Solar Continues to Fuel Sun City AZ with Savings

RCSC General Manager Jan Ek is pleased to present the following update on the photovoltaic solar project, which continues to provide savings in RCSC's operating costs.

For those that are not familiar, here's a quick summary of how RCSC came to lease photovoltaic ("PV") solar systems. As a nonprofit organization, RCSC was not eligible for federal or state tax credits, a needed incentive for the purchase of PV solar. An eligible leasing company purchased and installed the PV solar systems at RCSC, and RCSC leases the PV solar at ten locations with the initial lease cost of \$578,283 per year (15 year lease with increasing lease payments every five years). In addition, RCSC placed bids for 17 PV solar projects, receiving approval for 14 of them at 10 locations with the APS Renewable Energy Incentive Program. This needed incentive was projected to provide a rebate direct to RSCS of approximately \$185,000 per year for 20 years. The estimated production of electricity was estimated to save RCSC an average of \$480,000 per year. The estimate APS rebate plus the electricity production savings less the solar lease cost nets RCSC a savings of \$86,717 per year before insurance (approximately \$12,000 per year) and any repairs and maintenance.

So that was the plan, what has happened so far? Well to start, repairs and maintenance have increased some as non-warrantied repairs are required. Some of the expense, however, has been damage done by a vehicle to the solar panels and/or structure with no witness or identification of who caused the damage, so

no way to recover the expense. Repair and maintenance expenses were \$1,165 in 2014, \$4,810 in 2015 and \$7,156 in 2016.

The systems were installed and activated in 2013. All systems have been online, functioning and producing electricity, as of September 2013. It was expected that there would be some costs not covered by electricity production and rebates initially, and that proved to be the case. In 2013, the PV solar produced electricity with a value of \$202,873.59 and APS rebates of \$78,216.61. With a total solar rent and lease expense of \$332,711.51, there was a net cost to RCSC of \$51,621.31 in 2013.

The weather obviously makes a considerable difference in the amount of energy used and produced. Additionally we have had considerable issues with replacement of inverters under warranty. Wilson Electric installed our PV solar systems and has been less than responsive in getting the manufacture warranty replacements for inverters. Despite our continued requests and elevating the problem to top management, our struggles have been great throughout 2016. When an inverter is down, that means we are not producing usable solar power so we not only lose the use of it, we do not get paid any rebate for it by APS either. We have waited as long as four to six months for replacement of a warrantied inverter

which is unacceptable. With our persistence we have been able to reduce that turn around to two months, which is still less than desirable. Therefore, we are actively seeking other solutions.

In 2014 the PV solar produced 3,951,496 kWh of electricity at value of \$479,356.95 for the year. RCSC received \$189,211.01 in APS rebates for a total savings of \$668,567.96. The solar lease cost RCSC \$578,283.00, for a net savings to RCSC of \$90,284.96.

In 2015 the PV solar produced 3,783,354 kWh of electricity at a value of \$483,182.61 for the year. RCSC received \$181,404.78 in APS rebates for a total savings of \$664,587.39. The solar lease cost remained the same at \$578,283.00, for a net savings to RCSC of \$86,304.39.

In 2016 the PV solar produced 3,631,131 kWh of electricity at a value of \$475,027.49 for the year. RCSC received \$173,868.55 in APS rebates for a total savings of \$648,896.04. The solar lease cost remained the same at \$578,283.00, for a net savings to RCSC of \$70,613.04. This reduction in savings was caused by untimely replacements of warrantied inverters.

As electricity costs rise, the savings extended to RCSC with the production of electricity by the PV solar systems will also increase. But that is not the only place where RCSC can increase its rewards from PV solar.

On February 1, 2019, RCSC will have the option to buy out the lease for the PV solar systems for a projected amount of \$5,545,215.68. So why would RCSC consider this option? Simple, it provides a significant savings. If RCSC continued to pay off its 15-year lease and following five-year Solar Services Agreement to the owner of the PV solar systems, it would pay a total of \$2,497,720 more than if it takes the one time 66-month option to buy out of the lease and eliminate the Solar Services Agreement.

