## **Sundial Season Ticket Sales Begin November 1**

Back by popular demand, reserved seating for all ticketed shows at the Sundial Auditorium returns again for 2018.

With a superb line-up of entertainment, season tickets for the entire series go on sale Wednesday, November 1, 2017 which includes all 11 shows for the unbelievable price of \$154 (that's only \$14 per show).

Season tickets will be on sale during the month of November only and may be purchased by RCSC Cardholders only (limit of one series/season ticket sale per card and all cards must be presented at the time of purchase).

The Gold Dot entrance at Lakeview will open at 5:15am on November 1, when RCSC Cardholders will be issued numbers prior to ticket sales beginning at 8:30am when the Clubs & Activities Office opens.

This process will give Cardholders the ability to save a place in line and return later to make their purchase. It should be noted that anyone arriving at the office after their number has been called will not be served and must begin process over.

Tickets for all individual shows go on sale Friday, December 1 to RCSC Cardholders only for \$17 per person. Ticket sales to non-RCSC Cardholders will be available starting Tuesday, January 2, 2018 for \$20 per person should any tickets remain.

# **RCSC BOD Election Process Moves Forward**

With candidate packets for the upcoming RCSC Board of Directors Elections due to the Corporate/Board Office no later than Friday, September 29, 2017, the race for your vote starts counting down now. Once application packets are deemed complete and signatures have been verified, candidates will be announced to the local media and directly to Cardholders who receive RCSC News Email Alerts. The full slate of candidates along with their qualifications will also appear in the November edition of Sun-Views and on the RCSC Web Portal once online voting begins.

This year, RCSC Members will be voting for three director positions for those seats being vacated by RCSC President Rich Hoffer, Treasurer Carol Lawry and Director Ida Eisert. Those elected will serve through 2020.

Candidates will be formally introduced at the Board/Member Exchange on Monday, October 9 at 9:00am in Social Hall #3 at the Lakeview Center and at subsequent Board Meetings and Board/Member Exchanges, where tables will be provided for candidates to share informational literature about their qualifications. In addition, candidates will also be provided with tables at the annual Sun City Arts & Crafts Festival at Sundial Center on Friday and Saturday, November 24 and 25.

Two candidate forums will also be held again this year, allowing members to question candidates about their goals and expectations if elected prior to ballots being cast. Video of the candidate forums will also be available on the RCSC Sun City YouTube channel for those unable to attend.

Candidate forums are scheduled for Thursday, November 2 at 2:00pm at Fairway and on Tuesday, November 14 at 6:30pm at Marinette. Both sessions will have a meet-and-greet social one-half hour prior to the start of the forum. These forums provide

candidates an opportunity to debate the issues and answer member questions.

Electronic voting for this year's election begins online one month prior to Election Day (starting on Monday, November 13



at 8:00am). Safeguards that restrict each qualified member to only one vote will be in place and strict confidentiality will be maintained throughout the voting process.

By casting ballots online, RCSC Members will have the convenience of voting from any computer, anywhere at any time – from home, at work, or from a public library – whether they are out of town or right here in Sun City AZ. For any members without access to a computer, in-person voting will be held at Lakeview Center on Election Day (Tuesday, December 12, 2017) from 8:00am to 4:00pm. In addition, RCSC Members may cast their vote using an absentee ballot, which can be requested from the Corporate Office beginning on November 7 (last day absentee ballots will be mailed is November 30) and all absentee ballots must be returned by Election Day.

Stay involved and do your part – participate in the RCSC Board of Directors election process. Remember - those elected will be leading RCSC into the future. Your future and the future of Sun City AZ.

REMINDER: Night Board Meeting - Thursday, October 26 at 6:30pm, Fairway Recreation Center Arizona Rooms 1 & 2. Social time begins at 6pm where you can meet with candidates.

