#### Closures in Observance of Memorial Day; No Saturday Summer Hours at SCVC

#### **RCSC Cardholders:**

### Please keep the following in mind!

While you're out and about enjoying all that RCSC has to offer, please be aware of the following items which require Cardholder attention when using any of the recreational facilities:

- All RCSC Cardholders are required to check in with their Member or Privilege Cards (key fobs accepted for entry to fitness, pools and spas; not concerts or free events)
- Neither Sun City AZ residents nor spouses of RCSC Cardholders are eligible to be guests. With proper documentation and if eligible, privilege cards may be purchased at the Cardholder Services Office at Lakeview Center in order to use the facilities.
- Host punch cards are purchased by and belong to the Cardholder, not the guest. Host punch cards can be purchased at RCSC Facility Attendent Stations (exact cash or check only), Cardholder Services at Lakeview, RCSC Bowling Centers.

- Guests may be requested to show government-issued photo ID when checking in to use RCSC facilities.
- Proof of age for 4 and 5 year olds (birth certificate or passport) is required for access to swimming pools. Photo copies or electronic images are acceptable.
- Free concerts and events are paid for by RCSC Cardholders and are intended for RCSC Cardholders and their escorted guests only.
- Always be prepared to show your RCSC Member or Privilege card (with photo) when attending concerts and events. Key fobs are not accepted for entry.

- Must be available to attend Board Candidate Orientation(s).

#### **Golf & Grounds Report**

#### **Pro Shops**

A sluggish January followed by a wet and cold February have resulted in a decrease of 6,762 rounds compared to prior year. Through February, 68,550 rounds have been played, the second lowest total in the last seven years. Lakes West has recorded 10,452 rounds, followed closely by Riverview with 10,423 rounds. Lakes East has posted 7,177 rounds, followed by Willowbrook, which has posted 6,343 rounds. For the year, 92% of our rounds have been played by residents and their guests. Surcharge play represents 46% of total rounds played.

We have scheduled a night golf event for Saturday, April 13 at Lakes East. Check-in will begin at 6:00pm, dinner will be 6:30pm and play will start at 7:30pm. The format will be a two person scramble, the entry fee will be \$35. Entry forms will be available at all pro shops and we ask that the entries be turned in at Lakes East/Lakes West pro shop. Green fees will be paid on the day of play, entry fees will be due April 6.

#### **Snack Shops**

We would like to thank Russ Boyer, "BB" Boyer and Marlene Carmen for recently completing 10 years of employment with the Recreation Centers of Sun City. JP Loscher will be assuming the role of Snack Shop Manager at the South Course when it reopens. Darcie Hanssen will replace JP in the role of Snack Shop Manager at the North Course.

#### **Golf Courses**

Beginning April 8, spring fertilizer applications will begin at Willowcreek. We utilize an outside contractor for this application, which utilizes large tender trucks. The vendor is familiar with the golf courses and works with the golf superintendents to avoid damaging irrigation. This process is the most efficient way for this application. The applications begin early enough in the morning to avoid disrupting play. The dates for the other courses are as follows:

- Willowbrook April 9
- Lakes East/Lakes West April 10 & 11
- North April 12
- Riverview April 15
- South April 16
- Quail Run April 17

We have held our pre-bid meeting for our summer golf projects which include: rebuilding the South Golf Course practice area, sand replacement and bunker repair at the South Golf Course and installation of forward tees on Lakes West Golf Course. Six contractors expressed early interest in the project, four contractors attended the pre-bid meeting. The contract for the work will be awarded in early April. Work will begin first on the South Practice area, as this part of the project will have a hard deadline for grassing and is expected to begin in late May.

Work will then progress to the South bunker portion of the project. Installation of the forward tees is expected to begin in July. Courses will remain open during these projects; however, we will be making adjustments to tee sheets and, in the case of Lakes West, utilizing temporary tees as necessary.

#### **Grounds/Lawn Bowling**

Lawn Bowl greens are now mowed three times per week and are also double rolled three times per week. Ditches are raked and cleaned in conjunction with the double rolling. Greens speeds have been consistent, ranging from a low of 13.1 seconds on Bell North to 13.9 seconds on Lakeview East. We continue to water greens on an as needed basis, though frequency will begin to increase as temperatures increase.