The Solar Lease Buy-Out is currently projected to be paid out of the Preservation & Improvement Fund in 2019. The roughly \$600,000 that is currently included in utility expenses for the solar lease annually will end.

Evacuation Plans Being Installed

Every day somewhere in the world there seems to be a disaster. War, famine, terrorist attacks or the storms Mother's Nature sends our way require all of us to be prepared.

The Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. wants to make certain that Cardholders and their guests are prepared for any such emergency that might come into our community as well. The National Fire Protection Code requires assembly buildings such as our recreation centers to have evacuation plans and that staff be trained to help in such situations.

To that end, RCSC Skilled Trades Staff will begin this month installing Evacuation Plans and Emergency Manuals in every administrative office, club room, meeting room, fitness center, maintenance buildings, golf pro shops and snack shops, bowling centers, auditoriums and amphitheaters.

Various situations other than fire can arise and we want to ensure that every occupant of every RCSC facility knows what actions must be taken. This might include such things as, severe storms, earthquakes, bomb threats and natural gas leaks, just to name a few.

Meetings will be held in many of the centers and clubs will be asked to review and share this information with members as it becomes available.

Stay tuned for more updates regarding this project. Life safety should be everyone's concern. Your cooperation and assistance is appreciated.

Candidate Packets Now Available

Candidate packets continue to be available for RCSC Members interested in running for the Board of Directors. You've got plenty of time to complete the paperwork and collect the necessary signatures to get your name on the ballot.

To obtain a candidate packet, you must make the request in person at the Corporate/Board Office at Lakeview Center (lower level) and present your RCSC Member card. The deadline for packet submissions is no later than noon on Friday, September 29, 2017.

Requirements to become a RCSC Board candidate:

- Must be at least fifty-five (55) years of age;
- Must not be related by marriage or birth to any other member of the Board, Senior Management Staff, or Board Candidate;

- Must be a Deeded Real Estate
 Owner of property in Sun City, Maricopa County, Arizona;
- Must be a RCSC Member in good standing;
- Must reside in Sun City, Arizona and be available at least ten (10) months of the year;
- Must meet the requirements to hold an Arizona liquor license (RCSC holds liquor licenses which require Board officers to be included on the licensing);
- Must be eligible and available to serve a three (3) year term; and
- Must be available to attend Board Candidate Orientation(s).

Candidates must also submit a fully completed RCSC petition, signed by 100 or more RCSC Members in good standing, along with all other forms provided in the RCSC Candidate Packet.



A successful candidate will:

- Have a strong desire to serve Sun City, AZ;
- Be fair and courteous;
- · Use good common sense;
- · Have good communication skills;
- Be willing to work as part of a team;
- Ability to prioritize policy and projects which will have the greatest benefit for the most members; and
- Be willing and able to dedicate the necessary hours to be an effective Director.

Candidates will be introduced at both the October and November Board meetings and candidate forums that will be held in the fall. Forum locations and dates will be announced at a later time.

Golf & Grounds Report

Pro Shops

We have begun our first wave of summer agronomic programs with fairway verticutting. Each of these programs will require temporary course closures. For the purposes of making tee times, the pro shops will be open from 6:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. on the days courses are closed. After 9:00 a.m., one of the other courses can book tee times for a course that is closed for maintenance. The full schedule of summer course closures can be found on the RCSC website, under Golf and then under Course Maintenance. This information can also be found in the SunViews newsletter and closures are listed in the Golf section of Your Sun City AZ Week emails.

We have an additional option this summer for golfers wishing to brave the summer heat, which is our Super Twilight rate. Beginning June 1 the fee after 3:00 p.m. is \$10 for residents and \$12 for guests. For those looking for a later start, we still offer our After 5:00 p.m. Pass for \$44 for residents or \$12 for residents that are also Surcharge Pass Holders.

