Service Animal Misrepresentation Could Result in Fine

The Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. wishes to advise RCSC Cardholders that there is a new Arizona law making it illegal to represent pets as service animals.

The new law, signed by Gov. Doug Ducey on April 17, 2018 makes it illegal for pet owners to "fraudulently misrepresent an animal as a service animal" to businesses. Violation of the law is punishable by a fine up to \$250.

RCSC Board Policy 26 regarding Household Pets, which has not changed, states that no pets are allowed on RCSC properties nor in RCSC facilities, including all recreation centers, golf courses, parking lots, bowling centers, and club rooms. This also includes the Sun Bowl Amphitheater and the Sun City AZ Farmers Market at Bell. The only exceptions are in dog parks owned and operated by RCSC (Duffeland), Best Friends Dog Club classes and training (Fairway) or service animals trained to assist.

RCSC will continue to ask two questions: (1) is the dog a service animal required because of a disability, and (2) what work or task has the dog been trained to perform. RCSC will ask that pets be removed from the property.

We're also looking forward to a community education meeting on Wednesday, June 20, 2018 from 10am to noon in Fairway Arizona Rooms 3-4. "Getting to Know MCSO" will give residents an opportunity to meet with Maricopa County Sheriff's Office Captain Paul Chagolla and his staff as they share information about law enforcement statistics and what we can do to protect ourselves, our property and our belongings. Take advantage of this opportunity to get answers to your questions from our local policing agency.

Get ready for a true Sun City AZ tradition as we present the 40th Annual Ring That Bell Ceremony on Wednesday, July 4, 2018. The presentation and video will be shown in the Bell Social Hall at 9am. Afterwards those attending are welcome to "Ring That Bell" in the courtyard with Uncle Sam. From 11am until 2pm the fun continues over at Bell Lanes where there will be free bowling, darts, billiards and shuffleboard along with dancing and more. Pulled pork BBQ sandwiches with chips and water for lunch will be available for \$6 per person. Donations collected at this event will benefit the Sun City Foundation. Get ready for a real red, white and blue extravaganza! Later this afternoon, all are invited to attend an afternoon (3pm) performance by the All Stars Big Band in the Mountain View Auditorium (sponsored by the Sun City Players Community Theater). Written Confirmation Requested from HUD/FHA Regarding Reverse Mortgages

The Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. has requested written confirmation from HUD/FHA that if RCSC does not charge the Preservation & Improvement Fee (PIF) or Transfer Fee on foreclosures or properties being surrendered by deed in lieu, Sun City AZ will be given the green light by HUD/FHA for reverse mortgages. Despite the fact that RCSC has not made any changes that created the failure for HUD/FHA to approve reverse mortgages, unfortunately Sun City AZ has been excluded from approval despite RCSC's repeated efforts to remedy this situation. RCSC hopes that this recent request will be responded to favorably and as quickly as possible.

RCSC Elections: Candidate Packets Available Starting June 4

Now that candidate packets are available (starting on Monday, June 4, 2018) you have plenty of time to complete the paperwork and collect the necessary signatures to get your name on the ballot for this year's RCSC Board of Directors Election. There will be three vacancies to fill in this year's December election, with each being a three year term.

To obtain a candidate packet, you must make the request in person at the RCSC Corporate/Board Office at the Lakeview Center (lower level) and present your RCSC Member card. The deadline for packet submissions is no later than noon on Friday, October 5, 2018.

Requirements to become a RCSC Board candidate:

- Must be at least fifty-five (55) years of age;
- Must not be related by marriage or birth to any other member of the Board, Senior Management Staff, or

- Board Candidate;
- Must be a Deeded Real Estate Owner of property in Sun City, Maricopa County, Arizona;
 - Must be a RCSC Member in good standing;
 - Must reside in Sun City, Arizona and be available at least ten (10) months of the year;
 - Must meet the requirements to hold an Arizona liquor license (RCSC holds liquor licenses which require Board Officers to be included on the licensing);
 - Must be eligible and available to serve a three (3) year term; and
 - Must be available to attend Board Candidate Orientation(s).

