Status of FHA Insured Loans Including Reverse Mortgages in Sun City AZ

Timeline of Events as presented by the Recreation Centers of Sun City Inc. - June 2018

There has been considerable information promulgated about FHA insured loans including reverse mortgages in Sun City AZ. Some of which is with merit and some of which is far from accurate. This is a very complex subject. Following is RCSC's chronological account and status of FHA insured loans including reverse mortgages in Sun City AZ:

In mid-November 2016 the Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. (RCSC) started hearing from mortgage brokers, lending underwriters/originators and realtors regarding FHA loan application denials for Sun City AZ properties due to the free assumability language in 24 CFR 203.41. RCSC received all kinds of information, some conflicting. What appeared to be suddenly happening with no apparent cause was puzzling as there hasn't been any HUD rule changes for FHA insured loans since 2009.

After considerable research and an attempt to find the specific source of the determination that created the issue for current and potential Sun City AZ homeowners, RCSC contacted Thomas Rose the Director of HUD in the Santa Ana Homeownership Center and sent a subsequent letter to Santa Ana HUD on January 26, 2017 stating that neither 24 CFR 203.41 nor 12 CFR 1228 has language that would prevent HUD from approving loans on properties in Sun City AZ. The following explains the justification for that claim:

Free assumability language in 24 CFR 203.41.(b) and 24 CFR 203.41.(c)(2) relies upon the definition of legal restrictions on conveyance that is outlined in 24 CFR 203.41.(a)(3). In reviewing each of the definition points in (a)(3)(i) through (a)(3)(vi) there is no language that can be construed to include the RCSC Preservation and Improvement Fee (PIF) as a legal restriction on conveyance. As a result, the use of 24 CFR 203.41 for denying FHA loan applications in Sun City AZ is inaccurate.

In addition, H.R. 3700 that passed U.S. Congress in July 2016 directly affects the application of 24 CFR 203.41 and requires that HUD harmonize its regulatory treatment with that of the FHFA for condominiums – specifically 12 CFR 1228 which grants RCSC's Preservation and Improvement Fee (PIF) an exception provided this fee remain in the community and provide a direct benefit to the recreational property.

March 2017 a Sun City AZ home buyer happily reports that she found two lenders that would write FHA insured loans after being denied initially because the property she is purchasing is located in Sun City AZ.

March 2017 RCSC email communications with Santa Ana HUD were replied to include HUD Director of Processing and Underwriting Division believed to be in Washington DC.

March 2017 the RCSC Board of Directors (Board) considered amendments to the Corporate Bylaws and Board Policy Resolution No. 24 titled Preservation & Improvement Fee/Fund (BP24) which would modify the documents to not charge the PIF or administrative transfer fee to a lender pursuant to a foreclosure or deed-inlieu of foreclosure. The Board majority decided it was too early in the process with HUD to pursue document changes.

May 2017 HUD was not open to relaxation of their position during the review process regarding Sun City AZ and therefore would not agree to provide any relief from denying FHA insured mortgages including reverse mortgages.

June 2017 RCSC spoke with Santa Ana HUD who indicated that a mortgagee letter addressing the issue for single family homes had been drafted. While the draft occurred sometime earlier in the year, it had been recently sent to the branch offices for comment. The comment period had been completed with the subsequent information going to Washington DC for the final draft and signing by the requisite party. It was indicated that the context of the draft mortgagee letter was positive for RCSC in that the language

RCSC Elections: Why Not Pick Up A Candidate Packet Today?

With candidate packets now available, you have plenty of time to complete the paperwork and collect the necessary signatures to get your name on the ballot for this year's RCSC Board of Directors Election. There will be three vacancies to fill in this year's December election, with each being a three year term.

To obtain a candidate packet, you must make the request in person at the RCSC Corporate/Board Office at the Lakeview Center (lower level) and present your RCSC Member card. The deadline for packet submissions is no later than noon on Friday, October 5, 2018.

Requirements to become a RCSC Board candidate:

- Must be at least fifty-five (55) years of age;
- Must not be related by marriage or birth to any other member of the Board, Senior Management Staff, or Board Candidate;
- Must be a Deeded Real Estate Owner of property in Sun City, Maricopa County, Arizona;
- Must be a RCSC Member in good standing;
- Must reside in Sun City, Arizona and be available at least ten (10) months of the year;
- Must meet the requirements to hold an Arizona liquor license (RCSC holds liquor licenses which require Board Officers to be included on the licensing);

- Must be eligible and available to serve a three (3) year term;
 and
- Must be available to attend Board Candidate Orientation(s).

