RCSC Offices Closed on Labor Day

Lakeview, Oakmont and Mountain View Centers will close at 7:00pm effective Tuesday, September 4. All remaining RCSC recreation centers (Bell, Marinette, Fairway and Sundial) will continue to be open until 9:00pm.

While you're out and about enjoying all that RCSC has to offer, please be aware of the following items which require Cardholder attention when using any of the recreational facilities:

- All RCSC Cardholders are required to check in with their Member or Privilege Cards (key fobs accepted for entry to fitness, pools and spas; not concerts or free events)
- Neither Sun City AZ residents nor spouses of RCSC Cardholders are eligible to be guests. With proper documentation, privilege cards may be purchased at the Cardholder Services Office at Lakeview Center in order to use the facilities.
- Host punch cards are purchased by and belong to the Cardholder, not the guest. Host punch cards can be purchased at RCSC Facility Attendent Stations (exact cash or check only), Cardholder Services at Lakeview, RCSC Bowling Centers.
- Guests may be requested to show government-issued photo ID when checking in to use RCSC facilities.

- Proof of age for 4 and 5 year olds (birth certificate or passport) is required for access to swimming pools. Photo copies or electronic images are acceptable.
- Free concerts and events are paid for by RCSC Cardholders and are intended for RCSC Cardholders and their escorted guests only. Always be prepared to show your RCSC Member or Privilege card (with photo) when attending concerts and events. Key fobs are not accepted for entry.
- Lakeview Hillside Park is now gated and Cardholders must present Member or Privilege card to attendant for access.

You've still got the month of September to pick up a candidate packet, complete the paperwork and collect the necessary signatures to get your name on the ballot for this year's RCSC Board of Directors Election. There will be three vacancies to fill in this year's December election, with each being a three year term.

To obtain a candidate packet, you must make the request in person at the RCSC Corporate/Board Office at the Lakeview Center (lower level) and present your RCSC Member card. The deadline for packet submissions is no later than noon on Friday, October 5, 2018.

Requirements to become a RCSC Board candidate:

- Must be at least fifty-five (55) years of age;
- Must not be related by marriage or birth to any other member of the Board, Senior Management Staff, or Board Candidate;
- Must be a Deeded Real Estate Owner of property in Sun City, Maricopa County, Arizona;
- Must be a RCSC Member in good standing;
- Must reside in Sun City, Arizona and be available at least ten (10) months of the year;
- Must meet the requirements to hold an Arizona liquor license (RCSC holds liquor licenses which require Board Officers to be included on the licensing);

- Must be eligible and available to serve a three (3) year term; and
- Must be available to attend Board Candidate Orientation(s).

Candidates must also submit a fully completed RCSC petition, signed by 100 or more RCSC Members in good standing, along with all other forms provided in the RCSC Candidate Packet.

A successful candidate will:

- Have a strong desire to serve Sun City, AZ;
- Be fair and courteous;
- Use good common sense;
- Have good communication skills;
- Be willing to work as part of a team;
- Ability to prioritize policy and projects which will have the greatest benefit for the most members; and
- Be willing and able to dedicate the necessary hours to be an effective Director.

Candidates will be introduced at both the October and November Board meetings and candidate forums that will be held in the fall. Forum locations and dates will be announced at a later time.

Golf & Grounds Report

Pro Shops

We will be participating in Patriot Golf Day once again this year. Patriot Golf Day was organized, with the help of PGA of America to raise funds for the Folds of Honor Foundation. The money raised is used to fund scholarships for spouses and children of military service men and women killed or disabled while serving our Country. Starters will be collecting donations through the pro shops from August 31 through September 5. In addition to donation collection, we will be hosting a skins game on August 31 that is open to all golfers. Proceeds from the event will be added to our fundraising efforts. The event will begin at 7:00am at Lakes West with a shotgun start.

