Want A Bigger Voice in Sun City AZ? Candidate Packets Now Available

Now that candidate packets are available for pick-up (starting on June 1, 2017) you have plenty of time to complete the paperwork and collect the necessary signatures to get your name on the ballot for this year's RCSC Board of Directors Election.

To obtain a candidate packet, you must make the request in person at the Corporate/Board Office at Lakeview Center (lower level) and present your RCSC Member card. The deadline for packet submissions is no later than noon on Friday, September 29, 2017.

Requirements to become a RCSC Board candidate:

- Must be at least fifty-five (55) years of age;
- Must not be related by marriage or birth to any other member of the Board, Senior Management Staff, or Board Candidate;

- Must be a Deeded Real Estate Owner of property in Sun City, Maricopa County, Arizona;
- Must be a RCSC Member in good standing;
- Must reside in Sun City, Arizona and be available at least ten (10) months of the year;
- Must meet the requirements to hold an Arizona liquor license (RCSC holds liquor licenses which require Board officers to be included on the licensing);
- Must be eligible and available to serve a three (3) year term; and
- Must be available to attend Board Candidate Orientation(s).

Candidates must also submit a fully completed RCSC petition, signed by 100 or more RCSC Members in good standing, along with all other forms provided in the RCSC Candidate Packet.

Golf & Grounds Report

Pro Shops

During the first quarter of 2017, we recorded 116,426 rounds played, 3,398 fewer than 2016 totals. On a positive note, rounds in March posted the highest total rounds since 2008, a good sign that weather played a strong part in rounds reduction during January and February. We have often reported on the percentage of public play on our courses, using all eight courses as the basis.

We were asked this month, what the percentage of public play would be for the regulation courses only. For the first quarter public play accounted for 9.2% of rounds for the regulation courses and for 8.0% of rounds for all courses. Demand for the regulation courses is relatively even with 1,022 rounds separating the course with the most play from the course with the least play. Lakes West recorded the highest number of rounds, followed by Riverview, Willowcreek, North and then South. Lakes East recorded the most rounds among the Executive courses.

Our first night golf event of the season was held on April 23 at Lakes East Golf Course and sold out. Play was divided into four flights, including a Callaway flight for those players without an established handicap. We opted to play a two person scramble, instead of the announced best ball format. Winners were: Carmen Fish & Bob McGuire (A Flight-Net 23), Ron Williams & Carolyn Williams (B Flight Tiebreaker – Net 25), Terry Hanson & Kim Hanson (C Flight Tiebreaker – Net 22) and John Walker & Pam Walker (Callaway Flight Tiebreaker – Net 31). We are scheduling April 22nd for the event next year; a half moon should be visible during the event. We are also looking to change the food options for next year.

Course Maintenance

With 100 degree days right around the corner, the pace of transition from winter rye to summer bermuda can be expected to increase. To promote bermuda growth, fairway heights are lowered to open the grass canopy which permits the bermuda grass to receive more sunlight. During this time of transition it will not be uncommon to see brown patches on the course as the rye dies and the bermuda begins to grow. Slow release fertilizer has been applied to all courses to provide the bermuda nutrients for summer growth. Some courses have aerified using solid tines, mostly to address spots that are transitioning quicker than others, in the case of Riverview all greens have been solid tined.

It was discussed throughout the renovation process of both North and Riverview that the completion of construction is only one step of the process. Though we understand that not everyone will agree on the design concepts, I am confident that everyone can acknowledge how far the North course has come in the 2-1/2 years following construction. The thatch layer on the greens has reached a healthy level and areas around the greens have softened. North however is not finished maturing and will continue to improve. Riverview is a year behind North, but has improved dramatically over the past year. Riverview will receive the attention it needs this summer to relieve compaction around the greens and improve play around the green complexes. The planned processes for this summer include aerovating (to loosen soil), additional solid tining of greens, core aerifying of hard pan areas and sodding where necessary. Some of these processes may require temporary course closure to ensure success. Closures will be announced as needed. Weak areas will also be pushed with heavy fertilization.

Snack Shops

The increase in March golf rounds resulted in a positive variance to budget of \$3,800 for the month. As a reminder, Snack Shops soon will be closing at 3:00p.m. on a regular basis; snacks and beverages will be available in the Pro Shops after 3:00p.m.

Lawn Bowling and Grounds

GOLF

During our last committee meeting, the plans for correcting the draw issues on the Lakeview greens were discussed. The first steps of the plan have been undertaken, the application of nitrogen to stimulate growth and the adjusting of plinths boards. Next we will be increasing watering in preparation of scarifying the greens with the goal of lowering the greens ¹/₄" to ¹/₂" below the plinth boards. Following scarification, top dressing will be applied and the greens aerified with top dressing in place. The greens will then be laser leveled to ensure a flat surface.

