Two Board Meetings Start This Month

The RCSC Board of Directors will begin conducting two Board Meetings each month starting in April and both will be in an openmeeting format. The Board will no longer be meeting with management in closed-door work sessions. The opportunity for Board/ Member exchange will be available at each Board meeting.

These Board meetings will normally be held on the second Monday and last Thursday each month, all of which will be in the Sundial Auditorium at 9am (except in July and August). The meetings will be video recorded and available on RCSC's YouTube channel. There will no longer be any evening board meetings.

Meeting agendas will look similar and will continue to be emailed in advance to those signed up to receive RCSC News Email Alerts. They will also be posted on the RCSC website at www.suncityaz. org for your convenience. Agendas will include items for board action or approval and motions to be considered on second and third readings.

It is anticipated that these open meetings will allow for more input from members regarding motions under consideration and various discussion items in addition to miscellaneous issues of individual concern.

Under this new meeting format, the treasurer's report and management reports will no longer be read aloud during the meetings. Any concerns the Board might have regarding reports meeting.

Please keep the following in mind!

While you're out and about enjoying all that RCSC has to offer, please be aware of the following items which require Cardholder attention when using any of the recreational facilities:

- All RCSC Cardholders are required to check in with their Member or Privilege Cards (key fobs accepted for entry to fitness, pools and spas; not concerts or free events)
- Neither Sun City AZ residents nor spouses of RCSC Cardholders are eligible to be guests. With proper documentation, privilege cards may be purchased at the Cardholder Services Office at Lakeview Center in order to use the facilities.
- Host punch cards are purchased by and belong to the Cardholder, not the guest. Host punch cards can be purchased at RCSC Facility Attendent Stations (exact cash or check only), Cardholder Services at Lakeview, RCSC Bowling Centers.

- Guests may be requested to show government-issued photo ID when checking in to use RCSC facilities.
- Proof of age for 4 and 5 year olds (birth certificate or passport) is required for access to swimming pools. Photo copies or electronic images are acceptable.
- Free concerts and events are paid for by RCSC Cardholders and are intended for RCSC Cardholders and their escorted guests only.
- Always be prepared to show your RCSC Member or Privilege card (with photo) when attending concerts and events. Key fobs are not accepted for entry.

Golf & Grounds Report

Pro Shops

Get Golf Ready classes still have openings for March and April classes. Get Golf Ready classes are taught by PGA and LPGA professionals and are geared towards students wishing to learn the game or by students reentering the game. For \$99, each student receives a series of four group classes, with enrollment capped at 8 students. Also included is a 9 hole playing lesson with the instructor. In addition to swing fundamentals, students are exposed to course courtesy and etiquette.

Snack Shops

Snack Shops are scheduled to close at 5pm, however, as we move into longer daylight hours, closing times may be extended based on demand. Hours may be adjusted during periods of inclement weather.

Golf Courses

The overseed and aerification schedule presented to the Golf Advisory Committee and the various Green Committees has been finalized and is posted on the RCSC website. The only real change to previous years is the scheduling of three days for greens aerification on the 18-hole courses and two days for Quail Run. The additional day will provide a buffer to allow for equipment issues as well as additional time for top dressing.

As we move into spring we can expect an increase in golf rounds, and with increased rounds comes increased wear and tear. As temperatures warm throughout the spring, this wear and tear will heal faster; however, we still need golfer support. We ask everyone to please fill your divots and fix your ball marks. With increased play, slow play instances become more likely. We ask everyone to please practice ready golf by: playing your shot as soon as possible when it doesn't interfere with your playing partners or the group ahead; move to your ball whenever it is safe to do so; avoid excessive practice swings; read your putt ahead of your turn; and, record scores on the following tee box. Leaving the pin in to putt is also a great way to speed up play, particularly if the entire group agrees to leave the pin in.

As we move into spring and temperatures increase, we will begin preparing the courses to transition from winter rye to summer bermuda. The first step in this process is a gradual reduction in cutting heights, particularly in fairways and around green complexes. The process of lowering heights of cuts opens up the grass canopy to allow more sunlight to reach the bermuda grass as it comes out of dormancy. The additional sunlight gives the bermuda grass a better chance of competing against the established rye grass. There is nothing we can do that will completely eliminate transition related issues, lowering mowing heights promotes quicker recovery during the summer months.

