Board Approves Policy Change Addressing Caretaker/Caregiver Guest Fees

The RCSC Board of Directors recently approved changes to Board Policy 9, Cardholder Guests & Host Punch Cards, Section A-1 which allows for RCSC Cardholders who require that a caretaker/caregiver be present to enjoy and use the facilities to do so without incurring guest fees by annually submitting to the RCSC Corporate Office a letter from their physician stating a caretaker/caregiver is necessary along with an authorization from the RCSC Cardholder that allows RCSC to contact the physician for verification. RCSC Form BP:9-1 has been created for this purpose and may be obtained under RCSC/Corporate Documents at www. suncityaz.org or at the Corporate Office.

"We are pleased that the Board was able to see the benefit of changing this policy to better serve RCSC Cardholders who might find themselves in need of such assistance," stated Board Director Stella VanNess, who introduced the motion. is always available for viewing online (http://suncityaz.org/rcsc/presscommunications/) and RCSC News Email Alerts are another great way to stay in the know. Closures in Observance of Memorial Day; No Saturday Summer Hours at SCVC

RCSC Elections: Candidate Packets Available Starting June 4

While the RCSC Board of Director elections may be months away, it is not too early to begin thinking about giving back to the community by becoming a candidate for upcoming Board vacancies. There will be three vacancies to fill in this year's December election, with each being a three year term.

Candidate packets will be available for pick-up on Monday, June 4, 2018. Those interested in obtaining a packet must make this request in person at the Corporate/ Board Office at Lakeview Center (lower level) and present their RCSC Member card. The deadline for packet submissions is no later than noon on Friday, October 5, 2018.

Requirements to become a RCSC Board candidate:

- Must be at least fifty-five (55) years of age;
- Must not be related by marriage or birth to any other member of the

Board, Senior Management Staff, or Board Candidate;

- Must be a Deeded Real Estate Owner of property in Sun City, Maricopa County, Arizona;
- Must be a RCSC Member in good standing;
- Must reside in Sun City, Arizona and be available at least ten (10) months of the year;
- Must meet the requirements to hold an Arizona liquor license (RCSC holds liquor licenses which require Board Officers to be included on the licensing);
- Must be eligible and available to serve a three (3) year term; and
- Must be available to attend Board Candidate Orientation(s).

Candidates must also submit a fully completed RCSC petition, signed by 100 or more RCSC Members in good standing, along with all other forms provided in the RCSC Candidate Packet.

A successful candidate will:

- Have a strong desire to serve Sun City, AZ;
- Be fair and courteous;
- Use good common sense;
- Have good communication skills;
- · Be willing to work as part of a team;
- Ability to prioritize policy and projects which will have the greatest benefit for the most members; and
- Be willing and able to dedicate the necessary hours to be an effective Director.

Candidates will be introduced at both the October and November Board meetings and candidate forums that will be held in the fall. Forum locations and dates will be announced at a later time.

Cardholders are asked to please keep the following in mind!

While you're out and about enjoying all that RCSC has to offer, please be aware of the following items which require Cardholder attention when using any of the recreational facilities:

- All RCSC Cardholders are required to check in with their Member or Privilege Cards (key fobs accepted for entry to fitness, pools and spas; not concerts or free events)
- Neither Sun City AZ residents nor spouses of RCSC Cardholders are eligible to be guests. With proper documentation, privilege cards may be purchased at the Cardholder Services Office at Lakeview Center in order to use the facilities.
- Host punch cards are purchased by and belong to the Cardholder, not the guest. Host punch cards can be purchased at RCSC Facility Attendent Stations (exact cash or check only), Cardholder Services at Lakeview, RCSC Bowling Centers.
- Guests may be requested to show government-issued photo ID when checking in to use RCSC facilities.
- Proof of age for 4 and 5 year olds (birth certificate or passport) is required for access to swimming pools. Photo copies or electronic images are acceptable.
- Free concerts and events are paid for by RCSC Cardholders and are intended for RCSC Cardholders and their escorted guests only. Always be prepared to show your RCSC Member or Privilege card (with photo) when attending concerts and events. Key fobs are not accepted for entry.