Grounds is currently working with our irrigation designer on the next phase of irrigation improvements for Lakeview. The area for improvement extends from the Mini Golf areas to the west and along Del Webb Boulevard. Weeds still remain a prominent focus and issue at all centers. As with the golf courses, overseeded areas are beginning to transition. These areas are receiving slow release fertilizer next week to promote bermuda growth.







Is It YOUR Time Now?

Have you ever thought of becoming a member of the Board of Directors of the RCSC?

Beginning on June 1, Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. Members who are interested in running for the Board of Directors may get candidate packets. These packets can be obtained by visiting the RCSC Board Offices at the lower level of Lakeview Center and showing your member card.

There are a few things to understand before becoming a candidate. First of all, there are eight requirements. You must be at least 55 years of age; be a deeded property owner in Sun City AZ; reside in Sun City AZ for at least 10 months of the year; not be related through marriage or immediate family to current RCSC Board Members, or candidate or Senior Management staff; be eligible to hold an Arizona Liquor License; must be able to serve for a three-year term; must be a member in good standing; and must be able to attend the Candidate Orientation.

If you meet those requirements, and want to be involved in one of the most rewarding and exciting experiences of your life, you are invited to run for the Board of Directors this year. Once you take out your packet, there will be several forms to fill out. You'll need to attach an updated resume, and you'll have to get 100 signatures of other members. All candidate packets must be completed and returned to the Board Office no later than noon on Friday, September 29, 2107.

Once the signatures you have collected are verified, you are then a certified candidate in the 2017 election race. This year, there are three seats open for the Board of Directors. A Candidate Orientation will be held in early October, and two Candidate Forums are scheduled in November. Voting will take place online starting one month prior to Election Day and in person voting will be held at Lakeview Center on Tuesday, December 12, 2017 for those unable to cast ballots electronically. The winners will be announced late that afternoon after the results have been certified. RCSC will send out an email notification to Members and a press release sent to the media. Being a member of the Board of Directors allows you to work hands-on with the issues facing Sun City AZ today and into the future. You will be representing your community and making decisions that will last for decades.

But this is not a position to be taken lightly; rather it is one of the most fulfilling positions you will ever have. One questions is, "How much

time is required?" and that depends totally on you. Board Members can spend anywhere between 40 and 120 hours per month performing various duties.

Management Updates

Financial Report:

We have operated within our operating and capital budget for the first quarter of 2017. Despite the fact that we have ended the quarter with a negative variance in gross income of \$120k, we have operating savings that have accommodated for that difference. Remember that we did not budget revenues as conservatively for 2017 as we did in years past.

Bowling:

Bell Lanes will begin the monthly summer No-Tap bowling tournaments on May 28 and following each month on the last Sunday. All bowlers are welcome whether USBC certified or not.

On May 13, Lakeview Lanes will host a US Open Tournament Qualifier. Bowlers from all over Arizona, including some professional bowlers, will compete for a spot in the National US Open Tournament in Liverpool, New York on October 25.

Starting this weekend, April 29, the Annual Sun City Open Senior Bowling Tournament will begin and will run for two weekends. The tournament has always been successful. This year we have 60 entries (240 Bowlers) which will produce \$5k – \$6k in income. The tournament is open to all senior bowlers in Arizona.

Cardholder Services:

While payments on past due assessments were off slightly in March at 10.85% of past due balances, the first three months of 2017 are the strongest start to a year in at least eight years. Total accounts receivable increased by 4.7% in March and is most affected by the increase in current receivables from March, which is our largest billing month of the year. While the overall past due balances increased by 1.2% we saw both the older 60 and 90 day categories decrease by almost 3% this month. February assessments went 30 days past due at a 5.2% rate and January assessments went 60 days past due at a 3.1% rate. Both rates are right at the prior 12-month average.

Payments from our third-party collections firm totaled \$15,071 in March with a year to date total of \$45,551 which is 8.2% higher than the first three months of 2016.

Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal also continued very strong in March with payments totaling \$128,754 from 292 property owners. Year to date web portal payments total \$326,483 from 770 property owners. Both the amount paid and property owner count are up over 24% from the same period in 2016.

In March property transfer related balances increased by 1% and lender owned related balances increased by 22%. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent approximately 54% of all receivables and past due balances. At the end of March trustee sale notices on Sun City properties ended at 52 and properties owned by lending institutions at 12.

Human Resources:

Voluntary CPR, AED and First Aid training classes will be offered again this year to RCSC employees. Classes are scheduled for early May and will also be offered in the fall. Last year, 77 employees participated and received their two year certification cards. The presenting instructor is certified through the American Health & Safety Institute and works for the Sun City Fire Department.

