RCSC Elections: Why Not Pick Up A Candidate Packet Today?

With candidate packets now available, you have plenty of time to complete the paperwork and collect the necessary signatures to get your name on the ballot for this year's RCSC Board of Directors Election. There will be three vacancies to fill in this year's December election, with each being a three year term.

To obtain a candidate packet, you must make the request in person at the RCSC Corporate/Board Office at the Lakeview

Center (lower level) and present your RCSC Member card. The deadline for packet submissions is no later than noon on Friday, October 5, 2018.



Requirements to become a RCSC Board candidate:

- Must be at least fifty-five (55) years of age;
- Must not be related by marriage or birth to any other member of the Board, Senior Management Staff, or Board Candidate;
- Must be a Deeded Real Estate Owner of property in Sun City, Maricopa County, Arizona;
- Must be a RCSC Member in good standing;
- Must reside in Sun City, Arizona and be available at least ten (10) months of the year;
- Must meet the requirements to hold an Arizona liquor license (RCSC holds liquor licenses which require Board Officers to be included on the licensing);

 Must be eligible and available to serve a three (3) year term; and

• Must be available to attend Board Candidate Orientation(s).

Candidates must also submit a fully completed RCSC petition, signed by 100 or more RCSC Members in good standing, along with all other forms provided in the RCSC Candidate Packet.

A successful candidate will:

- Have a strong desire to serve Sun City, AZ;
- Be fair and courteous;
- Use good common sense;
- Have good communication skills;
- Be willing to work as part of a team;
- Ability to prioritize policy and projects which will have the greatest benefit for the most members; and
- Be willing and able to dedicate the necessary hours to be an effective Director.

Candidates will be introduced at both the October and November Board meetings and candidate forums that will be held in the fall. Forum locations and dates will be announced at a later time.

Golf & Grounds Report

Pro Shops

Through April, 149,839 rounds of golf have been played throughout our eight courses, which is slightly ahead of last year's pace and is due to a strong January. April rounds were 1,941 fewer than prior year as the other courses were unable to fully absorb the 6,726 rounds lost due to the closure of Willowcreek/Willowbrook. Among the regulation courses, Riverview has taken the overall lead in rounds played with 24,110, followed by Lakes West (23,342), South (22,412) and North (22,370). Lakes East has played the most rounds among the executive courses. During the month of April, 56% of rounds were played by annual pass holders and annual surcharge pass holders. Year to date, the Golf Division has exceeded revenue goals.

We have had an increase in complaints from neighbors along our golf courses concerning golfers trespassing onto private property to retrieve golf balls. While there are some homeowners that are not bothered by golfers retrieving errant shots, there are many that feel violated when someone enters their property to retrieve a ball. Please remember that when retrieving an errant shot on a homeowner's property, you are trespassing, unless you have been given permission to do so. We ask for your cooperation in respecting the property of others.

Golf Courses

On May 1, we conducted the first of our bi-annual USGA visits with Brian Whitlark, an USGA Agronomist for the West region. Brian's full report is now available online through the RCSC website, under Resources on the Golf Page. Mr. Whitlark was impressed with the Willowcreek/Willowbrook renovation project and in particular the water saving aspects of the redesign, such as lake lining, tee top specific irrigation and overall turf reduction. We also discussed putting greens, green surrounds, fairway transition, roughs, practice tee conditions and bunker maintenance, while touring North and Riverview.

Mainline installation at Willowcreek has moved to the front side, with progress through the fifth hole. Lateral line and sprinkler head installation is complete on the back 9 and is complete through hole #2 on the front nine. Work has begun on the shaping of the back 9 greens, holes 14-18 have been completed and the remaining greens have material in place and are expected to be finished by the first week in June. Coring of greens is complete on the front 9 and installation of drainage is nearing completion. The liner and shotcrete edge installation is finished on the back 9 and the lakes have been filled. The new pump station is in place and we expect to have it operational by the 1st of June. The project remains on target, with grassing of the greens to commence June 25 and be completed on July 13.