Candidates must also submit a fully completed RCSC petition, signed by 100 or more RCSC Members in good standing, along with all other forms provided in the RCSC Candidate Packet.

A successful candidate will:

- Have a strong desire to serve Sun City, AZ;
- Be fair and courteous;
- Use good common sense;
- Have good communication skills;
- Be willing to work as part of a team;
- Ability to prioritize - policy and projects - which will have the greatest benefit for the most members; and
- Be willing and able to dedicate the necessary hours to be an effective Director.

Candidates will be introduced at both the October and November Board meetings and candidate forums that will be held in the fall. Forum locations and dates will be announced at a later time.

Cardholders are asked to please keep the following in mind!

While you're out and about enjoying all that RCSC has to offer, please be aware of the following items which require Cardholder attention when using any of the recreational facilities:

- All RCSC Cardholders are required to check in with their Member or Privilege Cards (key fobs accepted for entry to fitness, pools and spas; not concerts or free events)
- Neither Sun City AZ residents nor spouses of RCSC Cardholders are eligible to be guests. With proper documentation, privilege cards may be purchased at the Cardholder Services Office at Lakeview Center in order to use the facilities.
- Host punch cards are purchased by and belong to the Cardholder, not the guest. Host punch cards can be purchased at RCSC Facility Attendant Stations (exact cash or check only), Cardholder Services at Lakeview, RCSC Bowling Centers.
- Guests may be requested to show government-issued photo ID when checking in to use RCSC facilities.
- Proof of age for 4 and 5 year olds (birth certificate or passport) is required for access to swimming pools. Photo copies or electronic images are acceptable.
- Free concerts and events are paid for by RCSC Cardholders and are intended for RCSC Cardholders and their escorted guests only. Always be prepared to show your RCSC Member or Privilege card (with photo) when attending concerts and events. Key fobs are not accepted for entry.
- Lakeview Hillside Park is now gated and Cardholders must present Member or Privilege card to attendant for access.

Golf & Grounds Report

Pro Shops

Rounds for the first quarter of 2018 were a mix of positive and negative performance compared to prior year. Overall all play was up by 2,707 rounds compared to 2017 and posted the 4th highest total over the last nine years. March play was down by 1,456 rounds compared to 2017, but ahead of the previous five year average. Lakes West posted the highest number of rounds played with 18,155, followed closely by Riverview with 18,030 rounds played, South and North played an almost equal number of rounds. The partial closure of Willowcreek affected total play. Lakes East was the busiest executive course with 12,921 rounds played, followed by Willowbrook and then Quail Run.

Demolition of the South Clubhouse is now scheduled to occur the middle of June, a delay of one month from the original plan. The delay is related to obtaining a permit for the temporary clubhouse. Once construction has commenced, the build time for the new building is estimated to be 7-10 months. Snacks and beverages will be available through a temporary trailer once the project begins.

With the closing of Willowcreek/Willowbrook, clothing and shoes that were located in the clubhouse have been moved to Lakes West/Lakes East and have been marked at 50% off for clearance.

Golf Courses

With 100 degree days right around the corner, the pace of transition from winter rye to summer bermuda can be expected. To promote bermuda growth, fairway heights are lowered to open the grass canopy which permits the bermuda grass to receive more sunlight. During this time of transition it will not be uncommon to see brown patches on the course as the rye dies and the bermuda begins to grow. Lakes West has transitioned quicker than the other courses and in several areas is extreme. The last several years, the Lakes West superintendent has promoted quick transition by underfeeding the rye grass late in the Winter season. This year, the rye grass transitioned at a rate faster than the bermuda could recover, leaving many areas bare. As bad as it currently looks it will soon recover as soil temperatures increase.