#### **ATTN: RCSC Cardholders**

RCSC would like to remind Cardholders of a few items which require your attention when using the recreational facilities:

- All RCSC Cardholders are required to check in with their Member or Privilege Cards (key fobs accepted for entry to fitness, pools and spas; not concerts or free events)
- Host punch cards are purchased by and belong to the Cardholder, not the guest.
- Guests may be requested to show government-issued photo ID when checking in to use RCSC facilities.
- Neither Sun City AZ residents nor spouses of RCSC Cardholders are eligible to be quests.
- Proof of age for 4 and 5 year olds is now required for access to swimming pools. Photo copies or electronic images are acceptable.
- Free concerts and events are for RCSC Cardholders and their escorted guests only. Always be prepared to show your RCSC Member or Privilege card (with photo) when attending events. Key fobs are not accepted for entry.

#### **Golf & Grounds Report**

#### **Pro Shops**

Total rounds for July increased 15% over prior year. This is the fifth month in a row that rounds have increased over prior year. Recent round performance has helped to make-up for the early deficit; year-to-date the Golf Division is within 568 rounds to prior year.

We currently have 74 participants signed up to play in our "Patriot Golf Day" event on September 1. This is slightly behind our 77 participants from last year; however, we are hopeful that we will pick up a few last minute entries prior to the date of play. "Patriot Golf Day" was organized with the help of PGA of America to raise funds for the Folds of Honor Foundation. The money raised is used to fund scholarships for spouses and children of military service men and women killed or disabled while serving our Country. Starters will also be collecting donations through the pro shops from September 1 through September 6.

#### **Snack Shops**

Snack Shop revenue exceeded budget slightly; however, remains slightly behind budget year-to-date. Snack Shops continue to have a regularly scheduled closing time of 1:00 p.m., but this closing time can be extended based on demand.

#### Courses

Overseeding will begin on October 9 on Riverview, Lakes West, Willowbrook and South. As we did last year, we have a built-in overlap period during which all courses will be closed. The overlap period this year begins October 23 and ends October 27. We will also be continuing with the expanded overseeding around green complexes, which was well received last year.

As a reminder, as we move into September, rough heights will be raised. The higher height of cut helps protect the rough from cart traffic as it moves into dormancy and throughout the winter. The height of cut is not raised to increase difficulty, though increased difficulty is a by-product of this procedure. We thank you for your patience and understanding.

The summer is a very busy time for the maintenance crews and we appreciate the patience and understanding shown as we moved through our cultural practices of greens aerification, fairway aerification and verticutting. In addition to our cultural practices, the amount of turf actively growing increases dramatically, as rough emerges from dormancy. The monsoon season complicates things further by requiring cleanup following storms and accelerating the rate of growth on our courses. We appreciate the hard work and effort put forth by our maintenance crews and we hope you do as well.

#### **Lawn Bowling/Grounds**

This summer the greens at Lakeview were frazed to remove thatch, top-dressed and laser leveled to level out the surface. Currently, the greens are being watered heavily and fertilized weekly. Once they have grown back in sufficiently, they will receive more top dressing and will be laser leveled once again.

The softball field had some of the weaker areas re-seeded as well as receiving the final fertilizer application before overseeding. In addition to seeding, the weak areas were dethatched with a spring tine rake. The entire field has been top-dressed and an application of herbicide was used to reduce nutsedge.

#### "Ready Golf" Guidelines

Here are a few more "Ready Golf" guidelines to help golfers speed up play without rushing or hurrying shots. Remember that each golfer within a group should hit when ready, rather than always playing "honors" and thinking ahead so you are ready to play when it's your turn.


#### HELPING TO FIND LOST BALLS:

It is important that everyone try to help out to find a lost ball in order to keep play moving, but players should do it after hitting their shots, not before. The player who is closest to the pin and scheduled to hit last should be the first to help the player whose ball is lost, while the players who are farthest away from the pin should play their shots first. When the players farthest away have played their shots, they should resume looking for the lost ball, while the players who are closest should get ready to play their shots. Limit lost ball search to 3 minutes. If you are looking for your lost ball, declare you are going back to hit a provisional while the rest of the group continues to look for the ball.

#### ON THE GREEN:

- Mark your ball and lift and clean it when you arrive at the putting green so you will be ready to replace it when it's your turn to play.
- Players should line up their putts while other players are putting, so they're ready to putt when it's their turn. A good rule of thumb is to get your putt off in 20 seconds from when it's you turn to putt until you make the putt.
- If the furthest away has not yet reached their ball or read their putt and others are ready to putt, they should go ahead and putt while the away player makes a read.
- Continue putting until holed out. Don't mark unless you will step on someone's line or it's a really tricky putt.
- Always leave clubs at the back or side of the Green closest to your golf bag.

