ATTN: RCSC Cardholders

RCSC would like to remind Cardholders of a few items which require your attention when using the recreational facilities:

- All RCSC Cardholders are required to check in with their Member or Privilege Cards (key fobs accepted for entry to fitness, pools and spas; not concerts or free events)
- Host punch cards are purchased by and belong to the Cardholder, not the guest. Host punch cards can be purchased at RCSC Monitor Stations (cash or check only), Cardholder Services at Lakeview, RCSC Bowling Centers.
- Guests may be requested to show government-issued photo ID when checking in to use RCSC facilities.
- Neither Sun City AZ residents nor spouses of RCSC Cardholders are eligible to be guests.
- Proof of age for 4 and 5 year olds (birth certificate or passport) is required for access to swimming pools. Photo copies or electronic images are acceptable.
- Free concerts and events are paid for by RCSC Cardholders and are intended for RCSC Cardholders and their escorted guests only. Always be prepared to show your RCSC Member or Privilege card (with photo) when attending concerts and events. Key fobs are not accepted for entry.
- Lakeview Hillside Park is now gated and Cardholders must present Member or Privilege card to attendant for access.

Golf & Grounds Report

Pro Shops

Golf Division slightly exceeded budgeted revenue goals despite a slow start to the year due to weather. After February 2017 the Golf Division was behind prior year rounds by 5,059 rounds and 2,252 rounds behind prior year through June. By the end of 2017 the Golf Division exceeded prior 2016 by 504 rounds, exceeding prior year from the period of March through December by 5,563 rounds.

On February 15, 2018, Lakes East/Lakes West will be hosting the 10th annual Teal Ribbon Tournament. This 9 hole event is open to ladies and men with no handicap required; 9:30am shotgun start and lunch follows play at Sundial. Proceeds benefit the University of Arizona Cancer Center for Ovarian Cancer research. The entry fee is \$30.00 per person, entry forms may be picked up and turned in to any pro shop.

We have received the new Ping G400 Irons for our fitting cart so we now have G400, G, G Max, I200, I Blades and Ladies GLe for fittings and demos. If you are interested in a custom fitting give us a call and schedule a fitting. We also have Ping G400 Drivers, Fairway Woods and Hybrids for our residents to Demo on the course at Riverview. We can match most prices with any of the Big Box stores on current year models so don't just grab a set off of the wall, come down and get custom fit for your next set.

Snack Shops

The replacement for the South Clubhouse remains on track for this year. A firm date for construction is not yet available; however, we are planning for construction to begin in May 2018. The decision has been made to demolish the current building and build the new building over the footprint of the existing building. During construction, pro shop operations will be staged out of a trailer. Food and Beverage options will be limited to prepackaged snacks and canned beverages. We thank everyone in advance for their understanding and patience.

Golf Courses

The preliminary aerification/overseed schedule was presented to the Golf Advisory Committee during the January meeting. Fairway verticutting continues to be in May. This process thins out the remaining rye grass, opening the grass canopy for more sunlight. The additional sunlight allows the bermuda grass to emerge from dormancy with more vigor. The end result is a smoother transition from rye to bermuda, though it does not completely eliminate transition. Fairway aerification helps to relieve compaction in the fairways and allows for more oxygen to reach the roots. Greens aerification removes organic matter and provides more oxygen to the roots. We have not scheduled an overlap period of complete course closures this year for overseeding. However, should it be apparent that temperatures will not be optimal for an October 1st start, the first set of courses will have their start date moved to October 8th and their reopen date pushed to October 27th. Should this change be necessary, an overlap of complete course closures will be the result.

We respectfully remind all golfers to please practice only in designated areas. We have begun to see an increase of hitting outside these areas. We rotate areas on a regular basis to allow the driving range to recover. We understand that often golfers are looking for a pristine spot to practice from, however this can impact the experience of other golfers. To that end we also ask that everyone becomes mindful of their divots and ask that everyone keep your divots in a line, meaning that where ever you start, you place your ball directly behind the divot of your previous shot. This practice uses much less area and is easier to maintain.

Planning, Projects Move Forward

Well...as we head into another month, the RCSC Board of Directors are getting into their new routine. Committee chairs and co-chairs have been determined, liaisons to community organizations are getting acquainted with various boards and meeting schedules are pretty well planned out for the year.

Decisions made previously are starting in on the planning and implementation stages or will be very shortly. There are lots of exciting things that are scheduled to start happening in Sun City AZ this year.