Golf & Grounds Report

Pro Shops

Despite a slightly sluggish February, total rounds have outpaced prior year by 4,163 rounds. Through February, 75,312 rounds have been played on our courses, which is ahead of the prior five year average of 74,329 rounds. Lakes West has played 11,230 rounds, followed closely by Riverview, which has played 11,206 rounds. Lakes East has posted 7,969 rounds, followed by Willowbrook, which has posted 7,033 rounds. For the year 91% of our rounds have been played by residents and their guests. Surcharge play represents 50% of total rounds played.

Participation in the 2018 Can/Am event was down this year with 74 participants. Golfers from both countries proudly displayed their country's colors. The American team won back the cup this year, winning 11 matches to the Canadian team's seven matches. The men and ladies divisions were broken down into four flights. We thank everyone that participated and look forward to 2019 and a

We have scheduled our first night golf event of the season for April 21, at Lakes East Golf Course. Check-in will begin at 6:00pm, dinner will be served at 6:30pm, and play will begin at 7:30pm. Applicable green fees will be paid on the day of play. The event is currently full; however, a standby list is available.

Demolition of the South pro/snack shop building will commence in early May 2018. During this construction period, pro shop operations will be staged from a mobile unit. Canned soda, canned beer and prepackaged snacks will be available, prepared food will not be available during construction. Updated plans are now posted in the snack shop at the South Pro Shop and reflect comments made during our "town hall" meetings that took place in 2017.

Snack Shops

Colder than normal February temperatures resulted in a slight miss of \$3,631 to budget.

Golf Courses

Work on the Willowcreek golf course renovation began on March 5 with installation of the mainline. Mainline construction is now complete on holes 11 through 18. On March 19 the back nine of Willowcreek closed to begin green construction, installation of irrigation lines off the mainline and irrigation lake renovation. The boring across Boswell Boulevard was delayed and took place the week of March 15 tying the new irrigation system to the current system on Willowbrook. Please remember that this is a construction site and areas under construction are closed, this includes foot traffic that is normally allowed on our courses before sunrise and after sunset. We ask for your cooperation both for your safety and to prevent inadvertent damage to course equipment during this process.

Beginning April 9 spring fertilizer applications will begin at Willowcreek/Willowbrook. We utilize an outside contractor for this application, which utilizes large tender trucks. The vendor is familiar with the golf courses and works with the golf superintendents to avoid damaging irrigation. This process is the most efficient way for this application. The process will be completed April 18th at Quail. The applications begin early enough in the morning to avoid disrupting

The warmer than usual winter has begun to awaken our bermuda grass. Watering of the roughs has increased. Though the rough is not growing at a substantial rate, we have begun to mow these areas to keep them clean. There are some unwanted grasses in the rough areas that grow at a faster rate, mowing helps to keep the rough height even.

Tips from a Pro

The easiest route to lowering your score!

The short game makes up nearly 70 % of the shots we take out on the golf course. That said it is usually the first place to examine if lowering the score is your goal!

Generally, the short game is made up of putts, chips and pitches. A small improvement in each area can add up to a big difference in score!

Putting: Start by practicing short putts. If you can consistently make the 2-3 foot putts, back up. Try the 10-15 foot putts. See how many out of 10 you can get close enough to the hole to make the second putt a tap in. Last work on the long lag putts. Imagine a hula-hoop around the hole and see how many you can get within that 3-foot circle. The goal should be a two putt every time.

Chipping: Practice both with a lofted club and a less lofted club. You want chips that will hop a little and roll a lot (7 iron) or ones that will hop and roll about the same amount. (Pitching Wedge) Practice short, medium and long distances with both clubs. The goal should be to get in close enough to the pin that there is a reasonable chance to make the putt.

Pitching: Using a lofted club (Pitching, Sand or Lob Wedge) practice 1/4, $\frac{1}{2}$ and $\frac{3}{4}$ swings to figure out the distance your ball goes. (Higher handicappers should stick to just one club, while advanced players may have distances figured with all wedges.) Once distances are known, practice on the pitching green from varying distances determining which swing is needed. See how many balls out of 10 you can get on the green. (Initially aiming for the center of the green and then eventually for the flag.)

Remember working on the short game is one of the fastest ways to reduce score! For high handicappers, it's not unrealistic to lower the score 1-2 shots per hole. For low handicappers, it can really help with overall consistency and scoring.