Remember: The goal of ready golf is to stay up to the group in front of you – not ahead of the group behind you.

## **Management Updates**

#### **Financial Report:**

Since there is no monthly Board meeting in August, I will include the Treasurer's Report information in my monthly report. The balance of unrestricted funds as of July 31, 2017 was \$12,664,209 which includes a \$2.5M cash reserve. Restricted funds include the Preservation and Improvement Fund ("PIF") and the Capital Reserve Fund. As of July 31, 2017, PIF had a balance of \$13,284,565 plus \$805,700 collected in July that was transferred into the PIF account the first part of August 2017. The Capital Reserve Fund had a balance of \$5,097,677 as of July month end.

We have completed July 2017 within our operating and capital budget year to date. Our total gross income (income less cost of sales) is on target with budget. General operating expenses and total wages, taxes and benefits are less than budgeted year to date. Utilities, however, is over budget by \$48k year to date, with the largest variance (\$41k) in pump & well electric expense in the golf division. Repairs & maintenance is significantly under budget by \$980k as projects are not released until we are assured that meeting our annual budget is without risk. Repair & maintenance projects are carried forward into the next year as needed so long as we complete the year within our budget, which should not be an issue.

#### **Bowling:**

The final summer bowling tournament will be held on September 24, 2017 at Bell Lanes. The tournament is a scotch doubles tournament and all bowlers are welcome whether USBC certified or not. Entry forms are available at both bowling centers or can be downloaded at www.suncityaz.org under the bowling tab.

Last month, the bowling department implemented a procedure that allows us to notify all league bowlers of events related to their specific league. The procedure has been working well as we have received several comments thanking us for the timely communication. With the new procedure, bowlers can also notify us if they will be returning for the upcoming season and if there are any changes to their teams. We plan to use this system throughout the bowling season to notify bowlers of events related specifically to their league such as meetings and upcoming position rounds.

The bowling department recently held the annual meeting for all league officers. The officers were informed of any changes regarding RCSC policies, bowling policies and league contract changes. Also in attendance were representatives of the Metro Phoenix USBC and the Sun City Bowling Association who informed the officers of any rule changes for the USBC Certified leagues. All RCSC leagues are contracted for a period of thirty-two to thirty-six weeks. The contracts guarantee the league price for the season and also protect RCSC with regard to absent and vacant bowlers.

The league contract also specifies what RCSC's obligations are to the league along with the league obligations to RCSC

#### **Cardholder Services:**

Payments on past due assessments were at an increased rate of 14.6% of past due balances. Unfortunately, this increase in past due payments correlates to an increase in overall past due assessment balances that has been occurring for the past four months. Past due assessments have increased by 9.6% since the beginning of the year. Total accounts receivable decreased by 2.2% in July but is still up 5.6% from the beginning of the year. Over 90 day receivables have decreased 2% since the beginning of the year while all other categories have shown increases. June assessments went 30 days past due at an increased 8.9% rate and May assessments went 60 days past due at an increased 4.1% rate.

Payments from our third-party collections firm totaled \$21,487 in July with a year to date total of \$102,897. Payments in 2017 are approximately 69% of the 2016 year to date total.

Cardholder acceptance and use of the RCSC Web Portal continues to be strong. Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal totaled \$102,241 from 225 property owners. Year to date web portal payments total \$742,198 from 1,641 property owners.

In July, property transfer related balances increased by 3% and lender owned related balances increased by 64%. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent approximately 53% of all receivables and past due balances. At the end of July, trustee sale notices on Sun City properties ended at 53 and properties owned by lending institutions at twelve.

#### **Human Resources:**

During the past month, Human Resources has been involved in annual compliance requirements including the completion and filing of forms and responding to information requests. In compliance with the Affordable Care Act, Human Resources submitted information to BlueCross/BlueShield, RCSC's employee medical insurance provider, to determine the medical loss ratio for the upcoming renewal.

