

RCSC Candidate Packets Available June 1

While the RCSC Board of Director elections may be months away, it is not too early to begin thinking about giving back to the community by becoming a candidate for upcoming Board vacancies. There will be three vacancies to fill in this year's December election, with each being a three year term.

Candidate packets will be available for pick-up on Thursday, June 1, 2017. Those interested in obtaining a packet must make this request in person at the Corporate/Board Office at Lakeview Center (lower level) and present their RCSC Member card. The deadline for packet submissions is no later than noon on Friday, September 29, 2017.

Requirements to become a RCSC Board candidate:

- Must be at least fifty-five (55) years of age;
- Must not be related by marriage or birth to any other member of the

Board, Senior Management Staff, or Board Candidate;

- Must be a Deeded Real Estate
 Owner of property in Sun City, Maricopa County, Arizona;
- Must be a RCSC Member in good standing;
- Must reside in Sun City, Arizona and be available at least ten (10) months of the year;
- Must meet the requirements to hold an Arizona liquor license (RCSC holds liquor licenses which require Board officers to be included on the licensing);
- Must be eligible and available to serve a three (3) year term; and
- Must be available to attend Board Candidate Orientation(s).

Candidates must also submit a fully completed RCSC petition, signed by 100 or more RCSC Members in good standing, along with all other forms provided in the RCSC Candidate Packet.

A successful candidate will:

- Have a strong desire to serve Sun City, AZ;
- Be fair and courteous;
- · Use good common sense;
- · Have good communication skills;
- Be willing to work as part of a team;
- Ability to prioritize policy and projects which will have the greatest benefit for the most members; and
- Be willing and able to dedicate the necessary hours to be an effective Director.

Candidates will be introduced at both the October and November Board meetings and candidate forums that will be held in the fall. Forum locations and dates will be announced at a later time.

Golf & Grounds Report

Pro Shops

February 2016 was a banner year with the help of good weather and leap year. February 2017, on the other hand, suffered with wet weather and posted the fewest number of rounds played during the month in the last four years. Coupled with a wet January, year-to-date rounds are at the lowest level since 2013.

The 2017 Can/Am event was well attended again this year, though down slightly from the 120 participants the year prior. Golfers from both countries proudly displayed their country's colors and flags during their round. The Canadian team won the cup in their 3rd try, winning 12 matches to the American team's 10 matches. Low net scores were divided between Americans and Canadians, with each country paying men and ladies winners. The men and ladies divisions were then broken down into four flights. We thank everyone that participated and look forward to 2018 and a full field.

We have scheduled our first night golf event of the season for April 15th at Lakes East Golf Course. Check-in will begin at 6:00 p.m., dinner will be served at 6:30 p.m. and play begins at 7:30 p.m. The event filled the maximum number of participants in a little over week after entries were made available. We look forward to a fun night under the stars.

The USGA will be updating rules on January 1, 2019. In advance of this change, the USGA has already released proposed changes in an effort to gather the feedback of golfers. The rules will be finalized in 2018, giving the USGA ample time to gather this feedback. In order to better educate Sun City AZ golfers on the upcoming changes, our resident USGA official, Missy Jones, has offered to do two formal presentations. The presentations are scheduled for Tuesday, April 4th and Wednesday, April 26th at the Fairway Center. The presentations will be held in Arizona Rooms 3 and 4 and will begin at 8:30 a.m. Both rooms will be set up to accommodate 200 persons.

Golf Courses

Beginning April 10th slow release fertilizer application will begin at Willow. We utilize an outside contractor for this application, which utilizes large tender trucks. The vendor is familiar with the golf courses and works with the golf superintendents to avoid damaging irrigation. This process is the most efficient way for this application. The process will be completed April 21st at South. The applications begin early enough in the morning to avoid disrupting play.

The combination of wet weather and unseasonably warm temperatures has spurred bermuda growth. Watering of the roughs has begun. Though the rough is not growing at a substantial rate, we have begun to mow these areas to keep them clean. There are some unwanted grasses in the rough areas that grow at a faster rate, mowing helps to keep the rough height even.

Snack Shops

Snack shop sales in February were affected by the reduced number of rounds, with sales missing budget by \$4,813. On a positive note, savings in cost of sales and total expenses allowed the Snack Shops to post a \$196 positive variance to net operating excess.