Renovations to the former Skilled Trades building behind Lakeview Lanes are underway and once demolition has been completed by the contractor, miscellaneous painting, minor plumbing, electrical work and fencing additions/repairs will bring to fruition the needed changes necessary for this structure to become the new "temporary" location for the Vintage Vehicles Club of Sun City.

Space planning and design work for the property on Grand Avenue is also in the beginning stages and several of the other clubs approved for relocation to this site (besides Vintage Vehicles) are busy anticipating how long this process is expected to take, including Camera Guild, Sun City Clay Club, Garden Club, Sportsmen Club and Piano Club. It was also the recommended by the ad hoc Long Range Committee that the Sun City Posse establish a satellite office on this property as well. We'll have to wait and see but one this is certain - It will be exciting to see how "grand" this RCSC property will become over the next few years.

Work that was postponed last year at Willowcreek is now scheduled to get started on March 5 on the back 9 with the installation of the main irrigation line while remaining open. On March 19, the back 9 will close as work begins on the lake, greens renovation and the remainder of the irrigation system. The front 9 at Willowcreek as well as Willowbrook will be closed as of April 9. We look forward to completing these irrigation, renovation projects and the water and cost savings that will result.

Some golfers at the South Course may be somewhat inconvenienced beginning in May as pro shop operations move into temporary, trailer-type housing when construction of the new clubhouse is anticipated to start. Food and beverage options will be limited to pre-packaged snacks and canned beverages while this project is underway. I suspect that a little disruption over the summer months will be worth the long wait this project has experienced.

Stay tuned as we keep you informed on what plans will be moving forward with next!

Management Updates

Financial Report
RCSC has completed 2017 within its operating and capital budget. The year ended with \$683,445 of unfinished repair & maintenance projects and \$58,774 of unfinished capital projects. The monies allocated to these projects will remain and be used to complete them in 2018.

Investment Report 4th Quarter 2017:
RCSC’s Investment Policy (Board Policy 33) is stringent in its requirements with the priority of investment objectives to be placed in this order: 1) safety, 2) liquidity, and 3) yield.

At the end of the fourth quarter 2017, \$4,595,970 (cost basis) of the \$2.5M unrestricted cash reserve and other unrestricted funds have been invested in various FDIC insured certificates of deposit and corporate bonds. In 2017, these investments along with the unrestricted money market account have produced interest income of \$88,562.28 with management fees of \$5,783.29 for a net income on unrestricted fund investments of \$82,778.99.

As of December, 2017, \$5,023,543 (cost basis) of the \$5M restricted capital reserve plus interest earned has been invested in various FDIC insured certificates of deposit and corporate bonds. Year-to-date, these investments have produced interest income of \$92,774.19 with management fees of \$10,024.26 for a net income on restricted capital reserve investments of \$82,754.93.

At the end of the fourth quarter 2017, \$8,353,729 (cost basis) of the approximate \$17M in the restricted Preservation and Improvement Fund has been invested in various FDIC insured certificates of deposit and corporate bonds. Year-to-date these investments have produced interest income of \$156,554.86 with management fees of \$4,234.12 for a net income on restricted Preservation and Improvement Fund investments of \$152,320.74.

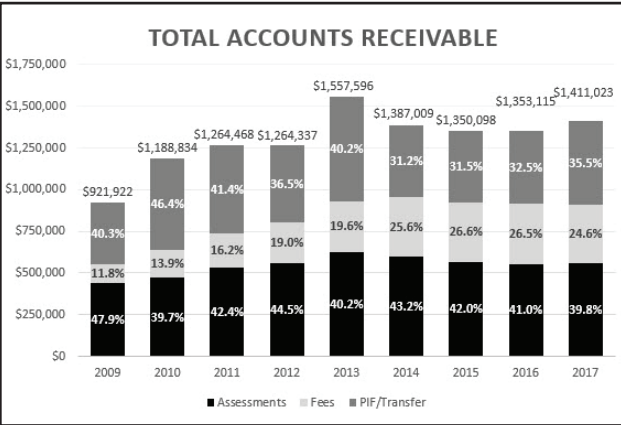
Bowling
The Metro Phoenix USBC Senior Championship Tournament was held on the weekend of January 6, 2018. The tournament was hosted by both RCSC bowling centers. The tournament generated \$5,600 in income.

