

Evacuation Plan Installation Continues into August

Every day somewhere in the world there seems to be a disaster. War, famine, terrorist attacks or the storms Mother Nature sends our way require all of us to be prepared.

The Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. wants to make certain that Cardholders and their guests are prepared for any such emergency that might come into our community as well. The National Fire Protection Code requires assembly buildings such as our recreation centers to have evacuation plans and that staff be trained to help in such situations.

To that end, RCSC Skilled Trades Staff has begun installing Evacuation Plans and Emergency Procedure Manuals in every administrative office, club room, meeting room, fitness center, maintenance buildings, golf pro shops and snack shops, bowling centers, auditoriums and amphitheaters. Various situations other than fire can arise and we want to ensure that every occupant of every RCSC facility knows what actions must be taken. This might include such things as severe storms, earthquakes, bomb threats and natural gas leaks, just to name a few.

Meetings will be held in many of the centers and clubs will be asked to review and share this information with members as it becomes available. Stay tuned for more updates regarding this project. Life safety should be everyone's concern. Your cooperation and assistance is appreciated.

Want A Bigger Voice in Sun City AZ? Candidate Packets Now Available

Candidate packets continue to be available for RCSC Members interested in running for the Board of Directors. There is still plenty of time to complete the paperwork and collect the necessary signatures to get your name on the ballot.

To obtain a candidate packet, you must make the request in person at the Corporate/Board Office at Lakeview Center (lower level) and present your RCSC Member card. The deadline for packet submissions is no later than noon on Friday, September 29, 2017.

Requirements to become a RCSC Board candidate:

- Must be at least fifty-five (55) years of age;
- Must not be related by marriage or birth to any other member of the Board, Senior Management Staff, or Board Candidate;
- Must be a Deeded Real Estate

Owner of property in Sun City, Maricopa County, Arizona;

- Must be a RCSC Member in good standing;
- Must reside in Sun City, Arizona and be available at least ten (10) months of the year;
- Must meet the requirements to hold an Arizona liquor license (RCSC holds liquor licenses which require Board officers to be included on the licensing);
- Must be eligible and available to serve a three (3) year term; and
 Must be available to attend Board
- Candidate Orientation(s). Candidates must also submit a fully

completed RCSC petition, signed by 100 or more RCSC Members in good standing, along with all other forms provided in the RCSC Candidate Packet.

RCSC would like to remind Cardholders of a few items which require your attention when using the recreational facilities:

Golf & Grounds Report

Pro Shops

Total rounds for May showed a slight increase over prior year and Green/Cart fees exceeded budget by 1.5% and prior year by 6.2%. Total revenue missed budget slightly due to misses in merchandise and driving range sales. Total rounds year-to-date are down from prior year due to January and February performance; however, rounds after February have increased over prior year.

We are offering the Wilson Duo golf balls at reduced pricing through August 31. You can purchase two dozen Wilson Duos for \$30 or two dozen Wilson Duo Spin for \$35. This offer is only available through the Riverview Pro Shop. The Duo is ideally suited for higher handicapped golfers looking for distance, providing great feel and low spin. The Duo Spin provides plenty of distance but adds spin which aspiring players are looking for around the greens.

Golf Courses

Transition is well underway as the winter rye and poa trivialis give way to the summer heat. Transition is painful as it is a much slower process reestablishing the bermuda in the summer as opposed to over seeding with winter grasses in the fall. The bermuda begins to emerge from dormancy late February/early March by using carbohydrate reserves stored in the root system. During this time it is competing with the well-established winter grasses for both nutrients and sunlight. To aid in transition on fairways and tees, we use a blend of perennial and annual rye. The annual rye has a lower heat tolerance and begins to transition out sooner. Greens are over seeded with a blend of poa trivialis and perennial rye, both of which are much hardier and can continue living until summer temperatures become extreme. We further aid the transition through mechanical means, such as lowering the height of cut, vertical cutting and aerification. By the time these processes are complete, the golf courses do not have the conditions golfers prefer. The goal is have the courses back on the road to recovery by the middle of July, providing the 100 days of growth bermuda

needs in order to store the proper amount of carbohydrates needed prior to dormancy.

Sodding has been completed at Riverview and North. These areas will remain closed to play and cart traffic until established. The 30 yard signs will remain in place at Riverview to keep heavy cart traffic away from the green complexes. For those golfers that carry a handicap card, carts are allowed within the 30 yard markers; however, we ask that once a shot is played, the cart is driven back from the direction it entered and then driven around the green. The less cart traffic we have around the green complexes, the sooner recovery will occur.