Lawn Bowling/Grounds

During the last Lawn Bowling Committee meeting, options were presented to the committee to address the irregularities that exist at the Bell Center and Lakeview Center greens. The plan recommended to the committee was to use the funds from a held over Lawn Bowling project to correct issues on the Lakeview Greens, as the funds are sufficient for this project. The Bell greens will be budgeted for a more aggressive fix in 2018 that will address issues on the end rinks on both greens that are affecting the bias of the bowls.

Weeds still remain a priority and an issue at all centers, though they are becoming less prolific. Grassy areas are beginning to transition and are in need of additional watering. We are careful not to overwater areas that are part of our busy entertainment schedule. Landscape plants have started to grow and are trimmed as needed.



Management Updates

Financial Report:

We have operated within our operating and capital budget year to date. Each financial division has ended February 2017 in a positive variance from budget, regardless of the fact that again all of the divisions, excluding bowling, had less income than budgeted for the month.

All divisions except golf ended in a positive net operating variance from budget year-to-date. However, although golf's revenue fell short by \$103k year-to-date, net operating variance only fell short by \$26k.

Bowling:

As fall leagues are nearing the end of their season and the bowling centers are preparing contracts for the 2017/2018 season, all leagues were notified of price increases and contract changes. League contracts are created for the purpose of guaranteeing league pricing, start times and number of lanes used. The contracts also notify leagues of all bowling and RCSC corporate policies and procedures.

Each season we provide all team captains with an information sheet for each bowler on their team. Captains are asked to verify that all contact information is correct. Beginning this season, we are encouraging bowlers to provide their email addresses so they can be notified of any information pertaining to their league including the league start, end, and meeting dates. Previously, we relied on league officers to contact bowlers, however, we feel the new system will be more efficient and reliable by putting the bowling centers in direct contact with all league bowlers.

Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments continued positive in February at 11.5% of past due balances with net past due balances having the largest monthly decrease in almost a year. While total accounts receivable increased by 1.7% in February the overall past due balances decreased again in February by 11.2%. The reduction in past due balances was again offset by a larger increase in current category receivables. January assessments went 30 days past due at a 5% rate, which is back below the average for the past 12 months after a spike in January. December assessments went 60 days past due at a 3.7% rate which continues to be higher than the prior 12-month average.

Payments from our third-party collections firm were lower in February with the year to date total of \$30,480 being below the 2016 year to date total by 8.5%.

Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal also continued strong in February with payments totaling \$100,149 from 236 property owners.

In February, property transfer related balances increased by 1% and lender owned related balances decreased by 18%. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent approximately 55% of all receivables due and 52% of past due balances. Trustee sale notices on Sun City properties held steady at 50 properties at the end of February. The number of properties owned by lending institutions decreased again this month to 12 properties. While the number of properties owned by lenders is extremely low compared to 2016, the number of properties with trustee sale notices is up by 22% in February from last year which may result in increased lender owners later in 2017.

Human Resources:

The Bureau of Labor Statistics through the U.S. Department of Labor requires certain employers to annually participant in a survey providing information on occupational injuries and illnesses. Their purpose is to provide the Department of Labor with accurate information about the safety record of American workplaces. RCSC is a selected employer and we recently provided required information including: annual average number of employees, total hours worked by all employees and information on each work related injury/illness in 2016.

During the first guarter of 2017, RCSC has hired 18 individuals. Eighteen others have left the company for various reasons.

Last week the Director of H.R. met with a Senior Risk Control Consultant from Travelers, RCSC's workers compensation insurance provider. The consultant reviews RCSC's work practices regarding employee safety and provides guidance in maintaining a safe environment.

Member Services:

March is by far the busiest month for Events and Entertainment here in Sun City AZ and we did this month up right. One of These Nights, the #1 Eagles tribute band started off the month, followed by the 5th annual Dancing with the Sun City Stars, Las Vegas Bee Gee's Gold, Sam Morrison's tribute to Bob Seger with Turn the Page, Bobbie Brooks Wilson (son of late, great Motown legend Jackie Wilson), Rob Caudill as Rod Stewart, Las Vegas performer Cookie Watkins as Tina Turner, the Eric Clapton Experience, and we closed out the month with the Heart of Rock & Roll a Huey Lewis tribute.

