Golf & Grounds Report

Pro Shops

The Beat the Pro event held on December 4 matched last year's donation total with \$2,230.88 raised for the Del Web Sun Cities Museum. The pros battled harder than most years, allowing 50% of the field to "Beat the Pros." We truly appreciate the volunteers that assisted with the event, John Dockham and Rich and Lynn Lybolt. Thank you also to Chris Linam and Larry Belt for helping to secure prizes for the event. The biggest thank you goes to all those that participated in making the event fun and successful. Riverview remains the course with the broadest selection of golf merchandise; however, all of our pro shops carry items that are perfect gifts for that special golfer in your life. We have great prices on TaylorMade, Ping and Titleist hats for men and a variety of hats for ladies. We continue to offer custom club fittings through our teaching professionals and have a variety of Ping G400 equipment available for use on the course, allowing you to try before you buy.Golf Courses

The Willowcreek/Willowbrook project continues to move forward, the bidding process is complete and the winning bidder was Wadsworth Golf Construction. We will begin formal construction meetings with the Wadsworth team beginning in February 2018. Installation of the main line will begin March 5, 2018 on the back 9 of Willowcreek, during which time the course will remain open. On March 19, 2018 the back 9 of Willowcreek will close and work will begin on the irrigation lake, the greens renovation and the remainder of the irrigation system. April 9, 2018 is the scheduled date for the front 9 of Willowcreek to close as well as Willowbrook. Plans for the Willowcreek/Willowbrook project are on display in the Willowcreek/Willowbrook pro shop. Both courses will reopen following overseeding in 2018.

Seasonal temperatures are still higher than average, but have dropped enough to push the summer bermuda into dormancy. As temperatures drop, the chance for morning frost increases, we ask for your patience during times of delays and your cooperation during periods of cart path only restrictions. Courses have begun spraying herbicides in rough areas to control weeds. Mowing heights have been lowered and near normal on all courses.

Grounds/Lawn Bowl

Replacement of lantana that was removed from Marinette is well underway. Plantings are being done with an eye towards having fewer, larger, mature plants, as opposed to many smaller plants. Cattails and reeds have been removed from the front of the Lakeview park Lagoons, affording a better view of the lagoons.

We have agreed to a May 15, 2018 start date to begin the process of fraze mowing and laser leveling of the Bell Lawn Bowl greens. Once leveled, the greens will be sprigged in early June 2018 allowing them ample time to grow-in and ready for play in the Fall 2018. Turf Equipment Source has been selected for the fraze mowing and leveling. Sprinklers on the Bell greens have been adjusted so they no longer hit the retractable awnings.



Management Updates

Financial Report

RCSC has completed November 2017 within our operating and capital budget year to date and each division has also ended the month within their overall budget year to date.

Bowling

Lakeview Lanes will host the annual New Year's Eve party on December 31 starting at 8pm. The event is sponsored by the Sun City Bowling Association. There are still openings for anyone just wanting to have fun, win prizes and ring in the New Year. The cost is only \$25 per person. Please call Lakeview Lanes for more information.

The Metro Phoenix USBC Senior Championship Tournament is scheduled for the weekend of January 6, 2018. Bowlers from the Metro Phoenix area will participate. The tournament will use both centers so lane availability will be limited during squad times. The tournament is expected to generate \$5-6k in income.

Cardholder Services

Payments on past due assessments in November decreased again at 7.5% of past due balances. Overall past due assessments increased by just under 1% in November and have decreased by 4.7% since the beginning of the year. Total accounts receivable increased by almost 3% in November and is up 2.8% from the beginning of the year. Historically we have seen increases in both overall and past due balances in November and this year is consistent with this trend. Both over 90 day and over 60 day receivables increased in November. October assessments went 30 days past due at a rate of 5% and September assessments went 60 days past due at a reduced 2.5% rate.

Payments from our third-party collections firm totaled \$13,825 in November with a year to date total of \$139,970. Payments in 2017 continue to be lower than the 2016 year to date total.

Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal were down in November and totaled \$80,733 from 191 property owners. Year to date web portal payments total \$1,094,140 from 2,394 property owners.