Golf Courses

On Tuesday April 4, we conducted our annual USGA visit with Brian Whitlark. Mr. Whitlark is a professional soil scientist and holds both Bachelor of Science and Master of Science degrees from the University of Arizona at Tucson Department of Soil, Water and Environmental Science. This visit was the first of two, half-day visits, which was newly offered by the USGA this year. Splitting the visit will allow Mr. Whitlark to view the courses pre- and post transition and to offer an opinion on the effectiveness of our practices. The report is now available for viewing on the RCSC Golf Page, and can be found under the Resources tab. During the meeting we covered overseeding, putting greens, green surrounds, fairways, tees, bunkers, roughs and upcoming capital improvement projects. We toured North, Willowcreek/Willowbrook and Riverview over a period of four hours, followed by a summary with the Board of Directors over lunch. The second visit has not yet been scheduled, but is expected to occur in August.

As previously discussed, part of improving areas of play at Riverview that have been slow to respond is the installation of sod. We are currently planning the installation of sod for the week of June 12 following fairway aerification. By June 12 we expect temperatures to be stable and the majority of rye grass to have died. This will only be one step in improving play around the green complexes; we will still continue with aerovating, core aerifying of hard pan areas and heavy fertilization. In addition to Riverview, North will also be sodding areas that are still weak, primarily around tee boxes and heavy cart traffic areas.

As a member of the Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary Program for Golf, Quail Run is required to undergo recertification every three years. Quail Run underwent the recertification visit on May 5, which was conducted by Kai Umeda, who serves as an Area Extension Agent in Turfgrass Science for the University of Arizona. Though we have not received final recertification status from the Audubon Society, Mr. Umeda's report indicated that Quail Run is still fulfilling the requirements necessary to maintain membership.

Snack Shops

We have had an increase in the number of cardholders bringing outside food and beverage onto the patio areas. We respectfully remind everyone that this is not allowed. Bringing outside alcohol onto licensed premises is against the law and puts RCSC at risk of losing its liquor license. Bringing in outside food is also not permitted, causing potential liability for RCSC and a concern with Maricopa County Health Department guidelines. We are open to requests for additional food and beverage offerings from the snack shops for you to enjoy on the patios. Please submit your suggestions through comment cards (available at all RCSC facilities), by

phone 623-876-3053, or via email at bduthu@suncityaz.org. Additionally, RCSC employees are required to enforce these policies and we ask for your cooperation by treating them with dignity and respect.

Please join me in congratulating J.P. Loscher on her appointment as Snack Shop Manager for the North Golf Course. J.P. is filling the vacancy created by the departure of Patty Kitchen, whom we thank for her many years of service.

Lawn Bowling/Grounds

Work on the two lawn bowl greens at Lakeview is continuing, following the leveling of the plinth boards. Both greens were aerified using deep tines and top dressed on May 18. The greens will continue to be fertilized with the goal of vigorous root growth. Root growth is important as we move into the frazing of greens, which essentially removes plant material above the surface.

The north green at Bell has been aerated and top dressed and the south green is scheduled for aerating and top dressing May 23. Mountain View has been aerated and top dressed, Oakmont has been verticut and scheduled for aeration and top dressing on May 30.

Higher temperatures have helped to slow down weed growth and are now in better control. We are currently fertilizing both Sun Bowl and Lakeview turf areas to push bermuda growth and to aid in transition. The recent high winds have kept the crew busy cleaning up debris and downed limbs.

We would like to recognize Robert Hedges for his 15 years of service to the Recreation Centers of Sun City. Robert serves on the Grounds Crew as an Irrigation Technician. We hope to have the expertise of Robert for many more years to come!



Sun City Open A Huge Success

The 29th annual Sun City Open Tournament was held at Bell and Lakeview Lanes on the weekends of April 29 and May 6. The tournament was a huge success with 63 team entries and 256 bowlers from all over Arizona.

The prize fund for the tournament was over \$11,000 and produced \$5,600 in revenue for the RCSC Bowling Centers. Scores for the tournament were outstanding; there were eleven 300 games and five 800 series. A 50/50 drawing was held during each squad of the tournament and \$2,000 was collected and \$1,000 was donated to the 100 Club of Arizona, an organization that provides financial assistance to families of first responders that are injured or killed in the line of duty.