Snack Shops

Snack shops are now closing at 1:00pm on a consistent basis, though will remain open longer depending upon demand. After the snack shops close, snacks and beverages are available through the pro shop. The snack shops have operated within their budgeted goals year-to-date. We thank everyone for their continued support.

Lawn Bowling/Grounds

Work continues on the Lakeview Lawn Bowl greens to remove irregularities in the surface. To date, RCSC staff have leveled all plinth boards and removed high points as needed. We are currently working with a contractor to "fraze" mow the surface and then top dress and level. After this portion is completed we will begin to re-grow the turf. After six weeks the contractor will revisit the site and further level and top dress as needed. All other Lawn Bowl greens have been aerified and top dressed. In addition to this process we have verticut and fertilized all greens.

We are currently working with our irrigation consultant on pressure problems around the softball field. Water pressure to the field has decreased recently, creating difficulty in providing consistent turf coverage. We are also working on eliminating high spots along the infield by using a total of 2,200 square feet of sod.

Cart Damage By the Numbers

Many believe that a single golfer in a cart would cause less damage to the course that two golfers sharing a cart based upon the additional weight. However, that is not the case.

Cart damage is defined as "turf wear damage caused by golf carts which includes: 1) turf and soil compaction due to the weight of the golf cart, 2) abrasion and wear caused byrepeated and concentrated traction including stopping, starting, and driving, and 3) impact damage from the golf cart."

By examining the area impacted by different play types, it will help you better understand why four-wheel golf carts impact the course so dramatically.

The following shows the estimated average area impacted when playing a normal 6,200 year golf course:

- Walking golfer with golf bag (9 holes)= 15,500 sf
- Walking golfer with golf bag (18 holes)= 31,000 sf
- Walking golfer with 3" wide wheel pullcart (9 holes) = 111,600 sf
- Walking golfer with 3" wide wheel pull cart (18 holes) = 223,200 sf
- Riding golfer with motorized cart (9 holes) = 2,380,800 sf

A Few Updates

It's hard to believe that the year is half over.

It seems like just yesterday it was January, and we were just getting over the holidays and looking forward to the best months of the year weather-wise. Now we are set for the monsoons. So, I thought what a better time to give you updates on some of the more interesting things your RCSC Board of Directors have been up to lately.

After spending eight months of hard work, the Ad Hoc Long Range Planning Committee presented its findings to the Board at the end of May. The Board wanted to take a long, close look at this work to make sure the recommendations for which clubs and which ideas that were suggested to move to the new property at Grand Avenue and 103rd was right. - c. Be at least 70 years of age

d. Income does not exceed 150% of current Federal Poverty Level

Management Updates

Financial Report:

While our gross income remains less than budgeted, we have held our own going into our off season. All divisions are within their operating budget, excluding golf, which has continued to improve their negative variance year to date. It is important to remind you once again that we commonly hold repair and maintenance projects until the fall when we are assured that we will have the funds to complete them. We currently have a positive variance from budget in repairs and maintenance of \$733,070. Remember that we carry forward all unfinished capital and repairs and maintenance projects until they are completed or cancelled.

Bowling:

Recently, the United States Bowling Congress (USBC) performed inspections on all RCSC bowling lanes, approaches, foul lights and pin spotting. No issues were reported at either center.

The bowling department recently contracted with the Metro Phoenix USBC for two upcoming tournaments. The first tournament will be held on August 6, 2017 and approximately \$2,000 of unbudgeted income is expected to be produced. The Senior Championship tournament will be held on January 6-7, 2018 and is expected to produce approximately \$5,000 in unbudgeted income.

Summer maintenance is being performed at both bowling centers by the RCSC bowling mechanics. Maintenance includes rebuilding major components and lubrication. The maintenance will ensure proper and reliable operation for the upcoming fall season.

Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments turned upward in May at 11.7% of past due balances. Total accounts receivable decreased by just under 2% in May and is up 7.6% from the beginning of the year. Due to an above average seasonal increase in past due rates in April and May, overall past due balances are up 2.7% year to date. The Over 90 day category increased by 5.1% in May while the largest increase year to date has been in the Over 30 day category. April assessments went 30 days past due at an increased 6.2% rate and March assessments went 60 days past due at a 2.4% rate.

Payments from our third-party collections firm were up slightly in May and totaled \$7,532 this month with a year to date total of \$56,320. This is approximately 50% of the 2016 year to date total.

Cardholder acceptance and use of the RCSC Web Portal continues to be strong. Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal totaled \$106,331 from 247 property owners. Year to date portal payments total \$540,525 from 1,271 property owners.