A recent bowler count shows a combined total of 2,040 bowlers for the two RCSC bowling centers for the 2017/2018 season. Bowling lineage for 2017 was down 2% from 2016 which amounts to 5,300 games, or 50 bowlers. The decrease is due partially to health of bowlers, merging of leagues and one league with thirty bowlers dissolved.

Cardholder Services
Payments on past due assessments in December 2017 bounced back strong at almost 14% of past due balances. Overall past due assessments increased by just over 1% in December and ended the year down 3.6% from the beginning of the year. November assessments

went 30 days past due at a rate of 5.8% and October assessments went 60 days past due at an increased 4.8% rate.

Overall total accounts receivable increased by 1.4% in December and ended the year up 4.3% from the beginning of the year. A chart of the ending Total Accounts Receivable for the past 9 years is below.



Payments from our third-party collections firm in December were the highest of the year and totaled \$32,821. The year to date total for 2017 was \$172,792. Payments in 2017 ended the year 18.5% lower than the 2016 year to date total.

Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal were down again in December and totaled \$77,296 from 178 property owners. 2017 ended with the highest yearly Web Portal payments and totaled \$1,171,436 from 2,537 property owners.

In December, property transfer balances decreased by 2.7% and ended the year up 10% from the beginning of the year. Lender related balances increased 2.5 times while ending the year down 1.9% from the beginning of the year. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent 55% of all receivables and past due balances. At the end of December, trustee sale notices on Sun City properties ended at 49 and properties owned by lending institutions at 22.

Human Resources
Human Resources has completed employee pay changes as a result of the State’s minimum wage increase and other annual salary reviews due on January 1, 2018. Sixty-two employees received the minimum wage increase and 271 employees received their annual review for a total of 333 pay changes.

Implementation of employee benefit changes have been completed. This year employees were offered three options for medical insurance coverage, allowing them to choose a plan that best fits their needs both medically and financially.

Project Updates

Building and Infrastructure:

Multiple Locations

- The RCSC WiFi services were originally installed in 2011 with usage growing over time. We are starting the process of upgrading the WiFi services at all RCSC locations (Centers and Snack Shops) which will take approximately 4-6 weeks to complete. These upgrades will include the replacement of access points that will provide stronger wireless signals, more consistent connections, easier access when visiting a new RCSC location, ability to remember devices and reduce connection interactions, and provide better Android device support. These upgrades address cardholder concerns that we have received regarding our current WiFi services.

Oakmont Center

- The cantilever shade structure has been resized to 16’ x 40’ and 12’ high based upon County requirements and has been sent for permits. Fabrication and installation pending final permit approval. Contractor is USA Shade. (Cost – \$24,172)

Lakeview Center/Lakeview Lanes

- Renovation of the men’s and women’s restrooms on the east end of Lakeview Lanes is approximately 75% complete. Pending items include the tile band and several punch list items. The remodel includes new sheetrock, lighting, plumbing fixtures, doors, tile, toilet partitions, toilets, lavatories, mirrors and counter tops. Contractors are Doege Development and Supercharge Electric. (Cost – \$94,369)
- The Blue entrance railings at Lakeview Center were repaired and repainted at the end of December. Contractor was Ken McIntyre Construction. (Cost – \$3,495)
- The automatic door on the east entrance to Lakeview Lanes is currently closed for repairs. We are awaiting the installation of a new low energy door operator. Contractor is Vortex. (Cost \$3,498)
- LED lighting to be added to the east and north sides of the Lakeview Lanes parking lot to provide better lighting in these areas. Contractor is Accel Electric. (Cost – \$6,574)
- Demolition of the interior of the old Skilled Trades building is approximately 80% complete. After the interior demolition is complete, the contractor will hand the space back to RCSC to complete painting, minor electrical and plumbing work and fencing additions/repairs. This space has been approved for use by the Vintage Vehicle Club. Contractors are Ken McIntyre Construction, American Fence, and RCSC Skilled Trades staff. (Cost – \$24,475)

Fairway Center

- LED lighting to be added under the canopy in the dog training arena. The existing lighting does not adequately cover this arena area currently. Contractor is Accel Electric. (Cost – \$2,212)

Marinette Center

- LED lighting to be added on the solar canopy on the west side of the building to provide better lighting in the parking lot areas. Contractor is Accel Electric. (Cost – \$3,539)

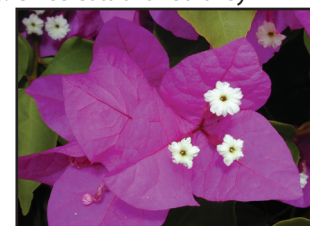

Water Conservation

Desert Plants Help to Make Landscaping Water-wise

It's a known fact that in Arizona cities, the largest use of potable water is on landscaping, and with spring in the air, it's a great time to consider your water conservation options for the upcoming summer months. It's also a great time to switch out some of those water-hogging plants for some desert plants and begin shifting your high water need shrubs and plants for some xeriscaping. There are many colorful alternatives for making your landscape "water-friendly."

