RCSC Board Elections

Determining the Future of Sun City AZ with Your Vote!



Record voter turn-out is highly anticipated to match the record number of candidates running in this year's RCSC Board of Directors Election with eight candidates on the ballot: Darla Akins, John Dockham, Kat Kyle Fimmel, Diana Graettinger, Rich Hoffer, Mike Kennedy, Jill McCullough and Lana Williams.

These candidates are vying for the three 3-year positions on the RCSC Board of Directors being vacated by Directors Bruce Alleman, Jerry Walczak and Rich Hoffer (who is completing the term of Ron Smith who resigned from the Board earlier this year).



Online voting began on Monday, November 12, 2018 via the RCSC Web Portal and continues through Tuesday, December 11 (Election Day) at 4pm. RCSC Members may also vote in-person on Election Day from 8am to 4pm in the Lakeview Social Hall #2. *(More information about the RCSC Portal can be found on page 11).*

At this time, absentee ballots for those unable to vote online or in-person must be picked up at the RCSC Board Office through December 10 and returned no later than December 11 at 4pm.

RCSC Cardholders once again had the opportunity to meet the candidates and hear their stance on the issues this year at two Candidate Forums. Both of these sessions were video recorded and posted on the RCSC YouTube channel for viewing.

Those elected to serve on the Board in this election will be sworn in at the Board Meeting on Thursday, December 20 at 9am in the Sundial Auditorium. The seat being vacated by David Wieland's resignation will be filled by appointment in early January 2019.

RCSC Cardholders: Please keep the following in mind!

While you’re out and about enjoying all that RCSC has to offer, please be aware of the following items which require Cardholder attention when using any of the recreational facilities:

- All RCSC Cardholders are required to check in with their Member or Privilege Cards (key fobs accepted for entry to fitness, pools and spas; not concerts or free events)
- Neither Sun City AZ residents nor spouses of RCSC Cardholders are eligible to be guests. With proper documentation, privilege cards may be purchased at the Cardholder Services Office at Lakeview Center in order to use the facilities.
- Host punch cards are purchased by and belong to the Cardholder, not the guest. Host punch cards can be purchased at RCSC Facility Attendant Stations (exact cash or check only), Cardholder Services at Lakeview, RCSC Bowling Centers.
- Guests may be requested to show government-issued photo ID when checking in to use RCSC facilities.
- Proof of age for 4 and 5 year olds (birth certificate or passport) is required for access to swimming pools. Photo copies or electronic images are acceptable.
- Free concerts and events are paid for by RCSC Cardholders and are intended for RCSC Cardholders and their escorted guests only.
- Always be prepared to show your RCSC Member or Privilege card (with photo) when attending concerts and events. Key fobs are not accepted for entry.



No matter what state you’re from, while you’re here in Sun City it is much appreciated if you would park in only one space (note the white line under car) and save these smaller spaces for golf carts - as designed.

Golf & Grounds Report

Pro Shops

We will be hosting a tournament on December 13 to raise money for our chosen Winter Celebration Charity, the Sun City Foundation. The Beat the Pros format will include Brian Duthu (PGA) and Chris Linam (Pro Shop Manager) and will be made up of two person teams. Teams that beat the Best Ball score of the Pros will equally share the prize pool. The entry fee is \$40 and the event will be held at Willowcreek Golf Course. In addition to bragging rights for beating the pro, there will also be a chance at a Pebble Beach Vacation.

Complimentary golf clinics begin November 10 at Lakes West. The first clinic will be chipping, followed by putting, irons and woods in subsequent weeks. The clinics will also be held on November 17, 24 and December 1. All clinics begin at 9:30am. Clinics are open to all skill levels and do not require registration. This is a great opportunity to introduce a family member, friend or neighbor to the wonderful game of golf. Another session of free clinics will be offered in March 2019.

Registration for Get Golf Ready classes is also underway. The cost of the classes is \$99 which includes 4 days of instruction as part of group of 8 students or less, as well as a 5th day of on course play. The program covers swing fundamentals as well as golf etiquette and an introduction to golf rules. The program is part of a national initiative of the PGA of America to grow the game of golf. The first class begins November 5th and classes will be available throughout the winter and into spring 2019.

