don't take political stands on most issues unless they effect the entirety of Sun City AZ.

We own and operate eight golf courses, seven recreation centers, five snack shops, two bowling centers, two (leased) restaurants, the Sun Bowl amphitheater, a 33-acre man-made lake, and a dog park. We have over 130 clubs that fall under our umbrella. We have \$95 million in assets with an annual budget of around \$22 million. We employ over 375 people, full and part-time, and about 65% of those folks live right here in Sun City AZ.

We sometimes are mistaken for having jurisdiction over the entire community, and nothing could be further from the truth. We don't have anything to do with your neighborhood (that's SCHOA or your individual condo association). We don't control the medians and the roads (that's Maricopa County). And we have nothing to do with the myriad of businesses that set up shop here.

Unlike most private corporations, RCSC is actually very open. We have two open meetings with the Board of Directors every month. We have a Board/Member Exchange, where members of the RCSC can come in and discuss issues with the Board that usually occurs the second Monday of each month (except July

and August when there is no meeting, and November and December when it's the first Monday of the month). We have a Board Meeting open to the public on the last Thursday of each month (again except in July and August when there is no meeting, and November and December when it's a week earlier). We now video tape both meetings and put them on the

Sun City AZ YouTube site.

And we make time on the third Friday of the month for "One-on-One with The Board" sessions where you can meet with Board members and discuss your issues in private.

Management Updates

Financial Report:

We have operated well within our operating and capital budget year to date. Each financial division has ended January 2017 in a positive variance from budget, regardless of the fact that all of the divisions, excluding bowling, had less income than budgeted for the month.

Be sure to join us at the Sundial Auditorium on Monday, February 27 at 6pm for the Annual Membership Meeting where the 2017 Annual Budget will be presented.

Bowling:

The 29th Annual Sun City Open Senior Bowling Tournament will begin April 29 and will run for two weekends. The tournament produces income of \$5k to \$6k. The tournament is open to all senior bowlers in Arizona. It is always a joy to receive the compliments from the bowlers about the cleanliness and upkeep of our two RCSC bowling centers.

Both centers now have lane bumpers installed. Two lanes were installed at each center. The lane bumpers will make the bowling experience more enjoyable for young grandchildren because the bumper will not allow the bowling ball to fall into the gutter.

Bowling Leagues are beginning to wind down, most leagues will finish their season by mid-April and shortly thereafter summer leagues will begin.

Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments started the year positively and jumped in January to 12% of past due balances. While total accounts receivable increased by 1.8% in January the overall past due balances decreased in January by 2.4%. The reduction in past due balances was offset by a larger increase in current category receivables. December assessments went 30 days past due at an increased 7.5% rate, which tops last month as the highest monthly rate in 3 years. November assessments went 60 days past due at a 3.9% rate which is 20% higher than the prior 12-month average.

Payments from our third party collections firm started the year well in January by doubling the January 2016 payment total and being greater than the monthly average in 2016. The total of payments in January was \$18,617.

Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal also started the year strong with payments in January totaling \$97,580 from 242 property owners.

In January property transfer related balances increased by almost 8% and lender owned related balances decreased by 34%. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent approximately 55% of all receivables due and 53% of past due balances. Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties decreased to 50 properties at the end of January. The number of properties owned by lending institutions decreased slightly this month to 14 properties.

Human Resources:

For participation in RCSC's voluntary wellness program, 96 employees completed a biometric health screening for the 2017 calendar year. The next step for those employees is to complete an online Health Risk Assessment. Those employees who complete the process receive a reduction in their share of the monthly medical premium.

RCSC currently has 167 full time employees and we consider 96 participants to be a good rate since approximately 47 employees have medical coverage elsewhere and some employees chose not to participate for personal reasons.

We hear good results of the program such as weight loss, blood pressure reduction, better cholesterol levels and decrease in waist circumference. Raising health awareness is providing goal setting for our employees with the desired results of good health and controlling medical premium rates for both employee and employer.