Management Updates

Financial Report:

While our gross income remains less than budgeted, we have improved considerably from the quarter end, with only an \$85k negative variance compared to \$120k just a month ago. All divisions are within their operating budget, excluding golf, which after the first four months of 2017 has a \$47k negative variance in total net operating excess. Nonetheless, the corporation overall is well within its operating and capital budget year to date.

Bowling:

Bell Lanes will begin the monthly summer No-Tap bowling tournaments on May 28 and following each month on the last Sunday. All bowlers are welcome whether USBC certified or not.

Every Friday at noon, Lakeview Lanes has a colored pin fun day. Cost is only \$11 and bowlers can win cash for colored pin strikes, colored pin spares, etc.

The 29th Annual Sun City Open Senior Bowling Tournament was held on the last weekend of April producing \$5,500 in revenue. Bowlers from all over Arizona participated in the event. The tournament scores were excellent; there were eleven 300 games bowled during the tournament.

The summer maintenance program has begun for the bowling pinsetters. The mechanics will perform various preventative maintenance tasks which include inspections, lubrication and annual maintenance.

Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments continued downward in April at 8.4% of past due balances. Total accounts receivable increased by 1% in April and is up 7.6% from the beginning of the year. Even though overall receivables have increased year to date, we have seen total past due balances remain unchanged for the most part and current receivables increase 29% year to date. March assessments went 30 days past due at a 4.7% rate and February assessments went 60 days past due at a 2.9% rate.

Payments from our third-party collections firm were down in April and totaled just \$3,283 with a year to date total of \$48,789.

Cardholder acceptance and use of the RCSC Web Portal continues to grow. Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal totaled \$107,711 from 254 property owners. Year-to-date web portal payments total \$434,194 from 1,024 property owners.

In April, property transfer related balances increased by 1% and lender owned related balances decreased by 36%. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent approximately 54% of all receivables and past due balances. At the end of April, trustee sale

notices on Sun City AZ properties ended at 50 with 10 properties owned by lending institutions.

Human Resources:

Twenty employees attended voluntary RCSC sponsored CPR, AED and First Aid training classes on Friday, May 12, and received their two year certification cards. RCSC will provide additional training classes in the fall of this year.

The H.R. Director attended a workshop last month regarding the AZ Earned Paid Sick Time provisions of Proposition 206 that was a ballot initiative on the November 2016 Arizona ballot and is part of The Fair Wages and Healthy Families Act (the ACT) that was approved by over 58% of voters.

The Earned Paid Sick Time provisions entitles all employees in Arizona, including: full-time, part-time, temporary, seasonal and on-call, to accrue and use earned paid sick time. The new provisions must be implemented by July 1, 2017. Currently, RCSC provides sick time off with pay to full-time employees only and we are in the process of completing compliance.

The ACT also includes the new minimum wage laws that RCSC implemented January 1, 2017.

Member Services:

On Sunday, April 30 we welcomed to the Sun Bowl stage for a second time, Jumping Jack Flash the ever-popular Rolling Stones tribute band! All watched in awe as the Mick Jagger look-alike pranced through the audience and took pictures with nearly everyone. The band was called back for two encores!

The Doo Wah Riders hit the stage as our final performance of the spring series and the audience hit the dance floor. Unfortunately, when the sun went down, the night became unseasonably chilly so some were forced to leave early, but the Doo Wah Riders received a well-deserved standing ovation.

Our next performance brings us Big Iron Band, a Marty Robbins Tribute at the Sundial Auditorium on June 7 at 7pm. We also hope to see you on July 19 at the Sundial Auditorium for Jim Westover's Elvis from Hawaii tribute. The fall Sun Bowl series starts on Sunday, September 24 with The 8 Tracks Dance Band.