Candidates must also submit a fully completed RCSC petition, signed by 100 or more RCSC Members in good standing, along with all other forms provided in the RCSC Candidate Packet.

A successful candidate will:


- · Have a strong desire to serve Sun City, AZ;

Golf & Grounds Report

Pro Shops

Rounds year-to-date are now slightly behind prior year through May due to 1,627 fewer rounds played in the month of May. Rounds increased on all courses that are open, however, the increase was not enough to offset the 5,453 rounds played between Willowcreek and Willowbrook last year. For the year, Riverview has played 28,655 rounds, followed by Lakes West with 26,397 rounds, North 25,817 rounds and South 25,800 rounds. Year-to-date 54.6% of rounds played have been played by holders of an annual golf pass.

With the heat of summer upon us, the desire to play and practice diminishes. We do have options that allow you stay on top of your game during times the sun is not as intense and the shadows are a little longer. We have an "After 5:00pm" pass, which allows you to play golf after the pro shops close. The "After 5:00pm" pass sells for \$44 for cardholders and \$12 for cardholders that are also Surcharge Fee pass holders. Additionally, Annual No-Fee pass holders are permitted to play after 5:00pm without the need to purchase an "After 5:00pm" pass. Ball machines are also available after 5:00pm, and can be accessed by Range Card holders. Range Cards can be purchased by Cardholders in amounts varying from \$18 to \$90. Range Cards also reduce the cost to practice, based on the dollar amount of the card. For example, the \$90 card provides \$115 worth of range balls.

Snack Shops

Snack shops are now closing at 1:00pm on a consistent basis, though will remain open longer depending on demand. After the snack shops close, snacks and beverages are available through the pro shop.

Courses

Mainline installation for Willowcreek is now complete and work has begun with the necessary connection to Willowbrook. Greens on holes 1–5 and holes 10–18 have been grassed and the green surrounds have been sodded. Installation of lateral lines on the front nine is complete through the 7th hole. Once the irrigation is complete the remaining greens will be grassed and the surrounds sodded. The project is still on track to meet the grassing deadline of the July 15. The landscaped areas on the back 9 are planted and the spreading of decomposed granite is nearly complete.

The second of our major agronomic practices, fairway aerification, will be finished on June 28-29 with work completed at the North Course. Beginning July 12 we begin the most disruptive practice, greens aerification, at Riverview Golf Course. Both aerification practices are designed to relieve compaction and provide airflow to the root system of both surfaces. Aerification will finish at the North Course on July 31.

Lawn Bowling/Grounds

Work continues on the Lakeview Lawn Bowl greens to remove irregularities in the surface. June 28-29, Turf Equipment Source will be on site to laser level our latest topdressing. The newly grassed Bell greens are filling in as expected and will be top-dressed and leveled throughout the summer.

Tips from a Pro

Replace old habits with new ones!

Most people want instant results when they make a change in their golf swing.

Whether you are working on a new pre-shot routine, a different grip, or something more difficult such as weight shift.... making a change takes time and patience.

Even though we've all heard the adage about "breaking" a bad habit; that is a misconception. Habits cannot be "broken," they can only be replaced with new habits!

Here are the five easiest ways to help you replace your old habits with new ones:

- 1. Practice. This means spending some time either on the practice range or at home repeating what it is you're trying to achieve. The more you practice the sooner the change happens. (Don't forget playing golf doesn't count as practice!)
- 2. Make practice perfect. Have you heard the saying practice makes perfect? Well I believe that only perfect practice makes perfect! If you are practicing it over incorrectly you aren't getting anywhere! (Depending on what you're working on, practicing it correctly may be easier without a ball. Sometimes making practice swings just using a tee is the easiest way to learn to make the correct swing.)
- When you play, just play. Save the thinking for practice sessions. If you don't see results when you play you need more practice.
- Be patient with yourself. Don't expect miracles. Give yourself time and if you're practicing consistently and correctly you should start seeing results.
- 5. Think positive. You can be your biggest ally or your biggest enemy! Use your brain to help your game by visualizing what you want instead of what you don't want!





