## Help RCSC Maintain "Healthy Swimming"

Safe and healthy swimming is one of the hallmarks at the Recreation Centers of Sun City and RCSC Cardholders and their guests are a key component to proper pool and spa sanitation.

While all recreational pool facilities must comply with Maricopa County Department of Environmental Health rules and regulations, RCSC goes above and beyond those requirements to ensure the wellbeing of swimmers, bathers and walkers alike that use the pools and spas.

Although public health code requires only one reading each day to test for chlorine, alkaline and PH levels, RCSC goes even further for your benefit by testing four times per day at each of the RCSC Center's pools and spas. Chemicals may need to be added and adjustments are made as necessary to maintain correct water balance.

### **Bell Center Aquatic Facilities Closure Begins June 3**

RCSC Cardholders are advised that all outdoor aquatic facilities at the Bell Recreation Center are scheduled to be closed beginning on Monday, June 3, 2019 for extensive work which will include the following: pool deck replacement, lap pool, walking pool and spa pebble sheen replacement, along with pool filter and pump replacement. It is anticipated that this work will take approximately two months to complete. The scheduling of this work over the summer months is in large part required due to contractor scheduling/availability.

Cardholders are encouraged to visit the other recreational centers for their swimming needs during this period. However, you are advised to review the pool schedules in SunViews, on the website at www.suncityaz.org or to call ahead to ensure that the venue is not reserved for club activities (Phone numbers for each center can be found on page 3.)



In addition, all RCSC pools and spas are equipped with Ultra Violet (UV) Light Systems which not only reduce the amount of chlorine needed but guickly sterilize or eliminate any bacteria in the water. During this process, pool water is channeled through a full pipe UV System and completely sanitized before returning to the pool or spa.

But all the chemicals, treatment and testing can't keep all of the pools healthy and sanitary all of the time. Swimmers must be active participants in helping with these efforts.

With all the steps the RCSC is taking and with the continued help and support from Cardholders and their guests, RCSC will be able to maintain healthy swimming pools and spas for everyone's enjoyment by following these simple guidelines:

- Always practice good hygiene. Onsite showers are required before entering any swimming pool or spa.
- Take frequent bathroom breaks and thoroughly wash your hands after using the restroom.
- Don't swim if you have diarrhea. Doing so can spread germs and make other people sick!
- Stay out of the water for at least two weeks after symptoms disappear.
- Avoid getting pool water in your . mouth and if you do, don't swallow.
- If you see fecal matter, immediately report it to the on-duty Facility Attendant so that proper measures can be taken.

RCSC staff are fully responsible for all pool maintenance and sanitation management. Certified Pool Operators are on-staff at all RCSC Recreation Centers whose responsibilities include water testing and pool equipment maintenance. In addition, there are four members on RCSC staff who have successfully completed the required testing and have received their Aquatics Facility Operator Certification ensuring our that facilities continue to be operated for your utmost enjoyment and protection by providing clean and sanitized aquatic facilities for all Cardholders and their quests.

"With everyone's continued commitment to keeping RCSC pools clean, Healthy Swimming in Sun City AZ is here to stay!" remarked Barry Masloff, Centers Operations Manager.

### **RCSC Cardholders:**

## Please keep the following in mind!

While you're out and about enjoying all that RCSC has to offer, please be aware of the following items which require Cardholder attention when using any of the recreational facilities:

- All RCSC Cardholders are required to check in with their Member or Privilege Cards (key fobs accepted for entry to fitness, pools and spas; not concerts or free events).
- Neither Sun City AZ residents nor spouses of RCSC Cardholders are eligible to be guests. With proper documentation and if eligible, privilege cards may be purchased at the Cardholder Services Office at Lakeview Center in order to use the facilities.
- Host punch cards are purchased by and belong to the Cardholder, not the guest. Host punch cards can be purchased at RCSC Facility Attendent Stations (exact cash or check only), Cardholder Services at Lakeview, RCSC Bowling Centers.
- Guests may be requested to show government-issued photo ID when checking in to use RCSC facilities.

- Proof of age for 4 and 5 year olds (birth certificate or passport) is required for access to swimming pools. Photo copies or electronic images are acceptable.
- Free concerts and events are paid for by RCSC Cardholders and are intended for RCSC Cardholders and their escorted guests only.
- Always be prepared to show your RCSC Member or Privilege card (with photo) when attending concerts and events. Key fobs are not accepted for entry.
- Household pets are NOT allowed at any RCSC facilities, including but not limited to buildings, golf courses, grounds, parking lots, except for dogs at the RCSC dog park, Best Friends Dog Club and/or dogs trained as service animals. This does not include emotional support.

