RCSC Board of Directors Electio

The RCSC Board of Directors election results are in. The total number of ballots cast in this year's election totaled 2,092 (204 absentee ballots, 302 ballots at the poll and 1,586 electronic ballots cast online).

The successful candidates elected to serve on the RCSC Board beginning in 2019 are:

- Rich Hoffer who received 1,049 votes,
- · Diana Graettinger who received 872 votes, and
- · Michael Kennedy who received 853 votes.

RCSC Directors are elected to serve three-year terms. The newly elected Board Members were installed on Thursday, December 20, 2018 at the regular Board meeting in the Sundial Auditorium.

The vacancy that will be created as of January 1, 2019 when the resignation of Director David Wieland takes effect will be filled by appointment once the new Board of Directors is seated in early January.

Congratulations to the winners and thanks to all of the candidates for their willingness to serve the community. Outgoing Board Members were Jerry Walczak and Bruce Alleman who completed their terms of service on the Board on December 31. Rich Hoffer was actively seated on the Board in 2018, completing a vacancy created by another resignation earlier this year.

Voter turnout was much improved over previous years and the total number of ballots cast in this year's election represents almost 900 more ballots than last year.

While you're out and about enjoying all that RCSC has to offer, please be aware of the following items which require Cardholder attention when using any of the recreational facilities:

- All RCSC Cardholders are required to check in with their Member or Privilege Cards (key fobs accepted for entry to fitness, pools and spas; not concerts or free events)
- Neither Sun City AZ residents nor spouses of RCSC Cardholders are eligible to be guests. With proper documentation, privilege cards may be purchased at the Cardholder Services Office at Lakeview Center in order to use the facilities.
- Host punch cards are purchased by and belong to the Cardholder, not the guest. Host punch cards can be purchased at RCSC Facility Attendent Stations (exact cash or check only), Cardholder Services at Lakeview, RCSC Bowling Centers.
- Guests may be requested to show government-issued photo ID when checking in to use RCSC facilities.
- Proof of age for 4 and 5 year olds (birth certificate or passport) is required for access to swimming pools. Photo copies or electronic images are acceptable.
- Free concerts and events are paid for by RCSC Cardholders and are intended for RCSC Cardholders and their escorted guests only.
- Always be prepared to show your RCSC Member or Privilege card (with photo) when attending concerts and events. Key fobs are not accepted for entry.

Golf & Grounds Report

Pro Shops

On December 13 we will be hosting a fundraising tournament to raise money for the Sun City Foundation. The format will be Beat the Pro(s), which will be Brian Duthu (PGA) and Chris Linam (Pro Shop Manager) and will be made up of two person teams. The event was originally advertised as a Best Ball event, however after consideration we will be playing a scramble format instead. The entry fee will be \$40 and the event will be held at Willowcreek Golf Course. In addition to bragging rights for beating the pro, there will also be a chance at a Pebble Beach Vacation.

In addition to our charity event, RCSC Pro Shops and Snack Shops are also selling Duck Bucks to raise funds for the Sun City Foundation. The purchase of a Duck Buck enters you in the Duck Race held on December 14 as part of the Winter Celebration event, held at the Lakeview Center. The ducks are released from the waterfall and race to the finish line. If your duck finishes in the top 3 you win a share of the pot, based on the number of ducks racing. There are two separate races held on December 14, so don't be left without a duck in the race. In addition to the duck race there are other fun events held on the 14th, such as a pie walk, a mini golf hole-in-one contest and a money tree. The evening ends with a lighted boat parade.

We currently have 20 active volunteer rangers, 12–15 of which are very active in the program. Anyone interested in volunteering for the program can contact Chris Linam at 623-876-8419. We are currently considering recent suggestions, made to the Golf Advisory Committee, to enhance participation.

Snack Shops

Through October, snack shops have exceeded both prior year and budget. Snack shops are now operating under winter hours and remain open until 5:00pm, except in the rare cases of significant inclement weather. We respectfully remind everyone that all food and beverage consumed in the snack shops or adjacent patios must have been purchased through the snack shops.

Golf Courses

As play increases, so does the stress on our courses. We remind golfers that we all have a responsibility to keep our courses in good condition. Golfers can assist by filling their divots, raking sand traps, replacing rakes in bunkers parallel to play and repairing ball marks. During times of cart path restrictions, please remember to take your sand bottle to the fairway.

Willowcreek/Willowbrook reopened on November 10 following the renovation. Both courses received new irrigation systems (including new pump stations on each course) and perimeter turf reduction. The perimeters of each course were planted with plants from the Arizona Department of Water Resources low water use plants. Additionally, all 18 greens on Willowcreek plus practice putting greens around the clubhouse were renovated. The greens were sprigged using tiff dwarf bermuda, the same as North and Riverview. As the greens are new, golfers can expect hard surfaces for the next 18 to 24 months. The greens were not overseeded this year to protect the newly planted grass from the rigors of overseeding, as such golfers can expect green speeds to increase throughout the winter months. Once the greens are actively growing we will be able to control greens speeds.