Grounds/Lawn Bowling

Green speeds are slower than normal for this time of year due in great part to the amount of rain we have received. Our normal irrigation schedule this time of year is once every two weeks and if moisture readings dictate that irrigation is needed. Though mostly dormant, the greens have retained some color and are growing slowly. Mowing is on an as-needed basis and rolling occurs three times per week.

We have recently welcomed Derek Wilkerson as Grounds Superintendent. We are excited for the amount of experience and expertise he brings to the position. The excessive rains have increased weed pressure at all centers. We continue to remove weeds both chemically and mechanically and will continue to do so until we have achieved eradication.


Tips from a Pro

Limit Your "Thinking" During Play

For many golfers, the mental side of the game of golf can be more challenging than the physical. There is so much information out there regarding the golf swing. We are bombarded with advice from golf videos, books, and articles in golf magazines - not to mention the advice we get from our golfing companions! All this information tends to put our brains on overload. Trying to play the game while our brains are on overload ultimately can lead to stress, frustration, poor shots and can take the fun out of playing!

Playing golf should be just that...play. In other words, when on the course play the "game of golf," don't play "golf swing." This means limiting thinking on the course to strategy, alignment, club selection, scoring, etiquette and rules. Isn't that enough?

If you are having trouble with the swing, address those issues during practice, not during play. Nothing can be changed or fixed in the middle of a round of golf anyway. If you are having trouble during the round, try to make it better by taking clubs that are more forgiving, shorter and with more loft. Try to relax and don't force anything. The more we relax, the more the club can do the work.



Remember playing golf should be fun! Instead of overloading your brain with a lot of mechanical thoughts while on the course - KEEP IT SIMPLE. It will be much easier, work a whole lot better and be much more fun!

DO NOT TWIST OR LIFT SOIL

Only YOU can prevent ball mark damage!

RIGHT!

- Close the gap/hole with putter by patting down the ball mark.
- Insert Green-Save tool on the high side behind ball mark and push the back toward the center.
- 3) Do not pull up, twist or lift with the tool.
- Push both sides of the ball mark into the center.
- 5) Gently tap the surface down with putter.
- Never use loosened turf for repair.

WRONG!

Pulling up or lifting on the center or the sides will tear the roots and result in brown spots taking weeks for the surface to heal.

Do not pull up or twist with tool. This will only bring sand to the surface and tear the root system



RIGHT!

Insert tool and push back and sides forward to center. No damage to root system. Healing starts immediately.

Changes Likely to Be Beneficial for Many

With the approval of RCSC Bylaws changes at the end of March, the RCSC Board of Directors will begin having two Board Meeting each month starting in April (with the exception of July and August). My intent here is to help you understand what these upcoming changes mean for Members and how you'll be able to participate in these meetings. There will no longer be Board/Member Exchanges and the Board will no longer have closed-door work sessions.

The agenda will look similar with some minor changes. As has been practice in the past, the agenda will continue to be posted on the RCSC website a week in advance of the meetings as well as emailed to interested Cardholders. It will include items for Board action or approval, motions to be considered on 2nd and 3rd readings with which Members will have the opportunity to address the Board with each reading of a motion. There will also be an item at the end of the agenda entitled "Member Comments," where you may address the Board with your thoughts and concerns.

The Treasurer's Report and Management Reports will be provided in written form only and will no longer be read aloud. Each report will still be approved by board action and any questions or concerns about report content will be addressed by the Board. These reports will continue to be posted on the RCSC website.

The initial action by the Board may result in a motion. If the motion passes, it will be posted on the agenda for the next Board Meeting for a 2nd reading and, if passed, it will then be

on the following Board Meeting agenda for a 3rd reading and final approval in order to go into effect. At both the 2nd and 3rd readings, Members will have the opportunity to sign up to speak regarding the motion. Thus, Members may have at least two opportunities to speak regarding a motion before the Board votes to approve and the motion becomes final.

Management Updates

Financial Report

The Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. (RCSC) has ended January 2019 within its operating and capital budget year to date. Every division has met or exceeded its net operating budget projections year-to-date.