Show your patriotic spirit as Sun City AZ celebrates America's birthday on Independence Day with our traditional Ring That Bell Ceremony in the Bell Center Social Halls. The ceremony will be followed by an indoor picnic where we will be serving hot dog, chips and bottled water for lunch. The cost is \$3 and proceeds benefit this year's RCSC Management Team's chosen charity – the Del Webb Sun Cities Museum & Historical Society. There will also be free bowling, darts, billiards and shuffleboard at Bell Lanes

These reports were presented to the Board at the meeting on May 25, 2017.

Project Updates

Building and Infrastructure

Marinette Center

 Some roofing repair and re-coating will be done on the Marinette roof. This work is scheduled to be done mid-June 2017. Contractor is Gryphon Roofing (cost – \$15,060).

Willowcreek / Willowbrook Pro / Maintenance

 The Willowcreek/Willowbrook/Skilled Trades maintenance building is completed, other than some shade canopy installations and some punch list work. Both golf maintenance and Skilled Trades moved into the new building in late April 2017. Contractors were Doege Development, CCBG Architectural and Bunger Steel (PIF Cost – \$1,881,825).

Bell Center

- Renovation of the Bell Lanes east restrooms are well underway with demolition, electrical rough-in, removal and replacement of rusted-out sewer lines and drywall completed. The completed renovation will include new drywall, paint, wall tile, counter tops, toilets, urinals, lavatories, partitions, floor tile, LED lighting, exhaust fans and doors. Contractor is Doege Development (cost \$120,026).
- Demolition inside the Bell Lanes restaurant commenced May 19, 2017. Remodel work will include the removal of the wall between the dining area and the server's station and installation of a coffee counter similar to the one at George's Lakeview Café. Other work includes several new appliances, cooking hood modifications, Ansul system modifications, new LED lighting, wall and ceiling repairs, re-roofing the shed and installing a door and several upgrades to the electrical system. Contractors are Doege Development, Accel Electric and Adobe Fire (cost \$162,589).
- The Bell mini-golf course is being re-carpeted with artificial turf and is currently scheduled to open to cardholders on May 24, 2017. The course also received some new railroad ties on hole #3 and painting where needed. Contractors were Baker Brothers Carpet, DVP Construction and Exquisite Painting (cost – \$32,512).
- Bell social hall roof repair and re-coating will be completed in mid-June 2017.
 Contractor is Tremco, Inc. (cost \$12,660).

Sundial Center

- The Sundial bocce courts renovation project is now completed and the eleven courts are open for use. Contractor was Ken McIntyre Construction (cost – \$111,709).
- A large horizontal sand filter will be installed, in late June on the warm water pool at Sundial. The new filter replaces two old Triton sand filters. This was originally scheduled for May. Contractor will be Aquatic Builders (cost – \$24,450).
- Sundial mini-golf roof repair and re-coating and is scheduled to be completed in mid-June 2017. Contractor for this work will be Gryphon Roofing (cost – \$22,583).

Lakes East/West / Pro Shop / Talisman Hall

 The Lakes East/West Snack Shop and Talisman Hall Roof is scheduled for repairs and re-coating in mid-June 2017. Contractor will be Starkweather Roofing (cost – \$17,168).

Lakeview Center

Five Triton sand filters on the Lakeview pool will be replaced with a large horizontal sand filter in late June 2017. This was originally scheduled for completion in May. Contractor for this project will be Aquatic Builders (cost – \$23,850).

Oakmont Center

 The Oakmont auditorium and kitchen received new vinyl plank flooring and baseboard this month. Contractor was Resource Flooring of Arizona (cost – \$20,302).

North Pro / Snack Shop

- The North pro/snack shop parking lot crack-fill and seal coat was completed May 12, 2017. Contractor was Regional Paving (cost – \$7,125).
- The North Cart Barn roof will be repaired and recoated in mid-June 2017. Contractor will be Gryphon Roofing (cost \$7,019).

Fairway Center

 Maintenance work on the Fairway indoor track was completed and reopened for use on April 26, 2017. Contractor was Dynamic Sports Construction (cost – \$35,000).

Mt. View Center

 Roofing repair and recoating of some roofs at Mt. View will be done in mid-June 2017. Contractor will be Tremco, Inc. (cost – \$4,820).