RCSC's auditors, PKF, are in process of the annual audit of the employees' 401(k) Plan. We are assisting in providing requested information to assure our plan is in compliance. A copy of PKF's audit document will accompany our annual required filing of IRS Form 5500 which includes reporting on RCSC's Employee Benefit Plans (medical, dental, life, and short and long term disability insurance plans).

# **Project Updates**

#### **Building and Infrastructure:**

#### **Oakmont Center**

 A 16' x 40' cantilever shade structure will be installed this year on the west end of the Oakmont pool deck. Contractor is USA Shade. (Cost - \$24,172)

#### **Fairway Center**

 Roof leaks were found in the music room and band equipment storage room at Fairway Center. The leaks are caused by compromised paper underlayment and shifted/damaged concrete roof tiles. Repairs will require a section of concrete roof tiles to be removed, new peal and stick underlayment installed and replacement of concrete roof tiles. A repair date has not been set but is expected to be sometime in early September 2017. Contractor is Starkweather roofing. (Cost – \$12,286)

#### **Lakeview Center/Viewpoint Lake**

 The Viewpoint Lake Waterfall pump is still being repaired by the pump's original manufacturer. As soon as the pump is repaired it will be reinstalled and the waterfall turned back on. Contractor is Advanced Pump. (Cost - \$19,422)

#### **Sundial Center**

- The four auditorium restrooms off the lobby hallway are being remodeled. After
  demolition, it was discovered that many of the waste lines needed to be replaced
  including under the concrete slab. This additional cost is reflected in the total
  project cost below. The newly remodeled restrooms will include new LED lighting,
  quartz vanity tops, toilet and urinal partitions, toilets, urinals, lavatories and faucets, tile flooring and walls, and a complete painting. Contractor is Ken McIntyre
  Construction and Accel Electric. (Cost \$146,598)
- The Sundial kitchen remodel is well underway with all electrical, plumbing and fire alarm rough-in work completed. In addition, the sheetrock ceiling and walls has been installed, taped and smooth textured. Painting commenced the week of August 21 with cabinet bases installed soon afterwards. This project includes the disposal of all appliances, demolition of all wall and ceiling board, new electrical wiring, replacement of the underground sink drain line, new cold & hot water piping, replacement of missing or damaged insulation, installation of drywall on all walls and ceilings, cabinetry (including lockable club storage lockers), new LED lighting, painting, new quartz counter tops and backsplashes, new kitchen sink, hand washing sink, new faucets, new appliances (two warming drawers, refrigerator/freezer and microwave), established areas for the ice machine and serving carts and new flooring with coved baseboards. Contractors include the RCSC Skilled Trades cabi-

netmakers, Ken McIntyre Construction, CCBG Architectural, Olympic fire protection, Accel Electric, Sunland Plumbing, Lee's Counter Tops, Resource Flooring, JRM Environmental and Spray Systems Environmental. (Cost - \$66,575)

 A large horizontal sand filter was installed August 6-7 in the pool pump room. The new larger horizontal sand filter will clean debris from the warm water pool. The new filter replaces two old Triton sand filters. Contractor was Aquatic Builders. (Cost - \$24,450)

#### **Water Conservation**

# When everyone conserves, everyone saves!

Water conservation has been a bedrock element of water management in Arizona for the last several decades. Water conservation is built into our communities where summer highs remain above 100 degrees and rain is a rare blessing. We conserve to stretch water supplies, assure a sound economic future for our grandkids, and keep our environment healthy. Yet, when water rates are increased, I am often asked: "Why am I using less water but paying more?"

The question Arizona residents should be asking is "How much more would I be paying without conservation?" To help answer this question, the Alliance for Water Efficiency worked with two Arizona communities, Gilbert and Tucson, to examine how costs were reduced thanks to decades of conservation.

The fact is, water rates are rising in many Arizona cities and across the country. It's costing cities more money to ensure a reliable supply of water, to maintain and

operate the treatment plants, and to keep the infrastructure sound, such as repairing and replacing pipes, pumps and meters.