Snack Shops

Through September snack shop revenue is running \$51,000 ahead of budget and \$27,000 ahead of prior year. With the Willow closure, the 2018 was intentionally conservative and we thank everyone for their support. The Willow snack shop has received some updates during the closure and we welcome everyone to come on in and check it out when it reopens.

Golf Courses

Over-seeding began October 1 and has mostly germinated as expected, despite the heavy rain and unseasonably cooler temperatures. North, Lakes West and Quail Run reopened October 24 and will be cart path only until November 10. The second wave of over-seeding began October 22 and will reopen November 10 with cart path only restrictions through November 22. Willowcreek and Willowbrook are operating under a slightly modified schedule and will open on November 10. Willowcreek will open with no cart path restrictions (weather permitting) and Willowbrook will open with cart path only restrictions, through November 22.

On September 28 we had our second visit by USGA agronomist, Brian Whitlark. We visited South, Lakes West and Lakes East during his four hour visit. The primary reason for the second visit was to evaluate course conditions post transition. Mr. Whitlark observed that the courses had recovered from transition and informed us that the conditions we reported were consistent with other courses throughout southern Arizona. He was impressed with the overall condition of the South course, particularly the greens and the quality of cut. A topic of concern was the weed population at Lakes West, particularly around greens and tees. The Green Kyllinga population on green surfaces was also a concern. His full report is now available online, through the RCSC website at www.suncityaz.org under the Golf tab, then Resources.

Lawn Bowl and Grounds

Bell greens are finally starting to fill in after much topdressing and fertilization. We have now lowered the height of cut on all greens to .110" and will be mowing every other day as well as rolling in 2 directions every other day. This has been our maintenance schedule throughout the month of October. The week prior to the U.S. Open Tournament we will be mowing and rolling every day. On the days of actual tournament play we will be performing all mowing during the evening after play has ended and rolling the greens in the morning before play. There are currently 350 Bowlers from 12 different countries entered to compete.

The softball field reopened for play on October 20 following over-seeding. Sun Bowl and areas around Lakeview were over-seeded the week of October 15.

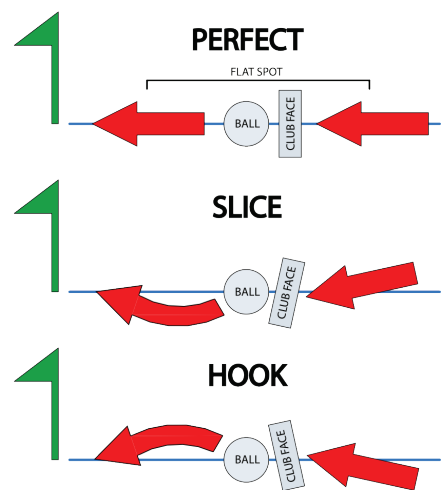

Tips from a Pro

Get your clubface square for straight shots!

To hit the ball straight, without a hook or slice, the clubface must be square (or facing the target) at impact. Many people start their clubface off square and wonder why it is not square at impact!

To understand this let's think about what the clubface does when you are putting. On a putt, your putter starts out square, or facing the hole, and as you make your putting stroke back and forth the putter face stays relatively square throughout the entire stroke. However, in a swing because it is much longer and our body turns away from the target on the backswing, the clubface opens on the way back and then must close back up on the way down. If it closes too late and the club is still open at impact, the ball will slice or curve right (for a right-handed golfer). If it closes too early and the club is closed at impact the ball will hook, or curve left (for a right-handed golfer).



To practice this proper opening and closing, use a 7 iron and tee the ball up. Take some practice swings first using just a waist high swing back and through. Stop on the backswing and look back to see if the club face has opened properly. If it has, the tip or toe of the clubface will be pointing up towards the sky. Now, swing through to a waist-high follow-through and again look to see if the tip or toe of the club is pointing up towards the sky. If so, the club has closed on the downswing. Getting the timing of this takes some practice, so working with a short club, and a short swing is usually the easiest way to perfect it! (Remember, if there is no curve to your ball, the club face was square when you made contact). Once you have it move to a longer swing and then a longer club. Say goodbye to your slice or hook!