Accounting, Information Technology and Human Resources completed reporting requirements of the Affordable Care Act in late March. Forms 1094-C were electronically filed with the IRS and employees received Form 1095-C through payroll distribution or U.S. mail.

Centers Operations and Human Resources are in the final steps of changing the job title of Utility Worker to Custodian. Those employees will continue to provide custodial services, maintenance and light repair work. The Lead Utility Worker job title is changed to Custodian Foreman. Both positions will remain in their current pay ranges.

Human Resources is in the process of updating policies, benefit manuals and intranet information for employees.

Member Services:

On Sunday, April 2, we welcomed to the stage another hit Las Vegas show, the Doobie Brothers tribute band, China Grove. What a great performance!

We were at the Sundial Auditorium on Saturday, April 8, for the Senior Prom Masquerade Ball. RCSC cardholders arrived in full costume, including masks, which enhanced the event. The king and queen were chosen, and they danced to Johnny K and Kompany while the rest of the court joined in. A great time was had by all. We can't wait to see what next year's theme will be.

The following night, Sunday, April 9, we were at the Sun Bowl to welcome Mogollon, a premier country rock entertainment group. Some say this was the best show so far this season and some say the best ever! Mogollon was totally engaged with and mesmerized by the Sun City audience.

On Saturday morning, April 15 we were at the Sun Bowl for our annual Easter Egg Hunt. There were 6,000 eggs stuffed with prizes and candy, and kids came from everywhere. There was face painting, pony rides and a petting zoo. This event grows bigger and bigger every year. What a joy to see all the little ones' faces as they experience this event!

The following morning, on Easter Sunday, the Sun Bowl was the setting for the annual Sunrise Service. Presented

Project Updates

Building and Infrastructure

Multiple Location Projects

• All florescent lighting currently under the solar canopies will soon be replaced with LED retrofits. The LED retrofits will provide more light and reduce lamp maintenance. Contractor is Accel Electric (cost after rebates – \$10,681).

Sundial Center

- Construction is well underway at the eleven Sundial bocce courts. Repair and maintenance work includes removing the old turf, re-leveling the courts, installing new turf and painting the block boarders around each court. Contractor is Ken McIntyre Construction (cost \$111,709).
- A large horizontal sand filter will be installed in late May on the therapy pool at Sundial. The new filter replaces two old Triton sand filters. Contractor will be Aquatic Builders (cost \$24,450).

Willowcreek / Willowbrook Pro / Maintenance

 The Willowcreek/Willowbrook/Skilled Trades maintenance building is nearing completion with occupancy expected in late April 2017. Contractors include Doege Construction (formally DVP Professional Builders), CCBG Architectural and Bunger Steel (PIF cost – \$1,881,825).

Bell Center

- The Bell Lanes east restrooms are scheduled for renovation which includes new sheetrock, paint, wall tile, counter tops, toilets, urinals, partitions, floor tile, lighting, exhaust fans and doors. The restrooms will close to cardholder use and demolition will commence April 20, 2017. Contractor is Doege Development (cost – \$120,026).
- Preparations are underway to remodel the restaurant at Bell Lanes. Work will include the removal of the wall between the dining area and the server's station and installation of a coffee counter similar to the one at George's Lakeview Café. Other work includes new appliances, cooking hood modifications and wall and ceiling repairs. Contractor selection and cost are expected soon.
- The Bell mini golf course will receive new artificial turf in late May 2017. Contractor will be Baker Brothers Carpet (cost \$32,512).
- The hexagonal kiosk between the library and the Visitors center has been demolished and a new triple faced block information wall finished in CMU block, rock and stucco is being erected. The wall will incorporate three LED lighted 60" x 48" outdoor bulletin boards. Currently the CMU wall is constructed and moldings applied in preparation for stucco and rock. Contractor is Ken McIntyre Construction. The information wall is part of the Visitors Center remodel and paid for by the estate of Leta J. Lyon Murphy.

Lakeview Center

 Five Triton sand filters at the Lakeview pool will be replaced in late May with a large horizontal sand filter. Contractor for this project will be Aquatic Builders (cost – \$23,850).

Fairway Center / Quail Run Pro Shop

- Two conventional 100 gallon water heaters are being replaced with two new "Rinnai" tank-less style water heaters coupled with two 119 gallon storage tanks. Contractor is Sunland Plumbing (cost – \$21,854).
- The Fairway walking track is currently closed for repair and maintenance work. The track has been well used since its installation. Contractor is Dynamic Sports Construction (cost – \$35,000).
- A new sign for Quail Run golf course has been ordered and is expected to be installed in late May 2017. The new sign is very attractive and will incorporate LED

lighting for evening viewing. Contractor is Bootz and Duke Sign Company (cost – \$14,034).