## **RCSC Amends Corporate Bylaws, Board Policies**

In our efforts to consolidate and streamline the RCSC Corporate Documents, several changes have recently been made. The 2019 Board of Directors determined it was necessary to merge many of the previous Board Policies into the RCSC Corporate Bylaws so that all information regarding specific topics could be found in one location.

This major endeavor was undertaken as a result of questions and procedural matters that surfaced during discussions with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development with regards to the reverse mortgage challenges we were facing back in 2017-2018.

As you may recall, there were many in the community who insisted that RCSC merely "change their documents." Both the Board and RCSC Management at the time felt that it was important to remain steadfast and work with the proper governmental authorities to resolve the matter.

While the reverse mortgage issue has been settled and property owners have this financial option available, this encounter brought to light several concerns which the Board felt needed to be addressed as we move forward in redefining the future of our community.

With this background presented, let us fast forward to where we are today. RCSC now has fewer Board Policies (ten remain) and amended Corporate Bylaws which more fully direct the operations of the corporation and direct the Board of Directors in their work to oversee the corporation in a concise and restructured format.

Change is oftentimes difficult and sometimes hard to grasp. It is hoped that these amendments to the Bylaws will, over time, be easier to use and understand as all information and explanations can be found in the same location.

## Candidate Packets Available Starting June 3rd

While the RCSC Board of Directors take a summer break after their meetings this month, it is time for others to think about giving back to the community by becoming a candidate for upcoming Board elections.

Candidate packets will be available beginning on Monday, June 3, 2019. Those interested in obtaining a packet must make this request in person at the Corporate/ Board Office at Lakeview Center (lower level) and present their RCSC Member card. The deadline for packet submissions is no later than noon on Friday, October 4, 2019.

There will be three vacancies to fill in this year's December election, with each being a three year term. Those leaving the Board at the end of 2019 are President Jerry DeLano, Director Darla Akins and Director Stella VanNess.

Requirements to become a RCSC Board candidate:

- Must be at least fifty-five (55) years of age;
- Must not reside with or be related by

marriage or birth to any other member of the Board, Senior Management Staff, or Board Candidate;

- Must be a Deeded Real Estate Owner of property in Sun City, Maricopa County, Arizona;
- Must be a RCSC Member in good standing;
- Must reside in Sun City, Arizona and be available at least ten (10) months of the year;
- Must meet the requirements to hold an Arizona liquor license (RCSC holds liquor licenses which require Board Officers to be included on the licensing);
- Must be eligible and available to serve a three (3) year term; and
- Should be available to attend Board Candidate Orientation(s).

if elected, Directors cannot serve on any board of a Chartered Club or green committee or golf association affiliated with RCSC golf courses.

Candidates must also submit a fully completed RCSC petition, signed by 100 or



more RCSC Members in good standing, along with all other forms provided in the RCSC Candidate Packet.

A successful candidate will:

- Have a strong desire to serve Sun City, AZ;
- Be fair and courteous;
- Use good common sense;
- Have good communication skills;
- Be willing to work as part of a team;
- Ability to prioritize policy and projects which will have the greatest benefit for the most members; and
- Be willing and able to dedicate the necessary hours to be an effective Director.

Candidates will be introduced at the October and November Board meetings and candidate forums that will be held in the fall. Forum locations and dates will be announced at a later time.

## South Pro Shop Open House Gives Many A First Look











The South Pro Shop Open House brought out many for a sneak peak at the new building. Director of Golf Brian Duthu presented Karen Scheurman with a brick from the original club house for her dedication to the project. Many stayed for lunch as the long line shows, keeping the snack shop staff busy for the afternoon and tables in demand both inside and on the patio. Comments included - Really nice! So spacious! And now with Sun City AZ's only golf simulator, too! South Course is definitely the place to be!







#### **Golf & Grounds Report**

#### **Pro Shops**

Total golf rounds for March were 42,930, 891 fewer than prior year and the second lowest recorded total in the last 14 years. Poor weather from March 11 through March 13 resulted in 2,263 less rounds from prior year. Despite fewer rounds played, green and cart fee income both exceeded budget and prior year; driven by a higher average green/cart fee per round.

#### **Snack Shops**

Snack shop revenue exceeded budget by \$1,600, despite fewer golf rounds played compared to prior year.

#### **Golf Courses**

The well on the back 9 of the South Course is back online, work included:

- brushing and bailing of column pipe
- cleaning dipping and baking of the motor
- replacing damaged column pipe
- videotaping of well

Prior to service, the well was operating between 500 and 600 gallons per minute. After service, output has increased to 1000 gallons per minute. Total cost of work performed was \$82,205.65.