Vandals Damage Lakes East Course



Sometime during the evening of November 11, 2018, an off-road vehicle was driven onto the Lakes East Golf Course in Sun City. There is evidence of the vehicle driving through much of the course, mostly along the cart path, as the vehicle was too wide to fully fit onto the path. After reaching the 14th hole, this person drove then off the path and used the vehicle to do "donuts" in the rough area to the right of hole 14.

The damage covers a wide area and has been repaired as well as it can be for this time of year. Since the area damaged is in dormant bermuda, the damage will remain visible throughout the winter

months and into early summer. We will be able to regrow this area, once the bermuda grass is active. Until then, the area will be considered "ground under repair" and relief may be taken by golfers should their ball come to rest within the damaged area.

Anyone with information regarding this incident should contact the Maricopa County Sheriff's Office (referencing Incident Report #18-033393) or the RCSC Corporate Office at 623-561-4600. Damage such as this is considered a felony criminal offense and RCSC seek prosecution and restitution to the fullest extent possible.

Management Updates

Financial Report

RCSC has ended the third quarter within its operating and capital budget year to date. All divisions: Building & Infrastructure, Golf, Food Service, Bowling, Member Services and General & Administrative have operated within their net operating budgets year to date.

Bowling

Sign-ups for the annual New Year’s Eve Bowling Party at Lakeview Lanes will begin Monday, November 5, 2018 at 9am. The party starts December 31, 2018 at 8pm with a potluck, bowling and prize drawings. The night will end with a champagne toast to the New Year. Everyone is welcome to the event even if you are not a bowler. Stop by Lakeview Lanes or Bell Lanes to reserve your spot as availability is limited.

Lakeview Lanes and Bell Lanes recently changed TV providers from DirecTV to DISH. DISH offered a lower price, free installation and upgrade to high definition. Bowlers will now have access to three different channels for sports viewing during their league play.

Bell Lanes will be hosting the Metro Phoenix Senior Ladies tournament over the weekend of November 17, 2018. Lakeview Lanes will host the Sun City Bowling Association tournament on November 10, 2018.

Cardholder Services

Payments on past due assessments in September were 10.3% of past due balances. Overall accounts receivables increased in September by 7.8%. This increase is most affected by a significant increase in the current receivables category that increased by 43% this month. August assessments went 30 days past due at a 5.9% rate and July assessments went 60 days past due at a 3.3% rate. Payments from our third-party collections firm totaled \$11,116 in September. Year to date payments through our third-party collections firm total \$140,038. Payments made in September by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal totaled \$95,250 from 220 property owners. Year to date web portal payments total \$1,078,288 from 2,357 property owners.

In September, property transfer balances increased by 6.6% and lender related balances fell to \$0 for the first time since tracking this statistic which began in 2013. Outstanding balances related to property transfers continue to represent 55% of all receivables and 56% of past due balances. At the end of September trustee sale notices on Sun City properties ended at 35 and properties owned by lending institutions down to three.

Human Resources

We have completed the fall series of CPR, AED and First Aid training with 15 employees receiving certification bringing the annual total to 47. This completes the third

year of training with a total of 176 certifications being issued.

We have received renewal rates for the employee benefits program from our various insurance carriers and can now proceed with the renewal process including preparation of related documents including revisions to the employee benefits manual.

Several of RCSC’s benefit providers have installed new or upgraded customer portals to their websites. Human Resources staff recently trained on those portals for medical, unemployment, workers compensation and the flexible benefits programs. The new systems provide the benefit of more available data, while requiring additional data input from human resources staff.

Member Services

The Strait Country concert at the Sun Bowl on September 30 was unfortunately cancelled one hour prior to starting time due to a storm that developed. We promise that they will be back for another performance and we will let you know when once they are rescheduled.

We continued to battle the weather the remainder of the month, with Thaddeus Rose, Faded Jeans and Furious George shows all moved to Sundial due to rain. These performances were all outstanding and we intend to bring them back to the Sun Bowl.

Be sure to join us in November, hopefully at the Sun Bowl, for the final two shows of the season. On Sunday, November 4 we welcome ’56 Rock and Roll and on Sunday November 11 we pay tribute to all our veterans with a very special performance by the Ahwatukee Foothills Concert Band and the Ahwatukee Children’s Theatre. Both performances begin at 6pm and food trucks will be on site for your dining pleasure.