Grounds/Lawn Bowling

The US Open for Lawn Bowling was held November 5 through November 11, in Sun City AZ, Sun City West and Sun City Grand. In all, 336 bowlers from 12 countries participated. Sun City AZ

Tips from a Pro

Dont' Forget the Importance of A Good Grip

The grip is a crucial part of our golf set-up. The grip has four components including positioning, placement, precision, and pressure and controls everything from direction to distance to contact.

- 1. Positioning means the way we have our hands rotated either right of left of the center of the grip. For a right-handed player, turning both hands slightly to the right of center so that two knuckles of the left hand are showing is considered neutral. A turn slightly more to the right where three knuckles would show is considered strong. From center if we turn slightly to the left so that one knuckle shows the grip is weak. A half-inch turn in the wrong direction can be enough to produce a 30-yard hook or slice!
- 2. Placement means how far up or down on the handle the hands are placed. Choking up or down changes the effective length of the club and therefore changes the distance the ball will go. For each inch you choke down 10 yards of distance will be lost.
- 3. Precision simply means placing the hands in the exact same way each time. Consistency in your shots can only be attained if the grip is done identical every time.
- 4. Pressure refers to how light or firm you hold the club. Most golfers grip the club much too tight. This leads to a variety of problems including topped shots, lack of distance and slicing the ball. Practice holding the club with a light grip and the difference can be amazing!











Remember - Because the only contact we have with the club is through the grip, and it affects every part of how we hit the golf ball, work to make it consistent and your game will improve!



- 3) Do not pull up, twist or lift with the tool.
- Push both sides of the ball mark into the center.
- 5) Gently tap the surface down with putter.6) Never use loosened turf for repair.

WRONG!

Pulling up or lifting on the center or the sides will tear the roots and result in brown spots taking weeks for the surface to heal.





RIGHT!

Insert tool and push back and sides forward to center. No damage to root system. Healing starts immediately.

Management Updates

Financial Report

RCSC has ended October 2018 within its operating and capital budget year to date. All divisions: Building & Infrastructure, Golf, Food Service, Bowling, Member Services and General & Administrative have operated within their net operating budgets year to date.

Bowling

On the weekends of October 21 and October 27, Lakeview Lanes and Bell Lanes hosted the Arizona State USBC Senior Championship tournament. The scores were outstanding with ten bowlers posting 300 games. The tournament produced approximately \$9k in unbudgeted income. The weekend of November 17, Bell Lanes hosted the Maricopa County Senior Women's tournament which was well attended. This tournament was also not confirmed prior to approval of the 2018 budget.

Cardholder Services

Payments on past due assessments in October were 12.5% of past due balances. Overall accounts receivables decreased in October by 8.8%. This decrease is most affected by a reduction in the current receivables category of 36% this month while the Over 30 days category increased just 1.1%. The current receivables decrease is the result of increased payments rather than unpaid invoice aging. The October ending total receivables balance was the lowest since February 2013. September assessments went 30 days past due at a 5.6% rate and August assessments went 60 days past due at a 3.6% rate.

Payments from our third-party collections firm totaled \$8,368 in October. Year to date payments through our third-party collections firm total \$148,406. Payments made in October by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal totaled \$104,494 from 238 property owners. Year to date Web Portal payments total \$1,182,782 from 2,577 property owners.

In October property transfer balances decreased by 8.5% and lender related balances remained at \$0 for the second straight month. Outstanding balances related to property transfers continue to represent 55% of all receivables and 56% of past due balances. At the end of October trustee sale notices on Sun City AZ properties ended at 41 and properties owned by lending institutions remained at three.

Human Resources

We have renewed contracts for the employee benefits program with our current insurance carriers for medical, dental, life, and short- and long-term disability plans. The 2019 Benefits Plan booklet has been revised and distributed to full time employees during open enrollments meetings which were held on November 8-9 with 147 employees attending. Human Resources is now assisting

employees with any benefit changes they wish to make for 2019.

Since November 1, ten new hires have been added to staff filling vacant greens worker, custodial and facilities attendant positions. There were many internal transfers during the same period of time.

The U.S. Department of Labor has selected RCSC to participate in a confidential survey conducted by the Bureau of Labor Statistics who will use the information provided for statistical purposes only and the end result will be used to provide a Job Openings and Labor Turnover Report for Maricopa County. Responses are strictly confidential and will not be disclosed in any identifiable form. We are required to provide monthly reports for the next six months. Required information includes: number of full-time and part-time employees who received pay on the 12th of the month; job openings on the last business day of the month; hires and recalls for the entire month; guits for the entire month; layoffs, discharges, terminations for the entire month; and other retirements, transfers, employee disability and deaths for the entire month.

Member Services

On Sunday, November 4 we welcomed 56' Rock and Roll to the Sun Bowl Amphitheatre! It was so nice that the Arizona weather allowed us this concert under the stars!

On Sunday, November 11, the Ahwatukee Foothills Concert Band and the Ahwatukee Children's Theatre put on an exceptional performance as we paid tribute to our Veterans. The Children's Theatre group worked continuously with the Concert Band to learn a variety of patriotic songs and the meanings behind them.