As we continue to enjoy the great weather at the Sun Bowl in April, remember that all shows in April begin at 6:30 pm. This Sunday, April 2, we welcome another hit Las Vegas show as we present the Doobie Brothers Tribute band.

On Saturday, April 8 at the Sundial Auditorium we will host the second annual Sun City Senior Prom with a Masquerade Ball theme. So find a mask, dress to impress and join us at the Prom. Music will be provided

Project Updates

General Information

Have you noticed that the RCSC has completed several lighting upgrades at its recreation centers clubrooms, restrooms, parking lots, activity areas and the Riverview pro shop? Some lighting installations that really stand out include the Sundial auditorium, Sundial parking lot and various club rooms such as Bell Crafts, Lakeview Sew N Sew and Sundial Palo Verde Artists just to name a few. This year, LED lighting will replace the florescent tubes under all solar carports and light up the Bell mini-golf course like never before. Several restroom remodels will also incorporate LED lighting into their 2017 renovations.

Sundial Center

- The broken tile cap on the block walls leading into the mall area, from the east and
 west parking lots has been removed and new colored 16"x8"x4" block has been
 installed. This repair is now complete. Contractor was Ken McIntyre Construction
 (cost \$10,060).
- Construction is now underway at the eleven (11) Sundial bocce courts. Repair and maintenance work includes removing the old turf, re-leveling the courts, installing new turf and painting the block boarders around each court. Contractor is Ken McIntyre Construction (cost – \$111,700).

Willowcreek / Willowbrook Pro / Maintenance

- A new counter top with drawers was recently installed under the new aluminum bulletin boards outside the Willowcreek/Willowbrook pro shop. Contractor was the RCSC Skilled Trades cabinetmaker (cost – \$160).
- The Willowcreek/Willowbrook/Skilled Trades maintenance building is progressing very nicely. Completion is expected in April 2017 after APS completes a transformer cutover. Contractors include Doege Construction (formally DVP Professional Builders), CCBG Architectural and Bunger Steel (PIF Cost – \$1,881,825).

Bell Center

- A new Facility Attendant "Welcome" desk with quartz top has been installed in the Fitness Lobby. Contractors were Lee's Countertops and the RCSC Skilled Trades cabinetmaker (cost – \$3,350).
- New parking lot handicap signs and posts have been installed in the east lot. Contractor was the RCSC Skilled Trades Facility Maintenance Technician (cost \$1,800).
- The Bell Lanes east restrooms are scheduled for renovation which includes new sheetrock, paint, tile, counter tops, toilets, urinals, partitions, flooring, lighting, exhaust fans and doors. The restrooms will close to Cardholder use and demolition will commence April 17, 2017. Contractor is Doege Development (cost – \$120,026).
- Cool decking repairs were done under warranty on the Bell pool deck. The repairs took the week of March 20th to complete and the pools and outdoor spa were reopened on March 27, 2017.
- The hexagonal kiosk between the library and the Visitor Center has been demolished (actually it pretty much fell down) and a new triple faced block information wall finished in rock and stucco is being erected. The wall will incorporate three LED lighted 60" x 48" outdoor bulletin boards. The wall is part of the Visitor Center remodel and paid for by the estate of Leta J. Lyon Murphy. Contractor is Ken McIntyre Construction.

Lakeview Center

- New vertical window blinds and arcadia door blinds were installed in Social Halls
 1-3 in early March 2017. Contractor was Budget Blinds (cost \$3,552).
- Eight water line tiles were replaced on the Lakeview pool and caulking was applied where needed under the pools cantilever edge. Contractor was Poolman, LLC (cost – \$485).

Fairway Center / Quail Run Pro Shop

- Two conventional 100 gallon water heaters are being replaced with two new "Rinnai" tankless style water heaters coupled with two 119 gallon storage tanks. Contractor is Sunland Plumbing (cost – \$21,854).
- The Fairway walking track is scheduled for repairs and recoating the week of April 17, 2017. Contractor will be Dynamic Sports Construction (estimated cost – \$35,000).