Be sure to get your Season Tickets for the 2019 Sundial Tickets Series. Season tickets go on sale Thursday, November 1 at 8:30am. For more details see our website at www.suncityaz.org.

Don’t forget the annual Fall Arts and Craft Festival at the Sundial Auditorium on Friday, November 23 from 8am to 4pm and Saturday, November 24 from 8am to 3pm. Project Updates

Building and Infrastructure

Grand Avenue

- The Plan of Development (POD) submission has been completed with Maricopa County. This is a high-level review of the site usage plan including building placement, grading and drainage. This multi-month process is required, and approval is a pre-requisite for the development of the site. Additionally, this process is separate from the building permit process and is required before permit issuance.

Lakeview Center

- Work has begun on the renovation of the Lakeview Center Fitness Restrooms. This work includes a complete demolition of the current restrooms and shower room fixtures, and a rebuild based upon a redesigned layout. Currently all demolition has been completed. Work started on October 15 and is projected for 9 weeks to complete. Contractors are: Valley Architecture, KAW Construction, Spray Systems, 1-800 Cooling and Supercharged Electric (Cost – \$219,133).
- Due to the timing of the start of the restroom renovations, the renovation of the upstairs restrooms at Lakeview Center will not be completed until 2019.

South Golf Course

- Work progress to date includes: Ground grading and pad build is complete, footers have been poured, stem walls are approximately 75% complete, and plumbing rough-in is approximately 95% complete. Floor slab is scheduled for placement on October 26, 2018 barring any rain or other delays.

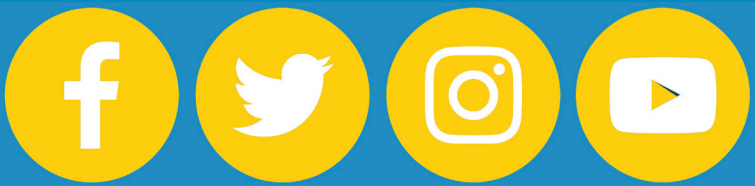
Sundial Center

- The work to repair concrete curbing and replace the turf carpeting throughout the mini golf course was postponed earlier this month due to inclement weather. The concrete repair was completed on October 5 and turf carpeting began on October 23. The work is anticipated to be completed with the Mini Golf course open as of October 29 provided there are no additional weather delays. Contractors are DFG Construction and Baker Brothers (Cost – \$24,604).
- The mirror was removed, and paint touched up in the Hatha Yoga room. Contractors were Jororan and Exquisite Painting (Cost – \$926).

Just Library Facts, Ma'am

According to *Library Outsourcing*:

- The world's oldest continuous running library is St. Catherine's Monastery in the Sinai, Egypt. It was built in the middle of the sixth century.
- The world's largest library is the Library of Congress, with more than 158 million items on approximately 838 miles of bookshelves.
- The world's smallest library is in New York City. It has space for one reader, houses 40 books, and is built using recycled materials.
- The world's highest library is on the 60th floor of the JW Marriott Hotel at Tomorrow Square in Shanghai, China, 757.5 feet above street level, or 1,435 steps if taking the stairs.
- The first recorded librarian was Zenodotus of Ephesus. He could be considered the library originator, although this distinction should also belong to the first and second king of the Ptolemaic period, 320 BCE to 30 BC.
- The first library classification system was established during the Han Dynasty, 206 BC to AD 220.
- The first bookmobile operated in a circle of eight British villages in Cumbria in 1857 "to diffuse good literature among the rural population" (British Workman)
- The world's largest fine for an overdue book is \$345.14, two cents a day for the poetry book *Days and Deeds* checked out of Kewanee Public Library, Illinois in April, 1955. Due back April 19, 1955, Emily Canellos-Simms found it in her mother's house 47 years later and paid the full fine.
- The most stolen library book is probably the Bible, followed by the Guinness World Records book.