Bougainvillea: While considered more tropical than desert, bougainvilleas are fairly resilient to drought and recover quickly from frost damage. Once established they really don't need copious amounts of water, but will do well with a good soaking once every week or two during the summer. In the cooler winter months they need only a good soaking every four to six weeks. Bougainvilleas come in many varieties and a myriad of colors to add shape and color to your yard. According to phoenixtropicals.com/watering.html#citrus, other plants that fall under this watering category are citrus trees and oleanders.



Texas Sage: A staple in Arizona landscapes, Texas Sage actually has many varieties which tolerate being watered very little. The above-mentioned link actually lists their watering needs under both "citrus" and "cactus" schedules. Slow growing, they produce bountiful blossoms that are unfortunately short lived. They do however blossom multiple times throughout the year.



Brittle Bush: Another low water alternative to our landscapes, Brittle Bush is related to the sunflower and gives off a "wild-flower" aroma, and needs very little water. In summer, they can go dormant and drop most of their leaves if not watered. They do look nicer if given an occasional drink and should be trimmed back after flowering in the late spring. With silvery-blue foliage, this plant needs no more water than a cactus, and grows to form a medium-sized, rounded shrub.



Bottle Brush: Not to be confused with Brittle Bush, Bottle Brush blossoms spring, fall and winter, comes in bush and tree forms and tolerates well in both full sun and partial shade. Watering needs are the same as citrus trees so these plants simply need a good dousing once every week or so in the summer and every four to six weeks in the winter.

Citrus Watering: The plants that utilize this type of watering can tolerate drying out between watering during hot summer months. Just be sure to thoroughly flood them (30 to 60 minutes) once every one to two weeks, keeping in mind that this schedule applies to established plants only.

Cactus Watering: Overwatering or watering too frequently will actually kill a cactus and most cactus native to Arizona need nothing more than Mother Nature. In hot summer temperatures (106 or more) for prolonged, rainless periods (a month plus) may cause cactus to become thirsty (you can tell if they begin to look "skinny"). So give your cactus a good drink and let it go for another rain-free month. Be aware that cactus not native to Arizona might need more water than this, so be sure to know your plants.

Remember that where you plant your shrubbery can be important as well. For example, Bougainvillea and Bottle Brush tolerate partial shade, which helps alleviate evaporation. So when we total all these little things we're learning, we can make...

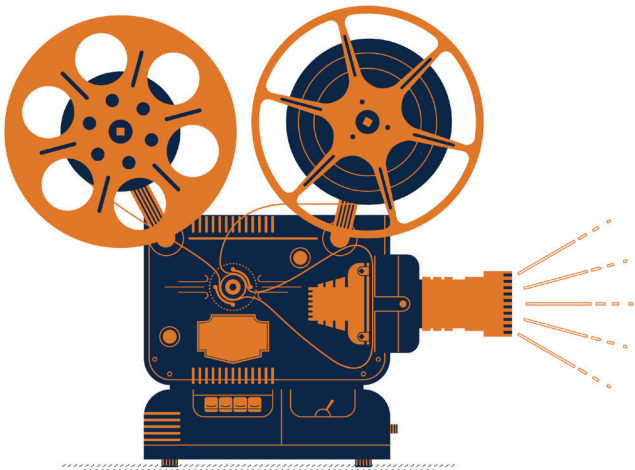



El Mirage School Supplied with Hope










Two Sun City Clubs + One Great Idea = School and Art Supplies for El Mirage Elementary School