The Occupational Safety & Health Act (OSHA) requires employers to post information on work-related injuries and illnesses, as well as the average number of employees and total hours worked by all employees each year. Information for 2016 is now available on OSHA Form 300A and is posted on employee bulletin boards throughout RCSC until April 1. Form 300A reports the average number of employees throughout 2016 to be 376 with 523,435 total hours worked. There were 20 reportable on the job injuries.

Member Services:

February's entertainment started when Kevin Sterner and his band gave us the most true-to-life George Strait tribute performance in the valley today. Followed by the Original Grass Roots, which mesmerized the audience with their talent and style. Then we welcomed a tribute to the Blues Brothers by the Fairchild Blues Band, which was full of high energy and thoroughly entertained the crowd. Last night, the #1 rated Tribute Artist of Las Vegas "Yesterday," a Beatles Tribute took Sun City AZ by storm performing to our second sold-out crowd of this season!

Back by popular demand, on Wednesday, March 1 One of These Nights, the #1 Eagles Tribute Band will perform to another sold-out crowd. On Friday, March 3, we will present our 5th Annual Dancing with the Sun City Stars free to RCSC Cardholders and their escorted guests. Doors open at 6pm and the performance begins promptly at 7pm. Then on Wednesday, March 8, all the way from Las Vegas Bee Gee's Gold will be performing to yet another sold-out crowd.

Project Updates

General Information

• The new Viewpoint Lake boat dock was opened on January 6, 2017. The new dock is outfitted with four paddleboats and two rowboats which are available free of charge to RCSC cardholders. Can you believe that the paddleboats alone were used by 527 cardholders from January 6 through February 17? This pleasurable activity is becoming very popular with RCSC cardholders so why not bring a friend and join in the fun at RCSC's Viewpoint Lake located at Lakeview Center. The boats can be checked out at the mini golf facility attendant station during normal operating hours.

Sundial Center

- New parking lot light poles and LED fixtures have been installed throughout the Sundial parking lot. The new fixtures have improved overall lighting in the parking lot and will also reduce electrical usage. Contractor was Accel Electric (cost \$34,134).
- The broken tile cap on the block walls leading into the mall area, from the east and west, is being replaced with a colored solid 16" x 8" x 4" block. Contractor is Ken McIntyre Construction (cost \$10,060).
- Preparations are underway to re-level, re-carpet and paint the eleven Sundial Bocce courts. The repair project will commence sometime after March 18, 2017. Contractor is Ken McIntyre Construction (cost \$111,709).

Riverview Snack Shop

• New window blinds were installed in the south facing windows of the snack shop meeting room. Contractor was Budget Blinds (cost – \$665).

Willowcreek / Willowbrook Patio

 Two in-stock outdoor rated aluminum bulletin boards and a counter with two metal drawers were installed at the Willowbrook/Willowcreek patio area. Counter fabrication and bulletin board installations were completed by the RCSC cabinet maker (cost – \$150).

Bell Center

- A new Facility Attendant welcome desk is being installed in the fitness lobby. Contractors are Lee's Countertops and the RCSC Skilled Trades cabinet maker (estimated cost – \$4,500).
- New parking lot handicap signs and posts have been installed in the east lot. Contractor was the RCSC Skilled Trades Facility Maintenance Technician (estimated cost – \$1,800).
- A trench drain has now been installed at the north end of the metal shop to divert water away from the building. Contractor was Ken McIntyre Construction (cost \$3,847).
- The Bell Visitor Center remodel is now completed and reoccupied by RCSC employees as of February 13, 2017. General Contractor was Ken McIntyre Construction (cost – \$132,152).

Lakeview Center

• Lakeview Social Halls 1-3 will receive new window and arcadia door vertical blinds in early March 2017. Contractor is Budget Blinds (cost – \$3,552).

Willowcreek/Willowbrook Maintenance

 The Willowcreek/Willowbrook/Skilled Trades maintenance building is progressing very nicely. The steel structure is up and steel siding and roofing panels applied. Masonry work on the block walls is completed and interior framing, mechanical, plumbing, sprinkler, electrical and compressed air rough-ins are completed. Drywall and site grading is now underway. Contractors include Doege Construction (formally DVP Professional Builders), CCBG Architectural and Bunger Steel (PIF Cost – \$1,881,825)

Skilled Trades Department

• The RCSC Skilled Trades Department completed 371 work orders during the last two weeks of January 2017 and the first two weeks of February 2017.