Snack Shops

The temporary clubhouse trailer has been delivered prior to the South clubhouse demolition and construction. As a reminder, food and beverage options during construction will be extremely limited and we ask for your patience. Beginning June 1st the closing time for snack shops will be 1:00pm.

Grounds/Lawn Bowl

The Bell Lawn bowl greens have reached the grow-in stage. The cooler than expected temperatures have slowed the process, otherwise the greens are responding as expected. Both greens have been fertilized several times with starter fertilizer to encourage root growth and have begun to receive organic material to encourage lateral growth of the plant. Tips from a Pro Align Yourself for Success

Golf is a "target" game, yet many people dismiss the importance of proper alignment. Others attempt to line up to the target but do so improperly. Remember, alignment doesn't only affect direction, it can also affect distance and contact with the golf ball.

Let's discuss a good routine with proper alignment.



First, stand directly behind your ball (facing the target) and find something on the ground that is lying in-between the ball and the target. This could be a divot, leaf, tee, etc. To make it easy, pick something as close to the ball as possible.

Second, from your address position place the club behind the ball aiming it at the spot that was chosen. (Similar to how you would aim your putter towards the hole.) Once it is in place position the hands on the grip being careful not to move the clubhead away from the spot.

Third, step the feet in position so that they are parallel to the target line. (the same way you would position your feet in putting, not aiming them towards the hole but parallel to it.)

Last, make the swing, feeling the confidence you will have in knowing that your alignment is correct, and your swing has a better chance of staying on the right path!

commence followed by a laser topdressing. We expect to have the greens available for play sometime in August.

All other Lawn Bowl greens have seen summer agronomic practices, including verticutting and aeration. During verticutting we have been removing 6–7 barrels of material from the greens. Verticutting helps to remove the thatch layer of the greens providing a firmer surface for bowls.

"Battle of the Weeds" 2018 has begun throughout the centers and though they are resilient, we have the upper hand. Pre-emergent was applied throughout the centers in an effort to reduce weed germination, weeds that survived this process are now being removed manually.



Architect's Report

New Irrigation Pump Station & Mainline Now Water Willowcreek

What a difference one month makes!

When the month of June started we did not have any of the greens or green surrounds grassed, for that matter many were not even ready. One month later we have 11 green and green surrounds grassed and the balance of the greens on scheduled to be completed by mid-July. The mid-July is the targeted grassing date as this is typically when the humidity starts to build in and allows us a good 90 days of growing weather before the maintenance staff needs to start preparing for winter dormancy.

The entire Willowcreek Golf Course is now being watered through the new irrigation pump station and mainline. This is a big improvement as this system provides more pressure and flow to the northern part of the golf course, the furthest point from the irrigation lake and pump station. Along with this we have all of the road crossings in so as we approach the major roads we are able to connect to our new crossings and keep bringing water with us.

In addition to the greens being planted the new landscape areas are starting to see plants and decomposed granite installed. The landscape contractor has gone ahead of their install crews and installed new drip irrigation in these areas for all the plants so when it comes time to install the plants all water is ready to go and be run by the golf course irrigation controllers.

Construction will continue on to the front nine of Willowbrook so we can make the irrigation connection into the Willowbrook pump station, which was installed last year.

While PIF (Preservation & Improvement Fund) projects were on hold in 2017, we are now in the process of working on long awaited endeavors such as the Willowcreek/Willowbrook renovation and turf reduction project (anticipated to save precious water resources well into the future) and the South Course Clubhouse rebuild which promises to bring Sun City AZ's second golf course into the 21st century.

The Vintage Vehicles Club is settling in nicely into their "temporary" home in the previous Skilled Trades Building behind Lakeview Lanes while planning, preparation and permitting

Management Updates

Financial Report

For the first time in my tenure I have to report that RCSC has ended April 30, 2018 over its net operating budget year to date by \$141,141 due to a miscalculation in budgeted annual property assessment income by approximately \$600k. The good news is that this miscalculation will balance itself out before year end and the negative variance will be remedied. All divisions, excluding Building & Infrastructure due to the miscalculation, have a positive variance from budget in net operations year to date.