Construction on Willowcreek remains on schedule with mainline installation complete on holes 10-18, and installation of lateral lines on holes 15-18. The old pump station on hole 14 has been removed and dirt removal from the lake should be completed by April 27. Property line survey has been completed on Willowbrook to mark areas for curb installation. Green coring is complete on holes 10-18, and the 1, 2 and 9 holes. Drainage installation began the week of April 16th on hole 18 and will progress backwards. Areas that will be marked for turf removal will be heavily irrigated prior to spraying of herbicide. The herbicide is most effective on healthy plants that are actively taking up nutrients.

Snack Shops

Snack shop revenue missed budget by \$6,800 due to reduced golf rounds. Beginning April 1 snack shops were scheduled to close at 3:00pm, however they will continue to close at 5:00pm until business no longer supports it.

Lawn Bowl

Work has begun on the frazing/regrassing of the Bell Center greens. To date, RCSC staff have leveled the plinth boards and back filled along the plinth boards two inches below the top of the boards, watering and compacting every 6 inches. Turf Equipment Source fraze mowed the greens to a depth two inches below the back boards April 19-20. Following the fraze mowing, RCSC staff began

Tips from a Pro
Three Steps to Hitting a Better Ball

Let's face it, everyone is different. However, regardless of age, gender, strength, flexibility, height or weight, hitting the golf ball better is about learning to make consistent contact. Here are three simple steps that can enhance anyone's swing without trying to remake the wheel!

Step #1 - Develop a good pre-shot routine/set-up. This means having a consistent way to approach the ball every time with every shot. It includes alignment to the target, grip, stance, ball position and posture. To me this is the most important factor since it is the foundation of the swing.

Step #2 - Relax. This is the biggest problem I see in most of swings I watch during a lesson. Tension is a killer of distance, it affects direction as well contact with the ball. (If you are hitting it short, right or on the top I'm talking to you!) Many times the tension starts in the shoulders and works its way down into the arms and hands so taking a breath and letting the shoulders relax can be key.

Step #3 - Make a smooth balanced swing. When the swing is smooth and in balance it is much easier to make good contact with the ball consistently. Why? Physics. Try and hit a small little ball with a relatively small clubface while falling backwards, forwards or to the side and your chances decrease. Additionally, the smoother you are the more likely you are to use your body parts in the correct order (timing) which also increases consistency! As a drill see if you can hold onto your follow-thru position until the ball hits the ground. If so, the chances that you were smooth and balanced are pretty good!

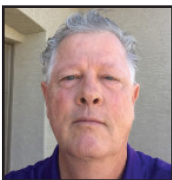

adding new material to the greens to the final grade. Following a period of watering and rolling, Turf Equipment Source will return to ensure the levelness of the final grade. Evergreen Turf will spread Tiff Dwarf sprigs the second or third week of May, once temperatures are optimal.

Strong winds in April have kept the grounds crew busy with clean-up throughout the centers, Duffeland Dog Park, the softball field and the Sun Bowl. Pre-emergent herbicide has been applied in all centers to help control spring weeds. The grounds crew has also been coordinating with the B&I team on the installation of a new dog water station at Duffeland Dog Park.

Tips to Get Seniors Back on the Lanes

If you've not bowled in a while, summer time in Sun City AZ is a great time to get back in the game. Bowling provide light exercise while helping with your hand-eye coordination. Best of all, bowling provides a chance to get out and socialize with others in the community – besides that it is cool and comfortable indoors this time of year. Many seniors can bowl safely even if been a while since you were on the lanes as long as you work within your limits and following a few basic tips.

Choosing a Ball - Choosing a ball can be challenging bowlers of all ages. Stick with a ball weight that feels comfortable. If your hands hurt or your muscles shake, the ball is too heavy. Some seniors find that a ball with an extra finger hole for the index or little finger, known as a balance hole, can be helpful, because it makes the ball easier to grip and offers some additional control. You may have to buy and customize your own ball to get a ball that fits just right.

