HUD/FHA-Insured Financing Receives Clearance

Although the issue of reverse mortgages has been a source of much concern throughout the community, the Recreation Centers of Sun City Inc, is pleased to announce that patience, perseverance and persistence had paid off! From first letter sent to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) back in January 2017, RCSC has claimed that RCSC's Preservation & Improvement Fee (PIF) was an Excepted Transfer Fee Covenant based on 12 CFR 1228, therefore removing any free assumability issues previously reported with FHA insured mortgages which includes reverse mortgages.

On October 5, 2018, RCSC was sent a letter from HUD in Washington DC that states: "FHA in conjunction with HUD'S Office of General Counsel reviewed the documents you provided and found that; to the extent RCSC is a 501(c)(4), which would qualify it as a covered association, such fee appears to meet the definition of an Excepted Transfer Fee under FHFA's regulations. This finding is based upon the current use of the PIF as outlined in the board resolution as reviewed and may not hold true should such use be modified in the future. Accordingly, the existence of this private transfer fee covenant, as described in the Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. corporate bylaws, as amended June 30, 2016 and the Board Policy Resolution No. 24, 'Preservation and Improvement Fee/Fund,' would not render a property ineligible for FHA insurance."

623-561-4600 beginning November 12; the last day to request an absentee ballot be mailed is November 30. Absentee ballots may also be picked up at the Board Office through December 10 and all absentee ballots must be received no later than December 11.

In addition, candidates will be in attendance at the remaining Board/Member Exchanges (on November 12 and December 10) and the regular Board Meeting on November 29.

Those elected to serve on the Board in this election will be sworn in at the Board Meeting on Thursday, December 20 at 9am in the Sundial Auditorium. HUD/FHA-Insured Financing Receives Clearance

(continued from page 1)

Reverse mortgages, a financial resource available to seniors who have equity in their home and are secured as a supplemental income, are available through FHA-approved lenders. The issues surrounding the free assumability clause had prevented approvals on singlefamily homes, prompting several area age-restricted communities to change their corporate documents in the hopes of gaining FHA clearance which proved unsuccessful.

As has been published previously, condominiums have separate regulations as pointed out in the letter as well, which states: "FHA also notes that if

the property securing the FHA insured mortgage is part of a Condominium Project, that Condominium Project must be approved in accordance with FHA's Condominium Project Approval and Processing Guide as amended."

Although the RCSC Board of Directors has been repeatedly criticized for staying on path to this resolve, in the end it has provided the very best results for Sun City AZ. RCSC Assistant General Manager Chris Herring championed this process and did a superb job. RCSC would also like to thank U.S. Representative Debbie Lesko and her team for helping to get this resolution out of Washington DC.

Golf & Grounds Report

Pro Shops

Free golf clinics are scheduled to start Saturday November 10 at Lakes West Golf Course. The remaining clinics will be held over the following three Saturdays. All Classes begin at 9:30 a.m. and are taught by PGA and LPGA professionals. Topics covered are chipping, putting, irons and woods. The free clinics are a great introduction to the game of golf or a great way to brush up on your game. There is no need to preregister and clubs are available to borrow.

Get Golf Ready classes will also begin in November, with sessions continuing through April. Get Golf Ready classes consist of four golf lessons in a group setting, followed by a fifth day of on course instruction over 9 holes. The cost for Get Golf Ready classes is \$99 per session and registration is handled by Chris Linam at (623) 876-8419 or email at clinam@suncityaz.org.

We had 102 participants in our Patriot Day golf event at Lakes West on August 31. Patriot Golf Day was organized with the help of PGA of America to raise funds for the Folds of Honor Foundation. Rich Lybolt was the big winner on the men's side, scoring the only gross skin on hole #1, worth \$385. There were four men's net skin winners, worth \$96.25, Guy Shaw, Mike Bratton, Tom Adams and Merv Hying. There were many skins out on the ladies side, Terry Klatt won a total of four, followed by Kim Oh with a total of three. Through entry fees, the 50/50 raffle and pro shop collections, we raised a total of \$1,300. The money raised is used to fund scholarships for spouses and children of military service men and women killed or disabled while serving our country.