Bowling

The summer maintenance program has begun for the bowling pinsetters. The mechanics will perform various preventive maintenance tasks which include inspections, lubrication and annual maintenance. Recently, both pinsetter mechanics attended a seminar about lane conditioning and lane machine repair and maintenance. The mechanics gained knowledge that will help in maintaining consistent lane conditions and increasing the life of lane machines.

The 30th Annual Sun City AZ Open Senior Bowling Tournament was held the last weekend of April producing \$6k in revenue. This year, we had 82 entries and 70 teams making this the most successful Sun City AZ Open ever! A total of 300 bowlers from all over Arizona participated in the event. The tournament scores were excellent! There were seven 300 games bowled during the tournament. Bowlers return to the Sun City AZ Open year after year due to the cleanliness of the centers, pinsetter operation and consistent lane conditions. This year, we had one bowler from the Phoenix area that has bowled in all 30 tournaments!

Monthly summer no-tap tournaments are held on the last Sunday of each month until September 2018. All bowlers are welcome whether USBC certified or not.

Cardholder Services

Payments on past due assessments in April were 10.5% of past due balances. Overall accounts receivables decreased in April by just under 3%. The largest increase this month was in the 60 day category while both the 30 and 90 day categories showed decreases. March assessments went 30 days past due at a rate of 4.3%. February assessments went 60 days past due at a 2.8% rate.

Payments from our third-party collections firm totaled \$20,261 in April and are 64% over the 2017 year to date amount. Payments made in April through the online RCSC Web Portal totaled \$125,353 from 291 property owners. Year to date web portal payments total \$515,901 from 1,149 property owners.

In April, property transfer balances decreased by just under 1% and lender related balances decreased by 60% as properties turn over. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent 52% of all receivables and past due balances. At the end of April, trustee sale notices on Sun City AZ properties ended at 42 and properties owned by lending institutions at 16.

Preservation and Improvement Fees year to date are \$2,807,710 which is \$879,210 over budget for the year. The year to date total is down 6% from 2017. A reminder that we intentionally budget PIF income very conservatively to assure that we have the cash on hand for planned projects as we remain debt free.

Human Resources

Three CPR/AED/First Aid training classes were recently conducted for RCSC employees. Twenty-six individuals attended and received certification. Additional training will be offered in early fall and will accommodate those whose certifications expire this year. Training is offered to employees on a voluntary basis through annual spring and fall classes. One hundred fifty-five employees have been certified since spring 2016 which is shortly after the AEDs were installed in RCSC facilities. Initial training was done prior to that time.

The corporation's uniform policy and related forms have recently been updated. Costs of uniform items missing or damaged when returned have been updated to include a laundry fee for items returned unlaundered. Uniform items returned in good condition are recycled which helps control costs. The uniforms have proven to be helpful for identifying "employees on duty" when assistance is needed by Cardholders or guests that frequent our facilities.

Year to date we have had 28 new hires, which is lower than normal due to the closing of Willowbrook/creek golf course. We were able to assimilate those employees into positions that otherwise would require a new hire. All but two employees were placed into other open positions within the company.

Member Services

The Sun Bowl Spring Series ended on Sunday, May 6 at 7pm with Chad Freeman & Redline. Unfortunately due to the excessive heat warning we moved this show inside to the Sundial Auditorium. This performance deserves to be at the Sun Bowl so we will be bringing them back in 2019 for another opportunity to enjoy the sounds of Chad Freeman & Redline.

Project Updates

Building and Infrastructure:

Multiple Locations

• Renovations of the restrooms at several centers are planned for 2018. These include: Lakeview Center 2nd Floor, Lakeview Center Fitness, Sundial Center Clubs and Bell Center Social Hall. We have begun work with an architect to develop the space planning and construction documents along with bid specifications. This work product will take approximately four weeks to complete and will be used for contractor bids for completion of these renovations.