Be sure to join us on Tuesday, December 11 at the Sundial Auditorium for the annual Christmas Spectacular! Complimentary hot cocoa and hot apple cider will be available prior to the show. Please present your photo RCSC membership card for admission to this free event.

The final RCSC hosted event in 2018 is on Friday, December 14 from 3pm–6:30pm. Join us at Lakeview Recreation Center for the annual Sun City AZ Holiday Celebration. There will be two duck races, the hole-inone contest, pie walk, money tree, hot cocoa and coffee for a dollar and free cake. Finish the evening by watching the infamous lighted boat parade. Proceeds from this event benefit the Sun City Foundation.

Building and Infrastructure

Grand Ave

• The Plan of Development (POD) submission is still under review with Maricopa County. Engineers have begun working with ADOT for the planned deceleration lane addition off Grand Ave. Architectural drawings are 80% complete with a round of changes to lighting design being incorporated, as well as design of the greenhouse space being worked on. Displays showing the floor and site plans for this property are at the rear of the room to show the utilization of this space. These will be on display at future Board Meetings and Board/Member Exchanges.

Lakeview Center

Work continues on the renovation of the Lakeview Center Fitness Restrooms.
 To date all walls are framed up and plumbing has been roughed in, including replacement of under slab deteriorated cast iron pipes with ABS pipe.
 Electrical has been roughed in as well. Contractors are: Valley Architecture, KAW Construction, Spray Systems, 1-800 Cooling and Supercharged Electric (Cost-\$219,133).

Marinette Center

• The west parking lot was closed on November 19 and 20 to be seal coated and restriped. As part of this work, two additional handicap spaces were created out of three regular spaces. Contractor was Ace Asphalt (Cost-\$6,275).


South Golf Course

Water Conservation

Make the Dishwasher Your Water-Saving Friend

Many of us think that hand washing the few dishes and glasses we use each day uses less water than the dishwasher. Truth is that newer dishwashers use only three to 10 gallons of water per cycle. So just let the machine do the "dirty" work.

We'll repeat it – Scrape, Don't Rinse. Scrape, Don't Rinse. Modern dishwashers do a fantastic job cleaning heavily soiled dishes. Simply scrape off any food and empty liquids and let the dishwasher do its thing. If you're not able to break the habit and must pre-rinse, at least use cold water. Many newer models also have rinse and hold cycles which use less was that doing the job manually.



When loading the dishwasher, fill the racks to optimize water and energy use but allow for proper water circulation. Wash only full loads when possible and select the cycle that uses the least amount of energy. Use the rinse and hold cycle mentioned above if it takes several days for you to get a full load.

Try using the no-heat air-dry feature if your dishwasher has one. If you've got an older model, turn off the dishwasher after the final rinse is complete and open the door to allow drying. If spotting occurs, you could dry the dishes by hand (aka the old fashioned way).

Three members of the club proved that again recently by earning medals at the 2018 USA Pickleball Association National Championships which concluded November 11 in Indian Wells, CA.

Michelle Orton and Doug White (shown at right) teamed to placed third for the bronze medal in the mixed doubles 70-74 age group at the 3.0 skill level.



Jane Powell (shown at left on right) of the Sun City club teamed with Florida's Julie Martens to place second and take a silver medal in the women's doubles 65-69 age group at the 3.5 skill level. Powell was also fourth in women's singles at 65-69 at the 3.5 skill level.



The USA Pickleball Association National Championships ran for eight days and hosted 2,300 athletes, ages 8 to 90, from 46 states, with many matches streamed on ESPN3. The professional players split \$75,000, the largest prize-money purse in the sport's history. The tournament was held on 45 courts at the Tennis Garden, the same site for the BNP Paribas Open, the largest combined ATP and WTA tennis tournament in the world, March 6-17, 2019.

This court-and-paddle sport has similarities to tennis, badminton, racquetball and table tennis, and has been around since 1965 (but has gained popularity the past 15 years, now with approximately 2.8 million players in the United States).

The Sun City Pickleball Club has 20 courts (eight covered) at Marinette and seven at Mountain View. Chartered in 2003, SCPC now has approximately 550 members. Annual dues are \$20. The club's next major tournament, a Super Senior International Pickleball Association event, attracting top players from the region, will be held January 29-31 at Marinette. 




Bell Stitchers

People, meeting needs of people is what Sunshine Service is all about. Sunshine Service lends medical and children's equipment to residents of Sun City and we have been doing so for over 54 years. We are a charitable non-profit Arizona corporation and are funded by voluntary contributions and memorial gifts.

While the equipment is available for the use of all residents or visitors staying with residents, the equipment must not be taken out of Sun City on a permanent basis. As a matter of control, equipment is loaned only to Sun City residents.

Records show that as the population of Sun City grew, so did use of our medical equipment. Savings for Sun City residents have been calculated periodically; in 2015, it was estimated that residents saved over two million dollars in cost of equipment for that year alone.



Sunshine Service, Inc has received local, state and national recognition. Awards received include the George Washington Honor Medal for services to the sick and handicapped from the Freedoms Foundation of Valley Forge in Pennsylvania.