Work began on the greens at Mountain View and Oakmont to remove unwanted grasses on March 25. We will begin by laser leveling the plinth boards and replacing as necessary. The top 6–7 inches of material will then be removed and replaced with new material, which will then be laser leveled. Following laser leveling the greens will be sprigged and the levels fine-tuned as the new surface grows

Grounds continues to battle weeds as the rain has brought increased growth and has rendered many of our pre- and post-treatments largely ineffective. We have assisted the Garden Club at the Sun Bowl rose garden with irrigation adjustments. We are beginning to apply spring fertilizers and are continuing our applications of preemergent for weeds.



Tips from a Pro

#### Learn to Control Your Distance with Short Game Shots

Controlling the distance of our short game shots (including putting, chipping and pitching) is perhaps one of the most misunderstood areas of the game. Most people know and understand that with full swings we best control the distance by switching clubs. The idea is to make the same swing every time and let the club make the difference in the distance.

With the short game, many golfers try and control distance by hitting the ball softer or harder. Instinctively this may seem to make sense, but it is very difficult to be consistent. First, it's hard to put a gauge on what is hard or soft and make it repeatable and, second, when we change the speed of the stroke it can also affect direction. So, how should we control distance for our short game shots?



Whether putting, chipping or pitching, the length of the swing should be what determines the distance. In other words, use short strokes for short distances, medium length strokes for medium distances and long strokes for long distances. How you decide to gauge the length so you can repeat it depends on what works best for you. You may think of how far you bring the club back in terms of inches (4 inches for a short putt, 8 for a medium and 12 for a long). Or, you may use a part of your own body as a refer-

ence for the length of the swing (swing the hands to the thigh for a short pitch, hands to the waist for a medium pitch or hands to the shoulder for a long pitch. How you measure it is up to you! The important thing is that you can repeat it time after time so you can count on the distance always being the same.

Remember if you learn to control the distance of your short game shots by changing only the length of the stroke that becomes your only variable and you will be much more consistent overall!

- 5) Gently tap the surface down with putter.
- 6) Never use loosened turf for repair.

#### **WRONG!**

Pulling up or lifting on the center or the sides will tear the roots and result in brown spots taking weeks for the surface to heal.

Do not pull up or twist with tool. This will only bring sand to the surface and tear the root system



#### **RIGHT!**

Insert tool and push back and sides forward to center. No damage to root system. Healing starts immediately.

### Speaking Your Mind: Unintended Consequences

As we age, many of us tend to be more vocal, feeling it is our right to share personal opinions, likes and dislikes, thoughts and concerns. While everyone has their own communication style, for the most part conversations do typically remain civil and professional. Healthy debate and discussion may mean that sometimes we just need to accept our differences and agree to disagree.

However, we all want to be able to give our input on matters that concern us and we wish to be respected as we express these thoughts without fear of retaliation or of being ridiculed.

Let's remember to be grateful to those who embrace opportunities to share their point of view – keeping their conversation concise and succinct. By this point in our lives, we should try to show compassion and be patient when someone struggles with expressing themselves, whether from momentary forgetfulness or a more severe cognitive disorder as the result of a medical condition.

But as we give our input and verbalize our concerns, we may need to work at removing some of the personal, almost selfish interests we might be expressing. Consider the bigger picture and the unintended consequences of your desires and demands.

Also know that when your concerns are being considered, it becomes necessary to take into account all the potential effects and results that may occur. One slight thing might bother five people, but on the other side of the issue there might be 500 cardholders whose livelihoods might be impacted.

In further consideration, when expressing your wishes keep in mind that RCSC offers similar amenities and activities at several

locations. While this might be a slight inconvenience, it is likely that something nearly identical is available at the same time, only at a different place.

Sun City AZ has been and will always remain a wonderful, extremely affordable destination with unsurpassed amenities and facilities avail-

able to those wishing to partake; for those 55 plus, whether still working or fully retired, permanent resident or only seasonal.

As we begin this process of open meetings, we are learning the nuances of two-way communication and discussion as we work to reach decisions and move forward. More input from Members may bring other thoughts and ideas to the table – but we all need to learn the proper processes, when and where input is appropriate and consider other people's point of view.

No matter the outcome, the benefits of open meetings and increased Member participation will be good for everyone. Just remember: Be careful what you wish for! Despite the best laid plans, unexpected consequences can happen. Perhaps, at times, it might be best to simply grin and bear it rather than make a fuss and then have to live with the fall-out. Let's make sure we join together and take advantage of this new experience.

#### **Management Reports**

#### **Financial Report**

The Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. (RCSC) has ended February 2019 within its operating and capital budget year to date. Every division has met or exceeded its net operating budget projections which is extraordinary considering that we have reportedly had the second coldest winter in the last 40 years which left gross income short by \$105,636 for the year.