We have received bids for this summer's golf projects: South bunker refresh, South practice area rebuild, and installation of forward tees on Lakes West. We are currently in process of submitting bids to the bid commission for approval and contractor selection. The budget for the South Bunker/Practice area is \$225,000 and the budget for Lakes West Forward tees is \$275,000.

#### Lawn Bowl/Grounds

Work has begun on the lawn bowling greens at Mountain View and Oakmont. The greens at Mountain View have had 7 inches of material removed, plinth boards leveled and new root zone material installed. The greens at Oakmont have had 7 inches of material removed and are awaiting replacement plinth boards to begin the leveling process. Once leveled new root zone material will be installed. Both greens will be laser leveled prior to being grassed. Total budget for project is \$150,000.

#### Tips from a Pro

## Thanks, but no thanks!

One of the biggest complaints I get from my students is the unwarranted advice they get from others while in the middle of a round of golf. It's only natural for people to want to help those who look like they need help, but although well intentioned, it's rarely useful. Why? Not because it is necessarily bad advice, but that it is offered at the wrong time...during the game! There are so many things to think about when on the course: club choice, distance to the target, order of play, replacing divots, keeping up with the group ahead ...whew! There is NO time to think about how to hit the ball.

Golf is no different from any other sport. The time for thinking and practicing needs to be done prior to playing. In many sports there isn't the time to think about the "how to" during the game. When the ball is moving or coming at you as in tennis or pickleball - you must hit it! In golf because the ball is stationary, we have the ability to let ourselves "think" about the how to at a time when we would be better served to "just do it"!

So, what is the best way to help others (or yourself!) on the golf course? Encourage them to relax and swing easy...perhaps use their favorite club or at least one that is most forgiving and work it out after the round on the driving range. Stay away from talking about the mechanics (what to do with their head, knee, arm, etc.). That will only make you over think, tense up and get more frustrated!

Remember, everyone hits bad shots and has bad days on the golf course, but as the old saying goes: "a bad day on the course is better than the best day at work!" Keep that in mind next time you become frustrated and it may just give you the attitude adjustment you need to relax!

## WELCOME GOLFERS

PLEASE REPAIR ALL BALL MARKS WITH THE TOOLS PROVIDED. USE ONLY THE APPROVED REPAIR METHOD SHOWN TO HELP MAINTAIN OUR GREENS AND INCREASE YOUR ENJOYMENT.

#### **Only YOU can prevent ball mark damage!**

#### **RIGHT!**

- Close the gap/hole with putter by patting down the ball mark.
   Insert *Green-Save* tool on the high side behind ball mark and
- push the back toward the center.
- 3) Do not pull up, twist or lift with the tool.
- 4) Push both sides of the ball mark into the center.
- 5) Gently tap the surface down with putter.
- 6) Never use loosened turf for repair.

### **WRONG!**

Pulling up or lifting on the center or the sides will tear the roots and result in brown spots taking weeks for the surface to heal.

Do not pull up or twist with tool. This will only bring sand to the surface and tear the root system



### **RIGHT!**

Insert tool and push back and sides forward to center. No damage to root system. Healing starts immediately.

### Management Report

#### **Financial Report**

The Recreation Centers of Sun City, Inc. (RCSC) has ended First Quarter 2019 within its operating and capital budget year to date. Every division has met or exceeded its net operating budget projections year to date. Gross operating income is under budget by \$78,630 which is attributable to the golf division and the cold weather. Food Service shows a negative variance in wages, taxes and benefits of \$7,608 due to the third pay period in March not being budgeted. Building and Infrastructure Division is over budget in repairs and maintenance by \$8,535. General Operating Expenses are under budget by a total of \$234,758 year to date with Total Net Excess before Depreciation in a positive variance position from budget of \$308,805 as of March 31, 2019.

#### **Maricopa County Library Lease Agreement**

The current Maricopa County Library Lease Agreement will expire on June 30, 2019. Another lease agreement for the Bell Center (13,675 sq. ft.) and Fairway Center (4,365 sq. ft.) libraries has been drafted for another 5 year term commencing on July 1, 2019 and expiring on June 30, 2024 and should be finalized in the near future. The terms of the lease are the same as the prior lease, with rent of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) per year and RCSC providing at its own expense utilities, maintenance and janitorial services.