Bell Center

- Replacement of the damaged ceiling in the Bell Center indoor spa was completed on May 23, 2018. Work included the removal of the existing ceiling, replacement of existing lighting with dimmable LED fixtures, replacement of the ceiling and painting of the ceiling and walls. During the completion of this project we identified a problem with the floor drain in this room. The spa will remain closed until we have identified a resolution to this issue. Contractor is DFG Construction and Spray Systems. (Cost \$45,351)
- Work in the Bell Metal Shop to add lighting to exterior grinding and sandblasting areas and upgrade the welding area exhaust fans are in progress. Work is being completed by Accel Electric, DFG Construction and RCSC Skilled Trades staff. (Cost – \$12,000)
- Work in the Artistic Stained Glass club to replace the flooring, paint the club room space and complete some woodworking tasks for tables and slot storage began the week of May 28. The club room space will be closed for approximately two months to complete this work. Contractors are Spray Systems, DFG Construction and Desert Coatings. (Cost – \$24,640)

Fairway Center

 Work is in progress to replace a failed lighting inverter component that provides the emergency lighting around the pool and spa areas at Fairway Center. Due to this failure, some lights around the pool and spa are not functioning. The replacement inverter required custom design and fabrication. When installed, the emergency lighting in these areas will be functional again. Work is being completed by RCSC Skilled Trades. (Cost – \$6,800)

Grand Ave

• Work on club room space allocation is nearing completion. Additional work to design the Garden Club greenhouse is still pending. Elevation design renderings are being worked on by the architect.

Lakeview Center

 Wind screens around the Lakeview Center Outdoor Shuffle Board courts have been replaced. Contractor was Custom Courts and Tile (Cost – \$1,140)

South Golf Course

• Permit review and comments from Maricopa County have been received. Responses to the comments will be submitted by May 31, 2018 with final permit approval anticipated in 2-3 weeks. The project was published on Dodge Construction's web site for review and bidding by interested general contractors. At the close of the bidding on May 24, no bids had been received. Based upon this, RCSC is working with the architect to identify general contractors for work on this project. Interviews are expected with contractors within the next week. This will delay the start of this project until a general contractor has been selected.

Sundial Center

 Roofing repair at Sundial Center around the dehumidifier pool paks has been completed. Contractor was Renco Roofing. (Cost – \$4,960)


Water Conservation Save Water by Reducing Paper Usage, Recycling

It takes a lot of water to produce the food we eat, the energy we use and all the things that we buy. Try using some of these tips below to reduce your water use by reducing your paper usage and recycling paper. You'll find that there are lots of ways to shrink your water footprint.



Use less paper or recycle it – there are lots of ways to do this. Always remember - "Saving paper (or plastic or glass or aluminum for that matter) equals saving water." One ton of recycled newsprint saves 7,000 gallons of water and 4.6 cubic yards of landfill space while recycling a ton of office saves 17 trees in addition to 7,000 gallongs of water.







Don't let your mail just pile up! Recycle as soon as you've gone through and read it. Or better yet, get off of junk mail lists and consider signing up for paperless billing or auto pay.



Bring your own coffee mug or travel cup next time you stop by your favorite coffee shop. Not only is there water in those paper cups and plastic lids, it takes more than 200 liters of water to make a single latte, much of which is used in the production of the milk and coffee beans. Wow!



Recycle that cereal box (but not the plastic cereal insert), milk carton, soda can and more. A lot of food and product packaging can now be recycled. With no sorting necessary, recycling has never been easier. While items should be relatively clean, be mindful to not waste water when preparing materials destined for the curb.



If you receive a lot of newspapers, check with your local animal hospital, shelter or SPCA since they might be able to use them. Better yet, why not go digital with your newspaper subscription? You might actually save money, too!



Many avid gardners compost. In addition to food waste such as coffee grounds, egg shells and vegetable peelings, some forms of compost allow you to include paper, including paper towels.