On December 13 we will be hosting a fundraising tournament to raise money for our chosen Winter Celebration Charity, the Sun City Foundation. The format will be Beat the Pro(s), which will be Brian Duthu (PGA) and Chris Linam (Pro Shop Manager) and will be made up of two person teams. Teams that beat the Best Ball score of the Pros will equally share the prize pool. The entry fee will be \$40 and the event will be held at Willowcreek. In addition to bragging rights for beating the pro, there will also be a chance at a Pebble Beach Vacation.

Golf Courses

Overseeding will begin on October 1, on North, Lakes West and Quail Run and reopen October 20. Riverview, South and Lakes East will close on October 22 and will reopen November 10. Willowcreek and Willowbrook will be overseeded as part of the closure and both will open for play November 10.

The Willowcreek/Willowbrook project is in the final stages, with all irrigation pieces installed. Work continues in the perimeter areas of Willowbrook and along hole 9 on Willowcreek, with the installation of plant material and decomposed granite. Willowcreek will be overseeded with the early wave of courses, but will remain closed until the scheduled opening of November 10. We expect some level of construction activity to remain well into October, remaining closed will allow this activity to continue unhindered.

Grounds and Lawn Bowling

The greens at Lakeview and Bell Lawn Bowl have received a final laser leveling, focusing mostly along the plinth boards. New sprinkler heads were installed at both locations. The corner heads were placed in the ditches, both to improve coverage along the ends and to reduce overspray. The locations of the previous heads will be filled in with concrete. The greens at Oakmont and Mountain View have received their final verticutting.

The softball field closed September 24 for overseeding and is scheduled to reopen the 22nd of October. Overseeding around the centers will occur during the first two weeks of October. The grounds crew will be installing new landscaping rock in the pool area of the Bell Center the final week of September.



Tips from a Pro

For consistent golf shots, work on tempo!

Most golfers consider consistency to be one of the most difficult things to achieve in the game. If this is true for you, working on tempo may be the key.

Think of tempo as the rhythm that your golf swing has. It may be slow, fast, or somewhere in between. What matters most is that it is smooth and allows the swing to be balanced. Balance is crucial since we are swinging at a small ball with a relatively small clubhead. This doesn't allow us much room for error, and therefore the more balanced we are in the swing, the greater our chances of connecting become!

To work on tempo choose a short-mid iron and practice swinging with a sense of being smooth. Examples: "one and two" or "back and through" or "turn and hit" ... whatever works best for you. Try and make both sides of the swing (the back swing and the down swing) feel even.

Second, check the follow-through at the end of the swing for good balance. If the tempo was smooth, you should be in balance at the end of the swing, facing the target with all the weight on the forward foot (left foot for right handers). This position should be easy to hold until the ball comes to rest.

Last, once tempo and balance are achieved begin moving to longer clubs keeping the swing the same.

Management Updates

Financial Report

RCSC has ended August 31, 2018 within its operating and capital budget year to date. The golf division shows a deficit of \$218k which is due to the fact that fertilizer, chemicals and pesticides used during overseeding was a budgeted expense in September but has already been purchased in August. Otherwise, all divisions have operated within their net operating budget year to date.

Bowling

October will be a busy month for the Bowling Division. Every weekend has an event or tournament scheduled. The Sun City Bowling Hall of Fame will host their annual tournament at Lakeview Lanes on October 6, everyone is welcome to participate. Both RCSC bowling centers will host the Arizona State USBC Senior Championship Tournament on the weekends of October 20 and October 27. The USBC tournament is an unbudgeted tournament that will likely produce \$8k to \$9k in income. The USBC tournament will use both centers; therefore, lane availability will be limited during squad times. See the list of upcoming bowling tournaments and events in the weekly email "Your Sun City AZ Week" or view the list online at the www.suncityaz.org under the Bowling tab.

Signups for the annual New Year's Eve Bowling Party at Lakeview Lanes will begin Wednesday November 5, 2018 at 9am. The party starts December 31, 2018 at 8:00pm with a potluck, bowling and prize drawing and the night will end with a champagne toast to the New Year. Everyone is welcome to the event even if you are not a bowler. Stop by Lakeview Lanes or Bell Lanes to reserve your spot as availability is limited.

Cardholder Services

Payments on past due assessments in August were 17.1% of past due balances. Overall accounts receivables decreased in August by 3.8%. The increase in 30 Day balances in July flowed into the Over 60 Day category in August, although at a lower rate. July assessments went 30 days past due at 6.2% rate and June assessments went 60 days past due at a 2.4% rate.