It's 48, not 300

When you bowl a perfect strike, the ball itself only hits four pins. A right handed bowler's ball actually connects with the 1, 3, 5, and 9 pins (sometimes the 8 pin) – and a left hander's ball will contact the 1, 2, 5, and 8 (or 9) pin. Theoretically, if you bowled a 300, you'd only hit 48 pins. Think about it.

Each pin is set 12 inches apart from each other. For an optimal strike to be thrown in the first place, you'd need to throw your ball to hit the pocket at six degrees. The pins that are set in the pocket weigh roughly three and a half pounds – but as long as the pin tilts at least 9 degrees, you're in great shape. All pins that tilt at least 9 degrees will fall

Architect's Report

Willow Irrigation Ensures RCSC Committment to Water Conservation

With July came the completion of the Willowcreek portion of the project and the start of the Willowbrook irrigation renovation. The road crossings were done ahead of time and provisions were made early on to isolate the two irrigation systems so that the install and conversion over of the Willowbrook system will not have any impact on the grow-in of the Willowcreek greens. With that said, the irrigation consultant did provide options in the design of the irrigation system that will allow water to be moved from either the Willowcreek or Willowbrook pump stations to any part of either golf course. A great insurance policy to have.

The planting of the golf course green surfaces was completed ahead of schedule which will just further help the grow-in as mid-July finally brought the much needed humidity that the Bermuda grass sprigs like. Now the golf course maintenance staff will be mowing, fertilizing and top dressing the greens and get them ready for the fall opening. It is always worth noting that when the new greens open in the fall they will be firm, as were North and Riverview, and as the grass builds up a thatch layer beneath the surface that is when the greens become more receptive to the approach shot.

Recently representatives from the Arizona Department of Water Resources (ADWR) toured the golf course and were very impressed with all of the design features that were being implemented that will lead to more efficient distribution of irrigation water. From lining of the irrigation lake, new irrigation pump station, new irrigation design with a tight tolerance on installation, to a controlled putting green profile, everything that is being done will have an effect on water distribution, efficiency and use. ADWR will be following up with the design team in the coming months to do a more elaborate feature on what went into the design and construction so they can show case the commitment of RCSC to future water conservation.

Don't Be A Victim; Be Smart & Stay Safe

Many people flock to Sun City AZ each winter for the splendid weather and numerous activities. Typically that first visit puts in motion return trips and eventually home sales. And the majority of these new homeowners are now electing to remain here year-round.

In addition to our vast array of facilities, amenities and club offerings, RCSC offers many great and often free events throughout the year (including two free summer concerts in the Sundial Auditorium). Sun City AZ's clean wide streets (thanks to the Prides) and many well-kept residential homes (hats off to SCHOA) require less maintenance and allow more time for fun - either in or out of the sun - as we golf, bowl, swim and stay active.

Unfortunately, we are not immune to crime in our little slice of paradise. A rash of golf club thefts earlier this summer prompted a recent community meeting with the Maricopa County Sheriff's Office (MSCO). Besides basic information about law enforcement in general and specific crime statistics for Sun City AZ, those attending may have been somewhat alarmed to hear that 236 crimes were committed in the first five months of 2018, most of which were thefts and burglaries.

"We have found that a lot of victims of these crimes did not lock their doors or roll up their windows," stated Captain Paul Chagolla from the District 3 Office, just west on Bell Road in Surprise.

So what it really boils down to is that staying safe and not being a victim of crime is partly your responsibility. Stay alert and be aware of your surroundings; use the buddy system rather than going alone. Don't leave any valuables in sight; put them in your car trunk or take items into your home. This includes leaving your golf clubs on your golf cart at the recreation centers, while

shopping or at local restaurants. Don't do it! Lock your doors – both when you are at home and when you're away. Do not open your door before you know who is there and turn on porch lights. Or better yet, install motion-sensor light fixtures. Be wary of strange persons and/or vehicles in your neighborhood. Keep your car windows rolled up and your garage door closed, even if you're only going inside for a

minute. Honestly, that's all the time is takes!

So, it really is quite simple - If you see something, say something. If you are a victim of a crime, report it. Crime statistics are based upon reports and these help to determine trends and where patrols might need to be stepped up. Unless people report such occurrences to law enforcement officials, how will they know?