According to the Sun City Libraries and the Friends of the Sun City Libraries, Inc.:

- The hub for the Books by Mail Service of the Maricopa County Library District is in Sun City. MCLD sends large print books to visually impaired and/or homebound County residents, but not DVDs or audiobooks. This postage-free service is for individuals that are homebound and unable to visit their library in person, and are unable to read normal print comfortably for a sustained amount of time.
- A Book Buddy from the Friends will deliver any library material to the door of any Sun City resident who cannot get to either Library.
- All MCLD libraries have Wi-Fi, available even without a library card.
- The Libraries do not take donated books, but the Friends of the Sun City Libraries do. The Friends also take magazines, CDs, DVDs, and puzzles. Proceeds go to Libraries. Bring donated items to Books Around the Corner at the Sun City Library.
- The Library District offers more than 5,000 programs each year. Check out the Sun City or Fairway ones at mclnaz.org by browsing the calendar or getting event emails.
- A seed library and American Flag disposal box are available at the Sun City Library.
- The County Recorder Kiosk at the Sun City Library will save a trip to Phoenix.
- Gale courses are available at mclnaz.org. Go to "learn; then go to Gale Courses." Choose from over 300 professionally-led online classes.
- RB Digital is available at mclnaz.org. Over 400 magazines can be read for no cost.



Water Conservation

We Really Do Need Water; Don't Waste It!

While we typically give tips about water conservation in this column, this one is actually addressing our physical consumption of water. While eight 8-ounces glasses of water a day is easy to remember, there is no single formula that fits everyone.

Water is the body's main chemical component and makes up 60% of our body weight. Every cell tissue and organ needs water to work properly, which includes:

- Getting rid of waste through urination, perspiration and bowel movements
- Keeping your temperature normal
- Lubricating and cushioning joints
- Protecting sensitive tissues



While bottled water may be convenient, the costs are high -- both literally and figuratively. Consider the benefits of drinking tap water instead.

- Tap water is far less expensive than bottled water and reduces waste in the environment.
- Use a reusable water bottle to eliminate hundreds (if not thousands) of disposable bottles. Of the 6 million pounds of plastics bottle that are thrown away year, only 30% of them are recycled. Of that 30%, only one-fifth is processed to create fresh bottle for food and/or beverage use.
- Make your tap water taste better by drinking it cold, filtering it (kitchen faucet, refrigerator or pitcher filter). Try adding lemons, limes or cucumber slices. You may also leave a pitcher of water sit overnight to allow the chlorine to evaporate.

Water -- we really do need it. But we really don't need to waste it!

Tips from Get Fit for Life -

Setting Goals for Fitness

“Goal setting is an important tool for active adults, if they want to improve health and fitness,” states Jane Fortier, fitness professional with Get Fit for Life. “Goals should be the target toward which all efforts are directed. Goals add a dimension of excitement and a sense of purpose to any fitness program.”

There are several components to effective goal setting. First, goals need to be realistic – this will lead to success, rather than burnout or injury. Establishing a goal to lose 30 lbs in a month or walk 25,000 steps in a day, could easily result in disappointment. A person may have the best of intentions, but without smart goals, and an appropriate plan to reach those goals, willpower weakens and failure follows. Goals need to be challenging, but within the realm of possibilities, given one’s fitness and experience level.



All goals need to be written. This action takes them from the subconscious to the conscious. Writing goals affirms their existence. It makes them tangible. Written goals should be posted, to be seen and read daily. This practice gives direction to the day, and keeps one on course. Whether it’s losing pounds & inches or building muscle & strength, daily affirmation of goals is critical. In addition, share goals with people who are close and supportive, that inner circle who can be trusted.

It’s wise to define a progressive set of fitness goals that build on one another – this sort of planning will propel you toward the bigger aspiration. Establish Short-Term goals and Long-Term goals – this helps mentally and physically. Short-Term might cover a 4-6 week span. If body composition is a concern, goals might include total pounds, inches and body fat lost. If workout design is paramount, goals might address duration, frequency and heartrate with cardio work; or total weight, number of sets, and repetition cadence for strength training. If controlling food intake is the topic of concern, goals might refer to calories eaten, balance of macronutrients, and size of portion. Once the term for these initial goals is over, a new set of Short-Term goals should be established. Long-Term goals look to the future, perhaps 6-12 months away. These goals might involve an activity or lifestyle change that would never have been possible, without meeting progressive Short-Term goals: running/walking a 10K race, hiking the Grand Canyon, losing 50 pounds, getting off diabetes/ blood pressure medication, getting into a 40 year-old wedding dress.