Handling the Ball - Instead of putting your fingers in the holes and lifting the ball directly out of the rack, use two hands to pick your ball up to prevent strain. Make sure all the balls have been returned and have come to a stop so your fingers don't get crushed. Never reach inside the ball return machine, as moving mechanical parts can cause serious injury. It might also be helpful to hold your bowling ball with two hands as you approach the lane. Some bowlers find that wearing wrist support can give them more stability.

Practice Your Timing - Some find it helpful to practice their timing without a bowling ball. Start just in front of the boundary line and step back four or five steps. This will help you determine where you should start your walk when you are ready to bowl. Then take a step or two forward and move your hand forward as if you had the ball, and let it naturally swing back and then forward again as you count your steps. Practice a few times to find your rhythm.

Respect The Rules - Never cross the foul line! This rule applies to all bowlers, but the consequences can be especially dire for seniors. Bowling lanes are coated with conditioning oil and are typically very slippery. You could easily fall if you pass the foul line by mistake. Only wear bowling shoes when bowling, as street shoes leave behind grit and dirt which can also be slippery on the lane. Keep your shoes tightly laced.

RCSC bowling staff is always available if you need additional assistance or guidance while you're at either of the bowling centers.

The 30th Annual Sun City Open Senior Bowling Tournament was held on the last week-end of April producing \$6,000.00 in revenue. This year there were 82 entries and 70 teams making this the most successful Sun City Open ever. A total of 300 Bowlers from all over Arizona participated in the event. Architect's Report

Willow Progress Continues at Good Clip

With the heat comes the big part of the renovation project. The guys have been enjoying the cooler days of early May and were getting a lot of extra hours in, knowing that the heat is inevitable.

The renovation of the irrigation lakes is now complete. Both irrigation lakes have been lined and a vertical hard shoreline and safety shelf has been installed. This renovation increased the amount of water storage in the irrigation lakes as well as helped insure that the water being stored in the lakes, remains for irrigation use and is not being lost to ground seepage.

All of the back nine greens now have drainage, gravel and new sand on them. Work is progressing ahead of schedule on the front nine greens with a target grassing date in mid-July.

The new irrigation system is by far the largest part of this project. Mainline and lateral installation is progressing on the front-nine of Willowcreek. The focus right now is to get the mainline done and water to all the green complexes to then be able to finish prep the

green surrounds and meet the target grassing date in mid-July.

The perimeter landscape areas have been sprayed out and installation of drip irrigation and some plants has commenced and will continue now through much of the summer.

Golfers Need to Respect Neighboring Properties

Sun City AZ is proud to offer residents eight golf courses and we are fortunate to have so many homes adjacent to these properties which help to maintain home values throughout our community.

However, when a golf course is your backyard, you accept the good with the not-so-good. Beautiful green spaces, some with water and fountain views make for great relaxation out on the patio for these homes. Despite our best efforts, course maintenance and renovations create a certain amount of noise and dust and the patience and understanding of adjacent property owners is appreciated.

These properties also come with a number of restrictions. Properties adjacent to RCSC golf courses may not have any structures closer than 25 feet to the property line abutting the golf course. In addition, these lots may not have a fence, wall, rail or hedge built or maintained greater than six feet high within 25 feet of property line adjacent to the golf course and any fencing in excess of three feet is limited to wrought iron construction. Landscaping on these lots must also be planted in such a manner as to avoid undue obstruction of the view of the golf course.

In short, golf course property owners are required by the community conditions, covenants and restrictions (also known as CC&Rs and enforced by the Sun City Home Owners Association) to maintain these properties to a certain standard due to the fact that they are adjacent to Sun City golf courses.

Golfers, too, are required in turn to show respect to these property owners and their homes. Golfers are not entitled to trespass on someone's property simply because the property is on a golf course. Golfers are also responsible for any damage they may cause to properties along the golf course. While a few homes may be more vulnerable, great care is taken when laying out a course to minimize the chances of damage. It is not the homeowner's responsibility (nor their insurance) to absorb the cost associated with any destruction caused by a golfer.