To report criminal activity, call 911. Stay calm, know your location, answer all questions and follow instructions if any are given. Let the dispatcher guide the conversation and be patient; they are determining how to best handle your situation. The MSCO phone number for non-criminal reporting and follow-up is 602-876-1011.

While the Sun City Posse is no longer affiliated with MCSO, they are still a unique and valuable force in our community. The Posse still helps keep residents and their property safe in a number of ways, including vacation watch, RUOK, block watch, along with other community services assistance.

Be smart, stay safe and report suspicious activity. Let's all work together to lessen the opportunities for crime to occur in Sun City AZ.

Management Updates

Financial Report

With the correction of the miscalculation of the monthly spread of the annual property assessment income in the 2018 annual budget, the reported overall negative variance from budget last month has been eliminated and all division's net operations are within budget year-to-date. The total 2018 budget for annual property assessment income has not changed, just the monthly allocation.

Utility expenses continue to be a challenge this year as both rates and weather affect these costs a great deal. As a result, utility expenses are very difficult to project. The expense varies a great deal from year to year. Due to a recent inquiry with APS, our electric provider, we have discovered that three of our golf course wells are on a rating system that allows for automatic yearly rate increases based on usage during a certain time of year. We have applied for these three wells to be placed on a water pumping only rate, the same as the other seven wells used for golf course watering. We have completed 2 of the 3 application processes to obtain that rate change. The final approval and agreement with APS should be forthcoming very soon which will decrease electric costs considerably for those three wells.

Bowling

Recently, the United States Bowling Congress (USBC) performed inspections on all RCSC bowling lanes, approaches, foul lights and pin spotting. Minor issues were reported and have been corrected.

Bell Lanes will continue hosting the monthly summer No-Tap bowling tournaments which are held the last Sunday of each month. All bowlers are welcome whether USBC certified or not.

Lane conditioning machines have been updated and consumable parts have been replaced to ensure high scoring and pattern consistency for the upcoming fall season.

Director of Bowling Operations, Randy Johnson, has spoken with two different leagues that bowl at other centers that are interested in moving their league to RCSC bowling centers for the upcoming fall season. We are currently in the process of negotiations and confirming lane availability.

Cardholder Services

Payments on past due assessments in May were 13.8% of past due balances. Overall accounts receivables decreased in May by just under 2% and are at the lowest total since February 2013. All categories of receivables decreased in May except the 30 day category which had

a 24% increase. April assessments went 30 days past due at an increased rate of 5.5%, which is typical for April receivables. March assessments went 60 days past due at a 2.1% rate.

Payments from our third-party collections firm totaled \$15,766 in May and are 68% over the 2017 year to date amount. Payments made in May by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal totaled \$135,503 from 291 property owners. Year to date web portal payments total \$651,404 from 1,435 property owners. It continues to be encouraging seeing the increase in the number of property owners that take advantage of the RCSC Web Portal.

In May, property transfer balances decreased by under 2.7% and lender related balances increased by 93.5% due to the low balance total at the end of April. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent 52% of all receivables and past due balances. At the end of May trustee sale notices on Sun City AZ properties ended at 50 and properties owned by lending institutions at 13.

Human Resources

Human Resources is in the process of reviewing and revising human resources forms and updating the Corporation's intranet as necessary. The RCSC Application for Employment and the Job Position Descriptions are two of the main forms being reviewed and revised. When completed these two forms will be included on the Corporation's website under the Employment tab.

Recruiting and hiring has slowed down during the past two months due to a decrease in turnover and the availability of golf employees who otherwise would have been laid off during golf course closures.

Member Services

On Wednesday, June 18 we welcomed the band Americana to the Sundial Auditorium. Americana performed timeless songs from North American singers and songwriters like Simon & Garfunkel, Mamas & Papas, Gordon Lightfoot, The Carpenters, Jim Croce, Linda Ronstadt, Crosby Stills & Nash and many more!

Mark your calendars for Wednesday, July 4 from 9am-2pm to join us at the Bell Recreation Center Social Halls for the 40th Annual Ring That Bell Ceremony, followed by free bowling, shuffleboard, billiards, darts, music and dancing. Pulled pork sandwiches, chips and bottled water will be available for \$6 from George's Café. Donations from this event benefit the Sun City Foundation.