Skilled Trades Department

 The RCSC Skilled Trades Department completed 280 work orders during the last two weeks of April and the first two weeks of May 2017. The completion of these work orders was in addition to the team physically moving the Skilled Trades offices and shop to the new Willowcreek location. What a team!

Centers Operations

- The Lakeview billiards room recently had three tables recovered along with the installation of new rubber cushions.
- A number of new pieces of custodial equipment were purchased for the centers.
 These items include two Riccar vacuum cleaners for Marinette and Bell Lanes, a
 wide-area vacuum for Fairway, and two upright scrubbers to be shared between
 Oakmont Center, North, South, and Quail Run golf courses.



Water Conservation

You're wasting water if you've...

Thrown ice down the drain (or kicked it under the refrigerator) after it drops on the floor. it in a houseplant. Put it in a baggy

Solution: Drop that errant ice cube in Fido's (or Garfield's) water dish or drop (clearly marked with a warning such as "dirty!") and save it for getting gum out of carpet or off from clothing, or



save the "ice baggy" for sore muscles or bee stings. And while garbage disposals are not water-economical, you can use dropped ice with a little lemon peel or cleanser to clean and freshen.

Taken a bath and not started the water with the plug in the tub. Solution: Plug the tub from the get-go so you are catching the cool water while waiting for it to heat up. Adjust the temperature accordingly. Of course, a quick shower is a much better way to conserve water, but we all need a "good soak" now and then.

Not caught the water in a bucket while waiting for the shower to heat up. Solution: Pretty obvious and probably one of the most ignored. Store that bucket of water right in the shower and use it to flush the toilet. Solves that "not having any place to put it" issue. If the bucket is a new, clean one, watering Fido or using the water to scrub fruits and vegetables is acceptable. Then you can take that lightly-used water out and water landscaping or houseplants for sure!



Rinsed your fresh fruits and vegetables under running water.

Solution: Okay, if you're not collecting your shower water in a clean bucket, then at least put a stopper and a small amount of water in the sink or find a suitably-sized bowl in which to soak/wash those fruits and vegetables. Use the left over water to water house plants or to run the garbage disposal. There is also no need to wash vegetables if you're intending to peel them. Simply give them a quick dunk afterwards and they're ready to go.

Not yet installed a low-flow showerhead.

Solution: It's pretty simple to do, changing out that showerhead. All you need is a wrench and some plumbers Teflon tape, or a helpful son, daughter or handyman. Keep in mind that a conventional shower head uses between 3 and 4 gallons per minute (gpm), while low-flow shower heads use about 2 gpm. So even at a conservative onegallon-per-minute difference and a 10-minute shower, you could save 10 gallons (by how many times a week you shower, times 52 weeks a year...WOW!). You can do the math for the theoretical 4gm vs 2gpm.

Not installed or replaced aerators on kitchen and bathroom faucets.

Solution: Installing Aerators can knock water consumption down to .05-1.5qpm (listed on the side of the aerator) from 2.2gpm for bathroom faucets and 2.5gpm on kitchen faucets. Plugged up aerators can cause low water pressure and can be replaced or cleaned; and again, they are pretty simple to add/replace or refresh. You need a pair of pliers or a crescent wrench (helpful hint: wrap the edges of the pliers/wrench with electrical tape to avoid scratches). To refresh an aerator, soak the screen in white vinegar, which will remove sediment build up.

Sun City Gives Back

Garden Club Gleans and Gives to Many

Spring of 2017 marked the last successful gleaning season for the Garden Club of Sun City. For the last 14 years, volunteer members of the Garden Club of Sun City have spent two to three days each week in February and March removing citrus (gleaning) from a variety of citrus trees of Sun City residents. Members in groups of 10-12 donned hats, gloves (and sometimes a bike helmet) and sun screen; and armed with citrus pickers and rakes, gleaning six to eight trees each day. Each member had a job and they all worked together beautifully to glean the fruit. Many residents benefited year after year. Each resident paid a nominal fee which went to the Garden Club. The donations of citrus to the St Mary's Food Bank was well over 4,000,000 pounds.