Payments from our third-party collections firm totaled just \$2,060 in August. While August collections payments have seen decreases, this year's payments are the lowest monthly total in the past three years. Payments made in August by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal totaled \$101,553 from 229 property owners. Year to date web portal payments total \$983,038 from 2,151 property owners.

In August, property transfer balances decreased by 3.6% and lender related balances remained relatively unchanged with a 1.1% increase. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent 55% of all receivables and 56% of past due balances. At the end of August trustee sale notices on Sun City AZ properties ended at 40 and properties owned by lending institutions at four.

Human Resources

The first of our fall series of CPR, AED and First Aid training classes was held last week with seven RCSC employees in attendance. Additional classes are schedule for October 5 and October 12. Participants who complete the class and pass hands-on testing receive a two year certification card. The presenting instructor is certified through the American Health & Safety Institute and is employed by the Sun City Fire Department. Classes are offered in the spring and fall of each year.

We have begun the process of reviewing RCSC's employee benefits program for the January 1, 2019 renewal date. We expect to receive renewal information from the insurance carriers who provide medical, dental, life, short and long term disability and the 125 medical reimbursement plan in early October. Open enrollment meetings are scheduled for November 8 and 9 to present the information to employees and allow for any coverage changes they wish to make for the new plan year.

Member Services

Casino Night was held Saturday, September 15. What a fun filled event! Plenty of prizes were given away throughout the night including four trips awarded to the "high rollers" of the evening.

The Sun Bowl fall series began Sunday, September 23 with Johnny K and Kompany. Due to predicted warm temperatures the concert was moved to the Sundial Auditorium. A dance area is now provided for the Sun Bowl shows moved. The following Sunday, September 30th we return to the Sun Bowl, weather permitting, and welcome Kevin Sterner and Strait Country.

Project Updates

Building and Infrastructure

Bell Center

Work on the indoor spa at Bell Center is nearing completion. The pebble sheen finish has been completed. The installation of the Rubarock floor covering began on September 20 and is scheduled to be completed over the next week. The project is expected to be completed with the spa reopening by October 1. Contractors were DFG Construction, CDC Pools and Arizona Safety Surfacing (Cost – \$49,441)

Lakeview Center

 Work is completed in the Women's Social Hall except for the installation of the new blinds. The club moved back into their club room on September 17. Contractors were Devil Dog Demolition, DFG Construction, Resource Arizona, Imagine Painting, Supercharged Electric (Cost – \$31,950)

Marinette Center

- The pool and spa areas were closed from Saturday, September 8 through September 14 to complete pool deck repairs to areas where there was excessive delamination of the cool deck material from the base concrete. Contractor was Desert Rose Coatings (Cost \$5,400)
- The corroded electrical panel in the pool pump room was replaced during the recent outage for pool deck repairs. This important work was timed so that there was not additional downtime for this necessary work. Contractor was Accel Electric (Cost – \$23,860)
- A seal coat will be placed on the west parking lot with a restriping completed after.
 This work is scheduled to be completed on Monday, October 1 (weather permitting). Contractor is Ace Asphalt (Cost \$6,275)

South Golf Course

The final construction and occupancy permits were received, and the pro shop
was moved to the temporary trailer for operations during the construction. On
Thursday, September 13th the demolition of the current pro shop building began
with the removal of asphalt and the knocking down of the building. Over the next
several weeks we will see the removal of the debris and the grading and preparation of the site for the new building foundation. As a reminder, Cardholders are
asked to stay out of the fenced construction area for their safety. The general
contractor for this project is Robert Porter Construction.