Centers Operations

- The months of January and February have seen increased daily usage at all seven recreation centers. In addition, Mountain View has been busy with The Sun City Players Community Theater production. Some other events include: A successful art show at Bell, a number of well-attended concerts at Sundial, and a Pickleball tournament at Marinette that generated a large number of participants.
- A new automatic robotic pool cleaner was recently purchased for the Lakeview pool to replace one that no longer worked. This device is placed in the pool overnight and cleans debris from the bottom of the pool.
- Some new mini-golf clubs were recently purchased for use at the Bell Center.
- Congratulations to Domenic Scarano at Mountain View for his recent 5-year anniversary with the RCSC, and to Rick Oster at Lakeview and Dick Willey at Oakmont on their recent 10-year anniversaries. All three employees perform their jobs with much enthusiasm and attention to detail.



Tuesday, April 11 is National Library Workers Day, a day for library staff, users, administrators, and Friends groups to recognize the valuable contributions made by all library workers. Come to one of our great libraries to see why we have so much to celebrate.

Water Conservation

Water Savings in the Kitchen & Bath

To start in the kitchen, first use a scraper or paper towel to wipe leftovers and FOG (Fat, Oils and Grease) into the garbage. Second, stopper the sink and run a small amount of water for pre-soaking plates, utensils and other heavily soiled dishes instead of rinsing under running water. After that, a quick swipe with a dishrag makes them ready for the dishwasher. Keep in mind that most new dishwasher models clean more thoroughly and require less pre-rinsing than older models and most new detergents work better when dishes are more soiled.

Designate a glass each day for water instead of using a fresh glass every time you need a drink.

Do not use running water to thaw frozen food. Not only does it waste a preposterous amount water, but it's unsafe. As soon as any part of defrosting food becomes warmer than 40 degrees Fahrenheit, bacteria present before freezing can begin to multiply.

Select the correct size pan for boiling veggies and pasta to avoid using more water than needed. Then reuse the leftover water from steamed/boiled food to start a nutritious and tasty broth for soups or gravy. This can be frozen in a freezer container, a baggie (when cooled), or an ice cube tray, a good option that allows you to use on a "per-cube" basis. If you don't want to go to the trouble of freezing it, put it in a jar in the fridge and the next time you make a smoothie be sure to add some of this nutrient rich juice. Just don't let it sit too long in the fridge before using. If you have a little one coming to visit, you can also use it to make pureed baby food from scratch.



Drop some ice cubes? Don't kick them under the fridge! Instead, place them in a plant or a pet's water dish to avoid wasting them. If you're not an ice-chewer, you can also dump remnants of ice water and tea (unsweetened) on plants as well. (Probably not in Fido's water bowl however, especially if there is any remnant of adult beverage on them, including tea!)

Wash fruits and vegetables in a bowl in your sink, then reuse the water for house or outdoor plants (but only If you don't pre-rinse your dishes in it). Keep a jug under your sink and dump your fruit/vegetable water and all those half-glasses of unfinished water, melted ice cubes, Fido's old water from yesterday, etc. When you have enough, you can water any indoor or outdoor plant. It's also convenient if you're on a tight schedule and there's no time for wandering around the house every time you have a few ounces of water. If you keep it in a jug or bucket under the sink, you might be more apt to save and use it appropriately instead of tossing it down the drain.

In the bathroom, keep a bucket in the shower and collect water while waiting for hot water. You can use this to flush the toilet, mop the floors, water landscape, wash the car... you get the idea. If the bucket is clean to start with, the water could easily be used for washing vegetables if it doesn't sit too long.

Have a glass in your bathroom? Fill it up (if it's a small one), take a sip and swish your mouth, dip your toothbrush, add toothpaste and brush to your heart's content. Take another mouthful, swish, rinse and spit; pour remainder over toothbrush to rinse the brush. You just brushed your teeth using 8 ounces of water or less instead of leaving the tap run while your electric toothbrush sings for 2 to 3 minutes. Nicely done, because...