Many golfers in our community are well-versed in these rules, regulations and responsibilities, and we thank you. Let's continue to be respectful of homeowners whose properties are adjacent to our golf courses and consider ourselves fortunate that there are many property owners who remain positive toward golfers and even eager to help retrieve the occasional wayward ball.

Let's stay the "course" and remain mutually respectful as we all enjoy the many benefits of golf.

Management Updates

Financial Report

RCSC has ended the first quarter within its operating and capital budget year to date. Budget deficit in utility expenses has increased to \$39k year to date. Each division has operated within its overall operating budget as of March 31, 2018 excluding Building & Infrastructure, which is expected to be back within its operating budget next quarter as the variance is caused by a timing issue between actual income and budgeted income.

Bowling

The 30th Annual Sun City Open Senior Bowling Tournament will begin April 28th and will run for two week-ends. The tournament has been filled to its maximum (64 entries).

Most summer leagues will begin the second week of May followed by the monthly summer no-tap tournaments which are held on the last Sunday of each month until September 2018. All bowlers are welcome whether USBC certified or not.

As fall leagues are nearing the end of their season, the bowling centers are preparing contracts for the 2018/2019 season. League contracts are created for the purpose of guaranteeing league pricing, start times and number of lanes used. The contracts also notify leagues of all bowling and RCSC corporate policies and procedures.

Cardholder Services

Payments on past due assessments in March were 11.2% of past due balances. Overall accounts receivables increased in March by 3.6%. The increase in current assessments in February flowed into 30 Day past due balances in March. February assessments went 30 days past due at a rate of 5.3%. January assessments went 60 days past due at a 2.5% rate.

Payments from our third-party collections firm dipped in March totaling \$11,823 but continued to be 42% over the 2017 year to date amount. Payments made by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal were at their highest level in March and totaled \$156,588 from 346 property owners. Year to date web portal payments total \$391,540 from 867 property owners.

In March, property transfer balances decreased by 2.4% and lender related balances decreased by 1.9% as properties turn over. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent 51% of all receivables and 55% of past due balances. At the end of March, trustee sale notices on Sun City AZ properties ended at 42 and properties owned by lending institutions at 19.

Preservation and Improvement Fees collected in March were \$802,710 which is \$260,210 over the amount budgeted. Year to date PIF fees are \$1,950,210 which is \$602,710, or 45%, over budget for the year. The year to date total is down 6% from 2017. A reminder that we intentionally budget PIF income very conservatively to assure that we have the cash on hand for any planned project as we remain debt free.

Human Resources

One of the statutory benefits RCSC is required to pay into is AZ Unemployment Taxes which are filed and paid quarterly. When the company's account was analyzed this year, it was determined that a voluntary contribution up front would reduce RCSC's tax rate and would be profitable for the corporation. We applied for the reduction and paid a voluntary contribution of \$5,574. As a result, RCSC's unemployment tax rate went from 1.54% to .94% with a net savings of \$12,696.

In July 2017, CopperPoint became RCSC's provider of workers compensation insurance to cover employees who are injured on the job or develop a work related illness. We have been working with their Loss Prevention Specialist and find that CopperPoint has a complete library of safety training materials to be utilized in RCSC's safety training program. In addition, through them we now have access to DuPont's video series of safety training. These videos can be viewed online by our personnel and provide a mechanism for testing at the conclusion, making these an excellent tool for us. We continue to work on providing a safe environment not only for employees, but for all who utilize the facilities.

Human Resources has scheduled voluntary CPR/AED and First Aid training classes for RCSC employees in April & May. Participants receive a two year certification card upon completion. It was two years ago that RCSC installed AEDs in the facilities and original training began. To maintain certification, those who trained early will have to renew with the scheduled classes or in this year's fall classes.