Grounds/Lawn Bowling

Green speeds are generally slower than reported in February. The average stimp reading in March was 12.5 compared to 13.4 in February. The warmer than normal temperatures have begun to bring the greens out of dormancy, resulting in growth and additional watering. Greens have been aerated using needle tines to allow water and oxygen to reach the root system. Currently, we are mowing greens once per week and rolling four times per week.

The lack of rain has produced fewer weeds than years past; however, they have begun to grow. Weed control will be a major focus over the coming weeks. Transition of grassy areas from winter rye to summer bermuda has begun. Weak areas will receive additional water as needed.

Architect's Report

Willowcreek Renovation - Full Speed Ahead!

If you have been by the Willowcreek Golf Course you can see that the renovation is in full swing. The golf course contractor has about 50 guys working on the project right now and as the lake construction and landscape portions ramp up that number will be closer to 75 in the coming weeks.

Irrigation mainline is complete on the back nine of Willowcreek including all four road crossings. The contractor has tapped into the mainline from the Willowbrook pump station so they have water available to them to flush and set heads as they go. Irrigation head installation is complete on six holes. The contractor will continue to work through the back nine and then continue in order through the front nine of Willowcreek.

All of the putting green cores on the back nine of Willowcreek have been shaped in and drainage is underway.

The Willowcreek Greens committee took a tour in early April and were able to see five of the greens already completed. The contractor is going to be continuing on the front nine and get all of the greens should be ready for our target July 13, 2017 grassing date.

Management Updates

Financial Report

RCSC has ended February 2018 within its operating and capital budget year to date. Every division has exceeded its income projections year to date while operating under the budgeted wages, taxes and benefits. Utilities, on the other hand, have come in higher than budgeted and overall, utilities expense ends February with a \$29k deficit year to date. In the end, each division has operated within its overall operating budget and has a positive variance year-to-date.

Bowling

Starting in May, Bell Lanes will begin the monthly summer No-Tap bowling tournaments which are held the last Sunday of each month. The first tournament will be held on May 27, 2018. All bowlers are welcome whether USBC certified or not.

The 30th Annual Sun City Open Senior Bowling Tournament will begin April 28 and will run for two weekends. The tournament produces income of \$5k to \$6k. The tournament is open to all senior bowlers in Arizona. It is always a joy to receive the



compliments from the bowlers about the cleanliness and upkeep of our two RCSC bowling centers. We have one bowler from Phoenix who has bowled all 29 tournaments and this year will be his 30th. We also have several bowlers with over 20 year's participation in the tournament. This has been a very successful tournament and provides us an opportunity to show off RCSC facilities.

Cardholder Services

Payments on past due assessments in February were 11.5% of past due balances. Overall accounts receivables increased in February by 2.1%. The increase in current assessments impacted the increase in total accounts receivables the most this month. Over 90 day past due assessments and total past due assessments were both at their lowest level in over 6 years. January assessments went 30 days past due at a rate of 5.2%. December assessments went 60 days past due at a 3.1% rate.

Payments from our third-party collections firm in February continued strong totaling \$25,114 which is a 44% increase over 2017. Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal increased in February and totaled \$121,838 from 275 property owners. Year

to date web portal payments total \$234,932 from 529 property owners.

In February, property transfer balances increased by 4% and lender related balances increased by 31% as properties turn over. Outstanding balances related to property transfers continued to represent 53% of all receivables and past due balances. At the end of February, trustee sale notices on Sun City AZ properties ended at 47 and properties owned by lending institutions at 19. Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in February were \$570,100 which is \$104,600 over the amount budgeted. Year to date PIF fees are \$1,147,500, which is \$342,500 over budget for the year. The year to date total is down 5% from 2017. A reminder that we intentionally budget PIF income very conservatively to assure that we have the cash on hand for any planned project as we remain debt free.

Human Resources

With the upcoming closures of Willowbrook/Willowcreek golf courses and South snack shop for projects, we will work to reassign employee duties as needed to avoid employee layoffs.

Since the beginning of the year, we have hired 23 individuals to fill positions as a result of turnover, as well as, other vacant positions. Twenty six individuals have left the company during this time period. Currently there are 389 individuals on staff at RCSC.