In November, property transfer balances increased by 4.25% and lender-related balances decreased by 28%. Outstanding balances related to property transfers continue to represent approximately 56% of all receivables and past due balances. At the end of November, trustee sale notices on Sun City properties ended at 50 and properties owned by lending institutions at ten.

Human Resources

Open enrollment meetings for employee benefits were completed in early December. We were able to offer

employees a diversified medical plan this year, providing three different options from which to choose. Each option has different premiums, deductibles, and out-ofpocket expenses allowing employees to find a plan that more closely meets their financial needs. The benefit package also includes life, short- and long-term disability, dental and a flexible spending account.

Presently, we are scheduling health assessment screenings in January 2018 for RCSC's Wellness Program. Those employees who participate receive a reduction in their monthly medical insurance premiums. We have seen positive results from this program.

We are in the process of updating information in our payroll system to meet all the changes that occur during year end. On January 1, all minimum wage employees will be brought up to Arizona State's new 2018 minimum wage of \$10.50 per hour. This group includes attendants for driving ranges, bowling lanes and facilities.

Member Services

If you are interested in attending the Sundial ticketed shows, be sure to get to the Lakeview Center's Clubs and Activities Office to get your tickets before they are all gone. If any tickets remain, they will be available to non-RCSC Cardholders for \$20 per person starting on Tuesday, January 2, 2018. Cardholders will continue to purchase tickets at \$17 per person.

The Holiday Celebration at Lakeview Center on Friday, December 8 was a success! The winners were very excited! Proceeds from this event will benefit the Del Webb Sun Cities Museum. Scott Keo's #1 Michael Buble' Christmas Tribute show on Tuesday, December 12 was spectacular!

We look forward to seeing you at our first 2018 event on Wednesday, January 10, as we kick off the Sundial 2018 Concert Series with One of These Nights, a tribute to The Eagles, one of Sun City's all-time favorite shows.

Project Updates

Building and Infrastructure:

Oakmont Center

 The 16' x 32' cantilever shade structure has been delayed due to designed size and building setback requirements. This structure is pending size redesign and variance approval from by Maricopa County Planning and Development and Maricopa County Environmental Services Department. Contractor is USA Shade. (Cost – \$24,172)

Sun Bowl Amphitheater

 At the time of this report, Renco roofing is completing the foam patching and overall elastomeric application to the roof. This is the last item to be completed pertaining to the evaporative cooler installation project that involved contractors Custom Cooling, Accel Electric, Ken McIntyre Construction and Sunland Plumbing. (Roof Repair Cost – \$2,076)

Lakeview Center/Lakeview Lanes

- Renovation of the men's and women's restrooms on the east end of Lakeview Lanes is underway and approximately 50% complete. The remodel includes new sheetrock, lighting, plumbing fixtures, doors, tile, toilet partitions, toilets, lavatories, mirrors and counter tops. Contractors are Doege Development and Supercharge Electric. (Cost – \$94,369)
- The Blue entrance railings at Lakeview Center will be repaired and repainted. The project will begin on December 26, 2017 and will require the closure of the Blue entrance for approximately 4 days. Contractor is Ken McIntyre Construction. (Cost – \$3,495)

Viewpoint Lake

- On December 12, 2017, 50,000 goldfish were stocked into Viewpoint Lake. The goldfish help control midge fly larvae and are forage fish for bass in the lake. The stocking went smoothly with groups of goldfish now being visible around the lake.
- On December 13, 2017, 800 pounds of trout (approximately 600 fish) were stocked into Viewpoint Lake. The stocking went smoothly with the trout taking to their new home and without the loss of any fish.

Sundial Center

• Palo Verde Art Club cabinets and countertops are complete. This work was completed by the RCSC Skilled Trades Carpenters.

Bell Center

 A new pair of storefront doors and a new automatic door opener were installed on December 18, 2017 on the south inside doors of Bell Lanes. Contractor was DH Pace Door Services. (Cost – \$3,995)

Marinette Center

• Final striping of the lane lines on the outdoor walking track at Marinette have been completed which finalizes the repairs to the walking track. As a reminder, the track repairs were done under warranty at no cost to RCSC.