- Bid requests have been sent out for a new Quail Run monument sign which will
 be set between two existing brick columns. The sign will be illuminated using LED
 strips within the sign cabinet. Designs for two very different signs are currently
 being circulated at Quail Run for golfer input.
- Parts are currently on order to replace the two damaged brass cow tongue drains, sign post and stucco repair on the south side of the Fairway library. The damage occurred by a driver who lost control of their vehicle.

Skilled Trades Department

• The RCSC Skilled Trades Department completed 260 work orders during the last two weeks of February 2017 and the first two weeks of March 2017.

Centers Operations

- A purchase of eight (8) stools and two (2) tables has been made for the billiards room at the Bell Center. The cost was just under \$2,500.
- Congratulations to Leon Smeaton for his recent 10-year anniversary with the RCSC. He has been an essential part of the staff at Quail Run Golf Course all these years.
- A new Clarke Scrubber was recently purchased for use in the Sundial locker rooms and rest rooms. The sqaure pad makes it very easy to clean corners.

Conclusion

This board report will be the last one I give in person as Assistant General Manager. As per my request, I will be moving into my new RCSC position as Building and Infrastructure Manager on April 1, 2017. At this time, I would like to say that I have thoroughly enjoyed attending RCSC Board meetings for the last 12-1/2 years and have been amazed by the lively discussions coupled with statements of admiration and appreciation between a bazillion Board of Directors and Cardholders alike. As I take on this new pursuit I do so with respect and gratitude for all fellow Sun Citian's who care deeply about this community and work harmoniously to keep Sun City AZ the BEST retirement community on the planet! May God bless all of you and be sure to say hi when you see me out and about at all of the wonderful RCSC facilities.

Water Conservation

Let's Test (and Re-test) Our Water Knowledge

- 1. To find a leak in a toilet:
 - A. Put dye (a few drops of food coloring will do) in the toilet bowl, wait 15 minutes, and if color seeps into the tank, there is a leak.
 - B. Draw a line in the tank; if water level goes over the line, there is a leak.
 - C. Put dye (a few drops of food coloring will do) in the tank, wait 15 minutes, and if color leaks into the bowl, there is a leak.
 - D. The only leak you have to worry about in a toilet is the supply line, and that will drip on the floor so there is no need for placing dye in tanks or bowls.

Sorry if we fooled you with tanks and bowls, but the correct answer is C. Put a few drops of food coloring into the TANK. If you don't have food coloring and have no reason to purchase any, check with your water company. Sometimes they offer free "Audit Kits" that contain dyes for running this simple little test along with other items that can help conserve water and money.

2. True or False: Thawing frozen foods under hot, running water is extremely "water efficient" and safer than all other modes of defrosting.

Come on! This was in a recent article. Not only does thawing foods under running water waste copious amounts of water, but it could also be harmful to you by encouraging bacteria growth in the thawing foods.

- 3. How much of Earth's water is potable and accessible to humans?
 - A. 3%
 - B. 45%
 - C. 1%
 - D. 2.5%

We used this same question last year, so here's a refresher: while about 2.5% is fresh, potable water, only about 1% is accessible for direct human consumption. Remember the polar ice caps and some deep, underground aquifers make more than half of our fresh water unobtainable.



4. True or False: Blackwater is a great way to water vegetable and flower gardens.

If you recall, greywater and blackwater are two separate things. Blackwater can include raw sewage (urine and feces) as well as food particles (full of bacteria) and is unsuitable for irrigation or reuse for any purpose. Greywater, such as that from laundry machines or floor mopping is fine for reuse on your flower and vegetable gardens.

5. True or False: The best way to dispose of old paint, glue and solvents is to rinse them down the sink or flush them down the toilet.

That is definitely false. Paints, glues and solvents, along with motor oil, lubricants and antifreeze are hard on pipes, watershed and wildlife. These types of products should be taken to an "Eco Station" or other appropriate disposal facility. Even disposed of on the ground, these pollutants can creep into ground water or down rain sewers.

Little steps are good. Lots of little steps can turn into an unbelievable amount of conserved water. Water footprints can be modified to show that you care not only for our planet, but for your grandchildren and their future generations. There is much truth to that familiar saying:







Tips from Get Fit for Life -

Three Reasons to Love Strength Exercise

"Strength Exercise is a valuable tool for active aging adults," states Jane Fortier, co-owner of Get Fit for Life. "It should be part of every senior's arsenal for personal fitness. Continued research by the National Institute of Health and numerous university medical studies supports the following three reasons for falling in love with Strength Exercise!"