In May property transfer related balances decreased by 4% and lender owned related balances increased by 78%. Outstanding balances related to property trans-

fers represent approximately 54% of all receivables and past due balances. At the end of May trustee sale notices on Sun City properties ended at 55 and properties owned by lending institutions at 13.

Human Resources:

Various departments within RCSC are in the process of preparing and implementing the AZ Earned Paid Sick Time portion of Proposition 206, The Fair Wages & Healthy Families Act. Human Resources has prepared required notifications for distribution to all employees for their signatures. Required labor law posters explaining the Act, both in English and Spanish, have been prepared for distribution to all work locations and will be posted on employee bulletin boards on the implementation date of July 1.

A requirement of the Act is to provide sick pay to all employees including full-time, part-time, temporary, and seasonal; increasing RCSC numbers from approximately 170 full-time individuals to the full staff of approximately 380 individuals.

Individuals hired after the implementation date will be provided information for signature during the new hire orientation conducted by Human Resources.

In June, Human Resources completed an in-house audit of the I-9 forms that verify employment eligibility for all individuals who work for RCSC. Forms for individuals who have left the company and met the destruction date were destroyed. Keeping those files up-to-date is essential in the event of an audit by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security.

Member Services:

For our first summer show at Sundial on June 7 we welcomed to the stage Big Iron Band, a Marty Robbins Tribute. What a great show! Chris Campbell's vocal representation of Marty Robbins along with the sound of the Big Iron Band made this performance exceptional.

Come and share the 4th of July with us at the Bell Recreation Center as we present the 39th Annual Ring That Bell Ceremony which will begin at 9:00am in the Bell Social Halls. Following the ceremony we will offer a picnic lunch of a hot dog, chips and bottled water for \$3.00 per person. What is a picnic without desert? No worries, we will also be serving free cake! There will also be free bowling, darts, billiards and shuffleboard until 1pm at the Bell Recreation Center following the ceremony.

Join us on July 19 at the Sundial Recreation Center for cool entertainment with an Elvis in Hawaii performance by Jim Westover as he relives Elvis' 70's concert years. Jim's professional experiences have included being one of the top Elvis tribute artists in the business. Please be sure to have your RCSC Member or Privilege card with photo on your person at this free event for admittance, as key fobs are not accepted.

Project Updates

Building and Infrastructure

Multiple Location Projects

- All under solar canopy florescent lamps have been replaced with LED retrofits. The new LED retrofits increase overall lighting, cut lamp maintenance expenses and reduce electrical costs. Contractor was Accel Electric (Cost after rebates – \$10,681).
- Roofing projects reported last month have been delayed until mid-July due to long lead times for materials to complete the required work.

Bell Center

- Demolition inside the Bell Lanes cafe commenced May 19, 2017. The rough-in work is completed and the interior is receiving paint and new Fiber Reinforced Plastic (FRP) panels on the walls in the kitchen. Remodel work for this project includes the removal of the wall between the dining area and the server's station and installation of a coffee counter similar to the one at George's Lakeview Café. Other work includes several new appliances, cooking hood modifications, Ansul system modifications, new LED lighting, wall and ceiling repairs, re-roofing the shed and installing a door and several upgrades to the electrical system. Contractors are Doege Development, Accel Electric and Adobe Fire (Cost – \$162,589).
- The shade canopies at Bell Lawn Bowl are being retrofitted with retractable shade covers on the North side of the structures. The new motorized retractable canopies will provide shade during lawn bowling events and will be retracted when the facility is not being used so the grass can receive necessary sunlight for healthy growth. Labor and material costs for this project have been paid by a generous RCSC Cardholder.

Lakeview Center

• Five Triton sand filters on the Lakeview pool were replaced June 23-24 with a new large horizontal sand filter. The five small filters were worn and due for replacement. Contractor for this project was Aquatic Builders (Cost – \$23,850).

Cart Damage

- Riding golfer with motorized cart (18 holes) = 4,761,600 sf
- Two golfers sharing motorized cart (18 holes) = 4,761,600 sf
- Two golfers each using a motorized cart (9 holes) = 4,761,600 sf
- Two golfers each using a motorized cart (18 holes) = 9,523,200 sf

The lessons learned from these number tell us the following:

- Walking a golf course impacts a golf course far less than pull or motorized carts do when considering area impacted.
- Walking carts impact the golf course less than motorized carts but all carts impact the golf course more than walking does.
- The rules of golf require hand pull and motorized golf carts to follow the same rules designed to minimize cart impacts on golf course playability and turf health.
- Wider cart tires result in more floatation and therefore less compression pressure
 compared to narrower tires because they spread the weight out over more area,
- (e.g., a 2" wide pull cart tire exerts twice the pressure of a 4" wide pull cart tire.)
 If you really care about your golf course, share a cart rather than taking your own.
- When using a cart, keep it away from approaches, collars, putting surfaces, and green surrounds.
- Another way to minimize cart impact is to stay on the cart path when possible and avoid stressed turf when driving around the golf course.