Member Services

The month of March started with Dancing with the Sun City Stars with an incredible performance by the Utah Ballroom Dance Company. On March 7 the spring concert series continued at Sundial as we welcomed to the stage Neon Circus, the best Brooks and Dunn tribute on the circuit. On March 14 we were honored to have Gary Puckett and the Union Gap perform flawlessly for another sold-out crowd. Then on March 21 a Doobie Brothers tribute, Listen to the Music, took the stage at Sundial for the first time! The final show of the spring concert series on March 28 was a rare treat with Carla Cooke, the daughter of the late, great Sam Cooke, who performed all of her father's hits as well as her own!

On Saturday, March 10 we held our third annual Senior Prom. Everyone



dressed in our Paris theme and looked amazing with top hats, evening gowns and berets. What a fun evening!

Project Updates

Sun Bowl

Lighting modifications at the Sun Bowl began March 26, 2018. Lighting will be
enhanced with LED floodlights at the rear of the Sun Bowl that will provide additional lighting into and behind the bowl area after shows. Additionally, LED light
bollards will be added to the center walk to provide pathway lighting during the
shows. This project is expected to be completed by mid-April. Contractor is Accel
Electric. (Cost – \$27,853)

Lakeview Center

Vintage Vehicle Club space – Permit approval from the Sun City Fire Department
has been received for the installed ventilation fan. All work has been completed
on this space except for rear fencing privacy slats. Review of the club operating
and safety procedures is underway and will be completed by the end of March.
A walk-through with club officers will be completed ahead of turning the space
over to the Vintage Vehicle Club to occupy the space. Contractors are Ken McIntyre
Construction, American Fence, and RCSC Skilled Trades staff. (Cost – \$24,475)

South Golf Course

 The site plan and floor plans for this project have been updated at the South Golf Course so cardholders can see the modifications that have been made. Plans are being updated to include the ventilation requirements that accommodate both gas and electric cart storage in the building. Permit submission and bid specification tasks are currently still on target.

Quail Run Golf Maintenance

 Additional LED lighting poles will be added to the Quail Run Golf Maintenance yard to provide additional security lighting. The installation is scheduled for completion in early April. Contractor is Accel Electric. (Cost – \$6,328)

Bell Center

Deflection screens will be installed on the walls of each tennis court at Bell Center. Deflection screens were present before the completion of the tennis court remodels in 2015. These deflection screens reduce tripping hazards by preventing balls from bouncing off the block walls and back towards the players. Contractor is Custom Courts and Tile. (Cost – \$13,600)

Grand Ave Property

Building modifications, room layout and a site plan have been developed and
will be presented to the Board for their approval. With the Board's approval of
the direction for this property, we will begin meeting with the identified clubs for
more detailed space planning for the assigned rooms.

The Friends of the Sun City Libraries, an all volunteer organization, is proud of its Libraries, its results, its community support, and most of all, its volunteers.


Water Conservation

Save Some Water Down at the Car Wash

Give yourself a break and save water at the same time by heading to the car wash. Did you realize that washing your care at home in the driveway can use up to be 140 gallons of water? Using a bucket and spray nozzle (with shut-off) can help save some but not much.

Most newer car wash facilities have fairly sophisticated water reclamation systems that allow water to be re-used many times over while still giving your vehicle a clean, dry finish by using fresh water only when absolutely necessary (such as the final rinse).

In other words, a car washing facility uses only 9 to 15 gallons of fresh water during a cycle, which is at the very least a 65% reduction in water usage and likely much more.



But water conservation is only the beginning. Driveway car washes also introduce soap, oils, brake dust and other chemical pollutants into the storm drain system, which eventually can harm plants and animal life in the ecosystem. Professional car washes empty excess waste in the sewer system where it belongs.

Let somebody else work their fingers to the bone - down at the car wash! And save water, too, becauase as everyone knows...





Sun City Gives Back

Club Honors Original Line Dancers

According to Wikipedia, if you were to ask ten people when line dancing began, you would likely get ten different answers. By Europeans immigrating to America in the 1800s. As servicemen returned from war having been introduced to traditional folk dances overseas. Some believe its popularity grew as youth learned country western dancing in large numbers whether at barn dances or in physical education class. Others feel line dance evolved from the disco era while some say that "Achy Breaky Heart" was the major turning point in its mass appeal.

The history of line dance in Sun City is quite a story. While the Sun City Line Dance Club was officially chartered by RCSC in December 1997, a large group of residents started meeting for fun and exercise an entire decade earlier. Many recall that in the beginning, RCSC paid the instructor directly. How times have changed! Today the club has over 500 active members and has been recognized as "the largest line dance club in the world" by Guinness World Book of Records.