Member Services

The month of April began with our first event at 7am on Easter Sunday with our annual sunrise service hosted by United Church of Sun City. It was a beautiful service with approximately 650 people in attendance. That evening, we welcomed to the Sun Bowl stage Come Back Buddy for a night of dancing under the stars.

On Sunday, April 8 RCSC Cardholders and their escorted guests were entertained by Flipside 45. The following Sunday, back by popular demand, Mogollon took the stage and ended the evening with two spectacular encores.

Project Updates

Building and Infrastructure:

Bell Center

- Replacement of the damaged ceiling in the Bell Center indoor spa began on Monday, April 16. Work includes the removal of the existing ceiling, replacement of existing lighting with dimmable LED fixtures, replacement of the ceiling and painting of the ceiling and walls. Work is anticipated to be completed by May 30. Contractor is DFG Construction and Spray Systems. (Cost – \$45,351)

Duffeland Dog Park

- Work began Monday, April 23 on the replacement of the existing dog wash pad to improve drainage and prevent water pooling on the walking path. Work is expected to be completed by Friday, April 27. Work is being completed by RCSC Skilled Trades Staff. (Cost – \$1,500)

Grand Ave

- Work continues with clubs on the club room space layouts for the property at Grand Ave.

Lakeview Center/Lakeview Lanes

- Additional LED parking lot lighting has been added to the east side of the Lakeview Lanes building to provide additional lighting to dark areas in the east parking lot. Contractor was Accel Electric. (Cost – \$6,574)

Mountain View Center

- Wind screens around the Mountain View Recreation Center tennis courts have been replaced. Contractor was Custom Courts and Tile (Cost – \$2,340)

Quail Run Golf Maintenance

- Additional LED lighting poles planned for the Quail Run Golf Maintenance yard to provide additional security lighting has been completed. Contractor is Accel Electric (Cost – \$6,328)

Riverview Golf Course

- Nine ceiling fans on the Riverview patio have been replaced due to defects in the previous fans. Work was completed by RCSC Skilled Trades staff. (Cost – \$2,555)

South Golf Course

- Final review of the floor plan identified some spacing concerns for the simulator layout. The floor plan was modified to accommodate one simulator rather than two originally planned and improving the seating in this space. The space increases in the plan have been added to the kitchen width for additional work space, as well as a corresponding enlargement of the inside seating area. This change required modifications to the plans and has delayed permit submission by two weeks.
- Charging stations for golf carts have been added to the South Maintenance yard for use during the construction of the pro shop. New electrical service was required for these stations. Contractor Accel Electric. (Cost – \$9,230)

Sun Bowl

- The lighting modifications to add rear and center aisle lighting at the Sun Bowl have been completed. Both changes have achieved the lighting enhancements expected at the Sun Bowl. Contractor was Accel Electric. (Cost – \$27,853)