Conservation actually helps keep costs as low as possible even though rates do rise. Using less water lengthens the lifespan of critical water supplies by being able to serve more people with the same amount of water. This avoids the costs of securing new supplies, building, operating and maintaining new infrastructure to access those supplies, and treating more water and wastewater. Here is a quick summary of the results from the Alliance study.

In the Town of Gilbert, two decades of conservation has reduced per-person-per-day demand from 244 gallons to 173 gallons. This reduction helped the town avoid the need for more than \$340 million in water and wastewater treatment expenses. As a result, rates are 5.8 percent lower than they would have been – a savings of \$38 annually for customers. Additionally, connection fees for new businesses and new homes are 45 percent lower today. That's a savings of \$7,733 that the builder is not passing on to customers.

In the City of Tucson, 30 years of conservation reduced water use from 188 gallons per person per day to 130 gallons. Without this reduction, Tucson would have needed to invest \$350 million in new infrastructure to deliver and treat more water and wastewater. Thanks to conservation, rates are 11.7 percent lower and all customers save an average of \$112 annually on their water bills.

Arizona residents understand that conservation is important to maintaining the state's water supplies and its economy. This is why cities offer a variety of conservation services, such as offering free desert landscape classes, rebates to customers who replace grass with desert landscaping and free water-saving audits to businesses and homeowners. The Alliance for Water Efficiency study shows that conservation also is a cost-effective and sustainable way to keep rates low and water affordable.





#### Tips from Get Fit for Life -

# **Dealing with Shin Splits**

"The phrase *shin splint* is a generic term that describes pain in the lower leg, either on the medial or lateral side of the shin bone," explains *Get Fit for Life* trainer Jane Fortier. "This pain usually begins as a dull ache that can't be pinpointed; it can be felt along the entire region where the muscle attaches to the bone. Exercisers will usually feel pain at the beginning and end of their workouts. But over time, the discomfort becomes more severe, lasting throughout the entire workout, and occurring in non-exercise activities, like getting out of bed. Technically, shin pain can be caused by a number of conditions: tendonitis, periostitis (inflammation of the membrane covering the bone), or a stress fracture. Considering that the placement, causes, and treatment of these three injuries are often the same, the term shin splint has become a simple way to label the injury."

#### What causes shin splints?

- Doing too much too soon Often people with a lot of enthusiasm start an exercise program too aggressively.
- Increasing the Intensity or Duration of a Workout - Overuse injury occurs when someone does too much, and continually strains the muscles of the lower leg. Increasing your distance or intensity by more than 10% per week would make you a prime candidate for shin splints
- Your shoes Quality running and crosstraining shoes are designed to give the best anatomical support. If your shoes are broken down or old—even when the soles or top appear fine—they have lost their ability to control the rotation of your foot and absorb shock.
- The surfaces on which you exercise -Hard surfaces can cause and aggravate shin splints. The optimal surface should absorb shock.
- High impact exercise Running sprints, running uphill, jumping, and repetitive impact exercises can all cause shin splints.

Your anatomy - Fallen arches, knocked or internally rotated knees, very high arches
and over rotation of the foot are all prime causes of shin splints. In these cases custom orthotics, as well as strengthening and stretching exercises are a must.

A combination of the following will usually help most people recover from shin splints and experience less pain:

- Active Rest rest, yet remain mildly active. Completely stopping activities may give temporary relief, but injuries are likely to resurface with resumed activity.
- 2. Ice periods of icing can be very helpful during the acute phase of your pain. Do not exceed 10 to 15 minutes each time you ice, and always wrap ice source to avoid frostbite to the skin.
- 3. Stretching and strengthening the calf muscles a standing Calf Stretch can help prevent and treat shin splints. This stretch along with a Hamstring stretch should be done when muscles are warm from activity.





We are a charitable non-profit Arizona corporation and are funded by voluntary contributions and memorial gifts.

While the equipment is available for the use of all residents or visitors staying with residents, the equipment must not be taken out of Sun City on a permanent basis. As a matter of control, equipment is loaned only to Sun City residents.

Records show that as the population of Sun City grew, so did use of our medical equipment. Savings for Sun City residents have been calculated periodically; in 2015, it was estimated that residents saved over two million dollars in cost of equipment for that year alone.