#### **Cardholder Services**

Payments on past due assessments in March were 10% of past due balances. While this payment rate is consistent for the past 7 months it is approximately 17.5% under the average for the past year. Overall accounts receivable increased in March by 3.7% and is up 9.6% from the beginning of the year. While both the Over 30 and Over 60 categories have seen significant increases, the Over 90 category has decreased and is at the lowest level in almost 6 years. Overall account receivable past due balances have increased 2.95% since the beginning of the year. February assessments went 30 days past due at 5.9% rate and January assessments went 60 days past due at a 2.9% rate.

Payments from our third-party collections firm totaled \$5,186 in March. Year to date payments through our third-party collections firm total \$25,157. Payments made in March through the online RCSC Web Portal totaled \$173,548 from 379 property owners. This is the highest single month total for payments through the web portal since this function was introduced in 2013. Year to date web portal payments total \$429,644 from 939 property owners.

In March property transfer balances decreased by 6%. Despite this decrease, property transfer related balances are 6.8% higher than the end of 2018. Outstanding balances related to property transfers represent 52% of all receivables and 55% of past due balances. Outstanding lender related balances increased in March. At the end of March trustee sale notices on Sun City AZ properties ended at 30 and properties owned by lending institutions decreased to 7.

 Work scheduled for June 2019. Includes the chip out of the existing finish, repair of broken bench, repair of 2" water supply line, replacement of pebble sheen surface, waterline tile, depth markers, new drain covers, and LED retrofit kits for lights. Contractor: CDC Pools, RCSC Skilled Trades (Budget \$57,585)

#### **Outdoor Spa Pebble Sheen Replacement**

• Work scheduled for June 2019. Includes the chip out of the existing finish, replacement of pebble sheen surface, waterline tile, depth markers, new drain covers, and LED retrofit kits for lights. Contractor: CDC Pools, RCSC Skilled Trades (Budget \$8,327)

#### Pool Filter and Pump Replacement

 Replacement of the cartridge filters with sand filters for the walking pool and outdoor spa will be completed during the closure for the interior refinishing and deck replacement. This change will save considerable time and expense for the ongoing cleaning of the cartridge filters. The pump for the walking pool will also be replaced at this time. Contractor: Superior Pool Products (Budget \$16,000)

#### **Repaint Bell Center**

• Bids from contractors have been received for this project and are currently being evaluated. Scheduling of work dependent upon approval and contractor selected. Anticipate work to be coordinated with the pool work so those areas around the pool are done during the pool closure. Contractor: TBD (Budget \$125,000)

#### Library Book Drop

 This project is the design and construction of a book drop on a center island within the access road to the north of the library. A civil engineer was contracted to ensure the grading, drainage and roadway modifications were adequately designed to ensure the selected contractor had specifications to construct from. The civil engineering work was completed as of 4/17/2019. The architectural drawings will integrate these drawings and be used for soliciting bid from contractors. We anticipate architectural drawings to be received by 4/19/2019 and solicitation of bids without delay. The costs of this project are to be reimbursed by the Friends of the Library. Contractor: To Be Determined (Cost – To Be Determined)

#### **Sewer Pipe Relining**

• A 4" cast iron sewer pipe under the foundation and runs under the shuffleboard and adjacent restrooms is deteriorated. This pipe will be relined with the Nuflow liner product to prevent the disruption of a traditional excavation and replacement. The restrooms on the Hutton side of Bell Lanes will be partially affected for 2-3 days while this work in completed. Contractor: Sunland Plumbing (Cost \$7,800)

#### **Grand Center**

- Resubmission of the building permit package completed on 04/16/2019. Pending receipt of building permit before requesting bids for the project. Bid and material specifications completed so the bid process will begin without delay upon permit issuance.
- The permit for the deceleration lane from ADOT is still pending.
- Board approval of the space allocation for the second building to be requested at the April 25, 2019 board meeting. Upon approval of the space allocation we will begin working with the assigned clubs on the detailed use of the assigned space.

#### **Upper Restroom Remodel**

• Final updated specifications provided to architectural firm for updating design documents and material specifications as of 4/17/2019. Bid Commission approval expected to be requested by 04/30/2019. Contractor: TBD (Budget \$110,000)

#### **Pickleball Pavilion Lighting**

 Met with the Musco lighting representative to review the pavilion and lighting needs. Revised proposal from Musco is pending. Ephesus Lighting, a division of Eaton, provides sporting venue lighting but has declined to participate in providing a proposal and recommended that the Cooper Division of Eaton may be a better fit. Continuing to seek additional bids on this project. Contractor: TBD

#### Water Conservation

### How to Drink Your 8 X 8 Everyday & Save Water

We all know that drinking water is good for us and most health professionals recommend eight 8-ounce glasses of water each day. Some call this the "8 X 8" rule. But here in the desert, especially in the summer, we may be required to drink even more depending upon our activity. This is one of only a few circumstances where water saving should be too much of a consideration.