Mah Jongg



Mah Jongg (MJ) is a fascinating, rummy like game played with tiles rather than cards. The game originated in China but its exact origins are shrouded in story and myth. Some claim is was the game of Chinese royalty, others claim it was invented by a Chinese General, and more recent investigations point to early versions of this popular tile game appearing as recently as 150 years ago in China as a variant of card games. There is a general

agreement that the game we play and love originated in China, and was popularized in the U.S. at the beginning of the 20th century.

There are two categories of Mah Jongg: American and Chinese. American differs from international MJ by using a card of standard hands, more tiles including jokers, and starts with a "Charleston" passing unwanted tiles from one player to another. Chinese is also played in our club.

There are millions of dedicated players around the world. A small amount of time and effort is required to become familiar with the elementary principles of the game. Your patience in mastering the fine points of MJ will be repaid many times by the keen enjoyment invariably derived from the game.



Exercise Boosts Brain Health

"Improving mental clarity is one of the many benefits of exercise," states Jane Fortier, senior fitness specialist and co-owner of Get Fit for Life. "Most of us know that regular exercise reduces the risk for heart disease, stroke, diabetes and a dozen or more different types of cancer. Those of us who do exercise, have experienced the endorphin release that helps to reduce stress and anxiety. But many active adults are not aware that exercise is cognitive candy – it stimulates the brain in ways that prove beneficial for aging."

The latest research shows that cognitive decline is not inevitable. Brain volume shrinks slightly with age, but the brain continues to make new neurons and fine-tune neural connections, as long as we live. Studies have revealed that exercise reduces the level of brain loss and helps keep mental clarity sharp. It slashes the lifetime risk of Alzheimer's by 50%, and general dementia by 60%. Studies have compared the cognitive abilities of people in top physical condition to those of people in poor physical condition. Exercise has been associated with an astonishing elevation in brain performance, compared with those who are sedentary. Clinical subjects scored better in just about every mental test possible: long-term memory; reasoning; attention level; problem solving.



Regular exercise has been proven to enhance mental clarity.

Imaging studies of the human brain have shown that exercise boosts the flow of blood to the brain, spurring the release of a chemical known as BDNF (brain-derived neurotrophic factor). This chemical stimulates the formation of new neurons in the hippocampus, the area involved in memory, learning and decision making. BDNF also repairs cell damage, and strengthens the synapses that connect brain cells. The hippocampus shrinks by 0.5% each year, starting as early as age 40. Recent studies show that exercise can actually increase the size of the hippocampus. Anyone, regardless of age, can pump-up their brainpower by committing to a regular workout regimen. And, the benefits of that workout are dose-dependent. The more a person exercises, the greater the cognitive benefit. The human brain evolved under conditions of almost constant motion. Our prehistoric ancestors walked roughly twelve miles per day. Our unique cognitive skills evolved in an environment of physical activity.

Getting started with exercise is often the hardest part. Using a Get Fit for Life personal trainer can help. Trainers design programs that address needs, goals and medical issues. 


Welcome to Sunshine Service

People, meeting needs of people is what Sunshine Service is all about. Sunshine Service lends medical and children's equipment to residents of Sun City and we have been doing so for over 54 years. We are a charitable non-profit Arizona corporation and are funded by voluntary contributions and memorial gifts.

While the equipment is available for the use of all residents or visitors staying with residents, the equipment must not be taken out of Sun City on a permanent basis. As a matter of control, equipment is loaned only to Sun City residents.

Records show that as the population of Sun City grew, so did use of our medical equipment. Savings for Sun City residents have been calculated periodically; in 2015, it was estimated that residents saved over two million dollars in cost of equipment for that year alone.



TAX CREDIT! Thanks to Arizona House Bill 2074 enacted in 1998, taxpayers may receive up to a \$400 tax credit on their state Income tax by contributing to Arizona schools if they are married and filing jointly. It will remain \$200 if they are single. The program gives a dollar-for-dollar reduction of state income taxes. The money must be designated for school-based extracurricular activities.

• Checks must be made payable to the Nadaburg Unified School District.

• The credit is against taxes. If an individual has no tax liability, a credit will not be available for this year, however, it can be carried forward to later years.

• When the check is received, the taxpayer will receive a receipt from a school district official. The district will also notify the Arizona Department of Revenue. When the District receives the tax forms necessary for your tax filing, upon request you will be sent the appropriate forms.