South Golf Maintenance

 One replacement and one new evaporative coolers have been installed at the South Golf Course Maintenance facility. Contractor was Custom Cooling (cost – \$12,042).

Skilled Trades Department

• The RCSC Skilled Trades Department completed 333 work orders during the last two weeks of March 2017 and the first two weeks of April 2017.

Centers Operations

- New salt generators were installed during the recent closure of the Oakmont pool and spa. Both bodies of water were drained and refilled to ensure the generators work efficiently. Additional umbrellas and replacement hand-rail covers were also purchased and installed.
- Congratulations to Fran Garrels for her 5-year employment anniversary and Randy Mabe for his 15-year employment anniversary with the RCSC. Fran works at Lakeview and Randy at the South pro and snack shop. Both are an essential part of the staff at both locations.



Water Conservation

Are you STILL wasting water?

We have mentioned all of these tips for saving water before, but just in case we'll go over them again! You have wasted water:

When you washed a small load of laundry and forgot to change the setting from large or medium.

Solution: Make certain that the water selection fits the size of your load.

If you left the tap running while you brushed your teeth.

Solution: Wet your toothbrush, then turn the water off while brushing! If you're really into conserving, fill an 8 ounce glass, dip your toothbrush, scrub, rinse with the water from the glass and then rinse your brush in the remainder. This makes you a conservation pro!



If you have left the tap running while shaving.

Solution: Wet your face and turn the water off while lathering. When you need to rinse the razor, run a little water in the stopped sink and swish your razor around in there. Use a wet washcloth to remove the shaving cream from your face.

If you washed a half-load of dishes in the dishwasher on a larger setting.

Solution: Most dishwashers today have settings that allow you to select the load size. Try to run a dishwasher like a washing machine with only full loads and/or on the correct settings!

If you rinsed and scrubbed your dishes before putting them in the dishwasher.

Solution: Scrape scraps into the garbage first, then wipe with a paper towel. If the dishes are still exceptionally dirty or greasy, run a little water in a stopped sink to soak or rinse. Reminder - most of today's detergents really do clean better when there's food particles left on your dishes.

If you watered your landscaping in the heat of the day.

Solution: If you water certain outdoor plants by hand, do it early in the morning or at dusk. If you have an irrigation system, set the timer for morning and/or night. The heat of the day, usually anything past 9am during our summer, will cause most irrigation water to evaporate. A drip system works better than sprinkler spray whenever possible. And remember, if irrigation is watering the drive, it is wasting water.





If you washed the car with a hose, without a nozzle and let the water run.

Solution: Do you really need an excuse to go to the carwash? That saves the most water, as car washes recycle water. However, if you're one of those people who enjoy an afternoon outside scrubbing, just use a bucket and a hose nozzle to stop the flow when you're in between rinses.

If you have ordered a glass of water in a restaurant and only had a few sips.

Solution: If you really need a drink of water with your coffee, but know you won't drink it all, ask for a small glass, or a half-glass or just ice cubes if it's simply to cool your coffee.

Some of these are small steps, some are larger; but either way, the importance is all the same. You must do your part to help conserve, because as you know...

Sun City Gives Back FW Ceramics Spreads Easter Joy to Luke AFB

For a third year, the Fairway Ceramics & Porcelain Club coordinated a Spring project with the third grade classes at Luke Elementary School, helping 78 children create a pair of unique marbled ceramic eggs in time for their Spring 2017 break.

In March, over 20 Club members helped young students and the three teachers, Mr. Guadalupe Alejos, Ms. Ellen Turner, and Mr. Patrick Voss, decorate ceramic eggs in clouds of shaving cream with swirls of colored pigment. The children's involvement in their hands-on project led to shaving cream "up to the elbows" for many, and expressions of surprise, delight, and glee.

Volunteer Club members carefully transported the eggs back to their Sun City Club for glazing and firing in high-temperature kilns. The eggs were returned to the students and teachers later that same month, carefully matching the finished pairs to the correct students. In each class, a ceramic floppy-eared bunny was presented to the winning student of a drawing. All three teachers were also presented with completed ceramics pieces of a larger Easter egg dish.

Luke Elementary School serves Luke Air Force Base and the surrounding community, located only 11 miles away from Sun City. The majority of the students are children of military families, which was one of the reasons the Club reached out to this school. Many of these children experience the frequent absence of the military parent, often over holidays, and it was the hope of Club members that this project would bring some joy to the students. Students are also often living far from their grandparents, and many Club members are, in fact, grandpas and grandmas. The students' warm response and frequent spontaneous hugs and expressions of thanks made this experience very worthwhile and memorable to the Club members.





Records show that as the population of Sun City grew, so did use of our medical equipment. Savings for Sun City residents have been calculated periodically; in 2015, it was estimated that residents saved over two million dollars in cost of equipment for that year alone.