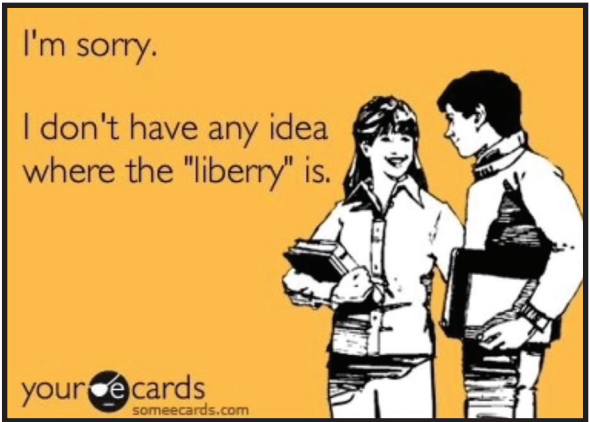

Water Conservation

Tips for When You're Away from Home

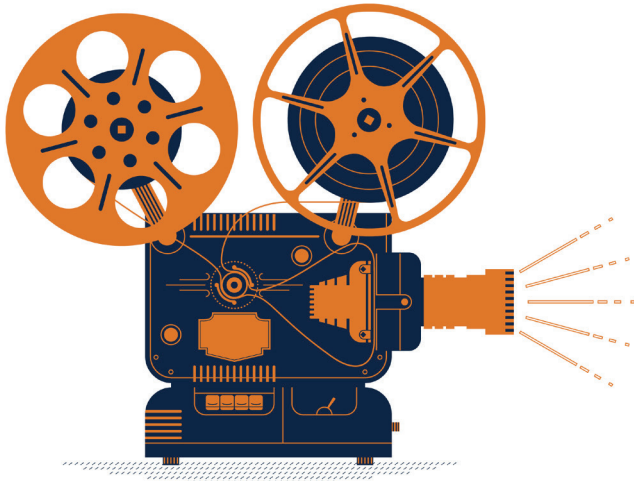

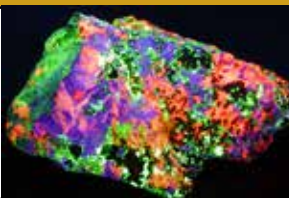

Tips from Get Fit for Life -
Physiological Changes that Accompany Aging

"The chronological clock takes a toll, as active adults get older," states Jane Fortier, senior fitness specialist and co-owner of Get Fit for Life. "The AGING PROCESS refers to universal physiological changes that take place in the human body, due to chronological aging. Those changes are independent of disease, genetics, behavior and lifestyle. Those changes are going to affect how a person feels and functions."

As we age, the following physiological changes occur:

CARDIOVASCULAR/RESPIRATORY SYSTEM

*heart structure changes, the size of the left atrial chamber increases
*blood vessel walls thicken, as well as the walls of the left ventricle
*blood pressure increases
*cardiac output (stroke volume) decreases
*lung tissue loses its elasticity, and aerobic capacity diminishes

SKELETAL SYSTEM

*bones become thinner
*joints become stiffer because of diminished synovial fluid
*calcification occurs in and around joints
*intervertebral disks, which are gel-like in nature, lose fluid, resulting in compression and shortening of the entire vertebral column



COGNITION & MENTAL CLARITY

*processes such as attention, judgement, memory and reasoning decline, due to changes in brain tissue
*response time and thought development slows down

ENDOCRINE SYSTEM

*hormone production in males and females declines
*changes in estrogen testosterone and progesterone effect fat allocation, with more settling in the abdominal area

SENSORY SYSTEM

*changes in vision
*changes in hearing and vestibular health
*tactile receptors decline, and the sense of touch is less acute in hands and feet
*proprioception (the ability to maneuver in 3-dimensional space) declines

MUSCLE AND CONNECTIVE TISSUE

*Sarcopenia (loss of muscle due to chronological aging) begins to affect movement and body composition
*functionality becomes difficult due to muscle and connective tissue atrophy

"Exercise is the number one line-of-defense, when dealing with these physiological changes," states Fortier. "A good exercise program for someone over 50 years would have three parts to it: aerobic, strength, flexibility. These three forms of exercise can have a positive impact on how an aging adult feels and functions."