Now that you know the numbers - stay on course and share the cart!

• A rotating surface cleaner for power washers has recently been purchased at Bell Recreation Center. This has been a huge help in cleaning the pool deck and the inside of the spa.

Be Cool in August

You have survived Phoenix's hottest month. The average high temperature for July is 106. The August average high is 104. Doesn't that make you feel a lot cooler? No? If that is the case, then go to your one of your Sun City Libraries. The outdoor temperature is no different there; but indoors you will find some really cool stuff.

If you are a regular Bell or Fairway Library goer, you know of all the great materials that are available. The Friends are so proud of our two great Libraries. The staff and volunteers are extremely helpful. The library shelves are stocked with interesting materials. If you can't find what you want on the shelf, it most likely available in one of the other 18 Maricopa County Library District libraries, and can be delivered to you at Bell or Fairway.

If you don't go often or have never been there, you are missing out on a real Sun City treasure. Our Libraries are traditional in their wide variety of materials; however, they are uniquely designed with seniors in mind. Bell has a Vision Limited Machine for those with significant vision problems. Bell also has a special room devoted to a computer directly linked to the Maricopa County Recorder's office. No more having to go to downtown Phoenix for County Recorder business. Computers are in both Libraries for your use, as are many large print books. Do not worry about machine operation or material location. Ask a staff member or volunteer, and help is on the way.

Both Libraries have new and really cool free programs every month. To get program information, go to the MCLD website, http://www.mcldaz.org/. Click on Events along the top of the page. From the list of branches, select either Fairway or Sun City Branch to open the calendar showing programs. If the program title is underlined it means that registration is required for that program. If it is not underlined there is no registration. You can come to the Library or call 602-652-3000 to register. Programs are scheduled two to three months ahead of time. Look on the calendar to see what's coming, but registration doesn't open until 21 days before the program date. Registration fills fast; so, register as soon as registration opens at 9:00 AM.



safety and effectiveness in the weight room. Sloppy form produces poor results, because muscles are not engaged correctly through each movement. It can also increase the risk of injury. If form suffers during a set, you are either overloaded or not knowledgeable on the correct way to exercise.

- Not Pushing Yourself Enough It's easy to get trapped in your comfort zone in the fitness center. Increasing weights can be scary, but you will never see improvements in your strength and tissue quality if you fail to challenge the muscle. If you perform 10 to 15 repetitions in a set and don't experience fatigue after the set, it's time to make some changes.
- Stuck in a Rut If you continue to do the same exercises, day-in and day-out, your body is going to adapt to the movements – which means you will stall-out on getting results. It's important to work muscle groups in as many different ways as possible. This could involve using different exercises for each muscle group, or varying your sets, reps and cadence schemes
- Wrong Approach to Sets & Reps Most people see significant strength gains by doing 2-3 sets of 8-12 repetitions, at a weight that completely fatigues the muscles by the last rep of the last set. Lifting lighter weights at higher rep schemes will build muscle endurance, but it's not the strategy to use if you want to focus on muscular strength.
- Exercising Inconsistently You won't see results if you strength train one time a week. To reap significant gains, you need to be working all your major muscle groups 2-3 times in a 7-day cycle.
- Not Training All Muscle Groups Evenly It's important to give the same amount of attention to all major muscle groups. Doing just the exercises you like is dangerous. Muscle imbalances lead to injury, and disproportionate body strength.



People, meeting needs of people is what Sunshine Service is all about. Sunshine Service lends medical and children's equipment to residents of Sun City and we have been doing so for over 54 years. We are a charitable non-profit Arizona corporation and are funded by voluntary contributions and memorial gifts.

While the equipment is available for the use of all residents or visitors staying with residents, the equipment must not be taken out of Sun City on a permanent basis. As a matter of control, equipment is loaned only to Sun City residents.

Records show that as the population of Sun City grew, so did use of our medical equipment. Savings for Sun City residents have been calculated periodically; in 2015, it was estimated that residents saved over two million dollars in cost of equipment for that year alone.