Better yet, don't use paper towels. Use rags that can be washed and reused. And when you do buy paper products, look for those made from recycled content.



Tips from Get Fit for Life -

Breaking Through Plateaus

"I've hit a plateau" is a statement we hear often," states Jane Fortier, senior fitness specialist.

What is a plateau?

If you've been exercising and cutting calories for several weeks, and you're no longer seeing the same results that you experienced in the beginning, then you've probably hit a plateau. This occurs when your progress comes to a standstill. It can be described

as not making any "gains" (improving fitness level or losing weight/inches), but not necessarily moving backward (losing endurance or gaining weight/ inches). Because every individual is unique, there's no way to actually predict when a plateau might happen. When it does, it's important to jump-start your body, mind and metabolism. This involves making changes of some sort, to your approach to weight loss. You could change-up the eating format you have adopted, or you could change-up the exercise regimen you have been using.



With regard to exercise, you might incorporate some, or all of the following suggestions to both prevent and overcome a weight loss plateau. With just a little tweaking, you'll be back on track again.

Add Variety to Your Workouts: Incorporating variety is critical because your muscles become very efficient at the exercises they are accustomed to doing. Switching things up or doing something radically different during each workout session is more challenging to your muscles. This concept should be applied to both aerobic exercise and strength training. An individual who always does the same exercises will usually plateau sooner than someone who continually makes changes. Changing your routine is crucial to keeping your muscles fired for action. Change makes muscles work harder - you feel more challenged - your body burns more calories – you build more muscle tissue.

Change your Cardio Activity: Change the type of exercise you usually do. The possibilities for aerobic exercise are endless. If you walk, try cycling. If you cycle, try the elliptical, if you use the elliptical, try the rowing machine, if you row, try a step-box routine. Consider adding aerobic activity outside the gym: dancing, hiking, swimming laps, zumba, jazzercise - anything, just change it up! Change the duration of your cardio workouts. Increase your minutes, as you become more fit - try a shorter, but more vigorous workout. Change the intensity of your workouts. This is something you can play with on a weekly basis – incline the treadmill, use exertion intervals on the bicycles, elliptical, rowing machine, vary the interval number and duration.

Change your Strength Training Routine: Change the mode of exercise. If you are using machines, move to free weights. If you are doing free weights, add a stability element like a Bosu Ball or Fitness Ball. Do your standing free weight exercises while balancing on one foot. Change the specific exercises you do. If you use a chest press, change to a chest fly: if you do an upright row, change to an inverted row. Think of an alternative exercise for each muscle group, and you'll have an entirely new workout! Change your resistance level and/or number of repetitions. Be sure to increase your weight regularly. Make sure you are lifting to fatigue with each set. If you typically lift 10-12 reps, try doing 8-10 with a slower cadence. Change the cadence of all three movements of the repetition (contraction, hold, release). Occasionally use a HIIT workout in place of your aerobic and strength routine.

"There are lots of ways to add variety to your workouts," states Fortier. "By always challenging yourself, you will avoid hitting a plateau in the first place, or overcome the one you're stuck in. The human body is amazingly adaptable. By making a few changes in various exercise areas, you can jumpstart your metabolism and see positive results kick-in again." 



People, meeting needs of people is what Sunshine Service is all about. Sunshine Service lends medical and children's equipment to residents of Sun City and we have been doing so for over 54 years. We are a charitable non-profit Arizona corporation and are funded by voluntary contributions and memorial gifts.

While the equipment is available for the use of all residents or visitors staying with residents, the equipment must not be taken out of Sun City on a permanent basis. As a matter of control, equipment is loaned only to Sun City residents.

Records show that as the population of Sun City grew, so did use of our medical equipment. Savings for Sun City residents have been calculated periodically; in 2015, it was estimated that residents saved over two million dollars in cost of equipment for that year alone.



Sunshine Service, Inc has received local, state and national recognition. Awards received include the George Washington Honor Medal for services to the sick and handicapped from the Freedoms Foundation of Valley Forge in Pennsylvania.