Cardholder Services

Payments on past due assessments in January were 10.6% of past due balances. Overall accounts receivable increased in January by 4.5%. All past due categories decreased in January with the account receivables increasing this month due to the Current category increase. December assessments went 30 days past due at 5.3% rate and November assessments went 60 days past due at a lower 2.9% rate.

Payments from our third-party collections firm started slow compared to the past two years and totaled \$9,147 in January. Payments made in January by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal totaled \$128,657 from 290 property owners.

In January, property transfer balances increased by almost 12% and lender related balances tripled due to the small number of properties. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent 57% of all receivables and 53% of past due balances. At the end of January, trustee sale notices on Sun City AZ properties ended at 37 and properties owned by lending institutions increased to five.

Human Resources

The OSHA Form 300A Summary of Work-Related Injuries and Illnesses for calendar year 2018 has been posted as required. This summary is to remain posted through April. The summary shows we had 21 work related injuries with 12 of them having days away from work totaling 172 days.

We have completed Non-Discrimination Testing for RCSC's Employees 401(k) Plan for the 2018 calendar year. The Plan passed all six tests. A summary of test results show there were 469 employees eligible to defer, however, 124 actually deferred for a 1.73% participation rate. Our next step is to complete the Form 5500 and file with the Department of Labor.



Project Updates

Building and Infrastructure:

Flag Poles

The three flag poles at 107th Ave and Grand Ave are scheduled for repainting.
 These flag poles are showing the wear of time. RCSC also supplies the flags that fly on these poles. Contractor: Exquisite Painting (Cost – \$3,840).

Grand Ave

 Initial comments have been received from Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) regarding the permit application for the deceleration lane. These comments are with the architect and civil engineering firm for review and response.
 To date, no response on the site development building permit with Maricopa County have been received.

Lakeview Center

 Final work on pending items in the Lakeview Fitness Restrooms are scheduled to be completed by March 1st. Changes to the permit approved for the project were necessary for the final inspection to be scheduled. This is expected by March 1st as well. The restrooms will be available for use upon the final inspection approval and receipt of the certificate of occupancy. Contractors are: Valley Architecture, KAW Construction, and Spray Systems (Cost – \$232,495).

Riverview Golf Course

 The chain link fence along the 5th and 6th holes at the Riverview Golf Course was damaged in storms last year. This fence ran along the property line with the SRP property to the west. The damaged fence and vegetation were removed, and 2,500 feet of chain link fence and barbed security top was installed. Cost of the project was covered by insurance proceeds. Contractor: American Fence (Cost – \$54,711).

South Golf Course

- Work is progressing very well although the inclement weather in February
 has brought challenges for exterior work. All concrete and curbing have been
 installed. Exterior building finishes have been completed. Inclement weather
 has prevented the installation of the asphalt surrounding the building with this
 anticipated to be completed by March 1 provided the base under the asphalt can
 accommodate it.
- Interior flooring finishes are close to completion. Counters and countertops are currently being installed with the custom pro shop counters built by RCSC Skilled Trades scheduled for March 3. Installation of the Trackman Simulator began on February 25 with completion pending electrical service to the building.
- Installation of the transformer and electrical service is scheduled to be completed
 the week of March 3-8. Electrical service is in the critical path of other pending
 items such as mechanical system startup and balancing, as well as the installation
 and testing of kitchen appliances.

Sun Bowl

Painting and repairs are being completed at the Sun Bowl amphitheater. The
antiquated and damaged BBQ pits have been filled in with concrete and the
side walls of the lower bowl area painted. The yellow caution areas in the lower
concrete seating sections have been repainted and row numbers have been
added up each walkway. Contactors: KAW Construction and Exquisite Painting
(Cost – \$9,070).




Tips from Get Fit for Life -

What is Metabolism?

"Most people have a vague idea of what METABOLISM is, but don't fully understand the complexities of the metabolic process," states Jane Fortier, fitness specialist for Get Fit for Life.

Essentially, METABOLISM is what produces energy in the body. That energy becomes available to the tissues of the body to use in the following ways:

- Initiate important cellular processes
- Create building blocks that make up proteins, lipids, nucleic acids, and carbohydrates
- Assist with the elimination of nitrogenous wastes



METABOLISM is essentially the sum of all the reactions that are taking place in the body, on a day-to-day basis. It is often referred to as one's Metabolic Rate. The faster the Metabolic Rate, the faster the reactions and chemical processes take place. It stands to reason, faster is better. A fast metabolism will burn more calories, create new tissue faster, repair damaged tissue more efficiently, and carry out other necessary body processes at a quicker pace.