Input Sought Regarding New Golf Rules for 2019

New USGA Rules of Golf are scheduled to take effect on January 1, 2019. By previewing the proposed changes and creating a period of feedback and evaluation, the USGA hopes to create an open forum that allows all who are interested to give their perspective on the proposed new Rules.

USGA intends to finalize work on the new Rules code in 2018 and will allow for a substantial period for education so that both golfers and golf officials will have considerable time to learn the new Rules before they take effect.

You can see written and video resources at usga.org/rules to help you understand these new rules and to give your feedback. The key changes are shown in the graphic below.

In addition, two educational Ouestion & Answer seminars with MIssy Jones, USGA rules official, have been scheduled to explain the proposed changes so that RCSC/Sun City golfers can try them out and get their feedback to the USGA. These sessions are open to both men and women and will be held in Fairway Center Arizona Rooms #3-4 as follows:

- Tuesday, April 4, 2017 at 8:30am, and
- Wednesday, April 26, 2017 at 8:30am.

Your thoughts and comments during this review period are important. It is hoped you'll be able attend one of these sessions or will submit your concerns to USGA directly.

MODERNIZING GOLF'S RULES: KEY CHANGES

The R&A and the USGA released a preview of golf's proposed Rules, which are due to take effect on January 1, 2019. Here are five of the most significant changes.

How to Drop a Ball

You will be able to drop a ball from any distance above the ground, provided it doesn't touch anything and falls through the air when dropped.



Tips from Get Fit for Life -<u>Which is M</u>ore Important? Aerobic or Strength?

"The answer to this question is simple," states Jane Fortier, senior fitness specialist for Get Fit for Life. "Aerobic and Strength exercise are equally important. Because of physiological changes in every aging body, Aerobic exercise and Strength exercise become a necessity. They serve different purposes, each having an impact on the way we feel and the way that we function. A smart workout routine, for anyone over the age of 50, would include both Aerobic and Strength exercise."

Aerobic exercise is continuous motion - doing an activity that has a rhythm, and staying at that activity for a period of time. Outdoor exercising like hiking, walking, jogging, swimming, bicycling, and Indoor exercising with the treadmill, rowing machine, elliptical, stationary bicycle, or NuStep all qualify as Aerobic exercise. The goal of Aerobic exercise is to improve Aerobic Capacity, or the body's ability to

utilize oxygen. Aerobic Capacity diminishes by five to 15% every decade after the age of 30. Your Aerobic Capacity will determine how much energy, stamina, and endurance you will have in a 24-hour period. *"How Much Time"* you spend at aerobic exercise is not as important as *"How Hard You Work"* during aerobic exercise. Elevating heartrate into the Cardio Zone is required, to improve aerobic capacity. Doing so, also improves glucose management, increases overall stamina and endurance, keeps working muscles in good condition, and results in residual fat burn after exercise is complete.

Strength Exercise is entirely different than Aerobic. It isolates individual muscle groups and takes those muscles to total fatigue. The exercise is done in repetitions with weighted resistance. It's not about raising heartrate and pumping fresh oxygenated blood to muscle groups. It's about exhausting a particular muscle group as quickly as possible. Striations or micro-tears occur in the muscle, as it fatigues. The body repairs those striations in the day's rest, that must follow the workout. This process, when done correctly, builds muscle strength and muscle tissue. A balanced, full body strength workout is necessary, so that muscle "in-balances" don't occur. Muscle moves the body and dictates metabolism. As we age, we lose muscle - Sarcopenia is the name given to muscle loss - due to aging. Studies reveal that the average adult loses five to seven pounds of muscle every decade, unless using strength exercise. Muscle makes daily functioning easier, and provides structural support for joints in motion. It needs to be a part of every senior's exercise regimen.





We are a charitable non-profit Arizona corporation and are funded by voluntary contributions and memorial gifts.

While the equipment is available for the use of all residents or visitors staying with residents, the equipment must not be taken out of Sun City on a permanent basis. As a matter of control, equipment is loaned only to Sun City residents.

Records show that as the population of Sun City grew, so did use of our medical equipment. Savings for Sun City residents have been calculated periodically; in 2015, it was estimated that residents saved over two million dollars in cost of equipment for that year alone.