Three weeks later on Wednesday, July 25 we will be back at Sundial Auditorium for an evening with the Main Event Band.

Project Updates

Building and Infrastructure:

Multiple Locations

 A total of 33 aged HVAC units have been identified for replacement across multiple RCSC buildings in 2018. These replacements will begin over the next week with six units being replaced at Bell, Oakmont and Lakeview Centers. All replacement units will have a minimum SEER rating of 14 that represents significantly greater energy efficiency than the units being replaced. Replacements of the remaining units identified for replacement will continue over approximately the next 8 weeks.

Bell Center

- The Bell indoor spa continues to be closed for maintenance. The existing floor trench drain will be removed and a new "SlotDrain" product will be installed and tied into the existing sewer line along with the replacement of the flooring with a rubberized material. The "SlotDrain" product lead time and concrete curing time will require this amenity be closed until approximately the end of August. During this extended closure the pebble sheen interior surface of the spa will be replaced. Contractors are DFG Builders, Arizona Safety Surfacing and CDC Pools. (Cost \$57,000)
- A pool chiller from Glacier Pool Coolers, Inc. was installed for the Bell lap pool. This
 cooling equipment will keep the pool temp 10-15 degrees cooler in the hot summer months. Contractors were Glacier Pool Coolers and Sunland Plumbing. (Cost
 \$12,980)

Grand Ave

Club room space allocation is complete. Upon approval from the Board, the space
plans will be handed off to the architect for formal architectural drawings of the
space. Design of the Garden Club greenhouse is in progress. RCSC met with ADOT
earlier this month to discuss the addition of a deceleration lane on Grand Ave for
entry into the parking lot. Feedback from ADOT was positive with design work and
cost estimates now in progress.

South Golf Course

 Maricopa County has approved the project and issued the necessary construction permits. The response deadline for bids from the identified general contractors is Friday, June 29, 2018. The review of the submitted bids and selection of the general contractor will be completed in early July.

Water Conservation

Water Saving Tips Simply Worth Repeating

- 1. Save water while brushing your teeth Maintain a beautiful, healthy smile and conserve water at the same time by turning off the tap to save up to 200 gallons of water per month.
- 2. Save water while washing your hands The average American washes their hands nearly 9 times per day. If you scrub your hands with soap for at least 20 seconds, you could save at least 6 gallons per day by turning off the tap while you scrub.
- 3. Save water while washing dishes An energy-efficient dishwasher typically uses as little as 4 gallons of water per cycle, whereas hand washing can use up to 20 gallons. Make sure you only run the dishwasher when it is full. Don't have a dishwasher? Scrape your dirty dishes into the trash, fill up your sink with water, and wash the dishes all at once instead of washing dishes one-by-one under constantly flowing water.
- 4. Save water while cooking Wash fruits and vegetables in a pan of water instead of a running faucet. Defrost food in the fridge instead of using water. When boiling food, use just enough water to cover food. *Tip: Using less water when boiling vegetables will also preserve flavor and nutrients.
- 5. Save water while taking a shower A bath typically uses up to 30 gallons of water, whereas a five-minute shower will use only 10-25 gallons depending on the efficiency of showerhead. So opt for a shower to save water.
- 6. Save water while filling your glass Is it hot outside? Don't keep running the tap until water gets cold enough to drink. Instead, fill up a large water bottle and keep it in the fridge. It's easy, fast and cool.





Sun City Gives Back

LGBT Bags and Bears Help to Ease Stigma and Sadness

LGBT Club of Sun City members recently volunteered their sewing skills to benefit the community during the club's June Gayme Night event. Below is the story of Ronn Enzweiler who has spearheaded this project.

When Ronn retired after 45 years of being a registered nurse, his sister gave him a sewing machine. "You need to keep busy, so you don't get into trouble," she said. Little did Ronn know that sewing ten hours a day would become a common activity. He started to make reusable cloth bags, tracing banned plastic grocery sacks as a pattern.



After moving to Sun City, Ronn joined a sewing club. One day a donation came in - yards and yards of seersucker. What could be done with all of this fabric? Ronn approached Eve's Place about making cloth bags for their clients, many of whom are victims of abuse. Rather than using plastic bags that can easily tear and which carry a certain social stigma, cloth bags are now being used to hold possessions.