Although the Garden Club is no longer giving back by gleaning, the Garden Club's Sun City Community Garden continues to donate their harvest of produce to senior centers, food banks and farmer's markets in the area. Over the last four years, the garden has donated over 2,000 pounds of produce.

Garden Club of Sun City opened the Sun City Community Garden in October 2013 as a joint commitment between EPCOR Water (EPCOR) and the Garden Club of Sun City (Garden Club). The garden is located in the enclosed EPCOR water treatment plant at 91st Avenue and Greenway. In the northwest corner of the Sun City Community Garden is an approximate 60' X 60' garden called Pete's Patch, named after a former president of the Garden Club of Sun City. Managed by Garden Club members, Pete's Patch is responsible for this large donation of produce.

The Garden Club of Sun City also gives back to the community by maintaining (weeding, pruning and fertilizing) the rose bushes at the Sun Bowl.

The Garden Club of Sun City strives to educate its members about various Arizona gardening techniques and practices by offering seminars at three or four Garden Club meetings each year as well as field trips and other outings.

A concert attended by friends and supporters of the club kicked off this donation event. All were entertained with many great sing-along tunes, even a Hawaiian hula dance or two.


In addition, several members of the audience were given a group lesson and after only a few minutes they were able to play a song. Again, simply amazing!

Tips from Get Fit for Life -

Exercise Cautions

"Most people believe that all exercises are good, safe and effective," states fitness professional Dick Fortier. "Some common strength exercises aren't safe at all, especially for aging adults who are faced with muscle, joint, and tendon issues. According to research on senior physiology, the following well-known exercises need to be performed with CAUTION, or not at all."

Behind-the-Head Lat Pull-Downs

Pulling a bar behind the head puts far too much stress on the shoulder joint. The amount of outward rotation on the humerus, combined with the motion downward, has a very un-stabilizing effect on this joint. The top of the humerus is actually pushing outward and away from the joint, overstretching the tendons and ligaments on the front of the shoulder. This can lead to injury. An Alternative: Sit at the exercise station, with spine straight, abs pulled in, a slight lean backwards, and pull the bar down in front of the body, toward the chest, but not below the collar bone.

Hovering Leg Lifts

As an abdominal exercise, boot camps and phone apps encourage people to lie on their backs, extend legs straight out, lifting the legs off the ground, to hover just a few inches from the floor. This lifting movement puts an incredible amount of stress on the lower back and can lead to injury. The cost-benefit of this move is simply too high. An Alternative: Start with legs extended straight up in the air (not lifting them from the ground) in line with the hips, lower the straightened legs down to about a 45-degree angle—or only as far as possible without back strain, hover in this position, then raise back up. Standard bicycle crunches or plank exercises are additional abdominal options.

Upright Rows

This standing exercise requires holding a barbell or weights with arms extended and hands close together, raising the weight up under the chin. Upright Rows are controversial because they cause the humerus to bang up against the AC (acromion process) joint. This can compress the nerves in the shoulder area and damage the cartilage in the AC joint. The purpose of this exercise is to work the shoulders (deltoids) and upper traps. An Alternative: Perform the Row exercise bending forward 90 degrees at the hips, arms extended directly beneath the shoulders, hands slightly more than shoulder width apart, lift weight straight up toward the chest until elbows and shoulders form a straight line (Bent-over Row). The standard Front Raise and Lateral Raise, using a modest weight, might be suitable options as well.



We are a charitable non-profit Arizona corporation and are funded by voluntary contributions and memorial gifts.

While the equipment is available for the use of all residents or visitors staying with residents, the equipment must not be taken out of Sun City on a permanent basis. As a matter of control, equipment is loaned only to Sun City residents.

Records show that as the population of Sun City grew, so did use of our medical equipment. Savings for Sun City residents have been calculated periodically; in 2015, it was estimated that residents saved over two million dollars in cost of equipment for that year alone.