Courses

The Willowcreek/Willowbrook project remains on schedule and all greens were grassed ahead of the July 15 deadline. This date is important as it gives the newly planted sprigs the opportunity to thrive during the higher humidity brought on by the monsoon season. The greens are receiving regular fertilization and frequent topdressing. The focus on irrigation now shifts to Willowbrook. All necessary tie-ins have been completed and mainline installation is complete from hole 1 through number 9. Hole 1 has lateral lines installed as well as sprinkler heads, lateral line installation has begun on hole 9. Perimeter landscaping will begin on Willowbrook, once the irrigation team has several holes completed.

Greens aerification will be complete July 31, with the aerification of the North greens. This process will mark the end of our major agronomic practices. As outlined in previous reports, all of these practices are necessary and help to promote healthy turf year round. We understand the impact many of these practices have on the golfing experience and we appreciate the patience of the golfing community.

Snack Shops

We invite all of our residents to try our snack shops for breakfast or lunch. The snack shops open daily at 6:00am and are open for lunch through 1:00pm during the summer months.

Lawn Bowl

The greens at Lakeview have had their final laser leveled topdressing and the greens at Bell are scheduled for their final topdressing on July 30 and July 31. All greens have been verticut and have been receiving regular fertilizer applications. We have been working with our contracted consultant, Lyall Adams from Woodbay, as well as members of the Lawn Bowl community to identify areas needing correction ahead of this year's U.S. Open.

The grounds crew has had a busy month cleaning up from the storms in early July. The bermuda grass also grows at a much guicker pace during the monsoon season. With the help of staff and equipment from the South course, the grounds crew also finished tying in the newly poured concrete pads at the softball field to existing landscaping.

Tips from a Pro

Setting Your Own Par

Depending on your skill level, your "par" on any given hole may be different than what the scorecard says! In other words, unless you are a low handicapper, expecting a par on every hole will most likely leave you feeling frustrated. To make the game more fun and to match the scorecard to your ability level, try the following:

New golfers or high handicappers:

Your goal may not even be scoring, at least initially. Instead, find a few clubs that you have some confidence and consistency with and stick with those. On the tee it may be a 5 iron to start with and then eventually may be a 5 wood. In the fairway it may be a 7 or 5 iron, or perhaps a hybrid club. Challenge yourself to get to the green in the number of shots "par" is. Example, on a par 3 hole, attempt to get on the green in three shots. Then, work to be able to putt in within two putts.

Bogey golfers:

On a regulation course (where par is 72) a bogey on each hole would give you a score of 90. Anything less than a bogey is a bonus! Attempt to get the ball on the green in one under par (get on in 3 shots on a par 4) then in the hole in 2 putts. This can make the game seem easier and help the score to come down! Another way to think about it is playing the game of 5's. If you make a 5 on all 18 holes you shoot 90. Keep track of how many over or under 5's you are. Example if you have a 4 on a par 3 hole you are now 1 under in your game of 5's!

Low handicappers:

Your goal is to make as many pars as possible. Having a reliable driving club to hit the fairway consistently is key. Next, accuracy on your fairway shots are important so you can hit the green in regulation at least 50% or more of the time. And last a good short game is key for getting up and down on any hole you don't make the green in regulation on.

Remember that keeping your "par" in mind helps you to approach each hole with a realistic strategy. Once you have mastered where you're at it's always fun to set new goals and a new "par" score to match. Enjoy!



Architect's Report

Work Continued Right On Through Heat, Humidity



Low-water use plants, once established, will enhance the desert landscaping saving water and money well into the future.

Keep pressing on has become the onsite motto as Wadsworth Golf has been working tirelessly through the heat and humidity to install the new irrigation system on Willowbrook. I think everyone involved has come to realize that the installation of nearly 4,000 irrigation heads and 50 plus miles of pipe was a major undertaking.

Along with the irrigation work, the only significant construction activity still being completed is the perimeter landscape around Willowbrook. The turf conversion is a significant part of the renovation to help reduce overall water consumption. All plants being installed are on the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality Low-Water Use Willowcreek and Willowbrook - we will be converting about 40 acres of irrigated turf to low-water use planting areas, saving the Recreation Centers of Sun City and its cardholders a significant amount water each year.