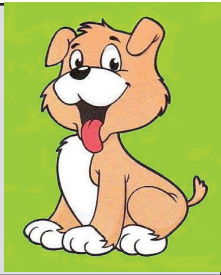

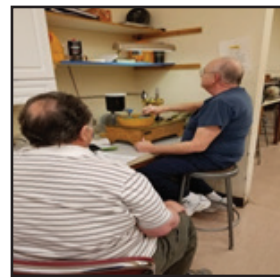

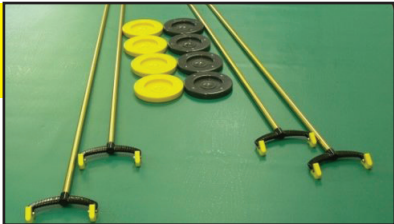
Friday Afternoon Bridge

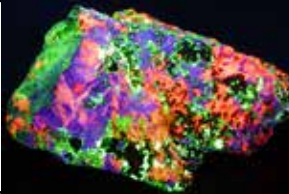

Tips from Get Fit for Life -

Cardiovascular Exercise

“Although cardiovascular exercise is only one component of a good exercise program for someone over 50 years, it is an important one,” states Jane Fortier, senior fitness specialist for Get Fit for Life. “Cardiovascular exercise is essential in reaching fitness goals, maintaining a healthy weight and reducing the risk of chronic disease. Whether it’s walking, jogging, hiking, swimming, bicycling, Zumba, HIIT workouts, or aerobic machines, cardiovascular exercise triggers an array of physiological adaptations in the body. Because of this, the body becomes more efficient in transporting and utilizing oxygen by increasing stroke volume (amount of blood pumped out of the heart with each beat) and produces more red blood cells and hemoglobin (which carry oxygen to the muscles at work).”



Sonny Fried, who faces a limited Ejection Fraction, uses cardiovascular exercise, as well as strength training, in his effort to improve overall level of fitness.

Research shows that regular cardiovascular exercise thins-out the viscosity of blood, and forms new capillary beds, which leads to an increased flow of blood to working muscles. Lung capacity improves too, which means the lungs are more efficient at transferring oxygen into the blood, and in removing waste products from the blood. Perhaps the most profound changes occurs in mitochondria, the powerhouses of each cell. Through cardiovascular conditioning, mitochondria increase in number and size, which computes to improved endurance and less fatigue. For Sun City golfers, that means having enough energy after 18 holes of golf to come home and clean the garage!

“While any aerobic activity is better than no activity at all, one has to hit the right intensity to reap the most benefits,” Fortier continues. “Research suggests that higher-intensity cardiovascular workouts deliver significantly greater fitness and health gains. Statistics have shown that fitness gains were approximately five times greater for each minute of vigorous activity compared, per minute, to moderate effort activity. From a health standpoint, other markers such as blood pressure, cholesterol, and body fat delivered an overall higher return, with higher-intensity training. That return was upwards of 5-7 percent greater. Although maximum heart rate and VO2max are useful tools for measuring aerobic exercise intensity, the more practical way, especially for people over 50 years, is rating “perceived exertion” or RPE. Heart rate values can be skewed by medications, hydration status, physical and emotional stress, and other factors, so Perceived Exertion Scales make good sense. ”

Many active aging adults face cardiovascular issues and are unsure about aerobic exercise. COPD, emphysema, asthma, and ejection fraction limitations make them hesitant to explore an exercise venue. Massage Therapy After Surgery

There is a common question that arises for many people after they have had surgery or major health challenge. When is the right time to schedule a massage? The truth is that Massage Therapy is great to help you to recover faster!

Prevent/Reduce Scar Tissue – Part of the body’s healing process is protecting the surgery site from any additional damage. This may result in an increased production of collagen fibers that can form visible and uncomfortable scars. Massage done locally on such scar tissue can reduce and soften this buildup of tough fibrous tissue.

Promote Flexibility, Mobility – Depending on the type of massage, it may improve flexibility and mobility. During the disturbance of muscles, tendons, ligaments, fascia and other tissues can stubbornly stick together, possibly causing reduction in your overall flexibility and mobility which massage therapy can help to restore.

We are a charitable non-profit Arizona corporation and are funded by voluntary contributions and memorial gifts.

While the equipment is available for the use of all residents or visitors staying with residents, the equipment must not be taken out of Sun City on a permanent basis. As a matter of control, equipment is loaned only to Sun City residents.

Records show that as the population of Sun City grew, so did use of our medical equipment. Savings for Sun City residents have been calculated periodically; in 2015, it was estimated that residents saved over two million dollars in cost of equipment for that year alone.

Sunshine Service, Inc has received local, state and national recognition. Awards received include the George Washington Honor Medal for services to the sick and handicapped from the Freedoms Foundation of Valley Forge in Pennsylvania.