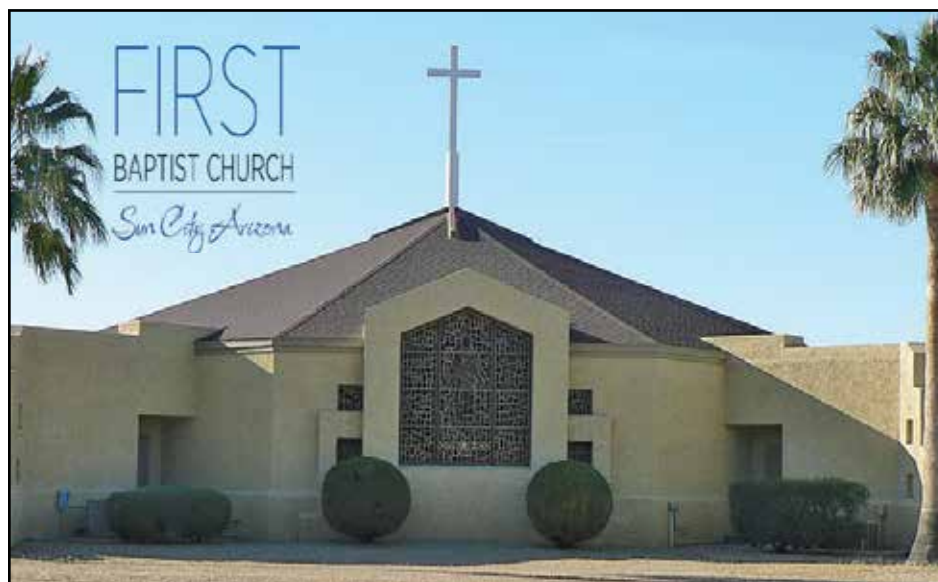

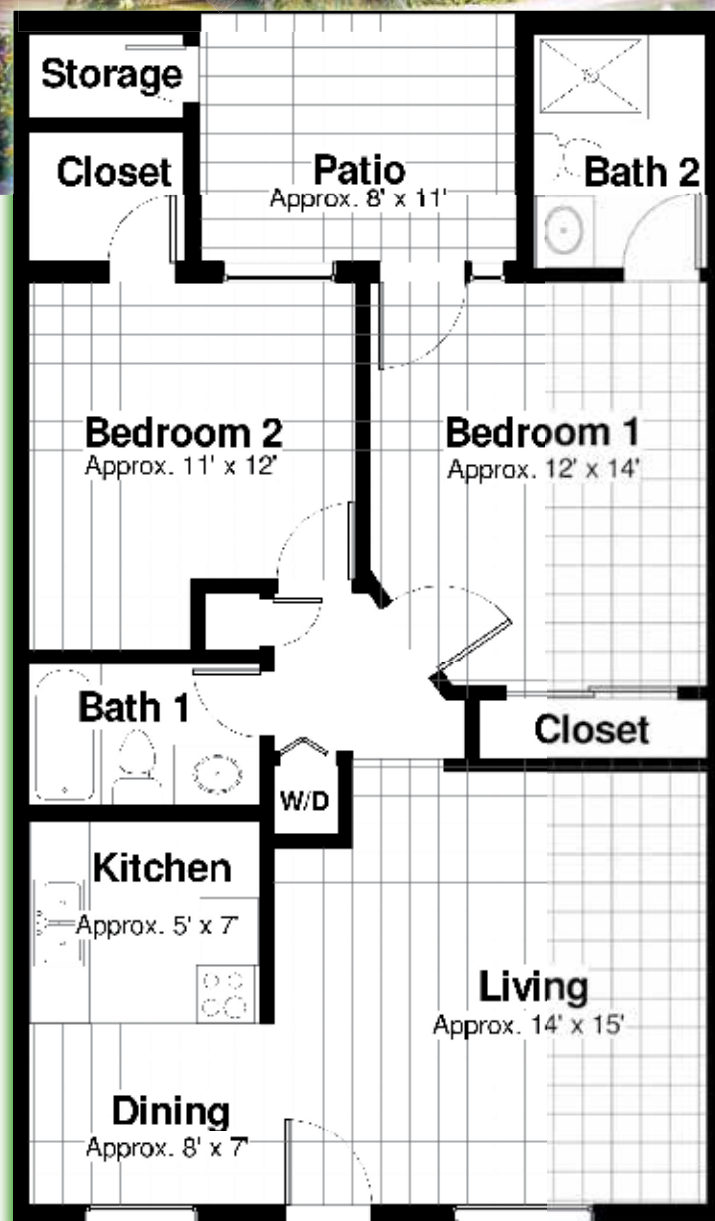