There are four main components of METABOLISM that will affect weight gain and level of fitness:

- 1. Resting Metabolic Rate-RMR: This is the sum total of all the reactions that take place in the body, to keep the body alive (brain functioning; blood circulating; heart beating; lungs breathing; kidneys/liver filtering correctly; tissues being repaired/replaced). RMR accounts for 60-70% of ones total METABOLISM. The most important factor that influences one's RMR level, is the total amount of muscle mass. Muscle is very metabolically active, burning a high amount of energy on a daily basis. An aging adult who wants to lose weight and become more fit, needs to develop as much healthy lean muscle tissue as possible.
- 2. Activity Level: This refers to one's level of movement, throughout the day. Exercising in the gym, recreational sports, staying busy with any type of activity burns calories, thus increasing METABOLISM. The amount of body movement, for the day, accounts for 15-30% of total METABOLISM. Logically, the more active a person is, and the more demanding each activity becomes, the higher that person's total METABOLISM will be.
- 3. Thermic Effect of Food TEF: This refers to the amount of energy used, during the process of digestion. An appropriate mix of carbohydrates, proteins and fats will account for 10-15% of total calorie burn. Foods that require the body to work harder during their digestion, will increase TEF (raw vegetables take more energy to break down than cooked vegetables; packaged & processed foods take less energy to break down than fresh or natural foods). Attention to what one eats is important, for increasing METABOLISM.
- 4. Non-Exercise Activity Thermogenesis NEAT: Essentially, these are the movements people make that are not planned, but spontaneous (pacing; jiggling feet; tapping fingers). Non-Exercise Activity Thermogenesis is a genetically influenced factor some people just can't sit still. These little movements can increase one's METABOLISM by 5-7%. The concept of NEAT seems insignificant, but it can attribute to a person's ability to stay thin.

"Developing lean muscle tissue, challenging cardio fitness, maintaining good flexibility and eating sensibly, are all components in revving-up one's METABOLISM," states Fortier. A personal trainer can help in all of these areas. Get Fit for Life trainers will custom-design workouts, taking into consideration exercise experience, medical issues, needs and goals. 
Exploring the Physical & Psychological Causes of Neck Pain

We have all experienced neck pain at one time or another; it can be quite irritating. Here we explore how and why this discomfort may have occurred. Neck pain may be caused by several different biomechanical reasons, such as sleeping in a contorted position, poor posture, muscle exhaustion, stress or injury such as impact trauma or whiplash.

The neck can also represent our barometer for self-expression and change. This is where we vocally express our feelings, thoughts, hopes and plans. Unfortunately, we are constantly being challenged as we encounter obstacles that may encourage us to make changes as we transition through life. This can be a type of mind-body conflict, which may sometimes subconsciously, commonly yield tension and stress. According to Louise L. Hay in her book "Heal Your Body: The Mental Causes for Physical Illness and The Metaphysical Way to Overcome Them," neck problems may represent refusing to see the other side of a situation or question, being stubborn or inflexible. The positive affirmation she recommends is: "It is with flexibility and ease that I see all sides of an issue. There are endless ways of doing and seeing things. I am safe." This affirmation is just an example of how we could psychologically improve our emotional perspective and reduce tension and stress.

Receiving regularly scheduled professional therapeutic massages is an excellent way to assist you in alleviating such discomfort. Unfortunately one massage session may help, it likely will not eliminate it completely. Energy Healing and Complimentary Practices focus on dealing with the root cause of a condition, rather than just the symptoms. A self-care program should be considered to promote ultimate health and wellness.

Acupressure points on the body can be manipulated to assist in rebalancing the body in the face of the pressures of modern life. Shown here are some of the acupressure points used to assist in reducing neck tension. You can use your fingers, thumbs, palms, side of hand, knuckles or a dull blunt object to relax an area or relieve pain by gradually applying firm pressure and holding without movement for one to two minutes. Use extreme caution and check with your physician if you have a serious, chronic or life-threatening illness such as heart disease, cancer or high blood pressure.