#### **Cardholder Services**

Payments on past due assessments in February were 10% of past due balances. This payment rate has been consistent over the past 6 months. Overall accounts receivable increased in February by 1.2%. The Over 30 category saw the largest change and increased by 39% in February. January assessments went 30 days past due at 4.9% rate and December assessments went 60 days past due at a lower 2.6% rate.

Payments from our third-party collections firm continued the slow start this year and totaled \$10,823 in February. Year to date payments through our third-party collections firm total \$19,970. Payments made in February by Cardholders through the online RCSC Web Portal totaled \$127,439 from 291 property owners. Year to date web portal payments total \$256,096 from 571 property owners.

In February, property transfer balances increased by 2%. Property transfer related balances have increased 13.6% from the end of 2018. These balances are the highest in over a year and contribute to the overall accounts receivable increase. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent 57% of all receivables and 56% of past due balances. Outstanding lender related balances decreased in February although the number of properties owned by lending institutions increased. At the end of February trustee sale notices on Sun City properties ended at 33 and properties owned by lending institutions increased to eight.

#### **Human Resources**

As the first quarter of the year comes to a close, I want to share some interesting statistics regarding staffing and demographics of staff members employed with RCSC. Since January 1, eighteen newly hired individuals have joined our staff. In addition, eight current employees have requested and received job transfers and/or position changes. Current employees have the opportunity to apply for changes when openings occur. Of the 384 employees currently on staff, 154 are full time and 230 part time. Two hundred and sixty employees are residents of Sun City AZ and the remainder live in various surrounding communities. The average age of RCSC employees is 65 years.

#### **Member Services**

The RCSC Senior Prom was an extremely popular event. There were over 350 in attendance, dressed in the theme of "Mid-Summer Nights Dream." A festive event it was!

The final show of the Sundial ticketed series was another sold-out performance as Greg Ansel wowed the audience with his tribute to Neil Diamond as "Diamond in the Rough."

The Sun Bowl spring concert series began Sunday, March 10th with Chad Freeman and Redline. The following week the Eagles Tribute band "One of These Nights" performed to another record-breaking attendance crowd. The Huey Lewis tribute, "The Heart of Rock & Roll" had attendance that was a close second. The last March show on the 31st is another all-time Sun City favorite "Mogollon."

April promises to be just as exciting as the month begins with our annual "Dancing with the Sun City Stars" on Friday, April 5 at 7pm in Sundial Auditorium. Then on Saturday, April 20, at Sun Bowl we will host our annual Easter Egg Hunt beginning at 9am. There will prizes, pony rides, a petting zoo and face painting. These are free events; however, please be sure to have your RCSC Photo Membership or Privilege card for admittance.

The final shows at the Sun Bowl through April with a show time of 6:30pm are "Americana," followed by a tribute to the Rolling Stones by "Jumping Jack Flash," then "Faded Jeans," and closing out the series and the month is "The Hamptons" on Sunday, April 28, 2019.

#### **Project Updates**

#### **Building and Infrastructure:**

#### **Bell Center**

Approved projects for the Bell Center pool area will require closure of the pool area for an extended period of time. The pool area will close as of June 3, 2019 with work estimated to be completed in 8 weeks. This work will include the replacement of the pebble sheen surface in the lap pool, walking pool and outdoor spa, repair of the bench in the walking pool, kool deck replacement with a Rubaroc product, and replacement of pool filters and pumps for the walking pool. Contractors are: CDC Pools, Rubcorp, Arizona Safety Surfacing, and Superior Pool Products (combined cost – \$367,652).

#### **Grand Ave**

- Engineers are preparing the response to the ADOT permit application along with the necessary design changes.
- Initial comments have been received from the Maricopa County Planning and Development Department regarding the building permit application. Responses to these comments are targeted for return to the County by April 5, 2019.
- Building design and space allocation for the second building on the Grand Ave property has begun.

#### **South Golf Course**

- APS energized the new building on March 20, 2019. Electrical service was in the critical path for configuring and verifying systems in the building.
- Mechanical systems are in the process of being tested and balanced with required reports verifying system functioning pending.
- All kitchen appliances are on site and being installed and tested.
- The majority of furniture is onsite with the final chairs due for arrival by April 3, 2019.
- A walk through with the architect and general contractor was performed on March 25, 2019 and punch list items for completion were identified. This list included a small number of items for completion.
- Final building inspection and certificate of occupancy is pending. Additionally, a final inspection and approval of the kitchen space is required from the Maricopa County Health Department.