Sundial Center

- The mini golf area will be closed starting in early October for repairs to concrete curbing and the replacement of the turf carpeting throughout the mini golf course. Contractors are DFG Builders and Baker Brothers. (Cost – \$26,104)
- The carpeting in the Sundial auditorium entry foyer will be replaced. This is scheduled for Saturday, September 29. The contractor is Resource Arizona. (Cost \$634)

Willow Pro Shop/Snack Shop

- During the work on the golf course the snack shop and pro shop are getting some much-needed repairs and renovations:
 - Buildings at Willow are being repainted on the exterior. Contractor is Ghaster Painting. (Cost – \$16,300)
 - The Willow Pro Shop interior is being painted. Contractor is Ghaster Painting. (Cost – \$7.750)
 - The roofs on Willow Snack and Pro are being repaired with a new foam elastomeric roof material being applied to the roofs. Contractors are Starkweather Roof and 1-800 Cooling. (Cost – \$21,372)
 - New flooring is being put down at Willow Snack in the seating, cooking and back prep/storage areas. Contractor is Resource Flooring. (\$15,120)
 - A new countertop is being installed in the Willow Snack bar service area, and tables in the seating area are getting new tops. Contractor is KAW Construction. (\$4,989.60)

- Income does not exceed 150% of the current Federal Poverty Level



Tips from Get Fit for Life -

Is My Exercise Regimen Working?

Many people feel their workout isn't effective unless they are out of breath, drenched in sweat, or so sore the next morning, they cringe every time they stand up. Heart rate and sore muscles are definitely indicators of workout intensity. But, what about those days when you feel like you worked hard, but fall short of any immediate or later after effects. Was the workout a waste of time?

"Certainly not," states Jane Fortier, senior fitness specialist. "Evaluating a workout is more complex than just a few physical signs. Looking at the bigger picture has more value: has there been an increase in your energy level; is body composition changing; are inches being lost; has strength increased to handle day-to-day functioning better; are recreational activities more enjoyable – these are the real measure of whether those consistent weekly workouts are worthwhile. Many factors come into play, as you exercise to reach health and fitness objectives."



Six Signs of a Successful Workout Program

- Am I sleeping better? Exercise can improve the quality and quantity of sleep, over time. Too much or not enough exercise can make sleep more difficult, so it's important to be sure your workouts are making you stronger and not running you down. When you notice you're sleeping better and feeling more rested when you wake up in the morning, that's a positive sign you're on the right track.
- Do I seem more mentally focused? A good workout provides an energy boost and improves concentration. It can help relieve the symptoms of depression and anxiety by releasing "feel good" endorphins and replenishing neurotransmitters. These changes begin to happen as soon as your workout is over. Over time, exercise improves memory and prevents cognitive decline.
- Am I hungrier? Exercise increases the production of ghrelin, a hormone that stimulates appetite. It's important to plan ahead for a healthy, post-workout snack or meal that fits into your calorie budget for the day. Be sure to stay adequately hydrated, too, since dehydration can often be confused for signs of hunger.
- Am I seeing progress in my ability to perform exercise tasks? You won't go faster
 every time you get on the treadmill, and you won't lift more weight each time
 you strength train. Over time, you should notice your fitness level improving. You
 should be able to work harder than when you first started your exercise routine.
 Keep in mind, however, that as you become more fit, improvements in performance become less frequent. That's why it is important to change up your exercise
 routine regularly, so that your body continues to be challenged in new ways.
- Am I feeling good about myself? A good workout can leave you tired, but can also leave you with a sense of accomplishment and a boost of confidence. A good workout not only improves how you look on the outside, but it makes you feel stronger and more confident on the inside.
- Do I like my exercise regimen? If you don't have a sense of accomplishment after your workout, consider trying something different. There are lots of exercise options out there. Don't like the treadmill? Try rowing or biking instead. Tired of strength machines? Try free weight or body weight exercises. Sometimes it takes a little creativity, and the help of a trainer, to find a workout that you are happy with.







People, meeting needs of people is what Sunshine Service is all about. Sunshine Service lends medical and children's equipment to residents of Sun City and we have been doing so for over 54 years. We are a charitable non-profit Arizona corporation and are funded by voluntary contributions and memorial gifts.

While the equipment is available for the use of all residents or visitors staying with residents, the equipment must not be taken out of Sun City on a permanent basis. As a matter of control, equipment is loaned only to Sun City residents.

Records show that as the population of Sun City grew, so did use of our medical equipment. Savings for Sun City residents have been calculated periodically; in 2015, it was estimated that residents saved over two million dollars in cost of equipment for that year alone.



Sunshine Service, Inc has received local, state and national recognition. Awards received include the George Washington Honor Medal for services to the sick and handicapped from the Freedoms Foundation of Valley Forge in Pennsylvania.