A Moment with President DeLano Monsoons Bring Wild Weather at Times

Well, here we are – half-way through Monsoon Season 2018 and into the home stretch towards cooler temperatures (or at least "less hot"). While many snowbirds are enjoying their time away, sunbirds around here appreciate the slower pace and easy access to less crowded RCSC amenities that we treasure this time of year.

Though there have been some days that may have felt like you walking into an oven, we've had no shortage of nights that offered no relief from the heat to go right along with them. Most morning walks generally were happening prior to the start of garbage collection or before landscapers arrived for work, and the ever-present hum from roof-top air conditioning units serenaded late evening walkers around the neighborhoods. During the day, parking spots in the shade (what few there really are) remained at a premium and car window shades are still put into use repeatedly to reflect the heat.

And yet for many of us it still beats the cold and snow, tornadoes or hurricanes, humidity or mosquitos other regions contend with on a seasonal basis.

But just like the double-edged sword or the flip side of the coin, relief from the heat typically comes in the form of monsoon storms here is the desert southwest.

After days (and oftentimes weeks) of 100+ degree temperatures, when the rains finally come it is quite the experience. Seemingly out of nowhere the clouds begin to build and the wind picks up. Broken limbs and uprooted trees require immediate attention and clean-up, while power outages and downed lines create life and death emergency situations in many cases that must be addressed. We should be proud, pleased and grateful that RCSC staff and work crews were out in full force getting nearly all facilities back in operation and safe for Cardholder use by then next afternoon. Thanks to you all for doing such a great job!

Since there is no monthly Board meeting in the month of July, I will include the Treasurer's Report information in my monthly report. The balance of unrestricted funds as of June 30, 2018 was \$15,045,906 which includes a \$2.5M cash reserve. Restricted funds include the Preservation and Improvement Fund ("PIF") and the Capital Reserve Fund. As of June 30, 2018 PIF had a balance of \$16,429,082 plus \$681,500 collected in June that was transferred into the PIF account the first part of July 2018. The Capital Reserve Fund had a balance of \$5,179,092 as of June month end.

We have completed our second quarter within our overall operating and capital budget year-to-date. Every division has a net operating positive variance from budget year-to-date.

Bowling:

Monthly summer No-Tap bowling tournaments are held the last Sunday of each month and end the last Sunday of September with a Scotch Doubles tournament. The tournament is being held at Bell Lanes and all bowlers are welcome whether USBC certified or not.

Bowling league Secretaries and Presidents are essential to league operations and communication with the bowling centers is also very important. On August 16, 2018, the bowling center supervisors, Director of Bowling Operations and representatives of USBC will meet with all RCSC league Presidents and Secretaries to discuss any RCSC policy changes and USBC rule changes.

Summer maintenance is being performed at both bowling centers by the RCSC bowling mechanics. Maintenance includes rebuilding major components and lubrication. The maintenance will ensure proper and reliable operation for the upcoming fall season.

Cardholder Services:

Payments on past due assessments in June were 13.6% of past due balances. Overall accounts receivables increased in June by just under 1%. While the Current and Over 60 Day categories both increased in June, the Over 90 Day category decreased by 1.8% and is at the lowest level since July 2013. May assessments went 30 days past due at a rate of 5.4% and April assessments went 60 days past due at a 2.3% rate.

Payments from our third-party collections firm totaled \$13,979 in June and are 33% over the 2017 year to date amount. Payments made in June by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal totaled \$116,714 from 266 property owners. Year-to-date web portal payments total \$768,117 from 1,694 property owners. This

is a 20% increase in payments through the RCSC Web Portal over the 2017 YTD totals.

In June, property transfer balances increased by 2% and lender related balances decreased by 20%. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent 53% of all receivables and past due balances. At the end of June, trustee sale notices on Sun City properties ended at 45 and properties owned by lending institutions at 12.

Human Resources:

In the second quarter of the year, three former employees filed for unemployment benefits. In reviewing the claims, the Arizona Department of Economic Security ruled in favor of RCSC for all three claims and the corporation's account will not be charged. Controlling benefit costs is one way in which we can affect the bottom line.