Those early line dancing pioneers were recently honored at a luncheon where ten dancers of the original group were

presented with Lifetime Line Dance Certificates.

What's kept them returning year after year? Gwen Hammond liked "making friends and the dancing—the minute you put your boots on, nothing's wrong." Other cited lasting friendships, comradery and support over the past 20+ years. Ann Marie Nemec's favorite thing about Line Dance Club is "Just being here—it's a happy place." When Fran Ryan was grieving the deaths of her husband and son, "Dancing at Line Dance Club was the best support group there was."

For years these members have contributed as well. Fran, Gwen and Bonnie Rotter were listed as monitors in records back to 1998, and Bonnie still monitors regularly today. Music, exercise, and lasting friendships—there's more than meets the eye to Sun City Line Dance Club!

What a fitting tribute to an amazing group! And another fine example of Sun City giving back!

Sun City Gives Back

Fairway Ceramics Shares Egg-citing Project with Luke Elementary Again



For the fourth consecutive year, the Fairway Ceramics & Porcelain Club coordinated a Spring project with three third-grade classes at Luke Elementary School, helping 90 children create a pair of unique marbled ceramic eggs.

Many of the students are children of military and other transitional families, which was one of the reasons the Club reached out to this particular elementary school. Many of these children experience the frequent absence of the military parent, often over holidays and often living far from their grandparents. It is hoped that this project brings some delight and joy to the students. Many Club Members are grandparents, and the students' warm response and frequent hugs and expressions of thanks make this project a worthwhile and memorable endeavor.





Tips from Get Fit for Life - Managing Diabetes with Exercise

"Physical activity is an important component in a well-balanced management plan for Type-2 Diabetes," states Jane Fortier, fitness specialist for Get Fit for Life. "Maintaining correct blood glucose levels is a constant concern for a diabetic. Exercise makes it easier to control those levels, thus preventing long term complications like nerve pain, kidney disease and arteriosclerosis."

People with diabetes have too much glucose in their blood, either because their body doesn't produce enough insulin to process glucose, or because their body doesn't use insulin properly (insulin resistance). Either way, exercise can help a diabetic live a normal healthy life. Exercise puts the body's muscles to work. It doesn't matter if you are insulin resistant or don't produce enough insulin: when you exercise, your muscles get the glucose they need, and blood glucose levels decrease.

"As we age, the body begins to lose muscle mass, a phenomenon known as Sarcopenia," Fortier notes. "Muscle is the receptor site for much of the body's blood sugar (glucose). Muscle burns or stores glucose. Resistance Training is a form of exercise that increases muscle strength and tissue, therefore increasing the body's glucose storage capacity and metabolic rate. This form of exercise is important for a Type-2 Diabetic. A good exercise program for a diabetic would also include Aerobic activity. Aerobic exercise is continuous motion that challenges the heart and lungs. Spending 10-15 minutes on an aerobic machine, at an intensity level that keeps the heart-rate in the Cardio Zone, will burn stored glucose and help with blood sugar management, long-term. Rounding out a balanced workout, for a diabetic, would be Flexibility exercise. Stretching for flexibility reduces muscle soreness and improves how well muscles and joints work throughout the day, and during an exercise session."

Getting started with an exercise program is often the hardest part. Get Fit for Life trainers help with that. They design programs that address needs, goals and medical issues, and teach clients how to exercise safely and effectively. 

People, meeting needs of people is what Sunshine Service is all about. Sunshine Service lends medical and children's equipment to residents of Sun City and we have been doing so for over 54 years. We are a charitable non-profit Arizona corporation and are funded by voluntary contributions and memorial gifts.

While the equipment is available for the use of all residents or visitors staying with residents, the equipment must not be taken out of Sun City on a permanent basis. As a matter of control, equipment is loaned only to Sun City residents.

Records show that as the population of Sun City grew, so did use of our medical equipment. Savings for Sun City residents have been calculated periodically; in 2015, it was estimated that residents saved over two million dollars in cost of equipment for that year alone.



Sunshine Service, Inc has received local, state and national recognition. Awards received include the George Washington Honor Medal for services to the sick and handicapped from the Freedoms Foundation of Valley Forge in Pennsylvania.