However, you can still do your part while consuming the necessary amount of water you should for proper hydration AND yet stay mindful of your personal water conservation efforts.



First of all, using a refillable container for your water is essential. While there are some instances when grabbing a bottle of water to go is convenient or perhaps even necessary, just remember that is takes about 1.5 gallons of water to simply manufacture one single plastic bottle plus the fact that plastic bottles are always made from new plastic material. On top of that, recycled plastic bottles are never refilled with water. Yikes!

The second "drink your water-water saving tip" is to keep a pitcher of water in the refrigerator. Don't let the tap run to get a cool drink; simply pour yourself a cool one and not waste a single drop. If you have neglected to refill your pitcher, put water straight from the faucet directly into a glass of ice cubes.

Simple enough, eh? Drink up and stay hydrated. Your life depends upon it – literally!

#### Uncertain about Pool Drainage?

### Seek Assistance from Maricopa County

Property owners with swimming pools in Sun City are advised that there are very strict Maricopa County regulations regarding stormwater and the draining of pools, backwashing, and filter cleaning. Many residents are under the misconception that they can drain onto golf courses after business hours. Be advised that this practice is not permissible. If you are uncertain how to proceed with the care and upkeep of your pool, please contact a pool maintenance professional if necessary. Otherwise, please refer to the information below and seek further assistance from the Maricopa County Environmental Services Department at 602-506-5557 or online at www.maricopa.gov/ stormwater.

#### Stormwater Management Best Practices

Swimming pools must be maintained properly to ensure that chemicals do not enter the street or storm drain system where they can be discharged directly into our rivers and lakes. Products such as chlorine and bromine that control pH, bacteria, and algae can also pollute water and harm wildlife.

#### What Can I Do?

Drain pool using one of these methods:

- 1. Drain into sanitary sewer cleanout.
- Drain onto your property making sure no water leaves the property.
- Drain freshwater swimming pool water into street or gutter making sure the water has been de-chlorinated/debrominated.

Filter Maintenance:

- Do NOT discharge filter backwash water into street or storm drain; use the sanitary sewer cleanout or maintain discharge on your property.
- Do NOT clean or rinse filter or cartridges into street or storm drain.

Last year, the Sun City Duplicate Bridge Club raised nearly \$1,500 and hope to exceed that amount this year.





#### Tips from Get Fit for Life -

### **Engage Your Core**

Have you ever been involved in exercise and heard the instructor say, "Engage your core," but had no idea what that meant, or actually how to engage it? "Don't worry," states Jane Fortier, fitness specialist with Get Fit for Life, "we've all been there." "Learning to activate core muscles can be confusing, but when you do it properly, you will be able to recruit more muscle activity to actually feel your muscles working and ultimately see more results."

The term "engage your core" typically refers to the activation or engagement of muscles that form a stabilizing girdle deep within the torso of the body, the transverse abdominis muscles. The quickest way to do this is to pull the navel back toward the spine. This action tilts the pelvis and stabilizes the spine.



A "Full Plank" is just one of the many core-specific exercises that help to improve balance, stability and overall movement, as active adults begin to age.

The complete CORE is comprised of all of the muscles that connect to the hips, spine and pelvis. That would include the Rectus Abdominis, External and Internal Obliques, Transverse Abdominis, muscles of the Pelvic Floor, the Diaphragm, and Spinal muscles (Erector Spinae and Multifidis). All of these muscles work together to create a strong, stable environment for the spine and internal organs.

- Rectus Abdominis –this sheet of muscle, running from the sternum to the pelvis, is used to flex the torso and stabilize the pelvis. You'll feel this muscle working in exercises like Crunches and V-Ups.
- External and Internal Obliques these are the muscles that run along the sides of your torso and work to rotate the torso and bend sideways. You'll feel these muscles work during twisting movements and ab exercises, like Side Bends and Abdominal Peddle-Pushes
- Transverse Abdominis (TVA) this is the deepest abdominal muscle group, and it works with the pelvic floor to stabilize the lower back and pelvis. You'll feel these muscles working during exercises like a Plank or Bridge.

While the equipment is available for the use of all residents or visitors staying with residents, the equipment must not be taken out of Sun City on a permanent basis. As a matter of control, equipment is loaned only to Sun City residents.

Records show that as the population of Sun City grew, so did use of our medical equipment. Savings for Sun City residents have been calculated periodically; in 2015, it was estimated that residents saved over two million dollars in cost of equipment for that year alone.