After a review, two of RCSC's Personnel Policies and Procedures have been updated, the Conflict of Interest and the Gratuities, Gifts and Tips policies. Revised policies are available to employees on RCSC's intranet and will be distributed to individuals in their next paycheck.

We have filed the Corporation's Form 5500 for the annual reporting of Employee Benefit Plans in compliance with the requirements of ERISA (Employee Retirement Income Security Act) and the Internal Revenue Code. The filing includes benefits for medical, dental and life insurance.

We are in the process of completing the requirements for filing the Form 5500 for the RCSC Employees 401(k) Plan. We automatically file for an extension for the October deadline each year, however, we plan to file before the end of this month. The audit of the plan has been completed and we are waiting for the final audit document in order to file. We expect to receive the document early this week.

Member Services:

On Wednesday, June 18 we welcomed Americana to the Sundial Auditorium. This performance was such a good time that we have put them in the 2019 Sun Bowl line-up.

The 40th annual Ring That Bell ceremony and presentation, followed by free bowling, shuffleboard, billiards, darts and dancing with pulled pork sandwiches, chips and bottled water at George's Café was very well received and attended. Thank you for your donations that will benefit the Sun City Foundation.

On Wednesday, July 25 we spent an enjoyable evening of music and dancing with the Main Event Band for our final summer concert at the Sundial Auditorium. (continued on next page)

Project Updates

Building and Infrastructure

Multiple Locations

A monsoon storm swept through Sun City on July 9, 2018 with a smaller follow up storm on July 11, 2018. These storms caused various levels of damage across the RCSC centers and golf courses. Considerable time has been spent documenting the damage and preparing the insurance claim for the damage incurred. Repair efforts are ongoing and likely to take several more weeks to complete all of the necessary repairs.

Fairway Center

 The pool was closed on Friday, July 13, 2018 for the completion of pool decking touchups and the installation of new Rubaroc flooring in the outdoor shower area. Contractors were Desert Rose Concrete Coatings and Arizona Safety Surfacing (cost – \$3,000).

Lakeview Center


- Work is set to begin in early August in the Women's Social Club Room at Lakeview Center. Work is expected to take four weeks to complete. Work will include the removal of the fireplace and hearth, repair of the wall, ceiling and roof, painting, and the installation of new flooring and blinds. Contractors are Devil Dog Demolition, DFG Construction, Resource AZ Flooring, Imagine Panting (cost \$27,618).
- Tables were recovered in the billiards area at Lakeview Lanes. The eleven tables recovered included two snooker tables, three Diamond pool tables and seven regular pool tables. Contractor was Arizona Billiard Service (cost \$7,000).

Oakmont Center

• The outdoor shower area and the Oakmont Drive auditorium entry were updated with the Rubaroc material. The auditorium entry includes a sunrise graphic inlay consistent with signage around the center. Contractor was Arizona Safety Surfacing (cost – \$11,016).

South Golf Course

• RCSC has selected Robert E. Porter Construction for the completion of the South Pro Shop and Cart Barn project. The kickoff meeting to begin the project has occurred. The general contractor has started the necessary dust control and environmental permit filings required before construction activities can begin.

Gimme A Hand

Think of all the uses of the word "hand." Here are just a few phrases that are commonly heard:

- wrote in a fancy hand
- tried her hand at sailing
- so many hands high
- had no hand in the decision
- give them a big hand

- use what we have on hand
- deliver the document by hand
- had matters well in hand
- kept supplies on hand
- rejected the idea out of hand
- had a great hand of cards
- hold hands
- use a hand tool
- hand over that chocolate



Maybe that last one was just wishful thinking; but the word "hand" is used a lot in our conversation. The kind of hand we depend on in Sun City is a volunteer. Our community has survived, in fact thrived, because of the use of volunteers.

As an all volunteer organization, the Friends of the Sun City Libraries depend on volunteers. Here is how you can support our organization:

Water Conservation Repairing Leaks Inside and Out Saves \$\$\$

A little attention to minor leaks now will save both water - and money! While we're more likely to notice leaky faucets indoors, don't forget to check outdoor faucets, pipes and hoses for leaks as well. Whether inside or out, grab a wrench and get them fixed, saving upwards of 140 gallons of water each week.