**Water Conservation** 

#### Now is the Time to Check Irrigation, Save Water

According to the Arizona Department of Water Resources website, up to 70 percent of residential water usage in the state is for landscaping. With the warmer weather coming, now is the perfect time to inspect your irrigation system and reset your timers.

How often and how long to water plants requires consideration of many factors besides the season – plant type and maturity, soil, location and root depth. Obviously new plantings have different watering



requirements than established plants, but water use can be significantly reduced by using efficient landscape design, plant selection and proper irrigation practices.

During these warmer months, irrigation should occur at night or in the early morning (between 3am and 8am) to reduce water loss from evaporation and wind. Continue to observe plants regularly, watching for signs of water stress such as wilted, curled or drooping leaves, yellowing or leaves dropping off, or dead stems and/or branches. Signs of excess watering include brittle leave on plant, wilting shoot tips, smelly and soft tissues and the presence of algae or fungi.

Tips from Get Fit for Life -

#### **Bouncing Back After Injury**

Have you been spending time at the gym, feeling good, staying committed, when the unthinkable happens: you get injured? "Whether you're a seasoned exerciser or a beginner, injuries are tough," states Jane Fortier, fitness specialist for Get Fit for Life. "It's difficult to stay motivated when doctor's orders (or just your own pain level) keep you from the activities you enjoy. Whether you're out for six days, six weeks, six months or longer, emotions run high. It's normal to experience feelings of anger, frustration and sadness - you can't do what you once did. You might

spend time thinking about how it could have been prevented, or asking "Why me?" But after the pity-party, it's time to pick yourself up, refocus and create a new plan. Attitude is everything. The following suggestions may be helpful."

- Set a goal for recovery. Put today's efforts into rehabbing the injury. Don't dread the exercises that will help you recover, view them as your next physical challenge. Put as much effort into them as you did your regular exercise routine.
- Get creative. If the doctor restricts your old activities, find new ones that are more body-friendly. Chair workouts, water movements, isometric exercises might be options. Listen to your body. Don't push through pain. Experiment to find pain-free activities.
- Keep things in perspective. Although working-out is important, it's just one small part of your life. Feeling down—and staying down—won't change the current situation. Look for other, non-physical ways to challenge yourself. Use your recovery time as an opportunity for personal growth in other areas of your life
- Track your progress. If things are moving slowly and you don't see much progress, record what's going-on. Develop a chart that tracks your gains in strength, things you're able to do this week that you couldn't do previously, increases in cardio endurance and other improvements.
- Remember what matters most, when it comes to weight loss. If losing or maintaining weight is one of your biggest reasons for exercising, never fear. Keep in mind that the majority of weight loss progress comes from diet, not exercise. Even if you can't exercise at all, you can still lose weight—or at least avoid gaining back the weight you've lost—if you consistently make healthy food choices and track your food intake on a daily basis.
- Stop dwelling in the past. Like it or not, you can't change the past. Don't dwell
  on how long you could use the elliptical or how much weight you could bench.
  Assess where you are right now and develop a plan to move forward toward new
  health and fitness goals. Don't let an injury dampen your attitude and define your
  success
- Find a good support system. It's not always easy to deal with life's ups and downs alone. Friends and family cheer you on when things go well allow them to pick you up when things are tough. The support of others, after an injury, could be just what you need to get motivated and begin again.

### LaTouch Wellness Massage Therapy Shares... Reducing Chronic Pain with Massage

If you are experiencing chronic pain it may be treated with regularly scheduled massage sessions. If chronic pain persists even though the injury has healed, massage and additional therapies may be warranted. Pain signals can remain active in the nervous and muscular system for weeks, months, or years.





We are a charitable non-profit Arizona corporation and are funded by voluntary contributions and memorial gifts.

While the equipment is available for the use of all residents or visitors staying with residents, the equipment must not be taken out of Sun City on a permanent basis. As a matter of control, equipment is loaned only to Sun City residents.

Records show that as the population of Sun City grew, so did use of our medical equipment. Savings for Sun City residents have been calculated periodically; in 2015, it was estimated that residents saved over two million dollars in cost of equipment for that year alone.



Sunshine Service, Inc has received local, state and national recognition. Awards received include the George Washington Honor Medal for services to the sick and handicapped from the Freedoms Foundation of Valley Forge in Pennsylvania.