As this idea evolved, a group of LGBT Club members agreed to meet monthly to make the bags at Ronn's home. Each piece of fabric must be cut, sewn and strung to be made into a usable bag. Studier bags are

also made for people who must carry items while using public transportation or walking. Approximately 800 bags have been given out to agencies dealing with those in need and the homeless public. Some bags are given to local police agencies for people to use as totes for personal care items, some bags continue to go to Eve's Place, and some are given to a local food bank.

To maintain the interest of this small volunteer group, another thought was to make stuffed teddy bears which has evolved into a labor of love. They SO CUTE! Fabric is cut



into a bear pattern and sewn, faces are carefully drawn. The bears are then stuffed and ribbons, which would otherwise end up in a landfill, are used to adorn each bear's neck. Right now, the biggest challenge is acquiring the costly stuffing for the bears. This idea is only a few months old and still evolving as they need to ensure that there is a steady supply before reaching out to neighboring fire and police departments to provide the bears to kids who they support. This fulfilling work continues and grows each and every month.

Status of FHA Insured Loans in Sun City AZ

(continued from front page)

was comparable to 12 CFR 1228 that would allow FHA insured mortgages including reverse mortgages where there is a capital improvement fee (PIF), provided this fee remained in the community and a direct benefit to the property. RCSC also received verbal acknowledgement that 12 CFR 1228 was applicable to condominiums and as a result FHA insured loans would be available to that property type in Sun City AZ. To RCSC's knowledge, that letter is still awaiting signature in Washington DC.

June 2017 Stephanie Smelnick FHA/HUD Field Director in Phoenix reports to SCHOA Board member that the condo moratorium was reviewed and lifted in April and that they no longer had an issue with PIF but that single family homes remained with FHA restrictions.

RCSC continued communication with Santa Ana HUD **between June 2017 and April 2018,** however, it did not produce any reportable results or verbal indications. There was never any timeframe provided for when HUD would respond or any estimated time HUD generally requires for a resolution. Any attempted communication with HUD in Washington DC resulted in referral back to Santa Ana HUD or no response at all.

April 2018 due to continuing delays with HUD's mortgagee letter reportedly drafted and awaiting signature in Washington DC and/or harmonizing the underwriting guidelines for single family homes as 12 U.S.C.A § 1709 outlines for condominiums, the RCSC Board majority approved and sent HUD proposed language for the Bylaws and BP24 which would modify the documents to not charge the PIF or administrative transfer fee to a lender pursuant to a foreclosure or deed-in-lieu of foreclosure in an effort to resolve the problem. The Board majority is not in favor of making changes to its corporate documents without written acceptance by HUD confirming that such changes would result in current and potential Sun City AZ homeowners being able to obtain FHA insured loans including reverse mortgages. RCSC received verbal confirmation from Santa Ana HUD Director Thomas Rose that these documents were received and forwarded to Washington DC and that Washington DC would review and provide comments. Although RCSC has been verbally told we are not being ignored and that Santa Ana HUD is working with "headquarters" to get an appropriate response, no written response has been received to date. Verbal indications are that the language submitted is not sufficient as FHA is not a lender and HUD will not draft language samples that they would approve for the Board's consideration.

May 2018 in a verbal conversation with Santa Ana, they hint that there are other considerations that could create problems for FHA insured mortgages including reverse mortgages in Sun City AZ. For example: 1) HUD does not like legal language that is binding and runs with the land which may obligate HUD, as well as subsequent purchasers from HUD to the terms of such language; and, 2) RCSC's Facilities Agreement states that its lien for assessments and fees shall be subordinate only to the first mortgage or first deed on the property.

May 2018 details of the entire process with HUD provided to newly elected Congresswoman Debbie Lesko's Deputy Director in Phoenix for review to see if there is any help that can be provided by Lesko in Washington DC to get some timely resolve for current and potential Sun City AZ homeowners.