Oftentimes, simply replacing a hose washer can fix a leaking garden hose connection. And if you use a hose nozzle (which is a very good thing), it is still important to turn off the water at the hose bib when you're done with the job – just in case.

Now let's head inside and check on the toilet. You can perform a simple dye test to check for leaks in the toilet flapper valve by placing dye tablets or some food coloring into the tank to give the water color. If the colored water appears in the bowl within 15 minutes, there is a leak in the flapper valve. Leaks occur when the flapper valve does not create a watertight seal. The seal can be compromised due to several reasons: a) the chain snagging, not allowing the flapper to drop completely onto the valve seat; c) the valve seat is worn; or c) the flapper is worn or warped. A worn flapper is the most common cause by far, and can be easily replaced. Get this fixed ASAP and save more than 600 gallons of water a month.



Little fixes add up to big dollar savings. Stop flushing money away!





#### Tips from Get Fit for Life -

### **How Exercise Affects Arthritis**

"Can I exercise if I have arthritis?" is a question I often hear from potential clients, states Jane Fortier, senior fitness specialist. "As someone who suffers with osteoarthritis and rheumatoid arthritis, I can confidently say, YES!"

Arthritis is a term that collectively refers to a group of rheumatic diseases that typically affect the body's musculoskeletal system—primarily, the joints. The more common



types of arthritis facing active aging adults are osteoarthritis (the most prevalent type), and rheumatoid arthritis (the most crippling form). Osteoarthritis is a chronic disorder that results from wear and tear on the body's cartilage and usually affects the joints of the hands, hips, spine, and knees. Rheumatoid arthritis is a systemic inflammatory disease that results from over-activation of the body's immune system, affecting the tissue in any number of joints and is characterized by flare-ups. Depending on the type of arthritis, symptoms associated with these conditions can include: stiffness, swelling, redness, warmth, tenderness, and acute pain.

A comprehensive treatment program for arthritis could include: medications, surgery, physical therapy, dietary changes, and a properly designed exercise program. Exercise is as essential for arthritis sufferers, as for anyone else. Individuals with arthritis, who exercise regularly, have less pain, more energy, and improved function. Specifically, exercise helps keep bones and cartilage tissue healthy and strong, helps keep joints from becoming unduly stiff, helps enhance the level of muscular fitness around the joints, and helps improve one's overall fitness level. Arthritis sufferers need an exercise regimen that meets individual needs and expectations. It must be safe, effective, and personally enjoyable.

A comprehensive arthritis exercise program should iInclude:

- Flexibility Exercise Stretching muscles and connective tissues and moving all the joints of the body through their normal maximal range of motion helps reduce stiffness in affected joints.
- Resistance or Strength Exercise Resistance exercise can increase strength and enhance the capability of muscles to support the joints of the body. Starting with a relatively low amount of weight and progressing, as the body allows, is a sensible approach. All major muscle groups should be included.
- Aerobic Exercise Aerobic or cardiovascular exercise helps improve overall level-of-fitness. Aerobic exercise involves low-impact activities such as walking, hiking, cycling, water aerobics, swimming and elliptical training. These activities engage the major muscles of the body, thereby placing a demand on the body's cardiovascular system.
- Body Awareness Exercise Exercises to improve posture, balance, joint position, and coordination are important. A joint and its surrounding muscles are often affected by the disease, resulting in impaired balance and coordination.






## **Welcome to Sunshine Service**

People, meeting needs of people is what Sunshine Service is all about. Sunshine Service lends medical and children's equipment to residents of Sun City and we have been doing so for over 54 years. We are a charitable non-profit Arizona corporation and are funded by voluntary contributions and memorial gifts.

While the equipment is available for the use of all residents or visitors staying with residents, the equipment must not be taken out of Sun City on a permanent basis. As a matter of control, equipment is loaned only to Sun City residents.

Records show that as the population of Sun City grew, so did use of our medical equipment. Savings for Sun City residents have been calculated periodically; in 2015, it was estimated that residents saved over two million dollars in cost of equipment for that year alone.