Once goals are established, a Plan of Action is in order. This is where the “rubber meets the road.” Action determines success. Charting a Plan of Action, with specific accountability, improves success. If food is the focus: keep a daily journal of what’s eaten, log grams for each macronutrient (carbohydrates, fats, protein), determining if their intake for the day is proportionately correct, read food labels, shop the outside aisles of the grocery store, clear bad foods out of the house. When exercise is the emphasis: create progress charts, log workout times and activities, record time spent on cardio, strength training and stretching, find a workout buddy to meet consistently at the gym, use a trainer to lend variety and effectiveness to your workouts. Accountability is crucial to the success of any Plan of Action. A diligently designed and executed Plan of Action yields positive results.

Goal setting skills are valuable and beneficial in all areas of life, especially health and fitness. Staying physically fit is not an option, but a necessity, for aging adults. If you need help in establishing fitness goals, contact a Get Fit for Life personal trainer at 623-696-6820. 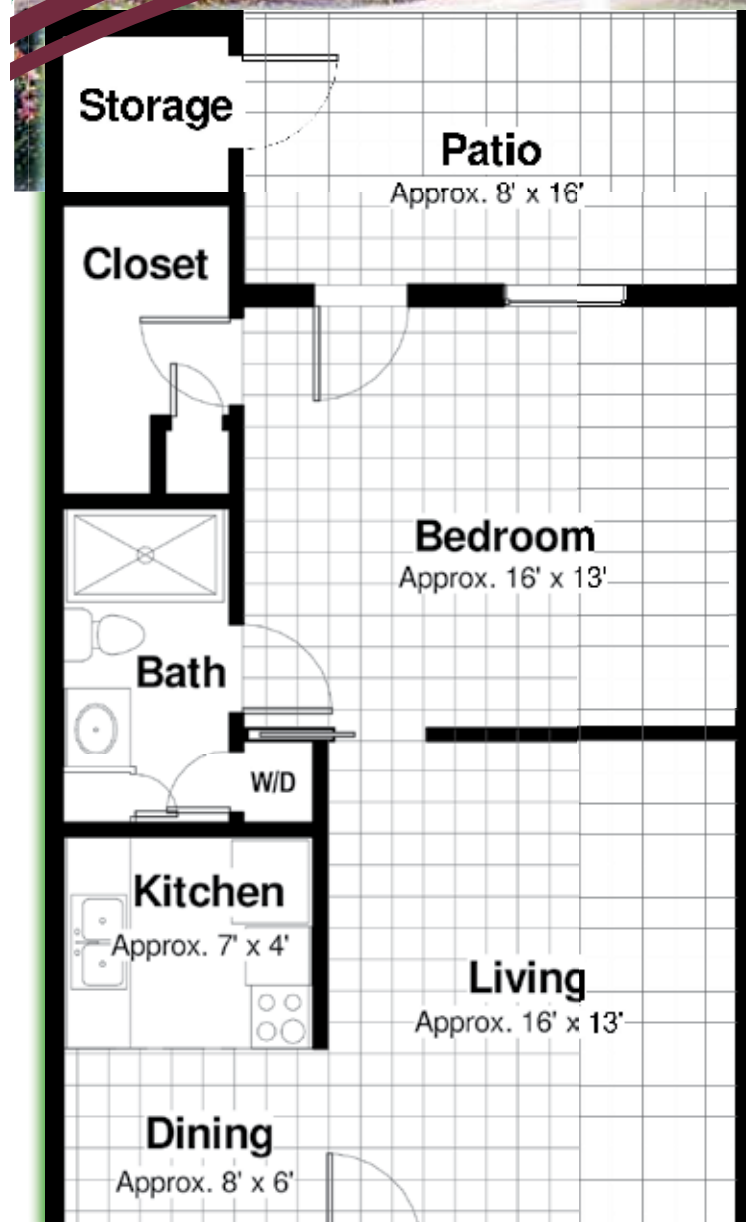

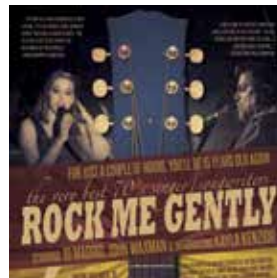