It Makes Losing Weight Easier - Love That!

Since muscle is active tissue (unlike fat, which is inert), it requires energy to be maintained. Starting in the 30s, most people (especially women) lose half a pound of muscle a year. After age 60, this rate of loss doubles. Regular strength exercise can preserve muscle throughout the lifespan and rebuild lost tissue. Strength training can provide up to a 15% increase in metabolic rate, which is helpful for weight loss and long-term weight control. For every additional pound of muscle the body gains, it will burn an additional 50 calories a day. Consistent and correct strength exercise, two to three times a week, can result in a gain of 1-2 lbs of muscle and loss of 3-4 lbs of fat, over an 8-week period. The more muscle a body has, the more food that body can burn - without gaining weight.

It Reduces the Effect of Certain Health Risks - Love That!

Strength exercise improves Osteoporosis. When muscles are stressed, the bones they are connected to are stressed as well. This activates "osteoblasts" – cells that build bone density. A strength exercise program that includes muscles connected to the hips, spine and pelvis will help to improve bone density in these areas, commonly affected by Osteopenia and Osteoporosis. Strength exercise reduces the risks of Diabetes. Adult onset (type 2) Diabetes is a growing problem, with over 15 million Americans suffering from the condition. Strength training increases glucose utilization by 23 percent in just four months. As muscles contract and relax, during exercise, they use sugar (glucose) available in the blood stream for energy. Exercise reduces blood sugar levels and decreases the amount of insulin needed for glucose management. Strength exercise reduces Resting Blood Pressure levels. Tests reveal that people who strength train shift from the high-normal RBP category to the normal RBP level. Strength exercise improves the ability of the heart to work, allowing it to pump more blood with less effort. Less effort results in less force (or pressure) on individual arteries.

It Makes Life More Enjoyable – Love That!

Chronic depression can be improved with strength exercise. When strength training is coupled with counseling, clinical depression symptoms improve faster. Sleep patterns become more stable, when a person strength trains. Exercisers fall asleep quicker, sleep more deeply, awaken less often and sleep longer. As a body ages, muscle mass decreases, causing skin to sag and wrinkle. Strength exercise can fight age-related muscle loss and help to maintain a more youthful physique. Building muscle makes everyday activities, such as lifting grandchildren, carrying groceries, and working in the yard much easier. Being in shape builds confidence and self-esteem, and definitely improves quality of life.

Therapeutic Swedish Massage Has Many Benefits

For many people, massage and bodywork are a critical part of their health and wellness strategy—an idea medical professionals are increasingly embracing. In a recent online survey, massage devotees talked about their commitment to regular massage therapy. Many of them would define massage as, "My monthly reset button, helping me to reducing stress, relieve aches and pains and increase endorphins."

Swedish massage is based on the Western concepts of anatomy and physiology, as opposed to energy work on "meridians" in Asian massage systems. Most people get a 30-60 minute Swedish massage, but 90-120 minutes gives the therapist more time to work the muscle tissue and achieve results.

Before the massage, the therapist should ask you about any injuries or conditions that he or she should know about. Things you would want to tell a therapist include areas of pain, discomfort, any allergies, joint replacements, surgeries, and medications you are currently taking. Its best not get a massage if you are ill.

A Swedish massage can be slow and gentle, or more vigorous, depending on the therapist's personal style and your preference. You can also tell them up front if you preference for light or firm pressure. During a Swedish massage you generally undress to your comfort level and lie on the massage table under a sheet covered from the neck to your toes. The therapist uncovers only the part of the body he/she is working on. The

therapist will incorporate various massage techniques that include effleurage, kneading, friction, stretching and tapping. Usually the therapist will check in with you periodically concerning your comfort level; if there is anytime you feel uncomfortable please let your therapist know. They want you to have a beneficial and rewarding session.

Swedish massage sessions can target specific areas of pain like knee, neck and shoulder discomfort, or



it can be used to manage the chronic pain that accompanies conditions like arthritis and fibromyalgia. Swedish massage can help make many painful conditions more bearable. Swedish massage also helps to improve circulation; it facilitates the flow of essential nutrients and oxygen to your body.