June 2018 the RCSC Board considered new amendments to the Corporate Bylaws and BP24 which would modify the documents to not charge the PIF or administrative transfer fee to a lender or lender's guarantor/insurer pursuant to a foreclosure, deed-in-lieu of foreclosure, assignment, or similar mechanism. This new wording would hopefully appease the verbal indication that previous wording submitted to HUD was not sufficient as FHA is not a lender. The Board majority opposed the proposed amendments as the Board felt the amendments would not solve the entire problem with HUD and did not uphold their fiduciary duty to the corporation nor the majority of RCSC's Members. While the fluctuation in PIF collected from owners of foreclosed properties can vary greatly each year (2012=\$636,000, 2017=\$126,000, \$375,000/year average from 2012 to 2017), the Board majority feels that their duty is to protect the assets of the corporation and do what benefits the majority of the membership.

June 2018 discussion with Santa Anna HUD confirmed that HUD's general counsel is still reviewing each of the related issues with this being on the forefront of weekly calls at HUD. Because this has been referred to general counsel, Santa Anna HUD is cautious in their communications on the issue and any future HUD actions. HUD has not provided written determinations approving recent changes to governing documents by neighboring communities. It is up to each originating lender to make an approval determination in alignment with the policies in the HUD handbook. Any approval determinations have been the interpretation by lending originators that the language in the documents follows HUD handbook policies.





Tips from Get Fit for Life -

Body Composition

"Body composition refers to the proportion of fat body weight and lean body weight that comprise one's total body weight," explains Jane Fortier, fitness specialist for Get Fit for Life. "The scale indicates total weight in pounds, it doesn't differentiate between fat mass and fat-free mass. Fat mass consists of all the fat tissue in your body. Fat-free mass is everything else, including muscle, skin, organs, bone and body fluids. With appropriate weight loss efforts, both fat mass and fat-free mass can change simultaneously. When this happens, total scale weight might remain the same. (Example: you start strength exercise and gain two pounds of muscle the first month - that muscle, along with a sensible eating program, help you burn two pounds of fat – your fat-free mass increased by the same amount that your fat mass decreased – thus changing body composition, but not total scale weight). A healthy body composition is one that includes a lower proportion of body fat and a higher proportion of fat-free mass. In general, men over 55 years should carry about 20% body fat; women about 25%. Body composition is one measurement that is used to assess health and fitness. It also determines how a body looks"

There are many methods to assess your body composition. The most accurate methods are usually expensive and only used in research or medical centers. A simple method you can use at home is measuring body circumference. By tracking a tape-measurement at the midriff (area below the chest but above the waist), waist (slightly above belly-button), belly (area below the belly button), and hip (6 inches down from the waistline) you will be able to determine a loss in inches. That loss computes to fat-loss. While a change in circumference doesn't give you an exact percentage loss of fat, it gives you a good idea that body composition changes are taking place. Decreases in



midriff, waist and belly circumference are a sign that you are losing belly fat. It's important to measure the same way each time, so you get more accurate results. Devices that measure body composition use a technology called bioelectrical impedance analysis (BIA). BIA sends small electrical currents through the body to see how much your body resists the current. While it's gratifying to see an actual number for your body fat percentage, many of these devices aren't very accurate. Factors like food and water intake, prior to using the device, can affect the results. A Tanika scale is the most popular BIA device for general usage. If you choose to use this scale, weigh in the morning, before you eat or drink any-


"If you are unhappy with the way your body looks, changes in body composition will improve things," Fortier continues. "Proper exercise and diet can help you make the best of the body your genetics gave you. But all weight loss efforts need to target body fat. Exercising regularly and eating healthy helps you lose weight, gain muscle and feel more energetic. Changing body composition, by adding muscle and losing fat, improves stamina and makes you look firmer and more sculpted. The amount of reshaping you can accomplish depends on your current physique, how long you have to devote to the process and your level of commitment."

People, meeting needs of people is what Sunshine Service is all about. Sunshine Service lends medical and children's equipment to residents of Sun City and we have been doing so for over 54 years. We are a charitable non-profit Arizona corporation and are funded by voluntary contributions and memorial gifts.

While the equipment is available for the use of all residents or visitors staying with residents, the equipment must not be taken out of Sun City on a permanent basis. As a matter of control, equipment is loaned only to Sun City residents.

Records show that as the population of Sun City grew, so did use of our medical equipment. Savings for Sun City residents have been calculated periodically; in 2015, it was estimated that residents saved over two million dollars in cost of equipment for that year alone.



Sunshine Service, Inc has received local, state and national recognition. Awards received include the George Washington Honor Medal for services to the sick and handicapped from the Freedoms Foundation of Valley Forge in Pennsylvania.




